

Dear Governor Sununu:

Students from the Antwerp International School (Belgium); Moscow School #1129 (Soviet Union); and Northport High School (New York) have been working together for the past year to draft the enclosed international treaty on deforestation. This project has been developed under the auspices of the New York State Bar Association's Law, Youth and Citizenship Program. The students first met in Antwerpen, Belgium in May 1989 to select a treaty topic and develop a workplan. The students selected deforestation as the subject for the treaty project. The purpose of the treaty is to "encourage reforestation around the globe and to discourage the deforestation of the world." The students met for a second planning meeting in New York during the fall of 1989 to develop strategy and outline the provisions of the treaty. The students have worked together by dividing up the research and writing tasks, they also have taken advantage of modern technology by faxing their drafts and using computer electronic mail to correspond.

The treaty has been drafted by the students applying all of the standards and theories of international law. It invites all nations of the world to ". . . save the world for future generations." The students will present the treaty before members of the International Court of Justice and officers of the United Nations at The Peace Palace, in The Hague, Netherlands on April 20, 1990.

Thank you for your note of March 13, 1990 regarding my suggestion to attach a Deming education package to the aid earmarked for Panama. You might consider the same type of package for the aid currently being designed for Nicaragua's new government and Eastern Europe. On the other hand, that is not what this note is really about.

The Americans With Disabilities Act (ADA) will create a legal nightmare for small business owners if it is enacted without significantly tightening its language.

Small business owners do not intentionally discriminate against the disabled. However, the ambiguous language in the bill and the unknown price tag could realistically result in a parade of attorneys seeking to profit through expensive lawsuits against small employers.

If a disabled customer or visitor believes discrimination may have taken place, the only remedy available under the ADA bill is a lawsuit to correct the problem. No administrative remedy exists in cases involving customers, clients, or visitors. Of course, a lawsuit means legal fees -- legal fees in amounts that could seriously harm the economic viability of a small business even if the business owner eventually prevails.

At a recent meeting before the American Bar Association, ADA legal expert, Thomas Barnard, of the firm Duvin, Cahn and Barnard commented with regard to enactment of the ADA, "we can expect 10 to 20 years of very serious litigation ahead of us."

The major reasons why this legislation will create such serious litigation problems include the following:

1. Significant disagreement over the meaning of the terms "reasonable accommodation" and "undue hardship".
2. Anticipatory discrimination suits by the disabled.
3. An unclear understanding of who is "disabled".
4. A vague and inclusive definition of a "disability".

Terms such as "readily achievable" and "undue hardship" are unnecessarily ambiguous. "Readily achievable" is defined as "easily accomplishable and able to be carried out without much difficulty or expense". Clearly, since this has never been used in civil rights laws before, trial attorneys will have a field day testing what it actually means in court.

"Undue hardship" is defined as "an action requiring significant difficulty or expense". While some individual case law exists with respect to "undue hardship" in large businesses, universities, and state governments, no case law exists for small businesses. When the proponents of the bill were asked to define what they believed this phrase meant, they indicated that even the worth of a job would not necessarily constitute an "undue hardship".

The ADA bill also allows a disabled customer to sue a store owner if the customer believes he or she is "about to be discriminated against." A business owner cannot even begin to fight an accusation based on anticipatory discrimination, especially if the statute and/or its accompanying reports do not contain a list of the disabilities covered.

The term "reasonable accommodation" may include job restructuring, modified work schedules, reassignment, and acquisition of equipment or devices. Again, very little case law exists concerning what the requirements for smaller businesses will actually be under the "reasonable accommodation" standard. Thomas Barnard, the ADA legal expert quoted above, states that the greatest legal controversies in the ADA will involve the reasonable accommodation requirement for the disabled. He believes that this provision will most likely require employers to go further than the current requirements of the Rehabilitation Act.


The 1974 Rehabilitation Act defines a "disability" as "a physical or mental impairment substantially limiting one or more major life activity". Proponents of the bill say that this is intended to cover some 900 types of disabilities. However, no list of disabilities exists for an employer to use to comply with the law. Proponents argue that it is impossible to list the covered disabilities, but without a list, a business owner will have no idea what may or may not be covered until it is necessary to go to court.

The lack of precision in the definition of a "disability" in the 1974 Rehabilitation Act has resulted in a confused body of case law in which the courts have been forced to determine which conditions, diseases, and behavioral patterns are disabilities protected by the Act on a case-by-case basis. One case was brought in which a woman claimed a disability because she was dependent upon her dog. While the woman did not prevail, her case is illustrative of the types of "disabilities" individuals may attempt to bring under the ADA bill.

It is simply unfair to expect individual business owners to know which disabilities are covered and therefore must be accommodated. Business owners will never know if they have guessed right or wrong until a complaint is filed, crushing legal fees have been paid and a decision is rendered. The combination of allowing anticipatory suits and not providing any guidance on which disabilities are covered under ADA creates a classic "Catch 22" situation for small business owners.

Governor Sununu, NFIB urges and encourages you to review the vague language used in the ADA bill and then move to prevent a legal nightmare from occurring for small business owners across the country. Without inclusion of important clarifying amendments, NFIB will be forced to oppose the ADA because of the far-reaching adverse consequences this legislation will have on the more than 500,000 NFIB small business owners across the country.

I understand that Mrs. Sununu and you are to be the guests of honor at the fifth anniversary celebration of the National Technological University (NTU), to be held at the Great Hall of the National Academy of Sciences and the National Academy of Engineering on April 5, 1990.

The Department of Commerce has long regarded the NTU as one of the more innovative solutions to the problem of enhancing our national training in science and engineering. As you well know, this goes to the heart of the Nation's industrial competitiveness, especially in vital high-tech areas.

The Federal Government has played a crucial role in NTU's establishment and development. Two Commerce Department agencies have extended financial assistance to NTU. Over the past five years, about \$2.4 million in grants has been awarded by the National Telecommunications and Information Administration for the purchase of equipment -- for the most part satellite uplink earth stations -- and satellite transponder time. NTU has also received a \$100,000 grant from the Economic Development Administration, under that agency's University Center program. This award will allow NTU to deliver interactive technical assistance programs on technology transfer for federal laboratories and business entrepreneurs at or near their work sites.

NTU, a consortium of 29 colleges of engineering, is now a \$11.4 million-a-year operation offering Master of Science degrees in seven technical disciplines. Over 700 persons are enrolled as Masters degree candidates and more than 550 courses are offered. It transmits its programming via satellite to 242 corporate and government research sites nationally.

I share in your support of NTU, with its successful melding of the potential of satellite communications with education.



The paper notes that the "Hawkins/Downey approach reflects the belief that social service bureaucrats, not parents, should choose how children are raised."

In view of the clear public support for the Stenholm/Shaw bill, the authors of the Hawkins/Downey bill have made cosmetic alterations in their legislation to create the appearance that it offers a degree of choice. In fact, the new Hawkins/Downey bill represents another step toward bloated bureaucracy and the erosion of states' authority. Stenholm/Shaw, on the other hand, guarantees to parents the right to freely choose from among a wide variety of child care alternatives, including institutions which include religious activities in their programs.

Dear Governor Sununu:

The February 7, 1990 announcement by the Department of Health and Human Services opening the door to the fifty states to require different diet and health information on food labels would result in widespread consumer confusion, loss of credibility for the Food and Drug Administration, increase unnecessarily the cost of food and impede international trade. Only the federal government can equally protect all 250 million consumers.

Indeed, a national food label is the only way to insure a level competitive playing field for products manufactured in one state and sold throughout the country. The 1983 report of the Presidential Task Force on Regulatory Reform, authored by then Vice-President George Bush, underscores this very point--food and drugs should be regulated at the federal level.

At a time when our government is seeking a harmonized global marketplace, it is wrong to permit the 50 states to independently label the approximately 20,000 food products which are typically sold throughout our country. In fact, your food safety plan wisely embraces the need for uniform pesticide residues. A national food label regulation deserves your support as well.



It was a pleasure to shake hands with you and have a brief talk at the Gridiron Dinner.


You seemed surprised at the distress occurring in the textile industry because of the enormous increase in imports that is taking place. I am attaching a copy of a recent report from the Greenville, South Carolina, paper, including a U. S. Commerce Department Census Bureau report on profits, which shows how very serious this situation is.

These figures represent the fourth quarter situation but the first quarter is even worse, and this will be coming out in the papers over the next few weeks.

The manufacturing infrastructure of the United States in which textiles and apparel play a key role--employing, as they do, 2 million people--is in deep distress due to government supported, pushed, and financed exports, mostly from the Far East. It is a serious situation for the future, and I take advantage of our short discussion to pass this information along to you.

That was an absolutely outstanding talk you made the other night at the dinner celebrating five years of NTU. I really enjoyed it.



**Dear John:**

I gather there is some internal deliberation as to the role the Postal Service will play in international postal affairs. A decision on this issue is vitally important.

At present, there is some controversy over the Postal Service -- whether it should be "demonopolized" and even privatized. My own view (see enclosed piece) is that the answers to both questions are in the affirmative.

But even if the Postal Service remains "as is", it seems to me highly undesirable to have it in charge of the U.S. Government's policies toward international postal matters. Competition (from express carriers and others) is breaking out in this industry -- to the great benefit of consumers. But, predictably, the world's government-owned postal monopolies are doing everything they can to suppress that competition.

In order to resist further cartelization of international postal service, I think it essential that the U.S. Government's leadership on this issue be passed from the Postal Service to the Executive Branch of Government.



Dear Governor Sununu:

On behalf of the futures industry, please accept my gratitude for taking the time from your busy schedule to listen to our point of view in matters relating to current jurisdictional issues. Although we provided some general explanations about our concerns, in the next couple of days we will also offer a response to your specific question as to what we fear from a regulatory switch to the Securities and Exchange Commission (SEC).

Allow me, however, to take this opportunity to personally respond to this query in a rather subjective manner. As you probably know, I had something to do with the introduction of financial futures back in the 1970s, as well as their subsequent global acceptance as a financial risk management tool. To me, therefore, the answer to your question seems self-evident. It is similar to asking someone who has been under the care of the same doctor for many years -- and is, relatively speaking, in good health -- why he resists changing to a new doctor. Why should he change? Has someone proved that the original doctor is no longer capable of carrying out his duties? What proof is there that the new doctor would be as good as the first?

Of course, such concerns beg the question, "does it matter whether the patient remains in good health?" To that, I believe the answer should be an unequivocal yes. Financial futures have been an economic engine of some note during the last two decades, one that has helped the United States maintain its preeminent status as a financial marketplace. Indeed, Merton Miller, Professor of Finance at the University of Chicago, named financial futures as "the most significant financial innovation of the last twenty years."

Moreover, the answer to this question can best be found in the testimony of Fed Chairman Alan Greenspan before the U.S. House Subcommittee on Telecommunications and Finance of the Committee on Energy and Commerce, May 19, 1988:

What many critics of equity derivatives fail to recognize is that the markets for these instruments have become so large not because of slick sales campaigns but because they are providing economic value to their users. By enabling pension funds and other institutional users to hedge and adjust positions quickly and inexpensively, these instruments have come to play an important role in portfolio management. The history of futures and options provides numerous examples of contracts that did not provide much economic value and consequently failed...

...Thus, trading in baskets of stocks representing indexes has been found to be a cost-effective means of achieving available returns on stock portfolios.

In this context, it is not surprising that institutional investors have come to rely heavily on index products in futures and options markets as a relatively low-cost means of adjusting their positions and as hedging devices...

Thus, if one accepts the premise that the health of financial futures and its equity derivatives are of economic importance to this nation, then I believe it is fair to ask why a change in regulators is necessary. To date, there have been no substantive arguments to convince one that the Commodity Futures Trading Commission (CFTC) has done an inadequate job or that the SEC would have done better.


Behind much of the discussion is the erroneous perception that stock index derivatives are somehow a cause of volatility or at fault when the stock market declines. These perceptions are blatantly false. Not one academic study ever came to these conclusions. Quite the contrary. Most studies concluded that equity derivatives help achieve market liquidity and thus act as a stabilizing factor.

Clearly, Governor Sununu, it is predictable that the stock market will, in the future, again be subject to volatility as well as to declines, sometimes to precipitous declines. These will occur whenever economic conditions, perceived or real, so dictate. And when that happens, it will not be the fault of any given market -- securities or futures. Indeed, Chairman Greenspan, in his recent testimony before Congressman Markey, made the following points: (1) that there is no relationship between stock index futures margin and stock market volatility; and (2) transferring some futures jurisdiction to the SEC would not make much difference with respect to any stock market crash in the future.

Thus, we believe the motivation of those urging a jurisdictional switch should be scrutinized. It isn't really so much a question of what harm a regulatory change would cause as it is a question of whether such action is warranted.

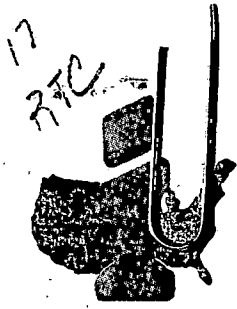

We are corresponding with your good offices in the hopes of your communicating the contents of our letter to President Bush.

Our contacts to date regarding the following have been with persons and offices at several levels of government....what were given to be "proper channels", as it were. Apparently our efforts have been lost in the shuffle, for we have received not one response or acknowledgement.

Inland Mortgage Corporation, headquartered in Tulsa, Oklahoma, is a fully-credentialed small mortgage bank; one of only a few nationally that is approved to administer real estate loans inherited by the F.D.I.C. as a result of failed thrift institutions.

We and our associates have developed a very complicated but very workable program to finance and market income-producing real property mortgage loans via a commercial mortgage-backed securities conduit; by private offerings as well as through Wall Street. It is all but complete and ready to be put in place, save for one important ingredient....mortgage pool insurance as credit enhancement in order to insure a AAA securities rating backed by these pools of loans.

Now, here is the "meat" of my letter: the first several pools of loans backing these mortgage securities could be partially (and geographically dispersed) structured to contain those developed from the sale of BILLIONS of dollars of properties owned by the FDIC and now being marketed by RTC...at losses that are a tremendous burden on the American taxpayer! John, a primary reason for these losses stem from the fact that they are being sold for cash at deep discounts, because there is no viable vehicle to FINANCE the sales.

Our commercial mortgage-backed securities concept has been developed by our group over the past few years; addressing underwriting, securitization and ratings, marketing, loan administration, corporate capitalization and pool credit enhancement. This last ingredient can be provided by FDIC pool guaranty, similar the very successful G.N.M.A. single-family MBS program.

When you consider this program can be a factor in stemming the tremendous losses FDIC is, and will continue, experiencing as it now is conducting business, it simply cannot go unexplored. By providing a way to market and finance the sale of FDIC-owned properties at a reasonable price level (if not dollar-for-dollar) and result in an appreciable on-going source of guaranty INCOME to FDIC, working with private enterprise, as pool insurer, this concept could be revolutionary. (as I mentioned, similar to the G.N.M.A. pool guaranty program).



Our C-MEP delegations meet regularly with officials in the State Department, Congress, and relevant embassies. We have had limited opportunity to date in holding comparable discussions with top White House officials.

The timing of this request is prompted by the upcoming "Washington Advocacy Days" sponsored by C-MEP on May 13-14-15. We expect a large and diverse turnout, including major leaders from several denominations. (See attached flyer)

While we are also seeking appointments at the State Department during this special gathering in Washington, I request the chance for a small delegation to meet with you for a brief discussion of concerns focused on the peace process in the Middle East. We commend recent public statements by the President and other White House staff which have been helpful in the overall process. The pace of events in the region makes an exchange of views very timely.

We understand that your schedule is always busy and subject to unexpected shifts. We would accomodate to whatever time might be available although the afternoons of Monday, May 14, and Tuesday, May 15, would be best for our out-of-town participants. If necessary, we would form a group that could meet with you on Thursday, May 10, or Friday, May 11, in advance of our larger gathering.

Dear John:

I was encouraged by our recent phone conversation. I really appreciate your agreeing to follow through with your commitment to address the reimbursement issue in Florida for its immigration crisis.

During our conversation, you asked me to describe the nature of the immigration emergency, the place where money can be found for reimbursement and how much is needed for each purpose.

To highlight the nature of the emergency, I would point to the numbers of Nicaraguans entering without status and the cost Florida has incurred to meet their basic needs.

Although it is impossible to give an exact number of Nicaraguans, the Florida Department of Health and Rehabilitative Services estimates there are between 70,000 and 100,000 Nicaraguans in Florida without legal status. The State of Florida estimates the long-term cost to Florida taxpayers to address this situation to exceed \$100 million. But when you look at per capita expenditures, in particular for health and education, even this figure appears low.

Health care and education costs provide strong documentation of the extent of this crisis. Jackson Memorial Hospital provided health care for approximately 1333 indigent Nicaraguans at a cost of \$7 million during fiscal years 1988 and 1989.

The Dade County School Board identifies 7,010 Nicaraguan-born students who enrolled in the system during the 1988-89 school year. The Board reports to me that the operating expenditure per Nicaraguan student was \$3,978. Therefore, the annual cost of providing an appropriate education to these children was \$27,885,780. To date, during the current 1989-90 school year, 2,524 Nicaraguan-born students enrolled at an estimated operating cost of \$4,096. Therefore, the estimated annual cost of providing an appropriate education to these children is \$10,338,304. The total operating expenditures for

Nicaraguan-born students who enrolled during these two school years is calculated to be \$38,224,084.

Dade County estimates the cost per student to provide additional student stations to be between \$1,500 and \$2,000 for temporary classroom space and approximately \$9,000 for elementary, \$10,000 for middle school, and \$13,000 for senior high school students for permanent classroom space. Presently, temporary portable/relocatable classrooms which include site preparation work are being utilized at a total cost of approximately \$20,000,000. Permanent classroom space for all Nicaraguan-born children is estimated to cost \$142,194,000.

I believe the "immigration emergency fund", Section 113 of the Immigration Reform and Control Act (IRCA), is the right place to find the funds necessary to begin to address the problem. I have enclosed a copy of Section 113 for your review. The provision authorizes the use of a \$35 million immigration emergency fund for two purposes: first, to provide for an increase in border control and other enforcement activities and second, for reimbursement of States and localities in meeting an immigration emergency.

As you can see from the attached legislative history of IRCA, Senator Paula Hawkins intended the immigration emergency fund amendment to offer relief to the States in an immigration emergency. She recalled the crisis Florida encountered during the Cuban boatlift and described the heavy financial burden placed on local communities.

Last year, Congress appropriated \$35 million for Section 113 due in large part to the efforts of Senator Bob Graham and myself. As you can see from the attached legislative history, we supported this appropriation for the purpose of addressing the immigration emergency in Florida.

As I see it, Section 113 is the best, if not only, way to respond quickly to this crisis. However, INS Commissioner Gene McNary has stated his opposition to the use of this fund for reimbursement to Florida, as he prefers to use the fund for border control activities. I would argue that while border control is important, reimbursement to the states is equally important.

I am delighted with the prospects for true freedom in Nicaragua. Hopefully, these changes will slow the rate of Nicaraguan refugee flows into Florida. Even if the flow stopped completely, the fact remains, that Floridians have already spent tens of millions of dollars to address the problem.

John, this is not fair. This is the result of federal immigration policy. And we've got to do something about correcting its failures.

Given the changes in Nicaragua, I suspect we now have a contained problem which we ought to address immediately. We appropriated \$35 million in the immigration emergency fund. I am asking you to use it.

The recent events in Eastern Europe have certainly been met with almost unbounded joy in this country but I have at least two concerns that temper my pleasure at the new found freedom of the Eastern Block countries.

The first concern is that, if the perceived material benefits of democracy are not forthcoming to these new democracies, the result might be civil unrest on a large scale, possibly culminating in the rise of thinly veiled totalitarianism and dictatorship. It should be recalled that the two World Wars were begun, not between the Super Powers of the time, but by conflicts involving the Central European powers. It is not inconceivable that, in ten to twenty years, the same sort of intertwined economic, political and military pacts that escalated these conflicts to international conflagrations could again be the basis for disaster.

My second concern is that, if economic renovation of these countries is achieved through the investment of other countries (e.g., Japan, West Germany, France), the United States will not only lose its position as guarantor of democracy, but will fall still further behind in the growing international trade gap. Thus, the ten- to twenty-year future will usurp the United States as the economic leader of the free world.

I am led to the conclusion that a large-scale American economic investment in Eastern Europe is the only hope for stability in the region and that the long-term United States preeminence in the international market can only be maintained by this same policy. The attached news clipping seems to indicate that this investment is unlikely to take place without some outside stimulus.

Obviously, the problem which this conclusion raises is how to fund such an investment when the electorate is not only widely opposed to new taxes but is anticipating a "Peace Dividend", and the investment required is on the order of at least tens of billions of dollars in order to stay competitive with the other investing countries.

I think the answer might be in a program similar to the Defense Department program called the Industrial Modernization Incentives Program (IMIP) which began about ten years ago. I was involved in the program in the 1982-1985 time frame and I would like to outline how it worked and how a similar program might be developed to leverage large private sector investments with relatively small government outlays.

Basically IMIP was a program to incentivize the DoD industrial base. Under previous guidelines of cost-plus-fixed-fee contracts there was no incentive to modernize or to cut costs of hardware produced for the DoD. Improvements which reduced the cost of end products merely meant that before the next contract was negotiated, a "show cost" analysis would be performed, the cost reductions would be identified, and a new, lower cost would be taken as the baseline for the new cost-plus-fixed-fee contract. Under these conditions the producer could never amortize his capital investment so there was no reason to spend money to lower the price of the product and lose the cost of the capital investment.

The IMIP program changed all this. The producer could show the government how a capital improvement would reduce the cost of the product and a cost sharing contract, which allowed the producer to amortize his investment and the government to receive the goods at a lower cost, was negotiated and both parties gained. In time other investments were also allowed as a basis for IMIP contracts, including computer programs for material and cost management, innovative financing, and just about everything except real property construction costs.

Soon, other secondary problems, which existed prior to IMIP, became apparent. In the past, the DoD had frequently been forced to purchase expensive, complex machinery and provide it as Government Furnished Equipment (GFE) to contractors when Preplanned Product Improvements (P3I), which required new subsystems for the main product, were scheduled during a contract performance period. This GFE placed a large paperwork burden on both the producer and the government since its maintenance and depreciation had to be carefully monitored and accounted for. If its use was proposed for any other contract, then the advantage

it gave the producer had to be considered. If this gave an unfair competitive advantage to the producer, the contract might be awarded to a higher bid which was calculated without this advantage.

Furthermore, when the equipment was no longer needed by the original producer, because the contract was terminated or lost or because the particular item the equipment produced was no longer needed, its maintenance and/or storage was an even bigger problem. A huge bureaucracy, DIPEC (the Defense Industrial Plant Equipment Center), had been built up which kept track of all such equipment, its condition, its location, etc. Before any new equipment could be purchased for GFE, this data base had to be searched and, if a piece of equipment similar to that required was identified, a complex and expensive procedure was initiated to examine, renovate and relocate the old equipment to the producer. Needless to say, the renovated equipment was frequently less productive and more expensive to maintain than a new piece of equipment, which was especially designed for the task, would have been.

When I terminated my involvement as a contractor in the IMIP program to accept my present position in the government in another area, there was serious consideration being given to major revisions to the GFE program which would alleviate many of these secondary problems, and it may now be quite different from what I depict it as here. However, the point is that, with a properly designed incentive program, American industry can and will make the investments which are required to meet significant productivity challenges. The problem facing us in this case is how to incentivize the American industrial base to make the necessary investments in the developing democracies. I now include Panama, Nicaragua, and possibly Colombia and other drug-producing countries to offset economic losses resulting from terminating drug production and/or distribution.

I think that a program similar to the IMIP program could be developed to meet this challenge. Its main goal would be to leverage private sector investment rather than to finance large infusions of foreign aid. The developing democracies need not only money but, more importantly, the long-term commitment of knowledgeable entrepreneurs to establish a viable economic infrastructure.

The program could be built upon a multi-tiered structure with small incentives for expanding imports to developing democracies, larger incentives for establishing wholly-owned subsidiaries or plants, and still larger incentives for cooperative ventures with

producers in the developing democracies. Incentives could likewise be tied to volume produced or sold, hard currency value produced in the host country, employment generated in the host country, more rapid amortization of production equipment in the host country, or other similar measures of effectiveness. Incentives could be in the form of government subsidies (on a cost-sharing basis or to be reimbursed after amortization) for capital equipment, tax credits on profits generated or investments made, loan guarantees, subsidies to offset possible foreign currency fluctuations, etc.

The main purpose of the incentives would, again, not be to finance 100% of the investment, but to give a reasonable assurance that the investment would yield an acceptable return. The producer and the government would be required to perform an analysis of the potential return on investment (ROI) and of other intangible benefits accruing to us and the host country in order to determine the maximum incentive which could be offered.

There are certainly still other factors which must be considered such as potential complaints from the international market of unfair export subsidization, price fixing or currency manipulation. These would have to be addressed by others who are familiar with our international agreements in these areas. I do expect, however, that there are solutions to these possible impediments.

I do not intend to imply that the problems associated with the implementation of this plan are trivial. A relatively complete systems analysis of each country and region, describing the existing technological infrastructure, the electrical power, the logistical, communications and financial (banking) structure would be required. Sensitivity to internal ethnic diversity would also be considered. Coordination (not necessarily explicit, possibly through contacts with the host country) with the activities of other foreign investors would also be required. This could be assisted by the State Department, the Agency for International Development, and possibly the Central Intelligence Agency, to name a few.


Fortunately, the majority of the countries in question have embassies in Washington, so that a preliminary investigation of the concept, including identification of in-country points of contact, can be accomplished with their cooperation. This analysis should be used as a basis for a balanced, evolutionary development plan which would bring both rapid near-term and more comprehensive far-term benefits. My limited understanding of past efforts of a similar nature indicates that such analyses

have rarely, if ever, been done. Consequently, individual projects have sometimes been successfully completed, but they have rarely reaped the benefits which they might have, if coordinated in a long-term, well conceived plan.

I would be happy to discuss this concept with one of your staff. I seriously feel that the solution to this problem is one of paramount importance to this country in the coming years and that a proactive rather than a reactive United States role is what the free world is awaiting.

The City of Tallahassee is extremely concerned that continuing opposition from EPA is placing our Clean Coal Technology repowering project in jeopardy. The City must qualify for the repowering section of the bill, both to obtain project allowances as well as to qualify for the treatment accorded to all other clean coal technology projects under the repowering section.

The Department of Energy strongly supports this project as evidenced by Admiral Watkins' letter of March 22, copy attached. As promised, this project will provide a vital demonstration of clean coal technology using eastern high sulfur coal. Our project is anticipated to cost approximately \$348,000,000. DOE would advance at least a \$65,000,000 cost share which amount is to be repaid to DOE. DOE staff worked with City officials to draft language necessary to assure that this project goes forward. This language has been available to Environment and Public Works Committee staff and EPA for some time.

I have met with officials of OMB, including Deputy Associate Director David Gibbons, and Non-nuclear Energy branch chief, Gary Bennethum, and indicated that EPA's opposition is jeopardizing the project. However, it does not yet appear that the Administration has determined its position. Without White House intervention, EPA's views could prevail in negotiations with the Senate Environment and Public Works Committee. Even if, through the efforts of Sen. Bob Graham, D-Fla., and Sen. Connie Mack, R-Fla., the City is able to secure approval of the Tallahassee amendment in the Senate, continued EPA opposition could derail the project in legislative drafting process in the House or in conference. We need help now in the Senate and through the remainder of the process. Failure to include the language that has been drafted by DOE, which will permit the project to qualify for the repowering section of the bill, will cause the City to abandon the project.

Therefore, the City respectfully requests that the White House intervene on our behalf, and support the language drafted by DOE. This will permit Tallahassee to qualify for allowances and all other treatment afforded under the repowering section of the Senate bill.

Dear Governor Sununu and General Scowcroft :

I wish to thank you, on my own behalf and on that of the Government of Colombia, for the attention I was given last week. As I noted, the purpose of my visit was none other than to advance the material implementation of actions derived from the Declaration of Cartagena, especially as regards trade and economic aspects.

With reference to trade, the declaration provides that "in accordance with the respective policies of Bolivia, Colombia, Perú and the United States, [the parties] will work together to increase trade among the three Andean countries and the United States, effectively facilitating access to the United States market and strengthening export promotion..."

With regards to economic legislation, it was recommended that "the parties may consider the establishment of economic and investment policies, as well as legislation and regulations to foster private investment". And further stated that "where favorable conditions exist, the United States will facilitate private investment in the three Andean countries, taking into account the particular conditions and potential of each."

With your strong support, we are optimistic that these declaration can materialize before July 1990, by which time Colombia shall undergo a change of government. Enactment of this legislation on a "fast track" basis in the current session of Congress will ensure the necessary public support to the commitments reflected in the Declaration of Cartagena, so as to guarantee continuity of such policies on the part of the next Government of Colombia.

In particular, we are encouraged by the U.S. Government's commitment to develop legislation which provides economic support to Colombia and the other Andean countries and effective access for their products to the U.S. market. Based upon this conceptual and policy framework, and as I committed myself in the fruitful meeting we had together, I am enclosing an outline of U.S. legislative initiatives which would assist Colombian economic development substantially. They are all the more relevant as, on February 22, 1990, President Barco's Administration embarked on a policy to open up the Colombian economy with a view to achieve high rates of growth through a greater presence in foreign markets.

The liberalization program is meant to be implemented within five years. Given that the United States is our chief trade and economic partner, the five-year special treatment proposed will effectively enable Colombia to advance her program of economic development. Investment-promotion and market-opening measures by the United States will complement the steps we are taking in Colombia to eliminate trade barriers and to make our economy more competitive and outward-oriented.

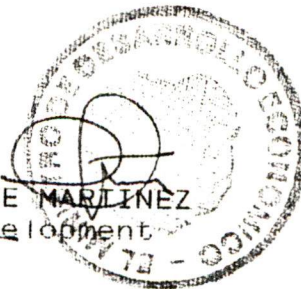
Consequently, the realization of Presidents Bush's pledge to support our countries and the principles that inspired his November 1, 1989 "Andean Initiative" can best be achieved through legislation providing greater investment and access to U.S. markets. A legislative package, oriented in that direction, will surely reflect his commitments and materialize his political will.

Given that the initiatives enclosed are of crucial importance to the Colombian Government, we are willing to cooperate as much as possible in the design, scope and drafting of the associated trade, investment and economic legislative measures required. Our trade and economic staff is available at any time to consult with your staff or the staff of participating U.S. trade agencies.

I look forward to meeting with you again in Washington in April at your convenience.

I recently learned that Wallace Stickey, a senior New Hampshire transportation official is the leading candidate for the position of Director of the Federal Emergency Management Agency (FEMA). As the Administration continues its efforts to fill the leadership posts at FEMA, I wanted to offer my highest recommendation on behalf of Albert G. Kirchner, Jr., who is seeking the top position in the United States Fire Administration.



Enclosed is a schedule which includes our seminars and conferences that are held in Aspen, and we would be glad to provide you and your staff with whatever additional information you may desire.

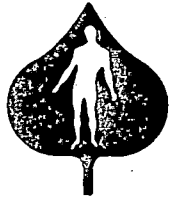

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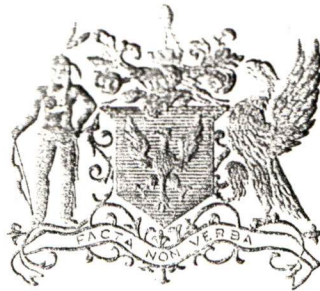

I apologize for not contacting you directly, however, I'm in Eastern Europe, and this matter needs your immediate attention. I am very concerned that, because of the delay at DOT regarding the sale of Eastern's South American Division to American, Eastern may be forced into Chapter 7 liquidation, jeopardizing the jobs of 18,000 employees, many of whom live and work in South Florida. Further, because South American operations are focused on Miami, Eastern's ability to consummate this transaction is of profound importance to the Florida economy.

It is imperative that DOT reach a decision by March 29. Further delay in obtaining DOT approval could be fatal. Eastern needs to be out of South America by the summer for its reorganization plan to hold together. Because of the fleet and crew scheduling exigencies present at all airlines and the necessity to obtain foreign government approval after DOT approves, failure to obtain DOT approval by the end of March will prevent American from being able to operate into South America this summer. This could mean the end of Eastern, and a substantial disruption in air service between Miami and all of Latin America.

On Monday, I hope to speak with Secretary Skinner by phone regarding this critical concern. Thank you for your attention to this matter.




I write with reference to the upcoming negotiations with The Netherlands regarding rights for new air services to the United States.

It is my understanding that KLM Royal Dutch Airlines is extremely interested in beginning non-stop service from Amsterdam to Kansas City. However, under current U.S. Department of Transportation policy, authority to operate new airline routes is being granted for only one year. With economic unification of the European Community in 1992 nearly upon us, and with an international airline route into the midst of Europe, America's heartland economy could be better positioned to take full advantage of that market worth \$4 trillion annually with 320 million consumers.

It is my belief that the Midwest can contribute greatly to the reduction of both the enormous budget deficit and the trade deficit. An "open skies" policy on the part of the United States is just one more tool which could help our agricultural and industrial capacities do just that.

I respectfully request our negotiators to offer an "open skies" policy to The Netherlands and KLM.

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**MEMORANDUM**

SUBJECT: Food Safety and the Suspension Problem

This memorandum is a fuller explanation of our earlier conversation on the food safety question and the unresolved difficulty with the suspension issue.

Food safety as it has been defined in the present context is really two separate debates involving the Delaney Clause in the Federal Food Drug and Cosmetics Act (FFDCA) and cancellation/suspension in the Federal Insecticide Fungicide and Rodenticide Act (FIFRA). When Secretary Sullivan and Administrator Reilly indicated that the outstanding problem in food safety was national uniformity of tolerances, they were referring to the FFDCA portion of the debate and the concerns of Messrs. Kennedy and Waxman. The major problem that we Republicans brought to the White House in February was disagreement with the EPA proposal on suspension in FIFRA.

In FIFRA suspension is utilized by EPA when a pesticide is deemed to carry an immediate risk that will impact humans or the environment during the period required for an ordinary cancellation. When such an "imminent hazard" is identified and determined to outweigh the benefits of the pesticide, EPA has the extraordinary power to remove the chemical from the market immediately, subject only to court review after the fact. While suspension authority is a powerful weapon, we agree that it is needed to protect the public in rare circumstances.

EPA has resorted to suspension only sparingly over the years, and when properly applied, it is an effective tool. Revision of suspension has never been an issue until last year when EPA began to talk of new suspension authority "to deal with the heavy workload caused by reregistration" and "to address public confidence issues like Alar on apples." Apparently EPA is seeking a "magic bullet" to make its workload and media problems disappear. The solution they have proposed would jeopardize the entire food delivery system to achieve their goal.

The proposal offered by EPA on suspension would lower the standard for suspension, replacing the present well-understood terminology with undefined and weak words like "substantial risk" and "less than substantial but significant risk." Their proposal would also create two levels of suspension and eliminate the consideration of benefits in one level. In sum, our examination of EPA's suspension proposal leads us to the conclusion that, if it were adopted, it would be easier for EPA to suspend a pesticide than to cancel it (the exactly opposite outcome a reasonable person would expect).

Opposition to the suspension proposal is uniform and adamant throughout the agriculture and food community. Deputy Secretary of Agriculture Jack Parnell was told on several occasions by representatives of farmers, chemical manufacturers and food processors that this approach to suspension was completely unacceptable. Over sixty House members, including nearly every member of the Agriculture Committee from both sides of the aisle, have cosponsored H.R. 3292 which deliberately does not change the standard for suspension, though it does remove one significant procedural impediment to its use. When EPA and USDA were questioned on the Administration language last week before an agriculture subcommittee in the House, several sharp questions were posed on suspension, and the answers given did not satisfy the bipartisan questioners.

The agriculture community will ~~not~~ support the President's initiative in the FFDCA area enthusiastically, especially uniform tolerances. The proposals for FIFRA can all survive the legislative process in recognizable form, **except suspension.** This suspension proposal is now seen as an attempt by EPA to gain a great deal more power to eliminate pesticides without the responsibility of defending its actions prior to taking action.

The fear is that at the first sign of intense media pressure, without regard to sound and thorough science, EPA would use this greatly expanded suspension authority to rid itself of a problem pesticide. In that kind of environment, farmers and consumers could not depend on chemical companies to invest the tens of millions of dollars necessary to sustain existing pesticides or develop new ones. Without these chemical inputs food price increases would seriously depress the standard of living for poor and working Americans and this country would no longer be a major exporter of food for trade and hunger relief.

Congress has already yielded to EPA requests for reregistration fees, for further registration maintenance fees, and for relief from the requirement to indemnify those holding stocks of suspended pesticides. We are now prepared, at their request, to streamline cancellation and make other adjustments in the registration process. The agriculture and food community is not, however, prepared to grant EPA the authority to regulate according to media pressure or the perceived need to lighten their workload.






I thought you would be interested in the enclosed lecture delivered recently at the Heritage Foundation by Reed Larson, President of the National Right to Work Legal Defense Foundation. Larson points out that the disproportionate influence of labor unions in the political process and the abuses of power at their members' expense is a product of the National Labor Relations Act passed by Congress in 1935.

He argues that the "injustice to America's working people and the resultant damage it imposes on our political system is a direct outgrowth of federal law." Individual rights have been compromised by the monopoly power of unions in collective bargaining situations. The practical consequence: union members must pay dues to keep their jobs.

Larson also decries the ever growing political power of the labor unions, which spend a far larger share of their dues receipts for political purposes than for collective bargaining.



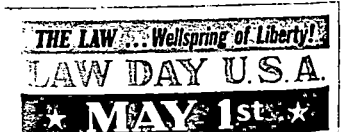
The advantages:



RE: EPA's incorrect implementation of the Clean Water Act.

Dear Dr. Sununu:

A recent article in INSIGHT magazine portrays you as an anti-environmentalist. But as an engineer, specialized in sewage treatment, I think it is time that somebody burst EPA's hot air balloon, in spite of the air pollution it will create.

I am very much in favor of projects that will protect our environment, but they should be based on science and technology and certainly not emotion and publicity. The Clean Water program has been and still is a failure because EPA did not understand the test which it selected to become the backbone of its entire water pollution program. Every first year student will understand the problems this creates, but EPA insists that it hasn't done anything wrong and continues the incorrect use of the test. A similar attitude, unfortunately is also exhibited by the "professionals" employed in the environment industries. What ever happened to the first code of ethics of a professional engineer, which states that his action should always be in the interest of the general public.

Enclosed is some information dealing with this issue. I haven't been very successful in bringing this issue to the attention of individuals who are in a position to correct it. Most claim incompetence by ignorance. The Subcommittee on Water Resources is going to hold hearings to re-authorize of the Clean Water Act and staff members assured me that I will get the opportunity to address the members of the committee. IF this happens, it will restore my faith in the system. Personally I am skeptical that this will happen since the EPA and many other interest groups will do anything in their power to prevent such an exposure of the facts. Nobody likes to admit that a billion dollar federal program was a total failure and a horrendous waste of public funds, especially not when one has to admit that this was caused by the lack of understanding of a test.

It only proves that a little knowledge is more dangerous than no knowledge at all.

I hope you can find some time to read the enclosed information. And I don't think that the media still would portray you as an anti-environmentalist, if you decide to take action to correct this situation.

Dear John:

It's been a long time since we have spoken, but I have followed your accomplishments in Washington with pride.

I am writing you because I need your help on a very important issue. Medical professional liability is the most severe problem facing all physicians today. It is having a profoundly adverse effect on the quality, delivery, and cost of health care in the United States.

President Bush spent a good deal of time on this issue last week when he delivered an address at John Hopkins University. In particular, he complained about the enormous cost of defensive medicine.

A distinguished Boston surgeon and personal friend of mine Barry M. Manuel, President Elect of the Mass. Medical Society, has for several years advocated a unique plan to remove professional liability from the tort system. It is a plan similar to the Workingman's Compensation and the Federal Government's Vaccine Compensation Bill. His plan was recently published in a scholarly article in the New England Journal of Medicine, and has received a great deal of attention.

If you could possibly spare some time, I would love to bring Dr. Manuel with me to Washington to explain his proposal in person. This is a very important and timely issue given the rising cost of health care and the amount that wasteful defensive medicine contributes to that cost.
