Susan Alverado and I have invited the two top executive officers of our client companies to come to Washington, D.C. on April 24, 1990 to visit with top Administration and Congressional leaders. Further to our conversation last Wednesday, I have been following closely Congressional consideration of the Clean Air legislation. My Government has determined that its proposed 10 million ton reduction in sulphur dioxide emissions would reduce transborder flows of such emissions to an acceptable level, i.e. to no more than 2 million tonnes.

As you know, one component of the overall 10 million ton reduction is an assumed "credit" of 1.1 million tons from non-utility industrial sources. Canada agrees that this is a reasonable assumption. I understand, however, that the utilities wish to see this credit increased significantly, with a corresponding decrease in the reductions required of them. Changing such a basic assumption of the proposed legislation would be seen as a deliberate effort to avoid achieving a real 10 million ton reduction and would completely undermine the legislation's credibility in Canada. I urge you to resist any such efforts to alter the legislation's basic framework.

I am also aware of proposals being discussed in Congress that would effectively delay attainment of the full 10 million ton reduction in sulphur dioxide emissions until well into the first decade of the 21st century. As you know, Canada's acid rain control program will be fully implemented by 1994. While I understand why the draft legislation sets the year 2000 as the final compliance deadline, any further delay would raise questions about the commitment of the United States to resolve this bilateral problem in a satisfactory manner. I would urge you to insist on a full 10 million ton reduction by the year 2000.

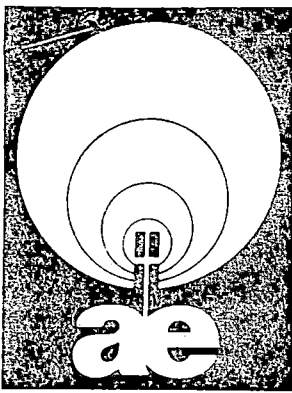

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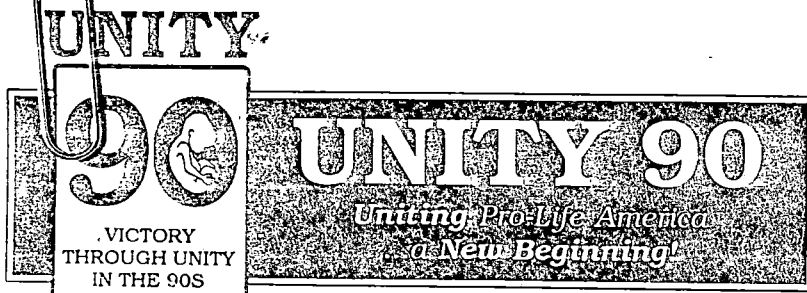

Dear Governor Sununu:

I have been informed that Judge Joseph M. McLaughlin is under consideration for appointment to the Bench of the United States Court of Appeals for the Second Circuit. I take the liberty of writing to you to express my enthusiastic and unreserved support for his appointment. My support is based as much upon my personal knowledge of and esteem for him as upon his outstanding professional qualifications. I have known him for more than thirty years as law school classmate, colleague, and friend. I repose the utmost confidence and trust in him.

Writers of recommendations ought to explain why their endorsements should be taken seriously. Because appointments of this sort typically evoke pro-life concerns, I believe it necessary to set forth some of my pro-life credentials. At the same time, I find myself in a quandry. My letter ought to concentrate on Judge McLaughlin. Yet his qualifications are a matter of public record and my credentials may not be widely known (to put it mildly). I hope you will forgive me, therefore, if I spend an inordinate portion of this letter on my own pro-life activities. They are more than consistent with my advocacy of Judge McLaughlin's elevation to the Second Circuit.

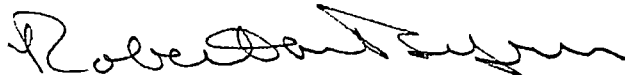
My involvement in the pro-life movement spans a quarter of a century (and more than two dozen articles in legal and medical journals and periodicals of general circulation). In 1968, I wrote the minority report of the Governor's Commission to Review New York's Abortion Law. A year later, I was awarded the Papal Medal Pro Ecclesia Et Pontifice. In 1971, I was plaintiff, as guardian of certain unborn children, in a rather famous (or notorious, depending on one's viewpoint) lawsuit that unsuccessfully challenged New York's permissive abortion law. Over the years, I have participated in the drafting of a great deal of pro-life legislation and testified before many legislative committees (including Subcommittees of the United States Congress that held hearings on the Buckley Human Life Amendment which I helped to draft). During the late nineteen

seventies, I drafted several parental consent and notification bills for the New York State Legislature, which led the Governor to appoint a Commission, under the chairmanship of Judge (then Dean) McLaughlin, to examine the question. (I am, of course, familiar with the entire episode and the memoranda that were written.) In 1980, as a lifelong Republican, I was invited by the Republican Platform Committee to testify with respect to the abortion plank.

I could continue but I begin to bore even myself. Indeed, I have gone on at this length only to indicate the extent of my commitment to the rights of unborn children, a commitment that transcends even close personal friendships. I would not support any appointment that was inconsistent with that commitment. I reiterate my wholehearted support for Judge McLaughlin.

Dear Mr. Sununu:

I would like to take this opportunity to thank you for your efforts in modifying the EPA, Corps of Engineers MOA for 404 permits. The final version that was adopted is certainly better than the original proposal by the agencies.

I am deeply concerned about the direction federal agencies are taking towards environmental matters, especially wetlands. Two major areas of concern are interpretation of policy, rules, regulations or agreement and duplication of effort.

Although there was an effort in the 404 permit MOA to perhaps clarify interpretation, I believe that in many areas the Corps is going to interpret it differently from what we as a DOT would. Words such as appropriate mitigation, practical, insignificant environmental losses, least environmental damaging, practical alternatives, all are open to different interpretation depending on who is interpreting these words.

In areas where there are numerous wetlands, in order to construct a highway project, we have to obtain permits from at least three federal agencies. Generally, these wetlands are under easement to Fish and Wildlife. As such, they fall under Section 4(f) of the 1966 DOT Act. Federal Highway Administration requires us to demonstrate that there is no feasible or practical alternatives to using the 4(f) land before they approve the highway project. As part of this process, we also need to demonstrate the measures that we intend to take to minimize harm to the 4(f) wetlands. Since the wetland easements are under the jurisdiction of the US Fish and Wildlife, we then need to obtain a permit from them to use the land for which they have easements. This involves providing them with a mitigation plan for wetlands being

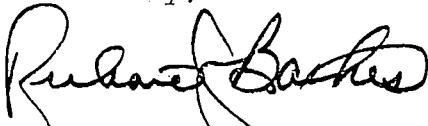
impacted by the project. Before construction can begin, we then need a Corps of Engineer's 404 permit to fill these wetlands. Our recent experience is that the Corps is asking for much more detailed analysis of alternatives and mitigation. As you can see, this involves the State DOT having to satisfy three different federal agencies for permits. These permits are obtained at different stages in the project development. Each agency has its own procedures and requirements. It would appear that this is a prime area in which the federal government could initiate a reduction in paperwork, manpower and cost savings. Implementing a policy whereby once one federal agency has approved the project, the other agencies would accept that approval, and would provide a much more streamlined process.

We have heard much about the no net loss of wetlands and are pleased that the MOA is considered a guideline and not a no net loss wetland policy.

It is my understanding that the President's Task Force on wetland policy will be conducting meetings around the country before finalizing a no net loss wetland policy. Given the number of wetlands in the state of North Dakota, and since our wetlands are of the prairie pothole type which are unique to just a few North Central states, we would appreciate it if the task force would conduct one of their meetings in the state of North Dakota. This would allow input from all interested parties within our state.

I would certainly appreciate anything you may be able to do to reduce paperwork, minimize duplication and streamline the federal approvals for highway projects. Again, thanks for what you have done regarding the EPA-Corps of Engineer's MOA.

We are pleased that states are now playing an ever-increasing domestic policy role. Over the past decade, NGA has substantially increased its capacity to assist the Governors in the formulation of national policy positions and in the development and management of state programs. 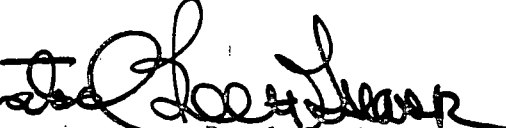

The Financial Institutions Reform, Recovery and Enforcement Act of 1989 ("FIRREA") substantially revised the corporate governance structure of the Federal Home Loan Mortgage Corporation ("Freddie Mac"). In shifting Freddie Mac's corporate governance from a board of directors composed of the three members of the now-dissolved Federal Home Loan Bank Board to an 18-person Board of Directors composed of 13 representatives elected by the corporation's shareholders and 5 individuals appointed by the President of the United States, the Congress put Freddie Mac in a position to take a major step in meeting the challenges that affect the residential housing market throughout the United States for the 1990's and beyond. (Of the 5 presidential appointees, at least one must be from the homebuilding industry, at least one from the mortgage lending industry, and at least one from the real estate industry.) As directors of Freddie Mac, each of these individuals will have a direct responsibility to ensure that Freddie Mac fulfills its charter purposes, as well as to discharge the fiduciary duties of loyalty and care which each director owes to Freddie Mac's shareholders.

Freddie Mac's first annual shareholders' meeting occurred on February 6, 1990. At that time, the shareholders elected thirteen individuals for the shareholder-elected seats on the Board. As you can see from the names listed below, the shareholders elected a group of individuals in which each member has impeccable professional credentials, an outstanding reputation for integrity, and the ability to add true value to Freddie Mac in meeting its Congressional mandate. The new shareholder-elected directors are:

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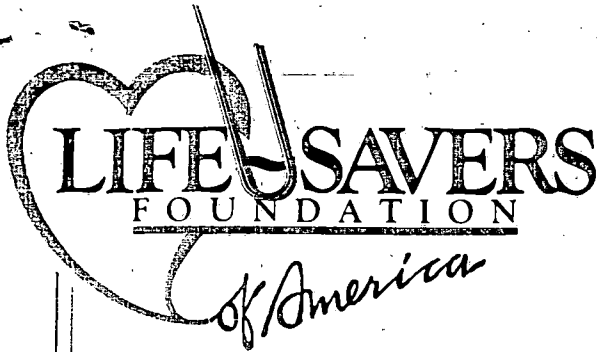

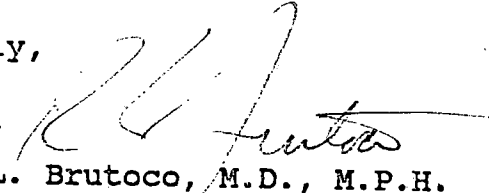
Now, over 80,000 Americans have volunteered to save a stranger's life through marrow donation. This is the ultimate form of voluntarism.

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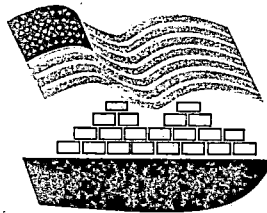

Dear Mr. President:

In your upcoming meeting with Prime Minister Kaifu, I hope that you will take the opportunity to mention the critical importance of a full opening of the Japanese wood products market, including elimination of tariffs. With full access, our industry, which is competitive worldwide, could sell literally billions of dollars of additional processed wood products annually.

Eliminating Japanese wood products trade barriers can be a win-win for the two countries. Obviously, the U.S. industry and the U.S. trade balance would benefit. U.S./Japan trade relations would benefit and pressure for restricting log exports to Japan would subside. In addition, Japanese builders and consumers would enjoy an enormous benefit in terms of the availability of high-quality, reasonably-priced building materials which are desperately needed in Japan.

Mr. President, this dispute is critical to our industry. As demographics change in the United States, demand for wood products may drop significantly. It is important that foreign markets be open to our competitive products. Over 10,000 direct mill jobs are at stake. 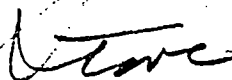

You might have noticed that our legislation provides that an ex officio member of our Board may designate another official to attend meetings in his absence. I am counting on you to carry out your "threat" to attend all of our meetings faithfully; you have already, at your first meeting, provided valuable insights, displayed exemplary enthusiasm and made significant substantive suggestions. In addition, your attendance at our meetings would provide a welcome example and incentive for your Cabinet colleagues on the Board to attend as well.

I suspect, however, that there will be times when you will not be able to attend. In addition, it is very useful to me and the director to have someone in the White House to reach when we might need help or advice.

Obviously the choice of your alternate is totally yours. I might mention, though, that Jim Cicconi served in that capacity for Jim Baker when he was in the White House. He was extremely effective and we all grew very fond of him.

The Family Research Council, a division of Focus on the Family, joins the Administration in opposing S.110, the Family Planning Amendments of 1989. We believe it is possible to hinder movement of S. 110 on the Senate floor through several approaches.

The Council's opposition to S.110 is multifold. We oppose the general increase of Title X funding, plus the new authorization of \$10 million dollars specifically designated for "community-based information and education programs" and the separate authorization of \$10 million dollars for the expansion and promotion of the development, marketing, and evaluation of new contraceptive devices, drugs, and methods.

In a time of concern over budget constraints coupled with alarm at the deterioration of the cohesive American family unit, we believe that an intensive study of Title X and its effectiveness in decreasing teenage pregnancies should be undertaken before additional funding occurs.

As stated in the November/December, 1989 issue of Family Policy, nearly twenty years have passed since Congress adopted legislation establishing Title X of the Public Health Service Act. Expenditures and clientele have grown dramatically. The American taxpayer has spent \$2.1 billion over the past twenty years, providing services to an estimated 1.5 million teenagers annually. As a result, teenage pregnancy is not declining, but rather, it is escalating. This should raise questions to both lawmakers and the public as to the effectiveness of the Title X program, its future, and what alternatives can be offered to both parents and teenagers.

Our opposition to the \$10 million authorization for community information centers is based on a concern that these will provide federal funding for school-based clinics. Opposition to the separate authorization for funding of contraceptive research opens the door, we believe, for research regarding abortifacients.

The involvement of parents in the Title X program is limited at best. The future of the program must be based on inclusion of parental authority and consent, whether on the state and/or federal levels. An example can be seen in the state of Minnesota, where a parental notice law for abortion went into effect in 1981. By 1985, data supplied by the Minnesota Department of Health indicated the number and rate of pregnancies, births, and abortions all dropped significantly for girls under age 18. This suggests that parental involvement is a significant deterrent to adolescent sexual activity.

The Council will view this vote as a pro-life vote.

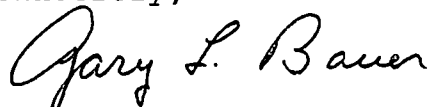
It is our understanding that the chief sponsor of the bill, Senator Edward M. Kennedy (D-Massachusetts) plans to bring S. 110 to the Senate floor in March if he has the sixty votes necessary to invoke cloture. We would like to make the following recommendations.

1. We recommend that the cloture vote for S.110 be regarded as a party-line vote.
2. If cloture is not invoked, we ask for Administration support of amendments addressing the funding of school based health clinics, contraceptive research that includes abortifacients, and an amendment which allows for parental consent prior to services rendered with Title X funds.

Enclosed is a copy of Family Policy, a copy of the Administration's position as stated in a letter from Secretary Sullivan to Senator Kennedy, copies of newspaper articles and an additional copy of a memorandum sent to you on January 24, 1990 with an addendum.

Thank you for your consideration of this matter. I trust that we will be able to work together on this issue. If you or your staff have any questions, please do not hesitate to contact me or Elizabeth Kepley at 393-2100.

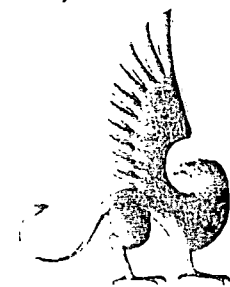

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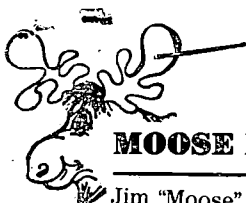

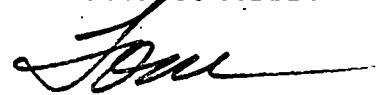

Problem #1 • The abortion question.

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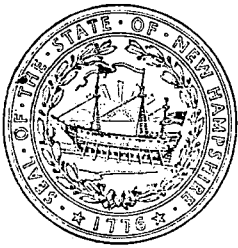

Thank you for your recent correspondence. Per your request I am pleased to enclose a copy of Promises To Keep : Supporting People With Developmental Disabilities, Their Families, and Communities in the 1990's, our Council's "1990 Report" required under PL 100-146. You will be pleased to know that consumers generally expressed high levels of satisfaction regarding the quality of services they received. Unlike many other states, we found that service models currently in use in New Hampshire are basically sound and that the real issue for the 1990's will be the creation of innovative approaches addressing as yet unmet needs within the context of a basically sound service structure. Particularly in the areas of community residential services and supported employment the Report serves as a testimony to your progressive and determined efforts while Governor of our state to develop dignified, responsive approaches based on the positive values of independence, productivity, and integration.

The Report contains many recommendations regarding ways in which services for people with disabilities and their families might be improved. Key areas for federal attention include Medicaid reform/restructuring and some resolution to the continuing conflict in vocational rehabilitation policy regarding the incompatible goals of serving people with "the most severe disabilities" in "a time-limited fashion". Please note that I remain quite willing to work with you or your staff on either of these issues or on any issues you might have in relation to the upcoming reauthorization of the Developmental Disabilities Act.

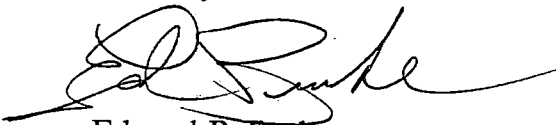

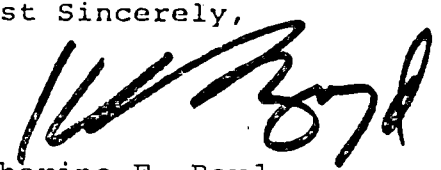
Dear Governor:

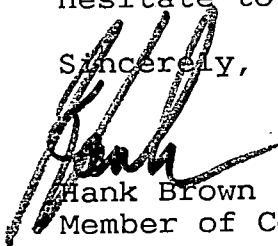

I read your interview with Business Week (2/5 issue) and am truly disappointed in your perception of how we will continue to be an economic force, etc. in the '90's.

Capital Gains Tax reduction...I support for lesser \$ realized than wealthier entrepreneurs. However, that will only help slightly as the senior management or founders of business, prosper vs the middle management and work force that made the products. What is needed is "Capital Industry!"

We are no longer a manufacturing Nation!

Twenty two years ago I started my business and represented only 1 foreign firm (BOFORS/Sweden), all others being USA.

If Congress wants to assist...than work with US industry to improve factories; prevent "vulture" acquisition; slowdown the "quick-buck" mentality of stock options to go public and bail out quick, etc.

We have been "free enterprised" by others than Americans.

How about a favorite "son" rule and not 1 specific industry. Since we have surrendered the memory chip business to Japan...for every \$ we send them...they must buy that much in computers; cars, refrigerators, etc.

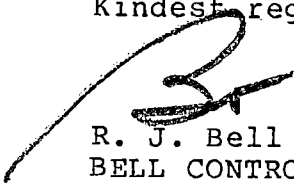
With that type of system...why would anyone buy any car or product other than American?

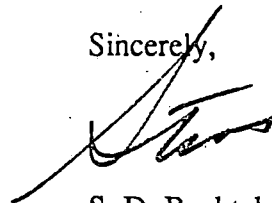

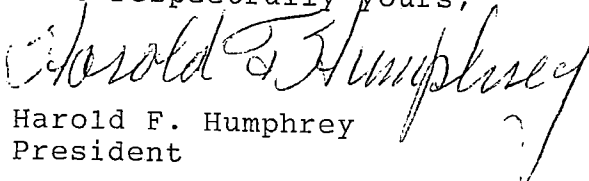
Our corporation is the owner of a very substantial note secured by a preferred ship's mortgage on the U. S. Registered vessel "Escapade", owned by Mr. Lewis Nadle, of Guatemala City, a U. S. citizen.

In November of 1988, the "Escapade" was illegally seized by the Guatemalan Navy as a result of a dispute between the owner and Techno Marina, a repair contractor in Puerto Barrios, Guatemala. To his credit, Mr. Nadle fought the matter successfully through the Guatemalan court system and should now be free to take possession of his property. However, he has now learned that the Guatemalan Navy will claim they are owed fees in the amount of Q400,000, or approximately \$100,000 U. S. for the maintenance and protection of the "Escapade" over the last fifteen months while they illegally held the vessel without the permission of the owner. Indeed, not only was he illegally deprived of the use of the vessel, but the Navy used the "Escapade" to entertain visiting dignitaries on sailing trips to the nearby cays! They also used her in their "Navy Day" boat parade, a fact that our Naval Advisor to the U. S. Military Group, Lt. "Nick" Nicol, can attest.

There is little doubt now that there is no intent to return the vessel to Mr. Nadle. It appears that the actions by the Guatemalan Navy are nothing more than clear acts of piracy against a U. S. vessel, disguised by a gloss of legality. We trust that such an illegal seizure of an American vessel is abhorrent to our government, and request your intervention on behalf of Mr. Nadle, and our corporation, with the government of Guatemala. The reason we are requesting your intervention at this moment is that it will present less difficulty if the fees are not officially imposed, than to have them removed later.

Thank you for your time and consideration in this matter which is of such critical importance to us.

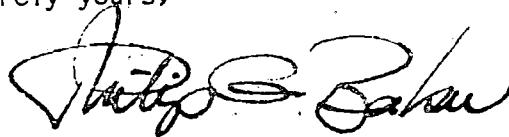
Dear Mr. Sununu:

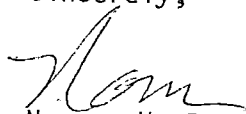
We have followed with interest the activities of the National Wetlands Policy Task Force, established by your Domestic Policy Council, since we had been especially heartened by the President's pledge "...promote more creative state and local initiatives." We fully expected that this task force would be the forum in which state and national perspectives could be integrated into workable, effective policy direction related to preserving our nation's wetlands.

As a former governor, I'm sure you appreciate the fact that federal officials are rarely conversant with specific regional differences which can (and usually do) seriously compromise implementation of national policy, no matter how well-intentioned that policy may be. I also know that you must share the feelings of all state governors that finalization of national policy without input from the states invariably results in loss of time and our money at both the state and national levels.

With this backdrop, you can understand our reaction of shock and dismay when we reviewed the November 15, 1989 final memorandum of agreement between the Corps of Engineers and the Environmental Protection Agency related to mitigation of impact to wetlands under the Section 404 program. As several of my colleagues (Governor Cowper of Alaska and Governor Sinner of North Dakota) have expressed, this MOA is obviously a statement of policy in wetlands, and just as obviously was not in any way coordinated with either the National Wetlands Policy Task Force or the states directly. This is definitely not the way to promote creative state and local cooperation.

I am attaching several statements prepared by the Western States Water Council with which I am in total concurrence. In short, I would strongly recommend that the MOA between the Corps and EPA be tabled until finalization can be accomplished within the framework of the National Wetlands Policy Task Force.

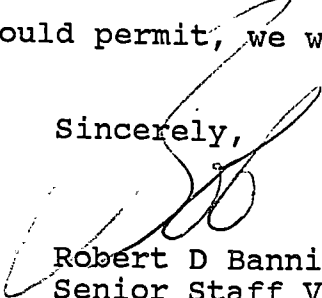

Dear Governor Sununu:

I hope this letter will keep the President from being blindsided from within his administration.

Some ten years ago the United States and China together established the National Center for Industrial Science and Technology Management Development at Dalian (NCISTMD). That program has been lauded by every U.S. Ambassador to China and by the Chinese themselves. Under the guidance of Richard Lee at Commerce, this program has -- at very low cost -- trained over 2,700 managers in China. They have learned about free markets, finance, production, customer responsiveness, etc. Indeed, much of what has been taught there was reflected in the social and economic changes that were under way in China before June of '89. Despite these facts, the Chinese Government wants the program to continue.

I know how important the President feels it is to maintain our relationship with China and to send no inadvertant negative signals to the Chinese. Yet an Assistant Secretary of Commerce has just told Richard Lee that the funds for the NCISTMD (about \$400,000) are to be redirected to be used in Eastern Europe and Central America. I perceive this move as a clear subversion of the President's policy re China by a lower level bureaucrat. If you share my perception, see that this decision is reversed.

I am writing to make you aware of some concerns that Iowa has with the final federal regulations implementing the Job Opportunities and Basic Skills (JOBS) program. Although states were assured by White House staff and the National Governors' Association (NGA) that the final regulations would allow maximum flexibility in administering the JOBS program, our review of the federal regulations shows that this is not the case. Our major concerns are as follows:

- Although the Family Support Act allows states to pay up to the local market rate for child care, the final regulations prohibit federal match for child care payments exceeding the 75th percentile of the cost of care in the community.
- The final regulations deny states the ability to use JOBS funding in specific target areas for at-risk children and families with dependent children (AFDC) to provide any type of classroom training program.
- The Family Support Act allows states to use JOBS funding in specific target areas for at-risk children and families with dependent children (AFDC) to provide any type of classroom training program. However, state officials who have had contact with DHHS have been told verbally that DHHS will not look favorably upon any target group waiver requests.

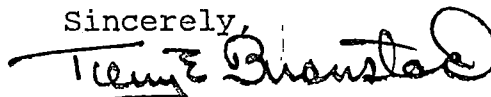

- The Family Support Act did not establish minimum hours of participation. However, DHHS has arbitrarily regulated that JOBS clients must be participating at least 20 hours a week in order to be included in the formula that determines if a state can receive enhanced match for its JOBS program. This requirement appears to be specifically designed to prohibit states from using classroom training as a component in the JOBS program.

I encourage you to influence the revision of these regulations. Additional information on each of these points is included in the attached copy of a letter from the Chair of Iowa's Council on Human Services to the state's congressional delegation.

Thank you in advance for your efforts on our behalf.
