Dear John:

I very much enjoyed our conversation yesterday and look forward to such stimulating conversations in the future. To recapitulate, I think it would be very helpful to all of us if you paid some attention to 1) maintaining the visibility of conservative media, 2) instituted a fairly regular lunch meeting with the President and conservative media as outlined in the attached letter I wrote him on April 20, and 3) attended dinner with the conservative writers I bring together occasionally.

I shall bring a dozen or so of these stalwarts for dinner at La Brasserie on June 19. Drinks begin at 7:30, dinner promptly at 8:00, festivities end promptly at 10:00. Everything is off the record.

Finally I would urge that, however things go in Europe, the President upon his return address the American people directly on prime-time television to celebrate 40 years of American diplomatic achievement in prudently managing the Cold War. A dignified address emphasizing this major American triumph, delivered by a man who's obviously from the same mold as Acheson, the Dulleses, and the other "wise men" of this tradition, would establish his rapport with the American people in a way no other event could equal.

Again, I enjoyed our chat and do let me know if you can attend our June 19 meeting. If not, we shall have other meetings starting in the fall.

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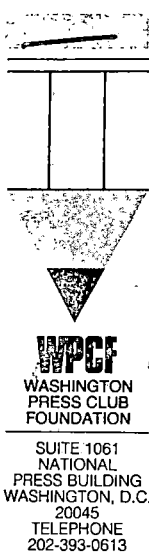

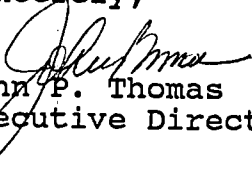

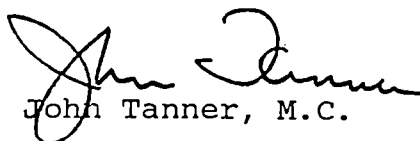
Dear Mr. Sununu:

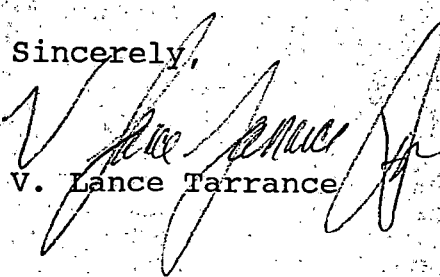

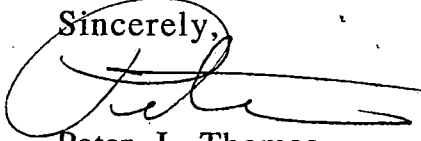

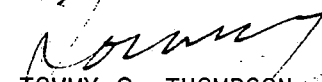
Wisconsin has already reduced its sulfur dioxide emissions by forty percent. I am most interested in seeing that states such as Wisconsin, that have made substantial efforts in reducing emissions, obtain credit for that contribution.

Likewise, as was discussed at the meeting, I am concerned over provisions which would require a fee or tax on the generation of electricity to create a fund for national clean-up. Customers of utilities that are required by state law to meet strict emission rate standards should not subsidize the rates of customers from other states that have yet to make the same contribution of emission reductions.

I hope an acid rain proposal that takes into account these concerns will be introduced soon to avoid being trapped in the added controversy of ozone and toxic proposals. I am delighted that you share these concerns and will be an advocate for the Alliance positions in the Administration. I have written President Bush on the same matter.

I certainly appreciate your personal interest on this issue. Thank you for your consideration.

This letter concerns the effectiveness of the Federal Communications Commission in providing guidelines for the control of "sleaze" and violence on broadcast television. We understand that the appointment of a new FCC chief is in the works. We feel the person who assumes this position will play a critical role in reversing the "hands off" position of the FCC over the past few years on broadcast television, resulting in some unfortunate programming decisions. We are particularly interested in this issue because we feel a direct relationship exists between the deterioration of standards for broadcast television and a growing incidence of teenage pregnancy, violence, and other serious social problems.

We urge the appointment of a new Federal Communications Commission chief committed to re-establishing a reasonable level of regulation over broadcast television. The airwaves, after all, are publicly licensed, and we feel that the move toward deregulation has been excessive and has not served the public well. We would urge you, however, to consider these matters in the appointment of a new Federal Communications Commission chief for the Bush Administration.

The Two Forks issue is vital to the economic future of Colorado. If Two Forks is not built the City of Denver will not be able to continue to provide enough water to the suburbs and also support growth.

There is a wide range of support for Two Forks locally, including the entire Colorado Republican Congressional delegation, as well as, the Colorado AFL-CIO and 40 different cities, counties and water districts. Furthermore, the Army Corps of Engineers, Colorado Division of Wildlife, Colorado Health Department, U.S. Fish and Wildlife, and the Nebraska Game and Parks Departments support Two Forks.

Two Forks is also politically crucial to the State of Colorado and Colorado Republican activists who worked hard and dug deep to get President Bush elected feel betrayed by his EPA administrator. Meanwhile, even if you can't help me out, please know we're all pulling for you. Being thrust in the middle of the Washington scene must be quite an experience.

At least you get cherry blossoms instead of mud season.

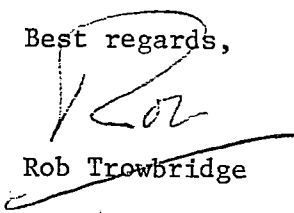

Dear John:

Even at the peril of beating a dead horse into the ground, I cannot but point to the daily flow of reports (see enclosure) highlighting the deadly urgency for a prompt and thorough scientific review of standards at the base of our regulatory superstructure.

Otherwise, because of unscientifically designed and arbitrarily set exposure levels parts of our country may have to accept, according to this one single article, bans on:

- o all gasoline powered vehicles;
- o free parking;
- o gas-powered lawn mowers;
- o chemical formulations of paints, solvents and household chemicals;
- o etc., etc.

Therefore, I hope a modest, well-operating science council will be quickly established. (I have a list of excellent candidates ready.) I also trust that it will be possible to promptly develop scientifically defensible criteria for regulatory actions and then proceed to review for the better existing regulatory benchmarks and the related regulatory proscriptions.

Knowing that it is much easier to offer advice than to translate words into action, I took a page out of your book (I sense that you did not run for Governor again in order to be available for other tasks) and asked my university for a sabbatical leave of absence so that I can be available for action where my talent, knowledge and skill could be of constructive use.

For the last twenty years, I have studied the problem of all possible vantage points, and pride myself on personally knowing (perhaps better than anyone else around) a broad cross-section of people in the sciences and beyond who could be called upon to assist

and serve. I think I could be helpful in transmitting accumulated experience to younger members of the administration who need to be brought up-to-speed in order to deal well with the problems they face. Alternatively, I could participate in the shaping of policies and mechanisms to implement policies needed to bring effectiveness and rational order back into the practical life of the nation. In either case, I am not interested in bureaucratic power but rather in the power to influence events for the better.

During the remaining useful years of my life, I would like to be helpful to those who are trying to implement the will of our people as expressed through the ballot box.

If you think I can be of active assistance, please let me know. In the meantime I will continue to mail you, as occasions arise, my thoughts which I hope you find useful.

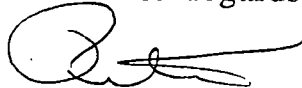

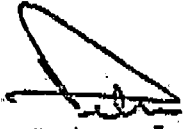
Dear John:

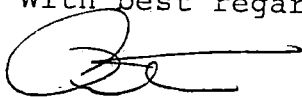

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Dear John:

As "food for thought", prior to our Monday discussions, let me delineate two areas which in our judgment are in dire need of action. Each factual background is followed by a relevant recommendation.

FACT In almost all conceivable areas, from the apple scare and the waste disposal impasse to the cost of ozone regulations and the weapons' production cleanup, a continuum of crises is generated:

- a) By regulatory standards which are either ill-defined, based on loose assumptions (extrapolations) or set unrealistically low;
- b) By the lack of effective communication channels between recognized scientific and technical communities and the public's leaders.

RECOMMENDATION Convene an Exact Sciences Panel on Projections and Standards (acting à la Grace Commission):

- i To establish criteria for credible scientific projections and the scientific validity of regulatory benchmarks;
- ii To formulate precisely questions to be addressed;
- iii To assemble -- in cooperation with professional organizations, institutes, laboratories and academies -- working groups of select, informed experts to address identified issues and articulate credible and scientifically defensible positions.

FACT By incremental changes over several decades, governmental administration (its enabling legislation, administrative procedures, regulatory orders, juridical processes, etc.) once supportive of the uses of scientific and technological discoveries has become the major impediment to applications of technologies and to economic development. One can note, for example, that even municipalities often cannot spend available funds because of what an article in the New York Times (March 12, 1989) called "the ever expanding obstacle course of laws, regulations, approvals, procedures, and litigations that now must be run before a project can be carried out." These obstacles are, according to the newspaper, actively manipulated by "power centers"

which can range "from neighborhood and block associations to preservation societies to environmental groups to businesses and real estate organizations; almost anyone with a cause and a lawyer."

RECOMMENDATION A study group within the Administrative Conference of the United States, composed of an appropriate mix of technical and administrative experts, should:

- i Develop a prioritized list of legislative, regulatory, administrative and jurisprudential problems areas adversely affecting the beneficial uses of technologies (including medical technologies);
- ii Establish firm schedules for governmental intervention which would restore today's administrative practices to erstwhile excellence, i.e., reshape procedures to bring technological/economic projects to successful completion within a reasonable time while being cognizent of competing goals and intentions, demands for openness, sensitivity to rights, requests for safety and the need for innovation and growth. (Time for approval and certification $\leq$ time to design and build.)

The challenge here is to establish productive order within a democratically-conceived and litigation-happy community.

Both tasks can be accomplished with well-chosen panels of scientific and administrative experts. Dr. Seitz and I and our friends can easily identify such well-versed and articulate individuals.

We also believe that now is a sociological and political "window of opportunity" to act on the problems.

We are therefore ready to act in any capacity to help move the questions -- from helping actively with advice to taking actual charge of organizing and conducting the effort on behalf of the U.S. government.

There is an important caveat, though, that in order to be successful the program must be formulated with clear conceptual goals and managed by competent people. (For example, I would most emphatically recommend that the ESP panel be co-chaired by Hans Bethe, Fred Seitz and Rosalyn Yalow.)

We were delighted to learn from Richard Torykian of Lazard Freres that you are willing to address the Council of Institutional Investors on Tuesday, April 4, if your schedule permits. The Council will be meeting in Ballroom A of the Vista International Hotel at 1400 M Street, N.W.

The Council is an organization of 60 of the nation's largest and most active pension funds representing over eight million American employees and retirees and holding over \$300 billion in assets. Institutional investors like our members hold over 40 percent of the equities markets (projected to be 50 percent in ten years) and thus hold private sector power that could be harnessed to achieve many of the economic goals of importance to the Administration and the country. In light of this power, the failure of policymakers generally to reach out to the institutional investors would seem to be a failure to use one of the most effective tools available for achieving meaningful economic and other policy reforms. Both as a key player and as a group affected by plans for economic policy changes, the Council would like to work with you to build the consensus needed to accomplish these changes. The use of large private sector market forces ought to have the additional attraction of decreasing the need for government regulation.

I am attaching some information about the Council and I look forward to hearing from you soon.

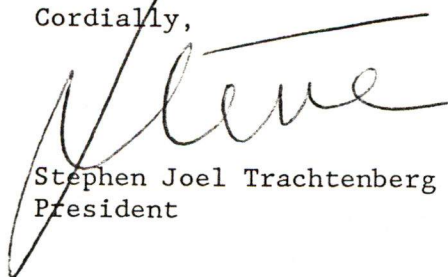

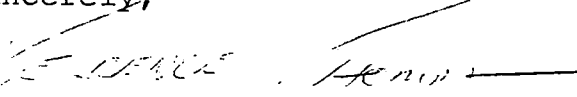

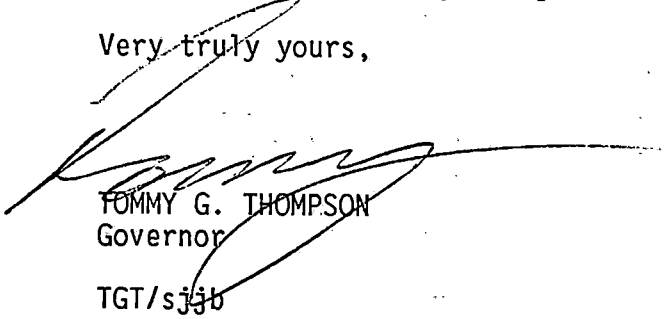
Dear John:

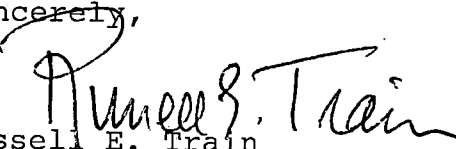

I am writing on behalf of the American Defense Lobby's 27,724 members to encourage President Bush to publicly promise a veto of the Department of Defense bill if funding for SDI is below \$4 billion.

Dear John:

I know that the Congress and the Administration will again be looking at the federal minimum wage when Congress reconvenes, and I wanted to bring you up to date on developments here in Wisconsin in this area.

My Administration, by way of an administrative rule, has increased Wisconsin's minimum wage from \$3.35 to \$3.65 effective July 1. We have provided for a 120 day probationary/training wage of \$3.45 that applies to those who have joined a firm for the first time.

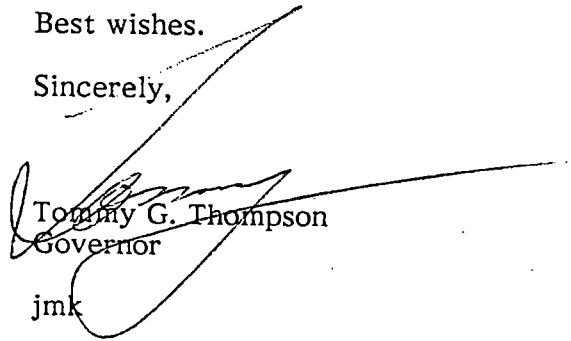
A legislative committee with oversight responsibilities for administrative rules partially suspended the rule, but because of constitutional questions connected with their actions, I have directed our Administration to implement the rule.

Therefore, we have a probationary minimum wage in place and working in Wisconsin. (Wisconsin, by the way, had some twenty-eight years of experience with probationary wages previously. In 1919 our first minimum wage was established at 22¢ per hour. But those in their first ninety days on the job received 18¢, and 20¢ per hour was paid during the second ninety days in the position.)

I thought you would be interested in what we are doing here in Wisconsin.

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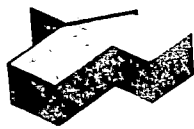

Dear Mr. Sununu:

Enclosed is an advance copy of results of a new survey of The Conference Board Associates. All the survey participants are chief executive officers of major U.S. corporations. The subject was the Federal budget deficit. I especially wanted to share this information with you, and with other key Administration and Congressional members and advisors, prior to its release to the media.

The following are a few findings we found particularly interesting:

- The budget deficit is clearly a major concern throughout the business community: ninety percent of those surveyed rate the deficit a "serious" problem.
- A majority of business leaders favor current levels of spending for major social programs such as child benefits, education, health research, Medicare and Social Security.
- While excise taxes get fairly high marks, there are distinctly mixed feelings about the benefits of a major change in the tax system. Business appears to be split, for instance, on value added tax, with slightly more favoring than opposing it.

This survey is part of a newly-instituted Conference Board program, which has two objectives: providing an appropriate forum for chief executives to express their views on major policy issues, and most importantly, creating a channel to communicate those views to government and media leaders. The Conference Board is uniquely equipped to provide this service in light of its longstanding tradition of non-advocacy, broad-based membership, and excellent survey and research capabilities.

We hope this information will be useful as a barometer of feeling within this business community, and would be happy to hear from you or your staff with questions or comments. In coming months we will conduct similar surveys on other critical policy issues. I will see that you receive the results as they become available.

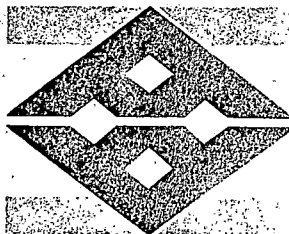

Dear Governor Sununu,

Governor John McKernan asked me to write to you concerning the Passamaquoddy Tribe's Recovery Scrubber, a high-efficiency SO₂ removal system that could help change the economics of the acid rain debate. We are hopeful that you and President Bush will be able to join us for a ground breaking ceremony on September 16, 1989 in Thomaston, Maine. I have enclosed a one page summary of the Recovery Scrubber, and two relevant newspaper articles, one of which contains a diagram of the process. A clean version of the process description is also enclosed.

The Recovery Scrubber constitutes a major breakthrough in air pollution control for both economic and environmental reasons:

1. Economic Advantages.

The Recovery Scrubber uses a waste material (biomass ash or cement waste dust) as its scrubbing agent and converts this material into useful by-products (potassium sulfate and cement kiln feed), thereby eliminating scrubbing agent purchases and scrubber sludge disposal costs, while generating by-product sales and, in some instances, tipping fee revenues. As a result, the Recovery Scrubber will pay for its cost of operation, and in some instances cover capital costs and actually operate at a profit. The Recovery Scrubber is also more easily retrofittable than other systems.

2. Environmental Advantages.

The Recovery Scrubber is more attractive in environmental terms than anything previously developed because it:

- a) produces no new waste (such as the sludge produced by other scrubbers), and reclaims existing solid wastes (ash and cement waste dust) which would otherwise have to be landfilled,
- b) consumes CO₂ (unlike other scrubbers which produce significant additional CO₂ emissions in the process of scrubbing SO₂),
- c) is expected to saponify (and thus effectively eliminate) dioxin emissions and render heavy metals in ash used as a scrubbing agent insoluble. Tests are currently being conducted at the University of Maine to verify our theories in this regard, and if favorable will mean that the Recovery Scrubber will also remove the two primary obstacles to waste-to-energy plant siting.

The Recovery Scrubber has been examined by numerous experts. The owners of Dragon Products Company retained Krupp Koppers of Germany, the Massachusetts Institute of Technology, and the Spanish Cement Institute, to review the process prior to deciding to invest \$4.8 million in the first full-scale commercial demonstration of the process at the Dragon plant in Thomaston, Maine. The Department of Energy's independent review team examined the technical, environmental, management, and cost aspects of the Recovery Scrubber in detail before it named Passamaquoddy Technology, along with giants in the field such as Combustion Engineering and Babcock & Wilcox, as one of sixteen recipients of Innovative Clean Coal Technology Round II funds. This award provided the remaining \$4.8 million for the Dragon demonstration. Extensive discussion with numerous utilities and utility investors concerning the Recovery Scrubber have brought equally enthusiastic responses.

There is much here that we can all be proud of. The Recovery Scrubber was the direct result of the first acquisition of a major off-reservation industry by an Indian tribe, which in turn was the direct result of the Maine Indian Land Claims Settlement Act of 1980. Such an improbable chain of events could only have happened in this country. The philosophy embodied by the Recovery Scrubber is also a wonderful blend of deep-seated Indian environmental

and conservation concerns, and equally deep-seated notions of Yankee ingenuity and frugality. There could be no better tribute to President Bush's Innovative Clean Coal Technology Program and no better example of what people, whatever their race, are capable of achieving when given a fair opportunity.

A celebration of this breakthrough would be in order for the reasons outlined alone, but is especially timely given the introduction of the President's Clean Air Legislation. We would be honored if the economics embodied in this discovery could play some small part in helping to move this important legislation.

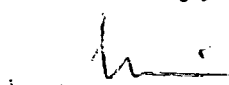

Dear Governor Sununu:

I am writing to underscore the depth of NAM member concerns with the Americans with Disabilities Act. Our position is reflected in the attached letter that was sent to the House and Senate. We support many of the concepts embodied in the ADA and are working with all parties in an effort to fashion legislation which can be broadly embraced. But absent significant change, particularly as to the remedies and enforcement provisions -- jury trial and punitive and compensatory damages in addition to the Title VII remedies available to other protected classes -- NAM will seek defeat of the legislation. I have attached two working papers that highlight these concerns.

I would be remiss in not commending Bill Roper for his leadership of the Administration team in negotiations with the Senate on the ADA. He and his colleagues have gone to great lengths to make sure the business community is kept apprised of developments and that our concerns are factored into discussions with their counterparts on the Hill.

All of us hope that the ongoing negotiations will result in compromise legislation that satisfies the legitimate needs of individuals with disabilities which at the same time takes into account the equally legitimate concerns of business. Failing that, we will seek defeat of the legislation, though it is not an option we would relish exercising.

RE: PRESIDENT'S EUROPEAN TRIP

Needless to say, the President's extended trip to Europe was superb both in substantive terms and in the perception of the American people. Television coverage was excellent and print reporting was positive and straightforward.

There were two negatives that I would like to comment upon:

Maureen Dowd's story in the New York Times threw a minor damper on the first days festivities in Poland. That story, however, had no legs.

The only other journalist I read mentioning the so called disappointing crowds was Robert Novak, whose column of last Wednesday was not only overly critical, but displayed a sharp lack of historical perspective in terms of the President's involvement in European geo-political affairs. I refer specifically to Novak's strong suggestion that Helmut Kohl has a keener insight into the political trends of Europe. He mentioned that while Bush was travelling in Poland and Hungary, Kohl's attentions were riveted on Gorbachev and toward the Soviet Union, suggesting that Kohl was looking at the bigger picture.

History shows, however, that it has been George Bush who has pulled Kohl from the political depths twice.

The first being in January and February, 1983 during the debate on NATO's deployment of intermediate nuclear force missiles. At that time Kohl expressed publicly, extreme concern regarding his own political fortunes and the anti-nuclear tide rising in Western Europe led by the Greens of West Germany. Prior to Bush's European trip, the first stop being Germany, then Soviet Foreign Minister Andre Gromyko had travelled to West Germany to advance the Soviet position of establishing a freeze on the deployment of INF. This nuclear freeze movement was extraordinarily well received by the left and center in Europe. Substantively and strategically the proposal was a farce. The Soviets at that time had more than 750 intermediate range nuclear missiles deployed in Europe. The United States and NATO had none. As Winston Churchill would say, "some freeze." Bush's mission which many foreign policy experts believe to be the most important foreign visit a Vice President has made in the history of the United States, was to change public opinion in Europe and strengthen the resolve of the allies to deploy INF and push for Soviet acceptance of the zero-zero option.

The Vice President did change public opinion and missiles were deployed. Chancellor Kohl's political future was greatly strengthened and ultimately in 1987 the United States and the Soviet Union agreed to the zero-zero option. And, of course, just this year the President solved the short range nuclear missile crisis which threatened Kohl's future and capped that with his conventional arms reduction proposal. I hope that someone will set Novak straight.

I was particularly pleased to see the Washington Post deal with the final summit communique in fairly substantive terms. Economic, environmental and aid to Eastern Europe were issues given extensive treatment. I also thought the President's discussion with the Japanese to resolve Super 301 problems in a far shorter period of time was a breakthrough and though properly recorded, did not receive extensive coverage. I believe this is an issue that has potential future benefits for the country and the administration.

The President's style in dealing with foreign affairs and serious East/West problems is clearly coming into focus. His temperance while in Poland and Hungary provided an image of a wise and prudent leader who is unwilling to over-reach for the sake of personal political gain and press euphoria. Rather, he comes across as a man who has his eye on goals and achievements in the

future that will be far more dramatic and meaningful and which will tend to provide greater stability throughout Europe. His style in Europe and his policy pronouncements were consistent and measures, reflective of his approach to the tragedy and turmoil in China.

While Mitterand attempted to upstage the basic purpose of the Economic Summit by directing attention to third world debt, it served no real useful purpose and what negatives surfaced in this area were dealt with rather nicely with the President's handling of the Mexican debt situation.

Furthermore, having watched the President's previous European visit and prior to that his trip to Asia, I am quite pleased that members of the cabinet travelling with him have not taken any of the spotlight away from him. Secretary Baker, for example, was barely in evidence with the exception of one or two instances. Secretary Brady was, but once, widely covered concerning the area of restructuring the Mexican debt.

Finally, I received calls from reporters throughout his trip and even some yesterday afternoon from those who travelled with him. He was given very high marks. Incidentally, I have mentioned to the President the very favorable comments of Jack Nelson on Washington Week In Review. His writings from Europe continue to reflect Jack's high opinion of this Presidency. Al Hunt of the Wall Street Journal is highly impressed and very favorable. The same applies to John Mashek of the Boston Globe and others.

All in all, I think you and the White House staff deserve high praise and hearty congratulations for a job very well done in support of the President.

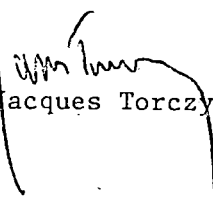
I follow with great attention your activities as Chief of Staff in the White House and it seems that the Popularity of the George Bush administration even exceeds the one of the previous administration.

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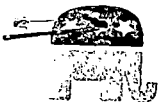

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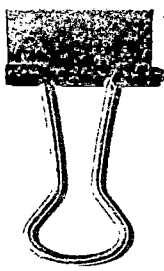

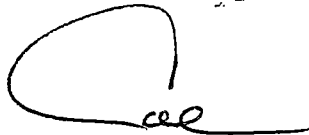
The President's impromptu news conference this morning was his best yet, I thought. Firm command of the issues, good banter with my colleagues...an all-around excellent performance.

Dear John:

I appreciated the opportunity to meet with you in Washington on June 8, 1989 to discuss Indian treaty rights and spearfishing in Wisconsin.

The exercise of treaty spearfishing rights by the Lake Superior Chippewa has proven to be an issue of increasing controversy. During the 1989 spring spearfishing season, the State of Wisconsin spent over \$1 million in law enforcement costs alone. The state has been involved in litigation over these treaties for fifteen years even though Wisconsin was not a party to the treaties and is powerless to alter them.

As I have indicated, it is our belief that a negotiated settlement among the affected parties is the preferable method of settling this dispute. To that end, I asked the Secretary of the Interior, Manuel Lujan, to send a representative to Wisconsin on a fact finding mission aimed at involving the federal government in the mediation and resolution of this matter. This follows my May 18, 1989 letter to Secretary Lujan in which I asked the Secretary to exercise his authority under federal law to promulgate regulations aimed at conservation and allocation of fishery resources (a copy of this letter and pertinent regulations is attached for your review).

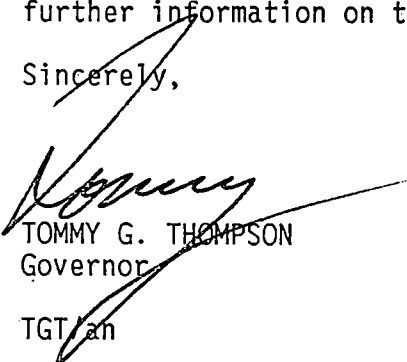
Secretary Lujan sent Mr. Patrick Ragsdale, acting Assistant Secretary of the Interior for Indian Affairs to Wisconsin last week. Mr. Ragsdale met with Attorney General Donald Hanaway and me, as well as tribal representatives, to ascertain the nature and scope of these matters. I am hopeful that Secretary Lujan will conclude that federal participation in the resolution of this dispute is appropriate.

I want to join my California Republican colleagues in asking you to meet with us to discuss the Food and Drug Administration's (FDA's) plans regarding Red Dye Number 3.

The Commissioner of the Food and Drug Administration has recently indicated that he may delist use of Red Dye Number 3 for cosmetics while continuing to allow the dye to be used as a food coloring. Agricultural interests fear the proposed delisting is based on concern about FDA's public image rather than scientific data. While data indicate Red Dye Number 3 is safe, and while the Commissioner has indicated that he does not have public health concerns about the use of the dye, delisting Red Dye Number 3 for use in cosmetics would almost assuredly raise consumer fears about the dye's use in foods.

Delisting Red Dye Number 3 under this approach would seriously disrupt agriculture. Delisting would come on the heels of other public controversies surrounding food safety, making it hard to convince consumers that food uses of the dye are safe. The peach, pear, grape, cherry and pineapple industries could lose between \$110 and \$220 million because of the negative image delisting would give fruit cocktails into which commodities incorporating the dye are made.

The decision as to whether or not Red Dye Number 3 should be delisted is a serious one. It should be based on solid, scientific evidence. California agriculture believes additional studies will clearly demonstrate the dye's safety. My colleagues and I wish to discuss an approach FDA can take in order to obtain that information without unnecessarily disrupting our food industry. I hope you will meet with us at the earliest possible time in order to discuss this important matter.

I regret to have to repeat myself so soon, but literally no day passes without another "here we go again" story (see attached).

It usually starts with some man-made phenomenon being singled out as a possible cause of "harmful effects" which are "worrisome" and, therefore, require "additional study."

If the past is any guidance, the epidemiological pursuit in these kinds of "health effects" end up inconclusive either because of the smallness of the samples or the smallness (if any) of the effect. The end results of the described progression are: more confusion; still more "research," still more confusion, a political outcry, and finally, a new, deleterious regulation or outright ban.

But, in the instant case, there was a time not so long ago (before Nikola Tesla invented AC) when there was no indoor, 60-cycle pollution, nor high frequency waves (except those from outerspace). And we have very credible statistical health records from that pre-60 Hz period.

Properly organized and validated, such pre-electricity health records could provide a powerful historical control population whose health characteristics would provide a gauge for the validity of the OTA concerns as reported in the enclosure. Refinements could be made by checking over a period of years for correlation (or noncorrelation) between the health statistics of the population and the expansion of electrical wiring from selected advanced cities into more rural areas, etc. (Also, the change from DC to AC, where they did occur, would lend themselves to correlative health comparisons.) OSTP could be a good home for and/or initiator of this and similar basic critical inquests.

I have no doubt that properly conducted inquiries of this type, combined with a savvy socio-political application of the related results, would have a powerful salutary effect on relevant decision-making of all three branches of government.

Properly applied science increases certainty and historically increased certainty made today's quality of life possible. I plead that we conscientiously revisit this proven, rational road.
