History will show that by your strength and resolve you have immeasurably enhanced our Nation's security.

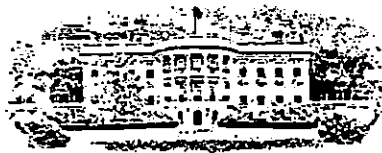

SAM HOUSTON BICENTENNIAL BIRTHDAY CELEBRATION

March 2, 1836 dawned a cold blustery day that could best be described as bleak and unpromising. In *San Antonio de Bèxar*, Santa Anna was laying siege to the Alamo, and a letter from Colonel Travis had arrived at Washington-On-The-Brazos pleading for help or their destiny would be death. There in a small wooden building, without windows and with the cold wind blowing through the cracks, some brave Texans gathered to sign the Declaration of Independence from Mexico and eventually decide the fate of not only Texas, but of the entire United States expansion to the west.

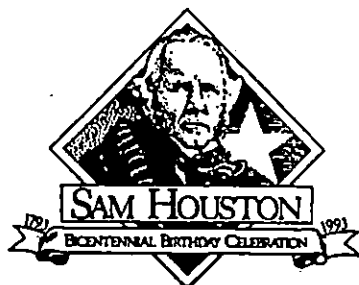
This historic event was just one of many in which a courageous Sam Houston—who served under and with every president from John Quincy Adams to Abraham Lincoln—was destined to play a part. His contributions to America's history are significant as he played a major role in the expansion of the United States to the Pacific, opposed the extension of slavery, and was an advocate for the rights of native Americans when they had few other friends. Sam Houston will also be remembered for his service as a country school teacher, his heroic military accomplishments from Horseshoe Bend to San Jacinto, and the crucial role he played in holding together the Republic and Texas' campaign for statehood.

Now, nearly 200 years since his birth, the institution that bears his name, Sam Houston State University, The State of Texas, and the Nation will pause to formally honor this national, yet sometimes overlooked, statesman and hero.

The celebration, co-chaired by Senators Bentsen and Gramm, is the culmination of over two years of planning. Events will take place now through March 2, 1993. The Grand Celebration in Huntsville, Texas will highlight participation from six states with ties to Sam Houston's life, representation from Native American tribes, public school children, scholars, citizens, and students from universities throughout the country. An entire week has been devoted for the celebration including a symposium on Native American culture and a tribal dance performed in honor of Sam Houston.

On March 2, 1993, the day will begin with a memorial service at Sam Houston's gravesite monument that proudly displays the words of Andrew Jackson..."The world will take care of Houston's fame." Characters in period costume will help create a unique atmosphere for a barbecue luncheon at noon, with stump storytelling depicting the legends of Sam Houston's life. "A Tribute to Sam Houston" scheduled for 2:00 p.m. will capture the essence of Sam Houston's accomplishments as the celebration brings his name into national prominence.

The life and teachings of Sam Houston will not end with his 200th birthday. His commitment to education and the history he helped create will live forever through the educational initiatives that have been developed by the university as a strategic goal of the celebration. These initiatives have gained national attention because of their interdisciplinary and practical approaches designed to inspire teachers, students and citizens of all ages. The educational programs are enhanced by the Sam Houston Memorial Museum, a fifteen acre educational complex which contains The Woodland Home, Sam Houston's primary residence and The Steamboat House, where he died in 1863.

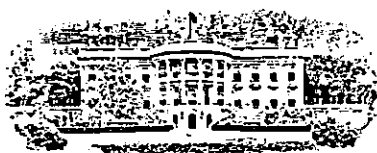

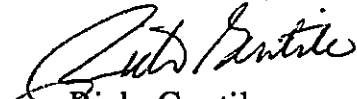

I am a producer for CBS Sports and fortunate enough to have worked on a couple of projects that brought me to your doorstep. The first occasion was a tribute to the special relationships of fathers and sons and how they are fostered through the game of baseball. I interviewed you in the Rose Garden and you spoke of your son George and how Mrs. Bush would bring him as a baby to your games. What a wonderful image to remember.

My second visit to White House came shortly after the Persian Gulf War. As our heroes returned home, we were reminded of the things that are American. 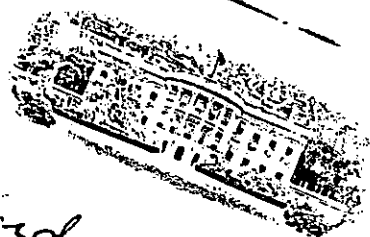

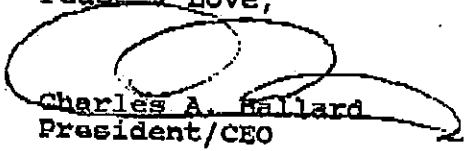
I know your time as President of the United States is coming to an end, but I would appreciate your assistance with the requests listed below:
