Good Morning John:

I spoke with Dave Carney several days ago and he suggested that I write directly to you on this matter. The North Country Council, the regional planning commission covering the three northern counties has been informed by the Philadelphia Regional Office (EDA) that they, the North Country Council, will receive zero funding for 1990. The funding under the Economic Development Planning program is under Section 301(b). They are funded as a continuing project. In the past, Section 301(b) grant monies provided \$45,000 on an annual basis to the North Country Council, and this was matched by \$15,000 of funds from the New Hampshire Office of State Planning. The Council will lose the match funds if in fact they are officially de-designated (zero funded).

Six other similar agencies have been reduced to zero funding in the Philadelphia region (see exhibit) with an additional seven throughout the rest of the country. In the meantime, 75 districts have received indications of increased funding under the EDA program.

The normal grant period is January 1 to December 31st and the application for funding is submitted in December. North Country Council is administered out of the Philadelphia Regional Office (Cassandra Wilkinson and Paul Raestch). I have been told that they strongly support a re-funding of North Country Council and have already submitted an appeal from the de-designation decision. The entire Congressional Delegation has signed a joint letter to EDA requesting re-funding for NCC which you know services the entire northern part of the State. It is hoped that Mr. "Pete" Perry can be persuaded to re-evaluate the northern section of New Hampshire in terms of major economic stresses effecting future development and economic well being such as (1) underemployment, (2) economic vulnerability, (3) remoteness, (4) infrastructure deficiencies and (5) high energy costs. North Country Council has prepared a position paper on a number of these factors.

In addition to being a long-time supporter of North Country Council, I have also been deeply involved in the development of the Littleton Industrial Park. At this moment I am working on a grant proposal to EDA to assist in the construction of a new "access road" to the Industrial Park (estimated construction costs \$900,000). In 1985, the Town of Littleton voted by two thirds plus majority to raise funds

through bonding for its share of a re-alignment of Route 302 south of Littleton to I-93 and participate in the construction of a new replacement bridge spanning the Ammonoosuc River which upon completion will allow for a superb connection to the industrial park. The Town tax payers also voted \$50,000 as their share of a \$70,000 engineering cost for the access road. EDA provided a \$15,000 grant for preliminary engineering and the Littleton Industrial Development Corporation (non-profit) (LIDC) provided \$5,000. The provision of the \$70,000 access road engineering funds has allowed the State of New Hampshire to simultaneously engineer the Route 302 re-alignment, the new bridge and the Access Road. Total funding is in place for the Route 302 re-alignment, the new bridge, but we now must raise the estimated \$900,000 to construct the Access Road. The voters of Littleton will be asked at the March, 1990 Town Meeting to approve such a bond issue. We also intend to tell them that we will make every effort to achieve successful EDA and perhaps UDAG -Community Development Block Grant Funding as matching grants to the Littleton Town's share.

We now have seven businesses employing approximately 450 people, in six buildings with 256,000 square feet. In addition, we have Hitchiner Manufacturing in the vacant shoe building with nearly 350 full time employees. Our unemployment rate has dropped dramatically and with the assistance of so many agencies and individuals we now have provided a very strong and diverse manufacturing economy. For those reasons, our application will probably suffer, ironically. On the other hand, we believe we have a wonderful story of success to share with such agencies as EDA and HUD. They have assisted us in the past and perhaps now they could see their way clear to assist us in this final effort to create a AAA industrial park which will service the entire region. We still have 50 fully serviced acres available for future development and four of the six current tenant buildings are designed to expand when economic conditions warrant.

I understand that submitting an application to fund the Littleton Industrial Park Access Road is not dependent upon NCC being designated as an EDD. De-designation has two effects: (1) eliminating the NCC staff Economic Development Planning capacity so that they cannot easily provide us with staff support for this type of project, and (2) severely curtailing the likelihood of a successful application because of the explicit determination that the region is no longer sufficiently distressed to qualify for Federal assistance. The criteria for evaluating the Access Road Grant is quite similar to that used in determining continuing funding for NCC.

I have taken the liberty of enclosing the North Country Council's December 1989 statement in support of their appeal for continued funding.

I apologize for the length of this letter, but I think it is necessary to give you a broad view of the situation. As a matter of fact, I would appreciate the opportunity to personally meet with you, either in New Hampshire or Washington, to review the Town of Littleton's EDA application for assistance in funding the Access Road. I will be in

Washington for a conference on March 4th through 7th and will call Jackie Kennedy with the hope that we could get together. If the morning of March 4th is convenient, then I would fly in on Saturday evening. Certainly I could meet with you at any time at your convenience. Thank you for your consideration and trust that all of your family is well and enjoying the continuing challenge of public service.

On behalf of the members of the National Printing Equipment and Supply Association, Inc., thank you very much for taking so much time from your schedule last Thursday afternoon to meet with me and other members of our coalition to discuss the status of Clean Air Act legislation.

As I stated then, NPES firmly supports President Bush's position of crafting legislation that balances the need for improving our environment, with policies designed to sustain the continued growth of our economy. In this regard, we are most gratified that the President's position is strongly reflected in the Bipartisan Senate Clean Air Act Agreement. We are particularly pleased that the 100 ton threshold for the definition of "major source" has been maintained. We agree that to mandatorily regulate businesses below this level would impose a high cost on the economy for the marginal benefit to be gained. However, the fact remains that the individual states may choose to be more restrictive. In this regard, we support the Small Generator Technical Assistance amendment that I spoke of last week. The attached one-pager states the purpose of the amendment and how it would work.

We appreciate your willingness to receive this proposal and hope that it is a position that you can support. Most importantly, we appreciate President Bush's leadership on improving the nation's air quality. As you know, we have already conveyed our support to Senators Mitchell and Dole. Additionally, we are now notifying our members nationwide to contact their senators while they are at home during the current congressional recess, and encourage their support for the Administration's position.

As you perhaps know, all four of my grandparents came from Czechoslovakia. They came from the Slovak Republic, to the east of the Czech territories (Bohemia and Moravia). In his first presidential address, Vaclav Havel made it his main priority to include the Slovaks fully in the new Czechslovakia. (Indeed, his brother is married to a Slovak woman, whom I met on their recent visit to the United States.) Tension between the Czechs and the Slovaks has long marred the history of Czechoslovakia, and needs to be overcome.

For this reason, if it is at all possible, I would like very much to be included in some event in which I could meet President Havel during his upcoming visit. Through intermediaries in England, Havel twice invited me to come to speak in Czechoslovakia, in order to help Charter 77, and to send over some of my books. I was able to do the latter, but not the former.

If this is an impossible request, please ignore it. Still, if I could be present with him during his visit, I would count it a singular honor.

It was a great pleasure to see you at various places last week, but especially at the BIB luncheon. Thought your comments were particularly pertinent re Eastern Europe, as I know many others did at the luncheon -- I had a chance to talk with them after you departed.

I would like to ask your help on a matter that is very important for all of you in the White House/U.S. Government, and of particular interest to me and many others. This involves the war on drugs campaign.

Beginning some six or seven years ago, the Advertising Council began to get involved very directly in the anti-drug advertising campaign (in conjunction with the Media-Drug Partnership, which Jim Burke is now heading up).

The Advertising Council, in being since 1942, has programs for important needs in the U.S. -- stop drunk driving, support the Red Cross, educate re AIDS, and, of course, the anti-drug programs. As you may know, the media business now gives over a billion two hundred million dollars towards the various campaigns noted above and many others. At least half of these campaigns are requested by the U.S. Government. I have had the great pleasure of being a director of the Council for the last 15 years and was also Chairman of the Advertising Council 1986-1987.

Now, the request. All Presidents have received directors of the council at the White House when they hold their annual conference. In 1990, the conference is going to be held on Monday, May 7, in Washington and I do hope that you'll be able to organize it so there will be a reception at the White House. Every President since Truman, has held receptions at the White House during the time the Advertising Council has its meeting in Washington. Generally, these receptions have been

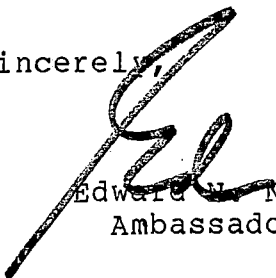
held late in the day -- 5:00 p.m. or so, for about an hour. The attendees are all the Directors of the Council, about seventy five or so, from across the country.

I am going to suggest to Mrs. Ruth Wooden, President of the Advertising Council, that she contact your office on this matter which is of such great importance to the Council and to all the Directors who make the Council work -- these Directors represent the media who provide all the free time and space for these campaigns, the leading corporations of America who help support the Council operation financially and all the advertising agencies who do all the work on a pro-bono basis.

Earlier, I mentioned Jim Burke. He has, as you may well know, signaled to the President that he is planning to get at least a million dollars a day of free media for the anti-drug campaign. I think, with luck, that figure will probably total four hundred million dollars, which is certainly the largest campaign fund that has ever been raised in the history of these programs. Jim Burke and all the people he has worked with have been enormous supporters of the Council, and I am sure could give a good word for what we are trying to do here.

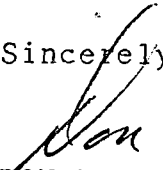

You were terrific at the lunch at the Board for International Broadcasting. Thank you very much for attending. We deeply appreciate it.

I liked President Bush's State of the Union Address very much, but I do think he missed one important opportunity. When he was listing the bigotries against which all Americans should stand in array, I wish very much that he had added "anti-Catholicism" to the list of other bigotries that are currently raising their head. There really is a growing rash of anti-Catholic materials in the press. Richard John Neuhaus described some of these in a recent piece in National Review concerning the New York Times. I think the President would touch a lot of hearts if he could bring himself to mention this on some important occasion.

It bothers me deeply that the terrible desecration of St. Patrick's Cathedral by the gay organization ACT-UP has gone largely unprotested by American academics, clergymen, and editorialists. If that had been a Jewish synagogue, or a black church, the outrage would have been universal and palpable. Many of us feel the current silence keenly. Somebody should speak up, in the name of the decency of all the American people.

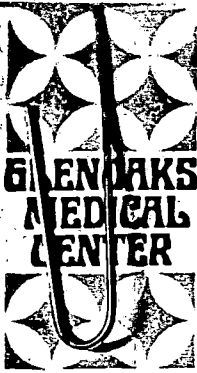

THE PRESIDENT'S LETTER

Dear John:

As this new decade begins, we are grateful for the growing interest and support of people in the work of CSFA, and we are anxious to report to you our continuing progress.

First Major Endowment Gift. Ten years ago Gove and Marcia Sleeper of Massachusetts established a Charitable Remainder Annuity Trust with CSFA as the charitable recipient. The trust, administered by CSFA Honor Roll Trustee Ed Lee, provided income for the Sleepers until their deaths. (Gove Sleeper passed away in 1982 and Marcia died this past fall.) The corpus of the trust, approximately \$320,000, has now been transferred to CSFA. We are extremely grateful for the generosity and foresight of the Sleepers. CSFA needs to build an endowment of several million dollars in the near future, especially to support the continuing expansion of the Dollars for Scholars program. This important gift provides a very helpful beginning.

New England Project. We are now preparing to open the regional Dollars for Scholars office in New England! Recent gifts from The New England, Arthur D. Little, Johnson & Wales University, George I. Alden Trust, Raytheon Corporation, and Sudbury Foundation have raised the total contributions for the New England program to \$232,000. We will continue to aim at our total goal of \$350,000 to provide administrative funding and challenge grants for local communities over a three-year period. In the meantime we are soliciting applications for our regional program development officer position, and we plan to open our office in the Boston area by early spring.

Iowa. Our Dollars for Scholars chapter development efforts in the Midwest received a major boost with the announcement last month of a \$60,000 grant to CSFA from the McElroy Trust of Waterloo, Iowa. The grant provides for 30 challenge grants of \$2,000 each to encourage communities in Northeast Iowa to create Dollars for Scholars foundations. Curt Trygstad, CSFA's Midwest PDO, reports that already 40 communities have made inquiries to CSFA in response to the challenge.

Program Growth for FY 90. As of December 31, 1989, half-way through our fiscal year, CSFA had added 33 new programs managed by our Scholarship Management Services. This number is in line with last year's rapid growth. Like last year, the average distribution size of the new programs is not as large as in previous years. However, CSFA staff members are currently working closely with several corporations on scholarship programs that promise to be quite large. Two new programs for our Education Grants/Innovative Services unit have been added this year as well. Twenty-eight new Dollars for Scholars chapters have become affiliated with CSFA. And 39 colleges and universities have joined the CSFA Collegiate Partners program.

Urban Projects. Major progress has been made in programs being directed by CSFA in urban and minority communities. Dorothy Green, CSFA Program Development Officer for Urban Initiatives, reports that the initial impact of the Pepsi School Challenge has been very positive. At Southwestern High School in Detroit 60% of the students and at L.G. Pinkston High School in Dallas 75% of the students have already signed up for the program. An additional registration period will be held at the beginning of the spring semester. In the meantime mentor teachers, school administrators, and community residents have launched special activities designed to raise educational expectations for the students. Also, an important new model for educational support was created in the Allstate-supported urban program with the formation of the Atlanta Dollars for Scholars foundation. This innovative chapter will provide scholarships for students from several public housing projects through the active volunteer support of the Atlanta Chamber of Commerce, Atlanta Housing Authority employees, and public housing residents.

An Effective Organization. At the fall annual meeting of Independent Sector, the national organization for nonprofit organizations, foundations, and corporate donors, CSFA was invited to make a presentation concerning its management and evaluation practices. Indeed, over the years CSFA has built up an effective management approach through a clear mission, long-range plans, annual business plans, careful appraisal of both organizational and individual performance, a unique staff incentive plan, and an active Board and Advisory Board. The recent move to enhance the role and status of the Honor Roll Trustees group was also an important step in strengthening the organization. But in the long run, a nonprofit organization is only as strong as the support, interest, and backing received from its broader constituency. We remain very grateful for the various ways in which a growing number of people throughout this country have placed their stamp of value on our organization. Many thanks!

I was most interested in what you had to say in your interview for Ch. 11's New Hampshire Journal. In particular, I was impressed by the thoughts you expressed advocating a limit of 12 years for members of the U. S. House and Senate. I believe that may be the Achilles Heel of our governmental system.

Just recently, a column by David Broder appeared in the Democrat in which he advocated a concerted effort by the media to break up entrenched power in Washington. His theme was similar to yours, power corrupts. It occurred to me that you two might profitably get together, join forces. Certainly, the part would seem to fit you well. You have set the precedent, like George Washington, and you expressed a keen interest in continuing to serve the public interest. Surely, this offers an infinitely greater opportunity to make a difference for us all than serving as a N. H. state senator.

Does it make sense in terms of equality among the branches of government to permit the legislature indefinite tenure while limiting the executive to eight years?

At this point, you have a marvelous platform to gain public attention and support for this cause. It will never be better. It's one of those historic opportunities.

I believe such an idea's time has come. I believe it would have a great enough impact to support a non-profit organized effort, supported by contributions from the public. I'm thinking of the Right to Work movement.

Dear John:

Congratulations on the reappointment of Steve Forbes as Chairman of the Board for International Broadcasting, responsible for Radio Free Europe and Radio Liberty. This is such a crucial time in the life of the Radios. They have never been more important. And among all possible first-rate chairmen of the board, Steve still excels. You have done a great thing!

I am still concerned that at least two critical members of the Board be reappointed. Both are Democrats: Ben Wattenberg and Lane Kirkland. Kirkland is crucial because of his ties to labor unions all around the world, and especially in Eastern Europe. He is a hero there. Also, he is a great defender of the Radios in the Congress and in public. Ben Wattenberg has been vice-chairman for some time (the vice-chairman is always a member of the other party), and he is savvy and extremely articulate at our Congressional hearings. He has great clout in the media.

As I mentioned to you in an earlier letter, there are a number of vacancies on the nine-member Board, through the normal attrition. Ed Ney (Republican) has become Ambassador to Canada, and Jim Michener (Democrat) has, alas, resigned. Ken Tomlinson (Republican, Reader's Digest) is the only member of the Board who is still serving in a term confirmed by the Senate. As for the rest of us, our terms have expired, although we serve until replaced.

To repeat myself, I am not requesting that my own seat (Democrat) on the Board be protected. The reappointment of Steve Forbes was absolutely the most important thing, but the reappointment of Lane Kirkland and Ben Wattenberg are also crucial. The term for each Board member is three years, divided into three annual classes, so there was always a chance to make three new appointments every year.

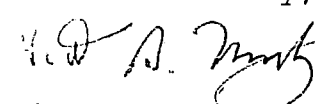

HAL DAUB ANNOUNCES FORMATION OF SENATE EXPLORATORY COMMITTEE

Expected To Formalize Candidacy In Early 1990

Former four-term Republican Congressman Hal Daub announced that he has authorized the formation of an exploratory committee for the purpose of waging a campaign to become the next U.S. Senator from Nebraska. Daub later told reporters that "there should be no misunderstanding about my intention to be a candidate."

In his announcement statement, Mr. Daub indicated that he is fully prepared for the arduous effort that will be required to unseat Jim Exon in what he characterized as the "battle of my political life." Stressing the importance of party unity in this effort, he pledged his support for the other Republican candidates for public office, and his commitment to Governor Kay Orr, the nation's only woman Republican Governor.

The hard work necessary to win this election is a familiar concept to Congressman Daub. He launched his political career in 1978 by challenging the Democratic Congressman, only to see him retire rather than face a re-match in 1980. As a Republican Congressman Hal's performance earned him a position on the prestigious Ways and Means Committee. And while his position in the House was virtually secure, he demonstrated his courage and vision by pursuing his party's Senate nomination in 1988. From this experience he benefited greatly, gaining the experience and building the statewide reputation that will enable him to wage a successful campaign for the Senate.

Republicans across the nation are genuinely excited about the potential of Hal Daub's Senate candidacy. Incumbent Democrat Jim Exon is one of the most vulnerable Democrats up for re-election in 1990. It is believed that Exon is a man of the past, while youthful but experienced Hal Daub represents the future for Nebraska and America. As Mr. Daub announced to an energized audience on Saturday evening, "the sun in the horizon is rising over the Nebraska Republican Party." Through hard work and unity of effort, Hal Daub will be the next Senator from Nebraska.

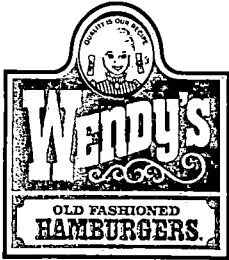

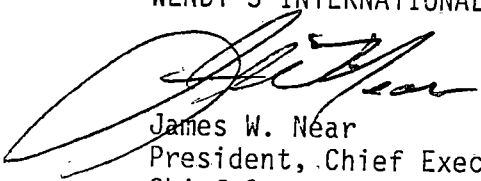
