SUBJ: Proposed Fundraisers Featuring John Sununu and Dick Darman

The single-most important issue facing the business community at the moment is the prospect of a major tax bill, perhaps one in the neighborhood of \$40 - \$50 billion. Unlike Clean Air, which had a more narrow impact, a tax bill affects virtually every industry. To some, such as those subject to excise taxes on their products (tobacco, distilled spirits, wine, and beer), the consequences are even greater. Representatives of the business community generally, and certain especially vulnerable industries as noted above in particular, are extremely anxious to do what is necessary to influence the composition of a tax bill.

You indicated that Governor Sununu and OMB Director Darman might be available for selected high-impact fundraising activities over the course of the next few months. Given the major role it is generally perceived that Governor Sununu and Director Darman are playing in the current tax and budget discussion, it might be productive to construct a series of small events that would ostensibly provide an opportunity for business representatives to make their respective cases on tax policy. These functions would be small dinners to be attended by a beneficiary Senate candidate and fifteen to twenty business representatives who would pay \$2,000 each. The proposed beneficiary candidates are as follows:

Pat Saiki (Hawaii)

Claudine Schneider (Rhode Island)

Tom Tauke (Iowa)

Lynn Martin (Illinois)

Bob Smith (New Hampshire)

Hal Daub (Nebraska)

NOTE: Since Daub does not accept PAC money, potential attendees at this event would be higher-level business representatives, perhaps CEO's, who would be making individual contributions.

The emphasis would be on the exclusivity of the affair, with the principal inducement being the implicit suggestion that the attendees would have the opportunity to discuss parochial business matters with two of the most influential tax policy decision makers in the Executive Branch who otherwise are not available for such discussions. Such an opportunity between now and the time that the budget and a revenue bill are finalized is one which should be somewhat attractive to a business representative.

Although it is anticipated that these events would be held in Washington, should Messrs. Sununu and Darman be willing to travel, consideration might be given to holding a dinner in New York City, with investment community representatives targeted as attendees. The number of dinner participants and the price would remain the same.

In discussing this proposal confidentially with others in the PAC Division as well as with trusted lobbyists, the following points were made:

1. While Governor Sununu and Director Darman are important attractions, the candidates themselves will still be an important part of the equation in determining the final contribution decision. If the business organization does not intend to support the candidate, it is unlikely that this event, alone, will cause them to change their mind. It might, however, serve to generate that additional amount of financial support which otherwise might be unavailable to the candidate.
2. If there is to be a number of these dinners, the first ones will be easier to sell than the latter ones. Therefore, our most needy candidates should be the beneficiaries of the early dinners.
3. Richard Darman's presence is key because he, unlike John Sununu, has not previously done fundraising events.
4. The success of these functions would be further enhanced if either, or both of the principals would be willing to make calls and send notes soliciting attendance.

It is hoped that Messrs. Sununu and Darman will be able to make themselves available for these proposed events. We will endeavor to develop functions that will minimize the squandering of their time. These will be cost-effective and time-effective events, and will certainly be welcomed by the beneficiary campaigns.
