(2) When a vacancy occurs in the office of Comptroller General or Deputy Comptroller General, a commission is established to recommend individuals to the President for appointment to the vacant office. The commission shall be composed of—

- (A) the Speaker of the House of Representatives;
- (B) the President pro tempore of the Senate;
- (C) the majority and minority leaders of the House of Representatives and the Senate;

(D) the chairmen and ranking minority members of the Committee on Governmental Affairs of the Senate and the Committee on Government Operations of the House; and

(E) when the office of Deputy Comptroller General is vacant, the Comptroller General.

(3) A commission established because of a vacancy in the office of the Comptroller General shall recommend at least 3 individuals. The President may ask the commission to recommend additional individuals.

(b) Except as provided in subsection (e) of this section, the term of the Comptroller General is 15 years. The Comptroller General may not be reappointed. The term of the Deputy Comptroller General expires on the date an individual is appointed Comptroller General. The Deputy Comptroller General may continue to serve until a successor is appointed.

(c) The Deputy Comptroller General—

(1) carries out duties and powers prescribed by the Comptroller General; and

(2) acts for the Comptroller General when the Comptroller General is absent or unable to serve or when the office of Comptroller General is vacant.

(d) The Comptroller General shall designate an officer or employee of the General Accounting Office to act as Comptroller General when the Comptroller General and Deputy Comptroller General are absent or unable to serve or when the offices of Comptroller General and Deputy Comptroller General are vacant.

(e)(1) A Comptroller General or Deputy Comptroller General retires on becoming 70 years of age. Either may be removed at any time by—

(A) impeachment; or

(B) joint resolution of Congress, after notice and an opportunity for a hearing, only for—

- (i) permanent disability;
- (ii) inefficiency;
- (iii) neglect of duty;
- (iv) malfeasance; or

(v) a felony or conduct involving moral turpitude.

(2) A Comptroller General or Deputy Comptroller General removed from office under paragraph (1) of this subsection may not be reappointed to the office.

(f) The annual rate of basic pay of the—

(1) Comptroller General is equal to the rate for level II of the Executive Schedule; and

(2) Deputy Comptroller General is equal to the rate for level III of the Executive Schedule.

§ 704. Relationship to other laws

(a) To the extent applicable, all laws generally related to administering an agency apply to the Comptroller General.

(b) A copy of a record and a transcript from a record or proceeding of the Comptroller General, that the Comptroller General or Deputy Comptroller General certifies under seal, shall be admitted as evidence with the same effect as a copy or transcript referred to in section 1733 of title 28.

SUBCHAPTER II—GENERAL DUTIES AND POWERS

§ 711. General authority

The Comptroller General may—

(1) prescribe regulations to carry out the duties and powers of the Comptroller General;

(2) delegate the duties and powers of the Comptroller General to officers and employees of the General Accounting Office as the Comptroller General decides is necessary to carry out those duties and powers;

(3) regulate the practice of representatives of persons before the Office; and

(4) administer oaths to witnesses when auditing and settling accounts.

§ 712. Investigating the use of public money

The Comptroller General shall—

(1) investigate all matters related to the receipt, disbursement, and use of public money;

(2) estimate the cost to the United States Government of complying with each restriction on expenditures of a specific appropriation in a general appropriation law and report each estimate to Congress with recommendations the Comptroller General considers desirable;

(3) analyze expenditures of each executive agency the Comptroller General believes will help Congress decide whether public money has been used and expended economically and efficiently;

(4) make an investigation and report ordered by either House of Congress or a committee of Congress having jurisdiction over revenue, appropriations, or expenditures; and

(5) give a committee of Congress having jurisdiction over revenue, appropriations, or expenditures the help and information the committee requests.

As you know, we have been trying to help Basil economically and have run into some roadblocks. I don't think anyone could question how much Basil has meant to the Republican Party in Delaware, and I think his organizational talents have helped others on a regional, and even national, basis.

He is presently the Administrator of the Delaware Turnpike. He is also the non-paid Chairman of the Republican State Committee, and therein lies the rub. The Delaware River Basin Commission position we were pursuing does fall under the Hatch Act. Nobody, including Basil, wants him to step down as State Chairman. His job is also considered full time and Basil is not the kind to accept a full-time job when he has other commitments.

Basil is the kind, however, to be able to do a part-time job in a splendid way and probably accomplish a lot more than most people doing it on a full-time basis. He is a glutton for work, and I don't need to tell you about how organized he is.

The question then becomes -- is there anything in the Federal government locally or on a regional basis which would allow Basil to maintain his present job and be the Republican State Chairman of Delaware, but to earn some additional income in exchange for a job well performed. I simply know nothing about all the positions that might be out there, nor do I necessarily believe there are many, if any, positions that would fit this description. SUBJECT: Guam

A situation has come to my attention which, based on my experience in territorial affairs, I recognized as important enough to require your attention. The matter arises from a request made of me by Congressman Ben Blaz for Administration assistance in dealing with political issues in Guam. Here are the essential points:

- Walter Mondale's associates (on monthly retainer of \$16,000) have convinced Guam's Governor and "Self-Determination Commission" to attack the Bush Administration (primarily Interior), link U.S. military interests to increased federal outlays to Guam and blame delay in federal action on Ben Blaz.
- These tactics are part of Guam Governor's effort to present the proposed Guam Commonwealth Act as a fait accompli that must be approved without revision. The Governor is now seeking intervention by the U.N. Committee on Decolonization in the matter of Guam's status.
- Ben Blaz is standing tall and urging Guam to refrain from inflammatory tactics and prepare for give-and-take to accommodate legitimate federal and territorial interests.
- Ben is being isolated and accused of being ineffective. He requests a letter from the President (draft attached) to encourage moderation and see him through the political storm while Interior's Task Force and then Congress develop a position on Guam's proposals.
- In addition to a Presidential message recognizing Guam's Liberation Day on July 21, I recommend that the President give Ben Blaz a shot in the arm with this letter of appreciation.

Dear Ben:

As Guam prepares to celebrate its liberation on July 21, 1944, I want to express my appreciation for your leadership in Congress on behalf of Guam.

I understand that you and many of Guam's elected leaders are working toward the goal of establishing a local constitutional government. Guam's leadership also has asked Congress to enact legislation concerning applicability of federal policies and laws under a proposed commonwealth act. It is my hope that the results of this effort will enhance the opportunities for economic and social advancement which Guam already enjoys as a member of the American political family.

As the Congress considers legislation for Guam in light of both federal and local interests, I know your colleagues in Congress will continue to look to you to promote reason and a spirit of accommodation. In this process I wish you and the people of Guam all the best.





Dear Andy:

As you know, we have been trying to help Basil economically and have run into some roadblocks. I don't think anyone could question how much Basil has meant to the Republican Party in Delaware, and I think his organizational talents have helped others on a regional, and even national, basis.

He is presently the Administrator of the Delaware Turnpike. He is also the non-paid Chairman of the Republican State Committee, and therein lies the rub. The Delaware River Basin Commission position we were pursuing does fall under the Hatch Act. Nobody, including Basil, wants him to step down as State Chairman. His job is also considered full time and Basil is not the kind to accept a full-time job when he has other commitments.

Basil is the kind, however, to be able to do a part-time job in a splendid way and probably accomplish a lot more than most people doing it on a full-time basis. He is a glutton for work, and I don't need to tell you about how organized he is.

The question then becomes -- is there anything in the Federal government locally or on a regional basis which would allow Basil to maintain his present job and be the Republican State Chairman of Delaware, but to earn some additional income in exchange for a job well performed. I simply know nothing about all the positions that might be out there, nor do I necessarily believe there are many, if any, positions that would fit this description. Nonetheless, because of my personal commitment to Basil and because of his early support of the President, I did not want to let the opportunity to help him pass.
