The President-elect also wanted a break-down of the Military Affairs Office budget.

What is the history of Rex Scouten and Gary Walters in the Residence staff?

done The President-elect does not plan on keeping the President's physician. How does he go about selecting a different doctor?

done Senator Mark Hatfield's son is looking for a job with Legislative Affairs either at the White House or with Commerce or Energy.

done Jen Teague of the VP's Senate staff should have a chance to stay on with Senator Quayle.

done The VP does not have any preference regarding the assignment of office space in the West Wing. He would agree to moving the VP's office to space closer to the Oval Office if Senator Quayle agrees. Scowcroft should keep the space now used by NSC. Boyden should keep the space used by Counsel. All Assistants should have office space in the West Wing.

done Susan Porter Rose should not be an Assistant to the President. She should be ranked at the Deputy Assistant level.

Congressional Relations
in a
New Administration

Beginning in 1969 with the advent of the Nixon Administration, there has been growing animosity between the Congress of the United States and the White House. Except for the period of time when President Ford was President and the short period of time that Howard Baker was Chief of Staff, the White House and the Congress have been in an adversarial relationship.

As someone once said "A House divided cannot stand" nor can a Government divided govern. One of the first things the next President should do upon taking office is to repair the rift that now exists between the Congress and the White House.

The quickest and easiest way for the next President to signal his willingness to enter into a cooperative arrangement with the Congress is the selection of an experienced, well-connected Presidential Assistant for Congressional Relations. I believe that over the last twenty years the role of Assistant for Congressional Relations has been relegated to nothing more than an information gathering office. The relationship between the Congress and the White House is too crucial to good government to have the post filled by someone who has neither a background on the Hill or an understanding of the relationship between the Executive and the Legislative Branches.

Further, it will be important that the President not only select someone of stature who is well-respected on the Hill but that the President make sure that the person is present at all meetings where decisions are being made that include either acceptance by the Hill or requires legislation be enacted. The role of the Presidential Assistant for Congressional Relations must be returned to the days of Bryce Harlow in the Eisenhower years and Mike Manatos in the Johnson years.

The selection of someone with the experience of a Harlow and the Congressional understanding of a Manatos will signal to the Congress the next President's desire to work with the Congress to provide good government for all the people. The selection of this person should be made very early in the Administration and with the same fanfare as the appointment of Cabinet officers.

In conclusion, one need only remember the change in the atmosphere between the White House and the Congress with the appointment of Howard Baker as chief of staff to realize how important the right person being selected as head of Congressional Relations in the White House will be for the incoming President.

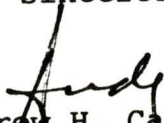

SUBJECT: Marilyn Quayle's Visit to Mexico

I thought it would be useful for the President to know about Mrs. Quayle's important work with our office in disaster mitigation and relief.

As I mentioned to you in our recent conversation, Mrs. Quayle accepted our suggestion that she attend with me the 25th Anniversary meeting of the National Association of Partners of the Americas, an organization which fosters technical exchanges between the U.S. and Latin American countries, with which our office has a sizeable disaster preparedness grant. At the request of Ambassador Negroponte, Mrs. Quayle agreed to stop in Mexico City prior to the Partners meeting in Guadalajara to visit with President Salinas and to discuss disaster issues with the Mexican Red Cross and government disaster managers.

Her visit went quite well. The most significant part of her trip was a meeting with the Undersecretary of the Secretariat of Interior who is responsible among other things for disaster management, mitigation and preparedness. The Undersecretary invited Mrs. Quayle back to Mexico in March 1990 for the inauguration of their Disaster Preparedness Center, a project of the Government of Japan valued at \$9.5 million. After a lengthy discussion in the Secretariat with senior Mexican disaster managers and scientists, the Interior Undersecretary concluded the meeting by turning to Mrs. Quayle and indicating his government's high level interest in renegotiating the bilateral Mexico-United States Border Agreement on Natural Disasters, a major reversal in Mexican government policy on this issue.

Our A.I.D. Representative in Mexico City informed us that when the U.S. Embassy had previously raised the issue of renegotiation of our border agreement on disasters with the Mexicans, in conjunction with the series of meetings which took place during Secretary Baker's recent visit, the Foreign Ministry indicated existing arrangements were sufficient and had no interest in further discussions on the matter. Apparently Mrs. Quayle's reputation, serious interest in the field and visit served as an important catalyst to change Mexican interest in further cooperation on disaster management. We intend to pursue this matter in the coming months with the A.I.D. Representative and the U.S. Embassy.

At a reception attended by senior Mexican government officials, businessmen and scholars held at Ambassador Negroponete's residence, Mrs. Quayle helped lead a very fruitful discussion on several important issues dealing with international relief response, particularly in relation to the Mexico City earthquake of 1985. This discussion will have an impact on how we shape future American responses to foreign disasters.

Mrs. Quayle's attendance at the Partners 25th Anniversary meeting was equally successful. More than 500 of the 25,000 Partners volunteers attended, representing 47 of the 60 partnerships. She spoke at the Partners Awards luncheon, singling out several individuals whose contribution to emergency preparedness has been outstanding. She also highlighted the important roles that the private sector and voluntary organizations play in both disaster relief and preparedness.

Mrs Quayle's visit to both Mexico City and Guadalajara received very favorable coverage in the local media. Her trip produced some unexpected benefits for the United States which would likely never have materialized without her influence and presence.

another way.

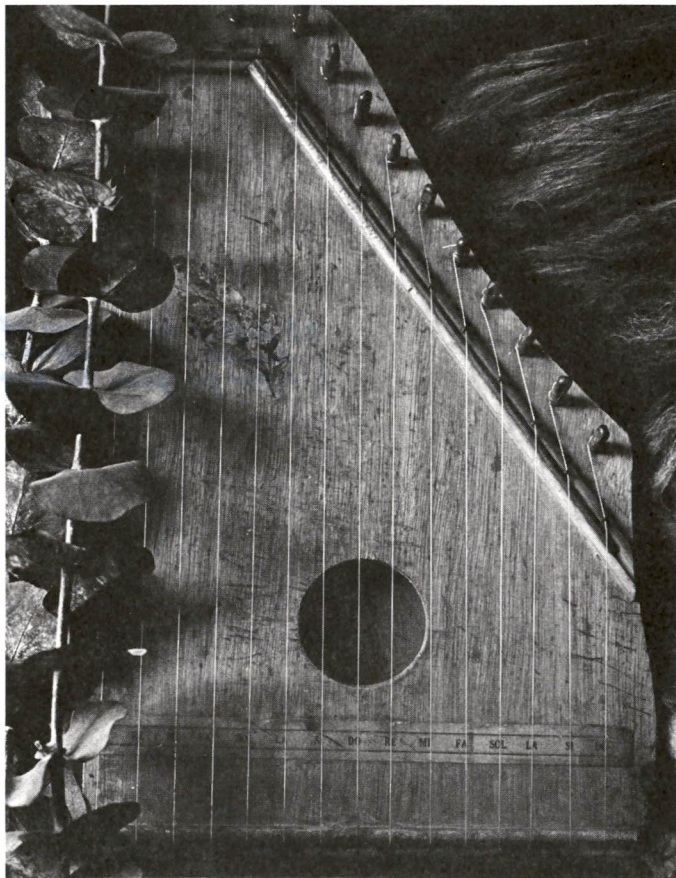
I do not in any way insist
