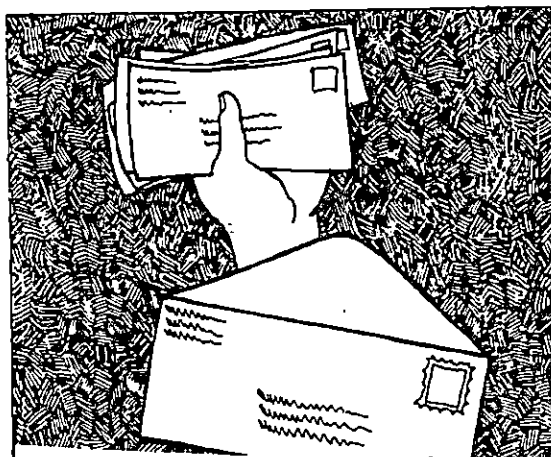

Dear Mr. Baker:

of or understands it.

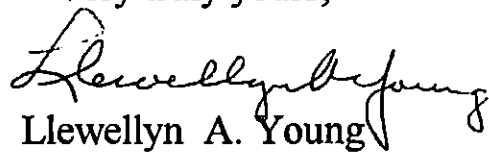
The hot winds of war have not cooled sufficiently to give up a great

Incidentally many of the Roosevelt plans were declared
unconstitutional. President Bush was not responsible for the turndown
in the economy. It would have happened no matter who was
President. This is a hard fact to sell but is true.

I am a great supporter of President Bush and hope he wins the
election. I also hope the information contained herein can be of some

Most people are taking beatings on vacation real estate, but some U.S. congressmen are about to score big by flipping their Caribbean island.

Shrewd timing?

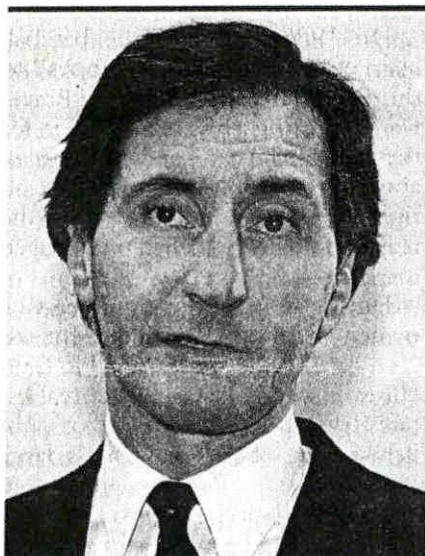
PIERRES ISLAND is a 17-acre Caribbean hideaway off the northern tip of Eleuthera, 55 miles north of Nassau, in the Bahamas. For the last two years Pierres Island has been owned by eight U.S. congressmen and eight of their friends. The group is now poised to flip the property for a big profit.

Organizer of the "Pierredise" deal is Representative Robert J. Mrazek (D-N.Y.), 45, a five-term congressman from Nassau and Suffolk counties on Long Island. He says he saw an ad for the island, flew down in early 1988 with Representative Tom Downey (D-N.Y.), fell in love with the place and cut a deal on the spot to buy it for \$475,000.

Mrazek then assembled an investor group of politically influential "friends." Among them: Senator Albert Gore Jr. (D-Tenn.); Representatives William Lehman (D-Fla.), Butler Derrick (D-S.C.), John Bryant (D-Tex.), Edward F. Feighan (D-Ohio), C. Thomas McMillan (D-Md.) and Matthew F. McHugh (D-N.Y.).

Although the group took possession in August 1988, the plan to buy the Bahamian property wasn't revealed until after the 1988 elections. Formal Bahamian approval came the very day of the election, and the purchase closed in January 1989.

Nice deal. Only nine months after it closed, Mrazek and company had a contract to sell the island for \$870,000—twice what they paid for it. Mrazek says the original plan was to use the island as a private resort and a source of rental income, but the group decided to sell, he says, because the upkeep was too much hassle. In

the brief time that the group owned the property, the partners rarely visited it, and it was rented for only a couple of weeks.

The proposed buyer is Geoffrey D. Brunning, an English-born Atlanta home builder and Caribbean hotel developer. If the deal closes, Mrazek will get about \$100,000 for the 25% stake he got for \$7,500—a nice addition to the war chest he may be building, reportedly to challenge Alphonse D'Amato (R-N.Y.) for D'Amato's Senate seat next year.

But Mrazek hasn't yet got the profit—and he may never get it. A number of coincidences regarding the sale have caught the attention of lawyers at the Justice Department and Department of Energy. And the Bahamian government has dragged its feet on

okaying the sale to Brunning.

Coincidence number one: The Bahamian company Mrazek says he had formed to buy Pierres is Douglas & Chamberlain Ltd., named, he says, after two of his Civil War heroes, about whom he wrote an unaired TV documentary in 1985. The coincidence is that a scant 5 miles from Pierres Island is the hamlet of Spanish Wells and "Seagate," the sprawling oceanside mansion of a fugitive from U.S. justice named Bartlett B. Chamberlain Jr., owner of Douglas Oil Purchasing Corp. Chamberlain, now 77, is wanted for dodging a \$26 million federal judgment and an arrest warrant for contempt of court. He is hiding out in Switzerland and reneged on an offer to be interviewed there by FORBES.

The claims against Chamberlain date to the early 1970s, when he and New York fuel merchant Edward Carey used hard-to-get export licenses and a Bahamian refinery to make millions from skirting federal oil price rules and the Arab oil embargo. In 1987 an appeals court ruled Chamberlain was personally liable for the oil overcharges, plus interest. He now owes the government \$26 million, with interest running \$5,000 a day. Chamberlain skipped the country late in 1989 after losing his last appeal.

Before he went on the lam, Chamberlain was almost rescued by political friends. An unusual amendment was tacked on to a massive 1987 federal appropriations resolution that blocked the Energy Department from pursuing its judgment against him for nearly a year. About that time, the attorney for a federal receiver says, Chamberlain moved millions of dollars to the Bahamas, where he has close ties to one of the largest construction firms on Eleuthera. Eleuthera? That's where Brunning has pitched plans to build two big hotels.

Who was the pol who introduced the amendment that saved Chamberlain for a year? Senator Richard Shelby (D-Ala.). Final passage of the measure depended on Representative Sidney Yates (D-Ill.) as powerful chairman of the House appropriations subcommittee on energy. Yates was later offered a piece of the Pierres Island deal but declined.

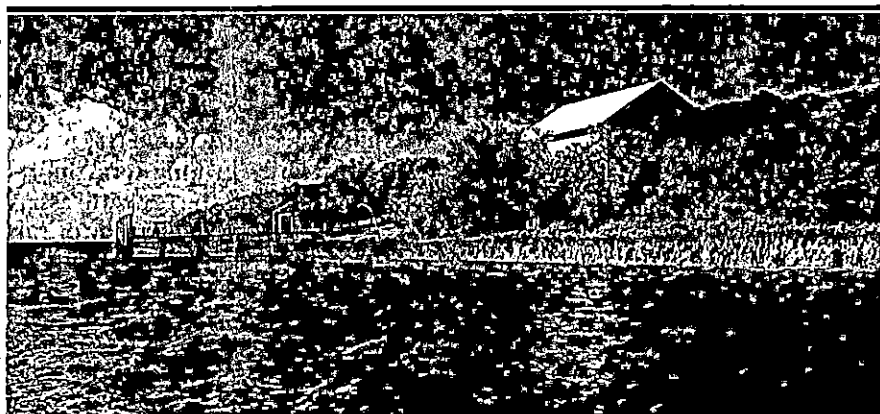
Coincidence number two involves

another Chamberlain association. Chamberlain's longtime business partners have been the Pack and Kahn families of New York, which founded and controlled Seatrain Lines Inc. Warren Pack, son of Seatrain founder Howard Pack, has been close friends with Chamberlain and a frequent visitor to Spanish Wells.

Throughout the 1980s, Seatrain, Warren Pack's Cove Shipping Co., other domestic shipping companies and their unions all waged a massive lobbying campaign to block other companies from copying a unique and immensely profitable arrangement

come. Mrazek insists he has never met or even heard of him—or Seatrain and the Packs. Mrazek also insists his involvement in the cause stemmed only from his ties to the shipping unions, who were his early and generous campaign donors.

Yet another Pierres investor is Representative Edward Feighan, a vocal critic of Bahamian efforts on drug control and particularly of Prime Minister Lynden Pindling, whom he has called "another General Noriega." Pindling chairs the Foreign Investments Board that okayed the congressmen's purchase of Pierres Island,

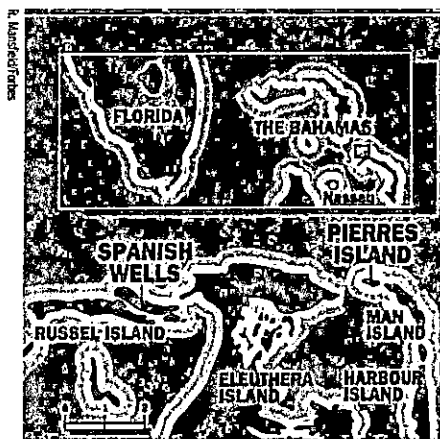


Pierres Island, near Spanish Wells

that Seatrain had with the U.S. Maritime Administration.

In their lobbying campaign, they got lots of help from Mrazek. A provision supporting their cause was made part of the same big 1987 appropriations act that helped out Chamberlain. Pierres investor Butler Derrick was also a player on the House Rules Committee, which put the shipping issue under William Lehman's control. Lehman, the powerful, irascible chairman of the House Appropriations Subcommittee on Transportation, was a key player. It turns out he was a schoolmate of Bart Chamberlain's at the University of Alabama in the early 1930s. Lehman denies any contact with Chamberlain since their school days and denies ever having heard of Seatrain or the Packs.

It's surprising how anonymous Bart Chamberlain seems to have be-



and which is now considering the resale to Brunning. In the past two sessions of Congress, Feighan has introduced bills that would have crippled the Bahamian economy. To say the least, Feighan's participation in a Bahamian deal looks queer at a time when he has been lambasting that country's government.

Maybe Pierres Island is just a simple real estate deal, as Robert Mrazek insists. Then again, there are all those coincidences.

Dear Mr. Strange:

This letter is in response to your letter dated September 9, 1992, concerning volunteer mediation panels in the area of family law. This letter is not a professional opinion, and does not reflect on any other person or organization other than myself. You may desire a more complete opinion from the Kansas Bar Association or other legal entities. This letter simply points out certain issues for you to consider.

First, one reason you advocate mediation panels is to reduce fees associated with litigation. The question raised in my mind is how the dispute will be argued before the panel. If counsel is allowed, then attorney fees are still present. The only reduced cost would be court fees. A somewhat less substantial amount of money as compared to attorney fees.

Yet to deny counsel in these situations would invite certain constitutional entanglements. Also, the issues involved in a family law dispute can be very technical. Property division and child custody are difficult issues that can easily be misunderstood without legal counsel.

Secondly, how binding is the mediation panel's decision? If every decision the panel handed down ended up being appealed to a court of law, the reasons for having the panel are substantially lessened. Yet to deny review of the panel's decision would again raise constitutional questions. Obviously the parties going in front of the panel would need to agree on the panel's authority. Especially given the fact the panel does not have a judge as recognized by the law.

There is also merit to your suggestion of volunteer mediation teams. Litigation is expensive and leads to ill feelings between the parties. It does often seem unfair the court system often treats family law issues in a "cold" manner. But to remove these issues to far from recognized legal authority also has its drawbacks. The law is a complicated field which should not be viewed lightly. It also can have serious consequences for those who misunderstand what the law says and does.

I wrote you earlier in this campaign. I
offer these additional observations and suggestions:

(1) Gov. Clinton is following a powerful
strategy of serving as father confessor/
psychologist to the country. He asks
people to tell him their most basic
concerns and fears, then tells them
what he feels they most want to
hear. It is a highly successful,

✓ (2) The President has still failed to

The following actions are required by the President to offset Clinton's message:

Mr. Baker:

As a Republican, I have watched with interest the President's, and your, efforts to restore his standing with the American people. I offer the following concepts for your consideration:

1. Emphasize the 92.4% of people that are working, rather than the 7.6% that are not. As for the charge that many adults have been forced to take minimum wage jobs, ask people to check for themselves the next time they go to their local McDonalds.
2. Stop saying "Recovery is just around the corner", even though it may be true.

This is the equivalent to saying "The check is in the mail." It's costing credibility.

3. Talk more about the tremendously difficult economic restructuring that must take place to make the U.S. more competitive globally. Remind people it will take some time. No one, not even the Democrats, can snap their fingers and make this happen. While Americans are extremely impatient, they will make and accept a sacrifice if they know the reasons for it.
4. Talk of a \$10 trillion economy is extremely positive. Give it time,
5. Republicans have been prone to over-inflate the positive results of the Reagan years. This makes them susceptible to ridicule and parody. Acknowledge the positive, i.e. curbing judicial excesses, the weakening of communism, etc., as well as some disappointments, i.e. business excesses, excessive federal debt, etc. It will

make you look reasonable, realistic, and able to face the facts.

6. Acknowledge more openly the successes and failures of the Bush years. Emphasize successes in Panama and the Gulf, etc., as well as some failures such as the slowness of the Administration to recognize the severity and extent of the economic slowdown (the source of most Americans' anger toward the President). Any talk of failures should be done in the most matter-of-fact manner, as if speaking of the weather. Americans do not want perfection in a President. They do want realism and honesty.

7. The phrase "invest in people" resonates powerfully in the American public. While probably no one could tell you exactly what that means, people really do seem to want to know someone cares about them. The phrase itself, unfortunately, without any action, has tremendous psychological meaning to people.

8. Republicans are in danger of cultivating a very negative image. The party must sometimes propose and support social legislation "supporting" people and not necessarily favoring business, i.e. the Family Leave Bill. While I did not support that bill, it would not have destroyed American business and would have given the party a more balanced image.
9. More frequently welcome women to the political process. Acknowledge they have been too long excluded. The Republican party badly needs to repair its image here.
10. Spell out more frequently the philosophical reasons behind political actions, i.e.
 - (a) the Thomas Appointment: to curb judicial excesses
 - (b) opposition to passage of the ERA: non-passage actually benefitted, and benefits, women by not allowing them to rely on legal means to achieve their ends. They're farther ahead because of their own efforts, unlike the blacks.

11. Acknowledge the environment more frequently. The generation of my parents (they're in, or would be in, their seventies) grew up in an era of less population, untapped natural resources, and economic hardship. For better or for worse, younger generations' affluence has given them the luxury of considering the environment in a different light.

12. ^{Emphasize} ~~Acknowledge~~ more frequently the divisiveness of the abortion issue. I would suggest that the President, despite his strong personal objections to abortion, state that the issue should be settled democratically. (I hope he does believe this.) Democracy is an American principle running deeper than any individual conviction. It forces abortion supporters to choose between an American principle and their own personal desires. I believe most democratic solutions will be along the lines of Pennsylvania.

I wish you the best in the rest of the campaign. One reason I believe Perot

has had such an impact is his realism. I believe the American public will respect the same in the President, along with his numerous and substantive achievements.

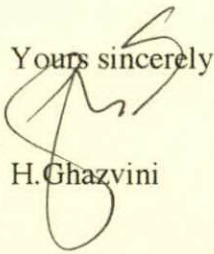

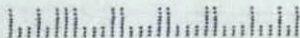

Dear Mr. Baker:

I am writing to you because of my concern that President Bush may not be re-elected.

It seems the American people need to be spoonfed to remember that with the successful conclusion of the cold war, at least for the time being, we are in a state of transition. For instance in California I heard that \$24 billion dollars less money that was spent on defense recently than in the previous year. Assuming an average salary is \$40,000 per year this would cause the loss of 600,000 jobs. I assume more thousands of jobs have been lost as a result of our ability to reduce defense expenditures.

The American public should be able to understand that while it is highly questionable if we could cope with the problems of a nuclear exchange, we can cope much more efficiently with economic problems. If the reduction of the nuclear threat is preferred to the transitional economical problems, people are better off than they were 4 years ago.

If a significant portion of the funds is no longer needed for defense expenditures, were utilized to rebuild the infrastructure, this would create thousands of jobs. If job re-training programs were implemented, this could assist people formerly employed in the defense industry.

I think the American public needs to be repeatedly reminded that the change proposed by our presidential opposition is for higher taxes and more spending. I cannot believe there are many people who do not think we are already taxed too much.

I would like to suggest President Bush should not paint all attorneys with the same brush just as he should not want, as a politician, to be compared with all politicians.

The Reagan-Bush policies hastened the collapse of communism and the end of the cold war. But at home only the rich have truly prospered. The middle class is hurting, the poor are poorer, inequality has grown and the country's ability to compete has been hindered by an undistinguished education system and widespread inattention to the problems of those caught in the backwash of the West's victory over the "evil empire."

So the nation seems ready for change, although fear of it—and of the untested newcomer who would lead it—still gives some hope to Bush. A majority may yet decide, in Reagan's phrase, that America's future is too important "to be trusted to a blind date." Enough may agree again with what Bush said four years ago: "Maybe there is an old-shoe familiarity. People will give me credit because, see, I've been through the mill."

Which is exactly what Bush is trying to put Clinton through right now; the Republicans, who have owned the White House, with the exception of the Carter hiatus, since 1968, are not inclined to yield easily.

As the President again demonstrates day night, no punch is being pulled. He has labeled this year's campaign the "toughest" he has ever seen, but it has borrowed a tactic from the early 1970s: Richard Nixon to imply that Clinton, a student, was tainted by communism.

No wonder so many voters are sour, numbed and disaffected by a long procession of public charges and countercharges, photographs and television filings by nonstop campaigners at Clinton's heels. A disenchantment bordering on bitterness consumes the public, and toward the whole punishing business.

How did the campaign get to this point, and what might the homestretch be?

A year ago, Bush was headed for re-election. Serious Democrats urged him to wait till the Constitution required the President from seeking a second term. Believing that anything was better than opposition's second string filled in.

At the beginning, no one had a hand, and each reasoned that the loss was the ticket to a more chance next time. Clinton, the winner, was hobbled by character, his own making, and fumbled r

I believe that the most powerful argument against Gov. Clinton is to take on his opposition to nuclear power. I have heard him say that as President he would seek to shut down existing nuclear power plants and put a total stop to the nuclear power program. This would be disastrous:

Almost 25% of our electricity now comes from nuclear plants, 112 of them with 8 more under construction, saving America 4-BILLION barrels of oil and \$114-billion in foreign oil payments since 1973. If our nuclear plants were shut down, it would increase oil imports by ONE MILLION barrels per day, DOUBLING our oil imports. Amax, Coral encouraged by Robertson intercepts

VANCOUVER — Assay results were released by Coral Gold (VSE) from the latest round of drilling on the Robertson joint venture gold property at Crescent Valley, Nev.

Three of five holes drilled by partner Amax Gold (NYSE) intersected encouraging gold values from the 39A zone, or central core area, which encompasses the zone and two open pits from a previous mining operation.

The drilling returned 130 ft. grading 0.087 oz. gold per ton, 245 ft. of 0.084 oz. gold and 135 ft. of 0.056 oz. gold, higher grade

The 39A zone remains open for expansion to both the north-east and southwest.

Assay results were also released from drilling in the Porphyry zone east of the leach pad, which remains open in nearly all directions.

The Robertson property is north of Placer Dome's Pipeline gold discovery.

Nevada major U.S. gold producer

Nevada accounts for 60% of gold produced in the U.S. and about 9% of world production, according to the Nevada Bureau of Mines and Geology.

In 1991, the state produced 5.8 million oz. gold worth US\$2.13 billion, a 1% decline in amount and a 3% decline in value from 1990.

At the end of 1991, Nevada gold reserves totalled around 135 million oz., up slightly from 1990. Existing reserves are probably sufficient to sustain gold mining at present levels in Nevada for 20 years.

The trend of finding more gold than is mined is not likely to continue much longer as there has been a sharp decline in exploration activity since 1988. Low gold prices, uncertainties regarding access to federal lands and increasingly more restrictive government regulations are the major causes of the decline in ex-

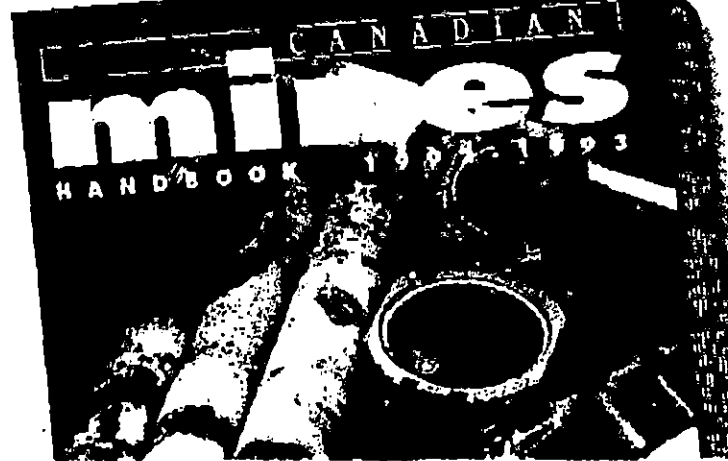

Estimated cost of the facility, first announced by Mitsubishi's U.S. subsidiary Texas Copper Corp. in 1989, was US\$260 million. Capacity of the smelter, to have been built south of Houston, would have been 182,000 tonnes annually.

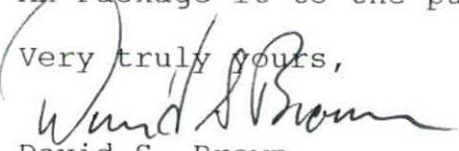

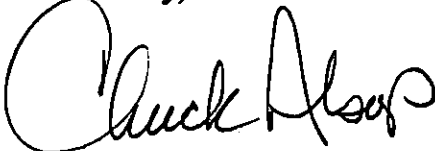

Gentlemen:

The first Presidential Election Campaign in which I was interested was the election of 1928. Strictly as an amateur, I have been interested in all of the elections since. My observations of the 1992 Campaign are that the Democrats have done a much better job of presenting their viewpoint than have the Republicans. If the election were to be run today, I think Clinton would win hands down.

Nevertheless, Clinton in the debates and in his TV ads has opened up areas, primarily his "I have a plan ---" statements which can be refuted. To date this has not been done. I am offering a few suggestions which I think could help in these refutations.

1. Stop making personal attacks on Clinton (even when true). Core Democrats will vote Democratic and core Republicans will vote Republican regardless. The central swing voters will not accept either side of the arguments and are bored with the whole matter.

2. When dealing with numerical concepts, where possible, use numbers not generalities. With large amounts use words with numbers. Example"

Use 27 billion instead of 27,000,000,000.

Clinton Plan. "Give all people in the USA the best possible health care". (This is an actual case).

A retired couple has a HMO insurance plan. It is a good but not "the best possible" plan. It does not cover a number of health needs and copay is required.

Part of the cost is paid by the retirees and part by the former employer, the total payments amount to \$5050 per year or \$2525 each per year. The population of the USA is approximately 250 million.

250 million X \$2525 =	\$631 billion
Present cost for same care	463 billion
Additional cost, Clinton Plan	168 billion

Clinton Plan. "Give all people in the USA the best possible education" (I will consider here only primary and high schools.)(These are 1980 figures, the latest which I have). Checking a large number of systems indicates that the "best" dollar per student is just over \$3000/year per student.

Number of students in schools thru high school in 1980 was 40 million.

40 million X \$3000 =	\$128 billion
1980 cost for thru high school	91 billion
Additional cost, Clinton Plan	37 billion

Many other "Plans" could be cited but I will list only these two.

How to pay added costs? Tax the "rich", defined as those with incomes over \$200,000.

In 1980 IRS reported 113,449 returns for taxable incomes of \$200,000 or higher.

Gross income for these returns	\$35 billion
Taxes from these returns	15.5 billion
If tax rate set at 100% :	
Additional tax revenue apporximately	\$20 billion.

Automobile Fuel Mileage. A discussion regarding 40 to 48 MPG automobiles.

There is today no automobile designed and manufactured by GM, Ford or Chrysler which can attain these mileages. There is no possible improvement in efficiency for the engines for the present vehicles which can make these MPG levels possible. If the 40 to 48 MPG becomes the requirement then all American passenger cars would have to be redesigned. The new designs would look somewhat like the Ford Festiva or the GM Geo 3 cylinder cars. Until the new designs were ready for production, all auto plants wuld close and all production workers would be terminated.

More information like this can be developed but time has run out.

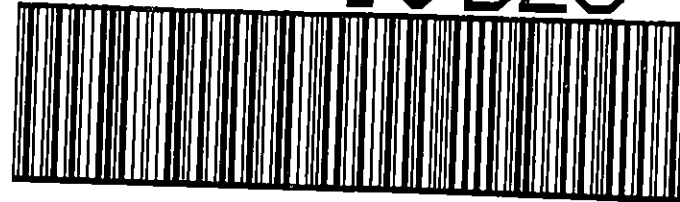

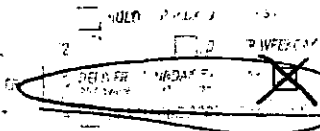
