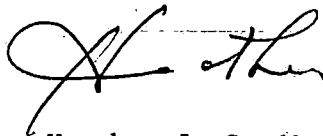
It was good to see you at the White House Christmas party, and I am following up on your question of how you can help in my transition to the private sector

I'm writing you about a proposal by the National Science Center Foundation, Inc. located in Augusta, Georgia. The Center has developed a computer-based system to revitalize U.S. math and science education, and I feel that it warrants your attention. I understand that representatives of the Foundation have met with Jim Pinkerton about their program.

The National Science Center Foundation (NSCF) was established in 1980 to raise funds for creating a discovery center to showcase the history and importance of communications. However, the NSCF Board of Directors enlarged its purpose in 1984 to include becoming a focal point for restoring technical literacy to U.S. secondary schools.

The National Science Center Foundation's goals are to excite renewed and increased interest in mathematics and the sciences, to develop new methods for teaching and learning those subjects using advanced technologies, and to transfer that technology to American classrooms.

To revitalize U.S. math and science education, the Foundation has developed and is activating a new, easy-to-use, computer-based instructional system called Learning Logic to improve student and teacher performance. The system will be used initially to teach mathematics, which is essential to all science and engineering careers.

The National Science Center Foundation estimates that \$2 million is necessary to fully implement their plans for 1990. I have written to Secretary Cavazos about the plan and seeking discretionary funds so NSCF can implement its plans for 1990.

I'm sure you will agree that the goals the program sets are reachable; however, they cannot be reached without our support. I feel that this is an excellent program that is worthy of the Administration's support. I have already contacted Secretary Cavazos in an effort to secure funding for the program.

I feel that this program offers the President an excellent opportunity to help our young people and improve our

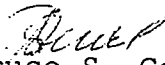
I think you will find of interest the attached USIA reports summarizing media reaction from East Asia and West Europe to the recent Scowcroft-Eagleburger mission to Beijing.

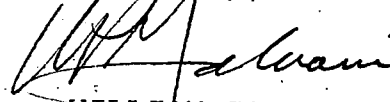

In December 9th's WASHINGTON POST, an article which covered the President's recent three-state swing reminded me that another campaign season is nearly upon us. As a result, additional travel will take place.

The POW/MIA issue can be explosive domestically, particularly in areas of the country where there is a dearth of factual material and misinformation has been spread. During the presidential campaign, potential difficulties were avoided by ensuring that then Vice President Bush had current data regarding the political climate in given areas as well as the status of official efforts to resolve the issue. In fact, he called me on a few occasions for this very purpose.

I have every confidence in the President's knowledge on the POW/MIA issue, just as I do his dedication to resolving it; however, I also recognize that situations arise which, without advance planning, can be detrimental politically. Enclosed is a copy of our most recent newsletter, published bimonthly, which provides up to date information on the issue. Reading this one brief newsletter will ensure responsiveness on most substantive questions which would be raised. Any "loaded" questions could be anticipated only with knowledge of events and individuals within in a specific area, something unpredictable until just before an appearance.

The League fully supports the President's policy for resolving the fates of our missing relatives. My reason for writing is to ensure that the President is never blind-sided by POW/MIA-related questions and that the issue is raised on appropriate occasions. Please know that I am prepared to assist, as appropriate.

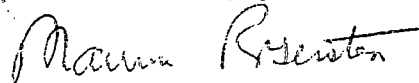

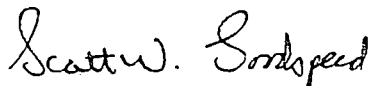
Dear Mr. Sununu:

I am writing this letter to affirm the need for fair Medicare funding in the FY 1991 budget and to encourage you to commit to provide quality health care for the nation's elderly and disabled. As Acting CEO of a 296-bed community hospital, I am well aware of the pressure hospitals have experienced as a result of cutbacks in Medicare funding. Medicare payments to hospitals have failed to keep pace with inflation in the prices hospitals pay for labor, professional fees, food, fuel, utilities and supplies. Since 1983, the hospital marketbasket has risen twice as fast as Medicare hospital payment increases. Today, the average hospital's Medicare payments are 8 to 9% less than the cost of providing care to these patients. The consequence of this underfunding is enormous when you consider that the average hospital relies on Medicare payments for 40% of its gross patient revenues. These types of funding shortfalls may inevitably cause many hospitals to close their doors rather than to risk being unable to adequately care for these patients.

Even with no further Medicare spending cuts, more than two-thirds of all hospitals are expected to lose money caring for Medicare patients in FY 1990. For this reason, it is imperative that you support a Medicare reform package that will allow hospitals to provide an appropriate level of care for our nation's elderly.

Furthermore, it is imperative that hospitals in this country become part of the solution. There are creative solutions and new approaches to this problem which must be explored. If there is anything I can do, I would be happy to become part of the solution.

Did you need seasick patches at Malta too? Tsk! Oh well, now you're getting to see a lot of the world.

John, there's a window of opportunity right now to help the Eastern European countries get some badly needed hard currency. I wonder if you have you any contacts which might help?

The one easily exportable product for these countries is music. They already have the skills - the performers and orchestras. Music can be exported in the form of cassettes, CDs or master tapes for reproduction in America, with royalties going back in hard currency. Music is a \$17B business today.

As the publisher of CD Review, I'm in a position to help popularize their music - particularly folk music. My readers are spending \$27 million a month buying music. Further, I have the largest mail order music firm (Music/NH) in the business. This would be able to immediately make imported music available through a mail order catalog. Then there's Creative Music Marketing, my new distribution company, which could help get imported music into American record stores. Where only the music itself can be exported I have Greener Pastures Records which could issue it on CD, cassette and DAT. I also have a music PR company to promote new releases.

It would obviously help the political situations in these countries if hard currency businesses such as this could quickly be established.

Then there's my amateur radio agenda. These countries are going to need intensive educational efforts in technology as well as in business. An emphasis on amateur radio would help them attract youngsters to electronic careers. Without a solid core of electronics-trained youngsters to provide the development, manufacture, sale, installation and service for electronics, computers and communications equipment, no country will be able to progress.

Business requires an electronic infrastructure to provide communications and manufacturing efficiency. It's prohibitive to have to bring in foreign technicians to make up the shortfall.

Have you any suggestions on who might help me communicate these ideas?

These countries might also be interested in my plans for modernizing education and for cutting college costs through an integrated work/study program. And I suspect they are all in need of a monthly magazine on how entrepreneurialism works - how to: make business plans, advertise, sell, manage, finance businesses, price products and services, and they need to understand packaging, point of purchase promotions, distribution systems, desktop publishing, the role of computers in business, mail order sales, inventory systems, warehousing, preventing customer and employe theft, telephone switching systems, facsimile, paging, cellular radio, mobile radio, etc.

It may be too risky to send money, but we can provide education - and that I know to do.

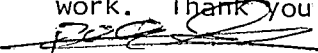
Although I was fortunate to receive your strong support which resulted in my being cleared by the White House Personnel Office and my name forwarded to HUD Headquarters for potential appointment, I feel I must impose once again and seek the support and assistance of your office to finalize my quest for a D. C. reassignment to HUD or other federal Agency.

Many months ago Chase Untermeyer's Office cleared me and sent my name along to HUD Headquarters. This was confirmed by both your office and HUD Headquarters, however as the months have passed nothing has happened despite the fact that several openings still exist in HUD Headquarters. In order to demonstrate my enthusiasm for such a reassignment I have filed well documented applications for over one dozen vacancies posted by HUD Headquarters in the past ten months. In every case the selectee was someone already in HUD Headquarters. As an example, HUD Headquarters recently posted two GM-14 positions in the area of homeless programs. I filed applications based upon a number of factors including my minority status, broad experience working on the poorest Counties and Indian Reservations in the nation, and my experience supervising and monitoring (27) homeless programs in Maine, New Hampshire, and Vermont. In addition, in the past fiscal year I was a speaker for the Department at (6) meetings to discuss homeless programs in Maine, New Hampshire and Vermont. Incredible as it may be, I have now been told that I did not make the Best Qualified List of over 15 names and all names were from the D. C. area. This is the type of frustration that has led to this letter to you.

As a result of action by your office I was set up for an appointment with a Division Director in the Office of Management and Budget last August. I came to Washington at my own expense and had what I considered to be an excellent two hour interview. Nothing has occurred since.

Governor Sununu, I know you receive thousands of letters each week and hopefully this one might just reach your desk or that of Mr. Card, or someone on your staff familiar with such frustrations. I am herein asking for your assistance in obtaining a reassignment or selection to a position in the D. C. area. I know I have strong qualifications in several disciplines including the Bureau of Indian Affairs based upon my enrolled status as a Member of the Huronne-Wendat Nation, my program analyses experience qualifying me for OMB, and positions in HUD, HHS, or other Agencies in which my housing experience could be utilized.

I sincerely seek your help at this time as I know you have never let me down before. Whether in New Hampshire, in D. C., or in the matter of your wife's Congressional campaign in the 2nd District, you can be sure the Gros Louis family is in the forefront of support and willingness to work. Thank you in advance for any help you can give me in this matter.

Dear Mr. Sununu:

As a fellow member of the State of New Hampshire and as a physician, I would like to pass on to you the Medicare Funding problem in your state. As a physician, I have tried to "play ball" with Medicare as a participating physician; however, I have known and seen most dramatically in the hospital now a continued cutting in Medicare refunding. Hospitals have been hit most dramatically by this with losses because of Medicare funding. As you know, they have to make up the deficit of that reimbursement by charging private insurers a higher rate. As I am sure that you are aware, the hospital costs have gone up as you know, because there is no way of reimbursement for services rendered except to charge private insurers a higher rate.

As I have told others, since Medicaid and Medicare are paying a fixed rate no matter what the hospital cost, the only person who can make up the deficit would be private insurers. This, of course, gets used against hospitals and the medical establishment in general as increasing hospital costs. This will only get worse. More importantly, hospitals will be less likely to want to take Medicare and Medicaid patients and this will also be influencing physicians who will start rejecting patients on government reimbursement. This is a very sad state of affairs and can only get worse instead of better.

Our community hospitals have been suffering on a year to year basis and it is definitely getting worse. I am well aware of the finances of the local hospitals because I have been on and presently on boards of hospitals and have seen the reimbursement rates drop to such a point that hospitals in their most lean, efficient state are still losing money. The New Hampshire hospitals and I am sure other state hospitals need your help in understanding the situation which is being created. I implore you to be well aware of this disastrous situation which is occurring.

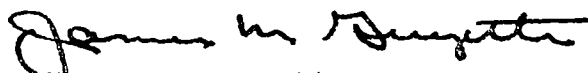

National Engineers' Week is February 18 - February 24 and the Student Engineers' Council at Virginia Tech is celebrating this occasion with events designed to publicize engineering and the value the profession has on society. I am writing to invite you to participate in a panel discussion dealing with a topic of interest to engineers and to society as a whole - the elimination of the trade barriers in Europe in 1992.

This new European Community, encompassing 325 million people, will create a single market for goods and services with a 1989 GNP of 4120.2 billion dollars. This will require American businesses to rethink their marketing strategy and to sharpen their trade practices if they want to compete with Fortress Europe and the Japanese. Engineers will be directly affected by these developments because we are the designers and creators of products and services that will be competing in this global market-place.

Europe 1992 creates interesting questions for the engineering community. How or should the engineering curriculum be changed to reflect a more competitive global economy? Should there be more interaction between the government, business, and academia, as in Japan, in order to move into this arena more quickly and effectively? How should we be preparing for this event? What exactly are the consequences of such a merger?

I would like to address this topic with a panel composed of three representatives from companies with overseas divisions and an academic, with commitments from Babcock and Wilcox and possibly Texaco and ITT. To make this panel complete, I would like to invite you to represent the government's opinions and to give advice to company representatives, students, and faculty that will be in attendance. Your presence is most desirable, considering your government, state, and engineering experience. This event is to take place Wednesday evening, February 21, 1990. I feel that this is an important topic that needs to be addressed. I can be reached at the number and address listed above. Your input and participation would be greatly appreciated.

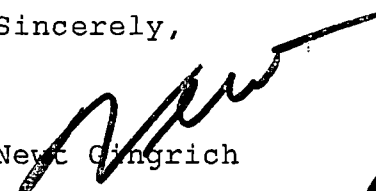

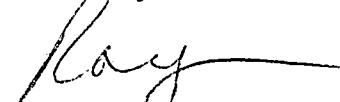

My concern regarding P.L. 100-383, which I understand is awaiting the President's approval or the other action. Enclosed is material which is surfacing around the country in print, talk radio programs, and TV shows.

Part of the anger appears to be generated by the size of the national debt, commitments to Poland, East Germany and other foreign aid programs.

As you can see the native Americans, Italians, Germans, and others are now raising questions via the media.

One of the sore points is that the legislation now requires that the redress matter be considered as an Entitlement Program. This is equated with social security and what others see as a manipulation of the Gramm-Rudman Act.

I forward this information to you for use as you see fit, and also as possible assistance regarding your discussions with the President on the resolution of this matter. Should the President so elect, I think you will find enough votes to sustain his veto.

I hope all is well with you and as one private citizen, thank you for being where you are.

Dear Governor:

A meeting between the Director of the United States Information Agency and the Soviet Politburo member with the ideology portfolio is not an everyday occurrence. When I met recently in Moscow with Vadim Medvedev, he was cordial and businesslike.

With this in mind, I thought you might be interested in some of the highlights of our talk:

NATIONALITIES

The Soviets want Americans to understand the complexity of the nationalities question and the fact that many of the tensions and animosities pre-date the establishment of the Soviet Union. The USSR was giving top priority to this issue and he (Medvedev) thought that expressions of national consciousness could be seen in a positive light when linked to overall economic development and local accountability.

DEFICITS AND INFLATION

Medvedev, himself a professional economist, stressed the need for basic structural change and called for the sale of government resources to the public. He noted that state deficits had been masked for years by "artificial tricks" and that inflation was running at about ten percent.

CONSUMER GOODS

Medvedev stated that not only would resources be diverted from the military to the consumer sector, but that military establishments will be asked to produce for the consumer market.

WESTERN THREAT

The Soviet leadership sees the United States not as a threat but as genuinely interested in the reform of Soviet society.

SOVIET THREAT

Medvedev stated that perestroika and glasnost presented no threat to the West. The new reforms were designed only to energize an apathetic and alienated population and strengthen democratic and human values.

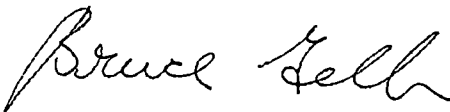
INTERDEPENDENCE

Medvedev emphasized Soviet recognition of the interdependence of the world and necessity of cooperative efforts to solve issues that were political, military, cultural, social, scientific and economic. He stated that he was fully empowered to proceed with concrete proposals.

I promised Medvedev that I would personally involve myself in an effort to send to the Soviet Union experts in a number of fields which Medvedev identified as critical.

Eventually, a piece of legislation will come to the President for approval or veto. This is P.L. 100-383, the so-called Civil Liberties Act. The Congress has acted to make the \$1.2 billion appropriation an entitlement program and it has no line item veto. To the best of my knowledge this is the first time in the history of Congress that the House Rules Committee made the decision to waive the rules if any point of order is raised in objection to the entitlement program. This the ultimate in budget busting.

There is available to you or your staff some forty years of research on this matter available here in Southern California developed by the Americans for Historical Accuracy. Senator Helms' office also maintains an extensive file on the subject.

Discussion points:

1. There is a Federal Class Action suit pending in Washington, D.C. (C.A. 89-607-JGP, March 9, 1989) challenging the constitutionality of the Civil Liberties Act of 1988.
2. The Commission Report, Personal Justice Denied, 1983 is seriously flawed. Information and testimony regarding "Magic" was not permitted to be introduced.
3. Is there a conflict of interest on the part of certain members of Congress who have pressured for passage of the legislation?
4. Why does P.L. 100-383 date back to December 7, 1941, when the Executive Order had not yet been issued? This action picks up Japanese aliens, convicted draft resisters, including those later expatriated or repatriated as well as those who refused to pledge allegiance to the United States.
5. Germans and Italians were also placed in internment as well as relocation camps. Why are they discriminated against in P.L. 100-383?
6. Why is there not an entitlement amendment to P.L. 100-383 for the Aleuts who were awarded \$12,000.00 in the original legislation? Again, the Germans and the Italians are excluded totally.

7. On three different occasions the United States has paid reparation for personal and real property. P.L. 886-1948.

8. P.L. 100-383, August 10, 1988, pays "damages for human suffering". The U.S. Supreme Court has consistently ruled that the United States Government is not libel for any damages for action taken in the interest of national security.

These are but a few of the facts that support the contention that this legislation is unconstitutional.

I and a number of others are available to you or your staff for extensive evidence to support the above and other contentions.

Year Before Vote, Tauke, Harkin Are At Brickbat Stage

Twelve months before the election, most Senate campaigns are content with laying the groundwork for organization, message development, research, and fundraising.

But in Iowa, Democratic incumbent Tom Harkin and his GOP challenger Rep. Tom Tauke are well past the simple preparation stage. They're already throwing brickbats and drawing a little blood as well.

Although Harkin is still holding onto a lead of 20 points or so, that gap is certain to close as Tauke moves around the state, gaining name recognition.

The wide lead belies a situation that resembles two locomotives heading toward one another on the same track; only in this case, we know that one will survive. The question is which one.

Republicans argue history, noting that Iowans have never re-elected to the Senate a Democrat who has served a full term, while Democrats believe they see a trend moving their way in the state. Michael Dukakis carried Iowa last year, the first Democratic presidential candidate to do so since Lyndon Johnson in 1964.

The spectre of the abortion issue hangs over the race — but neither side is sure which way it will play.

In 1978, abortion first appeared on the

political radar screen as a potent campaign issue with the upset of first-term incumbent Sen. Dick Clark (D) by Roger Jepsen, who wasn't even the GOP establishment's pick for the nomination.

While the momentum nationally and in Iowa appears to have shifted somewhat in favor of the pro-choice elements, both sides seem reticent to amplify their views before broader, non-selective audiences for fear of upsetting the delicate balance.

A good guess would probably be that the issue, among those who really vote on the

abortion question, will break something like 3-2 for the pro-choice side. But it's unsettling enough among pro-life Democrats that Harkin will not try to push it too far.

One hint of the kind of campaign that lies ahead in Iowa was a remark by Harkin at a Johnson County Democratic barbecue. The incumbent proclaimed that "the people of Iowa don't want a marshmallow in Washington. They want a Rock of Gibraltar."

It would seem that Harkin wants to attempt to transform his reputation as a combative, sometimes acerbic, figure in the Senate into a major asset.

Harkin's campaign would seem to be content preparing for next year's all-out war while the Tauke forces appear to be probing, in the words of one Harkin strategist, searching for a soft spot or an over-reaction from the incumbent or his campaign.

Just during the month of October, Tauke launched three attacks on Harkin, alleging:

1) that the incumbent "pressured" the Civil Air Patrol to target some marijuana fields in the state so that Harkin could participate in a drug bust during a scheduled "workday" with the CAP (see page 19);

2) that Harkin misrepresented his past voting record on cargo preference legislation (politically potent in agriculture export-oriented Iowa);

3) and, most recently, that Harkin tried to circumvent Senate rules regarding the

franking of newsletters, in this case a 1.1 million-piece mailing to every household in the state.

The most recent flap, over the franking case, involved charges that Harkin backdated or otherwise played hanky-panky with a newsletter mailing (see article on page 8).

The argument concerns whether Harkin's office delivered to the Senate Service Department his fall newsletter in time to be counted against his 1989 budget,

'It's going to get down to who's got the biggest bankroll.'

or, if it didn't, whether his franking allotment for the next year will be completely used up by this mailing.

It is questionable whether the flap itself — or Harkin's inability to send out franked newsletters next year — will make any appreciable difference in the incumbent's performance at the polls in 12 months, but an interesting twist in the last few days has given the GOP hope that, in just tugging on a thread, they may have unraveled at least a portion of Harkin's sleeve.

There is more than a little symmetry over this latest flap: The earliest exchange in the race, back in June, was over charges by Harkin supporters that Tauke violated

Congressional franking rules by mailing an anti-abortion letter to 49,000 pro-life activists statewide, most of the mail going beyond the borders of his own district.

House rules prohibit a Member from sending mass franked mailings outside the district if the Member is running statewide. Still, the franking commission has ruled in the past that, for these purposes, filing as a Senate candidate at the Federal Election Commission, as Tauke had done, does not trigger compliance; only filing as a candidate with state election officials does.

The Democratic complaint against Tauke was dismissed without serious consideration, but it scored a few points for Harkin by conveying a message that Tauke was using his Congressional office to advance his Senate candidacy and his pro-life views.

In this latest episode, the Tauke camp was simply returning the favor — with a little more bite than the original attack.

The details of the latest flap are relatively unimportant in the scheme of who will prevail in this hotly contested fight that most expect will go down to the wire.

As one Harkin campaign operative put it, "It's going to get down to who's got the biggest bankroll."

Still, the controversy, this early in the game, does indicate that the Iowa race could turn out to be the hottest Senate contest of 1990.

Saga of Harkin Newsletter Mailing Grows Ever More Complex; Piece Was 'Updated'

The Senate campaign of Rep. Tom Tauke (R-Iowa) has moved to capitalize on the franking problems of incumbent Sen. Tom Harkin (D-Iowa), charging that Harkin's staff is either incompetent or dishonest in its handling of the Senator's mailing account.

Harkin may be in a fix if the Senate approves the fiscal 1990 legislative appropriation conference report, which passed the House in late September, since it

contains a 50 percent reduction in franked mail for 1990.

Harkin, apparently unaware of the implications of the cut, will have already used almost all of his allotment on a mailing this fall if the conference report is passed (see Cook's column, as well, page 6).

That mailing is the subject of controversy because Harkin is seeking Rules Committee permission to charge it to his 1989 account, while the Tauke campaign claims that at least part of it should be

charged to 1990 since many of the pieces were sent out by the Senate Service Department after Oct. 1, the end of the 1989 fiscal year.

The latest charges involve Tauke campaign manager Tom Synhorst's accusation that the mailing could not have reached the Senate Service Department by Aug. 31, as Harkin's staff claims, because the mailing refers to events that took place as late as Sept. 18.

The newsletter, for example, alludes to

Drug Czar William Bennett's trip to Iowa, which was not announced until Sept. 6, and to an award Harkin presented to a Des Moines high school on Sept. 18.

Pam McKinney, Harkin's press secretary, still says the letter was originally sent to the SSD in late August. "During correction of the proofs we updated it because enough time had lapsed," she said. "In mid-September when we had another proof go down we changed it."

McKinney did not deny that Harkin's office knew that some of the mailings would be charged to 1990. She said the Senate Service Department called the office on Oct. 2 and informed staffers that one-half to two-thirds of the 1.1 million-piece mailing would be charged to 1990 if the mailing was completed.

McKinney said the office also notified them at the time that their 1990 allotment under the conference report would be three postal patron mailings, or roughly 3.3 million pieces.

"For some reason it was not realized [by conference negotiators] that there was not that much money in the agreement until last week," she said, and Harkin's office was not informed "until last week."

Synhorst claimed this explanation was at odds with an earlier explanation McKinney gave the Cedar Rapids Gazette, in which the billing of the mailing to the 1990 year was attributed to sluggish performance by the SSD.

McKinney stressed that the conference report is "still not a done deal," and the issue could become moot if the agreement is revised. What Harkin's 1990 franking budget will be is "speculation at this point."

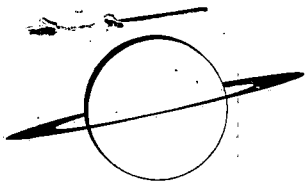

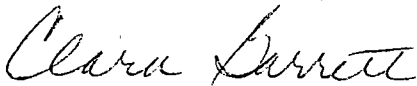

Dear Gov. Sununu:

I know you have met literally thousands of people in your position as Governor of New Hampshire and on the Washington scene in your present responsibilities to our Chief Executive. However, you might recall meeting me at the Pelham Junior High School when you visited the school as governor. We had a rather lengthy discussion on the educational needs of the children of New Hampshire.

I am writing you seeking your support and advice on how an about-to-be formed New Hampshire corporation to be called Magne-Flow Motors can proceed in the face of limited financial funding. Magne-Flow Motors is to be based in Pelham NH and I am currently working on a revolutionary motor that provides torque without burning fuel of any description. If we are successful in this endeavor and, at this writing, we are 80-85 percent towards completion, we plan to power an automobile with this no-fuel motor.

But, like all small companies, we are hampered by limited finances. All current Research & Development monies on this no-fuel motor have come from the pockets of my partner and myself. (Incidentally, my partner, Bob Charlton, is a graduate of Tufts University.)

Our concern is what we perceive to be a dubious effort to meet President Bush's Clean Air Initiative by the encouragement of alternative fuels. In the spring of this year, Energy Security: A Report to the President of the United States announced the launching of a broad-based assessment of the costs and benefits of a vehicle system for the roadways of the U. S. that would be capable of shifting from gasoline and diesel fuel (both based on petroleum) to energy sources that are not tied to oil.

Our understanding is that under the Alternative Fuels Act of 1988, the Dept. of Energy is encouraging the development and widespread use of methanol, ethanol and natural gas as transportation motor fuels. Gov. Sununu, all alternative fuels have serious environmental shortcomings. These alternative fuels will undoubtedly cost more than gasoline and, through general acceptance, will require the setting up of an infrastructure of supply networks as well as service stations that need retrofitting for alternative fuels. And I can envision traffic gridlocks on the nation's highways generated by automobiles running out of alternative fuels at the wrong moment!

If a New Hampshire company can produce a no-fuel motor, all the costs, environmental and infrastructure concerns would fade into the background.

Magne-Flow Motors of Pelham, New Hampshire is in a position to bring this no-fuel motor on-line but, as mentioned at the outset, we are stymied by the lack of personal funding to bring our endeavors to fruition.

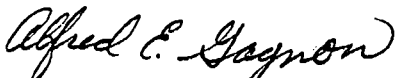
Is there a Grant Program available that could help us---without all the time and expensive paperwork involved in applying for limited funding through such programs as the Small Business Innovative Research Solicitation which historically funds ten percent or less of the applicants. The 1989 SBIR Abstracts of the Phase 1 Awards are devoted primarily to high tech energy programs that in no way relate to our low cost method of vehicular propulsion.

Furthermore, we are not yet set up as a viable incorporated company here in New Hampshire since everything, at the moment, is on hold pending an infusion of money that doesn't come from the inventors' own pockets.

A grant from our Federal Government to Magne-Flow Motors would put the state of New Hampshire at the energy forefront and it would help President George Bush reach his stated goals under the Clean Air Act Initiative.

We earnestly request that you or a member of your staff visit us in Pelham NH to witness the extent of our efforts. We would appreciate hearing from your office to this end.

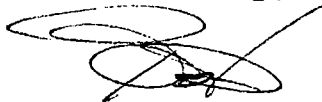

A brief description of the temporary Independent Commission established, and its purposes follows:

NATIONAL FOUNDATION ON THE ARTS AND THE HUMANITIES.

NATIONAL ENDOWMENT FOR THE ARTS

Grants and Administration

TITLE III--GENERAL PROVISIONS

Amendment No. 153

(c)(1) There is hereby established a temporary Independent Commission for the purpose of:

- (a) reviewing the National Endowment for the Arts' grant making procedures, including those of its panel system; and
 - (b) considering whether the standard for publicly funded art should be different than the standard for privately funded art;
- (2) The Commission shall be composed of twelve members as follows:
- (a) four members appointed by the President;
 - (b) four members appointed by the President upon the recommendation of the Speaker of the House of Representatives in consultation with the minority leader of the House of Representatives;

- (4) The Commission may, for the purpose of carrying out its duties, hold such hearings, sit and act at such times and partake such testimony, and receive such evidence, as the Commission considers appropriate.
- (5) The Commission shall issue a report to the Speaker of the House of Representatives and the President of the Senate no later than 180 days after the date of enactment of this Act.
- (6) The Commission shall expire on September 30, 1990.
- (7) Expenses of the Commission not to exceed \$250,000, including administrative support, shall be furnished by the National Endowment for the Arts.

I appreciate your willingness to appoint me to this Commission and would be grateful if you could let me know what additional action I should take.

Dear Governor Sununu:

Thank you for your last response to my letter relative to a meeting with our First Lady, Barbara Bush.

On another note, I thought I would write and share my concern with you as to the President's position on abortion. When the President ran for office last year, he stated that he was opposed to abortion, except to save the life of the mother and for rape and incest cases. I thoroughly agree with his position, because that is my position, too. However, the newspapers are stating that the President will veto such a bill if it comes out of Congress.

I suggest that his veto would not be the wisest move, as it would be considered contrary to his statement during his campaign. I am a firm believer in keeping what promises I make in my campaigns. I am sure the President is a man of his word, and I feel that his word would be questioned widely, if he did not keep his original commitment.

I, myself, have taken the position that I will not vote for any pro-abortion or anti-abortion bill without a statewide advisory referendum, since the question of abortion would be a matter of public policy for the State of Illinois. Toward that end, I have filed Senate Joint Resolution 87 in the Illinois Senate asking for such a referendum. I do not feel that any legislator should be judgmental on such a sensitive and personal issue as pro-choice and anti-abortion, without the voters' response on same.

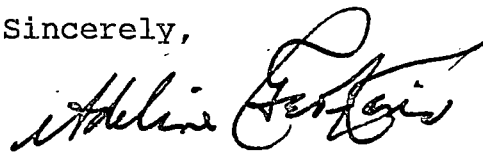

I would suggest to you that my soundings on the subject indicate that the women and men overwhelmingly feel that there should be the right of choice, whether I agree with it or not.

In 46 years of practicing law, I never sent a client for an abortion, nor do I believe in it, unless it is to save the life of the mother and for rape and incest cases. I think the President knows enough about me to know that I am not any wild-eyed liberal, and I think he knows, also, that I try to make my decisions on the basis of common sense and reason.

Thank you for listening, as I felt compelled to tell you what the reaction of the people can be on this subject.
