Dear Mr. Rogich:

After a conversation with Robert Marbut, I thought it might be helpful if I contacted you directly to provide some additional information on the Goodwill Games.

As you know, the Games will occur this summer, July 20 to August 5. The Games, while originally organized by Ted Turner, have been reorganized in Seattle under the sponsorship of a non-profit organizing committee. The Games will bring the equivalent of the Olympic finals to Seattle. In 21 sports, there will be a Soviet team, a US team, and then the six best teams as determined by the governing bodies for those sports. There will be approximately 3,000 athletes representing 60 countries. This will be the largest competition between the Soviet Union and the United States in the history of the two countries.

In conjunction with the Games, the Seattle Organizing Committee has helped organize a number of important bilateral non-sports programs with the Soviet Union. We will be hosting the largest visual arts program, the largest performing arts program, the largest conference program, and the largest home-stay exchange program in the history of the two countries. In short, from a cultural perspective, from a sports perspective, and from a people-to-people perspective, the Goodwill Games will be an historic event in the relationship of the Soviet Union and the United States.

The President has been invited (a copy of the invitation is attached). The President has established an informal White House Task Force to coordinate the federal government's involvement with the Games. Andy Card is staffing that task force. Vice-President Quayle included a Goodwill Games volunteer rally as part of a trip to Seattle last fall. He received a tremendous amount of press from that appearance.
