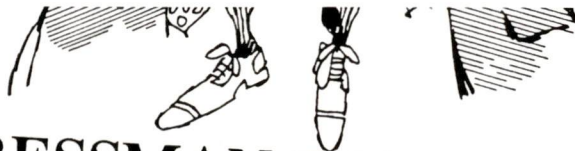

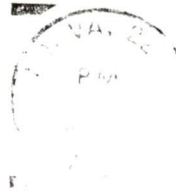

Dear Mr. Skinner:

I know your staff must think I am like a bad penny that just keeps popping up...yes, I already have your response that you are unable to attend the salute to women POWs, an invitation for which I have enclosed, FYI. And I have received a lovely note from Katherine L. Super on behalf of the President saying he cannot come due to a heavily committed schedule. I fully understand and accept both.

However, I have just received a thorough chewing out from a Major General who has informed me that I have made a greivous error, and specifically, in no uncertain terms that I did not permit the President or his staff, or yourself, to be fully informed as to what all was going on during the stay that these POWs will be in the Washington area, and that I have an obligation to do so. So I write to clarify.

The 17 POW women guests will fly in on 3/17/92. The big event will be 3/18 at Bolling AFB, and it was to this that I had thought it appropriate to send you invitations. However, on Thursday, 3/19/92, the day will be spent taking the POW women to Arlington Cemetery and the site of the Women in Military Service to America Memorial Site at the gates thereof; to the Vietnam Memorial Wall and then to The Pentagon where the Secretary of the Army has kindly invited them for a tour. Only once since repatriation have they been thanked by the President, some years ago by Reagan at the White House, decades after repatriation. The group of women able to attend this salute is much smaller, and is the last chance most have to do so, on this the 50th anniversary of their capture and captivity of about 3 years in the Philippines and for 1, in Germany. They are now quite elderly, most being in their 80's, and of the 45 remaining now alive of the 89 captured, only 30 are relatively mobile. We will also recognize that night and have a written tribute from Dr. Rhonda Cornum from the Persian Gulf; and even have a distant relative of Dr. Mary Walker, a POW from the Civil War.

The Pentagon's Committee to Commemorate the 50th Anniversary of WWII has "adopted" us for the purposes of support and will provide bus transport and other help through the Military District of Washington. From our prospective, our own 7 SE/BPW active-member flag rank women have pitched in to make this a great success. So much in fact, that we now have a total of 14 women with at least 1 star who are attending from the Washington area as well as Seattle, San Antonio, Carmichael, CA, and

Memphis, from 4 services, active duty and retired. Partially so our POW women can get to meet these other heroines of another sort, I have laid on the last event of the week, that is an informal supper and reception at my apartment complex, Crystal Plaza Apartments in Arlington.

3/19/92
This will be Thursday night; they arrive from the hotel at about 6:00 and dinner will be about 7:00, after socializing and seeing videos featuring some other women POWs who were interviewed during the Persian Gulf War including one WWII pow woman who died last week. As has been strongly pointed out by the President's supportive senior military person who just ate me up, these women, both the flag rank women who will be invited to attend the informal supper and the 17 POWs and their families, would love to have the chance for a photo-opportunity with the President; it might be a positive constituency for him to include as a visible support group; the location is close to the White House; and thanks to the number of folks who live therein, is, I am told by someone who used to be in security, considered relatively easy to secure.* It would certainly be a well controlled group, with a guest list limited to our own members, the flag ranking guests, the POW women and their families, and a couple of other out-of-town folks whom we felt we should invite. All of these names and social security numbers and birth dates can be provided well in advance; and none of them need know the President is coming. He could be in and out in 5 minutes, or is welcome, of course to stay for supper...(I guess chicken tetrazzi would be ok, and only planned broccoli casserole would have to change.) On the other hand, to spare me a heart attack, I can promise to be quite about it, but it would be helpful if someone might tell me.

For security purposes, they can contact the resident manager, Mrs. Jane Ridgeway. And I can provide the documentation on the invitees even at this early date. At any rate, I felt obligated to reissue this invitation, since I never intended to limit the options open to you, nor to prevent either senior military women or our honored POW women from having the chance to see the President and receive his best wishes. I apologize if it seemed that way. I remain,
