Dear Jim:

With less than two weeks remaining, in the "for-whatever-they-are-worth" category, I have several suggestions as the President closes the gap:

1. From the vantage point of watching George Bush close at hand for over 25 years, he is at his best in an informal format. He was at his top on the Larry King Show. Try to put him on that program as often as possible between now and November 3, regardless of whether equal time is given to Clinton and Perot.

2. Remember how, with your help, George Bush pulled the hat out of the bag in the New Hampshire primary in 1988 and in the Pennsylvania primary in 1980. Those town meetings helped to do the trick. If the money can be found to purchase television prime-time on the national networks, why not organize three one or two hour town meetings starting this coming Sunday night, with the two others on the following Wednesday and the Sunday before election day. Begin with the first in the South, the second in California (to show his trust in the electorate) and the third in one of the key industrial states of the Midwest. Place the President behind a lectern (with a Presidential seal) at the end of a horseshoe, filled with ordinary Americans seated in bleachers in the round. Broadcast the sessions nation-wide.

3. Stress the accomplishments of the Bush Administration as the President did on Monday night. Hit home that the U.S. economy is dependent on the global economy and that service as the Governor of Arkansas does not carry the necessary sophistication or expertise in this critical area.

4. Did you see the two hour Frontline show on the two party candidates on PBS last evening? It contained much revealing information about Clinton, including a photograph of him in the 1960's with long hair and shaggy beard, looking degenerate and like a radical hippie beatnik. Use it in one of the final campaign ads.

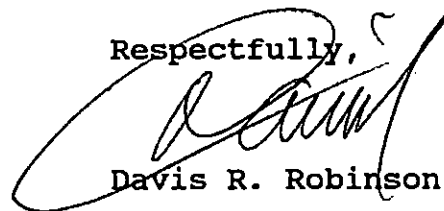

Dear Mr. Baker:

We need to re-elect President Bush! We can win this election if he now dramatically focuses in on the crime issue.

In addition to the good news about 2.7% growth in the economy, we need a dramatic message on the crime epidemic. Clinton has proposed hiring 100,000 discharged Service personnel to supplement local police forces. While he has recognized the urgent need for more law enforcement in high crime areas, it would take time, additional taxes, legislation, etc., while the violence continues upward.

As the 1991 Republican candidate for Mayor of Baltimore City (I carried 150 out of 400 precincts), I advocated that the Mayor and Governor meet, a state of emergency be declared, and personnel of the U.S. Military and State Police be assigned to high crime areas in Baltimore City under the supervision and assignment of the police commissioner -- at least for a limited time, e.g. 6 months.

The horror of criminal violence is a daily event. Yesterday four women bank tellers were shot -- two killed and two critical -- an outgrowth of urban crime. The homicide rate for 1992 at this time is 26 victims greater than 1991, which was an unusually high number.

I have attached a copy of my campaign press release dated July 30, 1991 on the subject matter.

I urge you to give this matter your immediate consideration and recommend a program to implement the essence of my proposal.

Samuel A. Culotta, Republican candidate for Mayor, again called on Mayor Kurt L. Schmoke to meet with Governor William Donald Schaefer and request that the Governor declare a state of emergency in Baltimore City and immediately order a minimum of 200 to 400 State Police and/or State Militia to patrol duty under the command of the Police Commissioner of Baltimore City for a period of six months. Mr. Culotta said that the recent random shooting and wounding of a number of persons at the major intersection of North Avenue and Charles Street, the wounding of 9 year old Lakiya Bradford and the 5 homicides over the weekend, are demonstrative evidence that violence in Baltimore City has reached epidemic proportions and that there is an urgent need to take off the "kid gloves" and take immediate steps to strengthen law enforcement.

Mr. Culotta said that it is time for the Mayor, and particularly the Police Commissioner, to admit that the Police Department is undermanned and underfunded to do its job of preserving the peace and protecting persons and property of the citizens of Baltimore.

The 6 month period of emergency, Mr. Culotta stated, will permit the strengthening of the Police Department and will provide sufficient time for the next Mayor of Baltimore to bring to the attention of the General Assembly of Maryland the urgent need of the City of Baltimore for more funding and/or the granting of additional taxing powers to the City to raise revenue to pay for the protection of its citizens. The State Militia and/or the State Police assigned to Baltimore City should be placed under the command of the Police Commissioner and, if necessary, deputized. Moreover, those members of the State Militia assigned to the Baltimore City Police Department should first undergo an indoctrination in Baltimore's civil police procedures.

Mr. Culotta observed that in the 1950's with a population of close to 1 million people, the annual homicide rate was approximately 50 to 60. Now with a population of fewer than 750,000, we will probably have a minimum of 300 to 325 homicides before the end of this year. The City is not safe. Our people are fearful despite the heroic efforts of the Baltimore City Police Department. We do not need 50 more foot patrolmen. We need a minimum of 200 to 400 foot patrolmen to cope with the current crime epidemic.

Mr. Culotta said there will be those who may cry out that by taking the aforesaid measures, we will scare away business and drive our citizens into Baltimore County. However, he stated that business, especially small businesses, has been discouraged because of crime and if, anything, the high crime rate has already driven many of our citizens out of Baltimore City and into the surrounding counties.

In Baltimore City, just like most major urban cities in America, it is time to stop the violent criminals of our society from playing Russian roulette with innocent children and other citizens. It is the first duty of government, in its compact with the people, to provide security for our persons and property. In the Culotta administration, crime prevention will be a priority, together with education and housing. Mr. Culotta said that in his Administration, we won't wait four years for the Mayor and leading members of his Administration to go to the scenes of homicide and other violent crimes to bring about change and sensitize the community to solve problems without killing each other.

Mr. Culotta emphasized that crime and violence is not related to race, creed or nationality but primarily to poverty, unemployment, inadequate housing and broken families. The vigorous support of the community, State and Federal Government, and especially the leadership of the Mayor of Baltimore City with the Governor, the General Assembly and the Congress and President of the United States is needed. To have a safe community, Mr. Culotta said, it is elementary law enforcement that there must be speedy justice in the detection, apprehension and prosecution of crime.

Dear Mr. Hearst,

We read your Editor's Report that appeared in the San Antonio Light, dated October 25, 1992, titled "Bush's chances good after solid debate".

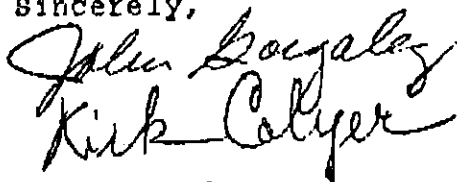

Talking Paper related to
President Bush's Second Term Priorities

The three Priorities:

1. Creating jobs
2. Increasing exports
3. Providing health care

Special note on The Federal Deficit:

A good diagnosis of the deficit problem was presented in the recent report of the Competitiveness Policy Council. The Council is composed of a group of 12 top representatives of business, labor, government and the public, appointed by the President, the Senate and the House of Representatives.

The report asserts that there are three basic elements that permeate our society and most directly, hurt it's competitive position. The elements are (1) short-termism (2) perverse incentives and (2) an absence of global thinking

Short-termism:

The notion of "short-termism" is that businesses view their business plans and profitability in short interval periods. For example, our corporations seem to concentrate their attention on quarterly profits. Apparently, the volatility of our economy, coupled with fluctuations in sales growth and inflation, makes it harder for the corporation, to plan or hire new employees, for the long run.

What primary factor contributes to a fixed constant sales posture or a decrease in sales? The inability of the corporation to "expand" it's sales base. ie. it limits it's sales territory to a given geographical area. Solution: Place or sale your products or services in a larger marketplace. Hence, it will eventually be able to hire additional employees. ie. create new jobs.

Perverse incentives:

Under "perverse incentives", the council recognized tax laws that reward consumption(sales) and penalize thrift. These tax incentives can be used to stimulate the expansion of a company's sales into wider markets, which will normally require more employees to be able to handle the additional production and distribution required to keep up with the increase in sales. For example, the employer's share of FICA tax for new employee positions, could be reduced in half for the first two years, as an incentive to hire; And a graduated lesser amount for the next 3 years.

Absence of global thinking:

The failure to think "globally", reflects the common ignorance on the importance of foreign trade to the economy. The council advises that "the share of trade in our economy, has double in the last 20 years. The United States is NOW as dependent on trade as Japan or the European Community. One fifth of our corporations' profits are derived from their international related activity. One of six jobs in manufacturing relies on exports. Almost 25 % of all agricultural output is sold abroad.

Our prosperity depends to a large degree on whether we can compete effectively in the world market."

President Bush's two primary second-term objectives are based on the above described economic scenario as reported by the Competiveness Policy Council. What does this council represent? It represents, in essence, what Mr. Ross Perot is trying to establish. A so-called forum or business townhouses where a group, outside of Washington, can group together for the common cause, to stimulate our economy and provide jobs for more Americans to become gainfully employed.

As you can assess from the above talking paper, President Bush has already commenced his economic reform program. For some unknown reason, he has not been able to "convince" the general public by merely stating that he will "create jobs."

If he is to "get" his point across, he will have to "tell" the voters "HOW" he expects to create new jobs.

If he is to win the election even by a narrow margin, we suggest that some of the above script be "publicized" in order to "inform(convince)" the voters that, indeed, the President has already chartered a course of action for the next four years.

ps. the above statistics obtained by the council, would also help to dismiss the notion by a large majority of the American public, that the NAFTA agreement will do away with a significant number of jobs. On the contrary, if the corporation can manage to place itself in the global market, it will create far more jobs, than the few that will be displaced. As mentioned above, one out of six manufacturing jobs is related to exports.

If the President does manage to become re-elected. We also suggest that he consider "expanding" the council members to encompass a good representation of business, government and community leaders. This could lead to a closer inter-action between the federal government, Congress, and the American public, businessman.

Schmoke denies he'd take post in a Clinton Cabinet

At a breakfast meeting of Baltimore ministers yesterday, Mayor Kurt L. Schmoke drew nervous laughter when he announced that he will be with Democrat Bill Clinton in Little Rock, Ark., on Election Day.

Mr. Schmoke's announcement came amid speculation that he could be a contender for a Cabinet post in a Clinton administration.

The speculation has arisen due to several factors: Mr. Schmoke has been a loyal Clinton supporter since the early days of the race, the mayor and Hillary Clinton were Yale Law School classmates and the Clinton campaign invited Mr. Schmoke to speak at the Democratic National Convention.

But Mr. Schmoke quickly dashed the rumors.

"It is not my interest nor have I sought to leave this city," he explained to the ministers.

"I am not interested in going to Washington. I'm interested in having a friend in Washington."

Mr. Schmoke's top campaign aide, Larry Gibson, last week denied rumors that the mayor would consider moving on to a bigger job in Washington.

"The mayor has never had an opportunity to operate the city with some real resources and with support from the federal government," Mr. Gibson said.

"He has said he wants to be mayor for the city's bicentennial [in 1988]."

The mayor reiterates his drug stance

Mayor Kurt L. Schmoke yesterday repeated his call for drug policies that focus on treatment of addiction as a health issue instead of a law-enforcement problem.

"Even people who don't agree with me that drugs are primarily a public health problem generally support my basic premise that our current strategy has failed," Mr. Schmoke told a House subcommittee in Annapolis.

Baltimore's mayor opened national debate on the nation's drug policies in 1988 when he suggested that illegal narcotics should be decriminalized to take the profit out of the drug trade.

Testifying yesterday before the House Special Committee on Drug and Alcohol Abuse, Mr. Schmoke called for a system that would allow drugs to be distributed to users for free by health-care professionals, the way methadone is given to drug addicts at rehabilitation centers.

"The goal is to ultimately get the person off the substance — whether that's six months or six years — and to make sure they don't do harm to others," Mr. Schmoke said. "What have we achieved? We have achieved safety because he is no longer a criminal predator."

He compared current drug enforcement efforts with futile attempts to restrict the illegal sale of alcohol during Prohibition.

"What happened in 1931 is not too different from what has happened in 1991," he said.

Mr. Schmoke said the failure of current policies has contributed to the spread of AIDS through drug use and caused too many young black men to be caught up in the criminal justice system.

The mayor sat beside Rob H. Hoesling, police commissioner of Rotterdam, the Netherlands, who said his city seeks to contain its drug problem. Mr. Hoesling said his city prosecutes drug traffickers but seeks treatment for drug users.

Mr. Hoesling said an emphasis on containing the problem has been successful because there has been no increase in drug use, the number of juveniles using drugs has declined and the average age of drug users is

tween the ages of 18 and 35 in Baltimore were under the supervision of the criminal justice system. He said young blacks are disproportionately prosecuted because "they're easy prey" for police when dealing drugs openly on the street.

Marc Maurer, assistant director of the Sentencing Project, said he believed that law-enforcement authorities want to get big-time drug dealers. He said the "war on drugs" hasn't led to safer streets.

Maryland Clinton campaign, said Mr. Clinton has promised to form a Cabinet that would reflect "an ethnic diversity of the country."

But Mr. Speller said that Mr. Schmoke's presence in Little Rock on Election Day signifies nothing more than that the mayor will be participating in a gathering of national Clinton supporters.

"It's a sign of respect and admiration for Mayor Schmoke," Mr. Speller said.

"That's all you should read into it. He was one of the first big-city mayors to support the campaign."

City Council President Mary Pat Clarke, who would become mayor should Mr. Schmoke resign, joked that she will take over when the mayor leaves town Tuesday after casting his ballot.

"I'll be here to hold down the polls for him," Ms. Clarke said.

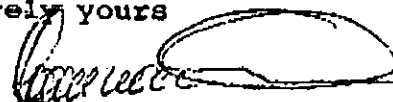

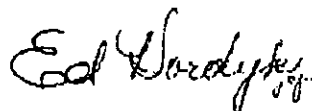

Many of us of "the older generation" are concerned about the lack of moral fiber in this country that is leaving our young people with few weapons to fight adversity and temptation. 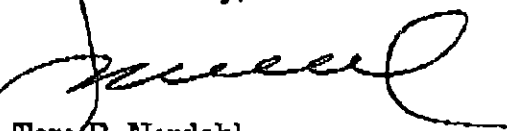

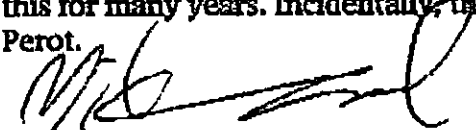

Re-elect George Bush

George Bush deserves to be re-elected president for what he has accomplished in the past four years. We have seen the collapse of the Soviet Union, the dismantling of the Berlin Wall and our victory over tyranny in the Persian Gulf War. They all happened because Presidents Reagan and Bush had built up the weak Armed Forces they inherited from Jimmy Carter into one of the strongest in the world.

Now Bill Clinton, Bush's Democratic opponent, wants to make deep cuts in our nation's defense forces. That will cause a lot of Kentuckians to lose their jobs and we will return to having national defense forces so weak we will not be able to protect our interests.

There has been a worldwide recession, but the United States has not been hit nearly as hard as other countries. The national media have been very unfair to Bush. Any of them who have studied economics know that when we have low discount rates (now 8 percent) for banks to borrow from the Federal Reserve, the economy will improve if businesses are not taxed to death and are given some incentives. The Gross National Product has gone up and unemployment has gone down for the past three months. Contrary to what Clinton and Gore have been saying, 95 percent of our work force in Jefferson County is now employed, and a large number of our businesses in Jefferson County are having an outstanding year.

One of the reasons that Jefferson County has fared so well during the worldwide recession is that the local Ford plant has been working two shifts plus overtime building the Ford Explorers. Clinton and Gore want a big increase in the automobile gas mileage requirements. That would cause many auto workers who build medium-sized cars here and in other cities to lose their jobs.

Clinton's health care plan is the first step to socialized medicine. Former U.S. Surgeon General Dr. C. Everett Koop, who recently spoke in Louisville, said Clinton's plan would cost business and taxpayers \$600 billion a year. Business would have to increase prices, and we would have another round of inflation that will end up taking buying power from the middle class.

Bush's health reform plan builds on the strength of our current system - consumer choice and state-of-the-art medicine - while controlling costs and guaranteeing access to low- and middle-income families.

Many of our savings and loan companies had made long-term loans on homes at low-interest rates and then had to pay as much as 18 percent to attract enough money to keep their doors open. This caused them to have huge losses and many had to close or merge. It cost the Federal Deposit Insurance Corp. many billions to keep their insured depositors from losing their money.

Our country has been in four big wars starting with World War I. All started under Democratic presidents who did not keep our country strong and waited too late to stop tyrants.

It would be difficult for Clinton as commander-in-chief of the Armed Forces to ask any man or woman to go to war. He spent his time during the Vietnam War in England, leading demonstrations where they shouted "Ho-Ho-Ho Chi Minh, Viet Cong is going to win." Then he came back to Washington, D.C., to work for the October Moratorium - an organization that led activities giving aid and comfort to North Vietnam and the Viet Cong while we were at war with them.

Clinton says he wants to tax the rich, not the middle class, but the government could only run for a few days on the taxes of the rich even if they were taxed 100 percent of what they made. To get the money for national health care and other liberal programs he will have to tax the middle-class people because that is where the money is. There are large numbers of households where there are two workers that have combined incomes of over \$50,000. These people can't stand any more taxes.

In Arkansas, earnings over \$25,000 are taxed at the maximum rate.

If the tax laws are fair, people with money will start new businesses and create new jobs. But if the tax laws are unfair and there is no incentive to start a new business or expand an old one, it will be like killing the goose that laid the golden egg. We need to cut spending, not to increase taxes.

The economy will improve over the next few months regardless of who is elected because the wheels are in motion, but the real test is where we will be four years from now. Clinton will fail that test because his plan will hold businesses back and his promises to the unions and to spend more on welfare will cause our situation to get worse over the next few years.

George Bush has the experience and know-how to handle a crisis. With his veto power, he

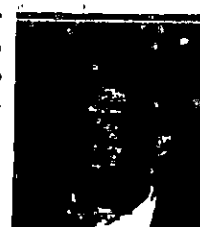

liberals in the media, while George Bush sat quietly by, making side deals with his political enemies instead of going to the American people with his story.

The net result is that millions of people believe that the annual deficits and the national debt are due to tax cuts ("for the rich") during the Reagan Administration, when in fact tax receipts rose to be hundreds of billions of dollars per year higher after tax rates were cut and the economy grew. The public can understand that, if the President tells them, but it cannot read his mind.

The public can also understand that only Congress can appropriate federal money or impose federal taxes, and therefore that only Congress can cre-



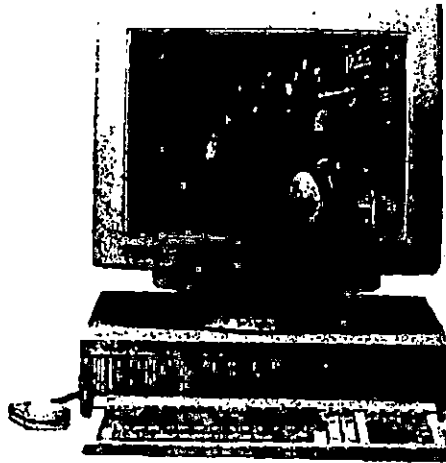

Someone ought to snout those words to President George Bush. If his goal is to go down in history as The Great Non-communicator, he has already achieved that distinction. But if his goal is to be reelected President of the United States, then he had better start telling his story to the American people.

The entire history of the 12 years of the Reagan and Bush administrations

ate a deficit. But if Congress can escape all responsibility merely by naming deficits after presidents—the "Reagan deficit," the "Bush deficit"—then of course they will cop out that way, *if the President sits idly by, hearing no evil and seeing no evil* for three long years in between elections.

The grand fraud of all is the notion that politicians and political "plans"



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Politicians and their imposed plans and mandated costs are a big part of the problem. It has been estimated by a scholar at the Heritage Foundation that the costs surreptitiously loaded onto the American economy by congressional mandates and regulation are almost as large as the sums collected openly from the income tax.

The public can understand that—if the President would only tell them, instead of coming up with his own "plan," so that now all God's chillun got plans, and there is no one left to tell them what hogwash this all is.

When President Bush goes around talking about "gridlock" in Washington, he is pushing the very narcotics his enemies are pushing—that if only the government would come to the rescue, the economy would be saved. Gridlock would have been infinitely preferable to the legislation that wrote a blank-check guarantee for the savings and loan industry, creating

workers were losing their jobs and automobile manufacturing plants were closing permanently.

ance plan; the President offers a health insurance plan. The Democrats offer a family leave plan; the President offers a family leave plan. If the Democrats offered square circles, the President would offer square circles.

How are you ever going to expose the fallacies of your political opposition if you insist on imitating them?

Harry Truman did not imitate the Republicans, he attacked them. Even people who disagreed with him respected him. Compare that with the chameleon-like, Rodney Dangerfield presidency of today.

President Bush has tried every gimmick and slogan. Perhaps in desperation he will resort to straight talk.

More likely, his landslide defeat in November will so discredit wishy-washy, one-day-at-a-time political pragmatism that we will have a better chance for a leader with principles in 1996. That is the only hopeful prospect in all of this.

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Politicians may talk about raising taxes only for rich people, but to raise any significant amount of revenue the pols would have to attack the middle class.

Follow the money

A NOTION greatly appealing to the average voter is that the budget could be balanced by a tax increase imposed at income levels beginning just above his own. Appealing, but wrong, unless this voter happens to be at the extreme low end of the income scale. Income tax revenues are raised mostly from the middle class, for the simple reason that this is where most of the country's income falls. And for the same reason, tax increases raising any large quantities of revenue will have to come mostly from the middle class. That simple fact, illustrated in the charts on these three pages, is not

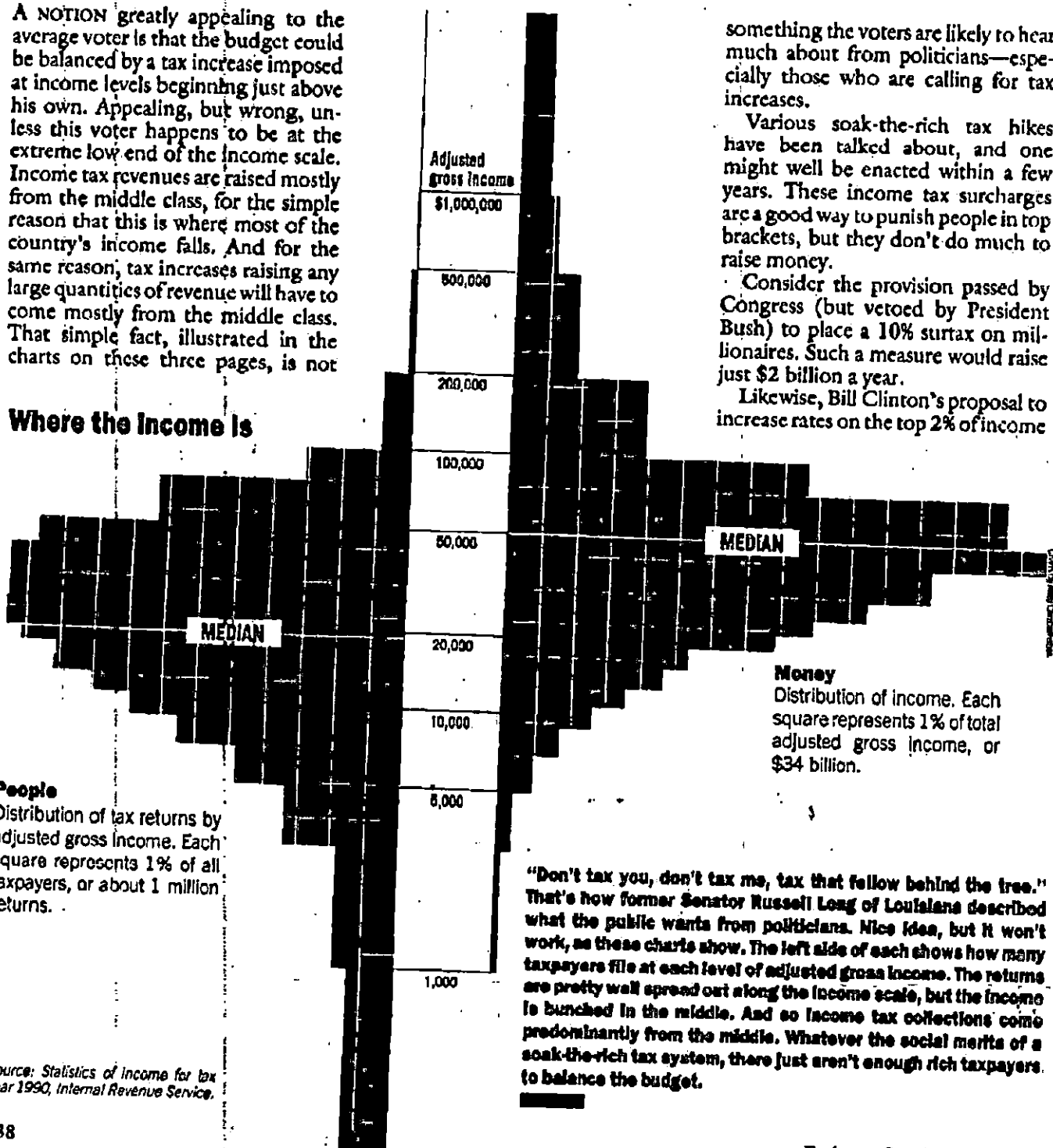
something the voters are likely to hear much about from politicians—especially those who are calling for tax increases.

Various soak-the-rich tax hikes have been talked about, and one might well be enacted within a few years. These income tax surcharges are a good way to punish people in top brackets, but they don't do much to raise money.

Consider the provision passed by Congress (but vetoed by President Bush) to place a 10% surtax on millionaires. Such a measure would raise just \$2 billion a year.

Likewise, Bill Clinton's proposal to increase rates on the top 2% of income

"Don't tax you, don't tax me, tax that fellow behind the tree." That's how former Senator Russell Long of Louisiana described what the public wants from politicians. Nice idea, but it won't work, as these charts show. The left side of each shows how many taxpayers file at each level of adjusted gross income. The returns are pretty well spread out along the income scale, but the income is bunched in the middle. And so income tax collections come predominantly from the middle. Whatever the social merits of a soak-the-rich tax system, there just aren't enough rich taxpayers to balance the budget.

Tax burden

Who deducts what?

These charts show how different income groups use four popular tax deductions. Each square represents 1% of the total deductions claimed, plotted against adjusted gross income. Note that the deductions for mortgage interest and property taxes are most heavily used by the middle class, and therefore politically sacred. The rich, by contrast, make the most use of the charitable and state income tax deductions. Cutting the charity deduction imperils museums, colleges and churches, while limiting the state income tax deduction hurts high-tax states.

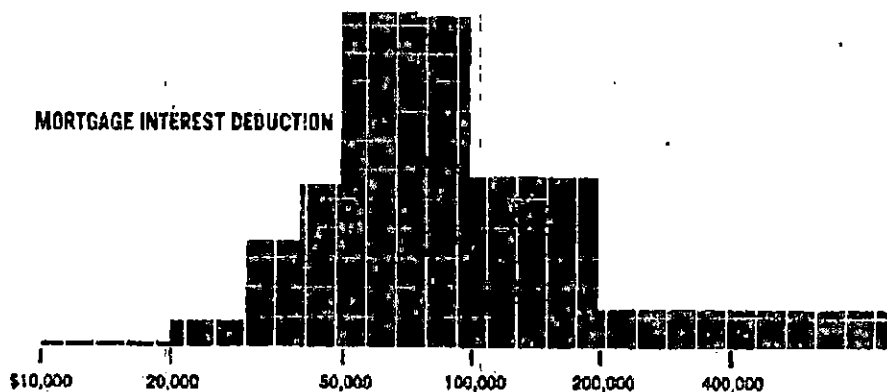
limiting this writeoff wouldn't necessarily make the middle class better off, if it meant that colleges got fewer donations and had to raise their tuition charges. And it would make lots of poor people much worse off.

The very rich are also heavy users of the deduction for local income taxes. Cutting this deduction presents big problems for politicians: It would be a huge effective tax increase on people and businesses living in those states, like California and New York, with the most expansive governments and progressive tax systems.

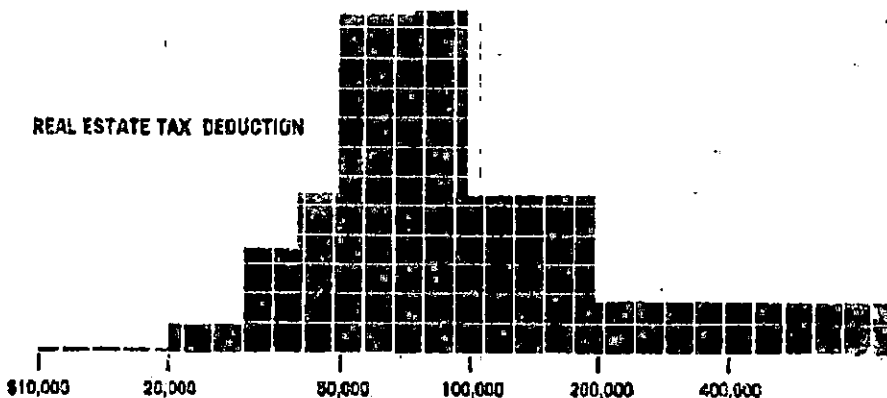
One thing that the charts don't show, and that the income tax laws don't recognize, is the geographic distribution of salaries. An income of \$100,000 would make a family in Nebraska very well off. But the same money in the suburban Philadelphia town of Abington doesn't go as far. A family consisting of two Abington schoolteachers and their children would have an income above \$100,000, yet they probably wouldn't consider themselves wealthy.

Keep all this in mind as the elections approach and the political blather increases. As economist and former Treasury official Eugene Steuerle notes, "We may opt for a more progressive tax system, but we shouldn't pretend that it would be sufficient to fund our large social programs." Or put it this way: Politicians may talk about raising taxes on "the rich." But if they want to fund expensive new programs, they have to speak the middle class.

MORTGAGE INTEREST DEDUCTION



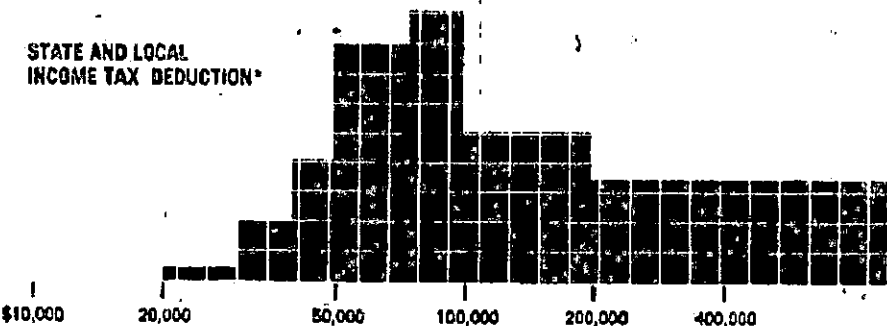
REAL ESTATE TAX DEDUCTION

earners, raise the alternative minimum tax and place a surtax on millionaires would raise about \$20 billion. Compare those numbers with the deficit, which will exceed \$300 billion for the fiscal year just ended.

Now look at the charts, which give a snapshot of the individual income tax for the year 1990, the latest available statistics. We have plotted the distributions of people, income and taxes. The distribution of tax returns (see the chart labeled "People") follows a predictable pattern. When income ranges are shown on a ratio scale, on which \$10,000 is equidistant from \$5,000 and \$20,000, the population spreads out along the familiar bell-shaped curve of statistics, except that there is some skewing toward the low end of the scale.

Now look at the chart labeled "Money." Again, the distribution follows a bell curve, but one far more concentrated in the middle. In other words, most of the income in this country—almost 60% of it—is earned by people with incomes between \$20,000 and \$100,000. If the budget

is going to be balanced or the government expanded, these people in the middle are the ones who are going to be made to pay.

Note that half of all returns show income less than about \$19,000. All told, this group's income accounts for about 12% of total adjusted gross income. But its share of the tax burden is much smaller, only about 5% of the total. If you doubled taxes on the

poorer half of the country, you could collect only an extra \$20 billion or so, and this from people who could scarce afford it.

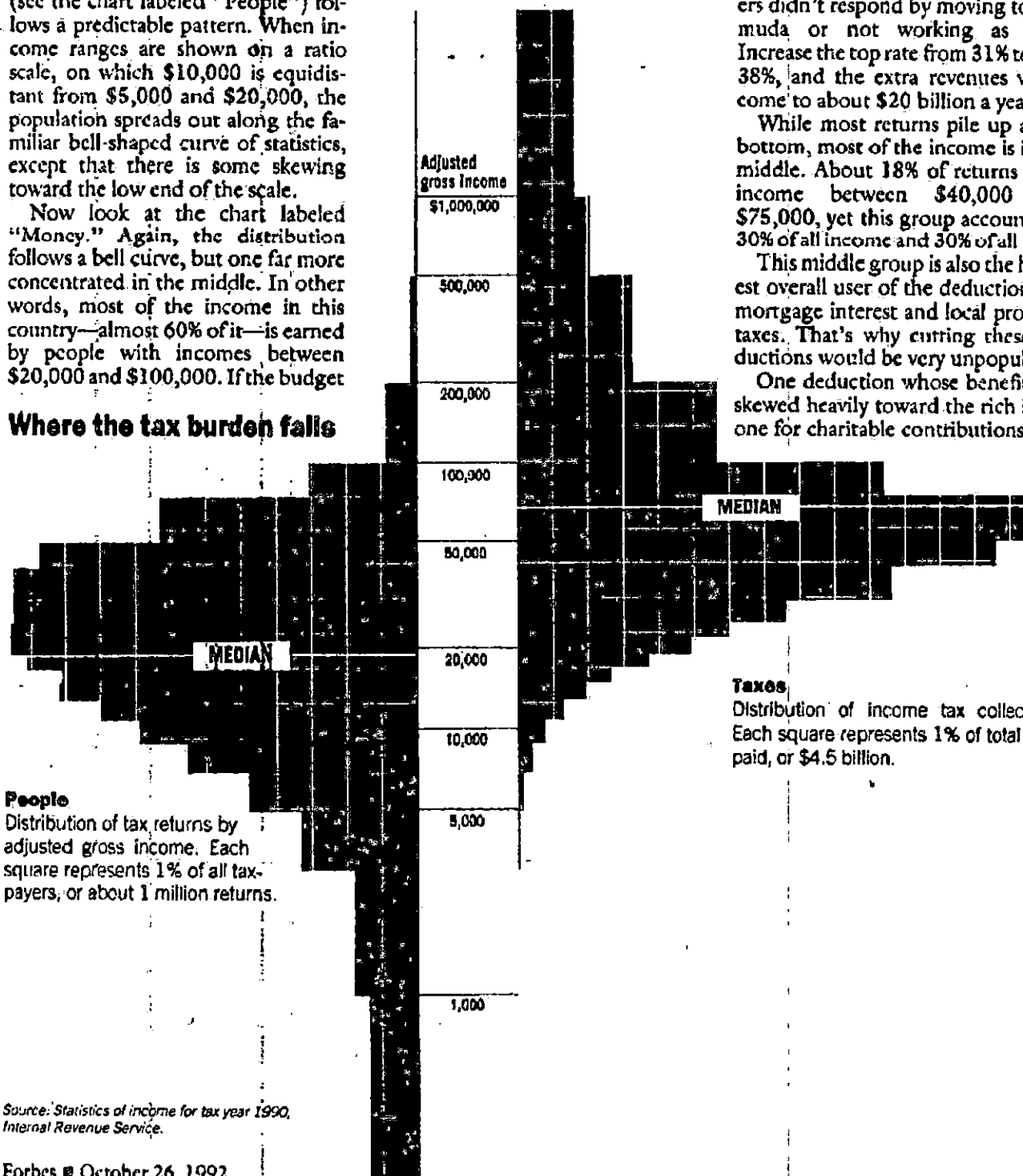
At the other end of the scale, less than 1% of all returns showed income greater than \$200,000. These people declared only 13% of all income but paid 23% of all income taxes. Double their income tax, and you would collect only \$105 billion in extra revenues—assuming that these high earners didn't respond by moving to Bermuda or not working as hard. Increase the top rate from 31% to, say, 38%, and the extra revenues would come to about \$20 billion a year.

While most returns pile up at the bottom, most of the income is in the middle. About 18% of returns show income between \$40,000 and \$75,000, yet this group accounts for 30% of all income and 30% of all taxes.

This middle group is also the heaviest overall user of the deductions for mortgage interest and local property taxes. That's why cutting these deductions would be very unpopular.

One deduction whose benefits are skewed heavily toward the rich is the one for charitable contributions. But

ENTREPRENEURS FAVOR BUSH THREE TO ONE OVER CLINTON, ACCORDING TO ERNST & YOUNG POLL

NEW YORK, October 28, 1992 - In stark contrast to most political polls, the nation's most successful entrepreneurs overwhelmingly favor George Bush in the upcoming election, according to a fax poll of 219 entrepreneurs conducted by Ernst & Young. Fifty-one percent of the responding Entrepreneur Of The Year (EOY) award recipients said they planned to vote for Bush, followed by 18 percent for Ross Perot, and 15 percent for Bill Clinton. The remaining 16 percent were undecided.

Almost all respondents (97%) picked economic issues as most influencing their voting decision, followed by the importance of character at 43 percent. Health care issues were cited by 27 percent, followed by international trade at 26 percent, and environmental concerns at 18 percent. (Respondents were allowed to cite as many issues as they wanted.)

Given a choice of eight economic issues on which the next administration should focus (respondents could choose two), reducing the federal deficit was number one, cited by 75 percent of the respondents. The need for business tax incentives such as investment tax credits and reduced capital gains taxes was next at 61 percent, followed by job creation at 35 percent. The other choices lagged considerably: provide easier access to capital (12%), develop international trade agreements (6%), provide universal health care (6%), provide job training (4%), and lower interest rates (1%).

Half of the entrepreneurs felt that economic conditions in the coming twelve months will be better for their business than in the past year. Thirty-four percent felt conditions would be neither more nor less favorable, with the remaining sixteen percent saying conditions would be less favorable in the coming year. "The relative optimism of

these entrepreneurs bodes well for the prospect of new jobs," said Dan Garner, national director of entrepreneurial services of Ernst & Young. "This year's 241 Entrepreneur Of The Year award recipients generated 103,000 jobs in the past two years."

Seventy-seven percent of the respondents were not willing to support a corporate surcharge tax to fund a universal health care program. "They appear to be willing to provide health care for their employees but prefer a private sector solution rather than a governmental solution," said Mr. Garner.

The survey was faxed to members of the Institute of American Entrepreneurs, which is comprised of Entrepreneur Of The Year award recipients. The poll was held on October 21 and 22.
