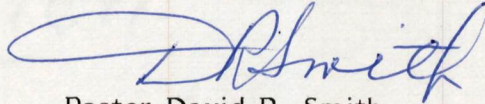

Dear Mr. President,

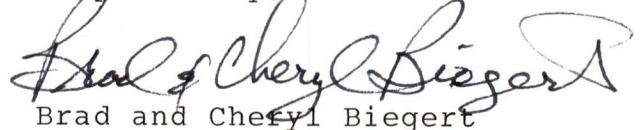
We are writing you over matters of great concern to us, which includes the recent dismissal of Mr. Doug Wead from his White House position.

I am outraged about the termination of Doug Wead from your staff.

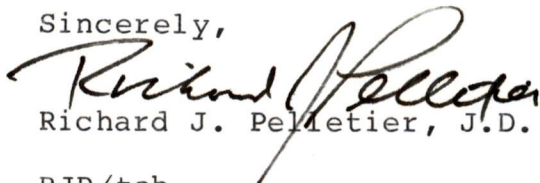
As a life long financial contributor to conservative causes and republican candidates I was thrilled to hear of Doug's appointment.
