The volunteers of the St. Clare's Home for Children nurture and care for infants and young children who were born with AIDS or are addicted to drugs.

St. Clare's Home for Children, founded in 1987 by Terrence and Faye Zealand after they lost a friend to AIDS, is comprised of three homes located in Elizabeth, Jersey City, and Neptune, New Jersey. The homes are transitional facilities which provide a homelike atmosphere for children born with drug addictions or afflicted with HIV. Local community members voluntarily offer compassion and care to the children at each home, all of which serve five children at one time.

Since the founding of the homes, the volunteers have cared for over 75 children. The children, aging from birth to six, stay at the homes while waiting to be returned to their biological families, placed with a foster family, or adopted. Many of the children who are severely ill spend their last days at the home. After completing a training program, where they learn how to handle the children safely and lead activities to help them develop their sensory motor, social, and communication skills, more than 100 volunteers visit the homes on a daily basis.



Mr. Levin, who must use a wheelchair or walker to move, decided to dedicate his life to sharing his culinary talents with the young people who live at the two facilities..

In 1987, Mr. Levin started teaching culinary arts and restaurant service one day a week. Today, he spends five days a week voluntarily teaching ten-week elective courses for the young residents of both facilities. He teaches the students menu planning and writing, setting a formal table, cooking, and proper service techniques. He also offers interesting stories on the history of food. Many of Mr. Levin's friends in the food industry invite the young people to tour their restaurant facilities and some even give the youngsters a chance to prove their new skills, eventually working into a full-time job. Some of the students have been accepted by reputable culinary schools. In addition, many of the young people maintain contact with Mr. Levin, calling on him when they are in need.

St. Clare's Home for Children, founded in 1987 by Terrence and Faye Zealand after they lost a friend to AIDS, is comprised of three homes located in Elizabeth, Jersey City, and Neptune, New Jersey. The homes are transitional facilities which provide a homelike atmosphere for children born with drug addictions or afflicted with HIV. Local community members voluntarily offer compassion and care to the children at each home, all of which serve five children at one time.

Since the founding of the homes, the volunteers have cared for over 75 children. The children, aging from birth to six, stay at the homes while waiting to be returned to their biological families, placed with a foster family, or adopted. Many of the children who are severely ill spend their last days at the home. After completing a training program, where they learn how to handle the children safely and lead activities to help them develop their sensory motor, social, and communication skills, more than 100 volunteers visit the homes on a daily basis.
