Wyckoff, New Jersey and the surrounding towns represent a very strong Republican area. Most of the voters with whom I have discussed the current election are trying very hard to find good reasons to support President Bush; but their support, so far, is largely an act of faith. If we are less than enthusiastic about George Bush's candidacy, it is not hard to understand why many other voters are negative.

We believe very strongly that the President has repeatedly put forth proposals which would have benefitted the economy, only to be stymied by the Democrat controlled Congress which has chosen to put political advantage over the common good. (See note 1). However, we also believe that Mr. Bush has not demonstrated adequate leadership and zeal in coping with this problem. If the President is to develop more broad based support, it is vital that he demonstrate an awareness of this past weakness and put forth a very positive agenda for correcting it. The simple statement that we will have a new Congress in 1993, is far from an adequate response. There is a very high probability that the new body will still be under Democrat control.

Mr. Perot is attempting to scare the voters with the vision of a four trillion dollar national debt to be paid by future generations. The truth is that such a debt is not an undue burden, if the economy continues to grow at the same average rate that it has maintained over the last 30 years (about 3.25% real growth). The critical item is to restrain further growth of the debt. Even so, a short delay in deficit reduction to provide for selective economic stimulus, would not be significant relative to the overall problem. (See note 2).

As citizens, we recognize and applaud the advances achieved in the world political scene. Nevertheless, the economic picture is on the mind of our voters and time spent reminding them of past achievements is becoming of marginal value in getting their support at this time (what have you done for me lately?). We believe in the philosophy of government being expressed by President Bush and wish to see him re-elected.

I am writing to you with the hope that this view from one corner of our nation will be helpful to you in the closing weeks of the campaign. I am acutely aware that it may be difficult to put together a positive response to the concerns expressed in this letter, but it needs to be done. If anyone can do it, you and your staff can.

Notes:

1. The speeches made by Senator Lott this summer in the U.S. Senate provide a very good summary of this point.
2. If we were to reduce the deficit at a rate of \$50 billion per year, the national debt would peak out at about \$5.5 trillion by the year 2000. Thereafter, paying off the debt over a period of 30 years at 7% interest would require an annual payment of about \$450 billion including interest. We are currently spending about \$200 billion on interest alone. The amortization payment of \$450 billion would represent less than 6% of gross domestic product in the year 2000 and less than 2% of GDP in 2030. If it is further considered that a modest rate of inflation will persist over this period, the actual payments will be even more modest. Again, the real urgency lies in reducing the deficit.

We need a President who reflects the fundamental values that made this country great: hard work, devotion to family, honesty, strong moral values, patriotism, and a sense of duty.

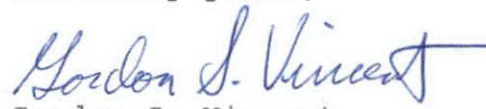

Dear Mr. Baker:

This is my first letter to you and is concerned with the re-election of President Bush. I have input relative to several of the issues. One of these is job security which I wrote about in July, and unfortunately got lost in the Department of Labor. That letter and the unsatisfactory reply are enclosed. You will be interested in it because it addresses why the approximately 90% of the work force who are employed are nearly paranoid about the economy, and are extremely vulnerable to promises of "more jobs". The job security issue I wrote about needs to be addressed and President Bush needs to propose legislation to protect people from layoff for non-performance reasons except when they are the lowest in seniority. Last-in first-out is the acceptable way of conducting a layoff.

I also suggest charts be prepared showing employment trends over recent administrations, changes as a result of defense spending cuts, U. S. versus foreign, trends of real personal income showing inflation, the impact of the national debt on economic growth, and the impact on U. S. business of buying foreign made products. You should also be able to relate foreign policy successes including the end of the cold war and Desert Storm to jobs.

Health care costs should be addressed with more **specific action** and data needs to be presented showing the flip side of government controlling health care costs, in terms of choking free enterprise. You might point out that most health care workers are low paid. Registered cardiac intensive care nurses make about the same wage as a beginning level computer programmer. Teachers, police, and nurses all make but a fraction of the wages of a baseball umpire (not to mention the players' salaries). Should government regulate sports and entertainment wages and other costs, as well as health care in order to get our priorities straight and be able to afford health care?

I believe that if you address these issues with **data** the average voter can easily grasp, and include the abortion issue and Iran-Contra, President Bush can still win in 1992.

Dear Mr. President:

I believe your record of leadership should make re-election nearly automatic. However, many Americans are suffering from profound insecurity. Economic growth is seriously constrained by this insecurity. A goal to provide more jobs is not enough and is not exactly on target. What is needed, even for most of the 90% that are employed, is legislation that provides assurance that an employee's years of service to his employer will give him an advantage over other equally qualified employees with less seniority. This was true for many years in many companies. In today's environment, there are no rules. Employees find personal politics is the primary criteria for surviving a reduction in force. This drastic change in values has opened the door to many forms of discrimination which are disguised as "restructuring".

Present concepts are obsolete and can be destructive. However, an alternative to legislation is to organize with productivity and quality goals shared between management and the work force. I could elaborate for pages!

The most important issue for now is re-election. To convince the voters that your administration now understands a crucial issue and is going to work to bring about improvement (not just change - anybody can change things), you need to spend some time talking to people like me. I have supervised groups of people for over 30 years and have studied personnel management and industrial psychology for years. I want to help. If you present my or similar concepts to the public, you will see an immediate improvement in the polls. I know, I am out here among the working wounded every day and very much in touch with them. Thank you for your time. Please advise if I can discuss this more with someone.

S.C. governor stumps for Bush in Gastonia

GASTONIA — South Carolina Gov. Carroll Campbell campaigned for President George Bush in Gastonia today ridiculing Democrat Bill Clinton's economic plan.

Campbell appeared at GOP headquarters as Southern spokesman for Bush, hoping to help clench Tar Heels' support in a tight race among Democrats and Republicans.

The South Carolina governor denounced Clinton's economic plan as an attack not on the upper class, but on midstream Americans and small businessmen.

"Raising taxes on the top two percent of the population does not reach Clinton's \$150 billion target," Campbell said. "In or-

der to reach his goal, Clinton will need to increase taxes on individuals whose annual taxable incomes start at \$36,600."

Campbell's criticisms came hours before Clinton was scheduled to speak at Charlotte's Marshall Park.

Campbell said Clinton, if elected, would "emasculate the defense of the country."

Campbell praised independent candidate Ross Perot for his one-liners in Sunday's presidential debate but called Perot an outsider.

Of the debate, Campbell said he felt Bush "held his own" but must stress his achievements to pull ahead of his challengers during the next debate.

Campbell, a rising Republican, is considered a key resource by political tool to win

the Southern states.

"If George Bush had said in 1988 if you elect me president, there will be a peaceful breakup of the Soviet Union, the downfall of the Berlin Wall and the restoration of democracy in Central America, you would have laughed at him," Campbell said. "Yet America is in a unique position of not being on an alarms alert anymore ... and not being threatened by a superpower."

Campbell criticized Clinton's proposal to impose a surtax on foreign companies — one he predicts would ward off industries like BMW.

BMW's impending move to South Carolina was fueled in part by hefty tax breaks that Campbell's administration offered the Bavarian motor company.

I would like to call your attention to the attached Wall Street Journal article which appeared on October 12, 1992. Clearly, it presents many favorable statistics that I was not familiar with and suspect many voters are not either (and most don't subscribe to the Wall Street Journal). The Outlook

Healthier Signals From a Sick Economy

NEW YORK

Frustration over this recession-like recovery obscures a development that should benefit the winner of next month's presidential election: In crucial ways, today's economy is far healthier—leaner and meaner, if you will—than the one that Ronald Reagan handed George Bush.

When President Bush took office in 1989, most forecasters believed — correctly, as things turned out — that the economy, expanding since the fall of 1982, had grown dangerously vulnerable to a recession. Reliable long-range indicators had begun to fail, also suggesting a slump was on the way.

Other developments were troubling as well. Inventories were growing faster than sales. Corporate profits and productivity were dropping. A huge trade deficit persisted. Swiftly mounting debt weighed on consumers and businesses. Inflation and interest rates were on the rise.

Today's economy, for all its undeniable difficulties, seems largely free of such troubling trends. Across the spectrum — from inventories to trade to the debt burden — encouraging patterns are emerging. Moreover, as feeble as the recovery may be, it appears likely to continue, and most forecasters look for a gradual pickup in its pace as 1993 unfolds.

The economy's leaner condition is apparent in data, adjusted for inflation, that express retail, wholesale and factory inventories in terms of monthly sales. When President Bush took office, this inventory-sales ratio was 1.51, appreciably higher than of late. Moreover, the ratio was climbing; it reached 1.53 in the spring of 1989, up from 1.49 just before the 1988 election.

In the past year or so, in contrast, the ratio has fallen. The latest reading of 1.40 is down from 1.42 last spring and 1.47 near the end of last year. With inventories so lean, businesses appear remarkably well equipped to cope with the economy's persistent sluggishness. By the same token, any pickup in demand could bring a significant increase in factory activity.

Vital to a company's health, of course, is its ability to make a profit and improve its productivity. When Mr. Bush became president, both barometers were dropping. Corporations' after-tax profits fell from nearly \$176 billion annually at the end of 1988 to a rate of only \$152 billion in the summer of 1989. The hourly output of workers in non-farm businesses also was declining.

ening, most companies report rising profits. At \$233 billion annually, the rate of after-tax profits has climbed some \$25 billion in just six months. Productivity has also been rising.

The ability of U.S. companies to compete in world markets has improved markedly in the past four years. This can be seen in America's trade performance. In 1988, the U.S. trade in goods and services with other nations was in deficit to the tune of nearly \$102 billion. Last year, this deficit was only \$11.7 billion, down steeply from \$57.5 billion in 1990 and \$75.5 billion in 1989.

A major factor in the improvement is the increasingly competitive pay of U.S. workers, which in turn partly reflects the dollar's reduced foreign-exchange value.

During Mr. Bush's White House years, the average hourly pay of U.S. factory workers has risen from \$14.31 to a recent reading of \$15.45. But Labor Department studies show far sharper increases in the period in comparable pay rates abroad. At \$13.54, the Italian pay level was lower than the U.S. rate when Mr. Bush took office; it recently stood at \$17.18, or \$1.73 higher than the U.S. average. Pay levels in 11 nations now exceed the U.S. rate. That's up from seven near the end of the Reagan years.

Debt, much of it piled up during Mr. Reagan's presidency, continues to inhibit economic activity in the U.S. But the burden has begun to diminish, as many businesses and individuals have managed to reduce what they owe.

When Mr. Bush became president, total private debt amounted to nearly 130% of the nation's gross domestic product and the percentage was increasing rapidly, up from about 100% at the start of the 1980s. But now this percentage is falling; recent estimates put it at about 125%. Meanwhile, delinquency rates on consumer loans, on the rise through much of the 1980s, are edging down and interest payments consume less of corporate cash flow—earnings plus depreciation—than at any time in nearly a decade.

Any assessment of the economy's health should also take inflation and interest rates into account. When Mr. Bush took office, inflation was accelerating. In early 1988, the consumer price index was climbing at an annual rate of 3.7%; by election-time, the increase was 4.9%, and in February 1989 it reached 5.9%. Recently, by comparison, consumer prices have been rising about 3% annually, which is a slower rate than early in the year. Military outlays, a particularly inflationary sort of government spending, were increasing four years ago; now they are declining.

Similarly, interest rates were high and rising in the fall of 1988. For instance, the federal-funds rate that banks charge one another averaged 8.35% in November 1988, up from less than 7% early that year, and it reached nearly 10% in March 1989. Now the rate is close to 3%, down from more than 4% early in the year.

To be sure, spurring the recovery will remain a stiff challenge for the winner of next month's election. But he will not encounter many of the worrisome trends that bedeviled Mr. Bush four years ago.

polled, were collectivized and romanticized by the President of the U.S."

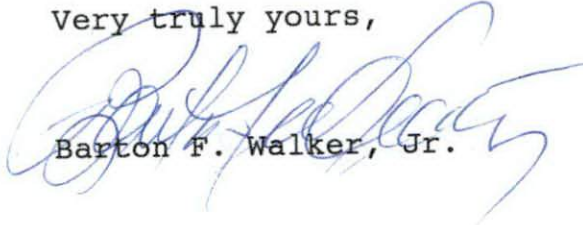

By that failure scores of people were killed and property damage is estimated in the hundreds of millions of dollars. The taxpayer pays.

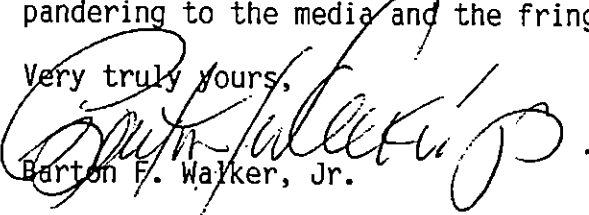

Penetrating wound of the orbit: a 31-year follow-up

SUMMARY The case is described of a man who at the age of 17 suffered accidental penetration of his right orbit by a rod and spring from a machine gun. Operation was successful, and follow-up 31 years later showed normal vision at 20/20 in both eyes.

Penetrating wounds of the orbit may cause considerable damage, resulting in the following complications: rupture of the eyeball with expulsion of the intraocular contents; retinal separation, immediate or delayed; avulsion of the optic nerve, with permanent blindness; ocular muscle injury of such severity as to cause permanent diplopia, lachrymal gland injury as well as extensive fractures of the orbital walls into the sinus cavities or into the cranial cavity, with leakage of the cerebrospinal fluid, a threat to life. Penetrating orbitocranial injuries are a grave threat to the patient's survival, with 12% mortality among 42 cases of orbitocranial wounds during the second world war (Webster and Guardjian, 1943). Serious infections may be introduced, with resulting meningitis, intracranial haemorrhage, and cavernous sinus thrombosis resulting in a fatal outcome.

On the other hand gross injuries may cause astonishingly little damage and often leave the eyeball intact along with other vital structures. Many bizarre injuries have been reported (Duke-Elder, 1954) wherein various foreign bodies of different sizes, shapes, and edges pass through the orbit without damaging any important structures. Uneventful recovery may follow without functional impairment.

A successful outcome of these injuries depends on the following important factors: the path of the penetrating object, the size of the object, the space the object takes in a constricted area, the time factor (from the time of injury to the time of medical and surgical care), the extent of the surgical intervention, the elimination of all possible complications, and the routes of antibiotic therapy to prevent or control secondary infection. A careful examination of the anterior and posterior ocular

segments for any sign of haemorrhage, laceration, or oedema are important to the medical management.

CASE REPORT

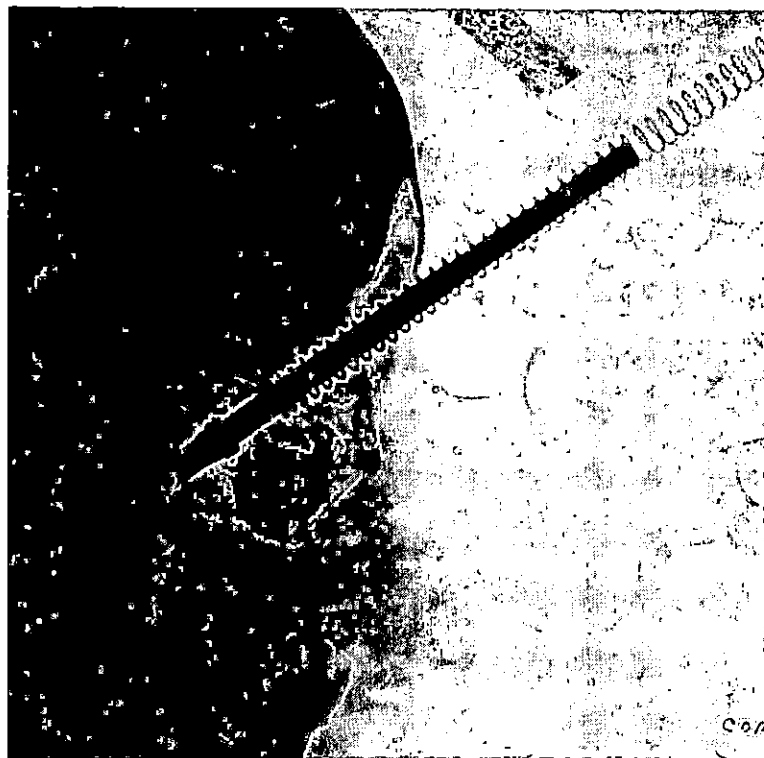


Fig. 2 Radiograph showing spring and rod in patient's orbit

On 13 May 1947 a 17-year-old Caucasian well-developed and well-nourished enlisted man in the US Army was brought from a training area to the Tilton General Hospital at Fort Dix, New Jersey, on a litter. He had been accidentally struck by a rod and spring from a BAR (Browning automatic rifle) machine gun during a class problem of reassembling the gun (Fig. 1). At the time he was getting the gun ready for firing when the trigger mechanism was set off. The driving spring and rod became disengaged from the belt and were forcibly ejected to the rear of the expanding drive spring. The spring and rod together struck and penetrated his right orbit (Fig. 2).

The patient was taken immediately to hospital, where morphine was administered intramuscularly. He was scheduled for surgery within three-quarters of an hour from the time of the accident. On examination he was seen to be in acute distress though conscious, with a spring approximately 12 in (30 cm) long and a central steel rod of approximately $6\frac{1}{2}$ in (16 cm) of which 2 in (5 cm) was projecting from the right orbit. Blood was splattered about the face and base of the spring. The right eyelid was everted to determine the extent of damage to the eyeball. Strangely enough the right eyeball was markedly compressed and wedged against the lateral orbital wall (the greater wing of the sphenoid bone).

Portable x-ray films showed the entrance path of the foreign body through the nasal floor of the right orbit, passing through the right antrum, then through the ethmoid sinus, and lodging in the pharyngeal wall.

Under general anaesthesia a small metallic plate was carefully passed between the spring and eyeball to prevent ethmoid bone spicules from lacerating the eyeball on removal of the spring. Gentle pressure was applied in the pharynx against the rod, and the spring was unwound counterclockwise to a complete

and safe withdrawal, with minimal bleeding. The spring and rod were contaminated with an oily substance and bony spicules between the coils of the spring.

Anticipating the problem of chronic sinusitis, plus the need for adequate drainage, a Caldwell-Luc procedure was carried out. Numerous fragments of bone were removed from the right antrum, and a rubber drain was inserted to allow for drainage, so that any postoperative suppuration would eliminate the possibility of cavernous sinus thrombosis or meningitis. The patient was given 10 million units of aqueous penicillin intramuscularly. The eye-grounds showed a moderately severe degree of retinal haemorrhage but no clinical evidence of retinal separation or damage to the optic nerve or the macular area. The anterior segment appeared normal, and there was no evidence of hyphaemia. The iris was not torn, and the intraocular pressure was within normal limits, by the digital pressure method, 18 mmHg for both eyes. Atropine sulphate 1% was instilled in the right eye to keep the pupil open. Iodides were administered orally to absorb the retinal haemorrhages.

The postoperative course was uneventful, and during the next 7 days normal healing took place

with no evidence of infection, global, sinus, or central. There was some evidence of diplopia, but as the oedema subsided it disappeared. During the following 2 weeks there were good extraocular muscle movements in all cardinal directions of gaze. The retinal haemorrhages cleared, with resultant vision of 20/20 and normal visual fields, taken on the tangent screen. On the 10th hospital day penicillin dosage was reduced to 3-6 million units intramuscularly per day for the next 10 days and then stopped. All vital signs and blood studies were found to be normal.

On the 26th hospital day the antral window closed, with no evidence of complications, and on 10 June, 27 days after operation, the patient was given leave for 20 days' bed rest at his home. On 7 July he returned from leave complaining of blurred vision in his right eye. Examination revealed a massive retinal separation, the right retina hanging like a balloon from the superior and temporal wall, extending from 8 o'clock to 1 o'clock clockwise. On close questioning it was learned he had been swimming and diving almost every day of his leave; repeated concussions may have caused the retinal separation.

The patient was put on bed-rest, and on 9 July 1947 was operated on for repair of the retinal separation, with disinsertion by the Walker method (creating electro-inflammation with small multiple needles through the sclera) around the periphery of the retinal separation, thus causing a sealed scar and preserving the rest of the retina for restoration of vision in the right eye. He made an uneventful recovery, with the excellent result of 20/20 vision and ability to read small print (Fig. 3). On 14 August 1947 the patient was discharged from the hospital and 'honourably' separated from the army.

On 19 February 1977 this patient visited my office for a check-up after 31 years. He is now 48 years old and has no complaints. He has had no problems with his health and particularly his eye or sinuses. He and his wife have reared 9 children.

Examination now shows normal vision, right eye 20/20, left eye 20/20. The eyegrounds reveal normal retina and normal retinal vascular tree, except for the area extending from 8 to 1 o'clock clockwise in the periphery, which is sealed off by scar and pigmentation, exactly as it was when he was operated on by me 31 years ago. The vitreous is clear, and the optic nerve and macula are clear and normal.

The visual field is normal except for the scotoma inferiorly and nasally consistent with the repaired retina at the time of the original surgery.

Discussion

The significant aspects of this dramatic recovery from traumatic injury are, first, that the successful outcome mainly depended on the speed with which the patient was treated. Secondly, from the time he was injured to the time of surgical removal of the rod and spring was only three-quarters of an hour. Thirdly, the retinal separation was at a favourable location. The Caldwell-Luc operation for drainage and the extensive use of antibiotics contributed to his recovery.

A 'Miracle' at Fort Dix

Phila. Surgeon Saved GI's Sight — and Life

Dr. Milton J. Freiwald, an eye surgeon of Philadelphia, Pa., as a U.S. Army Doctor in World War II, removed from a soldier's right eye a machine gun's 12-inch spring and a steel rod 5½ inches long, only 2½ inches of which projected outside the eye... 31 years later, the ex-GI visited Dr. Freiwald and was found to have 20/20 vision and perfect health.

This is one of the more incredible items from the famed Ripley archives. But forget the "or." This one you have to believe.

You can see the proof for yourself — including original photographs of the operation, along with the recovered rod and spring — on permanent exhibit at the Mutter Museum of the Philadelphia College of Physicians.

Dr. Freiwald, hero of this story, is now an emeritus attending ophthalmologist at Einstein Medical Center's Northern Division, and chief consultant in neuro-sensory sciences for the Office of Health and Human Services for Disability Determination in Philadelphia.

But even though it's been more than three decades since Freiwald made medical history with the emergency operation he was called on to perform at Fort Dix, N.J., he can still reconstruct the event in vivid detail.

"They brought the soldier in from the firing range on a litter, and I saw this thing sticking out of his head," Freiwald was recalling the other day. "I didn't know what it was, but I had him sent immediately to the operating room."

There, X-rays revealed that the firing spring and rod from a Browning Automatic Rifle (BAR) had backfired into the socket of the soldier's right eye during a routine training exercise on the firing range.

"If you're familiar with the BAR, you know there's a set-screw at the back of the barrel that has to be set exactly at 180 degrees," Freiwald explained.

"But in this case, the set-screw was in the wrong position. So instead of propelling the bullet forward, it drove the spring and rod backwards."

When Freiwald studied the X-rays, he was shocked at the extent of penetration.

"The spring and rod had gone through the floor of the orbital socket and displaced the eyeball sideways, squeezing it against the lateral wall (of the eye socket)," he recalls. "The rod itself was bulging out at the back of the man's throat."

As Freiwald explains it, if he had just pulled out the spring and rod, one of two things might have happened — both of them bad.

"There was the risk of cutting through the artery, with massive bleeding and the possibility that the man would have died right there on the table."

"But even if I avoided the artery, the sharp paper-thin bones of the ethmoid sinus, which were locked into the spring, could have lacerated the eyeball and blinded him permanently."

Concluding that his priorities were "to save his life, then his sight," Freiwald improvised.

"I cut a very thin piece of sterile aluminum, and slipped it between the eyeball and the spring," the doctor recalls. "Then I tried turning the spring both clockwise and counter-clockwise. When I turned clockwise, it moved further in, while counter-clockwise it moved out."

"So I gave the spring five gentle turns counter-clockwise, and out it came."

There was more to it than that, of course. But after a three-hour operation that also involved meticulous removal of all bone fragments and a thorough draining of the wound, a man's life was saved and his sight was restored.

More than three decades later, Dr. Milton Freiwald walked into his downtown office one day and found a bright-eyed stranger sitting there.

"Are you waiting for someone?" Freiwald asked.

"Yes," said the stranger. "You."

And the stranger embraced the doctor and thanked him for a miracle he'd performed in a military hospital 31 years earlier.

The above oil painting glorifies one of the early successful corneal transplants in Soviet ophthalmology by Vladimir Filatov (1875-1956), whose major contributions were in the field of transplantation. Eye Care In The U.S.S.R. and The United States: A Comparison

Dr. Milton J. Freiwald, F.I.C.S., recently stayed at the Filatov Eye Institute in the Soviet Union as the American representative to the first medical exchange program in ophthalmology between the United States and the U.S.S.R. The program was sponsored by the office of International Health, Department of Health, Education and Welfare of the United States.

Although the United States has made greater strides in therapeutic areas and in methods of ophthalmic medicine, the U.S.S.R.'s developments in the field are of the highest quality; in many areas of the specialty, the two countries are quite comparable.

Much time, energy and research is devoted to the prevention of blindness and the restoration of sight in the Soviet Union. Two outstanding institutions have been established for this purpose: The Helmholtz Eye Institute in Moscow, under the direction of the late Dr. Alexander Roslotsev, an outstanding physician and scientist, and the Filatov Eye Institute in Odessa

on the Black Sea. The Filatov Eye Institute operates under the direction of a fine woman physician, Dr. Nadegda Puchkovskaya. Women make up 85 percent of the staff at these two institutes.

One of the most prominent figures in Soviet ophthalmology was the late Vladimir Filatov, whose major contribution was in the field of corneal transplantation. Corneal transplantation was first successfully performed by Von Hippel in 1906, and by Zirm and Elschning in 1908. Although Filatov first began corneal grafting in 1912, World War I interrupted his work and he was not able to resume his studies until 1922. By 1949 he had performed some 1,000 transplants, and by 1955 he and his coworkers had performed some 3,500 corneal operations. When one considers the enormity of the statistics, this work is extremely significant. Some 35 percent of all causes of blindness are due to leucoma which prevents the image-carrying rays of light from entering the perceptive retina and then back to area seventeen of the brain.

Retinal Separation Surgery

Dr. Vladimir Shevelev is one of the leaders in the field of retinal separation in the Soviet Union. Surgical repair in the U.S.S.R. is similar to that in the United States, and successes and failures are somewhat similar in both countries. It must be remembered that the results of retinal repair in separation will depend on several factors: The location of the separation and tear; the extent of the separation and severity of degenerative changes setting in prior to the patient's coming for aid, and the duration of time elapsed from onset of the retinal damage. Regardless of the surgical skill or method, an unfavorable location will yield no dramatic recovery.

While working on his own, Dr. Shevelev worked out a rerouting of Stenson's Duct to the fornix conjunctiva for the substitution of parotid gland secretion for tears in cases of lacrimal gland deficiency. To my knowledge, this has never been duplicated.

Surgical Methods

A number of special instruments have been devised throughout the years by Soviet physicians. I was particularly impressed with their corneal-scleral suture stapler, which may save time and reduce complications in the healing of incisional wounds. This stapler is a smaller version of a stapler developed in the U.S.S.R. for use in thoracic and abdominal surgery.

Cryosurgery for cataract extraction which was pioneered and brought to fruition by Krwawitz of Lublin, Poland, is used in the U.S.S.R. The late Dr. Roslotsev gave me the instrument, then used with methyl alcohol and CO₂ for the desired hypothermia and mentioned to me at the time that he believed this method would one day prove to be the safest method for cataract extraction. His prediction was so true. The most modern apparatus for use in cryosurgery has, however, been perfected in the United States—by such leaders in the field as John Bellows, M.D., F.I.C.S., of Chicago, Kelman of New York, and others.

The Soviet scientists are familiar with the names and works of my esteemed friends, the late Temple Fay, M.D., and his protege, Henry T. Wycis, M.D., both neurosurgeons of Temple University Medical Center who pioneered in freezing methods in neurosurgery. Dr. Wycis first induced hypothermia in three critical cases of cerebral trauma successfully in 1946.

The success of glaucoma surgery is about as great in the Soviet Union as elsewhere. The closed angle type is usually managed by surgery, while the open angle cases are predominantly managed medically.

Dr. Irene Kluka of the Filatov Institute uses an ingenious machine for determining refractive formulae

when dealing with large numbers of patients. By manipulations of dials, the machine gives the formula quickly and accurately. I recall seeing a similar apparatus when I studied in London, but it was seldom used.

Soviet specialists have a complete understanding of the broad subject of neuro-ophthalmology, and the mechanisms of the physio-pathologic aspects of Strabismus and its surgical corrections are well known.

Therapeutic Management

The gap in knowledge between the Soviet Union and the United States on the subject of therapeutic management is great. For instance, "tissue therapy" is used in the U.S.S.R. to treat ocular inflammatory disease. This consists of subcutaneous and intramuscular injections of distillates of such substances as lagoon mud containing microscopic flora and fauna, aloe leaves and beet and placenta extracts. Maserated skin, at first human and later animal, are also injected beneath the skin of the patient.

According to the teaching of Filatov, tissue therapy is based on the belief that these substances are rich in biogenic stimulation which promotes healing of diseased uveal, retinal and optic nerve tracts. It is also claimed these methods cure *retinitis pigmentosa*. I do not recall any significant intra-ocular disease cure with these methods. There appears to be no specific scientific basis for this method of therapy.

Leeches are still used for treating ocular disease as well as traumatic problems in the U.S.S.R. It is noteworthy that, when the leech sucks blood, a substance called hirudin, an anti-coagulant, is secreted into the wound.

From observation it appears that in medical management the United States is more advanced and has a number of pharmaceutical products, including antibiotics and steroids which increase the opportunity for successful medical management. The introduction of steroid therapy in the cure of Herpes Zoster Ophthalmicus was accepted with great acclaim by Soviet physicians.

The free exchange of medical thinking between scientists and physicians in the U.S.S.R. and the United States permitted the visit to be most enjoyable and rewarding. ●

Bush's Burden

Promise of Better Times in a Second Term
Not Matched by Specific Agenda in Debate

WASHINGTON, Oct. 12 — Instead of giving President Bush the forward motion he needed so badly for his campaign, the first of the three Presidential debates became a showcase for his political problems.

The debate made especially clear what a crushing burden the economy has become for this President who courts country singers to display his common touch, but seems unable to make voters trust his instincts on bread-and-butter issues.

White House strategists felt that Mr. Bush needed to use the debate to instill confidence that his second term would be better than his first on domestic policy. But the President's presentation was not built around any ambitious agenda, and his tactical moves have lent the campaign a floundering, discouraged air.

But Scholars Say Restriction
on Federal Lawmakers May
Violate the Constitution

SAN FRANCISCO, Oct. 12 — Proposals to limit the terms of United States senators and representatives will be on the ballot in 14 states next month. Most of the measures are considered likely to pass.

Never before has the same been decided simultaneously by so many states, including the most populous, California, which reflects a sour mood of the electorate at a general clamor for change.

Only one state, Colorado, already has Federal term limits, which were passed with 71 percent of the vote in 1990. But momentum for curbing state and Federal lawmakers is strong, even as many legal scholars warn that Federal term limits imposed on states are probably unconstitutional.

From Sea to Angry Sea

"They will almost all pass," predicted Thomas E. Mann, the director of governmental studies at Brookings Institution and a critic of term limits. "They've got a head of steam."

Polls in the states considering term limits shows the measures leading by a wide margin. Here in the nation's most populous state, which two years ago passed term limits for state lawmakers, a recent Field Poll showed 68 percent of likely voters supported congressional term limits and 27 percent opposed.

The public opinion numbers are even more persuasive in Florida, 74 percent of likely voters said yes to term limits in a poll conducted for The Lakeland and other Florida newspapers.

Owned by The New York Times, the University of Missouri Research Bureau showed 71 percent supported another by The Kansas City Star showed 76 percent. In Ohio, The Columbus Dispatch found 72 percent in favor. And in Michigan, The Detroit News reported 67 percent supported term limits.

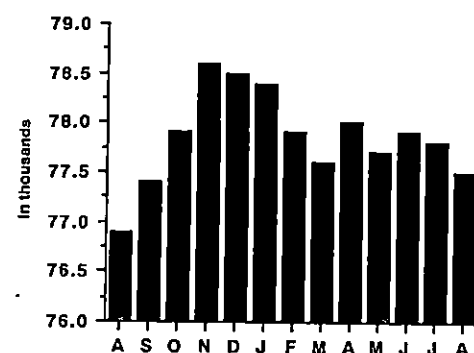

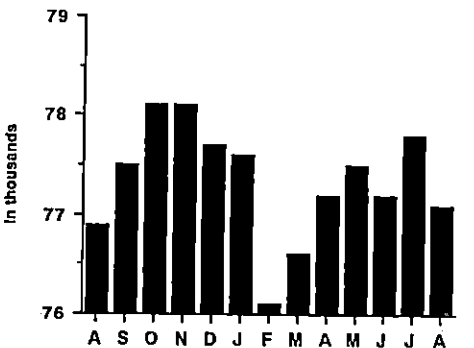

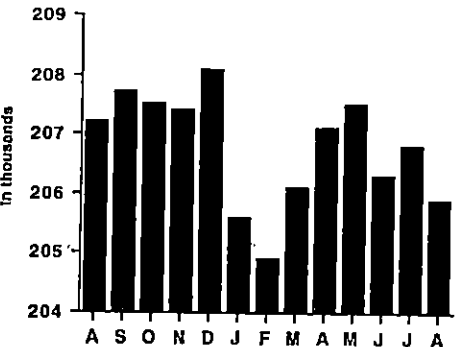
N.C. APPAREL EMPLOYMENT

Dear Mr. Baker,

President Bush could score a stunning victory over Clinton in the next debate(s) by taking over the questioning of Clinton to suit the Republican agenda.

This is done quite simply. Bush must use the final 30 seconds of his two minute answers and one minute rebuttals as a questioning challenge, and ask things Clinton is totally unprepared to answer. Clinton then either takes time to answer the question posed by the press (thereby using up his time to answer Bush), or he's forced to go on the defensive with Bush (thereby ignoring the press). Either way, Clinton is forced to ignore either the press or Bush. Every question Clinton fails to answer becomes a point of contention in the Bush summation.

For example, Bush answers the press question posed to him and then adds: "I'd like to remind the American people that Gov. Clinton stood here the other night and he said that experience is important but it is not everything. And then he looked the camera straight in America's eye and called for change. And I am reminded of another time in 1976 when another candidate did the same thing. He, too, was a Democrat with no experience in the House or Senate; no experience with the FBI or CIA; no experience making policy or dealing in Foreign Affairs; no experience in dealing with nuclear arms or hostage taking or dealing with disaster. And yet he stood before the American people and promised the American people a change. And now we have you, packaged a little prettier perhaps, but you are delivering the same Carter doomsday message, the same Carter call for change, the same Carter promises in education and health care and employment - and what I want to know is, if you're another Carter in Clinton clothing, and if you plan to give Americans another four year Carter administration - and don't try to slide out of an answer by saying I'm sad, or it's sad, or the world is sad, because we all know how prone you are to sadness and

when you're sad you can't answer a question. Because I'll tell you, the American people know there was no sadder time in their own economic history than 1976 to 1980 when the last Democrat was in the White House, and that President also said experience wasn't important and the only experience he had was a fine military career and was the Governor of Georgia..And here you are and your only qualification is being the Governor of Arkansas. What evidence do you have, Gov. Clinton, that you can succeed where your party and your predecessor failed so miserably? "

"If you, Gov. Clinton, don't want me to run against Carter then stop echoing the Carter promises and the Carter plans, and the Carter memory and the Carter doomsday message that calls for change as the only answer to solving the problems of this nation. We've begun to build something here and, yes, we're over budget and yes, we're late in the completion of the project. That doesn't mean we should tear this country down and start again based on a pipedream. Tell me, Gov. Clinton, and tell the American people here and now while they're all on the edges of their chairs waiting for a magic answer and easy way out - how are you going to get Congress to deliver on even one of your promises when you have no experience?"

"Gov. Clinton, you've been a fine Governor of one southern state and are to be commended for the progress you've made there. But your job is not done in Arkansas. And I would ask the American people to look at their own communities and own Governors and own quality of life and then ask themselves if they are willing to change places with the people in Arkansas. Do they think you could do a better job than their own Governor is doing. Do they want the same way of life that the people of Arkansas have? And what makes you think, Gov. Clinton, just because you've met with some success in some areas of running one state that you can run this country? What evidence can you give us - not promises - not plans - not pipedreams - but evidence that the Congress is going to deliver on any of your promises. Do you have their votes already locked in too? Because you seem to think the American people are in the bag and all you have to do now is coast down Pennsylvania Avenue. How are you going to deliver?"

And if he's asked the question back? "Experience, Governor. Experience. It's a long word that takes a long time to earn as part of your resume qualifications. I was born and raised in a political environment. My father served as my role model as Senator of Connecticut. I've served in the military and more branches of Federal Government than you've even dealt with during your entire, one office career. I know the difference between ideals and reality. I'm accustomed to making hard choices to benefit the majority of people. I know how to prevent a war and fight a war and win a war. And right now this country is at war over choosing a glossed over, short-term rainbow, easy way out - or returning to finish a job we started that will equate to long term security for the nation."

Finally, Bush is going to have to score some points to make the American people think about decent, human values and priorities.

We already know the press is gunning for Bush so he can't make outright accusations.

But he can sneak in commentary such as this, and let the people interpret it as they will:

"I grew up in a world much different than yours, Governor Clinton. I was taught to stop, and think, and try to make the right decisions and live a straight and honorable life as a child, youth and an adult. When I say my wife, Barbara, is my best friend, it means I wouldn't lie to her and I wouldn't betray her. And because I consider the vow I made to my wife as the most important promise one person can make to another during his entire lifetime, I think the country knows I value the trust between two people on the same level as I value the trust between the President and all the American people."

"I don't know who it was that changed the rules and I don't know why it is that people are so willing to abide by them. But there was a time that you had to be a solid citizen all your life before anyone made you a hero. Nowadays, it is the reformed criminal and the reformed drug abuser and the reformed liar and cheat who get the stars hung on them and I think that's wrong. I think we are sending a bad message to America's youth by honoring only those who have abused society, got caught, and reformed under spotlights. I think it would be better to praise the men and women who were always good, always honest, always hardworking, always believing in a better tomorrow. I think a person's past should stand for something important because it demonstrates character. I think we should go back to teaching our children that they should strive to be honorable for an entire lifetime, and not just when a chance at success makes being honorable important."

I'm not trying to tell you your job, Mr. Baker. But I won every award ever offered for debate. And I did it by letting the other guy hang himself. And I know that can only be done if you control the questions and the questions are ones that your opponent hasn't got a prepared and rehearsed answer for.

Please consider this, at least.

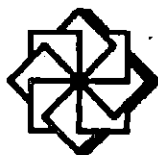

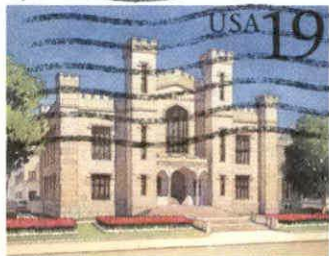

People may be by-passing an effective unit of government by expecting the federal government to do what state governments can do more effectively.

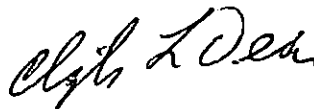

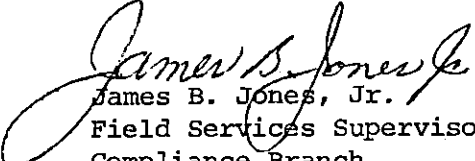
Dear Congressman Hammerschmidt:

Both farms are permitted by this Department and the permits allow the farms to spread their waste on land owned by Mr. Marley and Mr. Homesly.

We have forwarded copies of the complaint and the complete permits to our area field inspector in Fayetteville, Arkansas and instructed him to perform an inspection of the area where the hog waste is being applied to determine if proper land application procedures are being followed. We will inform your office as soon as we receive the results of our inspector's investigation.

Thank you for your letter of August 16, 1983, regarding problems your constituents are having over a certain hog operation in Washington County.

We must point out that this Agency does not have a loan with the hog operation and, therefore, we have no interest or jurisdiction over the operation.

We do know that the Arkansas Water and Air Control Act Number 472 of 1949, as amended, required that a State permit be issued for liquid waste disposal in connection with any size farming operation. The permit is not required for solid waste. In addition to the State permit, a permit is required from the Federal Environmental Protection Agency (EPA) if the hog operation has more than 2,500 hogs over 55 pounds.

If any additional information is needed, please advise.

We, the undersigned, humbly ask your assistance, or advise, about a problem that is continually growing worse. We live in Southeast Washington County along Highway 16 between Durham and Washington and Madison County Line. In our area there is a large hog farm, which we understand is owned by University of Arkansas coaches Lou Holtz and Eddie Sutton, and which is leased to Tysons, Inc. for management and operation.

We have been told that there are so many hog houses on the farm that the litter must be spread on other farms in our area. The stench of the hog litter is so intense that only a few will allow it. The two farms that are now being spread with the litter are about a mile apart and extend along the banks of the White River which runs parallel to Highway 16 about $\frac{1}{2}$ mile East of the highway. These farms are owned and farmed by Joe Marley and Pat Homesley. The trucks have been spreading litter all spring and summer on these two farms.

There were three litter trucks which ran continuously last November, December and January.

All the neighbors get some brief relief when the rains come and wash it into the White River and then to Beaver Lake. Then the litter trucks come and the stench is back.

Many of our homes do not have central air conditioning and the windows must be kept open for cooling. But it is almost impossible to eat a meal because of the stench. Many of us have poultry houses and can smell the stench of the hog litter while working in the houses.

An official of the local office of the Dept. of Agriculture advised that the regulations concerning hog farms were so broadly or loosely written that proof of a violation would not be possible.

Some of us are growing poultry for Tysons, and we prefer that our names be held confidential to avoid prejudicial treatment in our business relations.

We are at a loss about what can be done, and yet we suffer from this nauseating stench, realizing it will continue to get worse. It appears that our whole countryside, our streams, our lakes, and all our sources of water will eventually be polluted beyond use. We submit the following recommendations for consideration:

1. Limit, by regulation, the capacity of each hog growing operation to the amount of litter the acreage of the farm will accept.
2. If litter is to be used on other acreage than the resident farm, allow this only by a permit granted by an elected county official, such as the County Judge.
3. Prior to installation of a commercial hog growing operation have appropriate studies made and placed on record concerning health hazards and hold the owner, managers, and government agencies involved, responsible for damage to neighborhood

water sources and other health hazards.

In our exasperation we apologetically turn to you for help, hoping that something can be done.

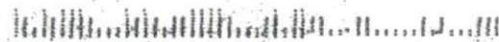

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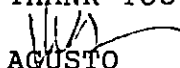

TERMS AND CONDITIONS

DEFINITIONS

On this Airbill, we, our and us refer to Federal Express Corporation, its employees and agents. You and your refer to the sender, its employees and agents.

AGREEMENT TO TERMS

By giving us your package to deliver, you agree to all the terms on this Airbill and in our current Service Guide, which is available on request. If there is a conflict between the current Service Guide and this Airbill, the Service Guide will control. No one is authorized to alter or modify the terms of our Agreement.

RESPONSIBILITY FOR PACKAGING AND COMPLETING AIRBILL

You are responsible for adequately packaging your goods and for properly filling out this Airbill. Omission of the number of packages and weight per package from this Airbill will result in a billing based on our best estimate of the number of packages received from you and an estimated "default" weight per package, as determined and periodically adjusted by us.

AIR TRANSPORTATION TAX INCLUDED

Our basic rate includes a federal tax required by Internal Revenue Code Section 4271 on the air transportation portion of this service.

LIMITATIONS ON OUR LIABILITY AND LIABILITIES NOT ASSUMED

Our liability for loss or damage to your package is limited to your actual damages or \$100, whichever is less, unless you pay for and declare a higher authorized value. We do not provide cargo liability insurance, but you may pay an additional charge for each additional \$100 of declared value. If you declare a higher value and pay the additional charge, our liability will be the lesser of your declared value or the actual value of your package.

In any event we will not be liable for any damages, whether direct, incidental, special or consequential in excess of the declared value of a shipment, whether or not Federal Express had knowledge that such damages might be incurred including, but not limited to, loss of income or profits.

We won't be liable for your acts or omissions, including but not limited to improper or insufficient packing, securing, marking or addressing, or for the acts or omissions of the recipient or anyone else with an interest in the package. DECLARED VALUE LIMITS

If the recipient accepts your package without noting any damage on the delivery record, we will assume that the package was delivered in good condition. In order for us to process your claim, you must, to the extent possible, make the original shipping cartons and packing available for inspection.

RIGHT TO INSPECT

We may, at our option, open and inspect your packages prior to or after you give them to us to deliver.

HO C.O.D. SERVICES

Dear Mr. President,

After greetings and sincere best wishes, I ask your indulgence in my writing again on a matter which I brushed through in my recent letter to you and which may be a suggestion that becomes even more vital in view of the repeating natural disasters occurring in America.

In my last letter I respectfully suggested the possibility of addressing the problems associated with young people in America not having a goal in life and perhaps turning to crime and drugs as a solution. It was just this great problem that I suggested the possible need to create a Civilian Conservation, Evacuation & Emergency Corps, not only to prepare such disenfranchised young people a wholesome start in preparing for a law-abiding and constructive life, but also to perform useful services for the country when natural disasters occur and to engage in programs such as road-building and repairing, reforestation, battling forest fires etc. while learning trades to pursue.

Obviously, as you have shown in the recent Florida hurricane, the military has played a vital role in assisting the unfortunate victims of that disaster, but then the military has a limited role it can play by law in the civilian sector. Such a corps as suggested herein, may in the future become a necessary body to be on ready call as these natural disasters, including earthquakes, occur.

Apart from such emergency services that it may be called upon to undertake, it would seem to me that it would give civilians a more secure feeling that its government is thinking more about their future welfare than say that of foreign interests beyond their borders alone.

You, Sir, have become a President who cares and a bold move even at this time during a Presidential campaign could not be interpreted as being just a new campaign twist. Such a civilian corps at this time addresses many urgent needs in America, particularly during a period of economic strife - it balances the serious costs associated with battling the drug and crime problem, but more importantly, it gives a dramatic boost to those young people who seem to feel that no one cares about where their lives are heading. Unlike aid to overseas problems the money spent is for Americans and it recirculates in America where such an

important endeavour is bound to contribute to the economy in a very effective manner as, indeed, emotionally and spiritually.

The creation of such a civilian corps cannot possibly be considered to be a political move to win an election, because there is, indeed, a serious need for a bold, dynamic and aggressive effort to solve the problems of the inner cities and to put thousands of young Americans to work in many areas of infrastructural need, emergency services, and literally hundreds of other areas of civilian life that is taxing heavily on the role of the state and federal agencies.

I believe that the time has come to make a sweeping, bold move on the American scene that will provide thousands of jobs, give Americans a stronger secure sense that their Government truly cares about their safety and future and that it is taking one of the boldest moves ever to restructure young lives and to give families that extra surge of assurance that their streets will become safer because the Government is taking aimless young people off the streets to lead more useful lives and thus better citizens.

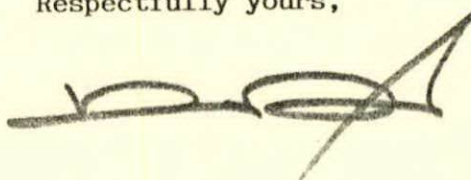
