Dear Governor Sununu:

I understand that on a recent trip Carla Hills briefly discussed with you Allied-Signal's 301 Petition for relief from Japanese targeting of our amorphous metals technology. I am writing to provide some additional background and to request your support in safeguarding the American stake in this critical area.

Allied-Signal's current world leadership in amorphous metals is the result of a fifteen year, \$200 million investment. With amorphous metals, we have pioneered both an entirely new process technology and developed a significant new product. The process technology involves direct casting of metal sheet with substantial capital and operating cost advantages over conventional processing.

Our product technology includes new metallurgical structures with vitally enhanced properties and uses. Of these the most immediate and dramatic is energy conservation. Transformer cores of "Metglas" (our amorphous metal trade name) save as much as 70% of the energy lost by conventional silicon steel transformers. Full employment of Metglas transformers would save 2% of the total energy generated in the United States -- in effect, one free week of electricity every year. A variety of other applications -- high performance alloys, high yield solders, flexible brazing materials -- have already been commercialized. Others are being explored.

Our company has been extremely successful in selling amorphous metals in the United States and other nations. Energy-poor Japan would seem a natural market.

Nonetheless, eight years of intensive effort conducted through a joint venture with Mitsui and headed by Ryusuke Hasegawa, a U.S. citizen who grew up on Japan and is a co-inventor of amorphous metal, have hit a stone wall.

The reason, it now seems clear, is that our efforts collided with a classic Japanese targeting conspiracy. The full details of the targeting are laid out in the 301 Petition which I enclose. Some of the highlights include:

- o Delays of 11 and 12 years in granting Allied-Signal's Japanese patents, one of which will now expire in 1993;
- o Exploitation of our technology which became public in Japan only 18 months after we filed for Japanese patents;
- o Large subsidies by a government agency, the Japan Research and Development Corporation (JRDC) to Japanese steel companies to develop amorphous metals;
- o Pressure by JRDC on Allied-Signal to license our technology to Japanese companies on unfavorable terms and support by JRDC for those companies to circumvent Allied-Signal patents;
- o Refusal by all Japanese electric utilities to buy amorphous metal for transformers despite its clear superiority.

The net result is that Japanese steel companies are developing full-scale amorphous metal production capacity on the basis of Allied-Signal technology, through JRDC subsidies, and free from import competition. We can document that this has occurred under the overall direction of MITI, JRDC and other agencies of the Japanese Government.

Obviously there is much at stake for Allied-Signal in the resolution of this problem. But its implications go far beyond the interests of one company. Product leadership was long one of the pillars of America's

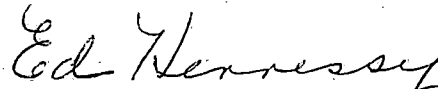

economic strength. Our experience with amorphous metals is a virtual textbook case of how to achieve such leadership. All of the elements are there: a research and engineering breakthrough in a critical technology, commercial applicability in essential industries such as aerospace, energy, and electronics, a marketing strategy keyed to the needs and business practices of potential customers. Yet all of this could be irrelevant if the Japanese tactics succeed. If the United States is to play a leadership role in the critical technologies of the future, the kind of targeting we have undergone in amorphous metals cannot be tolerated.

I hope we can count on your support as our petition moves through the 301 process. Naturally I am available to discuss the issue further or answer any questions you may have.

I have enclosed a sample sheet of our amorphous metal alloy. I would like to personally deliver to you in the next couple of weeks a larger sample in the form of a paper weight.

Dear John:

I think you know how much I appreciate your personal involvement in seeking a solution to the textile import problem. At our meeting in your office with Carla Hills, I was heartened to observe the commitment that both of you have shown in trying to work out an acceptable result for textiles in the Uruguay Round.

I was also gratified to hear the assurance that the Administration does not plan to "trade off" textile interests to achieve other negotiating objectives.

As we discussed, the U.S. textile and apparel industry continues to suffer due to further increases in imports. The record level of imports in 1989, the falling domestic orders, and the lowest employment level in 44 years in the U.S. apparel industry make it all the more urgent that an effective remedy be found.

I commend you and the President for including in our Uruguay proposal the framework for a global quota. A global quota tying import growth to the growth of the domestic market is essential if the domestic textile and apparel industry, and its workers, are to continue be a major manufacturing sector in our country.

The other points that we have discussed are also vitally important. Stronger rules must be negotiated to deal with unfair trade practices of foreign countries. A better mechanism is needed to give the U.S. industry relief from injurious imports once the global quotas are no longer in effect. The current levels of textile and apparel tariffs must be maintained since the Multi-Fiber Arrangement will no longer be in effect when the global quotas expire.

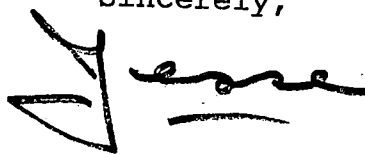
And lastly, the Administration must insist on real, significant opening of the many markets that now prohibit or restrict U.S. exports of textiles and apparel.

I urge that you make sure that these points become the elements of the U.S. "bottom line" in the negotiations in Geneva. My support for the Uruguay Round implementing legislation -- and, I am confident, the support of others in the Congress -- is contingent upon an acceptable resolution of these issues.

I am convinced that the domestic industry has moved in a very significant way to accommodate the desire of the Administration to bring textile trade under the GATT rules. With your personal support and involvement, and that of Ambassador Hills, I am confident that a lasting, effective solution to the import problem can be found.

You've been most helpful, my friend, and I just wanted you to know that I am deeply grateful.

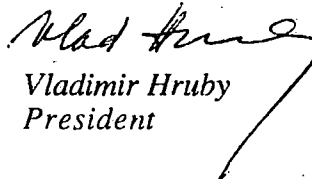
Dear Dr. Sununu:

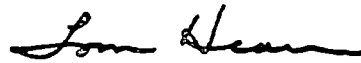

Dear John,

We watch with great interest and a feeling of understanding the reports of your various activities in the White House. I want you to know that in almost every case we understand and support strongly the stands you have taken, both in public and in the reported advice and positions that you have recommended to President Bush. They have been measured and highly thoughtful stands--of course not compatible with the somewhat extremist stands taken by well-recognized liberal groups!

I'd like to comment on a few of these issues. First: China. I think that Bush has taken exactly the right course in keeping contact with and gradually re-opening our intercourse with that nation. In my view, the student actions in Tienamen Square were totally stupid, almost designed to bring on a violent reaction from the government. The government was well launched on a gradual liberalization process, and the student actions to force a great leap into total democracy were ones that could not be countenanced at this time. It is too big a country and too slow moving for such a move. I think Bush has to recognize the realities of the situation: it's too bad we're back to ground zero in regard to China, but that's the way it is.

Next: the Environment.

The whole environmental movement is a political movement to anyone observing closely. Every front that they are amking big political and publicity moves on, such as acid rain, automobile regulation, global warming and others has very little scientific basis for huge government outlays, or private outlays for that matter. Of course we should be moving toward cleaner air and cleaner water that need to be long run topics over the next decades. However, to create a crisis condition through media hype through misrepresentation, if not outright lies, about the situation as is being done by environmental groups seems to me to be a reprehensible act that should be brought into the open wherever possible.

Abortion.

The solution, if there ever is one, is for the government to withdraw completely from the entire question, leaving it to the states to legislate what they want. The whole question is one of medical/personal relationships between family and doctor in each specific case, and to think the federal government and the constitution should be interposed is ludicrous. There should

be no funding at the federal level for any reason, whether it is because of crimes or personal actions on the part of the female; if the states want to fund, they can fund. Once the easy public money is taken out of the question, the whole argument will take on a different dimension, with national level politics out of it.

On Drugs:

It seems to be there have to be greater penalties for the use of drugs by citizens that are otherwise no criminals. The best idea I've hear is the boot camp idea. As the Army winds down, it could turn large camps entirely over to drug rehabilitation and punishment. Sentences of one to three years should be imposed for use, both male and female. The camps would be used under the supervision of the armed services for training these people in the ordinary civil methods of conducting their lives: how to eat; how to dress and keep clean, and to shove some education into their heads. If a person is convicted a second time, he must come out of boot camp with the equivalent of a high school diploma. There is no defect in our society today that is the equal of this, and if we have a "peace dividend" from the winding down of antagonisms between east and west, this is a far better use for that money than anything else that has been put forth, including environment and welfare uses.

I see that you are getting bashed in the media because of your reputed part in modifying some of Bush'd policies on various environmental statements made recently. I hope you will continue to do that and play a part in what is a strongly strident continuous environmental force on the national scene. Recently, I saw a newspaper article which characterized most commentators on the environment as being "ignorant and arrogant". I think you should know that out here there are some people who are trying to be realistic about the regulation and would like to see a national balance.

In any case, we applaud your efforts and hope you'll continue to make yourself felt strongly in all areas. As a son of the good old Granite State, Hang tough!

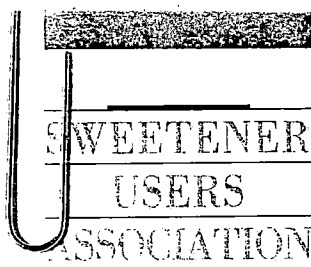

Events at home and throughout the world present the Congress and the Administration with a prime opportunity to work needed reforms into our nation's excessive and GATT-illegal sugar subsidy and quota program. Glaringly absent, however, are any Administration proposals in the 1990 Farm Bill recommending corrections in U.S. sugar policy.

It is clear that there is a groundswell of public opinion for such reform. An examination of the enclosed editorial review demonstrates the overwhelming grassroots support from around the nation -- business and consumer -- for changes to the failed sugar program.

The President's leadership on this issue is essential. We trust that the Administration will work aggressively with the Congress during consideration of the 1990 Farm Bill to ensure that the sugar program is reformed.

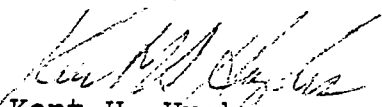

Dear Governor Sununu:

Recent reports in The New York Times and other publications have indicated that a famine, threatening hundreds of thousands of innocent civilians, is again taking shape in Sudan. As you may recall, last year between 250,000 and 500,000 individuals died from starvation in Sudan. Experts indicate that even more civilians may be at risk this year.

We are writing to request that President Bush dispatch Vice President Quayle to Sudan, as soon as possible, to meet with government leaders in Khartoum and to personally convey to the government the importance of humanitarian relief efforts and President Bush's deep concern about the worsening famine situation in that country. We have both travelled to Sudan during the past year and believe that a trip by the Vice President could be extremely helpful.

President Bush is the only U.S. President in history to have visited Sudan and is deeply admired and respected by the Sudanese. While, to date, the government of General Omar Bashir has not responded to U.S. prodding on relief efforts (failing even to agree to repeated requests of our ambassador for a personal meeting), we believe they would be obligated to meet with Vice President Quayle.

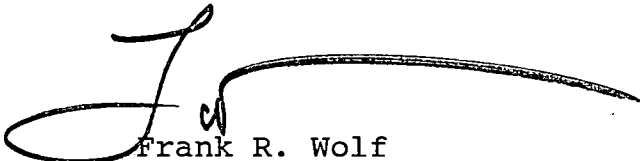
In addition to providing a forum for expressing U.S. concerns, Vice President Quayle's trip would focus world attention and pressure on the Sudanese situation which would be a further incentive for the Sudanese to act before hundreds of thousands of innocent civilians needlessly die.

The cooperation and active participation of the Sudanese government is essential to saving lives in Sudan. We believe that a high level trip by Vice President Quayle is exactly what is needed to encourage that cooperation and participation and we encourage you to give this idea your most careful consideration. Literally, hundreds of thousands of lives could be saved.

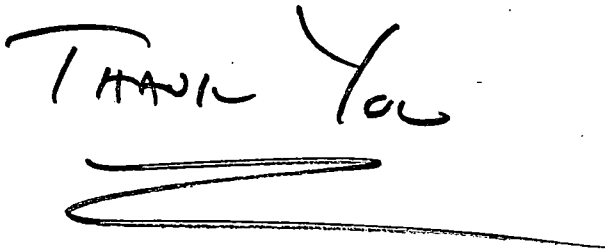

This past year was probably one of the most important and successful years in the history of trade relations between the United States and Korea. What were significant trade tensions at the beginning of the year have been set aside by comprehensive and satisfactory agreements on a diverse number of trade issues between the two countries...

The successes of last year have made it a real and attainable possibility for the two countries to form a genuine partnership: a partnership where both countries benefit fairly and meaningfully in pursuing a common economic future. The enclosed paper, entitled "Partnership in Progress: Korea's Record and Commitment," is designed to demonstrate the foundation Korea has built for such a relationship with the United States, a foundation based on facts such as:

- * Korea was one of only two countries which made significant concessions in connection with the Super 301 process, drastically opening its markets to U.S. goods, investment and services;
- * Korea has faithfully implemented these agreements;
- * Korea and the United States have reached highly satisfactory agreements or understandings in such diverse areas as intellectual property rights protection, steel, textiles, driftnet fishing and aviation;
- * Korea stepped up its activities to promote free and fair trade in multilateral trade forums such as the General Agreement on Tariffs and Trade; and
- * Most importantly, these efforts brought about striking results last year, including a 90 percent reduction in Korea's global trade surplus and a halving of the bilateral trade surplus with the United States. Such dramatic declines in such a short time span are indeed rare.

Importantly, these achievements should be viewed in their proper context. These efforts were taken and results realized at a time when Korea was going through particularly acute growing pains as it struggled, and continues to struggle, to attain social, political and economic adulthood. Korea has been undergoing a series of difficult and simultaneous transitions, including transitions from autocracy to democracy, from an emphasis on economic efficiency to one on fairness, and from a deficit-oriented economy to one which is surplus-oriented.

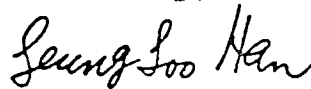
As the first anniversary of the Super 301 process approaches and the United States considers its trade relations with other nations, we believe that Korea's record of action, as presented in this paper, will stand out. Perhaps no other country responded so decisively to concerns from its trading partners regarding its trade imbalance. The United States and Korea have exercised sincere and committed efforts to attain these results and together we have accomplished them. Based on these successes, we propose through this paper a meaningful new beginning for the two countries, a beginning in pursuit of a genuine partnership in progress.

Dear John:

I am writing to update you on the situation at Portsmouth Naval Shipyard (PNSY).

As you know, the President's FY 1991 Defense budget proposes deactivating the USS Sea Devil, scheduled for overhaul at PNSY during FY 1991-1992. Cancellation of the \$128 million overhaul, which represents 320,000 mandays of work, will force PNSY to eliminate 1,100 jobs. Since the existing FY 1991 work schedule requires a reduction of 1,300 personnel, the loss of Sea Devil, if uncompensated, will result in an aggregate loss of 2,400 shipyard jobs.

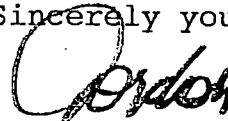
Secretary Garrett advises me that the Commander Naval Sea Systems Command and the Deputy Chief of Naval Operations for Logistics are working closely in an effort to identify several SSN Extended Repair Packages which might be moved to PNSY. This is encouraging. However, Navy contends that the refined schedule for PNSY will not be available until after the yard planning conference scheduled for late March 1990.

John, it is imperative that Navy act expeditiously in identifying and committing alternative work to PNSY. Shipyard managers must receive prompt notification in order to adjust manpower and maintenance schedules, and initiate necessary long lead procurement. Inasmuch as critical skill retention and long-term shipyard viability hinge upon timely resolution of this issue, it is essential that Navy accelerate compensatory scheduling.

I hope that you can help to expedite the scheduling of alternative work to PNSY. Securing compensatory work as soon as possible is of paramount importance.

I am writing as Chairman of the Concord Regional Solid Waste/Resource Recovery Cooperative and as a local government official in regards to proposed guidelines by the U.S. Environmental Protection Agency (EPA) for the construction and operation of "municipal waste combusters" which would have major impacts on our 27 community Cooperative.

As you are aware, the proposed regulations have attached stringent recycling requirements to the air emissions permit of facilities such as our waste-to-energy incinerator facility.

The proposed regulations will have major impacts on the Cooperative as a body, and the cost impact would be significant to our individual communities, particularly to implement the recycling provisions and the costs associated with alternate disposal methods if the incinerator loses its air emissions permit.

I would like to request a meeting between yourself and Ronald H. Ford, Project Director for the Cooperative; Craig Musselman, principal of CMA Engineers of Portsmouth and advisors to the Cooperative; and myself to review the impact this proposal has on the community and the failure of the EPA to acknowledge or address these concerns.

We have plans to be in Washington, D.C., on March 28, 29, and 30, 1990. Any time you might be able to spare during those dates to meet would be appreciated.

Thank you for your consideration and I anxiously await your response.

Over the past several years, each of us has been involved in repeated efforts to enact legislation to ensure fair and equitable treatment for airline employees who are adversely affected by mergers and acquisitions. Despite the fact that the House has passed this legislation at least four times by overwhelming margins with broad bipartisan support, final enactment has not been achieved.

The principal objection to this legislation has been that the Federal Government should not interfere with "labor-management" relations in a deregulated airline industry, and that the companies and the employees should provide for "labor protective provisions" (LPPs) through collective bargaining. Prior to the sunset of the Civil Aeronautics Board, LPPs were routinely imposed in airline merger cases as a condition for Board approval, and worked well to facilitate an orderly and equitable integration of workforces.

We remain convinced that the process of integrating workforces in an airline merger is unique to this industry whether regulated or not because of the seniority system which governs the employment status of flight crews including pilots and flight attendants. And, we are also convinced that collective bargaining may not always be a suitable mechanism to ensure seniority list integration which is fair to the flight crew members of the merging companies.

Re: The Corps and EPA Wetlands Mitigation Memorandum of Agreement

Dear Governor Sununu:

The National Wildlife Federation [NWF] has been informed that once again the White House is making an apparent eleventh-hour attempt to weaken the U.S. Army Corps of Engineers [Corps] and the EPA wetlands mitigation memorandum of agreement [MOA]. This past December the White House staff responded to the unfounded hysteria of the oil and gas industry. This time, we understand you are now responding to the demands of the U.S. Department of Transportation [DOT]. It is clear by now that the environmental community will not be given an equal opportunity to be heard on this issue, since our January 19, 1990 request for a meeting with you has been met only with a seemingly gratuitous offer to meet with your staff after a decision on the MOA has already been made. Therefore, I am writing to ensure that our position on this matter is crystal clear to the Bush Administration.

The mitigation policy articulated in the MOA signed by the Corps and the EPA on November 15, 1989 was consistent with -- indeed required by -- the Clean Water Act and the Section 404(b)(1) Guidelines. This mitigation policy is existing wetlands mitigation policy. Any change in the original MOA language [i.e., such as contained in the draft version making concessions to oil, gas and other interests that "due to hydrologic conditions" and where "there is a high proportion of land which is wetlands" mitigation may not be practicable] will be recognized as a significant retreat from existing wetlands policy and a breach of the President's clearly stated policy -- and promise -- of no net loss of wetlands.

The DOT appears not to be interested in mere flexibility in the crucial sequencing of mitigation requirement; but in no sequencing requirement at all. They apparently do not even subscribe to the principle that the EPA and Department of the Army -- as agencies charged by Congress with protecting the waters of the United States -- should be able to require transportation authorities to first avoid impacts to wetlands and then compensate for unavoidable impacts. The sequencing requirement is at the core of the Clean Water Act, the congressionally-mandated 404(b)(1) guidelines, and any realistic approach to achieving no net loss of wetlands.

Let me assure you that any deviation from the November 15, 1989 MOA will be strongly opposed by the environmental community and any deviation from the sequencing of mitigation requirement in the MOA will be the subject of legal action.
