- o With the recent resignation of Dante Fascell, there are now 15 NED directors (listed below).
- o The Board is to have two identified Republicans, two identified Democrats, two representatives from the Chamber of Commerce, and two representatives from Labor.
- o New NED by-laws have expanded the Board to permit 21 directors.
- o The Board wants to fill the five new memberships at its next meeting on March 29, holding the Fascell vacancy in reserve. The candidates apparently are three former ambassadors -- Winston Lord, Mark Palmer, and Harry Barnes -- as well as Stu Eizenstat and Susan Kaufman Purcell.
