Dear Mr. President:

The Congress is in the process of sending to you tax legislation aimed at improving the present economic climate.

The legislation (HR 3040, SF 2979) may not contain everything you and I would like to see in the Bill, in particular positive changes in the Capital Gains Tax, but I understand it contains some significant modification to the Minimum Tax, in particular, temporary (or hopefully permanent) repeal of "preference for charitable contributions of appreciated property".

As someone who has had a hand in raising substantial funds for educational, cultural and human welfare charitable organizations in the past and expects to be similarly occupied meeting their future needs, I write to urge you as strongly as I can to approve this legislation.

There is no question but what the present treatment of appreciated gifts for AMT computations places a very serious road-block in the way of those gifts - as amply indicated by the flood of gifts of appreciated art works to museums during the recent "window." The benefit of the proposed change to third sector organizations and hence our society will be tremendous.

Dear Mr. Bemis:

The President has asked me to thank you for your recent letter urging him to approve current legislation that would foster charitable contributions of appreciated property.

The President agrees that the tax code should be adjusted to spur such contributions. Therefore, under his proposal, the temporary exclusion from the AMT would be made permanent and would be expanded to include the fair market value of all gifts of appreciated property, including real estate and stocks and bonds. With these improvements, the proposal would restore the exclusion of gifts of appreciated property from the AMT that existed prior to the Tax Reform Act of 1986. The President remains committed to this goal.

We are, however, disappointed that the Democrat-controlled Congress has insisted on inclusion of a tax increase, and as you mentioned in your letter, has also been resistant to the capital gains changes the President feels are so crucial. We remain committed to working with the Congress to produce a sound economic growth package.

Again, thank you for sharing your thoughts and concerns with the President.

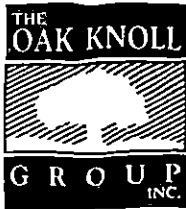

I am writing you today on behalf of my business associate and good friend John Reeder of Santa Fe, New Mexico. As you know, Susan and I have a home in Santa Fe. John is the sole stock holder of his small real estate development business, Reeder Development Company in Santa Fe.

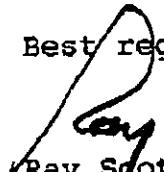
John currently finds himself at odds with the SBA over a contract made between Reeder Development Company and the SBA earlier this year which the SBA is now attempting to break. John has related the details of the case to me and it does seem to be a clear instance of the SBA violating its agreement. George, John and I have made every effort to resolve the problem in the Santa Fe SBA office. It is obvious that it must be resolved by Washington.

The details are narrated herein below, followed by a summation of the facts and a copy of the original Purchase Agreement. I am sure that after reading the facts you will agree that the SBA is acting in bad faith with John, and that its actions are an embarrassment to the government of the United States. And though this is not a case involving terribly large amounts of assets or money by business standards of today, I know it is an important matter to John.

Please be so kind as to give this problem your attention and pass this along to someone down the hall who can assist John in correcting this situation.

In the Spring of this year, John Reeder was solicited by the Small Business Administration in regard to a vacant 20.303 acre tract of land southeast of Santa Fe which the SBA, acting as the receiver for a loan in default to which the land had been pledged as collateral, wished to sell. The land had been listed for sale for over a year and had generated no offers, thus the SBA's effort to solicit a buyer. After lengthy conversations with John J. McCracken of Herndon, Virginia (acting receiver for the SBA) as to the value of the land and its potential for development, John finally agreed to purchase the land at a discounted value, subject to his satisfactory determination as to the likelihood of the land being approved for development by the local land use authorities.

Under the terms of the Purchase Agreement signed by John and the SBA, John had 90 days to satisfy himself as to the potential for development of the land. If during this 90-day period the SBA received a higher or better offer for the land, then John was permitted 10 working days to resolve the conditions and effect a closing of his Purchase Agreement. After approximately 60 days, another (higher) offer was, indeed, received. After being so notified, John made up his mind to resolve the conditions favorably and did proceed to a closing within the prescribed time frame, paying the full purchase price at the time of the closing on August 14, 1992. The language of the Purchase Agreement had been the subject of many back and forth negotiations between John and Mr. McCracken and in its final form was specifically worded to allow John the necessary time to effect a closing should the eventuality of another offer arise as, in this case, it did.

Because John planned to spend (and did spend) considerable funds in determining the suitability of the land for development on such items as survey work, water availability studies, etc., he had insisted on language that would protect his investment and preclude any other offer from obstructing his acquisition of the land if it were his decision to go forward with the purchase.

Subsequently, John learned that in blatant violation of the spirit and letter of his Purchase Agreement with the SBA, the SBA had actually entered into another Purchase Agreement for the same 20.303 acres with the other would-be buyer and continued to encourage the other party even after John had closed his original Agreement and paid in cash all of the agreed upon purchase price. After a considerable delay of almost two months, during which time the SBA continued to hold all of John's money, the SBA finally came forward with a petition to the presiding District Court and, again in blatant violation of his agreement with the SBA, recommended

that the presiding judge approve the latter offer, ostensibly because it was in the best interest of the SBA since it represented somewhat of an increase in proceeds for the SBA. Their thinly veiled excuse for violating the contract with John was that the ultimate disposition of the land was always subject to the approval of the Court and, thus, they were free to make whatever recommendation they deemed beneficial.

This is where the matter stands as of this date, with the SBA having filed the above mentioned petition, continuing to hold all of John's money and John waiting for his opportunity to go before the presiding judge and try to convince the judge to reject the SBA's recommendation and honor, instead, the contract that John kept in good faith. If this were a civil case rather than one involving the federal government, it is obvious that John would have a solid case for breach of contract and could seek both actual and punitive damages through the regular channels. However, because the SBA is involved, John would face the nightmarish task of suing the government, which no citizen should have to face simply to get the government to keep its part of a bargain. While it is admirable that the SBA should generally work hard at recouping as many taxpayer dollars as possible in cases of default, it is not at all understandable that they would seek to break an agreement which came about through their own initiative and which they were well enough pleased with at the time it was entered into. During this campaign year when honesty and integrity in government are significant issues, I am sure that you can well understand John's disgust with the way in which the SBA has acted in this matter, especially when it is supposed to be the aim of the SBA to foster and assist small businesses rather than break its own agreements with them. I hope that you will see fit to lend your good name and best efforts to help John convince the judge to uphold John's original agreement with the SBA, prior to when this matter will go before the court near the end of November.

Summation of Facts:

1.

Original Purchase Agreement signed by John Reeder, president of Reeder Development Company, and the owners of record, Robert and Mary Vickers (the debtors to the SBA, in default) on May 8, 1992. Modifications and additional conditions added by the SBA following negotiations with Reeder, including language re subsequent offer, and signed by Reeder and John J. McCracken for the SBA, dated June 18, 1992.

2.

June 18 to August 6, Reeder pursues due diligence; orders survey and water availability studies.

3.

On August 6, 1992, the SBA entered into a separate Purchase Agreement with a third party, David B. Nielsen, in violation of the above referenced language (paragraph 2 of the additional conditions dated June 18) and only afterward notified Reeder that another offer had been received and that Reeder had ten working days to close his original Purchase Agreement.

4.

On August 14, 1992 Reeder fulfilled all of the necessary requirements and closed, together with Robert and Mary Vickers, and paid into closing the full agreed upon purchase price at Capital City Title Company in Santa Fe, New Mexico. The SBA is notified of the closing the same day via telephone call and letter from Reeder.

5.

August 14 to October 7 - After almost two months delay, the SBA finally comes out with a petition to Presiding court recommending the approval of Nielsen offer rather than recommending the approval of the prior contract with Reeder.

6.

Currently awaiting the notice of a thirty day period for the filing of objections with the court, after which a date is to be set for the matter to be decided by the presiding judge.

7.

Petition filed October 8, 1992 at the United States District Court, District of New Mexico, case No. CIV-85-1105-HB.

STATEMENT BY THE PRESIDENT

Today I am signing into law H.R. 707, the "Futures Trading Practices Act of 1992." This forward-looking legislation is good for America's futures exchanges, good for farmers and ranchers who use futures, and good for U.S. financial markets. Indeed, this modernization of our financial laws will benefit everybody who works and invests in the American economy.

The bill contains an important provision sought by the Administration to give the Federal Reserve Board authority to oversee margin levels on stock index futures. The margin provision is crucial to help avoid the kinds of major market disruptions that occurred in October 1987 and October 1989. It is part of my Administration's continuing effort to adapt financial laws to the "one market" of stock and stock derivative products.

The bill also gives the Commodity Futures Trading Commission (CFTC) exemptive authority to remove the cloud of legal uncertainty over the financial instruments known as swap agreements. This uncertainty has threatened to disrupt the huge, global market for these transactions. The bill also will permit exemptions from the Commodity Exchange Act for hybrid financial products that can compete with futures products without the need for futures-style regulation.

The margin and exemptive authority reforms are critical for keeping U.S. financial markets strong and competitive. The Administration first requested them 2 years ago, and I am delighted that they now have been adopted.

The bill strengthens the ability of the CFTC to police the futures markets, impose tougher penalties on wrongdoers, and obtain assistance from foreign futures regulators. These provisions will further enhance the reputation of the United States as the safest and best place in the world to conduct trading.

Two provisions of the Act could be interpreted in a manner that would raise constitutional concerns and will, therefore, be construed so as to avoid those concerns.

Section 215 purports to direct me to appoint persons to the CFTC who meet certain congressionally mandated criteria. This provision raises constitutional concerns by appearing to circumscribe my power under the Appointments Clause to nominate officers of the United States. I shall treat the provision as containing advisory, rather than mandatory, criteria for appointment.

Section 213(a)(2) directs the CFTC to issue regulations specifying the circumstances under which the governing board of a contract market may issue, without prior CFTC approval but subject to CFTC suspension within 10 days, issue a temporary emergency market rule. To avoid any violation of the Appointments Clause of the Constitution, this section will be construed only to permit the CFTC to waive the usual statutory requirement that it approve such private market arrangements. So construed, the section does not vest exercise of significant governmental authority in the governing boards.

This impressive, nationwide group of CEOs can be used to rebut Clinton's constant reference to his "legion" of high-tech supporters, including John Young and John Sculley. Moreover, the credibility of Clinton's list of supporters can be questioned, as Gil Amelio was mistakenly listed as supporting Clinton. Amelio wished to set the record straight in announcing his support for you at his headquarters. Also, Hewlett-Packard Chairman, David Packard, also issued a statement expressing his support for you.

At the announcement, Secretary Franklin said, "We've been hearing in the press that the high-tech industry overwhelmingly supports Bill Clinton. Clinton makes claims that he alone understands high-tech and he alone has the plan to develop our high-tech base. His facts don't compute. While Governor Clinton has been talking, President Bush has been working with high-tech industries for four years, getting technology out of the labs and into the consumers' hands. While Bill Clinton talks about partnerships between business and government, our national labs have created over 1400 such cooperative agreements. That's why these leaders are here today to endorse George Bush."

She also cited increased trade and export growth in the high-tech sector, "Advanced technology exports last year were \$100 billion, which yields a surplus of \$40 billion to our current account. George Bush knows that getting the goods to market is an important part of the action and the North American Free Trade Agreement (NAFTA) opens new markets for high-tech. Clinton continues to waffle on NAFTA -- we can count on George Bush to create new American high-tech jobs here at home by selling our products across the border."

Admiral Watkins added, "The President's Agenda for American Renewal places heavy emphasis on Research and Development technology. Included in the Agenda are proposals for a 30%

increase in civilian R & D, a cut in the capital gains tax, a permanent R & D tax credit, easier access to credit, and improved education and training for tomorrow's scientists and engineers. Fortune Magazine, in its November 2 issue, notes that the President has already begun to move federal research spending from defense to civilian projects and that Clinton would concentrate civilian research grants in a new government agency, while Bush would keep the current decentralized system."

The same article pointed out that in a July Fortune poll of 184 CEOs, 85% supported Bush and only 9% backed Clinton. Fortune also reported that the Boston Co. Economic Advisors, "a respected, non-partisan forecasting firm" said that growth would initially spurt under Clinton, but the price of that spurt, "would be a significantly larger budget deficit under Clinton, which would leave long-term interest rates about a point higher than under Bush."

Watkins noted that the Bush Administration, beginning in 1988, agreed to provide \$100 million annually in funding for SEMATECH, a public-private consortium, to promote research and development in semi-conductors, major components in both defense and consumer electronics.

In addition to Secretary Watkins and Secretary Franklin, D. Allan Bromley, Assistant to the President and Director, Office of Science and Policy Technology, Rep. Tom Campbell (R-CA) and State Senator Becky Morgan attended the coalition announcement.

REMARKS BY THE PRESIDENT

THE PRESIDENT: Thank you, Chief Vaughn, and all of you -- thank you very much. (Applause.) Thank you so much. I'm just delighted to be here. Thank you, Chief Vaughn, the president, for that kind introduction. And may I salute Steve Harris, who I understand is the incoming leader of this most distinguished group.

I don't know where you get that enthusiasm. I fell asleep in the ninth inning and I'm sure some of you stayed up until the 11th. (Laughter.) But nevertheless, may I salute the distinguished members of the board. And a special welcome to the Chiefs of Police from around the world.

You'll have to excuse me if I'm not talking today about the importance of international cooperation. But don't think I've lost it. I understand. And I hear it from the domestics chiefs, from the local chiefs, how important cooperation is with the international component represented here today. Whether it's in antinarcotics, or whether it's in antiterrorism, we are very, very grateful to those law enforcement officers from overseas who are here today, and to your colleagues who may not have made it to this wonderful convention.

I would simply say to you that you're choosing, or you have chosen a very interesting time to visit our great country -- the weather's turning colder, and if you turn on the TV you can't help but notice that there's an election going on in just -- and Barbara and I were talking about this a few minutes ago -- just nine days. In fact, some of the U.S. police chiefs here may ask if they can go back with you to your country until all this hectic yelling and shouting is over with.

But we are getting down to the home stretch, and so let me talk this morning about government's first and foremost domestic responsibility -- function, and that is to protect every citizen at home and on the street.

Let me start with a story that most of the domestic chiefs have heard about, probably the kind of story you hear about every day, but one that just sickened Barbara and me when we saw it on the news I believe it was about a month ago.

In broad daylight in a neighborhood near Washington D.C., a woman was forced from her car at a stop sign by two men, who then drove off. But the woman got tangled in her seatbelt outside the car. Or maybe she hung on. What mother wouldn't? You see, her baby was locked inside.

And that woman was dragged almost two miles before the thieves crushed her to death against a fence. And then they tossed her little baby out by the roadside, like some kind of a piece of trash.

And I know that on this special Sunday in this special audience I am preaching to the choir, but this sort of thing must provoke outrage. People who act like animals have no place in decent society and they should go to jail, and stay in jail. And I strongly support you and your effort to do just that. (Applause.)

I think when the history of this century is written, America -- it will see -- it will be clearly seen that America got too soft on crime in the 60's, and for twenty years you and your brothers and sisters in law enforcement paid for it. But we fought back, and for the first time in decades -- the overall crime index is actually down.

And with your help, your leadership, we've slowed the rate of violent crime the past 12 years. We are turning the tide on drugs: I take heart from the fact that there's 60 percent use of cocaine by teenagers. But as you can tell by comparing our crime statistics with other nations, we still have a way to go, a long way to go. And that's what I really want to talk to you about today.

There are so many issues in this presidential campaign where the voters have a clear choice. And crime is one of the most important. And I do have big differences with Governor Clinton on crime and law enforcement. And I would only ask a simple, objective look at the record. Records reveal it. And here are some facts. Under Governor Clinton, Arkansas' violent crime rate went up about 60 percent in the 80's -- more than twice the national average. They had the nation's single-biggest increase in serious crime during the decade.

In '83, there were about 300 violent crimes for every 100,000 people in Arkansas. Last year, there were almost 600 violent crimes. It has doubled on the Governor's watch. The average inmate there served less than one-fifth of his sentence last year. But the federal inmate, as I'm sure most know here, an inmate for which I had responsibility -- he served 85 percent of his time.

You can't obviously -- and I don't mean to leave that impression -- blame the dedicated law enforcement officers from that state. Because you've got to look behind that at the statistics. Arkansas ranks near the bottom for every important per-capita crime dollar that it spends -- 46th -- for police officers: 49th. Spending on judicial and legal systems, Arkansas ranks 50th. Dead last in the country.

And so, no wonder crime goes ballistic there during the 80's. You're supposed to handcuff criminals -- not tie the hands of the police.

It's obvious -- (applause) -- and I firmly believe, and I'll get to the positive aspects of this in a minute -- that that crime record, that Clinton record is wrong for Arkansas, and, clearly, it would be wrong for America. And if you don't believe me, ask the Fraternal Order of Police in Little Rock. They know the Clinton record better than anyone, and they're joining hands with their national organization -- to endorse me for President of the United States. (Applause.)

And I think they did take the time to look at the overall record -- the good news that you don't hear out there on the network news every night. And let me just tick off a few of our priorities.

Start with money. Since I took office, we've increased the crime budget by almost 50 percent. We've hired more than 1,200 new federal prosecutors since 1989, assigned 300 FBI agents to help you get the gang members off the streets -- and proposed a program to double federal spending for prison

space in the 1990's. We're working to stop the abuse of our appeals process, to enforce the death penalty, and to let your cops use evidence seized in good faith. (Applause.)

Since 1989, we've taken more than \$400 million from criminals and used it to help the victims of crime. And we've also targeted the violent repeat offender, putting over 3,000 of those most dangerous fugitives in America behind bars in just a couple of months last spring.

Finally, we're helping to take back 20 worst inner-city neighborhoods. And, again, I salute the police chiefs and the law enforcement officers for this. Take it back with our acclaimed "Weed and Seed" program. Weed out the criminals and the drugs, and then seed the neighborhood with education and training. And, hopefully, if we can ever get enterprise zones enacted into law with jobs in the private sector.

Now, listen to Bernie Edwards, a 70-year-old resident of a tough neighborhood in Fort Worth, Texas -- Tarrant County. He saw Weed and Seed help to keep the young kids in his neighborhood off drugs and out of gangs. And he says, "For the first time in years I can sit on my porch. It sure feels good." There's example like example all across this country. And you know them far better than I do.

We've fought for these initiatives, though. Not just tough talk -- and we're taking action. But our action would be stronger if it were part of a national crime strategy supported by Congress.

That's why, 1,228 days ago, on June 15, 1989 -- the same day Mikhail Gorbachev first hinted that the Berlin Wall might someday come down -- I sent a comprehensive crime bill to Capitol Hill up to the Congress. And I extended my hand in partnership to Congress, and I asked for help fighting crime on a national level.

Since I first sent that bill to the Hill in 1989, 60,000 Americans have been murdered. There have been 260,000 rapes, 1.6 million robberies and 2.6 million assaults. And 69,000 of those violent crimes took place, regrettably, right here in Detroit.

Think about it. Enough Americans to fill Detroit's Cobo Hall four times over were brutalized by assault, rape or murder while that bill languished on Capitol Hill. No wonder. Americans stare at every news every night, shake their heads and ask, why doesn't somebody do something about this incredible mess? People are dying in the streets.

Well, as frustrating as this crime bill has been for me, it is still my job as President to get results. And so we've fought and won a couple of big battles the past few weeks. And today I'm proud to announce that right after this speech, I'm going to sit down here at Cobo Hall and sign two of the crime initiatives that I've fought for -- two tough new federal laws.

The first one severely punishes carjackers. And we told -- (applause) -- and we told the Congress that I wanted to make armed carjacking a federal offense with harsh penalties. And thugs who take cars at gunpoint should sit in a cell so long that when they get out they're going to be too darn old to drive. (Applause.)

And the second one deals with parents -- mostly fathers -- who refuse to make child-support payments -- they're called "deadbeat dads". And right now, a single mother in Detroit can struggle to keep the kids fed on a small salary while their father's on a lark in Chicago. And he could be way behind in child support, but no one can touch him across state lines. Well, that's a disgrace, and now the long arm of the law can

reach over that border, and tell that dad to pay up, or go up the river.

Why did these two ideas become law? Because national attention created national outrage that brought pressure on Congress to act. It's a formula I want to use again and again in the next four years.

You see, there are at least six other initiatives that Congress didn't pass -- that I care a great deal about and that I think would benefit your work. So next year, with a new Congress -- and there's going to be a new one. You might ask why and I would say to some of the foreign officials here you have been spared the sight of a Congress controlled by one group for 38 years that can't even run a two-bit bank or a two-bit post office. And so there's going to be a lot of new members. (Applause.) And those members, regardless of what party, are going to do what the people want. They'll be listening to the same voters I do. And so, then we're going to go after them and we're going to be given a new Congress. And with 150 new members next session -- maybe up to that many in the House -- we're going to pass those six items into law, too.

And here they are: Number one, I want to strengthen the laws dealing with sexual and domestic violence. It's bad enough -- (applause) -- it's bad enough when a woman is brutally attacked in the first place. Then, she takes the stand for testimony and gets attacked by some clever lawyers. And I say that's two attacks too many. And so we're going to go after tightening up these laws. (Applause.)

Two, I want repeat armed offenders behind bars until trial. Today, even a repeat rapist can get arrested and be out on bond hours later. I say, detain him until the trial, let the prosecution use past behavior against him. (Applause.) Right now, certain little details often can't even be mentioned in court. Like the fact that everyone within a country mile knows the guy's done this before. And that's wrong. Let him face what he's done and pay for it.

We've got to -- on the second major point here, we've got to crush gang violence. I want the gangs to be treated like the criminal enterprises that they are, so we can go after the leaders with federal medicine that they deserve. And I want to toughen penalties for using juveniles in crimes. (Applause.) I've talked to many chiefs about this, and they tell me that gangs send out these under-age kids -- send them out to do the dirty work of the leaders, and because they're minors who will get off easy if they're caught. That's disgraceful.

I remember going out to South Central in L.A. and hearing about two that were apprehended by the law enforcement community. I think they were 13 or 14. And they had been assigned targets to fire bomb during the outbreaks -- two little kids. It's a heartbreak. It's disgraceful. We've got to go after the big guys, make the big boys pay -- those that would use little kids in this way. (Applause.)

And, three: Protection for the elderly. It's absurd that the folks who have contributed to society all their lives have to live in terror just because some young punks see them as an easy target.

And I want to beef up the laws, so instead of stalking the streets -- (applause) -- and mugging grandmothers, they're down at the precinct, mugging for the police camera. (Laughter and applause.) Four -- and I've heard from many of you on this one, and we promise you we're going to keep on trying -- habeas corpus reform. (Applause.) Habeas corpus? Yes, habeas corpus should protect the innocent. But it's turned into a perversion of the law.

Some petitions can drag on for more than a decade, more than 10 years. And criminal lawyers are abusing the law to postpone justice, and it's time we put a stop to it. Let them have one habeas petition and be done with it. (Applause.)

Five -- and I know this one's controversial, but I'll tell you exactly how strongly I feel about it -- and I'm talking about a federal death penalty. I think certain acts of violence deserve the ultimate penalty. The sentence should be carried out fairly, but swiftly. Assassinations, murder for hire, terrorism, random drive-by shootings, gang massacres, and certainly and especially the killing of a police officer. All must pay with the death sentence. (Applause.)

And there is another collateral point here, and that has to do with justices. And I notice that Governor Clinton is here today with Mario Cuomo. But Governor Clinton has mentioned Cuomo for the Supreme Court. And it is my conviction to get this kind of tough crime legislation through, that we must not go back to appointing judges to the Court who oppose tough anticrime measures, who oppose the death penalty for these most heinous of crimes. (Applause.)

And the sixth one is firearms. This one's short and sweet. I want much tougher penalties for the criminal use of firearms.

So there's a lot of work to be done. But America's worth it. For every hardened criminal you face down, there are countless thousands of good and decent Americans out there with strong values and big hearts. And you don't hear much from them. But I happen to know on good authority that they certainly appreciate you, and I know because so many people tell me this.

So, in conclusion, let me just pass it on to you: America stands behind you. And you should never understand some of these crazy liberal appeals as an attack on our law enforcement officers. And I am with you 100 percent, bringing to bear the full weight of the federal government. And on behalf of all those unheard but grateful Americans, I really do thank you. I thank your families.

I know sometimes it must be a real strain when your chief or your officer goes out there and you're not going to know how he's going to be treated by these thug elements out on the street. So we can identify with that. And I really came here to say thank you to every single one of you for putting your lives on the line for us every single day.

Now you pass it on -- that support -- and go back and tell your brave men and women that we appreciate you and we need you all. You've done so much already. But let's face it, there is much more to be done. And to do it, I'd be remiss if I saw this many voters out here if I didn't say to you I need your support and I ask for your vote on November 3rd -- (applause) -- because I want to be in Washington for four more years.

Thank you. And may God bless our great country on this beautiful fall day. (Applause.) May God bless the United States. Thank you very much. (Applause.)

The President today recognized the volunteers of Safe Place of Raleigh, North Carolina, as the 934th Daily Point of Light for the Nation. The volunteers provide exceptional care and a sense of well-being for children who are confronting a crisis situation.

Developed in 1987, the Safe Place program is a network of 150 businesses and public facilities throughout Raleigh, which voluntarily display the Safe Place sign on their premises. This sign indicates help is available to youth ages 10 to 17 who are in distress. Some of the young people simply need a safe ride home and others are escaping a dangerous situation. These locations have the telephone number of the Wrenn House, a run-away shelter that works in conjunction with the Safe Place program.

Once the Wrenn House is contacted, a staff member calls one of the 100 Safe Place volunteers. The volunteer, who is trained to handle crisis situations and provide open arms and a listening ear, arrives at the site ready to help. Volunteers befriend the children, offering emotional support at a frightening time, and escort them to the Wrenn House for further assistance. A corps of volunteers is available to respond to the young person and determine how he or she may be assisted. Each volunteer is on call 24 hours and serves an average of two children a year. The young people learn about the Safe Place program and how it works through the local schools.

The President today recognized the volunteers of San Diego Rescue Mission, Inc., of San Diego, California, as the 935th Daily Point of Light for the Nation. The Mission offers educational and employment opportunities to the area's homeless men.

Founded in 1955, the Mission provides shelter to some 8,000 people each month, serving over 1,000 meals each day and providing medical and hygiene care, counseling, and referrals. One thousand volunteers work whenever they are needed and 100 volunteer weekly to cook, serve the evening meals, or tutor residents in reading, math, science, and social studies. Retired health care professionals volunteer at a medical clinic twice a week, and churches provide nightly nondenominational services for the men.

Through the Mission's one-year "Education for Life" program, volunteers work with 150 homeless men, assessing their level of education, tutoring them in academic subjects, and training them in vocational fields and job skills. With these skills, the men are able to help run the shelter themselves, performing such functions as cooking, driving each other to appointments, serving as chaplains, and orienting newcomers. After one year, they begin a six-month transitional period, during which they seek employment outside the Mission with the assistance of volunteers. This transitional period enables them to build savings before finding new homes and entering society.

So far this year, the San Diego Rescue Mission has served 194,726 meals, treated 1,046 homeless people at its free medical clinic, and hosted 65,838 men in the emergency shelter.

The President today recognized the volunteers of City Mission Society of Buffalo, New York, as the 937th Daily Point of Light for the Nation. Volunteers provide meaningful employment opportunities and the hope of economic advancement to people who are homeless.

The City Mission Society, founded in 1917, consists of a shelter for homeless men and Cornerstone Manor, which houses women and children. Over 250 volunteers, including shelter residents, give over 1,500 hours each month to help 225 individuals redirect their lives through study, work, and therapy. Volunteers serve an average of 15,000 meals each month, over 450 each day. Their regular presence enables them to offer support and friendship to the homeless. Volunteers also offer parenting, sewing, cooking, and nutrition classes.

Mission volunteers work with the Buffalo School District to provide an elementary and preschool classroom at City Mission so that children from local shelters have a stable educational environment. Most children at the Mission Society live outside their districts and would not be able to attend school. Volunteers assist teachers by tutoring and mentoring the children, providing support and friendship.

Men and women who stay in the shelters more than 30 days have the opportunity to participate in the work study programs. This opportunity allows the men and women to redirect their lives through learning responsible job skills and gaining confidence to pursue careers and lead independent lives.

Since leaving his native Somalia in 1984, Mr. Dahir has helped other Somali refugees resettle in southern California, giving them hope for their new future and a sense of well-being.

Mr. Dahir founded the Somali Relief and Rehabilitation Association which has helped over 1,000 Somali refugees since its inception in 1988. Drawing on his own experience of resettling in the United States, Mr. Dahir is able to run the Association and offer critical assistance to other Somali refugees. Helping them overcome language barriers, Mr. Dahir, along with his three associates, enables refugees to adjust quickly to American culture. They greet new arrivals at the airport and introduce them to organizations that offer resettlement assistance. He also escorts them to their new neighborhoods, showing them the nearest grocery store, teaching them how to use laundromats and other conveniences, and arranging for English language instruction.

Mr. Dahir works voluntarily with refugees over 40 hours every week, and he is always available to talk with them by phone or in person. His dedication to helping these new Americans has earned him the respect of people from all backgrounds. Thanks to his efforts, more Somalis have been able to start new lives in America and become productive members of their new communities.

Founded 22 years ago, Volunteers in Corrections utilizes 2,000 participants who have worked within the court system to assist troubled teenagers and their families and individuals on parole or probation. The volunteers work an average of four to five hours each week in one of 11 sites throughout the Ramsey County Corrections System. Their activities include facilitating a No Smoking program for inmates, tutoring juveniles, and raising scholarship funds for individuals on parole or probation to continue their education. According to Raymond Lescher, coordinator of Volunteers in Corrections, "The volunteers are the people that help humanize the service delivery system."

Volunteers in the No Smoking Program educate juveniles on the hazards of smoking to successfully lower the prison smoking rate. Other volunteers are matched with juvenile offenders and their families, appearing in court with them and helping them to understand the legal process. They also work one-to-one with youths from Boys Totem Town, a home for juvenile offenders, tutoring the boys and serving as positive adult role models.

The President today recognized the volunteers of the Burnet County Library System of Burnet, Texas, as the 940th Daily Point of Light for the Nation. The volunteers provide educational opportunities to adults, fostering a culture of lifelong learning.

Since 1986, the Burnet County Library has provided the only one-to-one adult basic education program in the county with instruction and tutoring at three of its branches. The library has reached a new and previously untapped segment of the community through private literacy training. Seventeen dedicated literacy volunteers teach 11 students, three to six hours a week. Volunteers work with students once a week for one year, developing supportive friendships.

Seventeen additional tutors instruct 32 students studying to obtain their General Equivalency Diploma (GED). Each volunteer commits to work with particular individuals two or three times a week for at least six months. Most participants in the GED and literacy program come to the Burnet County Library because it offers a private, confidential setting. By teaching others how to read and helping them earn GEDs, volunteers have increased literacy awareness and greatly encouraged reading throughout the county. As a result, many people have the opportunity to improve their lives and share the experience of reading with their families.

Volunteers plan, coordinate, and implement the Burnet County Library's Annual Summer Reading Program for both adults and children. Last summer, they encouraged over 1,050 adults and children to participate in reading, offering incentive prizes for young people and their parents. A number of other volunteers assist in supporting the library through filing, cataloging, and maintaining the buildings.

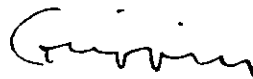

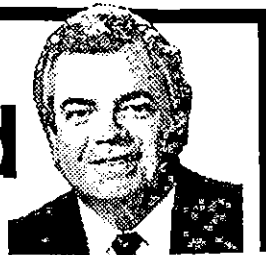

Let's Pretend: 1993 TV News

It is still permissible to indulge in fantasy. Fantasy has been known to hold some marriages together. Here's my report of a small daydream (daymare) I had trying to imagine what it would be like one year from now if Bill Clinton becomes president. The script for the evening television news in October, 1993, goes something like this:

"Good Evening. I'm Dan Rather. Demonstrators from Act-Up, a homosexual activist group, picketed the White House today to protest what they call President Clinton's complete insensitivity to the needs of People With AIDS. Even though the President has been able to increase appropriations for AIDS research by eliminating funding for cancer research, the demonstrators say it is simply not enough.

"Southern California continues to burn from the fires begun last February when the "display of displeasure" began following the *second* acquittal of the Los Angeles police officers accused of beating the Honorable Rodney King. "Confirmation hearings are expected to be brief and uneventful as Ambassador designate Gennifer Flowers and Linda Bloodworth-Thomason come before the Senate Foreign Affairs committee.

"And finally, our "Eye on America" looks at former President George Bush who is in the fourth month of his 'I Tried to Tell You' lecture tour. Mr. Bush is playing to sold out audiences everywhere. Mrs. Barbara Bush has begun a successful cookie baking company in Mexico. The former first dog, Millie, is busily placing paw prints on her new book titled, 'BARF, (A Dog's Eye View of the 1992 Campaign).'

The survey published by the Guy Gannet Publishing Co. found Clinton is the current choice of 40% of eligible voters while Bush netted 21% and 14% said they backed Perot. Twenty-two percent of the voters said they were still undecided.

PEROT/TRAVEL (Dallas/AP) -- Ross Perot will appear at East Coast rallies on Sunday, aides said, breaking out of his TV-only campaign with just over a week to go until the election. Perot will speak at rallies in Flemington, N.J., and in Pittsburgh, the aides said. He also will accelerate his television campaign, buying an hour commercial on ABC Monday night preceding the highly rated "Monday Night Football." Vice President Quayle, speaking on NBC's "Today" show, said "it's a two-man race" and added that Americans would be throwing their votes away if they opted for Perot. He expressed hope that Perot's supporters would switch to Bush as a way of blocking Clinton.

CHENEY/YUGOSLAVIA (Aboard the John F. Kennedy/Reuter) -- Secretary Cheney, aboard an aircraft carrier 30 miles off Bosnia, said the U.S. was determined to ensure that relief aid reached the former Yugoslav republic. "We are committed to use air and naval assets to support the humanitarian aid mission," he told Reuter during a visit to a U.S. naval force stationed off Bosnia-Hercegovina.

HOTEL (Houston/Reuter) -- The top official at the Houston hotel that President Bush calls home has resigned after he was indicted last week in a savings and loan fraud case. Joe Russo, chairman of the HFund Inc., the group that manages the Houstonian Hotel, resigned for personal reasons and also because the hotel is about to be sold, according to a written statement issued by the hotel. Russo, 60, was indicted for allegedly making illegal loans while he was chairman of the Ameriway Saving Association, which has since failed.

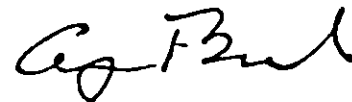

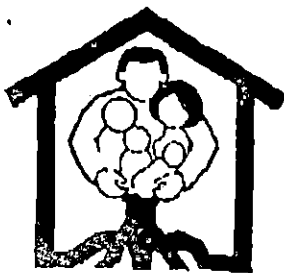

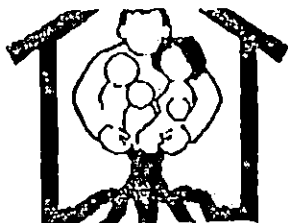

I would like to extend an invitation to you to visit our agency and meet with our staff and ten (10) of our young couples. Seven (7) of these couples are married. Some are former gang members, school

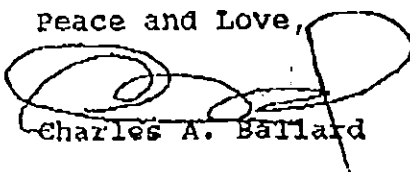
dropouts and teen parents. Today they have jobs, finished or doing well in school, have gotten married and/or established paternity.

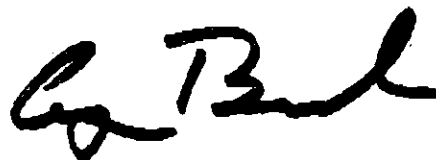

Sally Harell suggested that I contact you regarding endorsement letters signed by President Bush for use in direct mail pieces for our key Florida House of Representative candidates.

As you may know, during a special election in 1991 President Bush allowed us to mail letters of endorsement (see attached) which were instrumental in electing Buddy Johnson State Representative with a 59-41 margin in a 34% GOP registration district. The Bush letter was a decisive factor in making this district Republican for the first time in history, in spite of the fact the Democrats had just won the Gubernatorial election in a landslide just four months earlier and had all the momentum on their side.

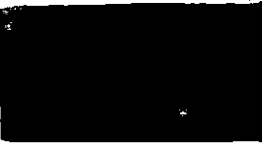

Dear Mr. President:

I am writing to urge you to sign into law the enrolled bill H.R. 429, the "Reclamation Projects Authorization and Adjustment Act of 1992."

H.R. 429 institutes a new approach for incorporating ecological, water quality protection and efficient resource use considerations into the funding and operation of Federal water projects. Under your Administration, the Environmental Protection Agency has consistently advocated market-based solutions to environmental problems. This bill contains several innovative provisions which are designed to use water pricing and the market to encourage more efficient water use and reduce adverse environmental impacts of that use.

I am aware that Governor Wilson and others have raised a number of specific concerns. I take very seriously the Governor's position. Governor Wilson has been a champion for environmental protection and a leader in advocating state-level reforms in water policy. His establishment of a water bank to help California deal with the drought was innovative and successful. I understand that you will be hearing his detailed concerns later in the week.

On balance my own opinion is that the bill as a whole offers enough positive and constructive measures to warrant signature. From an environmental perspective, H.R. 429 will have a positive effect on water policy.

Dear Mr. President:

On April 29, 1992, the Committee on Banking, Finance and Urban Affairs requested that you provide all documents that were responsive to the Committee's investigation of the Banca Nazionale del Lavoro (BNL) and the \$1 billion FY 1990 Commodity Credit Corporation (CCC) program for Iraq. To date, the Committee has not received one document, classified or otherwise, responsive to this request.

In recent days you have said repeatedly that Congress has received every document. In as much as the Committee has received nothing responsive to its request to you, I respectfully repeat my April 29, 1992 request that you provide the Committee with all documents in the possession of the White House on the BNL scandal and the \$1 billion FY 1990 CCC program for Iraq.

It has recently come to my attention that numerous administration officials may have met with Italian officials and representatives of BNL to discuss the BNL case. In light of this revelation, please be sure to include the following:

1. All documents or records relevant to meetings and/or telephone conversations that took place between White House officials and/or staff and Attorney General Thornburgh and/or Department of Justice staff. Please provide a list of all such meetings and/or telephone conversations relevant to this request.
2. All documents or records relevant to meetings and/or telephone conversations that took place between White House officials and/or staff and the U.S. Attorney's office for the Northern District of Georgia. Please provide a list of all such meetings and/or telephone conversations relevant to this request.

3. All documents or records relevant to meetings and/or telephone conversations that took place between White House officials and/or staff and State Department officials and/or staff and any other U.S. Federal agency officials and/or staff. Please provide a list of all such meetings and/or telephone conversations relevant to this request.

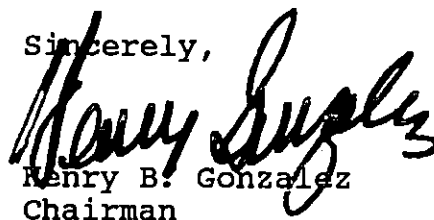
4. All documents or records relevant to meetings and/or telephone conversations that took place between White House officials and/or staff and representatives of the government of Italy, including the Italian Embassy in Washington. Please provide a list of all such meetings and/or telephone conversations relevant to this request.

5. All documents or records relevant to meetings and/or telephone conversations that took place between White House officials and/or staff and representatives of BNL. Please provide a list of all such meetings and/or telephone conversations relevant to this request.

The Committee seeks a full understanding of how BNL operated, how prosecution of the BNL case was managed, and whether policy considerations outweighed prudent financial management concerns in (a) granting the CCC guaranties and (b) permitting BNL to finance immense quantities of other loans to Iraq; and later, whether policy considerations affected the investigation and prosecution of the case. Your timely cooperation is essential, and I request that responsive documents be delivered by October 26, 1992.

Your assistance in these matters will be deeply appreciated.

In tribute to the gallant Hispanic men and women who served and continue to serve in the defense of this great Nation, the United States of America, we dedicate the establishment of a National Hispanic Veterans Memorial. The contributions of Hispanic Americans in the field of battle attest to the innate cultural values that preserve the principals of freedom and democracy upon which our Nation was founded.

Unfortunately our history books do not adequately chronicle or acknowledge the gallantry, bravery and sacrifices of Hispanic Americans in defense of our Nation's security. Hispanic Americans have proudly answered America's call to arms. From the late 18th century when the Texas Hussars, Spanish/Mexican cavalry, protected the citizens of the Texas Territory from indian attacks to those who served in Desert Storm, the military heritage of Hispanic Americans can be documented with valor, courage and heroism. Re: Editorial Board at Newark Star Ledger

I thought it might be useful to have a few points concerning New Jersey issues for your editorial board meeting today.

I. General Issues:

- The Star Ledger has the ninth largest circulation of any paper in the country. They are very proud of this fact. You may wish to note that some people in the White House even have the Star Ledger delivered to them.
- Governor Florio remains unpopular. As you know, he signed the largest tax increase in New Jersey history -- \$2.8 billion.
- New Jersey's unemployment stands at over 9% -- so jobs is the key issue. I think a key point is that: "There is no evidence that raising taxes will create jobs."
- New Jersey is a heavily trade-oriented state. It benefits from increased exports. One in six New Jersey jobs is related to trade. You may wish to point out that exports have risen by 40% since you took office -- and that helps create jobs in New Jersey.
- The Highway Bill has major benefits in terms of creating jobs for New Jersey. You may wish to compliment Congressman Bob Roe (who is retiring) for his role in it.
- You promised in 1988 to end the dumping of sewage sludge in the ocean. You delivered. As of this summer, all sewage sludge dumping in the ocean has been stopped.
- You are now taking further steps to help the New Jersey shore. Your budget included \$2.4 billion for sewage treatment -- including a \$70 million line item grant in each of the last two years to get New York City to treat its sewage at the secondary level and stop polluting the water in the New York Bight area. You may wish to say: **"It's time for New York to stop dumping on New Jersey."**
- New Jersey has always been acutely aware of the fact that, as a high income state, it does not get a fair return (in its view) on the Federal tax dollars it sends to Washington.

You might note that, with defense spending phasing down and civilian R&D spending increasing, a real opportunity presents itself for New Jersey. You may wish to note that **"New Jersey has the opportunity to be the national leader in these new technologies -- like materials science and environmental cleanup."** Note that New Jersey has some major technology centers, including one at New Jersey Institute of Technology (NJIT) right in Newark, that have been benefited from the increased funding we have provided to the National Science Foundation.

II. New Jersey Issues:

A.) Aircraft Noise:

A major controversy has erupted over routing plans for Newark Airport which have increased aircraft noise over Somerset, Union, and other New Jersey counties.

The plan in question (the "Expanded East Coast Plan" -- or EECF) went into effect in 1987. It decreased congestion at Newark Airport, but dramatically increased the noise problem. Two years ago, Senator Frank Lautenberg inserted language in the transportation appropriations bill which required that an Environmental Impact Statement be done on the EECF. That EIS is now almost finished, but it has not yet been released.

The two solutions people in New Jersey want are: a rollback of the EECF, or increased routing over the ocean.

You should say this: "We are aware of the aircraft noise problem, and are committed to resolving it."

If you want to say more, you could say: "We are looking at various options -- including increased routing over the ocean, and spreading the flights out somewhat. When the EIS comes out, there will be hearings so that New Jersey can be fully heard."

B.) Medicaid Funding

New Jersey has been engaged in a long struggle with the Health Care Financing Administration (HCFA) over Medicaid reimbursements. The state had been seeking \$550 million disproportionate share reimbursements for hospital costs.

Today, HCFA is announcing the release of \$126 million in Medicaid funds as a solution to the New Jersey Medicaid dispute. You may wish to announce this at the Ledger. The \$126 million is an amount that HCFA and New Jersey have agreed the state is entitled to -- prospective payments from December 1991 forward. [Another \$424 million in retroactive payments -- pre-December 1991-- is being denied. Several other states have been denied on this retroactive reimbursement issue. According to HHS, the law is clear on this point.]

SUBJECT: Campaign-related activity by White House Office staff

I have considered whether there are any restrictions on campaign-related activities by White House Office staff in the remaining period before the election.

First, as you know, White House Office staff (i.e., staff actually paid from the WHO appropriation) are not subject to the Hatch Act, and therefore they may engage in partisan political activity.

Second, pursuant to our political activity guidance memorandum and longstanding White House practice, White House Office staff who are not entitled to annual leave (i.e., Commissioned Officers) may take up to fifteen days per year compensatory leave (in other words, vacation time) to engage in campaign activity. Note, however, that any compensatory leave taken previously, such as to attend the Convention, counts toward the fifteen days. Also, approval to take such compensatory leave must be sought through one's supervisor. (Use of leave by other non-Hatched White House staff is explained in pages 4-5 of my November 27, 1991 memorandum to all White House staff.)

Third, as a general proposition, Government equipment and resources (Government cars, FAX machines, and the Government frank) and Government titles should not be used for campaign-related purposes.

Fourth, Government buildings may be used for campaign-related activities only under very limited circumstances (fundraising may not be conducted under any circumstance): (1) in the Residence, where the President or Mrs. Bush is present, provided there is appropriate reimbursement from the campaign; (2) informal meetings of small numbers of campaign officials and White House staff members may be held occasionally; (3) the OEOB studio may be used for campaign-related purposes where the President or Vice President is present, provided there is no expense incurred by the Government (an outside crew is used, and rent is charged to the campaign).

We have not had occasion to consider whether the OEOB studio or

other offices may be used by senior White House staff to conduct interviews or respond to questions of a campaign nature. The exception to allow the OEOB studio to be used by the President and Vice President is justified because they are elected officials; security considerations recommend the use of a building within the White House complex; there is some precedent for the use of the White House for campaign advertisements by former Presidents; and in any event, there is no cost to the Government.

Certainly, a White House official may respond to one or more campaign-related questions in the course of an otherwise official interview conducted out of the official's office. However, where one or more interviews are conducted solely or primarily for campaign-related purposes, we strongly recommend that White House officials other than the President and Vice President should not use their office or other White House offices, in order to avoid any question of propriety. Instead, these officials may use an office at campaign headquarters or a private studio arranged for by the campaign. White House staff should not be used to facilitate campaign-related interviews, other than tending to ministerial scheduling tasks.

Fifth, where a White House official has been invited to speak to an audience that will also hear a speech by a Clinton or Perot representative on the same program, even if the speech relates to the Bush Administration's programs and policies, the White House official's speech will be presumed to be campaign-related. This means that the Bush-Quayle campaign must pay the travel expenses, with one exception. The White House official may pay his or her own way, up to \$1000 in travel expenses (exclusive of food and lodging) under FEC regulations. Note, however, that any expenditure over \$1000 would count as a "contribution" and would trigger 18 U.S.C. 603. Travel expended personally to attend the Convention counts toward the \$1000. Finally, outside entities may not pay these travel expenses, because it would constitute an in-kind contribution the Bush-Quayle campaign may not receive.

SUBJECT: Political Activity

On October 11, the President authorized the formation of a campaign committee to work on behalf of his re-election. The purpose of this memorandum is to advise you of the legal and policy limitations on your individual political activity on behalf of Bush-Quayle '92.

First, only those employees in the White House who are paid from the appropriations for the White House Office or the Office of the Vice President may engage in political activity. You should check with your supervising officer to ascertain whether you are paid from appropriations of the White House Office or the Office of the Vice President; do not assume that because you have a White House pass you are paid from White House Office appropriations. If you are not paid from appropriations for the White House Office, or the Office of the Vice President, you are subject to the provisions of the Hatch Act and may not engage in any partisan political activities. A general list of permissible and impermissible activities for "hatched" employees is attached to this memorandum. You will be expected to adhere strictly to these guidelines.

Second, you should be aware that Federal law (18 U.S.C. § 603) prohibits any employee of the White House from contributing to the authorized campaign committee of the President, i.e., Bush/Quayle '92.

Finally, the following pages set forth, of necessity, general guidance. The simplest rule to follow, however, is the common-sense instruction that anything that is obviously campaign-related should not be done here, whether or not one could "legally" justify doing it here.

I. HATCH ACT

All Hatch Act prohibitions, discussed below and found at 5 U.S.C. §§ 7321-7327, cover all EOP employees, with exceptions principally for employees:

- (a) paid from the appropriations for the WHO, or from the EOP appropriation item for Special Assistance to the President in Connection with specially Assigned Functions¹ or the Senate appropriation for the Office of the Vice President; or
- (b) appointed to their current positions by the President by and with the advice and consent of the Senate (provided that such officials have nationwide or foreign relations responsibilities, as do all such officials within the EOP); or
- (c) . serving as the head or assistant head of an executive or military department.

These exceptions do not extend to other EOP employees. Other employees including Office of Management and Budget (OMB) staff, Office of Policy Development (OPD) staff, and all Schedule Cs and detailees should abide by all by Hatch Act prohibitions.

The restrictions of the Hatch Act are applicable to employees 24 hours a day, seven days a week, regardless of whether they are on annual or sick leave or leave without pay. As long as a covered individual is on the employment rolls of the Government, he or she is subject to the restrictions of the Hatch Act.

Because the limitations of the Hatch Act apply 24 hours a day, a "hatched" employee may not participate in political activity, either on the job or off. That means, for example, that a "hatched" employee may not draft a political speech. Although it is possible for a "hatched" employee to draft a speech concerning Administration issues that may be presented in a political setting, the "hatched" employee may not prepare any material containing statements of political advocacy, nor any materials that will be used exclusively for a political purpose.

Similarly, "hatched" employees may not type or transcribe political speeches; rather, the resources of a political organization should support political undertakings. Very limited ministerial activities, such as the typing of a brief political endorsement in a speech that otherwise deals with official matters or collating the brief political portion with the remainder of the speech are not objectionable under the Hatch Act. Additionally, "hatched" employees may write briefing materials on official Administration activities for use by Administration officials, even when such materials will be included in partisan political statements; however, such

employees may not write or prepare any materials that will be used only for political purposes (e.g., materials for the platform of the Republican Party), nor may they prepare any materials that contain statements of political advocacy.

Administration officials should be particularly sensitive to the limitations on "hatched" employees in instances of mixed political and official travel. Where a "hatched" employee accompanies an exempted official on a trip, it remains essential that no political activities be performed by the employee.² The "hatched" support staff of an exempted Administration official may perform their normal clerical and ministerial functions in connection with the political travel and appearances or activities of their principal, provided that the functions they perform are related to their official responsibilities.

"Hatched" employees, however, may not perform tasks that are purely political in nature or which relate solely to their principal's political activities. Logistical arrangements for an exempted official's purely political travel or appearances should be made where possible by the appropriate political organization, but a "hatched" employee customarily involved in such ministerial activities may make limited scheduling arrangements for his or her principal's political travel or appearances. Under no circumstances may a "hatched" employee engage in any of the "management" activities of a political event or work on the activities of a committee (such as the Platform or Rules Committees of a political convention).

For reference purposes, we have attached a practical guide to permissible and impermissible activities under the Hatch Act. However, if you have any questions with respect to these matters, please call the White House Counsel's Office before you act. In addition, you should be aware that the White House Office of Political Affairs (OPA) serves as the official liaison to the political community, including party officials, candidates, and campaign officials and staff. White House staff members exempt from the Hatch Act who desire (as an entirely voluntary matter) to participate in political activities should coordinate their activities with OPA.

II. LIMITS ON POLITICAL ACTIVITIES OF EXEMPT PERSONNEL

Even staff members who are exempted from the Hatch Act's prohibitions on partisan political activities are subject to certain restrictions. For example, the Hatch Act prohibits all Federal employees from using their official authority or

² Because the discharge of official duties is the only basis for a "hatched" employee to be accompanying his or her principal on a political trip, the travel expenses of such an employee must be paid from appropriated funds.

influence for the purpose of interfering with, or affecting, the results of an election. Similarly, appropriations law principles prohibit the use of appropriated funds and government resources for "political purposes."³

We have set forth below guidelines to help ensure that political activities undertaken by exempt personnel are within the limits prescribed by law and White House policy. As the campaign nears, we will provide additional guidance to exempt personnel who have responsibility for developing Administration policies and programs, to help further clarify the bounds of appropriate official and political activity.

USE OF LEAVE

(1) Certain White House staff members are entitled to specific amounts of annual leave. As discussed below, such leave may be used for political purposes; however, one cannot take an "advance" on annual leave to engage in political activities. Those White House staff members not entitled to annual leave (e.g., commissioned officers) may use a ceiling of 15 days per year of compensatory leave (i.e., the equivalent of vacation time) for political purposes.

(2) Non-"hatched" White House staff members must perform their official duties for a minimum of 40 hours per week or 80 hours per two week pay period in order to receive their full Federal salary. If a staff member does not complete 40 hours of official duty in any week, the difference between the number of hours completed and 40 hours must be covered by annual leave, leave without pay, official holidays or made up in the second week of that pay period. The difference cannot be made up in a subsequent pay period.

(3) Those non-"hatched" White House staff members who complete a minimum of 40 hours of official duty during any full week (Monday-Sunday) may be absent from their official duty station for no more than one weekday (Monday-Friday) for the purpose of engaging in political activity without taking annual leave or leave without pay. If a staff member desires to be absent for political purposes for more than one weekday in any week, each additional weekday must be covered by annual leave or leave without pay, regardless of the number of official hours

³ It is important to understand that for purposes of this section, the official responsibilities that customarily have been performed by the Office of Political Affairs constitute "official" and not "political" activities, and the restraints cited here therefore do not in general affect activities and office maintenance or other costs undertaken or incurred in the discharge of such responsibilities.

worked during that week. In other words, it is not permissible for a staff member to put in 40 hours of official duty in the first three days of the week and then take the remaining two weekdays off for campaigning without using annual leave or leave without pay.

(4) Sick leave may not be used to cover an absence from official duty for the purpose of engaging in political activity.

(5) Any White House staff member not subject to the Hatch Act is permitted to take leave without pay to cover absence from official duties for the purpose of engaging in political activity.

(6) When annual leave, compensatory leave or leave without pay is used for political purposes:

(a) Staff members must submit a request for leave, in advance of the leave period, to their White House unit supervisor. Following approval by the supervisor, the request should be forwarded to the White House Personnel Office.

(b) Supervisors must forward to the White House Personnel Office, in advance of a leave period, a report of their intended use of leave for political purposes.

(7) Staff members may only use eight hours of compensatory leave for political activity during any 7-day period without approval of the White House Personnel Office.

USE OF VEHICLES AND MESSENGERS

White House vehicles may not be used for political purposes. This means that White House cars may not be used to transport staff members or materials to or from any political committee office or event. Nor may White House vehicles be used to transport staff members or political materials to airports or any other location if the purpose of the trip is primarily political.

Because of the special requirements surrounding departures and arrivals from Andrews Air Force Base, White House vehicles may be used to transport White House staff members there when they are accompanying the President, Vice President or First Lady on a political trip. Additionally, where the President is participating in a political event in the Washington, D.C. area or other location where White House cars are available for official purposes, White House cars may be used for the Presidential motorcade to the extent essential to the security and support of the President.

White House messengers should not be used to deliver or pick up materials from the RNC, Bush-Quayle '92 or any other political committee.

USE OF COMMUNICATIONS SYSTEMS AND COPYING MACHINES

(1) In those limited circumstances in which Government communication systems (telephone, telegraph, teletype, telecopy or radio) are used for campaign-related purposes, appropriate reimbursement or payment at the "usual and normal charge," 15 C.F.R. § 100.7(a)(1)(B), must be made by a proper political campaign committee.

(2) Because of the need for liaison between a limited number of White House staff members and a political committee, telephones may be used for local calls. However, White House telephones must not be used, even locally, for regular campaign activities such as recruiting volunteers or fundraising.

(3) Government credit cards must not be used for campaign-related or other political calls, whether made from within or without the White House.

(4) Government operators should not be used to place campaign-related or other political long distance calls.

(5) Campaign-related or political long distance telephone calls made from the White House may be made only if charged to a credit card issued by the proper campaign or political committee or on telephones installed and maintained by a political committee for exclusive use in dealing with campaign or political matters.

(6) The incoming WATS System (800 #) should not be used to call into the White House on campaign or political matters.

(7) White House Communications Agency (WHCA) facilities provided outside the White House in connection with travel may continue to be used during mixed and wholly political trips. These facilities must be used exclusively for communications relating to trip planning and arrangements and not for direct political purposes such as campaign fundraising and crowd-building.

(8) Government copying machines may not be used to reproduce materials for transmittal to a campaign or political committee except in those limited instances where there is an official purpose for doing so.

TRAVEL

Government funds must not be used for the political travel of staff members. Principles governing the allocation of travel expenses are set forth elsewhere.

Any political or "mixed" official and political travel by White House staff must be approved in advance by the Deputy Assistant to the President and Director of White House Operations, by the Office of Political Affairs and by the appropriate political committee. No reimbursements will be made for non-approved travel expenses.

MEETINGS IN GOVERNMENT BUILDINGS

(1) Government buildings, including White House offices and meeting rooms, should not be used for meetings or events organized by a campaign or political committee. Informal meetings involving small numbers of campaign or political officials and White House staff members may occasionally be held in a White House staff member's office or, if it is a luncheon or breakfast meeting, in the White House Mess, provided that such meetings do not interfere with the conduct of Government business.

(2) Campaign fundraising activities of any kind are prohibited in or from Government buildings.

(3) Campaign-sponsored or other political activities (receptions, dinners, meetings, but not fundraisers) may be held in the Executive Residence at the White House, provided that either the President, Mrs. Bush, or some other family member attends the event. Campaign or other political events (other than fundraisers) may also be held at the Vice President's Residence so long as the Vice President, Mrs. Quayle, or some other family member attends the event. The cost of campaign or political events at either residence must be paid for by the proper campaign or political committee in accordance with the guidelines that have been established for the use of these residences for nonofficial purposes.

USE OF PHOTOGRAPHS

(1) White House photographers may continue to photograph all Presidential, First Lady, and Vice Presidential activities for the purpose of creating an archival record of this Administration. However, as a general rule, photographs taken by White House photographers at political events may not be used for distribution to individuals attending those events or for any other political or campaign purpose.

(2) Photographs taken at events in the Executive Residence (other than political-sponsored events), at West Wing and East Wing meetings, and at non-political events outside the White House may be distributed as in the past.

(3) A campaign or political committee will be expected to provide a photographer at all campaign and political events for which it desires to distribute photographs to the participants. White House photographers will not photograph receiving lines or greetings at campaign or political events, except to the extent necessary for archival purposes.

(4) A campaign or political committee may purchase for its use photographs taken by White House photographers in those limited circumstances where those photographs provide the only source for a particular picture. All photograph purchase requests from the campaign or political committee must be directed to the Director of the White House Photo Office. A record of all campaign photo requests will be maintained by the Director of the White House Photo Office, who will be responsible for billing the campaign or political committee for all photo orders on a monthly basis at the normal rate and according to the procedures established by the Government for the purchase of pictures.

CORRESPONDENCE

(1) Campaign and political correspondence must not be produced at the White House, nor can White House stationery, stamps or related supplies be used in the preparation of such correspondence at another location.

(2) Federal law prohibits the receipt of campaign contributions in Federal buildings. Occasionally, contributions intended for a campaign committee may be addressed to the White House and delivered with other mail. Such contributions should be handled as they have been handled in the past, by returning the contributions to the sender with an explanation of the applicable Federal law and a statement of the appropriate recipient's address. (Appropriate language may be obtained from the White House Counsel's Office.) There should be no acknowledgement of receipt of a contribution from the White House to the contributor. If the contribution is accompanied by a letter that deals primarily with governmental issues, a response dealing with those issues may be prepared and sent from the White House; however, there must be no reference to the contribution.

CRIMINAL STATUTES

A number of criminal statutes prohibit the use of Federal programs, property, or employment for political purposes. Violation of these criminal statutes is punishable by

imprisonment and/or the payment of a substantial fine. Certain staff members may also be subject to investigation and possible prosecution by an Independent Counsel in connection with alleged violations of these statutes.

Solicitation of Campaign Contributions: Solicitation of campaign contributions from Federal employees is prohibited, as is the solicitation or receipt of contributions in Federal buildings or on Federal property. Unless specifically approved by the White House Counsel's Office and the Office of Political Affairs, no White House staff member shall sign a fundraising letter on behalf of any Federal candidate.

Use of Official Authority: Criminal statutes prohibit any Federal employee, whether or not "hatched," from using his or her "official authority for the purpose of interfering with, or affecting, the nomination or the election of any candidate." While there is no definitive statement by a court or other body of what activities constitute such improper interference with election results, the following types of activities are clearly prohibited:

- One Federal employee directly or indirectly soliciting money from another Federal employee for a campaign contribution, or making a contribution to the official responsible for his or her employment.

- Soliciting or receiving campaign contributions on Federal property or in Federal buildings. This means that fundraising events may not be held in the White House; that no fundraising phone calls or mail may emanate from the White House or any other Federal buildings; and that no campaign contributions may be received at the White House or any other Federal building.

- Soliciting or accepting a campaign contribution or campaign support in exchange for a promise to appoint someone to a Federal job.

- Promising or withholding Federal benefits (jobs, grants, contracts, etc.) based on political support or nonsupport.

- Favoring or penalizing employees or withholding employment in order to induce someone to make a political contribution or otherwise participate in political activity.

Violations of these statutes can of course have serious consequences. If you have any questions about the legality or propriety of a proposed action, I urge you to consult the White House Counsel's Office.

DO'S AND DON'TS ON POLITICAL ACTIVITY FOR STAFF
COVERED BY THE HATCH ACT

DO'S

You may register and vote as you choose in any election. (You may also run for local office in certain exempted communities.)

You may assist in voter registration drives.

You may express your opinion about candidates and issues, privately and publicly, as long as you do not take an active part in partisan political management or campaigns.

You may participate in campaigns where none of the candidates represent a political party.

You may contribute money to a political organization or attend a political fundraising function.

NOTE: WHETHER OR NOT YOU ARE COVERED BY THE HATCH ACT, YOU MAY NOT CONTRIBUTE TO BUSH-QUAYLE '92 IF THE PRESIDENT OR VICE PRESIDENT IS YOUR "EMPLOYER." CONSULT WITH YOUR GENERAL COUNSEL TO DETERMINE IF THIS RULE APPLIES TO YOU.

You may wear or display political badges, buttons or stickers.

You may attend political rallies and meetings and participate by, for example, waving banners, cheering and demonstrating as a member of the crowd.

DON'TS

You may not campaign for your partisan candidates or political parties or be a candidate for nomination or election to a national or state office.

You may not work to register voters for only one party.

You may not make campaign speeches or engage in other activity to elect a partisan candidate.

You may not be a candidate or work in a campaign if any candidate represents a national or state political party.

You may not collect contributions or sell tickets to political fundraising functions or otherwise actively promote such activities as political dinners.

You may not distribute campaign material in a partisan election.

You may not organize or manage or lead political rallies or meetings.

You may attend a political convention (but not as a delegate).

You may join a political club or party.

You may sign petitions, including nominating petitions, but may not initiate them or canvass for signatures, if they are nominating petitions for candidates in partisan elections.

You may campaign for or against referendum questions, constitutional amendments, municipal ordinances, etc., including writing your Representatives and Senators to Say how you think they should vote on a particular issue.

You may not organize or participate in the program of a political convention.

You may not hold office in a political club or party.

You may not circulate nominating petitions.

You may not campaign for or against a candidate or slate of candidates in a partisan election.

MEMORANDUM FOR THE PRESIDENT

SUBJECT: Update on U.S.-Russia Business Development

The U.S.-Russia Business Development Committee we created in June is working to push through 25 U.S. company projects with over \$3 billion of potential investment. We are getting business started and establishing a roadmap to success for additional American companies. We have an ambitious schedule of trade promotion events and exchanges planned for the rest of this year, capped by my plans to lead a Presidential Trade Mission to Russia later this fall.

We achieved a breakthrough with Russian approval of a tax exemption for the large Conoco project in Northern Russia. We have helped a number of other companies conclude agreements, including ones for a Radisson-Americom hotel and business center and an Interstate Electronics proposal to produce jointly a satellite navigation code receiver. An Upjohn pharmaceutical plant and a ROTEC housing project are among several projects which are close to fruition, and we are aggressively pushing for closing action by the Russian government.

Because of the symbolic value of the project, the Department of Commerce is going all out to assist Marriott's efforts to proceed with an operating contract for the world famous National Hotel across from Red Square. You mentioned this project to President Yeltsin in June. The Moscow Mayor's office is threatening to invalidate the contract and retender. If this happens, other companies will be discouraged from risking investments in Russia.

I am focusing now on helping the Russians understand that it is time for them to set priorities and implement a clear policy on allocating their limited hard currency. We are facing the danger that American companies will become discouraged as they see many projects stalled because of a lack of decision-making ability on the part of the Russian government.

Meanwhile, we are bringing more and more companies into Russia through trade missions and conferences. Our new BISNIS Information Service for the New Independent States (BISNIS) already has a mailing list of 10,000 U.S. companies. Arrangements are being completed by our Special American Business Internship Training program (SABIT) for 300 interns from the new independent states, and we are arranging with State and AID to renew the program next year.

On another matter, we appear to be on track to resolving the uranium antidumping case against Russia and four other Independent States by concluding suspension agreements allowing them to continue some hard currency sales. Initialed agreements must be signed by October 16.

The President today recognized Andrew Bales of Des Moines, Iowa, as the 930th Daily Point of Light for the Nation. Mr. Bales helps clients of Good Samaritan Urban Ministries develop a sense of well-being, while providing them with a decent, safe place to live.

Going above and beyond his professional responsibilities as Executive Director of Good Samaritan Urban Ministries, Mr. Bales volunteers up to 20 hours each week. Under his leadership during the past two years, Good Samaritan has grown to become an affordable complex with both transitional and permanent housing for low-income individuals and families. Over 80 volunteers offer legal guidance, child care, tutoring, and health care, and serve as sponsor families.

Mr. Bales is a mentor to the residents of the housing complex, offering friendship and guidance to the families. He works one-to-one with each family, addressing their particular needs and enabling them to develop life and job skills and maintain emotional stability. Residents know that he is available 24 hours a day as a trusted confidant and advisor. He gives them hope to lead productive, independent lives.

Mr. Bales, a father of six, organized Saturday Night Ministry, which has mobilized 15 to 20 volunteers to serve hot meals to homeless people. In six years, the program has expanded to cover a 35-mile radius, from the center of town to its rural outskirts, providing 400 to 700 meals each Saturday night. During that time Mr. Bales has established trusting relationships and credibility with homeless individuals. Over two-thirds know him by name and regularly seek his support.

The President salutes Andrew Bales for exemplifying his belief that, "From now on in America, any definition of a successful life must include serving others."

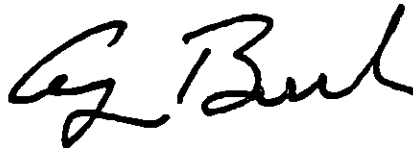

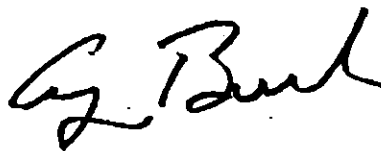

The President today recognized Doris Frank of Lake Waukomis, Missouri, as the 927th Daily Point of Light for the Nation. Mrs. Frank provides educational and recreational opportunities to individuals with disabilities and troubled youth.

Mrs. Frank, 65, teaches an aqua-therapy class for people with physical disabilities. Since she established this program in 1968, 135 swimmers each year have used the therapeutic exercises to overcome obstacles ranging from broken ankles to multiple sclerosis. Mrs. Frank, along with a corps of 100 volunteers, offers students one-to-one assistance through a specially-designed, individual exercise program at no cost.

For the past 25 years, Mrs. Frank has enabled individuals with disabilities and juvenile delinquents to meet each other and learn about their respective challenges. She volunteers more than 40 hours every week as a juvenile support counselor and supervisor at the Platte County Juvenile Department. On call 24-hours a day, she works with juvenile first offenders when they are taken into custody at the police department. She introduces them to her aqua-therapy classes where, every year, 50 to 70 of them volunteer, helping the students with water exercises. The youth develop a stronger sense of responsibility and self-esteem as they serve others. According to the Kansas City Police Department, over 90 percent of these juveniles do not become repeat offenders.

The President today recognized the volunteers of Genesis Women's Shelter of Dallas, Texas, as the 929th Daily Point of Light for the Nation. The volunteers provide a safe place to live and a sense of well-being to victims of domestic violence.

A program of Shelter Ministries of Dallas, Genesis Women's Shelter, founded in 1985, provides emergency refuge, food, clothing, counseling, and medical referrals to victims of domestic violence. Although some clients seek immediate crisis intervention, many need long-term assistance to live independently and lead more productive lives. They may remain at the shelter for six weeks.

This year, the shelter has served 575 women and children, offering counseling and support groups several times each week at which the women learn good parenting and career skills and prepare for court appearances. In addition, volunteers provide children developmental and psychological counseling, equipping them to cope with violence in their homes and teaching them to seek refuge from it to protect themselves.

Sixty volunteers offer support during counseling sessions, help with day care, answer hotline phone calls, and accompany the women to court appearances. Bilingual volunteers serve non-English speaking women and children. Others train new students at the Police Academy to recognize domestic violence situations and to offer support and sympathy to the victims.

Local volunteer attorneys offer pro bono legal advice and help in securing restraining orders. To raise public awareness about domestic violence, volunteers give workshops to school children and work with doctors and nurses, teaching them to recognize signs of abuse.

The President today recognized the volunteers of the Hidenwood Tutoring Team of Newport News, Virginia, as the 931st Daily Point of Light for the Nation. Hidenwood volunteers improve the educational opportunities available to elementary school children, fostering a culture of lifelong learning.

Established in 1989, the Tutoring Team instructs "at risk" first, second, and third grade students at Hidenwood Elementary School. Consisting of more than 40 volunteers from Hidenwood Presbyterian Church, the Tutoring Team has served 82 students with 1,760 hours of service.

Tutoring sessions are held twice daily. Students meet with their tutors three times each week, and no more than three children are assigned to any one tutor. Tutors read to students, listen as the students read to them, dictate words for those children unable to write or spell, and lead discussions that link stories with life experiences. Closely interacting and developing valuable relationships with students, volunteer tutors complete pupil progress reports, assessing the reading levels and specific problems of each child.

The program donates books four times a year and provides other weekly reading materials to the children. According to Ollie Lowe, Supervisor of Special Education Support Services and member of the church, "This program, beyond reading, teaches trust, offers genuine caring and interest, and provides good role models for children." The Tutoring Team concept has been replicated by ten other churches in the Newport News area.

The program has seen successful results, as nearly all of its participants improved their scores on tests taken before and after the program to diagnose problems and to evaluate and measure the program's effectiveness.

For the past five and a half years, Mrs. Shapiro has volunteered at Cleveland Works, a non-profit organization that offers tutoring to those completing their GED or improving math and grammar skills for their jobs. Her individual instruction helps instill independence, confidence, and self-esteem in 25 to 30 adults. She teaches the basics of math, grammar, English, and history, which her students need to gain employment or to continue their education. She also teaches an eight-week class called "Citizenship," which introduces students to our government and the importance of citizen participation. Taking classes three afternoons each week at Case Western Reserve University to stay current with world events, she shares the knowledge available there with her students.

Mrs. Shapiro also individually tutors nine non-English speaking Russian students who recently arrived in the United States. Although she does not speak or understand Russian, she teaches English through actions, pictures, and gestures.

The President today recognized Lydia Flores Perkins of Pharr, Texas, as the 933rd Daily Point of Light for the Nation. Mrs. Perkins provides recreational opportunities and a sense of well-being for individuals with disabilities in her area.

For the past thirteen years, Mrs. Perkins has volunteered ten hours each week for the Special Olympics. She serves as a coach, trainer, fundraiser, recruiter, chairperson of the Special Olympic Family Committee in her area, and member of Family Committees for the state and Nation. In recruiting adult athletes with disabilities to participate in the Special Olympics, she helps them to develop self-esteem, a sense of belonging, endurance, and discipline. Currently, she coaches and trains ten athletes ages 24 to 33 who compete against other adults with disabilities throughout the state in basketball, bowling, track and field, and softball. She also publishes a newsletter, written in both Spanish and English, to inform individuals with disabilities throughout the state of athletic opportunities available through Special Olympics.

Mrs. Perkins has increased the number of athletes with mental disabilities who are involved in Special Olympics. She stresses the importance of sustained family support: by providing encouragement, love, and coaching, the family can help produce winners. When the program began in 1988, 200 families actively participated. Now, more than 750 families are taking part in the Special Olympics locally. Mrs. Perkins also began an annual Family's Banquet five years ago that unites athletes, coaches, and their families for a celebration of the year's successes and accomplishments.

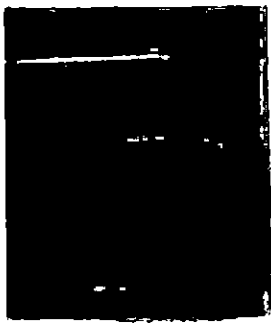

SUBJECT: Delegation to the Federal Republic of Germany's

The Federal Republic of Germany will hold a state funeral for former Chancellor Willy Brandt in Berlin on Saturday October 17. Numerous countries will be represented at a senior level. The State Department and National Security Council recommend that we send a two-person delegation. Ambassador Robert Kimmitt may also attend as part of his official duties in Germany.

I have not contacted any of the following individuals to ascertain their interest, but upon your approval, I will do so. I recommend that you approve the following individuals, so that I may call them, in order, so as to produce a delegation of two plus Ambassador Kimmitt.

PRESIDENT RICHARD NIXON, of New Jersey. 37th President of the United States.

PRESIDENT GERALD FORD, of California. 38th President of the United States.

HENRY KISSINGER, of New York. Former Secretary of State.

AMBASSADOR VERNON WALTERS, of Virginia. Former Ambassador to the Federal Republic of Germany.

SENATOR CLAIBORNE PELL, of Rhode Island. Senator Pell is the Chairman of the Senate Foreign Relations Committee.

Upon your approval and the concurrence of those whom you select, an immediate announcement will be made.
