Bush liaison dismissed from post

Conflict with liberals led to firing, friend says

R. Douglas Wead, the former Springfield writer who became President Bush's link to religious and conservative constituents, was fired from his \$55,000 White House job Thursday in the wake of his criticisms of administration dealings with homosexual groups, according to a published report.

Wead, 44, was appointed Special Assistant to the President for Public Liaison in January 1989 and charged with keeping Bush in touch with the concerns and leaders of religious conservative groups including evangelical Christians. Those groups represent an estimated 50 million American voters, according to conservative political groups.

Wead left town for the weekend, and was unavailable for comment Friday, said Kathleen Pollard, a Washington-based business associate and close friend.

Wead told the Washington Times that he was unwillingly leaving his job as a special assistant to the president for public liaison, but declined to explain the reason for his dismissal.

David Demarest, White House communications director, told the newspaper that Wead's departure was by mutual agreement.

"It's preposterous to think (Wead's) departure has anything to do with news accounts about gay rights activists at a White House event," the newspaper quoted Demarest in its Thursday edition.

He said Wead previously had discussed looking for another job and "as the months went by we mutually decided that now was probably as good a time as any for (Wead) to move back into the private sector."

Wead plans to keep a low profile over the issue, Pollard said Friday in a telephone interview from her Washington, D.C.-area office. Pollard is a former Springfield resident who has family here.

"He doesn't want to say anything that would hurt the president; he's very protective of him," she said.

Pollard said the White House already has hired an as-yet-unnamed

woman to replace Wead.

Wead is a writer and motivational speaker through Wead Enterprises, and heads up the annual Washington Charity Dinner, which raises money for charitable causes. Pollard works for Wead on the charity dinner and has volunteered for Wead at the White House.

Wead's relationship with Bush dates to the 1981 charity dinner. He later worked in Bush's campaign as religious liaison and later liaison for coalitions. Wead is credited with organizing the evangelical conservative voters behind the 1988 presidential campaign through his relationships with those groups and his book, "George Bush: Man of Integrity."

Washington commentator and syndicated columnist Cal Thomas featured Wead in his weekend column, saying that the former Springfieldian has been the target of gay rights groups and liberal White House colleagues since he joined

the White House staff in 1989.

Pollard agreed: "A year ago, we didn't know if this (Wead's job) was going to last."

Wead considered homosexual groups "enemies" of the president, because they oppose Bush's conservative viewpoints and they worked to defeat him in his presidential campaign, Pollard said.

His firing reportedly stems from a string of conflicts with what Pollard and Wead describe as liberal colleagues in the White House.

The latest came after Wead wrote a letter criticizing fellow staffers for inviting homosexual activists to the White House signing ceremony in April for the Hate Crimes Bill.

When a dozen people complained in writing that representatives of homosexual groups were invited by staff members to the signing, Wead wrote a letter defending the president, adding that the staff did not serve Bush well by inviting some of the groups that attended the ceremony, Pollard said.

"In no way does the president endorse the lifestyle of all groups which attend such events," Wead said in the letter. "I can assure you that he is especially offended by the attacks against Cardinal O'Connor and other manifestations of religious intolerance that some of the homosexual groups have espoused."

Wead also was quoted May 18 by the Baptist Press, a news service of the Southern Baptist Convention, as saying: "The concern was not just these homosexual leaders being invited to the White House, but some of these are anti-religious bigots." The decision "very poorly served the president."

While the National Gay and Lesbian Task Force praised Wead's dismissal, conservative organizations, such as the Family Research Council and the American Coalition for Traditional Values criticized the dismissal, saying Wead was doing the job he was hired to do. Others have criticized Bush's administration for the "active courting" of the

homosexual lobby, saying it has hurt his standing with his conservative constituents.

Wead probably will continue working on personal and business projects out of the Arlington, Va., home he shares with his second wife, Myriam, and their newborn son, Pollard said.

Wead attended three semesters at Central Bible College in Springfield in mid-'60s, worked as a church youth director and an itinerant minister around the country for seven years. He was ordained in the Assemblies of God in 1970.

He settled in Springfield in 1974, but continued to travel as an evangelist, and later writer and motivational speaker. He has written 26 books on religious, business and motivational topics. He also operates an Amway distributorship.



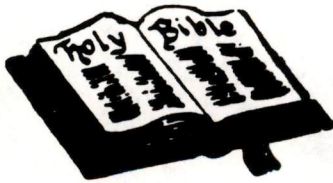
