SUBJECT: Cyprus: Invitation to the President

I understand the State Department recommended to the White House that I represent the President in Nicosia, Cyprus, at the end of this month at ceremonies commemorating the 25th anniversary of Cyprus independence.

Barring a trip by the President himself to Cyprus, I believe the Greek-American community would welcome my leading the US delegation to the event. From my days in Congress, I have been very close to the Greek-American community. Indeed, at your direction I helped to prepare and host the visit of the Greek Orthodox Patriarch to Washington earlier this summer.

I also am very familiar with Cyprus, the issues involving its political status, and the Greek and Turkish communities. I know many of the leaders of the national government and the Turkish community. I would not likely err or be trapped by the media into a corner on any important questions.

Cypriot President Vassiliou and I have known each other for several years. He calls from time to time for insights on US politics. I think the Cypriots would be flattered should I attend on President Bush's behalf.

I would be honored to handle this responsibility. I do need an early alert to clear my schedule inasmuch as I am planning to spend much of the next two months campaigning in support of various Republican candidates around the country.

Subject: Status of Orlando Area VA Medical Center

1. Airport site. The Navy is in the process of making available approximately 84 acres of land adjacent to the Orlando International Airport. The site has several advantages: sufficient land area to properly design and locate a VAMC; immediate proximity to Orlando Airport, close proximity to downtown Orlando; excellent access off the Beeline Expressway with a four-lane traffic controlled entrance to site; high potential for resource sharing with Navy because of close proximity to Navy bases. While the site is adjacent to the airport, it is compatible with federal and state airport noise standards. The expanse of the site area would permit building within FAA height restrictions. The combination of these advantages make this site an attractive candidate for selection.

2. Mormon tract. If for technical reasons the Navy is unable to make the Airport site available, we have been advised that a very large tract of land adjacent to the Beeline Expressway would be available. Consideration of a particular site therein has yet to be made pending resolution of the Airport site.

3. Naval Training Center site. The third Orlando site being considered is on the Naval Training Center (NTC) grounds. While it was offered by the Navy, it would consume a major plot of NTC land that might better be used for another purpose. Consequently, Navy states they now prefer siting the facilities on the Airport site.
