Cee-Jay is a member of the Civil Air Patrol Unit, a organization for youngsters interested in flying. When she grows up, she wants to be a pilot, doctor or maybe a politician.

In addition to her other interests, Cee-Jay likes to write letters. The 13-year-old began writing letters a couple of years ago, she said, after watching the news.

"I just got myself involved," said Cee-Jay. After writing a letter to Nancy Reagan about the "Just Say No" campaign and receiving a handwritten letter and auto-

graphed photo in response, she realized she could write to anyone. "The only thing people can say is no," she said.

Cee-Jay wrote to Oliver North during his trial and sent him about \$200 she raised to help pay for his defense.

"I wrote to tell him I supported him although I didn't really agree with everything he was doing but at least he was trying his best," she said.

Oliver North was so impressed with her support that Cee-Jay and her mother, Carmen, went to

Washington D.C. to meet him. "He was very nice. He thanked me and asked me how I got involved. He also asked me if I was going to go into politics when I grew up," said Cee-Jay.

Cee-Jay has corresponded with Soviet president Mikhail Gorbachev, U.S. senators and representatives, the Blue Angels and Disney World. U.S. Rep. Earl Hutto spoke at Gulf Breeze High School at her request.

"Most kids my age think politics is a dirty business and I want them to know what it really all about and what they are doing for our country, the good points," Cee-Jay said.

Cee-Jay writes the letters herself. Her dad, Jim Kerrigan, reads them for punctuation errors and sometimes helps her write them if

she can't express things the way she likes, she said.

"I get most of ideas from the newspaper or the TV news," Cee-Jay said. She gets a response from almost everyone she writes. The straight-A student said English has always been her best subject.

Her recent campaign is writing to Disney World to ask them to give soldiers involved in Operation Desert Shield free passes to thank them for their service.

"Disney World represents America and freedom," she said. She's still waiting for a response.

"I think there's more to life than clothes and boys," Cee-Jay said. "I'm also interested in that stuff too."

## 1:30 P.M. NEWS UPDATE

**OWL/LOGGING (AP)** -- An administration panel voted to override the Endangered Species Act and permit logging on 1,700 acres of Oregon forests critical to the threatened northern spotted owl. On a 5-2 vote, the Endangered Species Committee agreed to exempt federal logging from the act in an effort to postpone the loss of Northwest timber jobs.

**BUSINESS SALES (AP)** -- Business sales increased 0.5% in March, the third straight gain, while inventories rose 0.4% for the first time in two months, the government said. Analysts were uncertain whether the inventory buildup was voluntary or involuntary; if voluntary, it could reflect optimism that was prompting businesses to replenish their shelves.

**CONGRESSIONAL PAY (AP)** -- Speaker Foley said he considers an amendment limiting Congress' ability to raise its pay a formal part of the Constitution. Foley said he expects no move on Capitol Hill to challenge the amendment.

**URBAN PLAN/KEMP (AP)** -- Secretary Kemp, urging passage of President Bush's urban package, said the Los Angeles rioting was "a cry for help" from inner-city residents trapped in poverty. But a Senate Democrat expressed doubt that the administration plan would restore hope to the poor. Sen. Wofford said he had doubts that Kemp's plans for enterprise zones and promoting home ownership among public housing tenants would be sufficient to restore hope to poor neighborhoods. Jesse Jackson told the panel in prepared testimony that the administration's enterprise zones "do not address the root causes of urban decay and despair."

**BOSNIA (Sarajevo/AP)** -- Serb attackers and Muslim defenders fought a fierce artillery duel in Sarajevo. Defense officials said virtually the whole city came under bombardment, and at least three people were reported killed. The fighting ebbed by afternoon. Gen. Philippe Morillon of France said that there was no sign of a ceasefire that was supposed to take effect by midafternoon.

**MIDEAST TALKS (Ottawa/Reuter)** -- The U.S. and Canada tried to steer discussion at the conference on Mideast refugees away from the explosive issue of the Palestinian "right of return." Diplomatic sources said U.S. and Canadian officials were working hard behind the scenes to tone down the rhetoric and focus the debate on small, concrete steps that could be taken to alleviate the plight of some 2.5 million Palestinian refugees.

**PRESIDENT'S ASSETS (Christopher Connell, AP)** -- The assets in President Bush's blind trust rose by \$55,000 last year to almost \$1.3 million, and Bush and his wife received \$21,329 in gifts, the White House said.

**ABORTION (Reuter)** -- Most Americans believe abortion should remain legal and more than half say the abortion issue will not determine how they vote, according to a survey released today. The survey by Parade magazine of 2,538 people found 71% want to keep abortion legal.

Subject: Hot Key Capability within Quorum

I understand that you have expressed an interest in the status of gaining a reliable hot key capability within Quorum, particularly for the President's Personal Correspondence Unit.

A meeting was held in my office on Monday, April 27 with representatives of IRMD and Intelligent Solutions, and this issue was discussed at some length. First of all, the original requirements placed on the contractor called for the ability to access mainframe applications (CTRK, PCON, PRIV) from the Quorum menus. This capability has always been a part of the system. The problem arises when you go from the mainframe screen back into Quorum. Since the computer is unable to keep two different sessions active, the mainframe connection is broken and the users have to reenter their password in order to return to their mainframe application. This is not a problem for the majority of users since they work primarily in Quorum and only occasionally go into PCON to look up a name and/or address and return to Quorum to write their letters. In President's Personal Mail, in Gifts, and to a lesser extent, in Mail Analysis, it is a problem because their work requires them to constantly move between the two applications. In the case of Gifts, the planned incorporation of the gift accounting system into Quorum will eliminate the need for that office to move as frequently between two applications.

Intelligent Solutions, the contractor for Quorum, has devoted in excess of 150 manhours to resolving this problem since it was first brought to our attention by Courtney Palm. They have found a solution. The solution will do what we ask, but it requires the user to be very accurate in what he or she types. If they hit an incorrect key, they will lock up their system. Therefore, I have recommended against implementing it because I feel that the fix would cause more problems than it would correct.

The contractor has told us that they believe that with the help of IBM, a fix can be written that will be both effective and safe. An estimate of the cost is between \$4,000 and \$8,000. According to Intelligent Solutions, paying to have the necessary programming work done to make the hot key safe would also benefit us if we decide at a future date to add other applications to the base system.

In conclusion, they have given it their best shot. If we're going to have a reliable hot key capability, then we are going to have spend the extra money.

Dear Mr. President:

We commend you for visiting Los Angeles last week. The presence and concern of the President are important to Americans in a time of crisis.

The events in Los Angeles have focused national attention on the serious economic and social problems in urban areas.

The conditions present in Los Angeles exist in most of our nation's urban areas. They present a challenge to our society. That requires an immediate response to the situation in Los Angeles and a longer term strategy that addresses the fundamental problems in many of our cities.

The creation of jobs, and the opportunity and hope that come with a job, are vital to the recovery of Los Angeles and the renewal of our urban areas. The personal safety of residents of urban areas is crucial to the rejuvenation and vibrancy of neighborhoods.

We know that we and you disagree on some aspects of this matter.

Americans undoubtedly also have different perspectives on the best approaches to these problems. But on one thing we can all agree: No one benefits if differences of opinion paralyze our society's response.

We therefore propose the following actions and invite you to join with us in gaining their enactment.

- You have publicly committed \$600 million in assistance to those hurt by this disaster, through the Small Business Administration (SBA) and the Federal Emergency Management Agency (FEMA). We support your proposal. But, as you know, without supplemental funding, neither the SBA nor FEMA will have enough money to pay for disasters already declared and also help the people of Los Angeles. We ask that you join us in supporting greatly needed funding for SBA and FEMA, as well as for a summer youth jobs program under the Job Training Partnership Act.

- We agree that arson, looting and destruction damage the community as surely as any of the underlying causes of urban unrest. The conference report on the crime control bill has been approved in the House and awaits only Senate passage and your signature to become law.

It includes valuable provisions for community-based policing, state and local law enforcement assistance, a provision that will begin to control the proliferating urban arms race that threatens our police, and a range of higher federal penalties for drug-related offenses as well as for capital offenses, including the death penalty. It has the endorsement of every major police organization in the country. Its enactment can send a valuable and immediate signal to all the people of our cities and suburbs that the personal security of law-abiding citizens and the protection of private property are a central element of economic revival in urban areas.

- We propose that several provisions of the tax measure which Congress passed and you vetoed in March, be considered again and enacted. These are (1) the creation of urban enterprise zones; and (2) the extension of several expiring tax programs which utilize the private sector to help create jobs, provide better housing, and encourage investments in economically disadvantaged areas.

- The bill providing 13 additional weeks of unemployment insurance that we worked out together in February expires on June 13th. We should ensure that unemployment compensation is available for those who are unemployed. Only 40 percent of the jobless qualify for compensation today. When less than 50 percent of jobless workers in a recession qualify for unemployment benefits, the system is not working as intended. We ask you to join us in extending and fixing the unemployment compensation system.

- People need jobs. The Surface Transportation Act of 1991 provided the largest public works authorization in our history. Nearly all of the required money is in a Trust Fund. States have indicated that they could use another \$1 billion on approved projects this year. States will be able to spend the full \$25.7 billion authorized for the next fiscal year. We urge you to revise your FY 1993 budget request to provide for the full authorization. This would increase available funds by \$3.6 billion.

- In addition, the Housing Reauthorization bill now pending in Congress, including the Community Development Block Grant, and the Head Start Summer Program, will create jobs and empower urban residents by providing increased affordable housing and expanding local community development activities.

We can improve on this beginning, first, with consultation, among Members of the Congressional Black Caucus, community leaders in Los Angeles and other affected urban areas; and, second, by recognizing that other long-term measures, now stalled because of politics or paralysis, must be broken free and moved to the front of the nation's agenda. Specifically, we refer to the need for cooperation between the Executive Branch and Congress on behalf of broad-based economic growth that will provide jobs, opportunity and justice for all Americans. It has often been said, and we would do well to remember today, that a good job is the best social program for everyone in our society.

These measures, by themselves, will not solve all the problems. Much more will be needed. But we believe they represent an important start.

Without order, there cannot be the stable communities that nurture stable families. The foundation for personal responsibility is formed only within a stable family structure. There is a broad core of agreement between us on which we can build, and we write you in the same spirit you expressed in a news conference before leaving to visit Los Angeles.



# Two Cardinals Protest Award To Moynihan by Notre Dame

## Abortion-Rights Senator Named Outstanding Catholic

A decision by the University of Notre Dame to honor Sen. Daniel Patrick Moynihan (D-N.Y.) as an outstanding Catholic has drawn protests from two Roman Catholic cardinals who object to the senator's position on abortion, spokesmen said yesterday.

Notre Dame spokesman Dennis K. Moore said the college, in South Bend, Ind., had received letters from New York Cardinal John J. O'Connor and Boston Cardinal Bernard Law.

Moore declined to release the letters or discuss their contents except to say they expressed the cardinals' dismay about the election of Moynihan to receive the university's Lactare Medal, the oldest and most prestigious honor given to American Catholics.

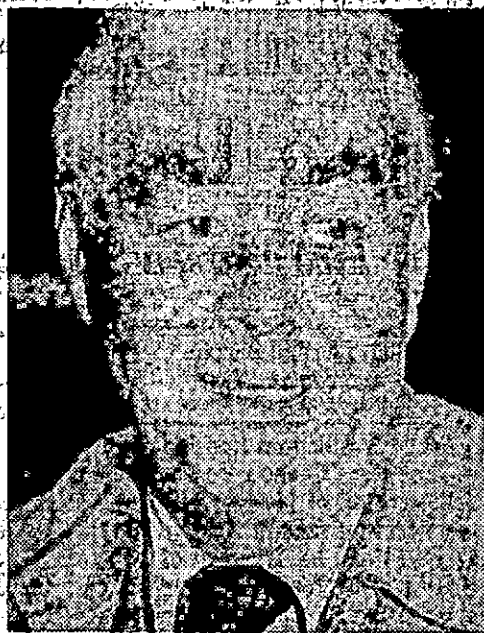

Moore said the church leaders' letters would not change the university's decision. "We will present the medal to Senator Moynihan at commencement," he said.

The medal is given annually to a Roman Catholic "whose genius has ennobled the arts and sciences, illustrated the ideals of the church and enriched the heritage of humanity," the school said in a news release.

Joseph Zwilling, a spokesman for O'Connor, confirmed that the cardinal had written to the Rev. Edward Malloy, Notre Dame's president, to express his disapproval. Zwilling refused to disclose or discuss the letter's contents.

John Walsh, a spokesman for the Boston archdiocese, said Law "wouldn't make any

comment on any of his correspondence that he may or may not have written because he regards that as private.

Moynihan, asked about the letters, said: "I have a reaction but I don't want to talk about it." He added that he has "a responsibility to the university not to make this any more controversial than can be and anything I say can do that."

Moynihan said he would be on the platform at Notre Dame's commencement May 17 with President Bush, the main speaker. "I get the last word," the senator said.

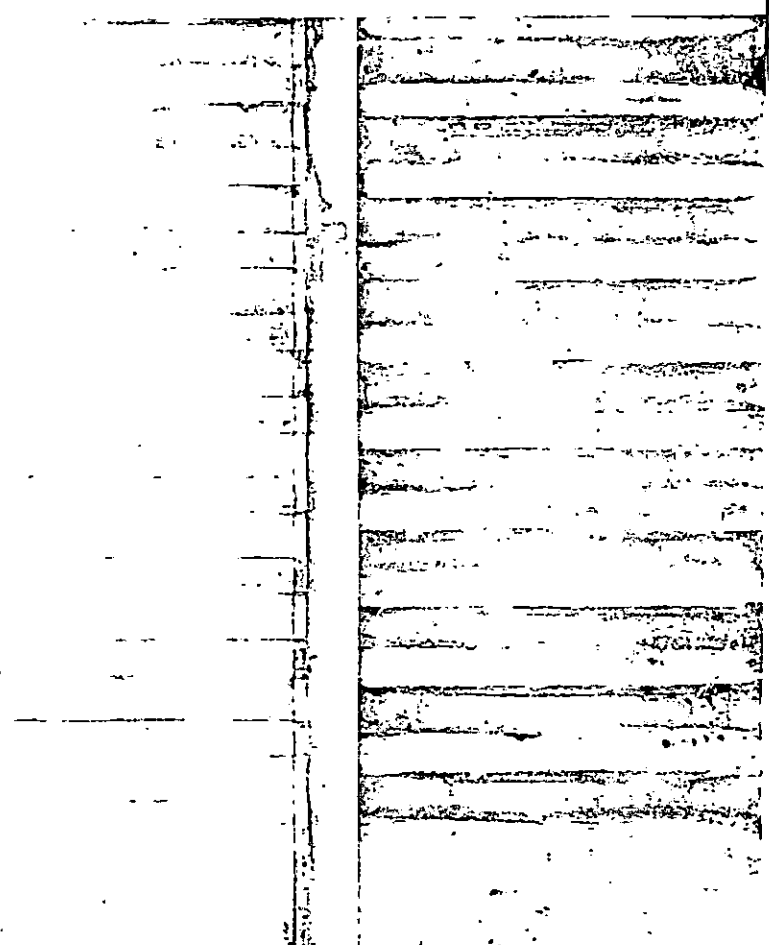
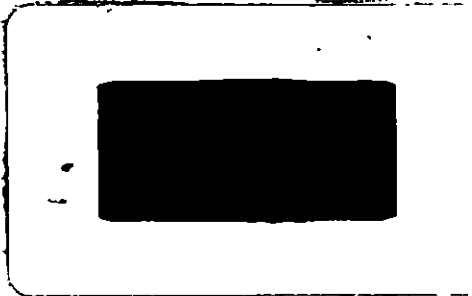

FACT SHEET ON THE PRESIDENT'S REGULATORY REFORM INITIATIVE

In a Rose Garden speech, the President today gave a report on the regulatory reform initiative he launched in his State of the Union address. He also outlined several additional steps to reduce the regulatory burdens that are ultimately borne by every American consumer and worker.

The President observed that excessive and misguided regulatory requirements "impose hidden taxes and costs on society" and often have unintended, pernicious consequences. For example, when Congress tries to legislate the fuel efficiency of our cars, "highway fatalities can increase and American auto workers can lose jobs."

Three months ago, the President took decisive action to reduce these hidden taxes. He asked the major federal regulatory agencies to set aside a 90-day period to evaluate existing regulations and programs and to accelerate initiatives that will create jobs and economic growth. He also imposed a moratorium on new regulations that could unnecessarily hamper economic growth.

As described in detail below, the President's reform initiative, under the guidance of the Council on Competitiveness, has already produced a substantial reduction in the burden of federal regulation. As shown in the attached table, the Administration's best estimate is that the reforms it has completed or set in motion since January 28 will ultimately save American consumers and workers roughly \$15 to \$20 billion per year (although the savings could be as high as \$22 billion or as low as \$10 billion). That amounts to between \$225 and \$300 per year for the average American family. These actions will also increase the amount of available credit by approximately \$15 billion, making home ownership more affordable and providing the financing necessary for further business expansion and job creation.

As the President emphasized, this is "just a down payment on savings to come."

1. Additional Steps Announced By The President To Reduce Regulatory Burdens. To ensure that the entire federal government continues to give highest priority to regulatory reform, the President took the following steps:

- o Expedited Timetable For Implementing Additional Reforms. During the 90-day review, Federal regulators identified hundreds of rules to be modified or repealed in the near future. The President announced that he has asked regulatory agencies to implement these and other reforms identified during the review period on an expedited schedule.
  - Specifically, the President asked that actions not requiring additional public comment be completed by August 1, 1992, and that, wherever possible, actions requiring public comment be finalized by September 1, 1992.
  - Each agency will submit an updated report on these activities to the President on September 1, 1992.
- o Extension Of The Regulatory Moratorium. The President also announced that, in order to ensure that adequate resources continue to be devoted to the regulatory reform initiative, the moratorium will be extended by 120 days. He again emphasized that the moratorium does not cover regulations needed to protect against imminent threats to human health or safety. He also requested that all federal agencies prepare a thorough cost-benefit analysis of each major rule issued during the moratorium period.
- o Better Cost-Benefit Analysis Of Legislative Proposals. Finally, the President directed federal agencies to estimate the likely costs and benefits of legislative proposals under active consideration by Congress or to be proposed by the agency. The Office of Management and Budget, in consultation with the Council of Economic Advisors, will provide technical guidance on the preparation of these estimates.

## 2. Impact Of The President's Initiative Thus Far.

Discussing the success of the 90-day review, the President noted that every agency asked to participate in the initiative has already taken concrete steps to reduce regulatory impediments to economic growth. Indeed, federal agencies took more than 200 separate actions. Following are some of the most significant reforms completed or initiated during the 90-day review:

- o Accelerating Approval Of New Drugs. The FDA recently announced important reforms that will reduce by as much as four years the overall time it takes to develop breakthrough drugs. These actions, which are the culmination of efforts begun by then-Vice President Bush's Task Force on Regulatory Relief, will ultimately save millions of lives as well as billions of dollars.

- As a result of these reforms, patients will have earlier access to drugs to treat diseases such as cancer, AIDS, Alzheimer's disease, depression, and cystic fibrosis.
- Under a pilot program, these reforms made it possible for the AIDS drug DDI to receive FDA approval in only six months.
- o Protecting Workers' Rights. The President signed an Executive order requiring Federal contractors to inform employees of their rights under the Supreme Court's Beck decision.
  - This action will help ensure that nonunion employees are not forced, through mandatory union dues, to support political causes with which they disagree. Between two and three million of the 19 million workers represented by unions are not union members, but must pay compulsory fees.
  - An employee who elects to exercise his or her Beck rights would receive a refund of approximately \$400 per year. This annual refund amounts to about a week's wages for workers represented by unions.
- o Reducing Regulatory Burdens On Biotechnology. The U.S. is the world leader in high-tech biotechnology -- the use of biological processes to make products with living organisms. Until recently, this innovative new technology was singled out for increased regulatory oversight, despite a scientific consensus that it poses no inherent risk.
  - Under a new policy developed by the President's Council on Competitiveness, federal regulators will exercise oversight only when a specific product poses an unreasonable risk.
  - With the help of this new policy, the U.S. biotechnology industry is expected to grow from a \$4 billion to a \$50 billion a year industry by the year 2000, providing innovative products for American consumers and new jobs for thousands of American workers.
- o Reducing Food Prices. Labeling costs are part of the price of foods all Americans buy. To reduce these costs and provide needed flexibility, the Department of Agriculture will implement an exemption from labelling requirements for small businesses. To ease the transition to new labeling standards, the USDA is also extending the implementation period for another year.

- o Reducing Financing Costs. Financing costs are a significant part of the price of almost all goods and services. The Administration has taken several actions to reduce these costs.
  - The Office of Thrift Supervision issued a rule permitting nationwide branching by the Nation's 2,000-plus savings associations. This change will foster safe, sound operations and will result in savings to borrowers and lenders of up to \$1.5 billion dollars annually. For a typical family taking out a \$100,000 30-year loan on a new home, for example, these changes could translate into a \$180 reduction in annual mortgage payments.
  - The four Federal agencies that regulate banks and thrifts -- the Federal Reserve Board, the Federal Deposit Insurance Corporation, the Comptroller of the Currency and the Office of Thrift Supervision -- have agreed to apply uniform policies and procedures in supervising banks and thrifts. This change, which builds on proposals made by the Task Force on Regulatory Relief in 1985, will eliminate unnecessary compliance costs incurred by financial services institutions.
  - By clarifying that lenders are ordinarily not liable for environmental damage done by their borrowers, EPA removed a significant barrier to lending that will increase credit availability.
- o Helping Small Businesses Raise Capital. Small businesses account for more than two-thirds of new jobs. The Securities and Exchange Commission has taken a number of actions to eliminate barriers to investment in small businesses, thereby facilitating business expansion and increased employment.
  - The SEC issued a proposed regulation to increase from \$500,000 to \$1 million the amount that a small business can raise through stock offerings without registering with federal authorities.
  - Also, the SEC has made it possible for thousands of small businesses to use streamlined registration forms. If used by one-quarter of eligible businesses, up to \$18 billion could be raised in initial public offerings under one of these new forms. Such businesses could thereby save more than \$180 million on legal and accounting fees.

- The SEC has also published an interpretation that would allow mutual funds to invest a greater percentage of their assets in the securities of small businesses, further increasing the capital available to this dynamic part of our economy.
- o Reducing Transportation Costs.
  - Shipping costs for consumer goods account for about 8 percent of the average family's budget. To reduce these costs, and to eliminate unnecessary regulatory burdens of some 52,000 small trucking companies, the Interstate Commerce Commission initiated a proceeding to abolish a regulation requiring motor carriers to keep a unique set of "regulatory" accounting books in addition to standard financial and tax records. The ICC also initiated a proceeding to spare motor carriers from having to obtain a registration stamp for each of their vehicles from each state in which they operate.
  - To reduce air travel costs, the Department of Transportation has implemented its "open skies" policy, which provides open access to U.S. markets for all European countries willing to permit U.S. air carriers free access to their markets. Increased competition will lead to lower fares and increased spending in the U.S. by foreign visitors.
- o Implementing The National Energy Strategy. The Federal Energy Regulatory Commission has taken several steps to achieve important objectives of the National Energy Strategy.
  - It adopted a major natural gas pipeline restructuring rule that will promote competition in the gas industry and increase the use of this clean fuel. The FERC's reforms in the natural gas pipeline industry will eventually reduce utility bills for the 50 million households that heat with natural gas.
  - It issued a proposal to allow "incentive regulation" for interstate natural gas pipelines, oil pipelines and electric utilities. This new policy will give these companies a greater incentive to innovate and to economize on operating costs.
  - It has also issued a proposed rule removing regulatory barriers to the sale of natural gas as a fuel for use in motor vehicles.

o Meeting Environmental Goals In A Cost-Effective Manner.

- The Administration has developed several innovative, market-based approaches to reduce the costs of meeting the Clean Air Act's stringent standards. One such initiative, known as "Cash for Clunkers," will help businesses meet the tough standards of the Act by giving them emission reduction credits if they take older, high-polluting automobiles off the road.
- The Commodity Futures Trading Commission has contributed to these efforts by implementing expedited procedures for approving new futures contracts. One of the first contracts approved under these new procedures was a futures contract in sulfur dioxide allowances. This new investment vehicle will significantly reduce the costs to utilities of complying with Clean Air Act standards, thereby ultimately reducing consumers' utility bills.

o Creating More Competitive Communications Markets.

- The Federal Communications Commission took steps to allow competition among international communications satellite systems. Its actions will lead to lower prices for the more than one billion phone calls made each year between the U.S. and other countries.
- In an effort to strengthen the rapidly changing broadcast business, the FCC increased from 12 to 30 the maximum number of FM and AM radio stations that can be owned by a single owner, and for the first time will allow ownership of more than one AM or FM station in a market.

o Clarifying Antitrust Guidelines. The Department of Justice and the Federal Trade Commission announced a unified antitrust enforcement policy for the more than 1000 mergers and acquisitions reviewed by these two agencies each year.

- Where stiff international competition already exists, the new guidelines will make it easier for American companies to achieve the economic clout they need to compete effectively in the global marketplace.
- A common policy will provide greater certainty about the standards to be applied in enforcing the antitrust laws, as well as a more reasoned analysis of the competitive effects of mergers.

- o Reducing Barriers to Exports of American Goods. The Department of Commerce has eased a variety of outdated export regulations that limited the ability of American businesses to export goods such as computers and semiconductors. These actions will eliminate licensing requirements for 2000 to 3000 transactions annually, thereby facilitating some \$2 to \$3 billion of exports.



# Clinton, Bush cruise in Pa. primary

## Under fire on finance reform, president wins big donors

WASHINGTON - The letter from President Bush was not subtle. If Republican contributors bought a table of tickets to last night's President's Dinner, they could sit with a senior administration official. If they donated \$92,000, they could have their picture taken with Bush. If they gave even more, they could sit with him at the head table.

And, in the fine print, the invitation noted that contributors can "exceed" the "federal limit." In other

words, the 4,300 people who attended last night's opulent fund-raiser, called the most successful in US political history, collected more than \$9 million for the party largely by getting around the \$1,000-per-person and \$5,000-per-political action committee limit on contributions to the Bush campaign.

The so-called "soft money" can be collected because of a loophole that limits only direct contributions to candidates, but not contributions that can indirectly help their campaigns, for example, by signing up voters. Many Democrats make

PHILADELPHIA - Gov. Bill Clinton added Pennsylvania last night to the collection of major states in which he has won primaries this year in his march toward the Democratic presidential nomination.

In Republican balloting, President Bush neared the threshold of his own renomination by sweeping the state's 72 GOP delegates in a pro forma victory over conservative Patrick Buchanan, who did not campaign here.

Thus, the Pennsylvania primary, which appeared to attract a low turnout of partisans in both parties, moved Clinton and Bush closer to their formal battle in the fall.

The Arkansas governor quickly built up a sustained advantage over his only active opponent, Jerry

Brown. There was more good news for Clinton in the exit surveys taken at polling places, which indicated that his negative ratings were going down.

With 81 percent of the precincts reporting, Clinton was rolling past Brown, 56 percent to 28 percent. Former Sen. Paul E. Tsongas of Massachusetts, who pulled out of the race last month, had 12 percent. Bush was winning 77 percent of the vote in the Republican race, to 28 percent for Buchanan, with 81 percent of the party's votes tallied.

The results guaranteed that Clinton will gain most of the 160 delegates at stake in the primary, which will push him closer to the

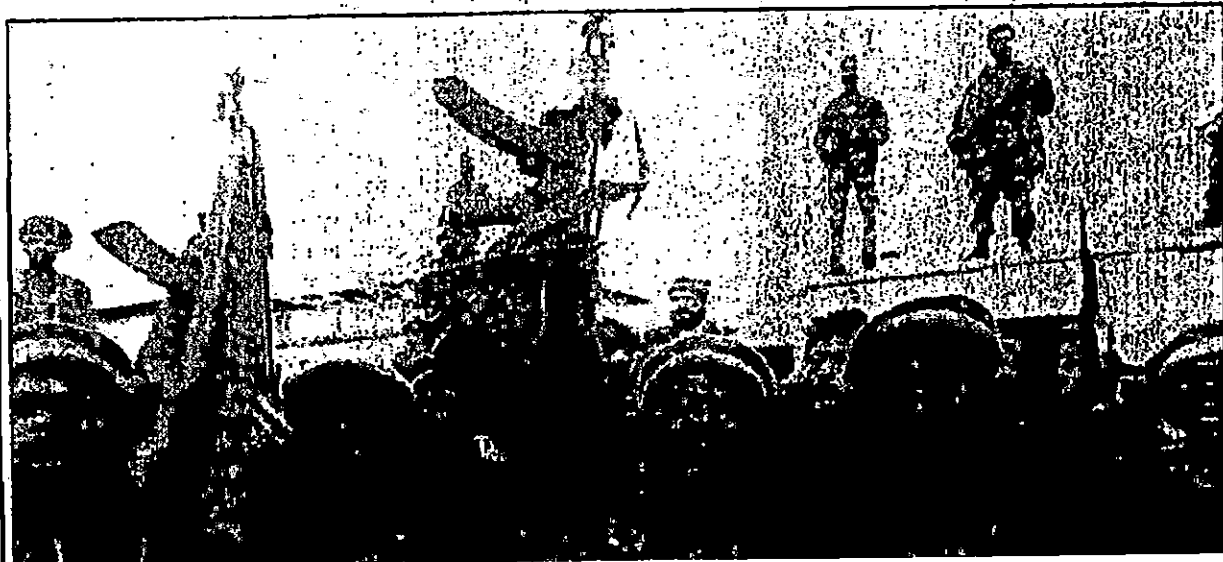

## As Bush faces critics on funds, diners with dollar

similar offers at their campaign fund-raisers, but Democrats said their attempt to change the system is being fought by Bush while he portrays himself as a champion of reform.

Indeed, the financial success of last night's dinner could not have come at a more awkward time for Bush. The Senate began final debate yesterday on the campaign financing bill, which Bush has promised to veto. Bush has said it is not tough enough because it would give corporations too much influence and because it would begin public financing of congressional races.

Democrats called Bush a hypocrite on the subject. The President's Dinner raised money largely with the help of corporations. At the same time, Bush is asking the Federal Election Commission this week for \$1.8 million in public funds for his reelection campaign. Bush has said he sees no contradiction with that request and his opposition to public funding for congressional races.

"We are at a crucial moment for the political system," said Fred Wertheimer, who runs the Common Cause lobby, which says it is trying to reform the campaign process. "On one hand we have the President's Dinner, which is a classic example of what's wrong with the way business is done in Washington. On the other

hand, we have Congress on the verge of passing landmark reform legislation. ... It is all in the president's hands."

But the White House made clear yesterday that Bush would veto the campaign financing bill. White House spokesman Marlin Fitzwater, asked about the propriety of guests at last night's fund-raiser buying tickets to sit with administration officials, acknowledged that the contributors were buying access.

"It's buying access to the system, yes," Fitzwater said. "That's what the political parties and the political operation is all about."

Fitzwater appeared to be emboldened to make the admission because Bush is not expected to be able to raise as much money as billionaire Ross Perot would use if he runs as an independent for the presidency. If Bush could not raise money for the party and congressional candidates as he did last night, Fitzwater said, "one rich man could always control every election."

The Senate Democratic leader, George Mitchell of Maine, has said that Bush is inconsistent on the subject of money and politics. Mitchell said that while Bush objects to public financing of congressional races, Bush as a vice presidential and presidential candidate will have benefited from \$200 million in public financing including more than \$60

million in taxpayer funds in the upcoming general election. In his fourth race for national office, Bush has been the beneficiary of more federal funds than any other candidate.

"There has been a return to the pre-Watergate, presidential campaign finance era," Mitchell said yesterday. "Wealthy individuals and corporations contribute enormous sums of money to fund presidential candidates. ... Some were awarded with ambassadorships. Some were beneficiaries of legislative initiatives proposed by the president."

The President's Dinner, this year at the Washington Convention Center, has become especially controversial because one of the dinner co-chairmen, James R. Elliott of Milwaukee, has been accused by a former employee, William Neiss, of firing him after Neiss refused to buy a \$1,500 ticket to the dinner. Bush said Monday that there should be no coercion, and Elliott denied it.

A Bush campaign spokesman said that Bush opposes the campaign finance bill — expected to reach the president's desk in the next days — partly because it fails to eliminate political action committees, which are often funded through corporations.

Nonetheless, last night's President's Dinner amounted to a show-

case of the nation's elite and most powerful individuals and corporations.

Many of the soft money contributors are members of the Republican group called "Team 100," which during the 1988 campaign raised \$25 million in \$100,000 contributions from just 249 individuals and corporations.

But the Republicans, though better funded, are not alone in holding high-priced fund-raisers. Gov. Bill Clinton, the Democratic front-runner, held a reception last night in Faneuil Hall that cost guests from \$250 to \$1,000 apiece. The highest contributors were allowed to ride with him from the airport.

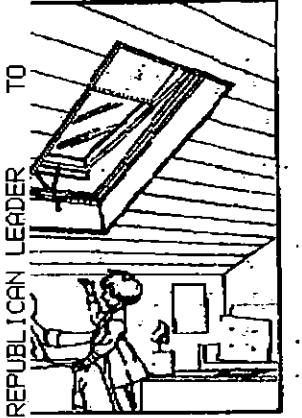
Democratic party officials and former presidential nominee Michael Dukakis raised more than \$40 million in soft money from 1988 to 1992, according to Common Cause.

The invitation to the President's Dinner minces no word about how the Republican Party wants contributors to take advantage of the loophole allowing soft money contributions. On a page labeled "Benefits for table buyers and fund-raisers," the invitation says that contribution are sought "exceeding" federal limits on such gifts.

The President's Dinner committee left the impression with some donors that all of the money was going directly to congressional candidates. But in fact, according to President's

Dear Mr. President:

We are a young, non-profit humanitarian organization seeking your help. Our members are volunteer pilots from several national origins which include: Argentinians, Venezuelans, Chileans, Nicaraguans, Cubans, and native Americans. Our objective is to save the lives of those who escape Cuba in rafts and other floating devices thru the Straits of Florida, while seeking freedom in the United States.

We regularly patrol the waters between Cuba and the Florida Keys and report to the U.S. Coast Guard the location of any vessel in distress we find for its immediate rescue. Academic sources that have studied this form of exodus from Cuba, estimate its cost in lives, as one success for every four attempts.

Brothers to the Rescue began operations on May 15, 1991. On December 31, 1991, only seven and a half months later, it had conducted, with the support of the local community in Miami, 204 search missions, and it had reported to the U.S. Coast Guard, the location of 28 individual rafts/vessels in distress for a total of 159 human lives saved as its direct result. During operations, our pilots also sighted 18 empty rafts/vessels for which we remained the witnesses of a great human tragedy.

We believe that you, as a pilot who knows the meaning of a rescue at sea, can appreciate, better than anyone else in the U.S. government, the importance of our effort. We need your help to tell my compatriots in Cuba that we both care.

Our problem is the lack of adequate equipment to realize our work. We are flying high risk, low efficiency airplanes. Some have a short range, some are single engine, some are poorly equipped and/or maintained rental aircraft, which make our missions sometimes inefficient and others outright dangerous. I dread the thought of losing anyone of my pilots.

We are requesting from you to allow us the use of three aircraft model Cessna FAC/O-2 which are kept mothballed by the U.S. Air Force since the Vietnam War. These aircraft were used for reconnaissance purposes and are particularly suited for our operations. Our pilots are very familiar with them.

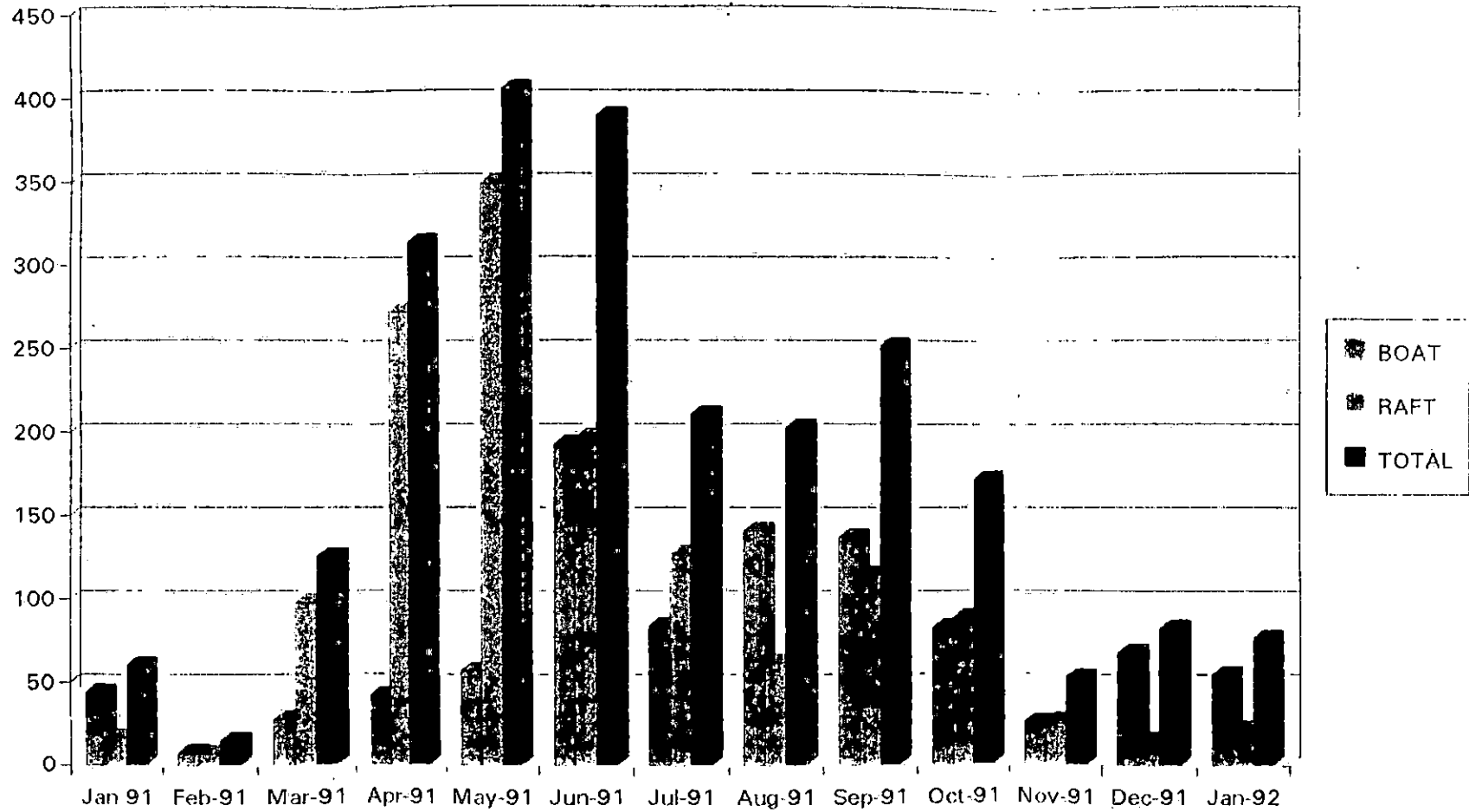
Please, Mr. President, hear the plea of our rafters for whom "Brothers to the Rescue" sometimes is their only hope.

It is to be privately financed and to this point we have already raised 42% of our first three-year budget.



CADCA is a nonprofit organization formed by recommendation of the President's Drug Advisory Council (PDAC) to President George Bush in January, 1991, with a purpose to continue and extend the mission of the PDAC regarding community anti-drug coalitions across America. The principal functions of CADCA will be to:

- (A) Continue Leadership Forums.
- (B) Encourage networking and regional cooperation to foster the growth and expansion of community anti-drug coalitions.
- (C) Provide training to start up and expand coalitions using its small staff plus volunteers from model coalitions.
- (D) Provide a national voice to assist in the formation of public policy re community anti-drug coalitions.

As a part of its mission, CADCA will:

- \* Respond to the new national strategy seeking to reduce the consumption of alcohol by adolescents.
- \* Recognize that many local community anti-drug coalitions have have a broader mission of substance abuse reduction which CADCA realizes is a proper prerogative of each local coalition. FACT SHEET ON CAPITAL MARKET REGULATION REFORMS

In response to the President's regulatory review initiative, the Securities and Exchange Commission (SEC) and the Commodity Futures Trading Commission (CFTC) today announced numerous regulatory changes designed to eliminate unnecessary regulatory burdens, reduce costs, and thereby to permit the Nation's capital markets to function more vigorously and efficiently.

Vigorous capital markets are essential for business expansion and job creation. Indeed, capital markets are the principal funding mechanism for the operation and growth of U.S. businesses. This is reflected in the fact that the value of all securities traded in U.S. capital markets -- including stocks, bonds, and commercial paper -- approaches \$12 trillion. In 1991, a record \$700 billion of new public and private financing occurred in the U.S. capital markets.

The reforms announced today fall into four general categories: (1) reforms that will expand choices for investors; (2) reforms that will streamline reporting and disclosure requirements, thereby making it easier for businesses to raise additional capital for expansion and job creation; (3) reforms that will increase capital available to small businesses; and (4) reforms that will make capital markets operate more efficiently. These reforms, some of which must be approved by the full SEC or CFTC, will achieve these goals without impairing the fundamental goals of investor protection and confidence that have made U.S. capital markets the best in the world.

1. Expanding Choices for Investors. The SEC and the CFTC are taking numerous actions to expand the range of choices available to investors, particularly small investors.

o Streamlined Regulation of Mutual Funds and Other Investment Companies. Registered investment companies, including mutual funds, represent the third largest sector of the U.S. financial system. They manage approximately \$1.5 trillion in assets. Mutual funds alone had more than 68 million investors at the end of 1991. The SEC's reform program will include the following steps to streamline and modernize the existing regulatory system:

- Remove Constraints on Asset-Backed Financing. The SEC's reform program will include new rules to exempt certain types of asset-backed securities from registration under the Investment Company Act of 1940. By expanding the types of assets (auto loan receivables, for example) that can be "securitized" without registration, the SEC's new rules will facilitate the creation of new, lower-cost methods of raising capital. The rules will also create new options for investors.
- Creating New Types of Investment Companies. The 1940 Act currently requires all "open end" mutual funds to offer redemption of shares every day. This makes it practically impossible for funds to invest in less liquid assets, such as the shares of start-up companies. To correct this problem, one SEC reform would permit development of a new type of investment company whose shares would be redeemable on a monthly, quarterly or semi-annual basis rather than daily.
- o Expanding Choices for Participants in Futures Markets. The CFTC is taking two important steps to expand choices for participants in futures markets:
  - Lifting the Ban on Trade Options. The CFTC has issued a proposed rule that would facilitate the offering of "trade options" -- i.e., options sold in the course of a commercial trading relationship rather than as investments. The proposed rule would not only expand investor choice, but also would permit agricultural concerns to obtain options that are tailored to their specific risk-shifting requirements.
  - Expanding the Availability of Foreign Option Products. Another proposed rule change would permit U.S. futures firms to engage in transactions in most foreign option contracts on behalf of customers outside the U.S.
- 2. Simplifying Reporting and Disclosure Requirements. The reforms announced today include numerous steps to simplify disclosure and reporting requirements. These steps will not only make it easier for investors to understand disclosure documents, but also will make it easier for businesses to raise capital for expansion.
- o Increased Use of "Shelf" Registration. In the 1980s, the SEC adopted a system for "shelf registration" of securities. Under this system, securities can be registered for delayed offering, thereby eliminating the need for further SEC review. This provides issuers greater flexibility in the timing, size, and manner of distributions, and reduces

costs. The SEC's reform program will include actions to expand the availability of shelf registration for all types of investment-grade, asset-backed securities. If such a rule change had been in effect in 1991, approximately \$48 billion of registered asset-backed securities could have been registered under these shelf-registration procedures.

- o Wider Availability of Rule 144A. SEC Rule 144A provides a "safe harbor" from registration requirements for resales of privately placed securities by large, sophisticated investors. The SEC's reform program will make it easier for institutional buyers such as insurance companies and pension funds to avail themselves of this safe harbor. This will increase the volume of securities sold in unregistered offerings, thereby reduce regulatory costs borne by issuers, intermediaries and investors.
- o Expanded Use of Simplified Registration. The SEC reform program will also include changes to enable an estimated 400 additional issuers, with an aggregate market capitalization of more than \$35 billion, to use Form S-3, a simplified registration form. This change will reduce by one-half the length of the prospectuses required to offer common stock and other securities for many of these issuers, resulting in significant cost savings.
- o Streamlined Requirements for Insider Reporting. The SEC's program will include steps to streamline reporting by a public company's officers, directors and significant shareholders of transactions in the company's securities. These steps will include action to address cash-only employee benefit plans and other broad-based employee benefit plans.
- o Simplifying Broker-Dealer Registration and Reporting Requirements. The SEC's program will finalize amendments to the basic registration form for broker-dealers to clarify and simplify disclosure requirements. The agency is also working with state regulators to develop a one-stop filing system for state and federal registration of broker-dealers.
- o Simplifying Disclosure for Commodity Pool Operators. The CFTC, in coordination with other regulators, has developed a simplified disclosure document format to be used by operators of "commodity pools" -- *i.e.*, investment vehicles in which investor funds are pooled to purchase interests in commodities. This change will enable pool operators to provide simplified disclosure to investors and to provide more detailed data only upon request.

- o Relieving Reporting Burdens on Commodity Pool Operators and Trading Advisors. The CFTC has issued a proposed regulation to exempt commodity pool operators from most of the disclosure, reporting and recordkeeping requirements for pools offered or sold to sophisticated investors in private offerings. This change will reduce -- possibly by up to 90% -- the costs of offering commodity fund participations to institutional and other sophisticated investors.
- o Expediting Registration of Commodities Brokers. The CFTC is working with the National Futures Association (NFA) to expedite a "direct entry" broker registration process now being tested in a pilot program. This program permits commodities brokers to enter required information directly into the NFA's computer system, thereby reducing delay and paperwork.
- o Eliminating Unnecessary Reports. The CFTC has issued proposed rules to reduce the volume of "large trader" and customer identification reports submitted by futures firms.

3. Increasing Capital Available To Small Businesses. In addition to the measures described above, the SEC is taking the following actions to increase access to capital by small businesses.

- o Amendments to Regulation A Offerings. Regulation A offerings of securities are less costly than registered offerings, and do not cause an issuer to incur periodic reporting obligations under the 1934 Securities Exchange Act. The SEC recently issued for public comment proposed revisions to permit more issuers to expand the availability of Regulation A offerings by increasing the annual dollar limit from \$1.5 million to \$5 million. It has also proposed a rule permitting the use of a simple question-and-answer format for the offering circular. Finally, the SEC has proposed to allow companies for the first time to "test the waters" for investor interest before incurring the expense of preparing offering documents. These changes will make it easier for small businesses to raise greater amounts of capital without incurring substantial legal and accounting expenses.
- o Small Debt Offerings. The SEC recently issued proposed rules that will expand exemptions to costly requirements for the issuance of corporate debt securities. The SEC's proposed amendments would exempt debt offerings, up to certain limits, from compliance with the Trust Indenture Act.

- o Seed Capital Offerings. The SEC recently issued proposed rule amendments to permit companies to receive up to \$1 million annually from the public without regulatory conditions.
- o Simplified Disclosure System for Small Businesses. The SEC has recently proposed simplified "junior" disclosure forms that can be used by small businesses to comply with securities registration and continuous reporting requirements.
- o Investments by Mutual Funds in Small Businesses. The SEC has recently taken two other steps to facilitate investment by mutual funds and other investment companies in small businesses. First, it has issued proposed rules to increase the dollar amount of securities that may be raised without registration by certain types of investment companies that specialize in small business investing. Second, it has published a release that allows mutual funds to increase the percentage of their assets that may be invested in the illiquid securities of small businesses.

4. Making Securities and Commodities Markets Operate More Efficiently. The SEC and the CFTC announced the following reforms to streamline the rules that govern the operation of U.S. capital trading markets. These changes will help make U.S. exchanges and other trading markets more efficient, as well as more competitive with their foreign counterparts.

- o Cross-margining for Option and Futures Positions. The SEC and the CFTC have recently approved rule proposals to reduce the margin requirements for transactions in which investors take positions in the securities and futures markets simultaneously. These rules will substantially reduce the margin deposits that investors must make on these transactions, thereby freeing up capital for alternative uses.
- o Streamlining Trading Practice Rules. The SEC's reform program will also streamline trading rules that apply to the distribution of securities. This includes amendments to codify and clarify the scope of SEC Rules 10b-6, 10b-7, and 10b-8, thereby providing greater certainty and reduced offering costs.
- o Eliminating "Low-Volume" Reports. The CFTC will eliminate a report that requires futures exchanges to prepare and submit low-volume futures reports.

(1) a review of existing programs to identify and expand the opportunities for such employees to be adult volunteers in schools and for students and out-of-school youth;

(2) the designation of a senior official in each such agency and department who will be responsible for establishing adult volunteer and partnership and youth service programs in each such agency and department and for developing adult volunteer and partnership and youth service programs;

(3) the encouragement of employees of such agencies and departments to participate in adult volunteer and partnership programs and other service projects;

(4) the annual recognition of outstanding service programs operated by Federal agencies; and

(5) the encouragement of businesses and professional firms to include community service among the factors considered in making hiring, compensation, and promotion decisions.

(b) REPORT.—Not later than 180 days after the date of enactment of this Act, and on a regular basis thereafter, the head of each Federal agency and department shall prepare and submit, to the appropriate Committees of Congress, a report concerning the implementation of this section.

#### SEC. 183. SERVICE AS TUTORS.

42 USC 12543.

Notwithstanding any other provision of this Act, a service opportunity through which a part-time participant serves as a classroom tutor under the supervision of a certified professional shall be considered an acceptable placement if the requirements of section 177(b) (1) and (2) and section 174 are met.

"(F) Annual adjusted family income does not include any living allowance received by a participant in programs established under the National and Community Service Act of 1990.";

(2) in section 411F(12)(B)(vi) (20 U.S.C. 1070a-6(12)(B)(vi)), by striking "(including all sources of resources other than par-

(2) **FAIR LABOR STANDARDS ACT OF 1938.**—For purposes of the Fair Labor Standards Act of 1938, residential youth corps programs under this subtitle will be considered an organized camp.

(c) **HEALTH INSURANCE.**—In addition to the living allowance provided under subsection (a), program agencies are encouraged to provide health insurance to each participant in a full-time youth corps program who does not otherwise have access to health insurance.

(d) **FACILITIES, SERVICES, AND SUPPLIES.**—

(1) **IN GENERAL.**—The program agency may deduct, from amounts provided under subsections (a) and (c) to a participant, a reasonable portion of the costs of the rates for any room and board that is provided for such participant at a residential facility. Such deducted funds shall be deposited into rollover accounts that shall be used solely to defray the costs of room and board for participants.

(2) **EVALUATION.**—The program agency shall establish the amount of the deductions and rates under paragraph (1) after evaluating the costs of providing such room and board to the participant.

(3) **DUTIES OF PROGRAM AGENCY.**—A program agency may provide facilities, quarters, and board and shall provide limited and emergency medical care, transportation from administrative facilities to work sites, accommodations for individuals with disabilities, and other appropriate services, supplies, and equipment to each participant.

(4) **OTHER FEDERAL AGENCIES.**—

(A) **IN GENERAL.**—The Commission may provide services, facilities, supplies, and equipment, including any surplus food and equipment available from other Federal programs, to any program agency carrying out projects under this subtitle.

(B) **SECRETARY OF DEFENSE.**—Whenever possible, the Commission shall make arrangements with the Secretary of Defense to have logistical support provided by a military installation near the work site, including the provision of temporary tent centers where needed, and other supplies and equipment.

(5) **HEALTH AND SAFETY STANDARDS.**—The Commission and program agencies shall establish standards and enforcement procedures concerning the health and safety of participants for all projects, consistent with Federal, State, and local health and safety standards.

42 USC 12454.

**SEC. 134. JOINT PROGRAMS.**

(a) **DEVELOPMENT.**—The Commission may develop, in cooperation with the heads of other Federal agencies, regulations designed to permit, where appropriate, joint programs in which activities supported with assistance made available under this subtitle are coordinated with activities supported with assistance made available under programs administered by the heads of such agencies (including the Job Training Partnership Act (29 U.S.C. 1501 et seq.)).

(b) **STANDARDS.**—Regulations promulgated under subsection (a) shall establish standards for the approval of joint programs that meet both the purposes of this title and the purposes of such statutes under which assistance is made available to support such projects.

(c) **OPERATION OF PROGRAMS.**—A participant may enter into contracts with a local government agency, labor organization, or management organization.

(d) **COORDINATION.**—Program agencies carrying out projects under this subtitle shall coordinate with related Federal, State, and local agencies.

**SEC. 135. FEDERAL AND STATE PROGRAMS.**

(a) **IN GENERAL.**—A participant may be the responsible person, or be the responsible person, for carrying out the program on a voluntary basis.

(b) **NON-FEDERAL EMPLOYMENT.**

(1) **IN GENERAL.**—A participant, while receiving assistance under this subtitle, shall not be employed by a Federal agency or State or local government agency relating to Federal or State programs.

(2) **WORK-RELATED ACTIVITIES.**—A participant shall not be employed by a Federal agency or State or local government agency under this subtitle while receiving assistance under this subtitle. United States with respect to a participant defined in section 134(b)(1) shall not be employed by a Federal agency or State or local government agency under this subtitle while receiving assistance under this subtitle.

(A) the term "participant" shall include a participant or crew leader while a participant or crew leader is performing activity authorized by this subtitle during the provision of a program or during the installation of a program.

(B) compensation shall be provided until the day following the day of injury to an injured participant.

(3) **TORT CLAIMS.**—A participant or crew leader shall not be considered a participant or crew leader for which a grant or award is made under this subtitle, Secretary of Defense shall be considered a participant or crew leader for the meaning of the term "participant or crew leader" in section 2671 of subtitle B of title 5, United States Code.

(4) **ALLOWANCE FOR TRAVEL.**—A participant or crew leader, a participant or crew member of the United States, shall be considered an "employee" as defined in section 2671 of subtitle B of title 5, United States Code.

(c) **AVAILABILITY OF ASSISTANCE.**—Assistance made available under this subtitle shall be available for activities that are in the area in which the participant is carrying out the program.

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(D) PARTICIPANTS IN PROGRAMS.—An individual receiving an award under this subsection need not be a participant in a program assisted under this title.

(2) INFORMATION.—The President shall ensure that information concerning individuals and programs receiving awards under this subsection is widely disseminated.

(h) REPORT.—Not later than January 1, 1993, the President shall prepare and submit to the Committee on Labor and Human Resources of the Senate and the Committee on Education and Labor of the House of Representatives, a report containing recommendations for the improvement of the administration and coordination of volunteer, national, and community service programs administered by the ACTION Agency, the Commission on National Service, and other Federal entities. Such report shall include—

(1) an assessment of whether Federal volunteer, national and community service programs could be more cost effectively and efficiently administered by a single Federal entity or fewer entities, including an estimate of any cost savings that could be achieved by consolidating or centralizing the management of such programs; and

(2) a description of the roles and responsibilities of the ACTION Agency, the Commission on National Service and other Federal entities in developing and coordinating National policy on voluntarism and national and community service and any recommendations for clarifying or altering the missions and responsibilities of such entities which may be appropriate.

In honor of National Volunteer Week, the President today recognized the volunteers of the Youth and Elderly Against Crime Project of Miami, Florida, as the 756th Daily Point of Light for the Nation. These teenagers and senior citizens are joining forces to make Dade County a decent, drug free, and safe place to live.

Now in its second year, the Youth and Elderly Against Crime Project is a partnership of several organizations, including the Dade County Public Schools, Jewish Family Service of Greater Miami, the City of Miami Police Department, and the Metropolitan Dade County Police Department. Students team up with senior citizens and local police to protect the city's elderly community from violence and other crime. Originally, the project linked residents of housing projects to teenagers from the three Miami high schools which had the highest rates of nearby crime. In their social studies and criminal justice classes, students surveyed the seniors in the designated projects and centers and found that drug-related violence and heightened racial tensions had made them virtual prisoners in their own homes.

Youth and Elderly Against Crime has since expanded to include students from seven high schools and two middle schools. By working together in teams of five to six students and one senior citizen mentor, intergenerational groups learn to respect each other's concerns and to protect themselves from crime. Groups meet at least once each week. Police officers teach them about safety and crime prevention so that the groups, in turn, can give presentations to their senior neighbors. Teen and senior volunteers from the Youth and Elderly Against Crime Project are reclaiming their neighborhoods and forming strong friendships that cross generational and ethnic lines.

In honor of National Volunteer Week and Youth Service Day, the President today recognized Jeff Gower as the 757th Daily Point of Light for the Nation. Mr. Gower, a senior at Union College in Schenectady, New York, works to provide low-income people in his community with a decent place to live.

Mr. Gower, originally from Lexington, Massachusetts, began refurbishing low-income homes through a Habitat for Humanity program with his church's youth group while he was in high school. After matriculating at Union College, he saw the need for a similar program that could mobilize students. With the support of school administrators, city officials, and fellow students, he founded "We Care About U - Schenectady." This group repairs homes owned by Better Neighborhoods, Inc. (BNI), a local non-profit housing rehabilitation corporation.

Mr. Gower, 22, has attended nearly 40 Saturday work days since the program started in January of 1991. Serving as the group's president, he volunteers as many as twenty hours per week in addition to being a full-time student. He helps gut, frame, insulate, sheet rock, and trim the interiors of homes being refurbished. As a civil engineering major, with an emphasis on structural engineering and construction management, he has also trained other volunteers who have no construction background.

Mr. Gower and nearly 80 other volunteers contributed over \$7,000 worth of labor costs on the first house they constructed. BNI donates the building materials and Union College provides other needed supplies, such as power tools and lunches.

In honor of National Volunteer Week, the President today recognized the volunteers of the Chi Chi Rodriguez Youth Foundation, Inc., of Clearwater, Florida, as the 758th Daily Point of Light for the Nation. The volunteers give troubled youth a second chance in life, helping them develop good character and values.

Established in 1979 by Professional Golfers Association champion Chi Chi Rodriguez, educator Bill Hayes, and the late Bob James, the Foundation's goal is to instill greater self-esteem in young people who have been victims of abuse, experienced minor brushes with the law, or suffered other hardships.

"Chi Chi's Kids," is an after-school program at Glen Oaks Golf Course and the Chi Chi Rodriguez Golf Club. Volunteers teach horticulture, golf and retail skills, as well as personal life management, hygiene, and social behavior to over 100 young people, who are referred to the program by teachers, counselors, or concerned citizens. Specific learning strategies are tailored individually to each child, whose progress is regularly reviewed. Children receive free clothing, legal assistance, and, if necessary, psychological treatment. Over 40 volunteers play golf with the youth, lead field trips, tutor them in many subjects, and help with golf course maintenance and administrative matters. Mr. Rodriguez periodically telephones "his kids" to check on their progress and visits them at times throughout the year.

Volunteers are involved in the Foundation's program which enables several hundred youth and adults with minor criminal backgrounds to learn landscaping and other job skills, while fulfilling court-ordered service requirements. The Foundation also provides the facilities, equipment, and expertise that enable 40 people with mental and physical disabilities to experience golf and recreation. In addition, Foundation golf pros work with other youth organizations through the "Performance Toyota Golf Program for Special Kids."

In honor of National Volunteer Week, the President today recognized the volunteers of New York City Relief as the 759th Daily Point of Light for the Nation. These volunteers provide a wide variety of support services to New York's homeless population.

In 1989, after 23 years of success in private business, Richard and Dixie Galloway turned their energies to the plight of homeless people in New York City. After extensive research, the Galloways discovered that numerous support services were already available. Their challenge was to match homeless individuals with services which would best meet their needs. With this objective in mind, the Galloways converted an old school bus into a medical clinic, kitchen, and resource office which travels to different neighborhoods, five days a week, and remains there from 10:00 a.m. to 2:00 p.m.

New York City Relief is run entirely by volunteers, who include housewives, doctors, and college students, and who range in age from 15 to 86 years. Nine volunteers donate full days to the operation of the mobile resource office, while the number of part-time volunteers ranges from 25 during the winter to over 100 throughout the summer. The volunteers work on location, serving food, administering first aid, and directing homeless individuals to the agencies able to meet their needs.

Whether serving someone a hot meal, escorting an addict to a detoxification clinic, or referring a pregnant woman to Cornell University's free pre-natal, birth, and post-natal care, New York City Relief volunteers touch the lives of more than 3,000 homeless men and women each day. One example is Larry, who after a 15-year heroine addiction, came to New York City Relief for assistance. He was accompanied to a detoxification program and eventually to drug rehabilitation by a volunteer. Today, he is drug-free, gainfully employed, and volunteers at New York City Relief every Friday. Because of the program's success, it has been replicated in Toronto and Philadelphia.

In honor of National Volunteer Week, the President today recognized Rosemarie Williams of Riverside, California, as the 760th Daily Point of Light for the Nation. Mrs. Williams helps women with developmental disabilities develop independence and a sense of well-being.

Mrs. Williams, 72, was inspired to serve individuals with mental disabilities because of her experiences with her own daughter, now 32, who is developmentally disabled. For the past six years, Mrs. Williams has been a volunteer with the Association of Retarded Citizens - Riverside (ARC). Four hours a day, five days a week, Mrs. Williams teaches personal hygiene and basic life skills to developmentally disabled young women between the ages of 9 and 40 years. In addition to better personal grooming habits, cooking skills, and other independent living skills, the women have the opportunity to learn how to socialize and develop relationships with their peers. As a result of Mrs. Williams' patient guidance, many of these women have become more confident and self-assured.

Prior to her work with ARC, Mrs. Williams organized and led a Girl Scout Troop for girls with developmental disabilities. She created her own Troop Merit Badge, called "Thinking," which is still used by troops throughout her area. Many of the girls from her troop now attend her classes at ARC. Over the years, Mrs. Williams has developed a number of programs which enable developmentally disabled children to enjoy swimming, hiking, and camping.

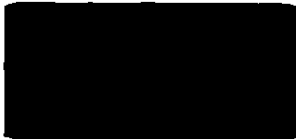

Alexander Says Clinton's Education Plans Hampered by Traditionalists

WASHINGTON (AP) - Education Secretary Lamar Alexander said Friday whatever creative ideas the Democratic presidential nominee proposes for improving schools will be rejected by his key supporters - "the business as usual crowd."

Alexander sidestepped the issue of whether his boss, President Bush, and Arkansas Gov. Bill Clinton, the front-runner for the Democratic nomination, have similar strategies to improve learning in America.

"I think the president's got an agenda and the presidential nominee's got a problem (because) he's got the business-as-usual crowd for his supporters," Alexander told a luncheon at the National Press Club.

"It will be more difficult for the Democratic nominee to be a strong advocate for revolutionary change in the schools ... The business-as-usual crowd will not go for revolutionary ideas," he said.

Bush on Thursday proposed giving all Americans a \$25,000 line of government-backed credit to pay for higher education or acquire new job skills. The money could be borrowed through the Student Loan Marketing Association, a quasi-governmental agency known as Sallie Mae, which in turn would sell \$100 million in securities a year to pay for it.

Terms of repayment would vary, with interest charges keyed to recipients' ability to pay.

Bush said he plans to include the idea as part of education legislation he will propose to Congress later this year.

Clinton has proposed a new national trust fund that would allow any person to borrow money for schooling and be able to repay it either through payroll deductions based on their income, or through community service.

Clinton's campaign spokesman Jeff Eller has said that Bush "borrowed parts" of the Democratic candidate's education program.

Alexander, noting the first anniversary of Bush's education reform program called America 2000, said Bush "has a clear agenda for revolutionary change in education."

He said the six national education goals developed by Bush and the nation's governors as part of America 2000 have been accepted across the country.

He said businesses also have accepted Bush's challenge to work with educators and others to design new ways to teach schoolchildren; teachers are being given more flexibility in operating their classes; and a national system of testing students is being developed.

"The Democratic nominee will have the same sort of problems with education as Paul Tsongas had with the Democratic Party on taxes," said Alexander. "The Democratic nominee will be under pressure" to limit to only certain schools key changes in the educational system.

Meanwhile, Alexander said Bush is working to implement a number of key changes in all schools, including private and religious.

Congress has rejected many of Bush's education initiatives, particularly those that would give low-income parents the choice to use tax dollars to send their children to public, private or parochial schools.

Alexander says America's schools can be best

WASHINGTON (UPI) - Education Secretary Lamar Alexander, praising his boss George Bush's record in education as reason to re-elect him president, said Friday that America can create the best schools in the world by the year 2000.

In an address to a lunchtime crowd at the National Press Club, Alexander touted "America 2000" - the strategy Bush unveiled a year ago Saturday to make Americans better educated that has been largely snubbed by Congress.

Alexander said the plan is working slowly but surely and that it can succeed if implemented to full term.

"This is not a seven-second sound bite," Alexander said of Bush's ambitious education reform package. "This is not even a 100-hour war. There is no solution that we can cook up here for what we need to do about education that comes in the form of legislation and some more money and instant result. It's more than that. And we have finished one year of a nine-year crusade."

Alexander said during the 30-minute speech that Bush's record as an "education president" is reason for Americans to give him a second term in the White House.

"I believe his leadership in education is one very good reason to give him another term because it would be an opportunity for him to finish the job," Alexander said.

The education secretary's remarks came a day after Bush, in an election-year speech, heralded "America 2000" as it approached its anniversary and reissued an old proposal to upgrade education that has been already shot down by Congress.

The plan calls for offering Americans of all ages a \$25,000 line of credit for higher education expenses. It was introduced in the House earlier this year but died on procedural grounds without coming to a vote.

"America 2000" includes building 535 so-called break-the-mold new schools, using federal dollars to give parents greater choice in selecting a school for their youngster, and alternative teacher certification.

With assistance from the nation's governors, Bush also set six lofty education goals for the year 2000 - children ready to learn when they come to school; 90 percent high school graduation rate, up from the current 70 percent; all pupils learning to a world-class standard in at least math, science, English, history, and geography; first in the world in math and science; skilled, literate work force; drug-free, violence-free schools.

Alexander said 43 states and 1,100 communities have adopted "America 2000."

"The goals have become the nation's goals," he said. "I feel we're making a little bit of progress every day. We can create the best schools in the world. This is the nation that grew up reading 'The Little Engine That Could.'"

"If we can put a missile down a smokestack, we can create the best schools by the end of this century," Alexander said.

The education secretary lamented that Congress, which has largely shelved "America 2000" as inadequate or even harmful, won't embrace the reform plan.

"It's hard for Congress to catch on," Alexander said. "The president asks for Congress to help communities, create break-the-mold schools, and they won't even provide the funding that would jump-start the first 1 percent of the 50,000 break-the-mold schools that we need."

Alexander said education will be a big issue in the long run for the White House.

''Elections shape the future of the country,'' he said. ''Education shapes the future of the country. ... The president has a clear agenda for revolutionary change in education.''

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PARTIAL TRANSCRIPT OF QUESTIONS AND ANSWERS  
THE NATIONAL PRESS CLUB LUNCHEON  
APRIL 17, 1992

Q: You made reference to the Sperling breakfast the other day in which, as I heard it, you said education would not be an issue in this election because Bill Clinton and George Bush are so close together in what they want. Do you still believe that, and, if so, how is the President and Bill Clinton going to differentiate themselves on education?

A: Well as I said, different people heard it different ways. The Christian Science Monitor said Alexander says education will be a battle ground in the fall so here's what I think about that. I think it's up to the President of the United States to set his agenda and it's up to the Democratic nominee to set his agenda and they will. You and other reporters will see the differences. I think, when I might have tried to explain the different kinds of issues, priority issues and then divisive campaign issues, that got confusing. So I think I'll stick with the idea that it'll be a big issue. I think if I were going to predict what might happen I would say that in this case it will be more difficult for the Democratic nominee to be a strong advocate for revolutionary change in the schools because the Democratic nominee will be in this case the establishment candidate. And I think the Democratic nominee will have the same sort of problem with education that Paul Tsongas had with the Democratic party on taxes. And we're likely to see issues develop like the President is saying: "Well let's have break-the-mold New American Schools with everybody involved coming up with the best ideas in the world. And the business-as-usual crowd will be saying: "Well, no, no, no, let's not let everybody get involved, let's give the money only to the people who gave us the schools we have. And the Democratic nominee will be under great pressure to say only for some schools. And the President will say: "Let's give middle- and low-income families more of the same choices of all schools that wealthy people already have," and the Democratic nominee will be under great pressure from the establishment and the business-as-usual crowd to say only choices of some schools. Or, the President will say: "Let's take the Federal money and give teachers flexibility in every state, in every community." And the business-as-usual crowd will say: "We can't untie the teachers' hands in that way we have a lot of rules and regulations we've got on," and that will put pressure on the Democratic nominee.

So I think the President's got an agenda and the Democratic nominee's got a problem. He's got the business-as-usual crowd for his supporters and we'll see what happens.

- Q: This questioner says a recent Washington Post article criticized President Bush for being almost invisible on his education promises. It quoted numerous people saying that his interests appear totally political and that he had nowhere near the genuine interest exhibited by you, his Secretary of Education. The article had numerous examples of his apparent disinterest, including no personal lobbying on recent education spending bills in Congress. To quote a former Democratic Presidential candidate, "where's the beef?"
- A: Well, the beef is the first National Education Goals in history, 43 states and more than a thousand communities in AMERICA 2000, a nation moving toward World-Class Standards, break-the-mold New American Schools, a national examination system, flexibility for teachers, choices for students, and a Federal education budget that puts more new money into education than into any other department in this government in new discretionary dollars. The beef is a half-billion dollars for the break-the-mold schools, a half-billion dollars to give families choices, the largest increase in history for Head Start, the largest increase in history proposed for grants and loans to help students go to college. The beef is, yesterday offering every American a \$25,000 line of credit for education and job training to be paid back out of earnings. There's plenty of beef, and the sooner members of the news media would report what the candidates propose and the merits of them and let the people worry about that instead of some of these side issues, I think the more people would know about it. I was with the President in Columbus, Ohio, for a day, a day, kicking off OHIO 2000. He got back into the car and he said a miracle happened. I said what? He said someone asked me a question about education. It's not on the front page, it's not at the top of the evening news. It's just the solution to most of what is at the top of the evening news and on the front page. And as people learn more about it in the campaign, they'll see he's not only not been invisible, he gives an enormous amount of time to it. I don't have a single complaint about the amount of time he spends on it, and I don't know of any Cabinet member on the domestic side anyway, who has easier access to him or who spends more time with him.
- Q: What is the strategy to bring African American students to the academic level of their counterparts in the public school system when state and local governments are cutting their education budget?
- A: The first strategy -- or first a correction. State and local governments overall aren't cutting their education budget. I know it seems like it because it hasn't been

going up as rapidly, but over the last four years education spending in the states is up 25 percent and in the Federal government it's up 41 percent. Now, it's been a tough time because for two or three years we've been in a recession, that makes managing the money hard. But the first thing to do for African-American students or Hispanic students or any other students, a large number whom may be at risk, is to expect of them exactly what we expect of everybody else and then do everything we can to help them succeed. I like the Henry Levin Accelerated Schools, such as the Coghill Elementary School in New Orleans, and there are many others. It's called accelerated because they slow no one down; they just speed everybody up who's behind. They do not accept, for a minute, that a child cannot learn and they succeed in that goal. Now it takes extra effort, it might take a longer school day, it may take more volunteers, it may take parents who get more involved, it may take foster grandparents, it may take turning off the television, it may take a lot of things; but any community that wants to help at-risk children succeed can do that. It's just a matter of the community deciding to do that. That's all it takes. The children can learn, and it is a grave disservice to African-Americans or anyone else to say, well, all of you who can learn come up here to the front and all of you who are African-American go over here because we assume you won't be able to learn as well. We've done that in our history. We should not do it anymore.



**Conference Proposes Shift of Pilot, Flight Engineer  
Penalty Adjudications from FAA to NTSB**

Nancy G. Miller

In its 1991 Plenary Session, the Administrative Conference of the United States addressed for the second time issues involving the Federal Aviation Administration's demonstration program. The Conference recommended that the program be made permanent and that the current limitation to cases involving penalties be lifted, but that the small portion of cases involving pilots and flight engineers be transferred from the FAA to the National Transportation Safety Board. All other cases, including those involving the FAA's controversy resolution program, would remain with the FAA.

The Conference has enacted a two-year demonstration program that authorized the FAA to impose money penalties administratively for violations of aviation safety rules. The program transferred FAA's authority to cases involving less than \$50,000. Under the program, cases are heard by the FAA, with hearings before administrative law judges in the

Department of Transportation (DOT), and review by the FAA Administrator. Aviation safety violations for which the FAA seeks to revoke or suspend a certificate have historically been heard by the National Transportation Safety Board.

Since the fairly controversial demonstration program came into effect in 1987, civil money penalties have become a realistically available enforcement option. Previously, civil penalties were only available if the Department of Justice brought a civil action in district court.

As the program was reaching the end of its initial term, the Administrative Conference, at the request of the FAA, undertook a study focusing primarily on whether the administrative civil penalty program should be extended, and whether changes should be made in the FAA's procedural regulations. Recommendation 90-1 addressed these issues, proposing, among other things, that the program be made permanent. See 1 C.F.R. § 305.90-1 (1991).

Congress extended the program through 1992, but specifically directed the Conference to examine the issue of where adjudicatory authority should reside in civil penalty cases under the Federal Aviation Act. Based on a report by Professor Henry Perritt, Jr. of Villanova University Law School, the Conference ultimately reiterated its proposal that the program be made permanent, with no dollar cap on administrative cases, and recommended that cases involving pilots and flight engineers be transferred to the NTSB, with all other civil money penalty cases remaining at DOT. In making this recommendation, the Conference sought to balance concerns about a potential conflict between the FAA as administrator of the air traffic control system and its role as decision maker in cases where controllers might have some responsibility for air safety violations. It also sought to ensure that the FAA retained substantial control over enforcement policy. Recommendation 91-8, 56 Fed. Reg. 67139, 67141 (1991). The Conference transmitted its Recommendation to Congress in mid-January.

The demonstration program expires in August 1992 and Congress is beginning to hold hearings on its extension.

SUBJECT: STATUS REPORT ON RIO CONFERENCE

The preparatory process for the U.N. Conference on Environment and Development (UNCED) completed its final session last month. Many points of debate have been resolved, but some significant matters remain open for conclusion in Rio. The United States has played a leadership role throughout the process and has made particularly significant contributions on issues which link democracy, free markets, and wise environmental protection.

**Major philosophical message:**

In the most fundamental terms, the Rio meeting is about the integration of environment and economic concerns. Some have used the term "sustainable development" to describe this linkage, although that term has been defined in countless ways.

**Deliverables and status:**

- **The Rio Declaration** will be comprised of major international norms establishing the linkages between environmental and economic development concerns. Status: a draft exists for negotiation in Rio.
- **Agenda 21** is a lengthy listing of policy and program options which might be adopted by individual nations around the globe. Agenda 21 covers over 25 specific topic areas, ranging from the world's oceans to protection of freshwater, from technology cooperation and science to financial resources. Status: Work has been completed on all but a few, very contentious topic areas, which will be raised again in Rio.
- **Principles for Protection of the World's Forests** stem from a proposal by the United States at the G-7 Summit in Houston 1990 and will cover all types of forests in all countries. Status: Will need additional discussion in Rio, particularly in connection with technology cooperation and financial resource implications.
- **Framework Convention on Global Climate Change** is due to be opened for signature in Rio. Status: The final negotiating session for the climate convention takes place April 30 through May 8, in New York.
- **Framework Convention on Biological Diversity** is also due to be opened for signature in Rio. Status: Final negotiating session takes place May 11 through 21, in Nairobi.





The VETFRAN Program includes a wide range of franchise opportunities to choose from, and the list of "Participating Franchisors" should triple by the end of this year. The veteran will contact the franchisor of his choice, and then be prequalified by the franchisor (ability, credit history, personal financial statement etc.). The franchisor

Mr. EDWARDS of Texas. Mr. Speaker, as a Member of the House Veterans Affairs Committee, I rise in support of a new and unique initiative designed to assist America's veterans, who have sacrificed so much for our Nation, find opportunities in small business franchise ownership. The program is called the veterans transition franchise initiative [VETFRAN] and was created by one of my constituents, a Waco, Texas, entrepreneur and Korean War veteran Don Dwyer.

VETFRAN is sponsored and supported by the International Franchise Association (IFA) and the Small Business Administration (SBA) and is designed to help the veteran make an easier transition from the military to the civilian sector.

On November 7, 1991, just prior to the first Veterans Day following the Persian Gulf War, this program, which can help millions of veterans, was announced at the National Press Club in Washington, D.C., to make each and every veteran in America aware of the opportunities presented by VETFRAN.

Under the program, more than 100 member companies of the International Franchise Association are offering veterans either a reduced franchise fee or market-rate financing for up to half the fee. The Small Business Administration will provide management and financial counseling and offer loans to eligible Vietnam and disabled veterans.

All veterans have until August 15, 1993, to apply to the program. Armed Forces members returning to civilian life between now and that date will have two years from the date of discharge to apply.

The Nation's franchise companies and more than 500,000 franchised businesses account for more than one-third of all retail sales in the U.S., and they should be commended for rising to the challenge of creating business opportunities, self employment and employment opportunities for the hundreds of thousands of armed services members who will be returning to private life in the near future.

I want to commend Don Dwyer for his vision and tenacity in bringing this far-sighted program into reality. He is an example of the kind of patriotic, can-do entrepreneur that has made our country the greatest land of opportunity in the world.

I urge my colleagues to join me in strongly supporting this small business initiative, and to encourage our veterans to consider participating in this business opportunity.

Dear Veteran:

Welcome to the Veterans Transition Franchise Initiative (VETFRAN). The purpose of this newsletter is to keep you informed of the developments in the VETFRAN Program, and to provide you with an updated list of participating franchisors. Your primary contacts for developments in the program will be Baxter Coffee and Patti Fernelius, VETFRAN Administrators, P.O. Box 3146, Waco, TX, 76707, 817-753-4555.

The purpose of the VETFRAN program is to introduce veterans to business opportunities in the franchise industry. The International Franchise Association (IFA) was motivated by President Bush's appeal to the American business community to provide more and better business opportunities for America's veterans. Don Dwyer VETFRAN creator and founder, petitioned William Cherkasky, International Franchise Association President, for national support from the franchise community.

Franchisors across the nation rallied behind the program, and on August 14, 1991, after seven months of organization the Veterans Transition Franchise Initiative was officially launched. Don's efforts were recognized by the White House and the United States Congress. He was awarded a "Certificate of Merit" by President Bush and was commended by Congress for being "...the kind of patriotic, can-do entrepreneur that has made our country the greatest land of opportunity in the world". "We want to show our active duty military personnel, and all veterans, that the franchise industry cares about their future", say Dwyer. "It is our way of saying thank you to those who have protected this nation".

The IFA has asked participating franchisors to create a program of tangible benefits for the veterans in the form of discounted franchise fees and/or by agreeing to finance a percentage of their franchise fee. Veterans must be able to meet all usual and customary qualifications of their selected franchisor prior to being accepted as a franchisee. Current members of the Armed Forces will have up to 24 months following their discharge to begin their participation in VETFRAN. All other veterans must begin their participation within 24 months after the onset of VETFRAN, that is, not later than August 14, 1993. An individual must show proof of veterans status (e.g. DD 214) and have been discharged other than dishonorably.


The primary benefits of the VETFRAN program are the substantial financial discounts and financing arrangements the participating franchisors are offering to the veterans. Enclosed with your Newsletter is a current list of "Participating Franchisors", including their telephone number, contact person and business classification. The VETFRAN Program includes a wide range of franchise opportunities to choose from, and the list of "Participating Franchisors" should triple by the end of this year. The veteran will contact the franchisor of his choice, and then be prequalified by the franchisor (ability, credit history, personal financial statement etc.). The franchisor

will counsel the veterans regarding the franchise industry, as well as discuss the most appropriate vehicle to finance the franchise purchase, i.e. personal assets, friends/relatives, conventional loan or SBA guaranteed loan. If a conventional loan, or bank loan guaranteed by the SBA is required, the veteran needs to be aware of the fact that he/she will still need to have a clean credit history and reasonable collateral. If the veteran does not have enough money to purchase a franchise he/she may need to obtain a conventional loan from a bank or other key lender. The veteran goes to the Key Lender who will discuss financing with him and provide a loan application for a regular commercial loan. The lender may direct the veteran to a CPA or "loan packager" to assist him in completing the loan application, business plan and forms. Loan packagers charge from \$250.00 to \$1,500.00 to provide these services. The SBA and its associated resources (S.C.O.R.E., S.B.D.C.) also can assist veterans in developing a business plan and loan application; however neither the SBA, S.C.O.R.E. or the S.B.D.C.'s can fill out SBA loan application forms for the veteran. Some franchisors have in-house loan packagers that can provide assistance. If the applicant is a Vietnam era veteran, or has a 30% or more compensable disability, and the veteran has been turned down by a bank for a commercial loan and the SBA for a guaranteed loan (for other than credit reasons) the SBA does have the limited resources to make a direct loan, (ceiling of \$150,000.00).

As soon as you receive this newsletter you may begin contacting the franchise of your choice. If there is a specific franchise you are interested in that does not appear on the list, please call us at 817-753-4555 and we will immediately contact the franchisor and make them aware of the program. If you belong to a veterans group or organization please feel free to have them contact us so that we may include them on our mailing list.

We would encourage all veterans to seek out those franchisors who are displaying the VETFRAN logo in their promotional materials. As you attend NCOA sponsored Job Fairs and joint NCOA/International Franchise Association Exposition seminars be sure to look for the VETFRAN logo being displayed in the participating franchisors trade booth; this logo means they support VETFRAN and are offering special discounts and/or financing arrangements for veterans. We wish each of you the best of luck in pursuing your new business opportunities.

# INTRODUCTION

As the nation watched the Gulf War on television, Don Dwyer, President of

The Dwyer Group (an international conglomerate of franchised businesses based in Texas), decided that he had to do more for veterans than just cheer them on from the safety of his living room. He considered the traditional ways that people support veterans, but saw nothing that captured the spirit on the scale he envisioned.

Don conceived an ideal solution while attending the February 1991 International Franchise Association (IFA) annual meeting. A veteran himself, he understood that all our veterans have fought to protect America's free enterprise system, and the heart of that system is private business ownership. Don decided that the best thing we can do as franchisors is to help veterans start their own business. Don believes that private enterprise is the ultimate American dream.

Don began to lay out his plan of action: first, he would convince national franchisors to agree to reduce or finance their franchise fees up to 50 percent for veterans; second, he would enlist the help of government agencies (SBA, VA, etc.) to consider lending their support to the program by publicizing and/or including VETFRAN in their existing veteran's assistance programs. The third phase of the program would be to encourage the nation's key leading institutions to support the program by giving veterans pursuing careers in franchising special consideration.

Initially, many of Don's colleagues were skeptical that enough national franchisors would rally around our veterans to create a program of real benefit and tangible value. In order to facilitate his efforts, Don petitioned William Cherkasky, International Franchise Association President, for national support from the franchise community. Don personally provided all the capital necessary for the research, start-up and administration of the program, and made dozens of trips to Washington and around the country to promote the project.

Franchisors across the nation rallied behind the program, and on August 14, 1991, after seven months of organization the Veterans Transition Franchise Initiative was officially launched. Don's efforts were recognized by the White House and the United States Congress. He was awarded a "Certificate of Merit" by President Bush and was commended by Congress for being "... the kind of patriotic, can-do entrepreneur that has made our country the greatest land of opportunity in the world". "We want to show our active duty military personnel, and all veterans, that the franchise industry cares about their future", says Dwyer. "It is our way of saying thank you to those who protected this nation".

# PUBLIC AWARENESS:

On Thursday, November 7th, 1991, after three months of preliminary organization, VETFRAN was officially launched at a press conference at the National Press Club in Washington, DC. Don Dwyer's dream of making it easier and more affordable for veterans to pursue a career in franchising has become a reality.

Publicity for the program has put the franchise industry in the media spotlight across the country. VETFRAN articles have been featured in the Wall Street Journal, Success Magazine, "U.S.A. Today", U.S. News & World Report, "The New York Times", The Nations Business, Good Housekeeping, the American Legion Magazine, D.A.V. Magazine, all the military periodicals, national television programs, and more than three dozen newspapers in 22 markets.

This multi-million dollar publicity campaign, spearheaded by The Hayes Group of Pennsylvania, is currently generating more than 1,000 veteran inquiries per month. A large number of these inquiries have been from enlisted personnel stationed at military bases that have been targeted for downsizing. Many of these people have received lump sum financial compensation from the government, and are looking to invest in second career opportunities. We have received dozens of inquiries from professional people (i.e., doctors, dentists, etc.) who are veterans of earlier conflicts and are wanting to leave their liability-intensive careers.

Since VETFRAN has become a reality, some of the banks and franchisors that had initially withheld their support are now lining up to join the program. There are currently more than 125 franchisors and over 200 lending institutions participating in the program. Participating franchisors contribute \$1,000 per year to help defray the \$10,000 per month cost of administering VETFRAN's national network of 1,000 veterans organizations, its ongoing lobbying efforts, veterans hotline, national publicity campaign, and its more than 3,000 newsletters.

# THE PROGRAM

VETFRAN is a cooperative effort of the public and private sectors: the International Franchise Association, a cosponsor of the program; the participating franchisors; and Worldwide Franchise Consultants, who is administering the program for Don Dwyer, founder and underwriter of the program.

The veterans will become aware of the program through the VETFRAN Newsletter, IFA Franchise Shows, veterans' organizations, Job Fairs or the national media. Veterans must be able to meet all usual and customary qualifications of their selected franchisor prior to being accepted as a franchisee.

Current members of the Armed Forces will have up to 24 months following their discharge to begin their participation in VETFRAN. All other veterans must begin their participation within 24 months after the onset of VETFRAN, that is not later than August 14, 1993. An individual must show proof of veterans status (e.g. DD 214) and have been discharged other than dishonorably.

Veterans can obtain specific information about the program by sending a self-addressed, stamped business envelope and one dollar to: VETFRAN, P.O. Box 3146, Waco, TX 76707. The VETFRAN Administrator will mail the veterans a VETFRAN Newsletter which includes a fact sheet and an updated list of participating franchisors, their telephone numbers and the contact people.

The veteran will contact the Participating Franchisor of his or her choice, and ask for a franchise information package (sometimes called an offering circular or prospectus). When the veteran contacts the Participating Franchisor he/she should ask what discounts or financing arrangements the franchisor is offering through VETFRAN. The veteran will then be prequalified by the

franchisor (ability, credit history, personal financial statement, etc.). The franchisor will counsel the veterans regarding the franchise industry, as well as discuss the most appropriate vehicle to finance the franchise purchase, i.e., personal assets, friend/relatives, conventional loan or SBA guaranteed loan. Some franchisors will provide in-house financing, other will direct the veteran to the Key Lender Banks participating in the program. The veteran visits the Key Lender, who will discuss financing and will provide a loan application for a regular commercial loan. The lender may direct the veteran to a CPA or "loan packager" to assist the veteran in completing the loan application, business plan and forms. The SBA and its associated resources (S.C.O.R.E., S.B.D.C.) also can assist veterans in developing a business plan and loan application; however, neither the SBA, S.C.O.R.E. or the S.B.D.C.'s can fill out SBA loan application forms for the veteran. Some franchisors have in-house loan packagers that can provide assistance.

The Key Lender will review and approve (or reject) the conventional loan. If the lender declines the loan the veteran could consider asking the bank to contact the SBA and request a loan guarantee (two lender rejects in cities of over 200,000). If the Lender approves the loan and the SBA agrees to guarantee it, the Lender, not the SBA, will issue the check. If the applicant is a Vietnam era veteran, or has a 30% or more compensable disability, and the veteran has been turned down by a bank for a commercial loan and the SBA for a guaranteed loan (for other than credit reasons), the SBA does have limited resources to make a direct loan, (ceiling of \$150,000) to these two groups.

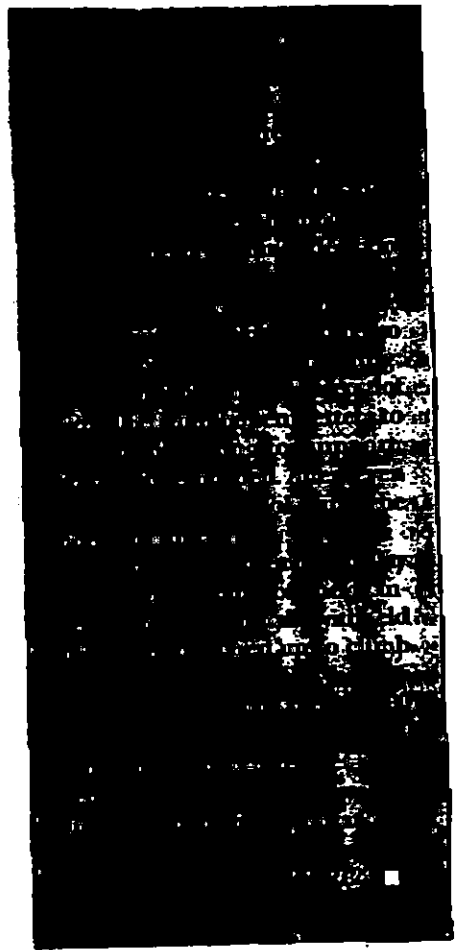
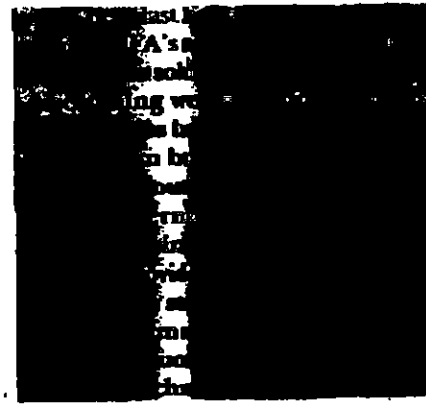
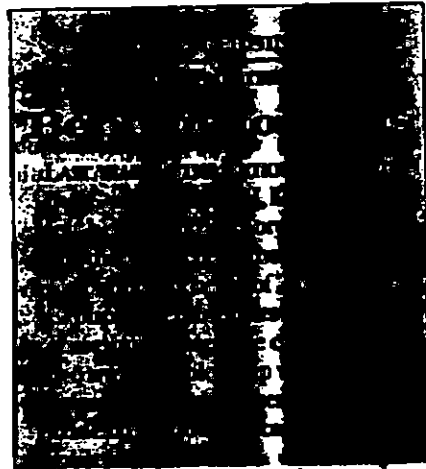

**V**eterans looking to go into business for themselves find it easier than before. Texas entrepreneur, Don Dwyer, the Small Business Administration (SBA) and the International Franchise Association (IFA) have combined forces to assist veterans in buying businesses of their own.

According to Dwyer, president of The Dwyer Group, who created and spearheaded VetFran (Veterans Transition Franchise Initiative), it's now possible for a veteran to purchase a franchise business with no money down.

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## VET-FRAN ENCOURAGES VETERANS TO BE FRANCHISEES

VETFRAN, Veterans Transition Franchise Initiative, introduces veterans to business opportunities in the franchise industry in cooperation with the Small Business Administration (SBA). With reduced franchise fees from participating companies and loan help from the SBA, VETFRAN organizers hope to attract veterans into the world of owning one's own business.

The International Franchise Association (IFA) was motivated by President Bush's appeal to the American business community to provide more and better business opportunities for America's veterans. Consequently, a "Memorandum of Understanding" was agreed to by William B. Cherkasky, President of the IFA, Don Dwyer, Committee Chairman and founder, and Tom Lorentzen, the Small Business Administration's acting Associate Administrator for Business Development and signed in Washington on August 14, 1991.

The SBA has agreed to initiate

information about VETFRAN through their network to instruct their Veterans Affairs Officers about franchise counseling and establish "key lender" financial institutions in each district throughout the country.

The IFA has asked participating franchisors to create a program of tangible benefits for the veterans in the form of discounted fees and/or by agreeing to finance 50% of their franchise fee.

Veterans must be able to meet all usual and customary qualifications of their selected franchisor prior to being accepted as a franchisee.

Current members of the Armed forces will have up to 24 months following their discharge to begin their participation in VETFRAN. All other veterans must begin their participation within 24 months after the onset of VETFRAN, that is, not later than August 14, 1993.

Although the SBA endorses and supports the VETFRAN program they are not loan officers or franchisors.

The franchisor, chosen from a list of companies, will send information about their company to the veteran and make arrangements to prequalify the veteran. The franchisors have extensive experience in career counseling as well as expertise in assisting the veterans in creative methods to obtain start-up capital. The franchisor will assist the veterans in obtaining financing by supplying them with the marketing, support materials and equipment costs necessary to develop a business plan; and will usually make arrangements for the veteran to visit a typical franchise operation.

If the veteran determines that a loan will be necessary to purchase the franchise operation they can inquire with the franchisor as to whether or not there is in-house financing available, or they can be directed to key lending institutions in their area. The franchisors will eventually have the names of two or three "key lenders" in their area who work with franchise operations and the SBA. If it

veterans is of the Vietnam era, a minority or handicapped, the SBA does have some funds available to make loans directly to the veteran.

The primary value of this program is the discounts offered by the participating franchisors; not "free money", but loan guarantees from the SBA. Veterans, franchisors, and the lending institutions will be working with conventional SBA loans and procedures; these require a great deal of patience and paperwork.

If there is a specific franchise you are interested in that does not appear on the list, please call us and we will immediately contact the franchisor and make them aware of the program.

SUBJECT: POLITICAL MAIL, THE SEQUEL

Now that <sup>a</sup> ~~the~~ Bush-Quayle Campaign Headquarters <sup>has been established</sup> ~~is up and running,~~ a number of new procedures have been put in place. This memo, which supplements (but does not replace) the original November 19, 1991 memo, has been coordinated with White House Counsel, *[Signature]* Cabinet Secretary, and the Office of Political Affairs and will apply to mail concerning the convention, platform, and election campaign, until further notice.

GENERAL GUIDANCE FOR WHITE HOUSE CORRESPONDENCE DEPARTMENT:

All primarily political CTRK and general public mail will be directed to the White House Political Affairs Office for appropriate disposition. Political Affairs will forward mail to the campaign except those it deems are:

a. Significant ~~More Important~~ (MI) letters that require substantive White House input or clearance.

b. Letters that require a personal response by the President.

All primarily official mail that expresses support, criticism, or

suggestions about the President's official policies or programs will be answered by Correspondence, even though the writer mentions these policies in the context of the campaign. The writer can be thanked for his support or suggestions. Writers who request information about the campaign (in addition to addressing official matters) can be told that they may write the campaign headquarters at 1030 15th St., N.W., Washington, D. C. 20005.

*It can be anticipated that*  
~~As the tempo of the campaign has increased,~~ more and more letters will mention voting and the election. To determine the appropriate response, *the considerations should be;* ~~ask yourself these questions:~~ "WHY is this person writing? Is he <sup>for</sup> motivated by the substance of the President's official policy or program, or is he <sup>for</sup> motivated by the outcome of the election?" If the former, handle as official mail; if the latter, send to Political Affairs.

SPECIFIC GUIDANCE FOR WHITE HOUSE CORRESPONDENCE DEPARTMENT:

*and* As most of you know, ~~we now have~~ Bush-Quayle stationery for the President's personal correspondence and messages, ~~as well as the~~ buff stationery *will be* ~~that we have always used for~~ *the President's* his Republican Party correspondence and messages. Mrs. Bush also has ~~her B-Q~~ *Bush-Quayle* stationery.

1. All drafts that are not ~~to be~~ typed on official azure stationery or Mrs. Bush's official stationery should be marked

"Political Stationery" or "B-Q Stationery" before sending to typing.

On behalf of President Bush, thank you for your comments about issues relating to the subject of abortion and about the Title X family planning program.

Title X was enacted as a Federal Government program to provide pre-pregnancy family planning services. Women who are pregnant require services that Title X cannot provide. Regulations were promulgated in 1988 that address the question of how to help women who, upon seeking services from a Title X funded project, discover that Title X funds cannot be used to treat pregnant women. The 1988 regulation requires that pregnant women be given a list of providers of services for the well-being of mother and child. Because the original Title X statute prohibits use of Title X funds for programs in which abortion is a method of family planning, providers whose primary business is abortion cannot be included in the referral list. Hospitals and other providers for whom abortion is only a part of their activity may be included in the referral list. No restrictions are placed on the content of the counseling that is received when a woman seeks the referral services. The Supreme Court has upheld the regulation.

Some have sought to portray Title X regulations as a "gag rule" that interferes with the doctor/patient relationship. To dispel this misperception, President Bush issued a directive last year

to the Secretary of Health and Human Services. The President's directive makes clear that implementation of the regulation must preserve the confidentiality of the doctor/patient relationship and that nothing is to prevent a physician from giving a pregnant woman complete medical information about her condition.

Officials who administer the Title X program have issued instructions to clinics that receive funds from this program asking them to comply with the rule. It is the same rule that was promulgated in 1988. Complying with the rule, as it is written -- as opposed to what some have represented the rule to be -- will assure the highest standard of care in the Title X program.

Dear:

Thank you for your letter and for the photograph that you sent to President Bush. I assure you that the President cares deeply about you and others who are unemployed because of the slow-growing economy. He has made it a point to listen to those who are having hard times. The President understands, ~~and he is very concerned,~~ that many hardworking people are worried about their future. He is determined that there will be change -- and, equally important, the right kind of change -- to ensure that our economy is back on track and moving forward again.

President Bush is taking action in two key areas to help unemployed Americans. First, he has proposed numerous initiatives to Congress to spur our economy and to encourage sustained economic growth so that there will be jobs and opportunities for all our people. Second, he has directed Secretary of Labor Lynn Martin to work with Congress to develop and to pass legislation that will extend the emergency unemployment compensation program through the end of this year. The President believes that this can be done quickly -- without raising taxes or adding to the ~~already huge~~ Federal deficit.

You may know that, twice within the last five months, President Bush has signed into law legislation that he had requested to provide emergency unemployment benefits. The President had made it clear that he would readily approve responsible additional unemployment benefits if he were presented with legislation that

would not deter future economic growth and its associated job-creation by adding to the deficit. Instead, Congress initially sent to the President bills that would have added \$6 billion to the deficit. President Bush refused to sign legislation that would have done further harm to the economy, and eventually Congress sent him responsible bills.

Clearly, the single best answer to the problem of unemployment is economic growth, and the President believes that government policies that encourage job creation and opportunities will ensure a sound and economically healthy America. Yet the task of converting commonsense proposals into reality is difficult when there is a fundamental difference between the Democratic-controlled Congress and the President about how to solve America's problems. The President's proposals constantly face significant opposition from the Democratic leadership of Congress, whose frequent answer to problems is more taxes and more Federal spending.

President Bush will keep pushing hard for legislation that will mean real help to unemployed workers such as you and to their families. The President appreciates having your views about these important issues.
