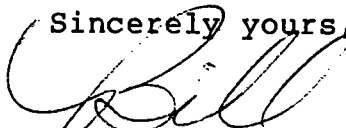
Dear John, Nancy, Elizabeth, Christopher and Peter:

Dear Governor Sununu,

I am a member of the National Council on the Arts, having been appointed by President Reagan for a term running from 1984-1990, and I served by appointment by President Carter from 1978 to 1984 on the National Council on the Humanities. Only one other person has served on both Councils (I. M. Pei). I am writing to you because I am deeply concerned by the unfolding of events over the past twelve months, and because I think we have to do everything we possibly can to calm the waters, before any long-term solution can be addressed.

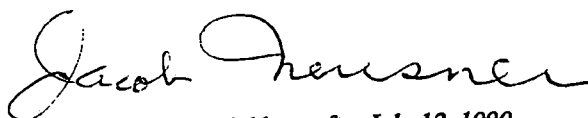
As a Republican and a conservative, I am part of a small minority on the Council, and I hope that the President will fill the two open places with artists (not "public" like me) who are conservative in politics (I don't care about their conservatism in the arts). We have no more than four sure votes among the 26 at this time.

My second suggestion for your consideration is that we make no chances at this time, simply pass a budget for FY 1992 (with the President's numbers in tact), and come back to this next year. At the same time, the President should urge a measure of tact and discretion on the Chairman, whom I like, respect, and support. For the coming year, avoid giving patent offense to anybody. It can be done. Chairman Cheney at NEH routinely withholds grants of which she does not approve, and makes grants of which panel and Council may not have approved; it is in the end the chairman's responsibility to do or not to do.

Nothing constructive can emerge from the present climate, in which (in my view) a radical part of the arts community will not rest until they have offended everybody else in the country, in the name of art (and that does not concern me) and on taxpayer funds (and that does concern me). What is within the law or what is "necessary" or what is a defiance of "censorship" — these are not at stake. All I want to see is a span of time in which things calm down, so we can plan reasonably and rationally for the next twenty-five years. I favor the arts and the Endowment, freedom from censorship, and freedom from federal support for what is patently offensive. I am confident that is precisely the position of not only the President but also the political consensus from Senator Pell to Senator Helms, and I have spoken to the staff of both senators often enough to know that they concur.

If I can be of service to you in any way, please let me know.

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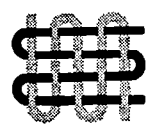

The main event was our conference in Honolulu, which attracted an enthusiastic audience and made many friends for the Council. 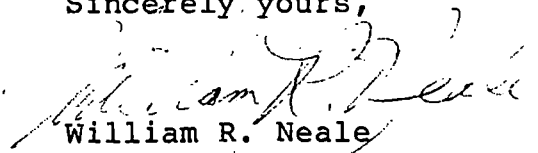

Dear Mr. Sununu,

I could have given this letter to George Pfau, an old friend of both President Bush and my husband, to make sure that it got to you through all the right channels. But that isn't what this letter is all about. It's not about using influential friends and making people pay attention. In fact, it's quite the opposite. It is about someone who is bright, but powerless, knowing enough to ask for help from someone who is much brighter and infinitely more experienced and powerful.

I don't even know the right questions, but let me explain the situation, and if you'll tell me what to do, I'll do it.

I decided you were my hope on May 5, 1990 at Aptos Middle School in San Francisco when Nancy Pelosi said how much she disliked you and wailed about what an awful person you were for not returning her telephone calls. She also said one of her congressional district's priorities should be to "get that man Bush out of office."

So why do I need your help and advice? My husband, Alan Nichols, is running as the Republican candidate against Pelosi in California's 5th Congressional District. There are 300,000 registered voters in the district. If we get a 50% turnout in November it will be considered high. That means 150,000 votes cast, and 75,001 needed to win. There are 57,000 registered Republicans in the district. If we can get 40,000 Republicans to vote for Alan and pick up 35,001 conservative Democratic and independent (independents outnumber registered Republicans) votes we can take the district away from Pelosi. Unfortunately, Republicans have not won an election in San Francisco in over 25 years. Our team has tried and tried to get something going - but the apathy is spirit crushing.

When I called Congressman Bill Thomas' office in Bakersfield for help, they were kind, but the reaction was "how nice that you're trying, but you know you can't win." I was furious when Congressman Tom Campbell, who is a real nice guy, came in to the 5th and raised a pile of money, yet when our fund raiser called,

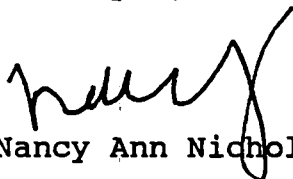
it's always "well, you can't win against Pelosi..." We're not targeted either by the state or national Republican organizations.

Maybe I'm just too stupid to know that we can't win. But I love my husband and I just won't accept the fact that Pelosi should be allowed to humiliate him. He is an outstanding candidate Republicans can be proud of. I know I'm aggressive and tenacious. I was that way once before. It was when my youngest son, Mac, was critically injured in an automobile accident. All his doctors said I would have to accept his probable death, and if he survived, severe brain damage and retardation. Well, Mac and me, we didn't believe that and just kept on working on his getting well. He is now in the 6th grade and doing just fine for a 12 year old. I don't think I was wrong to put up a fight then, and I don't think I'm wrong to put up a fight now.

Why is it that everyone feels that the seat should be Pelosi's without a real challenge? Is there some way to come up with state and national Republican support? When I went into this I wanted it to be fun. I wanted it to be something our family could share doing. Every campaign is hard, hard, work. But as the underdog we should be able to go all out and take chances and make extraordinary things happen. I want to take care of my husband, who is a tough and gutsy campaigner, as well as do the best I can for him. If we lose, it should be with class and style. And if we win... well, that really would be something!

Please, what should I do?

I had occasion to meet several senior American officials associated with President Reagan at the Toronto Economic Summit held here in June, 1988. I was pleased to attend the Summit as an observer, and with my particular interest in political leadership I found the chance to meet White House officials of tremendous interest indeed.

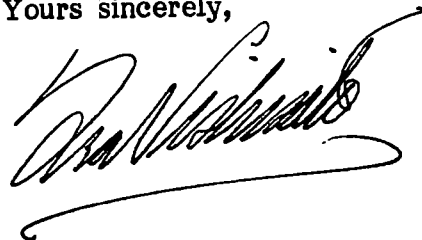
The approach of President Bush is, as I view it, distinctively impressive. The type of intense personal commitment he represents—and the stability that he has maintained—is, to be sure, to the envy of his colleagues. I well remember at the 1988 Toronto Economic Summit those visitors who were confounded by the formidable American delegation of over 900 members. The degree of preparedness was certainly unparalleled!

While I profess a certain cognition of executive structures and mechanisms, I am particularly interested in the American approach that has influenced many of our Canadian practices. As I will be in Washington for much of May and June, I was wondering whether you might consider receiving me for a few moments at which time I might pose a few questions about the operation of the White House and the senior executive in your capital. I was just a little way down from you at the Skydome game - yet too far to come and introduce myself. I hope the Blue Jays' victory made it into the National Security briefing, and that you liked the stadium.

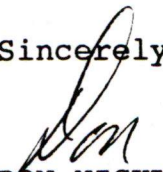

THE PRESIDENT'S LETTER

Dear John:

Since this "President's Letter" was initiated in February of 1989, the number of persons receiving the letter has grown. Currently approximately 200 persons receive the letter by virtue of their being members of the CSFA Governing Board, National Advisory Board, Trustees Honor Roll, Trustees Emeriti, special corporate, foundation, or individual financial supporters of our work and service, Volunteer Service Area Representatives, special friends of the organization, or other individuals who have demonstrated strong interest in CSFA's mission. We are grateful for this growing support.

Dollars for Scholars Growth. With steady growth in each of the regions served by CSFA Program Development Officers (Julie Scullard in New York State, Nancy Mead in Indiana, Curt Trygstad in the Upper Midwest, and now Steve Pratt in New England), the number of Dollars for Scholars chapters has grown to 490 as of April 30. Growth has been especially rapid in Iowa (12 chapters since January 1, stimulated by a special challenge grant from the McElroy Trust). Also, the first Dollars for Scholars chapter has been formed in South Dakota! CSFA now has Dollars for Scholars affiliates in 32 states, plus the District of Columbia. We are planning to reach 500 chapters by the end of this fiscal year.

New England Regional Office. CSFA's New England Dollars for Scholars Regional Office was officially launched with a special reception in Newton, Massachusetts on April 3. Steve Pratt has been hired to give service to the existing 100 chapters in the six New England states and to create and develop new Dollars for Scholars foundations throughout the region. Special efforts will be made to initiate Dollars for Scholars chapters in New England's urban minority communities.

California. Great news! The Irvine Foundation has recently announced a grant of \$100,000 to CSFA to help establish a new regional office in California. The Irvine grant is aimed especially at creating new Dollars for Scholars foundations in urban minority communities in Southern California. Part of the grant will allow CSFA to develop a new guidebook for chapters to provide academic support to local youth. Additional funds are being sought from other California funders in hopes of embarking on the new program by this coming fall.

Growth in Student Aid Management Services. This fiscal year we have already reached our goal of 55 new corporate-sponsored programs to be managed by our Scholarship Management Services unit. Six new programs have been added to the management roster of our Education Grants/Innovative Services unit, surpassing our goal of four new programs. Two new programs are especially significant. Marlys Johnson and a team of CSFA staff members have helped National Medical Enterprises design a major scholarship/loan forgiveness program designed to recruit and upgrade nurses and other medical personnel for NME facilities throughout the nation. Marlys and Program Development Officer Jon Lavin have helped to design and implement a major new scholarship program that will be part of a nationwide marketing program for a pharmaceutical company. This extensive, unique program will be announced this fall. CSFA now manages over 335 corporate-sponsored student aid programs.

Preliminary Steps Toward a Capital Campaign. CSFA has never undertaken a full-fledged capital campaign. And yet, if we are going to be able to extend our mission, service, and outreach to communities throughout this country, we will need to raise significant endowment funding. Because of our rapid growth, we will also soon need an additional building at CSFA headquarters. The CSFA Governing Board at its February meeting authorized the first steps toward organizing a capital campaign by electing Honor Roll Trustee Ralph Seifert chair of the campaign and agreeing to seek an outside consulting firm to conduct a campaign feasibility study.

The Impact of Scholarships. While the above news concerning CSFA's program growth is exciting, the "real news" must always focus on the impact on students. A recent study by Case Western Reserve University showed that Cleveland public school students who attended college with significant scholarship help and good academic counseling graduated from college at rates 60 percent above the national average. A recent national study reported in the Journal of Student Financial Aid reported the "inescapable conclusion that all forms of student aid have a positive influence on persistence" of students through the college years. What CSFA is doing makes a real difference in not only getting students to college but motivating them to complete college!

I called your office Friday and they asked me to follow up my inquiry with a fax. It concerns the possibility of Mr. Sununu's participation in an ad hoc industry group meeting in Washington on the morning of Monday, June 4, 1990.

The last time I hosted John was here at MIT when he gave a guest lecture on how government officials should handle the press in Ed Diamond's course on media and politics. I believe John's son was taking the course at the time. That may seem like ancient history now, and in any event, I have a new request.

For the past year I have been chairing an Ad Hoc Industry/Academic/Policy Group which has been meeting in Washington every month for an off-the-record discussion of developments in advanced communications electronics and the prospect for a resurgence of American industrial activity and trade. As you know, American industry has conceded the consumer electronics field to off-shore

manufacturing and may soon do the same in computers and telecommunications. The 25 participants include members of Congress, congressional staff, DOD and DOS staff, senior industry executives and some academic leaders who have been active in this area.

Mr. Sununu is well-known for his opposition to intrusive industrial policy and winner-picking in the high tech marketplace, so his participation in this group on this issue may be a bit like entering the lions den. John has never shied away from lions, in any case, but I think what is needed here is a meeting of the minds rather than a beating of the drums. And I think this informal and off-the-record setting may be an ideal forum for addressing what industry (and a number of those on the hill) see as a critical policy area for the administration. Two recent issues of particular concern are the FCC's inchoate policy on HDTV and the strong signals being sent by the recent departure of Craig Fields from DARPA.

I hope it will be possible for Mr. Sununu to spend an hour with us that morning for informal discussion. I'll call your office shortly to see if his schedule might permit it.

The Rutland, Vermont region is mired in a unique redevelopment dilemma. At issue is a proposed regional shopping center linked with a downtown revitalization program that could collectively bring about direct economic investment of over \$80 million. Some key facts surrounding the situation are:

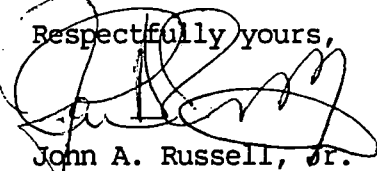
1. Officials of Rutland Town and the City of Rutland, regional planning agencies, Vermont's congressional delegation and Governor Kunin herself have endorsed the proposed center and associated wetlands mitigation program.
2. The proposed shopping center won the unanimous approval of the state Act 250 District Environmental Commission and the consent of the Vermont Agency of Natural Resources whose experts deemed the wetlands on the shopping center site to be non-significant.
3. The Corps official charged with reviewing the proposed shopping center effectively ignored the Act 250 testimony and findings including those of the state wetlands coordinator, Dr. Carl Pagel, and the developer's consultants and accorded special interest groups the clout of a state agency. The same Corps official prejudiced the review process by prematurely releasing his recommendation to the public.

The upshot of this dilemma is that two local governments, a region and a state are losing their self-determination and control to the Federal Government when there is no federal issue. Those of us who have spent the past four years trying to rejuvenate our regional and state economy continue to marvel at the obstacles we have faced trying to build projects that are environmentally and economically sound, and almost universally supported.

Colonel Daniel Wilson of the Corp's New England Division Engineer will issue a final decision sometime before June 1st on whether to deny use of the nationwide permit for which the developers feel they have qualified. Finally, we admire your courage in working for a balance between economic and environmental priorities, and thank you for your time and consideration of our request.

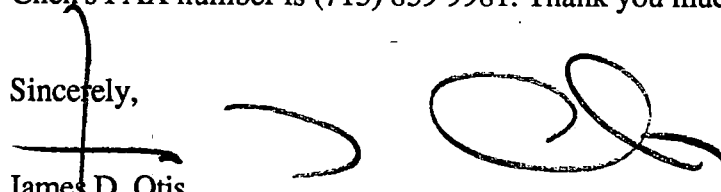

Dear Governor Sununu,

I am writing to ask for consideration of help to The Milton S. Eisenhower Foundation as I am Co-Chairman of the Foundation's Board of Trustees and have been active in its work since its founding in 1981.

And I write as a 40-year resident of New Hampshire, from 1942 until 1982 when I retired as Rector of St. Paul's School and moved here to the coast of Maine.

During this period I was active in several projects you know well. I was one of the founders of the Advanced Studies Program, in 1957, in which several of your children studied summers. Randy Bell brought you to the School one time where the three of us talked in the Rector's office about fund raising for the ASP.

Also, I was one of the founders of Channel 11, the State PBS TV station, working with Jere Chase. And I worked over the years with Governors (John King, Walter Peterson) in securing state funding for the station. After receiving my doctorate from Harvard, following extensive educational study and work, I was asked over the years by many Commissioners of Education to help with state sponsored studies, the most recent coming in 1983 after we had moved here, a study sponsored by the University of New Hampshire, with Dick Goodman as Director.

One of my prized possessions is a certificate in celebration of excellence in education, given me on May 11, 1985, which you signed as Governor, and signed also by my old friend, Bob Brunelle, the Commissioner. I am enclosing a copy of this certificate as a pleasant reminder of our association.

But enough of this. I had wanted, though, to mention the many points at which our paths have crossed in years past, most recently when with Dick Goodman our Commission members presented our report to you in your office.

The Eisenhower Foundation. We are in an unusual position. I shall mention the broad outlines of our situation only, as the details can be available through Committee records. In brief, this is the situation.

The Eisenhower Foundation was mentioned specifically with a recommendation for a grant of \$500,000 in the Conference Report accompanying HR2991, the FY 1990 Appropriations bill that included the Department of Justice.

4.20.90

I enclose a letter dated March 8, 1990, to Attorney General Thornburgh from Rep. Rangel and Rep. Coughlin indicating bi-partisan support for consideration of the award of \$500,000 to the Eisenhower Foundation.

The matter of the grant is now before the Justice Department. The Foundation has determined the regular way of making application for this grant and has followed the suggested procedures. The Foundation has had discussions with Assistant Attorney General Abel and with Mr. Gerald Reiger.

Also, I have written to Robert S. Ross, Jr., Executive Assistant to the Attorney General, whom I knew when he was a student at St. Paul's School for four years, graduating in 1962.

To date there has not been a favorable decision for Eisenhower.

I am writing now to ask you if you can help me and the Foundation. Why am I taking your time on a reasonably small matter? I can state it is because I believe it is in the national interest, and that this is a pressing and significant matter.

Eisenhower's programs, praised by Rangel and Coughlin, are described at some length in testimony of Dr. Lynn A. Curtis, the Foundation's President, before the Select Committee on Narcotics Abuse and Control of the United States House of Representatives, on November 15, 1989. I enclose a copy of that testimony.

The National Drug Strategy points in a number of directions that must be followed vigorously. At the same time, Eisenhower's program points in directions that are substantively different. 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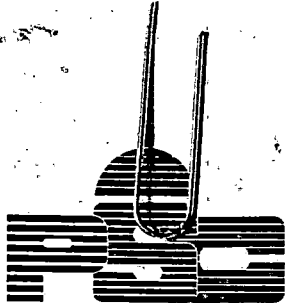

I miss you in the Governor's seat, but I am very happy with the great job you are doing for our country.

After a great deal of careful local and state planning and decision-making, Vermont's Rutland Region is poised for sweeping revitalization that hinges on the concurrent building of a new regional mall in Rutland Town and the redevelopment of a blighted 20-acre shopping center site in Rutland City's downtown district.

What is unique about this situation is that both communities overwhelmingly support both projects; in fact, downtown interests are championing the mall one mile to the south rather than fighting it, as one might expect. Equally notable is the fact that one developer, Finard-Zamias Associates is planning both projects.

In addition to enjoying broad local support, the mall has been endorsed by Governor Kunin; members of the congressional delegation; numerous local and regional agencies; the Rutland Herald; and over 6000 residents who signed a petition last month. The project also won unanimous approval in the State's rigorous Act 250 process and received the approval of water quality experts from the State Agency of Natural Resources, an agency known for tough environment scrutiny.

The situation would be ideal if not for the Army Corps of Engineers-New England Division's failure thus far to allow the use of a nationwide permit for filling what amounts to an eight-acre wet meadow on the mall site. The developers believe they comply fully with the terms of the nationwide permit and have offered to undertake a broad mitigation program, yet have been disallowed the use of their permit.

The Corps recently set a precedent in the Suffield (Connecticut) Prison case in which they granted a Nationwide permit to fill 9.75 acres, and ignored the project's indirect impact on 25 acres of wetlands on the site. In Rutland the same Corps District Engineer is making the case for protecting just 16 acres of wetlands that will be indirectly impacted by development.

Clearly, the Federal government, through the Corps of Engineers, holds the key (not withstanding clear local and state consideration of all environmental concerns) to economic survival in an area that is feeling the shockwaves of New England's downturn. Without the prompt qualification to use the Nationwide permit, the region and much of southern Vermont will sacrifice new jobs, tax revenues and myriad long-term benefits that would vastly improve the quality of life and carry the area through slow economic times.

The Corp's New England Division Engineer is now reviewing the District Engineer's recommendation to deny use of the Nationwide permit. I am appealing to you to help in the task of building a strong Rutland Region. Please consider reviewing the points presented in this letter with Colonel Daniel Wilson, Division Engineer, 242 Trapelo Road, Waltham, MA, 02254-9149; 617-647-8220. He must hear the message that the economic, social and environmental benefits of well planned and controlled growth far outweigh the preservation of an old farm field and the value of conducting a full public interest review.

We wish to express our sincere appreciation for the time which you took to discuss with us textile and apparel trade as it relates to the Uruguay Round of Multilateral Trade Negotiations.

While we made clear in our meeting with you our opposition to a global quota system, we want to assure you that we are willing to work with you on developing any viable method for taking us from the present regulated market under the Multifiber Arrangement to a free and open market in textile and apparel trade.

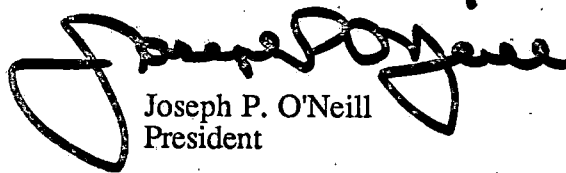
We feel the following are fundamental principles and objectives against which any transition mechanism should be measured:

- Any transition system for textile and apparel trade should immediately decrease -- not increase -- the cost to the consumer.
- There should be no abrupt or drastic changes, but the mechanism should be a continuous phase out that is completed within the transition period.
- Such a system should be flexible enough to accommodate fashion swings and should be manageable and administratively efficient, and not create a new bureaucracy to administer it.
- A date should be set by which the MFA and trade in textiles and apparel will be completely under the auspices of the General Agreement on Tariffs and Trade (GATT).

The American retail industry buys virtually all of the apparel and a sizable portion of the textiles produced in the United States. We feel that we have much in common with the domestic producers and urge you to promote a joint meeting in the next 30 days, under the direction of the Administration, to discuss the policies and positions to which we may all give common assent and to attempt to lower the rhetoric and political posturing which may in the end injure U.S. interests in the Uruguay Round of Trade Negotiations.

The retail industry considers itself allies and supporters of the Administration and continues to strongly support the position President Bush espoused during the campaign on textiles and apparel. We stand ready to enlist our industry's 18 million employees to provide the political support necessary to carry out your policy objectives, and look forward to working with you on the development of a trade policy that will benefit all Americans.
