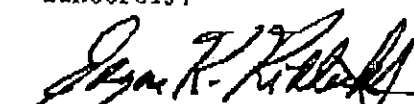

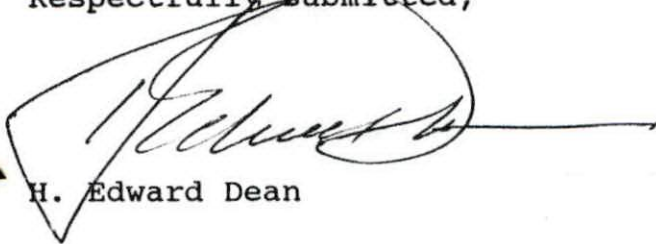

The minimum amount that we have heard from Governor Clinton that he will raise taxes is \$220 Billion. The Governor says that he will raise taxes on the 2% of the people that earns more than \$200,000 annually.

There are 250 million people in the USA. 117 million of these people make up the USA work force.

If you raise taxes, producers will produce less by definition because government is taking more from them to distribute to consumers who produced NOTHING! This consumption does not add to the immediate revenue stream if ever...everything is down stream in the Governors scheme.

There are 14 million businesses in the USA. By and large these and corporate executives are the producers who earn more than \$200,000 annually.

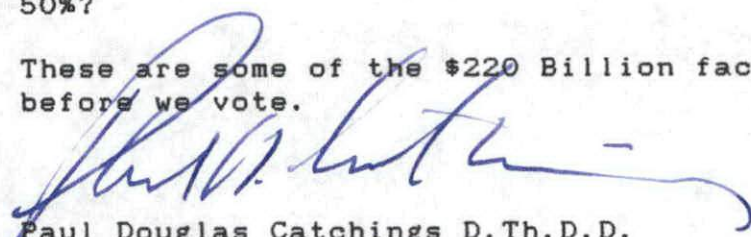
Under the Governor's 2% tax increase plan, these producers represent 35.7% of all businesses. (when we use 5 million producers listed above under possibility #1).

Dear Mr. Baker:

This really does pertain to the campaign, but you need to know the background.

Over the last few months, I have noticed, both in my law practice, and in talking to other attorneys, that a number of buyers of real property and their title insurers, have been sued because they acquired title that emanated from Iranians who forged deeds to transfer title, and have then returned, or are planning on returning to Iran. There is also a related series of crimes involving the theft of notarial stamps, stamping pads, and log books. Additionally, stories are circulating, in the banking community, about counterfeit dollars coming into the United States of America from Iran. While these may or may not be related events is uncertain at this time, but there does seem to be a potential for a pattern.

As such, I suggest that consideration be given to legislation and/or legal action that would restrict travel and movement of people, money and/or documents affecting title, to a foreign country, by a person who sold real property within 90 days prior to the event to be restricted, without independent verification, after the sale, from the sellers in the chains of title, for the twelve (12) months proceeding the sale, that they in fact did previously sell the property, or where there is a recent uninsured conveyance in the chain, because that is potentially a "red flag" of a forgery. Most real estate sales are now accessible by computerized records, and the cost of obtaining the verifications, is in my opinion, an expense the title insurers would prefer, to the millions, that are being paid out by title insurers, to victims of forgeries. I am also introducing the title insurance industry to a ranking California Department of Motor Vehicles official, to explore use of an electronic verification of identity network, to match driver's licenses shown to notaries, with DMV records, to verify the identify of grantors and assignors, and hope to include the State Department in this proposed network, because United States passports are a statutory alternative to driver's license identification. Properly structured, this concept could also generate new revenues for State, by charging for access to its records of passport holders names and numbers.

The point I am trying to make, is that in talking to other title insurers and to other attorneys in Southern California, who engage in real estate litigation, is that there is good cause to believe that there is an epidemic forgery problem, that needs attention, in order to avert another financial institutional crisis.

You may wish to have the Department of Justice check with local law enforcement, to determine the magnitude of this problem, because six (6) of the real property crimes came to my attention, in 24 hours, and my opinion is that Tehran may well be a principal culprit in this matter.

Also it would not hurt the Bush Campaign to play the crime fighter card, because the loss to the title insurers results in loss of otherwise taxable income, that results in a loss of Federal Income Tax Revenues. As such, it is not just the title insurers that are the victims, it is also the American taxpayer. In that respect, I am sure that the Department of Justice can come up with a variety of legal weapons to use to reach Iranian governmental assets that have been frozen, because it would not surprise me if governmental immunity would generate the type of testimony needed to tie Tehran to the forgeries, because that's where the forgers often go after they commit their crimes, and while I presently do not have any evidence that Tehran is involved, I can not believe that the people who left when the Shah fell, would be going back to Iran, unless they had good cause to believe that they would be able to live, without being subjected to political imprisonment. As such, my own view is that many of these forgeries were either orchestrated in Tehran, or that Tehran is reaping the benefits of these crimes, or on an after the fact basis, and at the least, the President may, once he has the facts, wish to denounce this type of conduct as International Criminal Behavior, and look at ways of stopping it, and bringing those who are guilty, to justice, in a manner akin to the War Crimes Trials of WW II.

As such, the President may wish to urge the International Community to consider boycotts against Iran.

From a campaign perspective, the President may wish to deliver a message, to the effect that there is a connection between foreign policy and domestic economic recovery, because foreign affairs are a Bush strength, and a Clinton and Perot weakness, and we can't afford to import crime, and export dollars to foreign criminal governments, because the loser is the American public, and the treasuries of our Federal, State, and Local governments.

The other point I want to make is that at the local level, the RTC is at a standstill. By way of example, in Orange County,

properties (i.e. Hyatt Newporter Hotel) are being taken off the market, where there are interested buyers (125), because the sale of properties creates job insecurity for local RTC officials. In Florida, Centrust could have been sold for \$50 million in cash, but was sold for approximately \$42 million, mostly in paper, because the RTC wanted to carry a note that needed loan servicing.

As such, RTC, in Washington, should insist that the local offices act solely in the best interest of the public, and not of the local staff.

I suggest that a program that attacks both the economics of crime and bureaucracy, has a deficit reduction potential and is a superior alternative to the proposed tax increases on the Clinton and Perot agendas.

I also suggest that the governmental revenues from such programs be ear-marked for productive programs, and not for benefit payments, because if America invests in itself, and in its future, others will follow. If America fails to invest in itself, it will fail to prepare, for its future, and that's preparing, for a future of failure.

Another message the President should consider, is the number of Congressional bad-check writers, and as well as the number of pro-Sadam Hussein Congressmen, that support Clinton, because the Presidency and the Congress are related issues.

The President is a good counter puncher, and what I am suggesting is that he start throwing combination punches at Clinton and the Congress. (i.e. How many Kuwaitis were killed, tortured, robbed, and raped, while Clinton's Congressional supporters argued against Desert Storm?; e.g. how many scholarships or other financial aid, to American students could have been funded, if Clinton's Congressional supporters hadn't flooded the House Bank with NSF checks?)

One argument is that "you know a man by the company he keeps" and Bill Clinton and his Congressional supporters are simply not fit to hold public office.

In a trial, one tactic is to blame the "empty chair" (i.e. the unsued wrong doer), and the liberal, tax raising Congress, is the "empty chair" in this campaign.

Also, the President should consider a stronger message of hope, because the moderates tend to vote Republican when they feel good

about themselves and about America. The economy is a complex creature, and in states such as California, lay-offs make the headlines, all too often, and one of the reasons is that business is moving out and unemployable welfare recipients and bogus worker's compensation claimants are moving in, driving up insurance costs, and driving out more businesses. Tragically crime pays, for the criminals, at the public's expense.

As such, the argument should be that crime and Clinton's liberal supporters in the Congress are not "strange bedfellows", but rather long time lovers.

As such, the message of HOPE, is that America needs Bush, Baker, and perhaps even "Stormin Norman", in an "Operation Urban Storm", so that the good citizens can take back their streets, feel secure in their jobs and homes, build up their savings accounts, feed, raise, and educate their children. As such, there needs to be a new approach to dealing with criminal punishment, because the drug lords and their troops will keep doing what they do unless they are either executed or banished to an area without easy access to methods of communications. Local Law Enforcement needs to be encouraged in its work, with joint Federal, State and Local Task Forces, that have a simple mission..... Arrest and deport the criminals.

As such, the President should consider the argument that his message of hope, is not wishful thinking, that Clinton's tax plan will not lead to a happier and better America, and that when "Operation Urban Storm" is over, America will be a better and safer place to live, and that the President needs a Republican Congress to wage that battle.

The other element of the message of hope involves job security and greater opportunity for advancement, and those subjects depend upon R & D, Capital accumulation, and an entrepreneurial spirit that works in partnership with the public interest, and the environment. As such, the President should be talking about policies and tax incentives that promote those goals, and linking those policies and tax incentives to a better America. Perot raised this issue, in the first debate, about the relationship between government and business, in other countries, and the President needs to recognize that Perot makes sense, but to sell the fact that Bush's prior experience, in government and business, makes him the better choice to lead on this issue.

The bottom line is that the President has to "recapture the center" (i.e. the moderates), and depict Clinton and the Congress as the

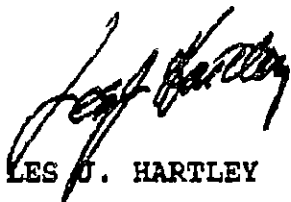

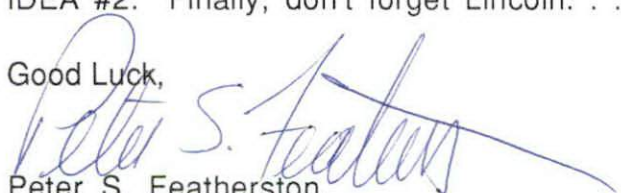

It has taken me many years to learn that in order to win and win convincingly, one must fight and "fight smart". This is an old Marine Corps philosophy that has proved very effective. After watching the debate this evening, nothing has changed much. Nothing has happened that in my opinion would change the opinion of the electorate. As you are undoubtedly aware, "Nightline" on ABC TV published the following statistics regarding who won the debate which was taken immediately following the debate. Bill Clinton 53%, President Bush 25% and Ross Perot 21%. A Texas Poll showed Clinton with 49%, President Bush with 21% and Perot with 17%. Obviously, these statistics are very discouraging, however, being the fighter that I am and an optimist, I still believe that President Bush can pull it out. However, in order to do so, I strongly believe a much different approach must be taken and taken immediately. Please consider the following comments and suggestions.

President Bush keeps talking about the past and his current proposals. The people want to know what he is going to do in the future to change the future of America and what's good for our people. While many of his past actions are correct and many, if not all of his new proposals are correct for our country, the credibility gap is so wide, people have a hard time in believing what he says. He must become more forceful on specific issues that directly affect the populous. 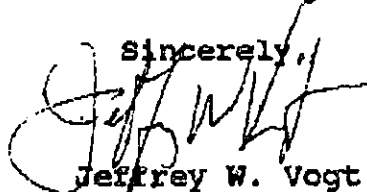

In reference to my letter dated September 22, 1992, I would like to revisit the issue of a Presidential campaign visit to our company. According to a recent Op-ed piece in the *Wall Street Journal* (enclosed), many high tech CEOs from Silicon Valley have defected from the GOP to the Clinton/Gore team. The hot topic these days on the campaign scene is that some rather well-known executives are defecting to the Clinton camp. What is even more interesting than how a few big business CEOs have endorsed the Clinton/Gore ticket is why business leaders have traditionally shunned Democrats. Traditionally, Democrats have ignored Corporate America. This team has emphasized their loyalty to big business and has done quite a remarkable job in reversing this perception. But is the Clinton/Gore team really a friend of small, entrepreneurial America?

Business friendly policy would not begin with mandates. Clinton's plan is riddled with mandates. It would be interesting to know how those business leaders who have embraced Clinton justify mandated health insurance and family leave. (Other than to say as big business they have these policies in place). How do these business leaders break it to their employees that payroll taxes will increase by 7-9% for this pay-or-play program? How do they think that businesses currently under the economic gun can afford stricter environmental standards and new, ambiguous civil rights laws. If Gore is able to impose his radical environmental agenda on America, businesses will have to be placed on the endangered list. Clinton's answer is more social programs, new spending for industrial policy and increased revenues.

Business friendly policy would advocate a reduction in the federal budget deficit. There has been little talk by Clinton of how to reduce the deficit. Why? Clinton believes that in order to get the economy back on track, government can't concentrate on the deficit. An emphasis on the deficit would threaten programs, that are essential to the Democratic base. Bush has proposed a budget reduction plan that would cut the deficit by \$437.5B with no revenue increases, limited new spending and realistic cuts in government spending. Clinton on the other hand, proposes increased spending by \$219 billion.

Business friendly policy would have as its centerpiece a capital gains tax cut. There is a near consensus among astute economists that there must be lower tax on investments as an incentive. Reagan understood this best of all. This will encourage the investment that has been missing in the last four years. Any politician interested in getting the economy back on track must propose a tax cut on capital gains.

The difference between the two candidates is overall central beliefs. Should government be the steering force behind the economy, or is there still a basic assumption that the private sector has the knowledge and the profit incentive to get the economy growing. Yes, times have been tough, there is, after-all a world-wide recession. However, we must avoid making matters worse by giving the government new jobs that will be entrenched into the next decade. There are too many examples of outdated and unnecessary government programs that are impossible to dismantle because of the entrenched bureaucracy created around them. This is a risk we take with the government meddling in health care. We will never get rid of them. If Americans think we have a health care problem now, they will be witness to a crisis if the incompetent federal government takes over.

NOT FOR PUBLICATION

Business leaders have sided with Republicans because we held the same basic belief that government by nature is inefficient. The malaise is caused by size and detachment from incoming revenues.

I do not think it is unfair to say we have had a disappointing four years. Not because George Bush carried out his policies that Clinton bashes, but because he did not. So why give him a second chance? Well, because change for the sake of change is not a very intelligent position. Afterall, there may be something worse-remember the misery index.

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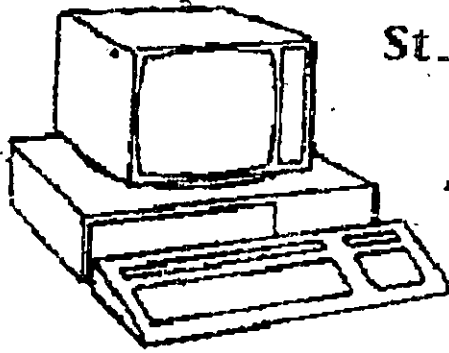
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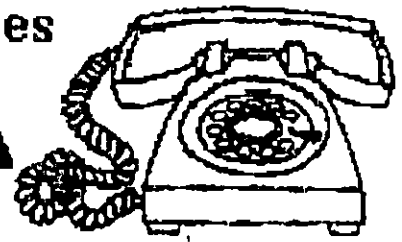

Bill Clinton's socialist

GEORGE Bush's chief economic advisers, Treasury Secretary Nicholas Brady and Budget Director Richard Darman, may be no great shakes. They coaxed Mr. Bush into swallowing the 1990 budget deal, with its near-record tax increase, thus pushing the economy into recession, and have encouraged the president to embrace a \$400 billion annual deficit and record growth in federal spending and debt.

But would Bill Clinton do any better? It seems highly doubtful. The Democratic nominee's top economic adviser, Derek Shearer, is not merely a careless calculator. He is a radical of the worst stripe, however vigorously Mr. Clinton and his campaign organization may strive to camouflage the facts.

Mr. Shearer, the architect of Mr. Clinton's \$200 billion "investment" plan for America, was an Oxford classmate of the candidate in 1969. From Oxford he went on to become economic guru to Tom Hayden, quondam husband of Jane Fonda and renowned '60s radical. Mr. Shearer also is an esteemed fellow at the Institute for Policy Studies, an unabashedly socialist Washington think tank that, until Soviet communism's last gasp, was an

them palatable to the American middle class.

What the Clinton-Shearer "investment" plan contemplates for the American economy is a typically socialist redistribution scheme. Mr. Clinton alleges that the \$200 billion spending on infrastructure improvements — roads, schools, water treatment plants, bridges and the like — would create millions of public-sector jobs. Indeed it would, albeit temporary ones.

Yet what needs to be asked is where the money would come from to pay for such "investments." From higher taxes, naturally, though the Clinton campaign is quick to offer the assurance that only the "rich" — those earning more than \$200,000 annually — would pay more, while everyone else would get a tax break.

On the other hand, Mr. Clinton has suggested that he would raise taxes on the top 2 percent of American wage earners. This expansion of the tax bite would incorporate individuals making \$90,000 a year and families earning \$130,000.

Call it socialism, economic democracy or Clintonomics — whatever name it goes by, it is the same old redistributionist snake oil. As Great Britain learned in the

uncritical apologist for socialist hegemony in Europe and around the world.

In 1982 Mr. Shearer told *Reason* magazine that "socialism has had a bad name in America, and no amount of wishful thinking on the part of the leftists is going to change that in our lifetime." So Mr. Shearer coined the term "economic democracy" — he co-authored a book by this title — to repackage socialist redistribution-of-wealth policies and make

1960s, when a nation enacts punitive taxes on the "rich," capital flees, economic growth slows to a stop and jobs are lost by the thousands.

One of the great mysteries of the 20th century is why, when so much of the world is slipping out from under the heavy hand of socialism, Americans such as Bill Clinton and his pet socialist persist in believing that such an economic philosophy is anything but a dead end.

Dear Mr. President,

After seeing the debate last Sunday and the commentaries that followed, I felt compelled to send you this letter which you may find sends some powerful messages through my experience as a Californian, 26 years young.

My true father and I always stayed close, and I look to him as a model for compassion. I presently design medical devices as an engineer in Silicone Valley, attend law school at night, and have been newly married 3 months. My wife and I each work over 40 hrs/wk. I rarely get to bed before 1:00 a.m. due to my schoolwork, and this will continue for the next 4 years. Regardless of my busy life, I will always honor the family interaction and values that make my life whole.

Those close to me are entrepreneurs, physicians, scientists, accountants, engineers, salesmen, truck drivers, and students. It is true that we are all working harder, as Mr. Clinton claims. But we are not working harder for less. We are working harder for more—for ourselves, for our families, and for our community. We believe that the power of the individual is the essence of freedom, and that our government's duty is to feed this power by offering more incentives, more control to local communities, and less federal government—by empowering the people and promoting strong family units. 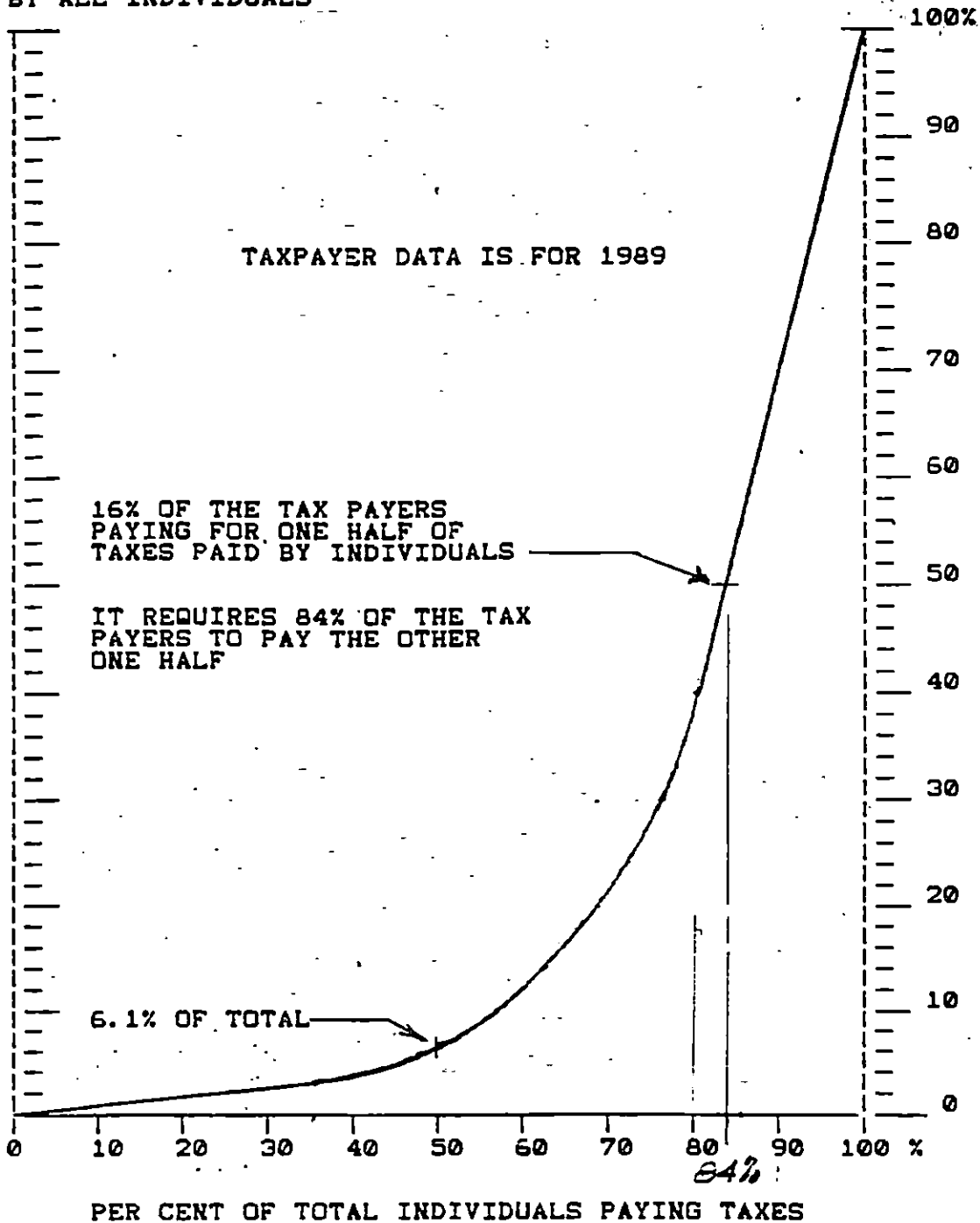

HITTING FACTS THAT CAN OVERWRITE THE OLD MEMORY.

PRINCIPLE No.2:

ONLY FIVE OR SIX POINTS THAT ARE THE MOST EFFECTIVE
SHOULD BE USED. IF MORE ARE NEEDED THEN LET SOMEONE ELSE
PRESENT THEM.

DO NOT VARY FROM THESE FIVE OR SIX, REPEAT, REPEAT
AND REPEAT TO WRITE THESE INTO THE PROSPECTS MEMORY.

PRINCIPLE No.3:

WHEN YOUR OPPONENT HAS LONG BEEN BEATING YOU OVER THE
HEAD FOR A LONG TIME YOU HAVE TO BET THE FARM AND GO ALL
OUT. YOU DO NOT WORRY WHAT THE OTHERS WILL THINK, IF YOU
LOSE THEY WILL JUST LAUGH AT YOU ANYHOW. YOU ALWAYS FEEL
BETTER WHEN IT YOUR TIME TO LAUGH. THIS MEANS WITH THESE
POINTS YOU HAVE TO HIT AS HARD AS HONESTY WILL ALLOW AND
FORGET WHAT OTHER BIASED PEOPLE WILL HAVE TO SAY. THEY ARE
YOU ENEMY TOO.

PRINCIPLE No.4:

AFTER YOU HAVE LAID OUT YOUR MESSAGE AND BENEFITS FOR
THE PROPECT YOU HAVE TO HAVE TO COMPARE YOURS WITH YOUR
OPPONENT'S PITCH. YOU DO YOU HAVE TO HAVE GUTS TO CALL
A LIE A LIE AND TELL THE PROSPECT HONESTLY BUT IN THE
MOST DIRECT FASHION HOW DAMAGED HE WILL BE. HOW
UNWORKABLE THEIR PROGRAM IS AND ALL THE COSTS AND
HARDSHIPS HE WILL ENDURE AS A RESULT OF THEIR PROGRAM.
THEN BRIEFLY QUICKLY RECAP YOUR BENEFITS FOR HIM.

PRINCIPLE No.5:

DO NOT GET BORED USING THE SAME SPEECH ALL OF THE TIME.
AT THIS LATE DATE YOU HAVE TO DRIVE IT HOME AND LOCK THE
BARN. REMEMBER THAT AFTER YOUR OPPONENT,S REBUTTAL YOU
HAVE TO REFILL THE TARGET AUDIENCE'S MEMORY JUST LIKE IT
WAS TO KEEP THEM FROM BECOMING CONFUSED. IF YOU VARY OR
SWITCH MORE THAN ONE KEY POINT AT ANY GIVEN TIME THE VOTER
WILL BE CONFUSED AT DECISION TIME.

PRINCIPLE No.6:

DO NOT GET DISTRACTED BY COMMENTING ON MINOR ISSUES AND
POINTS AND AVOID BEING PULLED INTO DEBATES ON SMALL
ISSUES EITHER BY THE OPPONENT OR THE PRESS. IT JUST FILLS
THE PROPECTS MEMORY AND CONFUSES THE KEY ISSUES AT
DECISION TIME.

PRINCIPLE No.7:

START OUT EACH MEETING OR SPEECH WITH NO MORE THAN 4 LINE
SUMMARY OF EACH KEY POINTS. AFTER DETAILING EACH THEN

CLOSE WITH THE SAME 3 LINES FOR EACH KEY ISSUE TO ERASE
ANY CONFUSION IN THE PROSPECTS'S MEMORY.

PRINCIPLE No.8: (In the event of Public matters and the media has failed to fully inform the public on the issues.)

YOU MUST INFORM THE PUBLIC THAT THE MEDIA HAS NOT DONE ITS JOB TO INFORM THEM. IF THERE IS ANY SUSPICION OF BIAS THEN YOU HAVE TO PUBLICLY CHARGE THEM WITH IT. DO NOT FALL FOR THE WEAK-KNEED THINKING THAT YOU DO NOT DARE MAKE THEM MAD. THEY ARE GOING TO DO YOU IN ANYWAY IF THEY CAN. WITH ENOUGH PRESSURE SOME MAY BACK OFF.

SPECIAL NOTES:

1. While on the way to Indiana's Congressman John Myers' recent outing Mr. Bob Brinker of Cal. advised his radio audience that a House Bill had been brought up for consideration that reduces the Estate Tax Exemption from \$600,000 down to \$250,000.

Dear President Bush:

After learning of the formation of the Americans with Disabilities Coalition to support Bush-Quayle '92, and hearing your citation in the inaugural debate last night of the ADA as the highest legislative achievement of your administration, it struck me as an astounding paradox to receive the attached copy of a letter from Evan Kemp to a patient served by MDA who'd challenged Kemp's assault upon our Association over the past several months. I've since received another copy of the letter, that one to a Virginia state senator, implying that Kemp is using it as a form reply.

Obviously, you're vitally interested in the support of disabled persons. I wonder if it doesn't strike you too as a paradox that the man you've renominated as an EEOC commissioner, and whom you've indicated you'd reappoint as chairman, in effect thumbs his nose at you on network television and in personal/"official" correspondence. I say "thumbs his nose" because, as Kemp himself acknowledged on ABC-TV's "PrimeTime Live," you've repeatedly admonished him to cease his attack on MDA, its Telethon, and its national chairman, Jerry Lewis. Clearly, Kemp is making a mockery of your credibility among the millions who support and are served by our Association -- certainly impairing the effort represented by the formation of the Coalition and your remarks about the ADA last night.

Moreover, he appears to be continuing his attack on MDA in a manner that's both more malicious and more disingenuous than even his past attempts to subvert our effort. As you'll read in the attached, he says on the one hand that he's "never attacked or demeaned the organization," only to contradict that statement immediately by indicating that he's "been critical of the technique MDA has used to raise funds" since the mid-seventies. All this, Kemp says, is by way of clarifying "the misunderstanding that has been created by . . . MDA."

Whether out of sheer malice or ignorance, Kemp ignores the fact that perhaps no public presentation of people with disabilities in the history of the world has ever more positively represented them than did our Labor Day Telethon this year which, in addition to numerous high achievers with disabilities, featured your Coalition member Sandra Swift Parrino. Also appearing on the show were many members of MDA's Task Force on Public on Public Awareness, a panel of distinguished leaders with disabilities, biographical information on whom is appended. In addition, the 50 state MDA Personal Achievement Award winners were acknowledged during the broadcast and five of them were presented in individual segments during the show. The National Personal Achievement Award winner was Stephen Mikita, who spoke

movingly of the important role Jerry Lewis has played in his life. Mikita is the Assistant Attorney General of the State of Utah.

Nonetheless, Kemp continues the Big Lie that our show reinforces "a mistaken view that all persons with disabilities are helplessly dependent -- mere objects of pity -- with no ambition or ability to take control of their lives and become contributing members of the community." As if that weren't enough, he actually has the incredible temerity to accuse Jerry Lewis and MDA of undermining the civil rights of persons with disabilities.

This is no small matter. The effort of MDA that Evan Kemp seeks to subvert has great consequence for our entire society, both the disabled and able-bodied. This morning's announcement that two MDA research grantees have won this year's Nobel Prize for Medicine is surely graphic evidence of that. Millions care intensely about the success of MDA's effort. If you want to count on their support on November 3rd, that may require more forthright action from you regarding Mr. Kemp's misbehavior than you've taken thus far.

With gratitude for the help you and Mrs. Bush have given us in the past by meeting with our national poster children . . . and much regret that we must write letters of this sort.

I appreciate your writing me directly about your concerns regarding my position on Jerry Lewis and the Muscular Dystrophy Telethon. I welcome the chance to clarify the misunderstanding that has been created by the media and the Muscular Dystrophy Association (MDA).

I am not out to get the MDA. I recognize the tremendous contributions that Jerry Lewis and the MDA Telethons have made in the fight against neuromuscular disease, and I earnestly support MDA's attempts to help fund direct services and medical research.

My family helped to found the MDA, and I have never attacked or demeaned the organization. I am well aware of the contribution MDA has made in the fight against neuromuscular disease. However, since the mid-70's I have been critical of the techniques that the MDA has used to raise funds for their activities.

I simply see no reason that the appeals for donations must reinforce a mistaken view that all persons with disabilities are helplessly dependent--mere objects of pity--with no ambition or ability to take control of their lives and become contributing members of the community.

My aim has been to convince Jerry Lewis and the MDA to reinforce, rather than undermine, the civil rights of persons with disabilities. I hope to convince Jerry Lewis and the MDA, when they appeal for donations, that they can join the disability rights movement at no risk to their fund-raising. Indeed, if they do so, they will probably raise more money for the worthy causes we all support.

Americans are not going to stop giving when they learn that their donations are going to people who, like everyone else, resent being treated as objects of pity, who have the same desire as everyone else to lead independent, responsible lives, and who desire to minimize their dependency as much as possible. Both the Easter Seals Society and United Cerebral Palsy Association have abandoned the pity approach with no harm to their fund-raising. Why cannot Jerry Lewis and the MDA Telethon do the same?

Everyone in the disability community agrees that the single greatest obstacle is the attitude of those who assume that people with disabilities cannot compete and do not belong in everyday society. It is this attitude of being different, of somehow not being fully human, that saps people's resolve to take charge of their lives, and leads others to treat people with disabilities prejudicially, as objects of charity to be pitied and not to be taken seriously.

Such stereotyping, which the pity approach reinforces, leads to all kinds of discrimination, for example, theater owners denying admission to people with disabilities, restaurateurs refusing service to persons with disabilities, employers rejecting the applications of persons with disabilities. For why should an employer hire someone who, admired public figures on the Telethon tell them, is really helpless? Indeed, one of the major objectives of the Americans with Disabilities Act of 1990 (ADA) is to address through a civil rights approach the barriers, including attitudinal barriers, that people with disabilities must confront.

Because of the threat it poses to people leading productive, fulfilling lives, the "pity" approach has no place in our society. That is why for years I have criticized this manner of raising money by charitable organizations. To portray an individual with a disability--any disability--as someone who must be pitied and taken care of is to perpetuate an inaccurate and unfair stereotype.

I am the Presidential appointee in charge of the lead federal agency responsible for enforcing equal employment opportunity laws, including the ADA. As Chairman of the U.S. Equal Employment Opportunity Commission (EEOC) I have neither the time nor the interest to deeply involve myself in any MDA activities. However, it is my duty as Chairman of EEOC to speak out against attitudes that threaten to undermine the philosophy and goals of the civil rights laws it is the Commission's duty to enforce.

Since the MDA Telethon is viewed annually by millions of Americans, Jerry Lewis and the MDA organization have a wonderful opportunity to educate the public and to make it aware of the accomplishments and potential contributions of people with disabilities.

Charitable appeals must play to the strength of character to which all people aspire--to make the best of their lot--the can-do spirit with which all Americans can identify.

TASK FORCE ON PUBLIC AWARENESS

The Task Force on Public Awareness is made up of people who are leaders in their communities and achievers in fields such as education, medicine, communications, law, marketing and computers who have as their common goal support of MDA's research and patient service programs and are affected by a neuromuscular disorder.

The voluntary group serves as a sounding board for MDA on issues related to accessibility for people with disabilities. As a group and as individuals, they represent the Association to the news media and educate the public about MDA's activities.

Many of the Task Force members are leaders of and participants in civic and business advisory groups that help set policy and advocate for people with disabilities. Following their example, similar task forces are being formed in each of MDA's 162 chapters across the country.

After its initial meeting, the MDA Task Force on Public Awareness determined the major focus of its mission would be to help publicize the research and patient services provided by MDA in behalf of more than a million Americans affected by 40 neuromuscular diseases.

MEMBERS OF TASK FORCE ON PUBLIC AWARENESS

William W. Altaffer

Bill Altaffer is a Tucson, Ariz., attorney with a special interest in equal access for everyone, including people with disabilities. He occasionally serves as a court-appointed arbitrator in civil actions.

Altaffer, 33, earned his law degree from the University of Arizona College of Law. He lives in Tucson with his wife in a wheelchair-accessible home they designed. He's involved with the Americans Friends Service Committee and the World Peace through Law Section of the Arizona Bar Association, and is on the advisory committee of the Arizona Council for Economic Conversion.

At the law firm of Strickland & Altaffer, he served as associate general counsel to three Indian nations, interpreting constitutions and helping draft environmental legislation.

Altaffer has type III spinal muscular atrophy, also known as Kugelberg-Welander disease, which first appeared in childhood. The progressive condition involves weakness in the leg, hip, shoulder, arm and respiratory muscles.

Tedde Scharf

Tedde Scharf is associate director of Disabled Student Resources at Arizona State University in Tempe. ASU's program for students with disabilities is one of the country's largest, serving more than 1,000 students each year. Scharf previously directed a support program for disabled students at the University of Northern Colorado in Greeley.

Scharf, 49, is a long-time advocate for people with disabilities; her activities include public relations, speaking and administering student services in the areas of housing, transportation, personal care, education and career development. Her professional associations include AHSSPPE (Association of Handicap Student Service Programs in Post-Secondary Education) and A Bridge to Independent Living (ABIL). She is on the board of directors of National Focus, a disability newspaper, and a consultant for Passy and Passy, Inc., which manufactures speaking valves.

She has a master's degree in special education and rehabilitation from the University of Northern Colorado.

Scharf, who is ventilator dependent, has limb-girdle muscular dystrophy, which was diagnosed when she was 8 years old. The disorder involves weakness and wasting of the muscles in the shoulder and pelvic girdles.

Previously a corporate member of MDA, Scharf was elected to MDA's Board of Directors in 1992.

Geni Cavitt

Besides her broadcast duties on KFMB-AM, San Diego radio personality Geni Cavitt serves as co-host of the San Diego segment of the MDA Jerry Lewis Labor Day Telethon. In addition, she emcees many local fund-raising events for MDA and other health-related organizations.

Cavitt, 40, lives in Carlsbad, Calif., with her husband and daughter. She serves on the executive committee of MDA's San Diego chapter.

In 1991, she was honored as volunteer of the year for the Combined Health Agency Drive in her community, a fund-raising program for more than a dozen nonprofit agencies.

Cavitt has myasthenia gravis, an autoimmune disease that causes weakness and fatigue of muscles of the eyes, face, neck, throat, limbs and/or trunk. She has benefited from a thymectomy and other treatment. Her condition was diagnosed in 1985.

Jack F. Epling

Jack Epling is a real estate and financial professional with a real estate firm. Epling, 60, previously worked for the railroad and served as local chairman of the Transportation Clerks Union. He lives in Diamond Bar, Calif., is married and has four children.

For his work with MDA and other community activities, Epling received a civic and community award from the Whittier Board of Realtors. He also ran events for Special Olympics for several years, taught religion in juvenile halls and youth training for minority groups through the Archdiocese of Los Angeles.

Epling has limb-girdle muscular dystrophy, which was diagnosed in 1970. The disorder involves weakness and wasting of the muscles in the shoulder and pelvic girdles.

Dr. Arnold D. Gale

Arnold Gale, M.D., is a consulting neurologist with the U.S. Department of Health and Human Services Division of Vaccine Injury, Stanford University. He commutes monthly from his home in Santa Clara, Calif., to Washington, D.C., where he serves as a consultant for the U.S. Government Office of the Department of Health and Human Services.

Dr. Gale, 42, was drawn to neurology because of his neuromuscular disease and because of friends and relatives who were affected by neurological disorders. He earned his bachelor's degree from Stanford University and his M.D. at Johns Hopkins University School of Medicine. He was previously on the faculty of the George Washington University School of Medicine and Health Sciences as well as director of the neurology training program at Children's Hospital National Medical Center in Washington, D.C.

His perspective as both a physician and a person with a neuromuscular disease has made Dr. Gale an effective leader of MDA's adult support group in San Jose. He's also a member of the Advisory Committee of MDA's Mission Counties Chapter.

Dr. Gale has fascioscapulohumeral muscular dystrophy, a progressive condition initially involving weakness of the muscles of the face, shoulders and upper arms.

Dr. Gale was named a national vice president of MDA in 1992. Vice presidents offer the Association advice and assistance in their areas of expertise.

Matthew Schuman

Matt Schuman of Greeley, Colo., works as a sports reporter for the Greeley Tribune, covering Greeley High School sports and the Denver Broncos.

A former MDA Colorado State Poster Child for six years, Schuman fought for several years to be mainstreamed in the public schools, achieving his goal before his high school graduation. He holds a degree in journalism from the University of Northern Colorado in Greeley.

Schuman, 28, is a member of the Greeley Jaycees and a former board member of the Northern Colorado Center on Deafness. An active speaker for MDA, Schuman is MDA's 1992 Personal Achievement Award winner for Colorado.

Schuman has type I spinal muscular atrophy, which was diagnosed when he was an infant. The progressive condition leads to generalized muscle weakness and paralysis of the limbs.

Shelley C. Obrand

Shelley Obrand, 33, is an education program director at NOVA University in Fort Lauderdale, Fla. She directs a program for children with learning disabilities and advises graduate students and classroom teachers.

She strives to impart to student teachers the need for patience, understanding, persistence and confidence. She sees herself as a mentor to student teachers and learning-disabled students, and has inspired many students to achieve their goals despite their disabilities.

Obrand has a master's degree in specific learning disabilities and an educational specialist degree in primary education. She lives in Hollywood Hills, Fla. She's a frequent speaker for MDA and has been featured on local segments of the Jerry Lewis Labor Day Telethon.

Obrand has a form of muscular dystrophy, which leads to generalized muscle weakness and wasting.

Clyde R. Appling Jr.

Clyde Appling, 42, works as director of Grants and Contracts at Georgia State University in Atlanta. During his 22 years with the university, he's been an integral part of its accessibility planning and implementation. He serves as a mentor to students, and is on GSU's affirmative action committee and the handicapped assistance program.

Appling has a bachelor's degree in accounting and an M.B.A. in finance. His hobbies include reading, sporting events and boating. He lives in Cumming, Ga.

Appling has type III spinal muscular atrophy, which was diagnosed when he was 10 years old. The progressive condition involves weakness in the leg, hip, shoulder, arm and respiratory muscles.

Mark T. Obatake

Mark Obatake is executive director of the Hawaii Centers for Independent Living. A resident of Waipahu on the island of Oahu, he was for five years patient services coordinator for MDA's Honolulu office.

Obatake, 33, holds a bachelor's degree in human development and a master's in social work from the University of Hawaii. As a student, he interned at several rehabilitation and development programs.

An active participant in community organizations, Obatake currently serves on the Governor's Commission on Persons with Disabilities, the State Independent Living Council, the Community Long Term Care Advisory Council and the Goodwill Industries Board of Directors.

Obatake has intermediate spinal muscular atrophy, which causes weakness in the arms, legs and torso.

James Robert Tillman

Jim Tillman owns and operates Replay Computer Co. in Evanston, Ill.

Previously a personnel manager and a theater management executive, Jim decided to change careers in 1985. He earned certification in computers at Triton College in River Grove, Ill., and launched his business. His services include preparing databases, mailing lists and resumes.

Tillman, 47, has a bachelor's degree in business administration from New Jersey State University. He enjoys bank fishing. His activities with MDA include volunteering at MDA summer camp and coordinating a pledge center for the Jerry Lewis Labor Day Telethon. He is president of MDA's Chicago Cook County Chapter.

Tillman has adult spinal muscular atrophy, which was diagnosed in his 30s. The slowly progressive condition involves weakness in the arms and legs.

Roy Miller

Roy Miller, 38, is a microcomputer analyst with St. Anthony's Medical Center in Crown Point, Ind. As a child, he was one of the first disabled students in his community to attend a public school. He holds bachelor's degrees in history from Purdue University and in information systems from Indiana University.

Miller, who lives in Merrillville, has long been involved in organizations to benefit people with disabilities. He serves on local and state boards on accessibility issues and as a consultant on attitude awareness.

Interested in motorcycles all his life, Miller has a bike especially designed for him by American Bikers Aimed Toward Education (ABATE) of Indiana with a transmission donated by Harley-Davidson. He's active in ABATE, an MDA sponsor group, and has been featured on the MDA Jerry Lewis Labor Day Telethon. He was cited in 1984 by the U.S. Department of Education for providing special counseling for people with disabilities.

Miller is affected by Charcot-Marie-Tooth disease, a disorder of the peripheral nerves that leads to atrophy of muscles in the hands and lower legs.

Regina Lee

Regina Lee of New Carrollton, Md., owns and operates The Scribe, a word processing business providing a variety of typing services and maintenance of mailing lists. In addition, she is a successful Amway distributor.

A former employee of the U.S. Department of Housing and Urban Development, Lee, 36, also worked for the Information Protection and Advocacy Center for Handicapped Individuals, counseling youthful offenders, Hispanics and people with disabilities on their rights. She has assisted the Maryland National Rehabilitation Center by allowing them to videotape her working in her accessible home office.

In 1980, Lee was first-runner-up in the Miss Wheelchair District of Columbia Pageant. In 1989, she was a contestant in the Miss Wheelchair Maryland Pageant.

Lee has been involved in MDA activities for 10 years and is secretary of her local chapter's executive committee. She has appeared on television and radio talk shows.

Lee has limb-girdle muscular dystrophy, a progressive, muscle-wasting disease that affects the shoulder girdle and pelvic girdle.

George Donahue

George Donahue works with major shoe retailers as a telemarketing sales representative for the Sperry Top-Sider Division of Stride Rite Corp. in Cambridge, Mass.

President of the Greater Boston Chapter of MDA, Donahue, 37, is also a member of Stride Rite's Americans with Disabilities Task Force. He regularly gives interactive presentations on living with disability, which includes informal panel discussions and audience participation.

Donahue's interests include making videotapes, writing science fiction, participating in community theater and scuba diving.

Donahue has Charcot-Marie-Tooth disease, a disorder of the peripheral nerves that leads to atrophy of muscles in the hands and lower legs.

Clarence Moorer

Clarence Moorer, 43, is a computer programmer with the IRS Data Center in Detroit. He earned a B.S. degree in math from Wayne State University in 1971.

Moorer has served on the Detroit Drug Task Force Volunteers and tutors children in math and English. He also was a union representative on the local Equal Employment Opportunity committee from 1984 to 1989. He's helped at local MDA Telethon pledge centers and at MDA summer camp.

His hobbies include chess, watching sports, travel and music.

Moorer has type III spinal muscular atrophy. The progressive condition involves weakness in the leg, hip, shoulder, arm and respiratory muscles.

Ronald Biss

Ron Biss is an administrative assistant for National School Bus Services in the greater Minneapolis-St. Paul metropolitan area. He lives in Bloomington, Minn., and has worked as a farmer and owned a marketing business.

Biss, 50, is involved in a number of community organizations dealing with accessibility for people with disabilities. He is chairman of Bloomington's Office of Special Services and sits on the office's Architectural Barrier Removal Committee. In that capacity, Biss was instrumental in designing an accessible two-mile trail in a new park.

He's also treasurer for the United Handicapped Federation, an advocacy group; a member of the Community Education Advisory Board for the Bloomington School District; and a member of the Bloomington Leadership Program of the Chamber of Commerce.

MDA presented Biss its 1992 Minnesota Personal Achievement Award for his many volunteer activities. He's treasurer of his MDA chapter and involved in patient service committees and the Jerry Lewis Labor Day Telethon. Biss facilitates MDA's parent support group and has volunteered for 10 years at MDA summer camp.

Biss has limb-girdle muscular dystrophy, which was diagnosed when he was 23. The disorder involves weakness and wasting of the muscles in the shoulder and pelvic girdles.

Lori Hinderer

Lori Hinderer, 30, offers home-based telemarketing and referral services to St. Louis area businesses. She sells headset telephones for people with disabilities and a diet product.

An avid letter writer, Hinderer speaks out on issues of accessibility for people with disabilities. Her testimony before a state senate subcommittee in 1990 was instrumental in passing the Missouri Comprehensive Health Insurance Pool.

Long active as a volunteer with MDA, Hinderer is chairperson of the local patient service committee and a member of the Mississippi Valley Chapter Executive Committee. She helps coordinate the local Jerry Lewis Labor Day Telethon. This year, Hinderer received local and state Personal Achievement Awards from MDA.

Her interests include traveling for business and pleasure.

Hinderer has muscular dystrophy, which was diagnosed when she was 4 years old. A sister also has the disorder, which involves muscle weakness and wasting.

Hinderer was elected a national MDA vice president in 1992. Vice presidents offer the Association advice and assistance in their areas of expertise.

Chris Rosa

Chris Rosa, 25, is a graduate student working toward a doctorate in sociology at the Graduate Center of the City University of New York. He's writing his dissertation on "The Culture of Disability."

Rosa, who lives in Flushing, N.Y., graduated Phi Beta Kappa from Queens College with a double major in sociology and philosophy. His activities include coaching basketball for the Catholic Youth Organization and teaching at the graduate center.

As a recently appointed consumer representative on the New York State Independent Living Advisory Council, Rosa is involved in making policy recommendations to state agencies dealing with people with disabilities. In 1992, he received MDA's regional Special Achievement Award for exemplifying courage, determination and dedication to MDA and the community.

Rosa has Becker muscular dystrophy, a slowly progressing, muscle-wasting disease. His condition was diagnosed when he was 9; a brother also has Becker muscular dystrophy.

Paul Jason "P.J." Dixon

P.J. Dixon, a senior at Wright State University in Dayton, Ohio, is active in a number of campus organizations. President of the Downhillers Ski Club and captain of the Wheelchair Intramural Football Team, he is also on the advisory council for Handicapped Intramural Sports and Recreation.

In 1989, Dixon, 22, was inducted into the Hall of Fame for Persons with Disabilities. He works as a disc jockey for radio station WWSU and teaches a taijutsu self-defense class in the university's theater department. An international studies major, he plans a career in international service.

Dixon, who lives in Galena, Ohio, was featured on the 1991 Jerry Lewis Labor Day Telethon for MDA. He served as MDA's Ohio State Poster Child in 1978-79 and has helped emcee the local segments of the Telethon for 10 years.

Dixon earned the rank of Eagle Scout and is a Vigil Honor Member of the Boy Scouts' Order of the Arrow.

Dixon has Charcot-Marie-Tooth disease, a highly variable progressive disease that results in atrophy of the muscles of the hands and lower legs. His condition was diagnosed at age 2.

David Klock

David Klock, 37, is an electronics engineer at the Naval Air Warfare Center, Aircraft Division, in Warminster, Pa. He lives in Warrington.

Klock's activities include serving as a deacon in the New Life Presbyterian Church in Fort Washington. Through his job, he's a member of his department's Equal Employment Opportunity committee and a representative on the Navy's EEO Committee on Accessibility Issues.

His St. Bernard-Rotweiler, Candy, is being trained as a helping dog, learning to open doors, pick up dropped objects, answer the phone and help Dave with exercise and walking. Klock and Candy have participated in an MDA K-9 walk, and he is also involved in an MDA support group.

Klock has facioscapulohumeral muscular dystrophy, which involves weakness of muscles of the face, shoulders, upper arms and legs. His condition was diagnosed when he was 12 years old.

David Whited

David Whited is a Protestant clergyman who has served several congregations. A resident of Nashville, Tenn., he's currently involved in many activities to benefit people with disabilities.

Calling himself a "quiet activist who loves to educate," Whited, 44, frequently speaks about attitudinal barriers and living with disabilities before local business and community groups. He's also involved in Nashville CARES (Council on AIDS Research Education and Service), a local voluntary health agency.

Whited is active in the Nashville, Tenn., MDA chapter. He participates in local Telethon segments and edits the chapter newsletter. He recruits and helps orient volunteer counselors for MDA summer camp.

He was educated at Volunteer State Community College in Gallatin, Tenn.; Berean College of the Bible, Springfield, Mo.; and Southeastern College of the Assemblies of God in Lakeland, Fla.

Whited received MDA's Personal Achievement Award for Mid-Tennessee this year. He has also represented MDA with the Mayor's Office for Handicapped Persons.

Whited has type III spinal muscular atrophy, also known as Kugelberg-Welander disease, which first appeared when he was an infant. The progressive condition involves weakness in the leg, hip, shoulder, arm and respiratory muscles.

Barry H. Goldberg

Barry Goldberg works as director of marketing services for AMR Information Services Inc., a sister company of American Airlines, based in Fort Worth, Texas. He lives in Plano with his wife and son, and has a married daughter.

He currently performs his marketing duties from his home-based office with the assistance of equipment provided by AMR.

Goldberg, 45, was featured on the 1991 Jerry Lewis Labor Day Telethon. An eloquent public speaker, he participates in many events for MDA. He was a featured speaker at MDA's National Development Conference in 1991.

Goldberg has amyotrophic lateral sclerosis, commonly known as Lou Gehrig's disease. This progressive condition destroys nerves controlling voluntary movement and leads to wasting and weakness of all body muscles. ALS results in total paralysis, and the average life expectancy is five years after diagnosis.

Scott F. Schneider

President of the Schneider Design Studio in Houston, Scott Schneider earned his B.F.A. from the Ringling School of Art and Design in Sarasota, Fla. His business, opened in 1983, is a successful graphic arts and interior design firm.

An all-around athlete, Schneider has won gold, silver and bronze medals in track and field in the 1984 International Games for the Disabled and the 1988 Paralympics. He's been active in skiing, canoeing, wheelchair basketball and soccer. He served on the executive committee for MDA's America's Love Run program.

Schneider credits recent advances in MDA-funded research as instrumental in his and his wife's decision to give birth to their daughter last year.

Schneider, 35, was voted one of America's Outstanding Young Men for 1981 and 1983.

Schneider has Becker muscular dystrophy, a slowly progressing condition that has caused muscle wasting in his legs and back. His condition was diagnosed when he was 14.

Schneider has been an MDA corporate member and was elected a national vice president of the Association in 1991. Vice presidents offer the Association advice and assistance in their areas of expertise.

David A. Sheffield

David Sheffield, county attorney-elect in Hardin County, Texas, lives in Silsbee with his wife and stepdaughter. He's served as first assistant district attorney for the county, as well as chief legal counsel and chief prosecutor of the Southeast Texas Narcotics and Intelligence Task Force.

Sheffield, 29, earned his undergraduate degree at Lamar University in Beaumont, Texas. Determined to be self-supporting, he transported his iron lung to the University of Mississippi and slept in it every night while studying for his law degree.

Sheffield is active in the Silsbee Jaycees and Silsbee Chamber of Commerce. Featured on the 1991 Jerry Lewis Labor Day Telethon, he's a frequent speaker for MDA.

Sheffield has a neuromuscular disorder similar to limb-girdle muscular dystrophy, which involves weakness and wasting of the voluntary and respiratory muscles.

Sheffield was named a national MDA vice president in 1992. Vice presidents offer the Association advice and assistance in their areas of expertise.

Kristi Hansen

Kristi Hansen is a civic leader in her community of Mount Lake Terrace, Wash., a suburb of Seattle. In 1991, she was elected to the Mount Lake Terrace City Council, defeating an incumbent by a 16 percent margin. One of her interests is opposing pornography in her community.

Hansen, 31, received a degree in psychology from the University of Washington in 1984 and worked as a GED teacher before being elected to the council. She lives with her husband and 4-year-old daughter. Hansen lifts weights and exercises to maintain her upper body strength.

Hansen has Friedreich's ataxia, a disease of the peripheral nerves that impairs limb coordination and involves muscle weakness and loss of sensation. Her condition was diagnosed when she was 13 years old.
