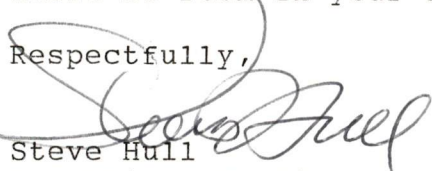
This letter is to protest the firing of Special Assistant Doug Wead. Doug was one of the best spokesman the conservative cause has.

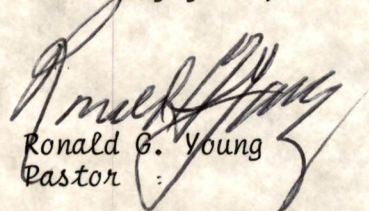
Dear Mr. President:

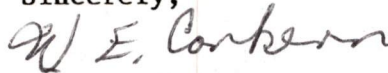
