They are selected by the State Superintendent of Schools based on their high grades in civics and government.

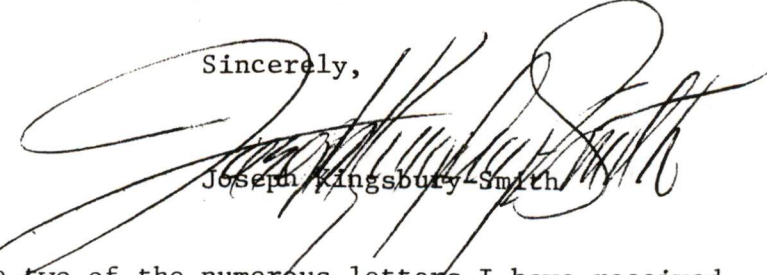
They spend the first week of February in Washington to learn at first hand about the operations of the Federal Government, The Supreme Court and the Congress.

They have been received or greeted by every President since the program started in 1962. President Bush has received or greeted them every year as President and almost every year as Vice President. They have been received every year by the Chief Justice or an Associate Justice of the Supreme Court. The Senate holds a special lunch for them each year.

For the past 12 years I have delivered to the Chief of Staff of the White House a letter to the President from a Republican and Democratic Senator who serve as Co-Chairmen of the Program, and from Randolph A. Hearst, president of the William Randolph Hearst Foundation which funds the cost of the program. I have always expressed the hope the Chief of Staff would bring the letters to the attention of the President and support the scheduling on the President's agenda of a day and time for the meeting and or greeting. President Bush has greeted them on the way from the Oval Office to his helicopter for departure to Camp David. In 1992, it would be particularly nice if the President could say a few words to the students before he takes off.

President talks sports, eats chicken-fried steak, 1

EULESS — President Bush stopped in Tarrant County yesterday to give two speeches, eat lunch with construction workers, tour a road project, react to the national recession and sign a landmark transportation bill. It was a three-hour visit.

Area construction crews had one task — prepare for his arrival — and it took two days.

Workers spent two overtime days arranging a stage and construction equipment for the signing ceremony. The job was more like arranging office furniture; they had to move the stage around until it met government specifications.

"The White House wanted the photo opportunity; the Secret Service wanted protection," said Randy Towles, a foreman with Austin Bridge Co.

The 30 construction workers invited to see the president wiped rain-spattered folding chairs for the officials in the audience while they took shelter under an overpass.

Bush arrived, gave his prepared remarks for 10 minutes and toured the construction site. While dozens of cameras recorded the moment, he walked around a crane that would not have been there had the White House not asked for it to add to the photo opportunity.

He stayed for about 15 minutes, talking sports and roadwork. Hello, goodbye. Tip of the hard hat. Back in the limo.

After the bill-signing ceremony, the Bush motorcade sped across the north side of Dallas/Fort Worth Airport to Cafe 121 alongside Texas

121 in Coppell.

Once inside, the president was seated in a corner red Naugahyde booth with seven Austin Bridge Co. construction workers, while senior White House officials and the news media found tables nearby.

Former Transportation Secretary Sam Skinner, who became Bush's chief of staff Monday, introduced himself to four men who were sitting across the room from Bush's table.

"Hi, I'm Sam Skinner, the president's chief of staff. If you guys let me join you, I'll buy lunch."

As he was sitting down, Skinner reached into his pocket for his wallet, then into another, and another

before coming out empty-handed.

"Hey, Marlin," he called to White House spokesman Marlin Fitzwater. "Can I borrow some money? I forgot my wallet."

At the end, one of Skinner's would-be guests picked up the tab for his grilled-cheese sandwich and soft drink.

Most people call him Mr. President.

But to his waitress at Cafe 121, George Bush was "darlin'."

During his hurried lunch, Bush was waited on at least once by each of the four waitresses. The most friendly was Julie Anna Nelson of

Lewisville, who took the president's order.

"What can I get for you, darlin'?" she asked Bush.

Although yesterday's bill-signing ceremony was on the Fort Worth half of D/FW Airport, officials from Cowtown appeared to be an afterthought in Bush's comments.

During his opening remarks, Bush saluted Dallas Mayor Steve Bartlett and Dallas Councilwoman Charlotte Mayes.

But Rep. Pete Geren, D-Fort Worth, a member of the powerful House Transportation Committee

that helped write the bill, and M Kay Granger were covered with casual, "We have other leaders from Fort Worth as well."

After Bush's speech, Granger pushed her way to the front of the crowd and told one of Bush's members who she was and that she wanted to make sure the president knew he was in Tarrant County.

"It was very disappointing," Granger said. "The whole thing seemed to be oriented toward Dallas, even though the president spent most of his time in Tarrant County."

Bush staff members immediately apologized and invited Granger

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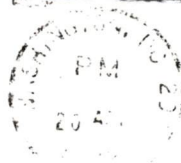
