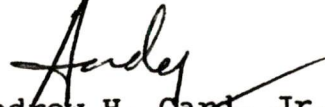

I am enclosing some background on the contests, as well as on Foundation For A Creative America, who sponsored the entire events for the celebration of the bicentennial of Patent and Copyright Laws.

Every major problem solving contest across the country is represented plus the winners of contests in high schools across the country for original works in the following categories: short story, poem, musical work, dramatic work, videotape, photograph and computer program.

As a volunteer I have the responsibility of coordinating the events here in Washington for the young winners and their chaperon, either a parent or a teacher. A copy of their proposed schedule is attached.

Most of the events listed with the exception of the events involving the White House and the President and Mrs. Bush have been confirmed. The requests to the President and the First Lady were handled separately. I am told that all requests have been regretted.

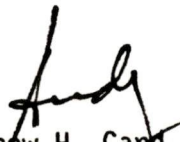

For a long time, I have been interested in attending a state dinner or other White House reception for the Prime Minister of Greece. I enclose my prior 1987 correspondence on this subject.

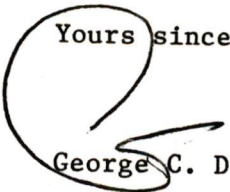

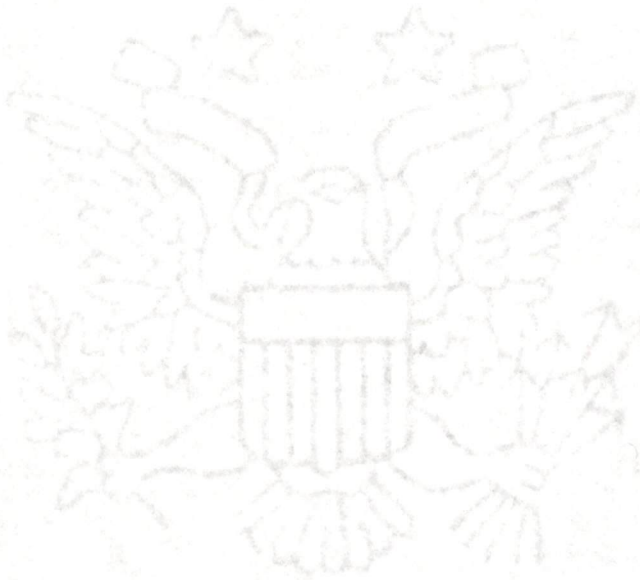

Rotarians around the world admire you as the First Lady of the United States. As a matter of fact, I'm sure they think that your husband is a pretty fortunate fellow.

Once each year, Rotarians from all over the world gather for their "Annual Convention." This year that convention will be in Portland, Oregon. We expect about 16,000 in attendance and normally 80 to 100 countries will be represented. About half of the attendance will be from the United States and the remainder from overseas. 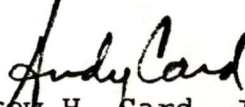

I hate to take up your time with this, but I'm not sure who write to and I know you can get this information to the right person.

Last week, Mrs. Bush visited my district. She landed in the City of Chicopee, which I represent, and then visited Brightside, a children's orphanage which is in the heart of my district. I wasn't notified or invited to either event even though the Democratic representatives and senators were.

The following day, the attached article appeared in the newspaper and I have had to "tap dance" around a number of questions from many of my constituents. The appearance to the general electorate is that we have no unity and that we don't take care of our own. That may be one of the reasons that we have such a terrible time getting people to run and getting them elected.

One reason I am bothered by this is that I worked very hard for President Bush after Senator Dole was out. I had a press conference in Washington with Jerry Solomon; and after Ron gave me the lead, I was responsible for getting out the information about the overdrafts at the Bank of Boston. The Herald headline the President used so effectively, as well as all the press interviews I gave to newspapers all over the country, I'm sure helped the campaign. Howarth and I did that, regardless of the local heat we knew we would generate for ourselves, and we weren't looking for anything except the victory the party enjoyed. The last thing I expected was that I would be "shot down" in my own district.

I know you have other more important things on your mind; but I felt I had to send this letter so that in the future the same error won't occur either here or elsewhere in the country.

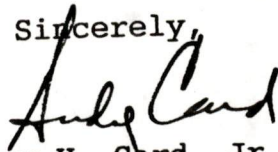

Dear Mrs. Bush:

The Brockton Area Private Industry Council has been involved in the development and implementation of adult literacy programs since 1985. The Council sponsored Adult Basic Education and English as a Second Language programs at the Council's Skills Training Center, the Brockton Public Schools Adult Learning Center and the local community college.

After completion of the first year program in adult literacy with the Adult Learning Center, the Council received commendation by the Massachusetts Department of Education as the state's most successful program, exceeding its goals by 140% with the lowest cost per participant of any program.

In June of 1987 the Council's Adult Literacy Committee met to review adult literacy needs and to provide support in identifying employers who would benefit from a workplace literacy program. The employer community was so enthusiastic about implementing workplace literacy that in October of 1987 the Council launched a five year plan to combat illiteracy in the Brockton area. The result is that adult literacy programs are presently being conducted at three major corporations, as well as the Adult Learning Center and community college.

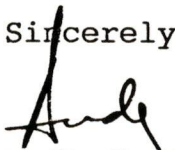

The Community Literacy Council in Plymouth, Michigan would like to invite you to attend a dinner in your honor. Thanks to your advocacy of literacy which has brought so much national attention to this most important issue, we have been very successful in reaching hundreds and hundreds of non-reading adults who want to read better and tutors who want to help an adult read.

We are a community-based organization that works in close partnership with our school district to provide both professional and paraprofessional reading help to our students. The school district sponsors our tutor training programs, while we recruit students and tutors, fundraise, and generally raise literacy awareness through promotional programs. Our civic organizations, like the Canton Rotary, have formed standing literacy committees that have sponsored major community events for our cause. Thanks to this broad-based community support and strong network, we have trained almost 200 tutors since 1985 and placed them with our most needy students.

One of our most moving experiences in working with adults was with Mr. John Young. Mr. Young, who is 58 years old and disabled, was a total non-reader when he entered our literacy program. He had recently lost his wife and was depressed. On the advice of his doctor, he reached out to us for help. Thanks to Mr. Young's dedication, great desire to learn, his tutor, and teacher, he became a very functional reader in just one year. He was nominated to attend the National Adult Literacy Congress in Philadelphia as the Michigan representative.

Despite the fact that Mr. Young and his wife were both non-readers, they raised a most remarkable son, John Jr. Their son had a brilliant high school career and graduated from the Air Force Academy. John continued in the military as a pilot but unfortunately was killed in a plane crash in 1989 while co-piloting a military plane. He was buried with full military honors in Plymouth, Michigan. Fortunately, Mr. Young can at least read all the wonderful letters that his son wrote and he can handle with pride all of his own business that involves reading. Mr. Young, his family, and his story sends a clear and moving message to all of us who work closely with those who have lost too many freedoms and opportunities because they cannot read.

One of our literacy council's new goals is intergenerational learning. We know that the likelihood of the children of non-reading adults having similar reading deficiencies is high. Therefore, we are developing programs for adults and children to learn together. This past Christmas we participated in the Detroit Free Press Gift of Reading program. We gave over 200 books to adults to pass to their children. This project brought books to homes with no reading material and joy of reading to both parents and children.

We would be honored to have you meet our students, tutors, Mr. John Young, and our community organizations that have been so supportive. We can only imagine the constraints of your schedule, so we would be happy to arrange the date for dinner in your honor to your convenience. The Community Literacy Council and all the students whom we serve truly appreciate your continuing support of literacy. We look forward to hearing from you.

Thank you very much for getting together yesterday. I felt the need to touch base with you regarding the no-advanceman situation.

I wanted to follow up here on our brief mention of the possibility of participation in the senior staff meetings.

It is crucial that the direction (you) set for the President and the White House be fully and directly -- not filtered -- understood and implemented in East Wing activities; and important that I be adequately informed for the decisions I make on behalf of Mrs. Bush. With the time and schedule pressures all of us face, your staff meeting is the most direct and practical means of ensuring this coordination. This information would be the daily underpinning of the direction I provide Mrs. Bush, her staff, and the organizations supporting us.

Mrs. Bush begins her term as First Lady with an unusual degree of popularity and credibility already established during the past eight years and during the campaign. It is important this be built upon in tandem with goals set for the President and his Administration. 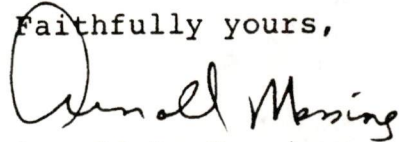
