Dear Governor Sununu:

Thank you for coming to St. Louis last Thursday, April 26th, with the Cabinet members and visiting us in St. Louis in support of the National Governors Conference. I particularly enjoyed the opportunity to meet you and our exchange over dinner concerning the education crisis in our country. I consider myself a conservative Republican; I believe that the Federal Government is not the solution to most of our country's problems, but should only be involved in a partnership with state and local government or fulfill a function in which our state and local government can perform.

My discussion with you on the need for more emphasis on and resources for our education problem is based on my observation of the inability of many of our inner cities to address the educational resources available to those parts of our society. As President of an inner city boys club in St. Louis (Herbert Hoover Boys Club), I am involved in helping to alleviate that problem to the degree possible by raising additional money and hiring social workers to work with single parent families, the schools, and the boys club activities in trying to help these young afro-american boys fulfill their potential. However, I am not sure that is going to be enough, and while national defense requires a federal resource commitment, I believe education also does to some degree and in some manner.

At the end of our conversation, you asked the question, "If I owned a company that made widgets unprofitably, would I keep throwing resources at the widget part of our company?" I agree with you that in most situations you would not throw more money and more resources at the widget division except, when it was determined by management that making that widget profitably and making that widget was necessary for the long term viability, competitiveness and survival of the company.

In my opinion, the education of all of our youth, not just the suburban youth, not just the private school youth (which is where I send my children), but in the poor sections of our country we must find a solution (a profitable solution) to make and keep our country competitive on an international scale. Therefore, in answer to your question -- yes, I do believe that if the widgets our country was making were education for a large part of our underprivileged children, I would keep investing in resources and would find a solution. The Federal Government in partnership with state and local governments must find a better way. Having a Governors Conference to emphasize the education crisis and cheerlead the states to do something about it is a step toward a solution, but it is not enough.

Thanks again for spending your time and energy with us in St. Louis. If I can ever be helpful to you as a private citizen, I would be more than happy to do what I can. My wife and I are particularly impressed with the Bush Administration's focus on the family and how important the family is to our society. We support wholeheartedly this genuine emphasis in the Bush Administration.

Enclosed for your review and retention is a copy of Bethlehem's Report for First Quarter 1990. Bethlehem's reported net income of \$21 million for the First Quarter was 68% lower than our net income for First Quarter 1989. This decline is principally due to a continuation of the slowdown in steel markets which began in the second half of 1989, lower realized prices, and higher operating costs. Bethlehem continues to be a company in transition and certain sections of the Report are marked to indicate areas of progress and concern.

1. Lower Shipments.

Steel shipments were approximately 19% lower in the first quarter of 1990 than in the year earlier period, and our raw steel production declined to 70% of capacity from 82%.

2. Higher Costs.

Production costs at steelmaking operations were higher, reflecting planned outages for relining a blast furnace and modernizing a hot strip mill, plus blast furnace interruptions and coke oven repair projects and start-up costs of a recently modernized tin mill.

3. Competitive Pressures.

Severe market and competitive pressures continue to affect our Rail Products and Pipe Division, our Bar, Rod and Wire Division and our Structural Products Division.

4. Steel Related Operations.

We continued to implement restructuring actions which were initiated in 1989 at the Baltimore Marine and BethForge Divisions, and operating results have improved. In March 1990, our BethForge Division entered into a joint venture for the production of cast rolls with a subsidiary of Usinor-Sacilor, a French steelmaker.

5. Liquidity.

Our cash and cash equivalents declined to \$368 million at the end of the first quarter from \$531 million at year end. The decline resulted from reduced cash provided from operating activities, higher levels of capital spending and pension funding.

6. Capital Expenditures.

Capital expenditures were \$100 million during the first quarter, and we currently estimate that for 1990 capital spending will be about \$500 million compared to \$421 million last year.

7. Pensions.

We contributed an additional \$92 million to our pension fund during the first quarter. Further contributions during the year will be considered as appropriate.

8. Clean Air Legislation.

Legislation is currently pending in Congress that would impose more stringent environmental control requirements under the Clean Air Act. Certain risk-based standards for air toxics could impose significant, unwarranted costs on domestic steelmakers. We continue to work towards reasonable legislation that would not be a major obstacle to maintaining international competitiveness.

9. Outlook.

Steel markets continue to be adversely affected by the slowdown in the domestic economy. However, recent improvements in the order entry rate suggest that 1990 shipments may be higher than our estimated 77 million tons.

We recognize and appreciate your efforts, and those of your Staff. Please let me know if you have any questions, or if we can be of assistance in any way.

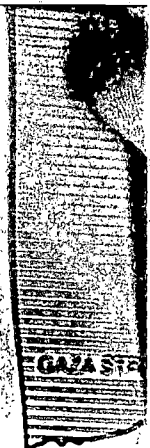
THE KNESSET'S ANNUAL tree-planting ceremony this past Tu b'Shevat became embroiled in political controversy. The planting was to be held in a Jerusalem suburb located across the "Green Line" — the boundary separating Israel's pre-Six-Day War territory from the west bank areas that it captured in that war.

The solution was to hold three separate ceremonies: one within the Green Line, another over the Green Line and a third straddling the line.

This vignette about roots and borders speaks volumes about the nature and symbolism of Israel's internal political debate, but the irony is that the Green Line is absent from virtually all maps printed in the state of Israel. By 1969 it had become government policy to eliminate the line entirely, or any other distinction between the occupied territories and the rest of Israel, from official maps of the state.

Israel's political and geographical maps, road maps, tour books and most of the maps used for fund-raising purposes by Israeli non-profit organizations in the United States do not include the Green Line. By contrast, nearly all maps published in countries that recognize Israel clearly demarcate the west bank and Gaza Strip from the state's pre-1967 borders.

The common Israeli justification for removing the Green Line is that this policy is consistent with the delineation of boundaries after the 1948 War of Independence. After that war, the area under Israeli control was considerably larger than what had been included in the 1947 United Nations partition

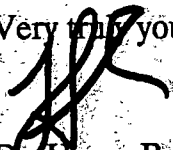
Prime Minister Oduber will be attending the CGCED World Bank meeting in Washington April 24-26.

Enclosed is a 16 x 20" print of "Screaming Eagles". When Ms. Yvonne Alford presented President Bush with my print of "Screaming Eagles" last year, she told me that you really liked it. I would be honored if you would hang it in your office.

Presently, I am faced with a dilemma that I would like to request Pres. Bush's intercession on. The dilemma involves the Park Service at Denali National Park in Alaska. I have applied for a permit twice this year and have been denied because they felt that I didn't meet their criteria. I am a scenic and wildlife freelance photographer. I applied for a ten day permit inside the park this summer so that I can take my own vehicle in and when I see wildlife, I can stop and photograph it, staying as long as I need to in that spot. The Park Service has denied my request based on tear sheets I sent them of the Exxon Valdez oil spill. My tear sheets are of aials of the Exxon Valdez and the Baton Rouge, 48 hours after it went a ground on Bligh Reef. One of my aials is in the National Geographic, January 1990 issue, on page 14. I argued that I met their criteria (which is enclosed) because it was in a series of photos which depict the natural scene and surroundings of Prince William Sound at the time of and subsequent to the grounding of the Exxon Valdez. The single photograph exists within a series of photographs necessary to describe the effect the spill had on Prince William Sound. The Park Service's criteria is such that not even a National Geographic photographer covering that same story would qualify for a permit.

Since I last applied for the permit I have been published several more times, my photographs of the Moose death toll up here are being published in Europe. The problem is that I don't have alternative tear sheets to submit because I have only been doing photography since February of 1988. In fact "Screaming Eagles" were the first photographs I took. This permit is essential to my ability to get the kind of wildlife shots that will allow me to be more marketable and more competitive.

I feel that the Park Service has a vendetta against me and if you would read the copies of letters that have gone back and forth, you'll see why. My Mother, is Rep. Ramona Barnes, (R) and the Park Service isn't thrilled about that either. Sen. Stevens tried to help me and failed. You are my last hope, I really need this permit! If you could do anything to help me in this regard I will be most grateful. As you read the enclosed information, you will no doubt pick up on the other problems wildlife photographers have in the park from the Rangers. The whole situation needs to be addressed really, but I would be satisfied just to receive a permit at this time.

I am going to apply one more time and submit my new tear sheets (enclosed) with three photographs as Ranger Ken Kehrer, Jr., Acting Chief Ranger suggested.

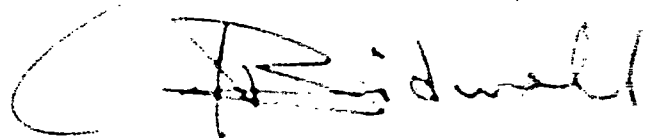
