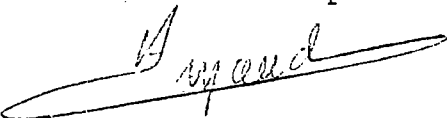

Dear John:

On February 11 - 13, the U.S. produce industry will gather in San Antonio for the 86th Annual Convention and Exposition of the United Fresh Fruit and Vegetable Association.

American agriculture in general, and the produce industry in particular, are enthusiastic fans and supporters of President Bush. United's convention would be a wonderful opportunity for the President to meet with and address our 7,500 convention participants who represent some 80% of the \$65 billion a year fresh fruit and vegetable business.

As you well know, we face formidable challenges and great opportunities in U.S. agriculture in the coming decade. 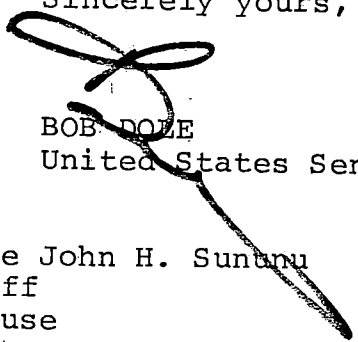

I am happy to forward for your review the enclosed Hudson Institute monograph by Dr. Timothy Ashby, titled "Missed Opportunities: The Rise and Fall of Jamaica's Edward Seaga."

This paper by Dr. Ashby, a Hudson Adjunct Senior Fellow who has recently assumed responsibility for Caribbean, Mexican and Central American Affairs at the Commerce Department, combines a careful, in-depth study of the economic failures of Seaga's eight-year leadership of Jamaica with an incisive analysis of the effects of U.S. Agency for International Development policies during this critical period. Ashby concludes that Prime Minister Seaga was not truly committed to economic reform, but rather mouthed free market rhetoric to please the United States and attract A.I.D. support, while in fact expanding the role of the state in Jamaica's economy and ultimately furthering its economic woes.

Dr. Ashby's monograph includes a foreward by noted author Nick Eberstadt and endorsements by Senator Richard Lugar and former Assistant Secretary of State Elliott Abrams -- who describes the work as "a terrific contribution" by someone who "knows the Caribbean inside out."

Hudson Institute believes this study is important not simply for its historical analysis of the Seaga era in Jamaica, but also for the lessons it draws about future U. S. developmental policies throughout the Caribbean and Latin America. I hope you will find it useful in your own deliberations about the course American policy should take in this critical region (both during the Bush Administration and beyond), and look forward to hearing your comments and reactions.

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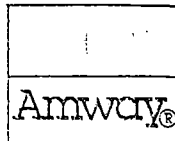

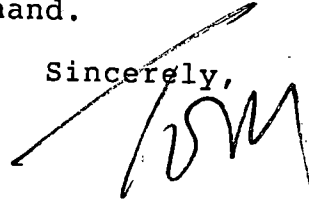
Dear Gov. Sununu:

I have noted with concern reports that an Administration task force studying capital taxation is also considering increases in excise taxes. Whether they are called taxes, ducks or user fees, excise taxes are regressive and discriminatory. For instance, a recent study by the Policy Economics Group of Peat Marwick found that families with less than \$20,000 of family income in 1989 pay more than 20% of federal excise taxes on gasoline, alcohol and tobacco though they receive under 9% of total family income.

A combination of cuts in taxes on capital (which would principally affect upper-income taxpayers) and an increase in an excise tax (which is borne disproportionately by lower-income families) would be especially regressive. Such a combination would be undesirable from a political, as well as an economic, standpoint.

On behalf of the Coalition Against Regressive Taxation, an alliance of businesses that remit the bulk of federal excise taxes, I urge you to advise the President to reject excise tax increases out of hand.

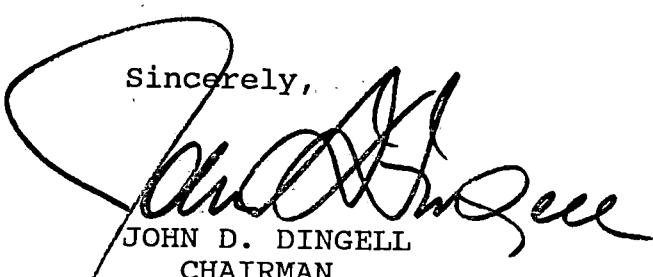

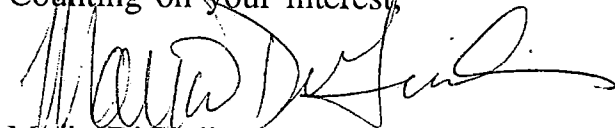

There are grave concerns that Clean Air legislation pertaining to Electric Power Generation, as presently proposed, will result in freezing technology at a significant increase in the cost of electric power to the consumer.

The approach to achieving reduction of sulfur and nitrogen oxides as proposed is similar to what has been done in both Germany and Japan with a resulting steep increase in electric power costs in those two countries over the last 5 years.

A great deal of money has been invested in Clean Coal Technologies by the U.S. Many of these technologies are ready for demonstration now with commercial deployment possible by 1996 to 1998.

If Clean Coal Technology were to be relied on to achieve emission reductions instead of present technologies, total emissions and cost of electric power by the year 2020 (and beyond) will be significantly lower than that achievable, were we to force reduction under proposed legislation.

Reliance on Clean Coal Technologies would boost U.S. competitiveness and leave us in a leadership position to export technology and products.

I urge careful review of this matter. There is ample data to make the case for Clean Coal Technologies.

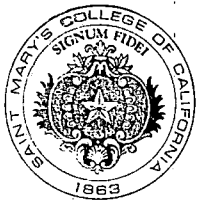

As a member of the Board of Trustees, Memorial Hospital, North Conway, N. H., I have a potential, obvious bias about the subject of this letter. With that "on the table", I never-the-less believe that I have a genuine concern regarding the funding of Medicare, and the possibility of an increasing shortfall in reimbursement payments for treatment of Medicare patients.

You are undoubtedly aware, because of your interest in our community and hospital over the years, that Memorial Hospital is a non-profit facility. As such, no one is turned away from our doors. Being located in an area with a high percentage of seasonally oriented service businesses, we do have and serve a significant number of persons at the low end of the economic scale. That, coupled with an ever increasing retired population, thus Medicare covered, requires intensive attention to efficient operation and expense control.

Example: Management and Board of Trustees have recently approved a much needed renovation project, but on a phase basis - pay as we go - rather than borrowing to complete the project all at once.

That project, and expense, is something over which we do have control. But, many others are beyond our control:

i.e. a significant population at the low end of the economic level, thus inhibiting ability to pay

an increase in the retirement population, thus increasing the Medicare eligible

purchase of state-of-the-art medical equipment necessary to provide patients with the advantages inherent in advancements in technology, and, necessary to recruit and retain a top flight medical staff to care for our patients.

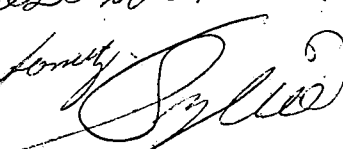

I am writing to you on behalf of the St. Joseph Hospital family regarding our concerns pertaining to Medicare.

I believe you have probably heard all of the arguments, but it is important to put the issue in terms that one can understand which are most close to home. New Hampshire is on the down side of the economic wave. It's something that had to happen, but the impact becomes all the more difficult because of the steepness of the slope of the original up curve. People in industry are losing their jobs which provides them with less health insurance. Hospitals, therefore, are doing more cash (free care) business than ever before. The impact of Medicare on industry is felt because charges are shifted to the commercial insurance carriers, Blue Cross/Blue Shield and the HMO's, in order to makeup the significant deficit between Medicare patient cost and actual payment. We at St. Joseph Hospital are receiving something less than fifty cents on the dollar. The bills for Medicare patients this year will be close to \$15 million and we will be paid some place around \$7 million.

We urge you to join us in recommending to the President Part A funding for fiscal year 1991 sufficient to meet the projected program obligations.

This letter is relative to the submission of a proposal to the United States Department of Agriculture, Food and Nutrition Services on September 29, 1989. The proposal, submitted by Bull Worldwide Information Systems in response to a Request for Proposals issued by the Department of Agriculture, seeks funding for a demonstration of the effectiveness of an off-line Electronics Benefits Transfer (EBT) system within the Food Stamp Program in Rhode Island. I understand the President is planning to hold a press conference the afternoon or evening of Tuesday, December 5th, to report on his summit meeting the previous weekend.

Here is a (possibly) bright idea: he might instead speak at the AEI luncheon that day, taking press questions afterwards. There will be a sizeable and sophisticated audience at the luncheon. It would be a better forum for delivering his message, emphasizing key points, etc., than pre-Q&A remarks in the press room. And the press would be (marginally) better behaved.

Of course there may be no hard news coming out of the summit. But if so, and if the press responds by playing on the "lack of initiative" theme, a speech event would be even more preferable than a press conference -- since coverage would tend to focus more on the content of his own remarks rather than on responses to reporters' questions.

As you may recall, President Bush spoke at this luncheon three years ago; it was his first full-dress talk on the Iran-contra business, and it was a great success. And last year, President Reagan came straight from his final summit meeting with Mr. Gorbachev and delivered his report at the AEI annual dinner, which received wide and favorable coverage.

A brochure for our annual policy conference is enclosed, and you will note that Tuesday's sessions are devoted, appropriately, to foreign policy and arms control issues. The setting -- the new Georgetown Conference Center -- is the handsomest in town, but could probably be moved if necessary.

If the luncheon address was helpful to the President, it would be a great honor to AEI and to the undersigned -- his loyal former staffer who would do back-flips to make the event a success for him.

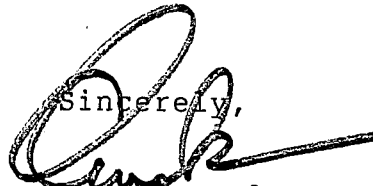

With all the tough issues on your desk you don't need this nit-picking complaint. But, you may find it helpful to give it some consideration.

Simply stated, to arrange for White House speakers at Association business meetings, out of Washington, is a complicated, litigious and negative process. That's a problem for Associations and a bad rap for the Administration.

My example is as follows -- we invited Larry Lindsey to speak in Chicago before 3,000 senior trucking executives on the same program as Chairman Dan Rostenkowski.

He, at first, could not come because the White House could not afford the ticket and only a 501(C)(3) can pay for them under White House Counsel rules.

OK. We have a (C)(3) and were very willing to pay the few hundred dollars for the ticket.

We were then asked to produce three sets of documents -- not all at once, but one at a time as the thought came to counsel. They wanted:

-- proof of the (C)(3) - We sent the documents, then they checked them with the IRS.

- some background on ATA -- What is it? What do we do and for whom?

After spending thousands of dollars worth of time, we worked it out -- and Larry did a super job ... even spent some time with the Chairman.

My questions are simple:

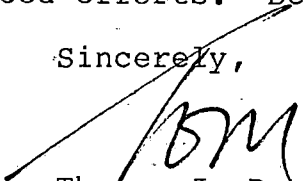
- Can an Association buy White House favor with a single airline ticket to Chicago?

Dear Governor:

I understand that the Economic Policy Council has under consideration a proposal to expand the Cooperative Research and Development Act to include certain production activities of American high-tech companies. I want to convey my support for this approach toward making the United States more competitive in the world marketplace.

My support is generated from the advances in research that our friends in universities and industry are making. At the same time, I am troubled that the development of these discoveries is being impeded.

At issue is whether our present antitrust system promotes innovation through competition as originally intended, or whether a changing business environment requires legislation that stimulates a procompetitive research and development environment.

The government must take the lead and encourage the development of American scientific discoveries via joint ventures among American companies. The challenge from abroad is clear and immediate. The obstacles to technological development in the United States are extraordinary:

(a) On the average, U.S. firms incur capital expenses that are at least twice that of foreign competition while selling their products in the same marketplace.

(b) The structure of foreign firms, so-called vertically integrated companies, provide the competition with enormous financial reserves. American companies that deal exclusively in one area have limited resources. Consortia such as the Coalition for Joint Manufacturing (CJM) and the Council on Superconductivity for American Competitiveness (CSAC) are mechanisms to promote development and pool resources.

(c) Foreign competition is governed by a far more flexible antitrust system. Simply put, U.S. firms are subject to a different set of rules, and yet are playing the same game.

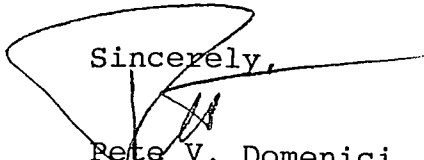
(d) American firms must make massive investments to remain competitive. One example is that of X-Ray Lithography, a process that will be essential to the production of microchips before the end of the century. Only one such facility exists in this country. In Japan alone, 19 projects were developed via joint efforts between industry and government.

The groundwork to empower companies to share ideas and scientific discoveries has already been laid. The National Cooperative Research Act of 1984 has encouraged the creation of consortia that have enhanced the research process. Nearly 120 such groups have been formed since 1984. The development and manufacturing process must be nurtured in a similar fashion.

The National Cooperative Research Extension Act, introduced in the Senate in May of this year, would begin to take the steps necessary to reshape American technological muscle. By extending rather than supplanting the 1984 Research and Development Act, this proposed legislation retains the protections against antitrust violations. Moreover, the Justice Department and the Federal Trade Commission need not surrender their authority to monitor and investigate the structure of joint production ventures.

Science and creativity are not restricted in an academic setting. They should also not be bound or subject to constraint in the development of new technologies. I ask your support for this legislation.

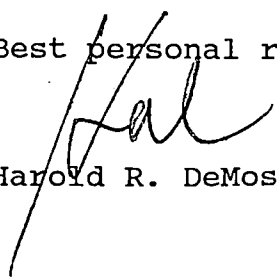

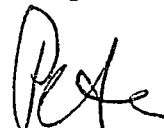
It was good to swap political war stories and catch up with your view of the world from the eye of the hurricane.
