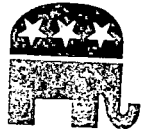

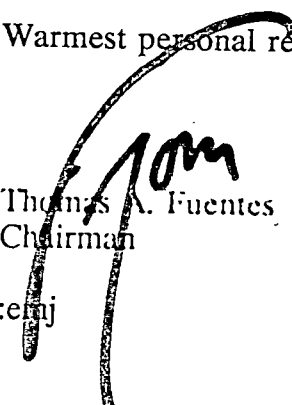

**Avius Virgin Islands Project:
Decision of the U.S. Customs Service**

Sir:

The attached decision by the U.S. Customs Service has caused great harm to the Administration's efforts to rebuild the Virgin Islands economy after the devastation caused by Hurricane Hugo. The decision is arbitrary, contrary to law, misstates the facts, and is in disagreement with prior decisions of the Customs Service. Unfortunately, the remedies afforded by the judicial system are inordinately lengthy and the further delay would be fatal to this project.

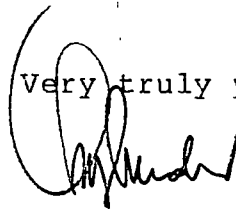
The 12,000 metric tons of specialty steel which would enter the United States from the Virgin Islands is minimal. However, the project would have placed in the Virgin Islands a basic industry, from which others could develop. It would have provided desperately-needed private investment and employment.

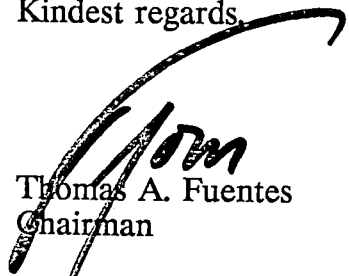

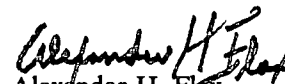

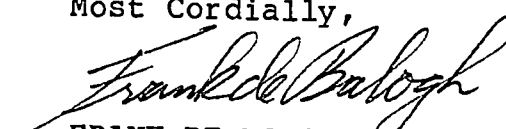

As a follow-up to our conversation at the White House, I wanted to share with you my thoughts on the study of the Federal OCS program by the National Academy of Sciences.

As you know, this study entitled "The Adequacy of Environmental Information" was a component of the President's OCS Task Force which recently made its recommendations for the leasing of certain Federal lands off the coast of California and Florida. In addition, this study was the subject of a Congressional hearing before my subcommittee, Panama Canal/Outer Continental Shelf Subcommittee on November 14, 1989.

During that hearing, the Chairman of our Subcommittee, Congressman Roy Dyson, asked Dr. Arthur Maxwell, the Vice Chairman of the National Academy of Sciences' Environmental Study Committee, whether "Leasing in these areas should be prohibited." Dr. Maxwell responded "No, sir, I am not saying that." In addition, Dr. Maxwell testified that "I do not think it is the Committee's (National Academy of Sciences) prerogative to say whether it is proper to drill in those areas or not. There are many other considerations that must bear on these decisions." In short, despite numerous attempts the National Academy of Sciences repeatedly refused to assert that OCS drilling should not occur off the coast of California and Florida.

Governor, in all honesty, I also find it difficult to imagine how the National Academy of Sciences or anyone could complete a thorough study of the OCS program in only eight months and at a cost of \$300,000. By comparison, the Department of the Interior has been studying the program for over thirty years. During that time they have spent more than \$500 million analyzing every aspect and potential environmental impact of OCS activity.

In addition, I find it odd that the National Academy of Sciences would state that the Department of the Interior's environmental studies are deficient because they have not evaluated the "sociological, cultural, political or psychological" impacts of offshore development.

Governor, this finding is particularly peculiar in light of the fact that the OCS Lands Act Amendments of 1978, P.L. 95-372, does not mention nor mandate that the Secretary of the Interior evaluate these factors.

Instead of spending their limited resources determining whether or not some California or Florida coastal residents may be psychologically affected, it is unfortunate that the Academy did not point out that the continuing real menace to this nation's coastline is not the Federal OCS program but oil tankers, particularly foreign-flag tankers.

Of the 60 largest oil spills that have occurred in the waters of this nation, only one was the result of oil and gas activity and that was over 20 years ago. The remainder were primarily caused by foreign tankers carrying foreign crude oil.

Governor, there has never been a blowout or major oil spill from an exploration well in the history of the Outer Continental Shelf program. In fact, the OCS is our nation's safest energy extraction program.

Finally, I would point out that the National Academy of Sciences has also issued a second report entitled "Evaluation of the Hydrocarbon Resource Estimates for the Offshore Areas of Northern and Southern California and Florida South of the 26th Degree Latitude". In this report the Academy indicates that "extensive and adequate data to support the Government's belief that there could be large, untapped reserves of oil and gas" in these California and Florida offshore areas. Unfortunately, this report has received almost no press attention.

Governor, in the final analysis, I would hope that you would keep in mind that you will never be able to collect or analyze enough data to satisfy certain members of the California and Florida delegation or lay the issue to rest unless the President permanently prohibits all OCS activity off their shores.

By so doing, this action would condemn this nation to an ever-increasing level of dependence on foreign sources of oil and in my view ultimate economic calamity.

Instead, I would hope that the President would advise these members that all efforts will be made to protect the environment but that OCS energy resources are critical to our nation's security.

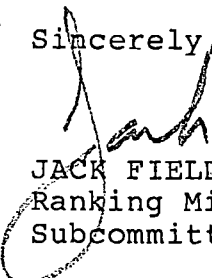
Those Federal OCS lands off the coast of California and Florida belong to the people --- all of the people --- of the United States. After ten years of delays, I think it is time we allowed the people of this nation to enjoy the benefits of the oil and gas resources that may exist on those lands.

Governor, the National Academy of Sciences' study provides some interesting but incomplete conclusions about the Federal OCS program. It is appropriate to give this study some consideration but I hope that you would not just dismiss or ignore thirty years of environmental work by the Department of the Interior and an excellent environmental record. We can have a balanced Federal OCS program which includes both leasing and additional environmental studies designed to identify and to further minimize any impacts from offshore development.

I hope you will seriously consider my views on this most important subject.

The House of Representatives will soon be taking action on national child care legislation. Originally, we, like the President, supported a policy of tax credits without government grants for daycare. However, it now seems inevitable that any final daycare legislation will contain both tax credits and a daycare grant program. In this context, it is important to assure that the daycare grant component of any legislation embody the President's conservative principles.

In particular, it is important that any grant program ensure equal treatment of parents seeking religious daycare. This would be consistent with the promises made by President Bush to the convention of National Religious Broadcasters on January 29, 1990. At that time, the President stated that he would not accept any legislation which restricted the choices of or discriminated against parents seeking religious daycare. Clearly, legislation which subsidizes secular daycare and fails to guarantee parents the option of a voucher for use in religious care would be inconsistent with the President's statements. Such legislation would also economically undermine the religious daycare system since it would force religious daycare providers to compete against federally subsidized secular daycare in the public schools.

I urge the White House to oppose and veto any legislation which does not embody the following principles:

- 1) Any new tax credits must give equal treatment to parents who care for their own children in the home.
- 2) Any legislation should contain no more than minimal federal regulation concerning daycare.
- 3) If the legislation contains funds for a daycare grant program to the states, the grant program must guarantee assisted parents the option of receiving a child care certificate or voucher which will empower the parents to select the child care provided to their children. (This provision is particularly important if the grant program provides federal funds to the states, through Social Service Block Grants, which the states may use to pay for daycare in the public schools; any legislation which expands the role of the public schools in caring for pre-school children should be unacceptable unless it guarantees assisted parents the right to select non public school care through child care vouchers.)
- 4) If the legislation contains funds for a daycare grant program, it must contain explicit language permitting states to allow parents to use the program's vouchers or certificates in facilities which provide children with religious values and instruction.
- 5) If the legislation contains funds for a daycare grant program, religious organizations which receive funds should be able to show preference for members of the faith with respect to employment and should be able to refuse employment to persons whose past or present conduct violates the religious and moral teachings of the organizations.
- 6) If the legislation contains funds for a daycare grant program, the program should not require religious organizations receiving vouchers or certificates to be automatically subject to state secular daycare regulation, if the state does not choose to so regulate the religious organization.

The Senate-passed daycare legislation already contains reasonable provisions concerning religious vouchers as described in principles #3, #4, and #5 above. Senators Hatch and Dodd, in writing to House Democrats, have stated that the guarantee of vouchers to parents is one of the strong points of their bill.

The creation of a national daycare program which guarantees parents choice through vouchers and which assures that vouchers can be used in institutions which provide religious instruction to children would establish an enormous precedent for tuition tax

credits at the grade school level. It would legitimize the idea of parental choice and put liberals soundly on the defensive. The fact that the Democratic Senate overwhelmingly voted for religious voucher provisions in the Senate daycare bill offers a critical window of opportunity on the tuition tax credit issue which will not reoccur for a decade. Failure to carry this opportunity forward into victory would be a tragic setback for conservative policies and American families.

Unfortunately, the House Republican leadership appears willing to abandon these principles in negotiations with Congressman Downey. This position is all the more perplexing since a firm stand on the issues of parental choice and nondiscrimination against religious daycare would be overwhelmingly popular with the public; so popular, in fact, that liberals have been unwilling to publicly oppose these principles.

The issue of tuition tax credits is among the most important to the conservative Christian community. A failure of the White House to stand by the principles outlined in #3 through #6 above would be interpreted by many groups as a clear contradiction of the commitments which the President made before the National Religious Broadcasters and elsewhere. We would not want to see a key constituency which has provided strong support to the President in the past alienated in this manner.

The President has triumphed on the daycare issue whenever he has aggressively stood for conservative principles. I hope the White House will support the principles outlined above in any negotiations over daycare legislation.

Enclosed is an album of the 25-cent Ida B. Wells stamp issued today in Chicago, Illinois.

Ida B. Wells was born to slaves in Holly Springs, Mississippi, in 1862. She was educated there in a freedmen's school and became a teacher herself by age fourteen. She later moved to Memphis, Tennessee, where she attended Fisk University and continued to teach until 1891 when she was removed from her post by the Memphis school board because of her involvement in a lawsuit arising from her refusal to surrender her seat in a "whites only" railroad car.

Ms. Wells turned to journalism and bought an interest in the *Memphis Free Speech*. She later wrote for the *New York Age* and the *Conservator*, and, in 1895, published a detailed work on lynching, titled *A Red Record*. Her passionate opposition to lynching had been stirred three years earlier when three of her friends were killed by a mob.

Devoted to bringing the injustices of discrimination to the forefront of the social conscience, she pioneered in organizing to gain equality for Black Americans, serving as secretary of the National Afro-American Council and as first president of the Negro Fellowship League in Chicago. She also took part in the 1909 meeting of the Niagara movement which led to the founding of the National Association for the Advancement of Colored People.

I hope you enjoy this album.

I understand that procedure. If I were your assistant, that's likely how I would have handled the letter.

Unfortunately, I did a poor job in drafting it. I erred in failing to make explicit the President's stake in all this.

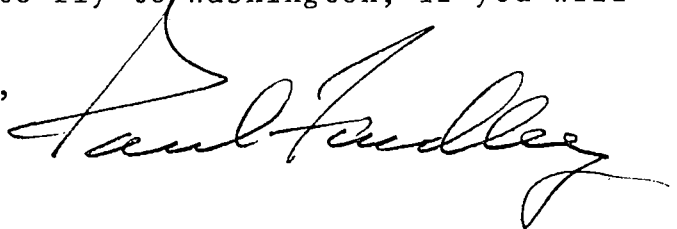
I reiterate my strong recommendation that you quickly direct the Mr. Mark Edelman, administrator of AID, to rescind the removal order. It is clear that Mr. Edelman views BIFAD as an institution of little importance and bothersome to boot.

To the contrary, BIFAD is vitally important to the advancement of the President's program to solve the world hunger problem. Out of 22 years' experience in Congress and over six years on BIFAD, I am absolutely convinced that BIFAD plays a vital role in marshalling the great U.S. institutions of higher education to the challenge. It represents the very best hope for ending famine and malnutrition worldwide. To do its job, BIFAD is often a burr under the AID saddle. It must remain so.

In the next few months, President Bush will install a new Administrator of AID. He will also select a new chairman and appoint four of the six other members of BIFAD. By July 1, it will become truly a Bush Administration board.

Please don't let Mr. Edelman destroy BIFAD before President Bush's team takes over. BIFAD is the product of the late Senator Hubert Humphrey's vision and my hard work. I know it is worth saving and am eager to fly to Washington, if you will receive me, to plead my case.

This is a note to express my appreciation for your consideration last December of the position of the Postal Service in opposing a last minute reservation to the terminal dues provision of the Universal Postal Convention.

I firmly believe that the Universal Postal Union's (UPU) decision on this issue was to the benefit of the U.S. mailing public and was not at all anticompetitive. The U.S. Postal Service supported this decision because it has a statutory mandate to support the interest of the U.S. mailing public.

I am aware of the continuing interest of other federal agencies in this issue and, if you think it would be helpful, I would be pleased to arrange a briefing for your staff on where matters stand, on prospective developments in the UPU, and on the role and responsibilities of the Postal Service in shaping these developments.

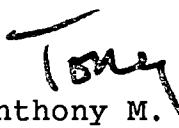
Please be assured that the Postal Service remains open to input from other federal agencies on future developments with respect to the terminal dues issue and that it will continue to brief interested agencies on such developments.

Last year we were privileged to have former President Ronald Reagan as our speaker. I mention this so you can sense the caliber of persons who address us.

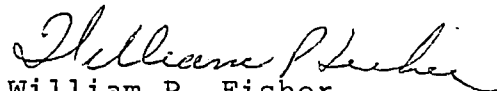

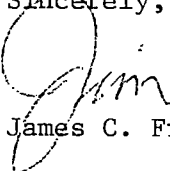

The growth "cap" was included in the President's Clean Air Act Amendments purportedly to ensure the support of the Environmental Defense Fund.

As you know, the "cap", together with the permitting, enforcement and alternative fuels provisions were, and still are, the major concerns industry identified in the President's bill. Notwithstanding these significant concerns, the Clean Air Working Group worked hard to secure cosponsors for H. R. 3030. To my knowledge, the Environmental Defense Fund did not secure a single cosponsor for this legislation, despite having endorsed it.

In that light, I thought you might be interested in viewing the attached videotape of an appearance I shared with Fred Krupp of the EDF and Senator Reid of Nevada. Watching it, an uninformed viewer would think that CAWG was a defender of the President's bill, and that EDF was instead endorsing the much more onerous, inflexible and expensive Senate bill, S. 1630.

At the very least, it appears that EDF does not feel its endorsement of the Administration bill prevents them from advocating more extreme proposals. With friends like these, who needs enemies?

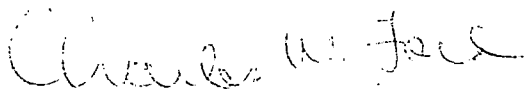

It appears to me that we, the United States, should be offering our services to assist these former Communist governments to rewrite their Codes of Law.

We know that without laws governing democratic societies, progress will not be realized. Perhaps your Administration has already established contact with legal authorities in Poland, Hungary, Czechoslovakia, Bulgaria and Roumania to undertake this task. This offer on the part of the Bush Administration would add another link in the chain of collaboration with these newly liberated countries.

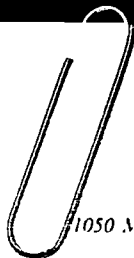

Dear Governor Sununu:

I intrude upon your busy schedule to call attention to an administrative decision that may do serious damage to the President's program for combatting world hunger and malnutrition.

It relates to the Board for International Food and Agricultural Development on which I have served for six years. (You will recall our earlier correspondence about the possibility of Dr. Jean Mayer serving as a member).

BIFAD is the only presidentially-appointed institution in the Agency for International Development. It has been fighting an important and, at times, frustrating, battle to advance the President's program. It is, I fear, about to be moved to oblivion. The acting administrator, Ambassador Mark Edelman, who, of course, could not be expected to be fully aware of the board's history, mandate and responsibility, has directed that the board offices and staff be removed from the State Department building and relocated in a building elsewhere. He responds, of course, to never-ending pressures for more office space for senior officials.

This may, at first glance, seem like a small matter. In my view, it is not. BIFAD has a legislative mandate to share with the administrator of the agency the development, execution and oversight of AID programs related to world hunger and famine. It is not just an advisory board. It has co-responsibility with the administrator in a number of vital areas and must deal personally and frequently with the administrator and with his senior staff.

There are times, I am sure, when the leadership of AID becomes upset with BIFAD's efforts to influence decision. Maybe BIFAD is sometimes viewed as a nuisance, because, in carrying out our

presidential and legislative mandates, we often challenge what is being planned or done. That's our job. We would be neglecting our duty to the President if we did not.

The removal of BIFAD offices would impose a physical handicap in meeting these duties. Still worse, it would be interpreted in a profoundly negative way, I fear, by the AID bureaucracy and the university community with which the board deals on a broad and continuing basis. If this presidentially-appointed board is, so to speak, cast into Siberia, why pay any attention to it? If the removal is effected, BIFAD will be seriously crippled.

I sincerely believe, Governor, you will be serving the President's vital interests if you should direct a suspension of the removal order until the decision can be carefully reviewed by your staff.
