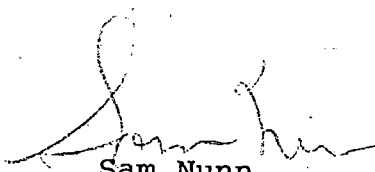

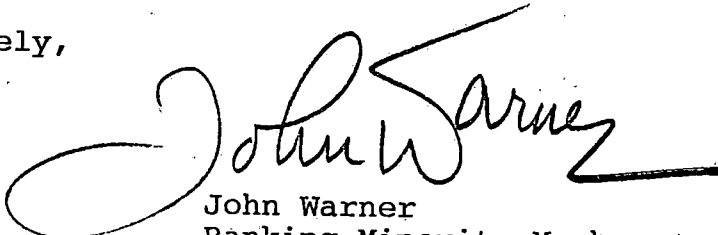
We are writing to bring to your attention the need for the new Defense Nuclear Facilities Safety Board, whose members were confirmed by the Senate on October 18, 1989, to have permanent, secure office space in order for the Board to conduct its essential national security functions in support of our nation's defense nuclear facilities.

We understand that the General Services Administration has had difficulty finding a secure facility where the Board would be able to store and have access to classified information, including restricted data pertaining to production of special nuclear materials. Due to the independent oversight functions of the Board, the Forrestal Building, in which the Department of Energy is located, would not be an appropriate permanent facility for the Board's offices; however, we recognize that the Forrestal Building may offer the only secure facility for the Board on a temporary basis.

As you know, the Board has determined that its first priority will be to review the presidentially-approved plan for the restart of the Savannah River defense reactors, which are the only viable source of tritium for our nation's nuclear deterrent forces at the present time. We hope that you will be able to facilitate the administrative arrangements necessary for the Board to discharge its statutory function to provide independent oversight for the safety of the Department of Energy's defense nuclear facilities.

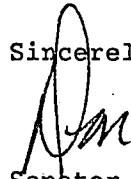

Niebuhr's many books, including The Nature and Destiny of Man, The Irony of American History, and Children of Light, Children of Darkness, are great American classics.

I would also like to recommend that, as often as possible, the President quote Reinhold Niebuhr in his speeches, where appropriate.

I like very much the idea of honoring a figure who is deeply respected on the left and on the right, and who has a real claim to classic stature.

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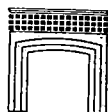

Subject: NATO Military Force Structure - Reexamination

Dear Mr. Sumner,

as you know the House and Senate Armed Services Committee are at odds over the issue of maintaining U.S. support of NATO forces at current levels. The Air Force is being forced to close its fighter base in Torrejon, Spain because the Spanish Government will not renew the air force base agreement. Therefore, the immediate issue facing the Congress is the need to resolve the problem relating to rebasing the 401st Tactical Fighter Wing (TFW) located at Torrejon AB, Spain and the financing the \$885 million dollar costs associated with building a new base in Italy.

The Armed Services Committee of the Senate wants to build a new airbase and transfer the 401st TFW to Crotone, Italy while the House Committee wants to return the 401st TFW to the U.S. unless the NATO pays a substantial portion of the cost of building a new airbase in Italy.

The bankruptcy of the Soviet economy is forcing the Russians to reevaluate their allocation of major resources to the military forces and to deactivate or withdraw military units confronting the NATO forces. Although some of these reductions have been unilateral the Soviets want no less than parity and insist on an equal reduction in NATO forces in the European theater of operations. The Soviets are willing to trade tank reductions for a reduction of the technically superior aircraft in the NATO forces.

President Bush, a pragmatist I believe, recognizes and encourages détente with the Soviet Union, but I believe

is wary of the Soviet military intentions, as a consequence the troop reduction process is currently stalemated. President Bush can regain the initiative from the Soviets by releasing the presence of U.S. Air Force fighter aircraft in Europe without effectively reducing the air support of NATO by transferring the 481st Tactical Fighter Wing from Torrejon, Spain to a forward air base in the U.S. As Commander-in-Chief, he could immediately rebase the 76 F-16 fighter aircraft to Pease AFB, a New England base located within a few flight hours of Europe. Refueling tankers presently located at Pease AFB could readily move the fighters to any theatre of operation in Europe, the Middle East or Africa within hours of notification of an impending threat to peace.

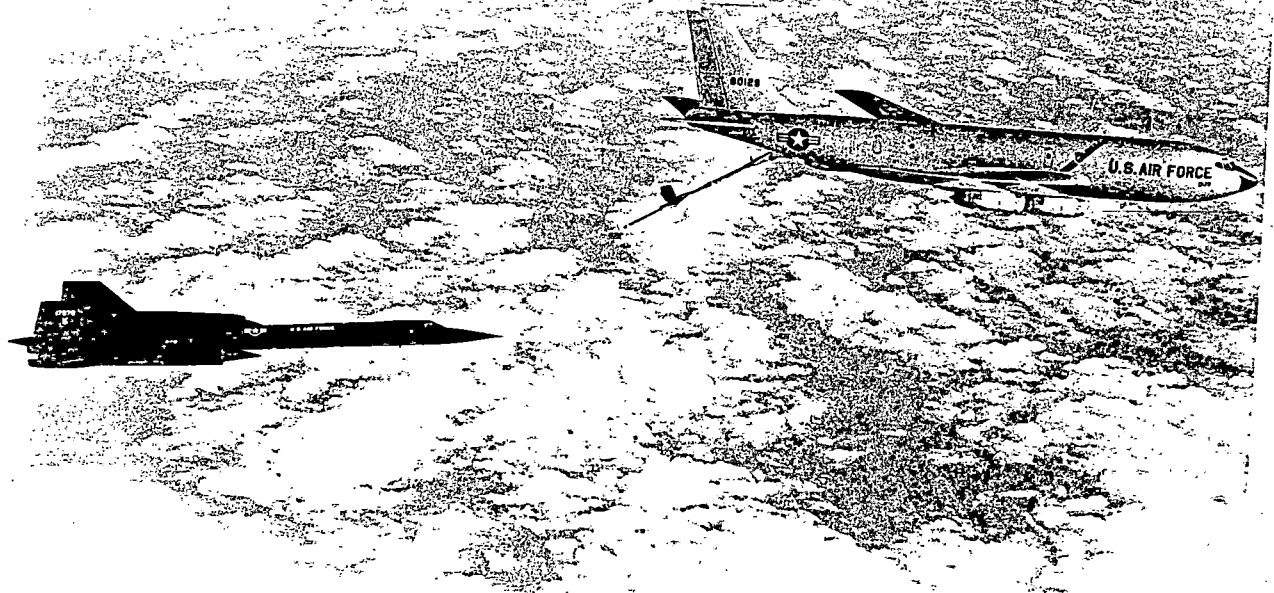

The money saved from this plan of operation could purchase a B-2 bomber, or about 10 thousand low cost apartments, or aid in the war on drugs.

I wonder how soon after building the 885 million dollar casino in Cuneo, Italy will it also be closed. The impending collapse of the Soviet Empire, the developing self reliance of Western Europe in arms manufacturing and the forthcoming European integrated economic program will dramatically affect American influence and activities in Europe. If we must continue to support NATO, let us do so with US Air Forces based in the US or Canada.

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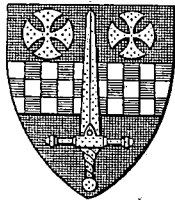

The Korea Foreign Trade Association ("KFTA"), which consists of some 20,000 Korean importers and exporters, is deeply interested in U.S.-Korea trade relations. The trade volume between the U.S. and Korea exceeded \$34 billion last year, with Korea becoming the 7th largest trading partner of the U.S. Significantly, Korea's market for U.S. exports is expanding at a rate faster than that of any other country in the world. This ever-expanding trade relationship appears to have recently developed into that of a true partnership where both countries act responsively and responsibly toward each other. The partnership has recently been epitomized by the decision of the U.S. government not to designate Korea as an "unfair" trader under the so-called "Super 301" provision of the 1988 Omnibus Trade and Competitiveness Act (the "1988 Trade Act"). Korea has made it clear that it values this partnership and intends to preserve and promote it, and KFTA, with a vital interest in U.S.-Korea trade relations, will be an integral part of Korea's efforts to that end.

As in any healthy relationship, however, the two countries do not agree in all respects. There are disagreements in a few areas, and one of them is the exchange rate issue involving Korea's currency. This disagreement has been particularly painful to Korea because it has such paramount importance to and impact upon Korea's economy. The disagreement stems from a particular provision of the 1988 Trade Act which requires the U.S. Department of Treasury ("Treasury") to designate countries that manipulate their currencies in order to gain unfair competitive advantage or to prevent balance of payments adjustments. Since last fall, Treasury has twice designated Korea as such a manipulator. We feel that such designation is inappropriate, unjustified and unfair to Korea.

We feel that the designation:

- is inappropriate because Korea's case simply does not meet the requirements set forth in the 1988 Trade Act for such designation;
- is unjustified because it ignores Korea's unique historic and economic background while seemingly confusing Korea's act of correcting imbalances with that of creating them; and
- is unfair because it unjustifiably bestows on Korea an image of an "unfair" player in the international community.

The enclosed paper presents the reasoning behind our opinions described above.

The paper will also show that continued designation of Korea as an unfair manipulator will materially hurt the economic and security interests of the U.S.

Currency misalignment is a complex issue. Designating an ally and a trading partner as an "unfair manipulator" is a serious matter, not to be undertaken lightly. The U.S. can best approach this matter only with great care and reason, given the complexity and magnitude of the issue. We are concerned that such a careful, rational approach is perhaps lacking in the designation of Korea as a manipulator, and the enclosed paper intends to show the basis for our concern.

There are abundant signs indicating the likelihood of further positive developments in the already close and productive trade relationship between our two countries. We welcome these signs and are buoyed by the positive prospects they bring. In this process of ever-deepening partnership, neither the U.S. nor Korea should allow misperception, misunderstanding or lack of care to hinder the process. Both countries should be winners. In that sense, we feel this issue may deserve your valuable attention and serious consideration. In as much as the issue has been so painfully important to us, your careful review of the enclosed paper, and any resultant comments, will be deeply appreciated.

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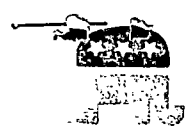

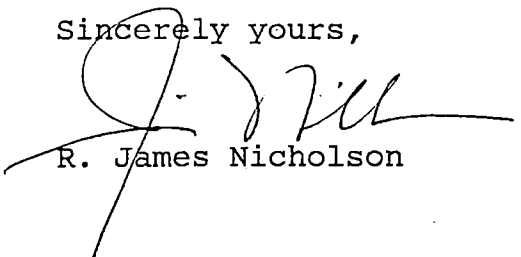

Dear John:

Continuing program growth, fund-raising results, and important actions by the CSFA Board prompt this edition of the President's Letter.

Program Growth in FY 1989. CSFA's fiscal year ended on June 30, 1989. How did we do in program growth this past year? Extremely well! In fact, in terms of new programs FY 1989 was the best year ever for CSFA. We added 69 new corporate-sponsored scholarship programs, approximately twice the number of any previous year. Also 91 new Dollars for Scholars chapters were created, the largest number in any single year. As of June 30, CSFA was managing 288 student aid programs for corporations, foundations, associations, and individuals throughout the U.S. Our Dollars for Scholars chapter roster stood at 435.

New England Project. We continue to gain important financial backing for our plan to establish a regional Dollars for Scholars office in New England. Since May 18 (when Ray Stata, President of Analog Devices, hosted a breakfast for representatives of New England corporations and foundations), two important grants have been obtained, \$60,000 from the Jessie B. Cox Charitable Trust and \$10,000 from the Arthur Young Company. These grants bring the total support from corporations, foundations, and individuals to \$166,000 and move us close to being able to launch the New England program. A number of key proposals are still pending with New England corporations and foundations.

Northwest Project. Very exciting news for CSFA has come from the Northwest this past summer. In mid-May the Washington State Legislature passed a \$100,000 challenge grant program to encourage local Washington towns, cities, and communities to create scholarship foundations to assist their local students in obtaining the benefits of post-secondary education. Passed under the leadership of Washington legislators Ken Jacobsen and Holly Myers, the bill provides \$2000 each to the first 50 communities that create scholarship chapters and carry out initial fund raising. CSFA will work hand in hand with the Washington Higher Education Coordinating Board in implementing the program. This first-of-its-kind program could become an important model for other states. In July CSFA also received from the Oregon Community Foundation a grant of \$20,000 for challenge grants to create Dollars for Scholars chapters in Oregon. We are currently awaiting the outcome of our request to a key foundation in the Northwest for start-up funding for a new regional office.

Indiana Program Results. In late 1987 CSFA received a grant from the Lilly Endowment to launch a new regional Dollars for Scholars program in Indiana. In less than two years 50 new Dollars for Scholars chapters have been formed in that state. Congratulations to Indiana Program Development Officer Nancy Mead and the caring, responsive volunteers throughout the Hoosier state.

Long-Range Plan. CSFA is a mission-driven, goal-oriented organization. Under the leadership of Board Chair Lloyd Brandt, a Long-Range Planning Committee worked throughout this past year to prepare a new five-year plan for the organization. That plan, adopted by the Board in May, sets forth challenging goals. The plan calls for us to be distributing annually \$32,000,000 in scholarship funds and educational grants through our student aid management services by 1994. The plan challenges us to reach a total of 1200 Dollars for Scholars chapters by the same year. To support this growth our fund-raising goals are equally challenging and include an organized capital campaign to raise funds for endowed scholarships, building expansion, and for the first time, endowment funds to support our Dollars for Scholars program operations.

Staff Changes and Additions. CSFA's continuing growth has also been recognized in important staff changes and additions in recent months. Marilyn Rundell has been promoted to Vice President, overseeing our growing scholarship management operations. Fred Vogel has been hired as our first full-time Director of Finance. A CPA, he brings to CSFA extensive experience in both for-profit and nonprofit corporations. As a result of these changes, Stuart Johnson will be able to devote full time to executive leadership in marketing CSFA's student aid management services and Marlys Johnson will now be able to devote more time in using her creative talents for program development and fund-raising activities. We have a great staff prepared to join with Board members, friends, and supporters to make the visions of our long-range plan a reality.

Community and Responsibility. Two recently published books, M. Scott Peck's A Different Drum, and Charles Murray's In Pursuit of Happiness and Good Government, though written from different political and psychological perspectives, point to a major problem in our country. Both authors decry the lack of community in our nation -- and the consequent lack of responsibility. People are simply too dependent on "someone else" -- the government or some other organization -- tackling the problems surrounding us. We are forgetting that small groups of people coming together can make a tremendous difference. CSFA is a unique organization that constantly works to bring people together -- in communities, corporations, or other organizations -- to meet the educational needs of our country. CSFA itself is also a special community. Each of you -- whether Board member, staff, contributor, or friend -- is part of a community of people taking responsibility for the educational future of our nation. For that we remain extremely grateful.

The Edison Electric Institute has appreciated the opportunity to work closely with the Administration on a variety of issues during the last eight months.

As the Administration debated and developed their proposals on Acid Rain, we provided credible information and constructive policy recommendations to both Cabinet offices and the White House. Our goals have been to assure flexible and cost-effective approaches to these complicated issues and to minimize the economic impacts on our customers.

I have enclosed a Study by Temple, Barker, and Sloane, as well as a press statement which we conveyed to the White House August 30. It is an attempt to make our companies' views known on the economic impacts of the current proposal.

As a follow up to my letter of August 16, enclosed are the papers discussing, in detail, the issues of which we are concerned.

The issues we have addressed are:

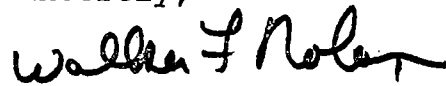
- o Energy Efficiency and Conservation;
