Dear Mr. Sununu:

Thank you for taking time to look over the "Cammex Engine" report sent to you by Lucille Lagasse. I appreciate the extra time you have taken to share the report with others in the White House.

A healthy economy is the most prudent way to pay the environmental bills. I believe the "Environmental Engine" made in America, with worldwide proprietary rights "held" in America, can play an important role to insure continued U.S. economic health and growth.

As you know positive economic growth can be accomplished if higher disposable income "and" increased state and federal tax revenues could occur at the same time. Yet, that is a difficult combination to find. Growth

would also be stimulated if a simultaneous increase in exports developed. Can these things be accomplished together? I believe they can.

One other ingredient accelerates economic growth, and is perhaps the one which is the most needed, a "Positive National Attitude". This all important component has been eroding for 3 or 4 decades. It is created in peacetime from things like Edison's "phonograph" and "electric lamp", the saga of Henry Ford and the "working-man's automobile" and Charles Lindbergh's "Spirit of St. Louis". These are things that working people can comprehend and sit around the dinner table or at the coffee shop and discuss with American pride. Lately, technology has been far above the level of daily thought. If the average high school graduate has difficulty pointing out Washington D.C. on a map of North America, he or she surely isn't talking detail to Mom and Dad about "Super Computers", "Super Conductors" or "Super Colliders". Not that these things are not important, quite the opposite. It's just that working America doesn't talk high tech. There's a "comprehension gap" and a "pride gap".

I have the details of how to fill these gaps and help to accomplish the economic growth goals we all need and want. They are outlined in an executive summary. If you think it is something you would like to consider,

let me know and I will send you a copy.

I am heartened by recent interest in this proposal by respected people around the nation and in Washington. Support continues to grow for this effort to develop a "Positive National Attitude". This "Positive National Attitude" excitement comes from the "Environmental Engine" an "American Engine", made only in America, having superior efficiency and emission quality, and exported around the world.

As a political leader you can appreciate the effects of increased per capita disposable income, increased state and federal tax revenue and increased American exports. Having them simultaneously as a result of this new engine concept would have a positive effect on economic growth.

As an engineer you can appreciate how this can be accomplished with the ability to independently manipulate small segments of the relationship of piston position to crank angle. This relationship is key to thermodynamic, volumetric and mechanical efficiency. The ability to control these cycle dynamics allow the "Environmental Engine" to have the potential for "High Efficiency" and "Clean Air". I hope my report sent to you by Lucille Lagasse has provided a good initial understanding of the invention

and its merits. Now that "Clean Air" engine technology is on the table, implementation is the next step. I believe this concept can help you to improve economic growth, improve environmental conditions, reduce foreign oil dependence and inspire the "grass roots" national pride. Your leadership is needed to take that next step.

On a recent trip to Washington I met with a number of people to ask for their support. Several Senators have taken an interest in this technology because of its potential for "Clean Air". The Chief Patent Counsel for Chrysler Corporation and a senior technical advisor at the Pentagon have the engine report under review. I have asked each of them to send a letter in support of continued development of this technology to Mr. George Lewett and Dr. Richard Bartholomew at the Office of Energy Related Inventions. I have been working to obtain a \$50,000 grant through this agency. The solicitation (evaluation #25368) is in the second stage of evaluation and a final decision will be made in the near term. I would appreciate it very much if you would write a letter in support of continued development of the Environmental Engine to Mr. Lewett and Dr. Bartholomew. Their favorable response would allow Brackett Research to continue development and publish a technical paper on the engine's thermodynamic and mechanical relationship. I believe this would lead to further support in favor of building a well designed prototype with the integrity required for testing at


the National Combustion Laboratory. These are crucial steps which need to be accomplished before widespread acceptance and commercialization of this technology can be realized.

I am encouraged by recent events and look forward to continued development of the "American Environmental Engine".

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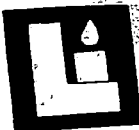

Dear Governor Sununu:

Amid all of the actions, decisions and climatic events in the daily calendar of our President, the National Day of Prayer carries far more influence than perhaps any of us realize. Thank you for your encouragement to President Bush to observe this day. The visible involvement of the President is an encouragement to Governor and Mayor observances around the nation.

Reports are continuing to come in, but so far I can tell you that 7,000 people participated in San Antonio, hundreds of gatherings took place in churches, numerous mayor and governor prayer breakfasts were held, and many gathered at Candlestick Park in San Francisco.

It is difficult to attract the attention of the media for events such as this because, at the present time, prayer is not considered newsworthy. We hope to hire a media consultant next year, who will enable us to gain higher visibility. The Christian media, magazines, radio, and television are very supportive and will carry reports of the breakfast in the White House, as well as events of the day nationwide.

The National Day of Prayer is extremely important, in my opinion, because:

1. As a nation, we have the opportunity to emphasize the National Day of Prayer as a means of acknowledging and honoring God.
2. This day provides opportunity to remember and observe our biblical roots.
3. It is a legitimate day to teach and acknowledge our biblical heritage in every area of society, especially in our schools.
4. With prayer and Bible reading removed from our schools, it is important that we use this day to declare the biblical focus for our country.

Dear Governor Sununu:

The Management Association of Illinois has a state-wide membership of over 2000 employers engaged in manufacturing, service, warehousing, and retail businesses as well as several non-profit associations. Many of our members are federal contractors and have Affirmative Action Plans as required by E.O. 11246. Many more have pro-active employee relations policies that embrace the goals and objectives of equal employment opportunity. This Association and our members solidly stand behind the spirit and purpose of existing equal employment opportunity legislation. These are not at issue.

The Civil Rights Act, 1990 victimizes three groups in order to satisfy the greed of the plaintiffs' trial bar and has little or nothing to do with employment discrimination reform. We expect strong White House leadership to oppose the passage of this legislation (S.2104/H.B.4000). The three groups victimized are (1) employers but particularly small and medium sized employers, (2) employment discrimination claimants, and (3) the public.

The design of the proposed legislation is to prolong the litigation process by lengthening the time for filing charges of discrimination and law suits. It imposes on employers virtually impossible burdens of proof which are placed on employers by non-causal statistical evidence. The net effect is plaintiffs are not expected to prove discrimination; only the suspicion of such. The burden then falls on the employer to prove that none of its employment practices contributes to discrimination.

The burden of the legislation on the employer is the threat of jury trials, compensatory and punitive damages which have not been available to claimants under Title VII, CRA of 1964 as amended. The extorsive effect of the legislative design of CRA of 1990 upon smaller employers is obvious. Maybe larger companies can fund the process but not the smaller companies which make up the overwhelming majority of commercial and not-for-profit employing organizations. They are the first victims.

The second victims of CRA of 1990 are the claimants. For 25 years their charges have been resolved through conciliation efforts of the Equal Employment Opportunity Commission or similar state agencies. With few exceptions, conciliation has served all interests well. Victims of discrimination have been made whole and extensive remedial employment procedures have been effected under court supervision. The CRA will sweep away conciliation, substituting litigation. The already clogged court system where plaintiffs wait for jury trials for as long as five to seven years will become totally grid-locked. These employees cannot wait that long. But with contingent fees driven by the greed of punitive damages, complainant-employees will be the ones to suffer.

The third victim is the general public and consumers. These are the persons who will pay the cost of the CRA of 1990 in terms of higher prices for products, services and taxes to pay for court rooms and an expanded judiciary. Tort reform is already a major issue because of the adverse economic effects of punitive damages, it is not too smart for Congress to endorse an expanded role for punitive damages and litigation. Employer-employee relations need less, not more, adversarial conduct.

By definition, punitive damages are vindictive and the antithesis of the healing, remedial process of conciliation and, indeed, the very purpose of the CRA of 1964. The CRA of 1990 will undo the successes of the CRA of 1964 and affirmative action under E. O. 11246 with greed driven compensatory and punitive damages and litigation. The only beneficiaries are members of the plaintiffs' trial bar.


I am sure you continue to maintain an interest in the currently lively public affairs process in New Hampshire despite your far more global preoccupations in Washington.



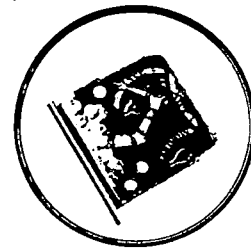


On behalf of the Yale Political Union, I have the honor of inviting you to keynote a student debate at Yale this fall.

Enclosed is a letter that the Chairman of the FBI/UCR Advisory Board sent to the Director of the Federal Bureau of Investigation in an effort to save the UCR program from the budget meat axes being wealded by the bureaucrats in Washington, D.C. Crime statistics, crime information and crime reporting are not the colorful, gutsy stuff that gains headlines, but it is just the information that helps us do a better job in law enforcement administration. I am sure those persons within the beltway will raise the issue that the Bureau of Criminal Justice Statistics Victimization Survey provides better information of crimes than the UCR. The difficulty is you are comparing two different instruments.

UCR has emerged over 60-years to provide a wealth of information for the guidance of law enforcement and the Criminal Justice System throughout the Nation. It needs to continue.

To discontinue this expenditure in the F.B.I.'s budget would not make sense, nor would it make any sense to ask the F.B.I. to absorb this expense by reducing its budget in some other area. If we are going to hold crime in check, and continue our war on substance abuse, law enforcement requires information to assure sound administration for the support of the detectives and police officers who are making the arrests and handling crime and substance abuse problems. As a Chief of a small City and a small State, the UCR information provides vital statistical information upon which to justify our budget requirements, and to demonstrate the efficacy of our policing efforts.

I hope you can support the continued funding of the UCR Program without reducing some other program within the Federal Bureau of Investigation budget. UCR is as necessary today as it was 60-years ago.

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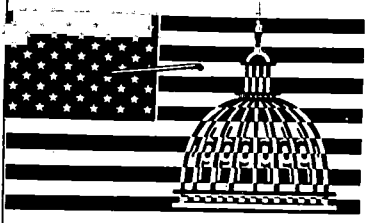

Dear Gov. Sununu:

I am writing to express my thanks for the clarification you sent me concerning the funding of the National Endowment for the Arts. IFA is thankful that the administration, and NEA Chairman John Frohnmayer, have gone on record as being opposed to funding obscenity with tax dollars. These issues are in flagrant violation of the Bible and they go against the Judeo-Christian ethics on which this country was founded.

However, several other matters concern me and thousands of members of IFA who want to support you and President Bush in prayer but are puzzled by recent White House actions. You yourself encouraged us to "be confrontational" at a White House briefing some weeks ago, so here goes.

As President of IFA, I was aghast--like other pro-family leaders--to read that leading homosexual activists were invited to the White House bill signing ceremony for the Hate Crimes Statistics Act several weeks ago. Never before in U.S. history had practicing homosexuals actually been invited as a "minority" group to the White House for any reason. While I agree that we all must work to end the evils of discrimination, it is another thing altogether to give one group official recognition, credibility and almost a kind of "preference." Especially when that group is an affront to million's of law-abiding Americans--biblically, morally and personally.

Victimization does not warrant an invitation to the White House for a bill signing ceremony. In fact, the homosexual community has called this bill signing ceremony "historic," and is using this event as a means of promulgating and legitimizing their lifestyle. Again, we are saddened that the White House has for whatever reason lended its imprimatur to a so-called minority group morally offensive to pro-family groups like IFA. Where do you draw the line? Will the Nazis, the Klu Klux Klan, or the likes of a Louis Farrakhan be the next to grace the White House?

If not them, then why anti-family gays?

I am also puzzled as to what religious groups were invited to the signing ceremony? As you are no doubt aware, it has become quite fashionable to engage in anti-Christian bigotry and bias. There is an all-out war against Christian images and beliefs. Whether this is done by producing blasphemous and biased television shows and movies, or displaying pictures (some call this art?) of Jesus Christ immersed in urine or by invading St. Patrick's Cathedral in New York and tossing condoms about and desecrating the communion elements, few government officials seem willing to openly and strongly condemn these actions. It is as if many top officials sworn to uphold the principles of our founding documents have forgotten what those principles are, or have chosen to follow new ones, no matter how nebulous or ephemeral they may be. We are praying and hoping that the Bush administration will take a stronger posture demonstrating it intends to uphold the formative Judeo-Christian ethics in America.

Additionally, you might recall during a meeting several months ago with evangelical leaders that many Christian and pro-family organizations are having an increasingly difficult time mustering the grass-roots to support President Bush's initiatives. And when people see President Bush honoring the androgynous pop star Michael Jackson as "Entertainer of the Decade," it is no wonder they feel this way. The kind of message and role model this has presented to the teens of America is a sell-out and set-back to many groups trying to wean teens away from cheap values, empty show and toward high moral ground and noble values.

I no longer know how to present all of this to our grass-roots members and readers across America. They are writing and calling in every day, asking why the Bush administration has done this or done that. Who advised the President in these decisions, etc? What do I tell them? Any answers from your end are welcome.

The membership of IFA appreciates your strong leadership and service, and I want you to know that many are praying for you to have wisdom in these days of dynamic change and unparalleled opportunity. I am trusting that you, and President Bush, consider this heartfelt petition in upcoming days.

Dear Governor Sununu:

I am not opposed to paying more taxes, but neither do I favor rewarding profligacy. It seems to me that Congress has consistently breached its fiduciary responsibility to all taxpayers and citizens. Until such time as Congress spends funds entrusted to it more wisely, equity alone dictates that we have every right to expect them to do with what they have. Many of our federal programs are counterproductive; many represent narrow interests and create a breeding ground for fraud and abuse. Our farm parity program is a fiscal disgrace. Pork barrel attachments to legitimate spending bills are far too numerous, and the management of Congress and the government is so bloated that only waste and inefficiency can result.


I don't believe I am an economic Neanderthal, and I have always had reservations about those who prayed to the supply side as the ultimate solution to our fiscal problems. Over the years I have favored and proposed the adoption of the line item veto. However, in absence of same, it appears to me that the President has awesome power via the existing veto mechanism. He should simply go to the American people, itemize his specific reasons for vetoing a particular bill and, for emphasis, indicate its sponsors. In my opinion President Reagan should have vetoed far more legislation than he did. I am glad to see that President Bush is a little more active in that area.

There is no question that our government income statement needs fixing. History has shown that pre-election promises are generally hollow. Unfortunately, many made after elections, particularly with regard to reducing deficits, also turn out to be empty.

Addressing the issue of taxes in isolation, even with the best intent, is symptomatic of a larger problem: reassessing the long term role of government and the future of this country in a more competitive economic environment. In my opinion it would be shortsighted and counterproductive to address tax policy changes without comprehending their effect on our competitive status and our military and diplomatic commitments.

Lastly, discussing taxes without addressing the issue of Social Security emphasizes the "hostage" effect our graying population has on this country.


Since our government will be sponsoring a similar enterprise, ("Citizens Democracy Corps"), I believe I can be of great help in its organization, administration and execution.


Dear Mr. Sununu:


Here in the Sixth Congressional District, I am engaged in a tough fight against incumbent Barbara Boxer, a knee-jerk liberal Democrat. I have the community background to outflank her on the environment and use other issues to put her on the defensive. I am a conservative Republican.

However, one issue is a litmus test for the support of Northern California voters: off-shore drilling. No one can be elected without being for a ban. Apart from this political reality, I also recognize the fragile ecosystem in the two tracts off the Northern California Coast, where a year ago the President suspended drilling. I do not advocate a ban on both Coasts or even the California Coast. The North Coast, however, must be protected.

Please recommend to the President that the suspension on drilling be made permanent. Otherwise, believe me, President Bush will not be able to establish credibility here as the "Environmental President." From Monterey, North to the Oregon border, the President lost all but one county in the 1988 election. 

Dear Dr. Sununu:

I have observed your political career, from across the river in Maine, with more than common interest. I well remember the period in the late sixties when you served as faculty advisor to the Iota Tetarton Chapter of Phi Sigma Kappa at Tufts. I was a member at that time, although I must admit that my most vivid recollection is the excruciatingly embarrassing evening when you and your wife arrived in response to a dinner invitation that our chapter president had unaccountably failed to communicate to the rest of the Brotherhood.

I am writing now in hope that you can be of assistance to three small Maine and New Hampshire towns. I am a member of the School Committee in Acton, Maine. Acton is a town of fewer than 2000 souls, but currently very active in the educational arena. Our School Volunteer program was recently the recipient of President Bush's 117th "Point of Light" recognition, and we have under construction an addition which will triple the size of our K-8 school. This was in response to explosive enrollment growth in the past few years, growth which will reach the high school level by the middle of the decade. We currently send our secondary students to Wells, 30 miles away on the coast, which has expressed reluctance to continue the arrangement in the face of a projected doubling of Acton students.

For the last eighteen months we have been involved in discussions with our neighbors to the west, Wakefield and Milton, N. H., relative to establishing a new high school for the three communities. As you may be aware, a Maine-New Hampshire Interstate School Compact exists on the books of both states, having been enacted by the two legislatures and signed into law in the late 1960's. Unfortunately it was never submitted to the U.S. Congress for the required ratification until early this year. Senator Mitchell and

Representative Snowe (curiously - we're not in her district) have been extremely supportive. It appears that Senator Rudman, however, is in receipt of an unknown number of letters in opposition to the ratification, and his support is essential.

I would like to make two points. First, ratification of the Interstate Compact in no way commits anyone to any ultimate course of action. It merely establishes a legal framework for co-operation among the three communities. Actual establishment of an Intestate School District is at the pleasure of the voters of the three towns and the two State Boards of Education. Eventual construction of a high school would require further action by the voters to bond the project. Given the long road still ahead, I am sure you appreciate our need for early congressional action. Second, while actual support for building a high school is problematic at this time, there has been enormous support in all three towns for joint action. Wakefield and Milton have twice voted overwhelmingly to form a New Hampshire Co-operative School District, first in conjunction with Middleton, and again between themselves when Middleton withdrew. Acton has voted unanimously at two town meetings, first to seek approval of the Interstate Compact, and again to fund its share of the planning costs. Voters in the newly formed Branch River Co-operative School District have appropriated funds to continue the planning process. Perhaps most impressive, Mr. Carl Sieman of Milton has donated an ideal 80-acre site bordering the state line for the purpose of a district high school.

At last night's meeting of the Branch River Board, the members authorized a major campaign of letters and petitions to attempt to communicate to Senator Rudman the wide support for the ratification. Unfortunately, the current session of Congress is slipping away. A delay into next January would add a full year to our most optimistic timetable for this badly needed project.

I wonder if there is anything you could do to impart to Senator Rudman the concern and dismay of so many people in Wakefield, Milton and Acton over this delay. I realize that this falls rather far outside of your current scope, but I hope to take advantage of your longstanding commitment to the people of New Hampshire. If I can provide you with any further information, I am at your service.

Dear John:

It was good to meet you at the John Carroll Society dinner. Your remarks were deeply appreciated by many of us who are looking to public officials for truth and public commitment to their private convictions. As you suggested, public officials have the responsibility to use all appropriate means to "impose their views" when those views are principled and directed at "the common good."

As you know from our previous correspondence, I am now working to do what I can to revitalize the private sectors in the poor, debt-burdened nations of Latin America, Africa and Asia. The Debt-for-Development Coalition, with whom our Foundation, is associated is assisting private, not-for-profit institutions to utilize the debt swap mechanism to finance educational, social, environmental and humanitarian projects in the "Third World." We have found the Coalition is well staffed, dedicated and experienced in the banking and development fields.

Although the media has focused most of the attention on debt-for-nature swaps, there have been over \$106 million in "development" swaps, including education, compared to approximately \$26 million in debt-for-nature. These swaps bring the dynamism of the private sector in this country into close working relationships with the private sectors in the developing nations. In the long run, these linkages will provide the foundations for development.

The President and his Chief of Staff are living testimony to the power of education and commitment to values. As I understand he is planning a trip to one of the largest debtor nations, Brazil, later this year I thought that you may wish to be informed about an initiative that is about to open up the possibility of major debt-for-development swaps in Brazil.

The Executive Director of the Debt-for-Development Coalition, Dr. John Ross, just returned from a trip to Brazil during which he met with senior officials of the new Collar Government. This trip culminated in a press conference given by the Ministry of Agriculture to announce the agreement to establish a debt swap program that will link Brazilian entities with U.S. Universities and other entities to modernize Brazilian agriculture. Additional swap programs are of interest to the President of Brazil to raise the standards of living in the 100 poorest communities in Brazil and planning is underway to assist the President in achieving his goals.

The Coalition has formed an informal group of prestigious U.S. institutions interested in joining this effort. (See attached) This is definitely an exciting initiative, one which the President may wish to encourage on his forthcoming trip. The initiative could become one of the international "points of light"; it could bring together the talents of the private sector to address one of the most pressing environmental issues of the day, the destruction of the rain forests in Brazil, in a collaborative linkage with the largest nation to our South, both in terms of population and size.

If you find this as interesting as I do and would like further information, John Ross and I would be happy to meet with you or members of your staff prior to the trip of the President to Brazil.

On behalf of our members, who operate poultry farms in New Hampshire and throughout New England, I am writing to request your opposition to a proposal by the U.S. Food and Drug Administration which would ban gentian violet from use as a mold inhibitor in poultry feed.

Gentian violet has been shown to prevent the growth of aflatoxin, the most potent carcinogen known to man, about which there has been serious concern since the drought-affected corn crop of 1988 was found in some instances to contain unsafe levels of this form of mold.

If gentian violet is removed from the market by FDA during the warm months ahead, considerable amounts of poultry feed will be found unusable, with resulting economic loss to poultry farmers. The FDA appears to believe that propionic acid can be substituted as a mold inhibitor in poultry feed. However, actual experience has shown this not to be the case. Only gentian violet provides adequate insurance against mold growth.

The FDA appears to be acting on the basis of theoretical concerns which are more than countered by recent data reviews by eminent toxicologists, who find that gentian violet is a very safe compound.

11 We specifically ask that the Office of Management and Budget require that this proposal be considered a major rule change, requiring (by statute) an in-depth study of economic impact.

Economists estimate that the banning of gentian violet would increase the production costs of eggs by at least 2 cents/dozen, which will result in cost increases of 4-5 cents/dozen to consumers and, when combined with similar increases for chicken and turkey producers and consumers, result in a cost of over \$300 million to the U.S. economy. FDA calculations at a much lower level are based on the assumption that there are adequate substitutes for gentian violet. This assumption is incorrect.

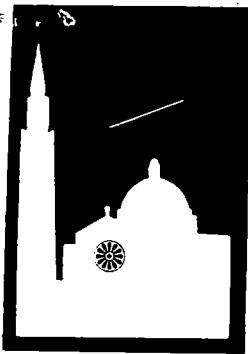

Dear Governor Sununu:

Our firm serves as the International Trade Consultant to the Society of the Plastics Industry, Inc. In that capacity we have organized trade missions, trade exhibitions and introduced potential venture partners in China. We follow the economic and political developments in that country with great interest.
