Dear Governor Sununu:

Tuesday, The Washington Post asked that you use the Social Security Trust Fund to reduce the Federal budget deficit. Of course, it is not legally allowable to use Trust Fund revenue for non-Social Security purposes. What the "Post" and others who hold the same view are really asking is that OASI cost-of-living adjustments (COLAs) be cut in order to add to the existing Trust Fund surplus. This surplus, in turn, is loaned to the general fund and then masks the true size of the deficit.

The National Council of Senior Citizens (NCSC) strongly objects to any Social Security COLA cut. To do so would be false deficit reduction, while pushing almost 500,000 elderly and disabled Americans into poverty. Senior citizens are willing to bear the same burden any other American in similar circumstances is asked to in order to reduce the deficit. However, the Social Security system is not in deficit. It has a \$65 billion surplus. NCSC hopes that you will oppose use of this smoke and mirrors gimmick for deficit reduction which will cause very real pain for our nation's senior and disabled citizens.

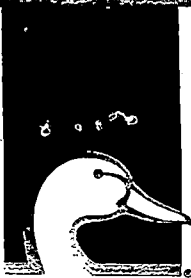

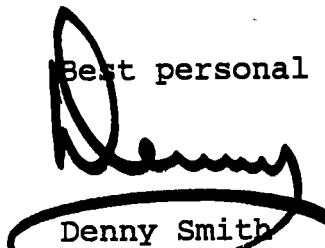
Just a quick word of thanks and appreciation for all that you personally did on my behalf to make the President's trip to Oregon helpful to my reelection.

There are still incredible problems, and if you get a chance to visit with Deb Anderson, she will tell you all about it. The fact is, the small upper basin states were getting screwed, and we haven't got the votes to stop it. Politically you have a lot of friends downstream getting hurt too. It is incredible to me that the upper basin states absolutely get taken advantage of year after year in this whole Pick Sloan Project.

Because of the drought, the difficulty with the production sector, and OPEC dumping, I am now running the state with the same dollars with which it was run in 1981, the equivalent of a 35-40% cut. I don't know how much longer I can keep this up. I am working my rear off to maintain sanity here; but it is not easy. When you have a developing tourism industry that gets capriciously crippled by support for a minuscule downstream shipping industry, it is hard to take. People here are actually talking about blowing up the dam, and it is unfortunate when such stages of anger are reached, but it is to that level.

At any rate we will keep on fighting. I would appreciate any help you can give us along the way.

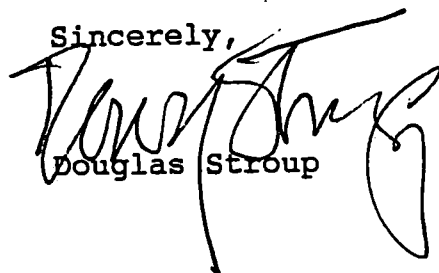

Dear John:

I am sure that you are aware of the increasing problems facing many New Hampshire banks. Some of our largest banks or bank holding companies are being subjected to very close scrutiny by the Federal regulators because of their substantial losses, primarily in real estate investments, and I understand that one or more of these may not survive.

The regulators are putting pressure on all of our banks now as a result of the failures which have occurred across the country. At first glance, this would seem to be an understandable action to help to correct the problem. However in actuality, at least here in New Hampshire, it is having a severely depressing effect, not only on the banks, healthy and unhealthy, but also on business in general.

In addition to banking, the businesses particularly hard-hit are realtors and builders. As the regulators have clamped down, the availability of money for buying or building has decreased. Even worse, the supply of money for the normal needs of all business is also low and businesses are having problems financing cash flow requirements.

I am sure that you are aware of the problem, although you may not realize how serious it is. It is the hope of those of us in state leadership that the regulators will ease up on the pressure being applied before serious damage is done to the economy.

We would appreciate any help that you might give us in resolving this problem, John.

I'm writing to express Caterpillar's concerns regarding the "Civil Rights Act of 1990" (S.2104 and H.R.4000). As you know, proponents claim this measure would simply restore certain plaintiffs' rights in alleged discrimination cases. They argue these rights were lost as a result of five 1989 Supreme Court decisions.

Rather than being restorative, these bills would have a far-reaching and harmful impact on U.S. business. They represent a major rewrite of Title VII of the Civil Rights Act of 1964. As such, they would open up a new area of employment law.

A major concern is the provision allowing compensatory and punitive damages under Title VII. Existing remedies under this section are aimed at "conciliation" -- bringing the parties together. These remedies are limited to "make whole" relief -- such as promotion, reinstatement, back pay, along with injunctive relief and attorneys fees. Judges make awards based on the original statute and developing case law. This makes for timely and fair resolution of plaintiffs claims ... which is in keeping with the original intent of Title VII.

The pending legislation goes far beyond existing practice and remedies. Instead of conciliation, it would promote lengthy, costly litigation. It would provide for jury trials, which would substantially delay resolution of claims. Plaintiffs could be awarded large sums in the form of compensatory and

punitive damages. Plaintiff's attorneys, seeing the potential for huge awards, could "go through the motions" of conciliation with a goal of getting before a jury.

This change in remedies represents a major departure from the congressional intent of Title VII -- and of the past 26 years of application. Further, it calls into question an agreement made by the White House -- and supported by Caterpillar and other businesses -- on remedies in the Americans with Disabilities Act (ADA). That agreement removed jury trials and damages as remedies in favor of the "make-whole" remedies contained in Title VII.

We only have to look at huge costs associated with medical malpractice and product liability to see the road we're headed down if compensatory and punitive damages are allowed under Title VII.

Another unwarranted change is extension of the time period for filing charges in Title VII cases -- from 180 days to two years. This extension would make charges more difficult to investigate -- further prolonging final settlement.

Those parts of the legislation aimed at last year's Supreme Court decisions also are troublesome -- none more so than language addressing the Wards Cove v. Atonio decision. Requiring an employer to prove that each of its employment practices "bears a substantial and demonstrable relationship to effective job performance" would provide a formidable challenge to business. The burden of proof would then rest with employers to defend each and every employment practice.

Caterpillar's experience in recruiting for jobs in skilled trades demonstrates the problem. For example, electricians, millwrights, and machine repair trades currently have few women and minorities among their ranks.

Under S.2104/H.R.4000, it could be claimed that Caterpillar's employment practices are discriminatory because of under-representation in such skilled trades, relative to other employee groups or the local

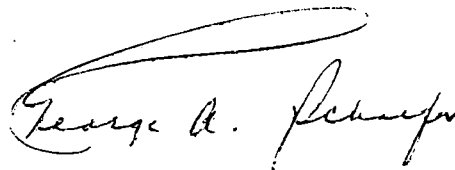
labor market. The company then would have to prove to a jury that its employment practices -- including testing for mechanical aptitude -- bear a "substantial and demonstrable relationship" to effective job performance.

In an attempt to avoid a glut of discrimination claims, I suspect that we and other employers would find ourselves "hiring by the numbers" -- quotas -- to match the local labor market.

Caterpillar has been actively opposing the bill for the past several weeks and will continue to do so. If the "Civil Rights Act of 1990" reaches the President's desk, we urge him to veto it, unless -- at a minimum -- the concerns outlined above have been addressed.

Dear John:

I have hesitated to write to you until now for I have some idea how busy you are. First, I want to again congratulate you on your selection by President Bush to head his executive office, a sensitive and creative challenge. Press and TV reports show how active you are in many demanding situations. The following is an appeal to you as an engineer.

My real objective in writing to you, in my capacity as a citizen and a civil engineer, is serious concern for our environment's condition and our need to do all we can to protect it for future generations: i.e., water and air quality, acid rain and water resources. Included in the latter, specifically, is my understanding that Federal support of surface water data collection, is facing a critical cut-back as it has for the past several years. I understand the administration's request for the Federal State Cooperative Program for stream flow data collection and analysis, the essential support of the nation's historical stream flow gauging network, is only \$56.15 million or \$4.27 million (7%) below the \$60.42 million needed to continue the current, minimal services. This may seem to be a small cut in such a tremendous Federal budget but it is critical here; it would result in the closing of about 700 continuous recording stations, or 18% of all the historical, continuous recording stations in the country. I know you understand the need for the continuation of these long time records if we are to design properly the facilities necessary for the maintenance of water resources, and for protection of people and their environment.

I know the budget is in a critical state, but neglecting continuation of the historical water data collection for use in water resources research, project design and flood protection is so shortsighted. The 50/50 State/Federal cooperative program relies on this U.S.G.S. budget. Please help in restoring these funds so vital to the successful implementation of the recently enacted Water Resources Development Act of 1988 (P.L. 100-676), and the Water Quality Act of 1987 (P.L. 100-4).

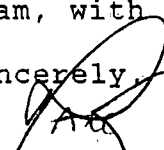

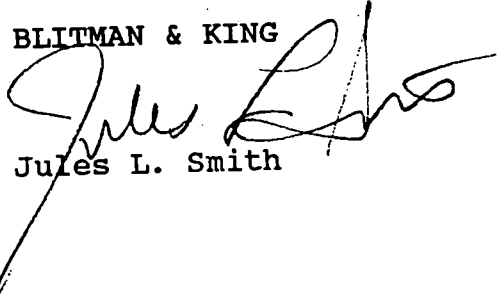
Dear Governor Sununnu:

I so very much enjoyed meeting with you at the May 15, 1990 conference with various union lawyers and union leaders. I also appreciated the opportunity to express support for the pending Civil Rights Act of 1990. As was indicated at the meeting, the labor community feels strongly that the present bill is extremely important and will not create an impediment to economic expansion as some employers seem to feel. In that regard, it is relevant to note that similar fears were expressed about affirmative action remedies at their inception. In several years after their more widespread use, many employers, particularly municipalities, determined that affirmative action had helped improve the quality of their operations. This was partly because such affirmative action required employers to formalize and objectify their hiring and promotion procedures. The result was that employees were more apt to be hired and promoted on merit.

Once again, I thank you for the opportunity to meet and discuss these various issues.

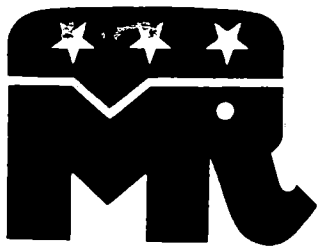

Dear Mr. Sununu:

I wish to follow-up on our recent meeting at the White House regarding the Civil Rights Act of 1990. In particular, I wish to reaffirm my comments regarding the impact on small businesses.

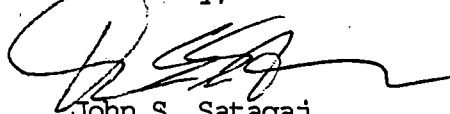
Obviously, there are many provisions of the bill that are of equal concern to big and small businesses alike, but there are two provisions which I fear shift a disproportionate burden upon the shoulders of small business.

With respect to damages, the current standard of "make whole," by its nature, takes into account the size of the business. Compensatory and punitive damages, on the other hand, are likely to result in awards of similar size, without regard to the resources of the business involved.

Second, we are concerned about the burden of proof imposed by the provisions developed in reaction to Ward's Cove. Putting aside whether the section forces the use of quotas, we fear it will make small businesses more vulnerable to equal opportunity actions, regardless of their merits, simply because small firms are less likely to have the advisors or resources to follow the technical procedures necessary to build the evidentiary case to meet the burden of proof.

As your discussions with the civil rights leadership progress, we ask you to keep these particular concerns in mind. As always, we appreciate the opportunities you provide to contribute to constructive dialogue.

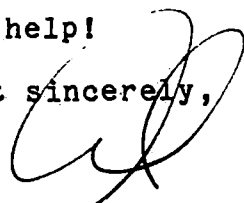
Larry handed me this the other day. He was in pain again!

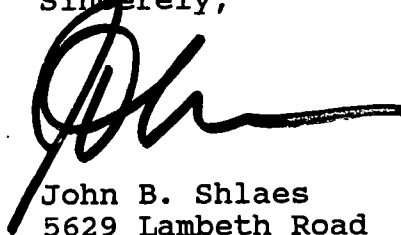

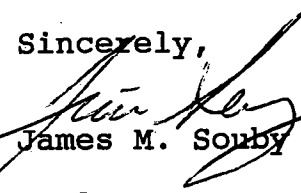

I know that many of the Republican candidates may have difficulty in the elections this November in their defense of the Republican party's position on abortion. One of the people who has written very wisely on this subject is Mary Ann Glendon, a professor at Harvard University. I am enclosing her book, Abortion and Divorce in Western Law.

In addition, at the Joseph and Rose Kennedy Institute of Ethics at Georgetown University, there is an information system where the most current information on scientific, ethical and political articles is available. These may be helpful in developing a position. I myself have been opposed to abortion and have tried to make my views known in support of human life.

One way I think abortion can be fought is to be on the side of providing good prenatal care to all pregnant women, helping to give continuing care after birth, and to educate teenage mothers, especially in the values of family, marriage, schooling and work. The Kennedy Foundation has developed a program to do just this called the "Community of Caring." I am enclosing a very brief statement describing this program.

I am actually writing to you, however, to tell you about Dr. Glendon's book and to suggest a couple of resources that may be helpful to you in developing anti-abortion strategies in the future. I know how difficult it is for politicians to deal with this issue, so we need all the help we can get.

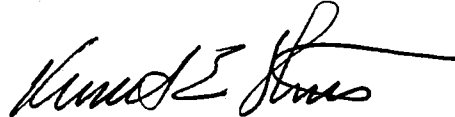

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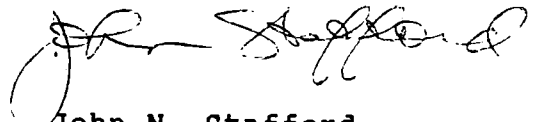

I know you are the busiest man in the country and how hard it must be to squeeze me in your schedule for five minutes. As a substitute, I hope you can take a few moments to consider this letter.

Enclosed is the way the NEW YORK TIMES reported the Administration position on the Federally-Mandated Parental (Family) Leave bill that passed the House last week. I thought the President came out very well, indeed, with the TIMES' clear, succinct statement of the Administration position. Because the President's position is unequivocal, he ended up with the high moral ground on a rather difficult issue.

What will the NEW YORK TIMES chart look like if the Hawkins-Downey-ABC bill goes to the President? I sincerely hope that the Administration's position will be just as clear and unequivocal. I suggest that the "Bush" box in the TIMES should read:

The Administration opposes the legislation on the grounds that it builds a federal baby-sitting bureaucracy to control preschool children; and that it discriminates against all other child care.

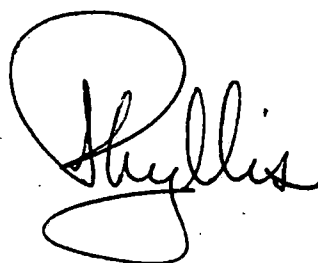
It believes any child care bill should leave 100% decision-making power in the hands of parents to choose mother care, relative care, neighborhood home care, or religious care.

Since the Administration proposal of a \$1,000 tax credit for every preschool child was rejected, and the Administration-backed compromise (Stenholm-Shaw) was defeated, the President will veto the Democrats' bill.

If Republicans try to "clean up" Hawkins-Downey, they will only muddy the waters and the Administration will end up with lots of blame and no credit. There is no way the liberals will agree to a satisfactory bill. Stenholm-Shaw was the compromise, and the liberals rejected it.

Dear Governor Sununu:

The President's nomination of Wallace Stickney to head the Federal Emergency Management Agency prompts me to express concern about a situation that could prove potentially embarrassing. While it has no direct bearing on Commissioner Stickney's qualifications, nonetheless it has, in my opinion, some serious political implications.

As you are aware, the pivotal issue in the licensing of New Hampshire Yankee's Seabrook Station was the adequacy of the federally-mandated off-site Radiological Emergency Response Plans (RERP) for the 17 New Hampshire and six Massachusetts communities within a ten mile radius of the facility. As one of the key architects of those plans and as a witness for the utility during the Atomic Safety and Licensing Board hearings, I worked closely with New Hampshire officials for more than three years to ensure that both the procedures and the personnel resources necessary to implement them were adequate, leading to the ALSB's ultimate finding that the plans provide a "reasonable assurance" that public health and safety would be protected in the event of an accident.

Implicit in that finding, and as required under FEMA/NRC regulations, the maintenance of a continuing emergency response capability by the state is a condition of Seabrook's operating license. When FEMA certified to the NRC that the New Hampshire RERP as written met the emergency planning standards imposed by NUREG-0654, it relied upon its own evaluation of the plan's implementing procedures. The supporting documentation regarding state and local emergency response capability was supplied by the utility's consultants, myself included.

During your tenure as Governor, there was little difficulty recruiting and training the necessary personnel to document the state's ability to implement the RERP. However, that situation changed dramatically during the summer and fall of 1989, and the rosters of available personnel were barely adequate when certified to FEMA in November -- before Seabrook's operating license was granted. Over the past several months, while the plant has actively engaged in power ascension activities, there has been a continuing deterioration of personnel support from among a number of key state agencies to the point that I doubt today that an audit would show the capability to fully staff the state responsibilities outlined in the RERP.

The state Office of Emergency Management and the Executive Department are aware of the situation, but have taken no steps to address it, citing budget constraints. The utility also is aware of the problem, but apparently is unable to influence remedial action. Meanwhile,

thousands of dollars of utility money, paid to the state treasury under Public Utilities Commission orders to support RERP activities, which could be used to address some of the deficiencies, has been ordered frozen by executive prerogative.

Some FEMA officials are also aware of the problem, but indicate they are not required to audit response capability on an on-going basis. I am disturbed by the apparent hypocrisy that demonstrates it is FEMA's policy to consider emergency response capability more important while a nuclear plant license is being litigated than after it is issued.

This matter represents a credibility problem for ASLB witnesses such as myself and former NHOEM Director Richard Strome, who testified under oath that the State of New Hampshire did have, and would maintain, the capability to implement the RERP in the event of an accident at Seabrook with off-site ramifications. While I can not be held culpable for actions beyond my control, I'm not sure Dick Strome, in his present position, could say the same.

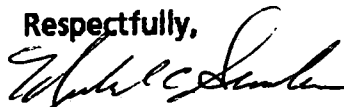
(You might also be interested in knowing that similar capability maintenance problems exist with emergency plan certifications at many other fixed operating nuclear sites nationwide which are not routinely or uniformly scrutinized by FEMA.)

The motivation for bringing this to your attention is integrity. I've worked with the nuclear industry for nearly a decade, as an overseer in state government and with FEMA, as well as in the role of a private consultant. I believe that nuclear power plants can be operated as a safe and viable source of electric energy. But I also believe that the Federal and state governments have accepted a legal and moral responsibility to adequately protect the public in the event of accident, and to the extent they fail to honor that commitment without justification, there is a legitimate basis for demanding accountability.

As I indicated at the outset, Mr. Stickney's nomination is not directly at issue here, but if the question of New Hampshire's emergency preparedness capability should arise during his confirmation hearings, it would be prudent for him to have a knowledgeable response.

If I can be of any assistance to you, Commissioner Stickney, or President Bush, please let me know.

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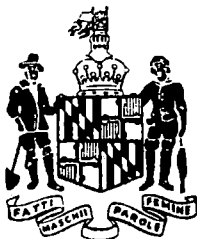

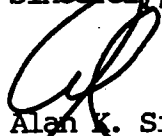

Dear Governor Sununu:

The Upper Missouri River Basin is in the third year of extreme drought conditions and we need your assistance.

The Missouri River is perhaps our most valuable regional natural resource and we are watching this river system reach new, record low levels every year. If this problem was simply caused by the drought, we would accept the whims of nature. Tragically, however, the draining of our Missouri River reservoirs is caused by the outdated management policies of the US Army Corps of Engineers.

The Missouri River dams and reservoirs have provided substantial benefits for the downstream states. Unfortunately, the same cannot be said for the upper basin states which have contributed so greatly to the construction and operations of the Missouri River reservoir system. We are continually being denied even small portions of recompense for our massive state sacrifices for this project. Now, even those projects we have developed at our own expense are threatened. During this prolonged period of drought, we have asked the Corps of Engineers to recognize our serious problems with declining water levels and to revise their operations accordingly. While acknowledgement of our problems by Assistant Secretary of the Army Robert Page and his staff is appreciated, the process moves excruciatingly slowly, and to date, we have not obtained sufficient relief.

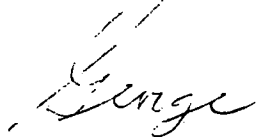
Some significant relief to this tragic problem is possible. If the Corps of Engineers would reduce system releases until June 1, 1990, to maintain reservoir levels, the upper basin states and lower basin states would all benefit. We need stable water levels in the spring and early summer for fish spawning and other purposes. This will also help the system for the remainder of the season. According to the conservative estimates of the Corps of Engineers, upper basin recreation alone generates \$64 million in annual economic benefits compared to \$12 million in downstream navigation annual benefits. Studies in the Dakotas have shown that recreation actually generates in excess of \$130 million annually in benefits. This upper basin economic activity is essentially the only benefit of significance we receive from a system that was designed to provide us with much more.

We have, in fact, today, filed legal action to try to achieve some relief in the courts. The lower basin states have gotten \$4 - 5 billion of flood protection. They need water, too. All of this need is in terrible jeopardy to serve a very small shipping industry . . . (like \$12 million). Recreation income in South Dakota and North Dakota alone is around \$130 million . . . and that's all in jeopardy. We have asked the Corps of Engineers to take a common sense approach to accommodate our mutual use of the Missouri River and they have failed to do so.

The Corps of Engineers has claimed its current operations are required to support the navigation industry in the spring and summer. At this time, there are only five tows on the Missouri River. It is incomprehensible that the Corps of Engineers would continue to make massive releases from the reservoirs during a severed drought for so few tows. Not surprisingly, in the Dakotas, the public is seriously questioning the policies and operations of the Missouri River system of the Corps of Engineers.

We appreciate your understanding and assistance. Please contact us if we can help reach a resolution of this matter.

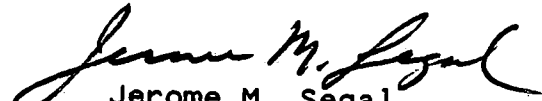

Thank you for taking the time today to discuss the latest developments regarding the promotion of abortion in foreign aid legislation.

On Thursday, May 3, Congressman Peter Kostmayer (D-PA) urged the House Rules Committee to allow him to offer a Romania/Population Control amendment to H.R. 4636, the "Supplemental Assistance for Emerging Democracies Act of 1990." The Rules Committee is scheduled to report a rule for H.R. 4636 on Tuesday, May 8.

The Kostmayer Amendment would authorize \$1 million for population assistance for Romania, earmarking the funds to be provided through the United Nations Population Fund (UNFPA) and the International Planned Parenthood Federation (IPPF). Both of these organizations are currently ineligible for U.S. funding because of their support for abortion as a means of population control.

The UNFPA co-manages China's coercive population control program and IPPF has actively lobbied to overturn pro-life laws in developing countries. Kostmayer's amendment would, therefore, undermine the current pro-life policies known as "Kemp-Kasten" (anti-coercion) and "Mexico City" (abortion should not be performed or promoted as a method of family planning). Millions of unborn babies could die if these vitally important policies are reversed.

A strong veto message from The White House could persuade the Democrat leadership in the House that the Kostmayer Amendment should not be offered to this important emerging democracies legislation. If the House leadership ignores this message, we will fight the Kostmayer language vigorously on the floor and, if necessary, produce the votes to sustain the President's veto.

This identical Kostmayer Romania/Population Control language has likewise been attached to H.R. 4610, an emerging democracies authorization bill for FY 1991. Kostmayer also succeeded in attaching an amendment that would explicitly overturn the "Mexico City" policy

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during the Foreign Affairs Committee markup on March 28. The Alan Guttmacher Institute (the research affiliate of Planned Parenthood) reported in their April 10 "Washington Memo" newsletter that Kostmayer intends to offer another amendment to dramatically increase population assistance funding and to **earmark** a portion of the funds for the UNFPA. H.R. 4610 is expected to be considered on the House floor sometime after the Memorial Day recess.

We anticipate that these issues will again be engaged during consideration of the FY 1991 Foreign Operations Appropriations bill. You may recall that Senator Mikulski sought to mandate renewed funding of the UNFPA during the FY 1990 appropriations cycle. President Bush's veto persuaded the Congressional leadership that the Mikulski language was completely unacceptable. It appears that we have picked up a few votes in the House on this issue in the meantime. The combination of an unambiguous Presidential veto message and a strong House vote should enable us to prevail once again.

On October 6, 1989, President Bush sent a letter to Congressional leaders stating that "the current Kemp-Kasten law, along with the Mexico City Policy, must be maintained without dilution, in order to preserve both the pro-life and pro-human rights character of the population assistance program." Another letter along these lines, which makes it clear that the President's position applies to all related foreign aid bills, could be very helpful at this important juncture.

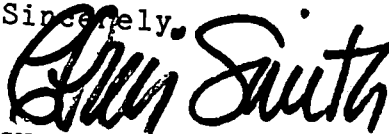
Yesterday, the House voted 388-8 for a motion to instruct conferees on the FY 1990 supplemental appropriations bill (H.R. 4404). This vote precluded the offering of any motion that would have supported the Senate's attempt to renew funding of abortion-on-demand in the District of Columbia. I am convinced that the strong veto message from the White House helped to produce this overwhelming vote. Of course, it is still necessary to make sure that the Senate conferees get the message and relent from their pro-abortion position.

As you know, all of the funds in the District's budget are federally-appropriated. Congress and the President have a Constitutionally-enunciated role in this life and death decision making process. The U.S. Supreme Court's Webster decision did not in any way diminish this Constitutional authority. Indeed, the Webster decision enhances the authority of legislatures at all levels -- congressional, state and local -- to regulate abortion. When pro-abortion advocates argue to the contrary, they are trying to turn logic inside out.

Dear John:

Thank you for the opportunity to talk with you today concerning the timber supply crisis facing the Pacific Northwest. I believe that the President's leadership on this issue is vital to the economic survival of the region, and can also benefit him politically.

The supply crisis is immediate, but the policies adopted this year will affect the region for decades. In the short run, severe supply problems are being created by 1) the current notice of the intention to list the spotted owl as a threatened species throughout its range and 2) implementation of the Interagency Spotted Owl Committee's (ISC) report (also known as the Thomas Report) on the biological needs of the owl.

Full implementation of the Thomas report would cause a 48 percent reduction in the harvest off of federal lands; listing the owl would have an even greater impact. This is compounded by the twenty percent reduction in harvest levels incorporated in the latest round of forest plans. As you know, forest plans must be revised every 10 years, and the new plans for Region Six--the Pacific Northwest Region--are about to be implemented.

This is not just a regional "jobs" issue. The Forest Service estimates that full implementation of the Thomas report will raise the cost of new houses by \$2,500 to \$3,000 across the United States. Unfortunately, I believe that the Forest Service has underestimated the regional economic impacts of implementation of the Thomas report.

As I see it, our top priority in reaching a solution must be "certainty of supply." In recent years, timber sales have been the subject of endless appeals and litigation, even when those sales were offered in accordance with existing land management plans. Last year's short-term timber compromise, Section 318 of the 1990 Interior Appropriations bill (also known as the Hatfield-Adams Amendment), was needed because half of the federal timber sales in the region were enjoined by the courts under lawsuits. I've attached a copy of Section 318, for your use.

The plan for economic stability in the region, as I see it, is:

- **Complete implementation of Section 318, the Hatfield-Adams amendment:** This amendment was a carefully-crafted compromise that reduced harvest levels in exchange for some initial protection of unfragmented stands of old-growth timber. The 9.6 billion board feet of timber to be offered from BLM and National Forest lands during Fiscal Years 1989 and 1990 was also to be protected from administrative stays and court injunctions. The 9.6 billion board feet was a "mandated harvest level." Unfortunately, the land management agencies are now treating that mandate as a mere guideline. They should be instructed to sell that volume before the end of the fiscal year.

- **Support a ban on log exports from state and federal lands.** The current federal ban on log exports harvested off of federal lands west of the 100th Meridian has been attached to the annual Interior appropriations bill for the past 17 years. There is legislation currently pending in Congress that would codify the federal ban and allow states to enact a similar ban on log exports off of state lands. Log export legislation will probably be enacted by the Congress this year, and I would hope the Administration could support it. In 1988, Oregonians approved a ballot initiative supporting a ban on state log exports by over 85 percent.

- **Establishment of timber production set aside lands:** National Forests and BLM lands are supposed to be managed under a multiple-use scenario--a management strategy that I have always supported. Unfortunately, with large areas of land dedicated to wilderness, the owl, and other single-use mandates, I think that the multiple-use concept is no longer viable in many areas.

We should, therefore, dedicate "Resource Production Lands" in the National Forests and on BLM lands for intensive timber harvesting and reforestation. About one-third of the public land base would be sufficient to preserve the timber industry at current harvest levels. These lands must be protected from challenges under various environmental statutes. They must also be statutorily dedicated as resource production lands, in much the same way that wilderness lands are designated. Currently, the timber base is "on the table" for inclusion or exclusion in the base every ten years, when the new forest management plans are drafted.

- **The Endangered Species Act must be modified in several ways:** The Act should be modified to review species, rather than sub-species. The northern spotted owl is a sub-species of a thriving species of owl. The U.S. Fish and Wildlife Service recently The

announced that it has accepted a petition to list the Mexican owl, which has its range across the southern United States from eastern Texas to the California coast. We are going to lock up resources from large areas of the United States if petitions for various subspecies continue to be accepted.

Economic and human impacts should be part of the listing decision. I do not believe that those who crafted the Endangered Species Act ever envisioned that 8 million acres (the recommendation of the Thomas report) would be set aside for a few thousand owls, at the expense of 2.5 million Oregonians.

Thirdly, the Act only requires that the listing decision be made on "best available data." There are no qualitative standards for that data. In Oregon, almost half of the forested lands have yet to be systematically surveyed for owls, yet all harvesting of mature and old-growth timber on both public and private lands will be halted in six weeks when the owl is listed.

- The Endangered Species Committee must be convened if the owl is listed: While it is imperative in the long run that changes be made to the Endangered Species Act, the Pacific Northwest is six weeks away from economic disaster. The Endangered Species Act provides for the convening of an Endangered Species Committee to consider economic impacts. In the event the owl is listed, this Committee should be convened immediately.

- Interim protection for the owl must be agreed upon if the owl is listed: While I do not support listing the owl, I am concerned about timber availability during the period between listing of the owl and implementation of a recovery plan, in the event that the owl is actually listed. Without some management plan being deemed as sufficient protection for the owl during this interim period, it is possible that the entire timber industry on both public and private lands could be shut down.

- Get the media and the public on our side: The President's reforestation initiative could easily be linked to the way federal lands are managed in the Pacific Northwest. By law, lands that are harvested must be reforested within two years. Any lands where the Forest Service believes that the reforestation cannot take hold within five years cannot be harvested and are removed from the timber base.

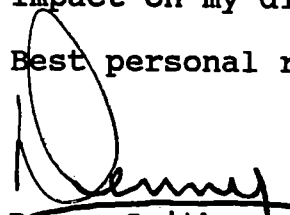
We have been harvesting timber in Oregon for 150 years. Oregonians are good stewards of the land. We have more trees now than ever before. In the 1988-89 planting year, an estimated 200,000 acres in Oregon were planted with 100 million seedlings. We can have timber harvesting and a sound environment; they are not mutually exclusive.

I think that it is essential to make the average American understand the link between themselves as the consumer and the production of this and other resources. As Republicans, we understand that the hidden costs of environmental elitism fall most harshly on those with low or fixed incomes.

This is a basic outline of the provisions that I believe need to be part of the solution to the Northwest's current timber supply crisis. I would be happy to discuss these issues further with you at your convenience. I appreciate your personal involvement in an issue that will have a significant impact on my district.

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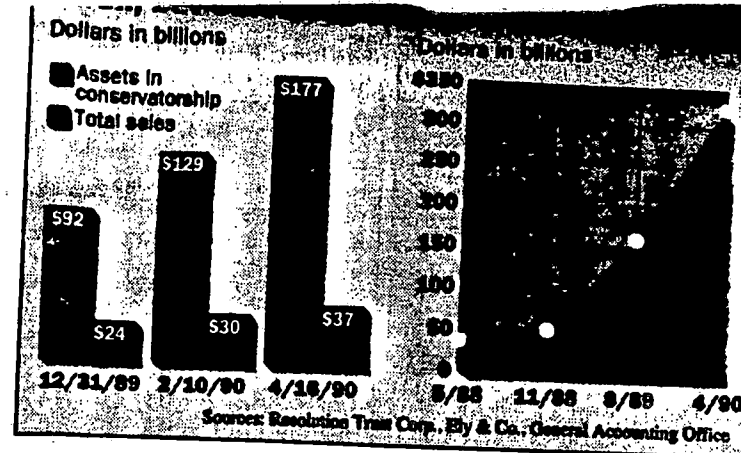

RTC may have to clean properties

Officials at the Resolution Trust Corp., which has taken over more than 400 insolvent savings and loans, say some of the failed financial institutions had foreclosed on polluted property. The RTC could be responsible for cleanup after recent court rulings have found that financial institutions are potentially liable for cleaning up such property under the 1980 Superfund law. The RTC doesn't yet know how many of its more than 30,000 real estate parcels are contaminated. The RTC, already faced with an estimated \$325 billion price tag for its bailout, thinks the Environmental Protection Agency's Superfund should foot the bill on any failed S&L property cleanups.



Thrift Fiasco Threatens to Soak Broad Segments of U.S. Economy

The thrift bailout, now concluding its ninth month, has evoked a lot of imagery about immensity: elephantine bureaucracy, a Grand Canyon-size fiscal hole, mountains of tainted assets. But perhaps no analogy is more frightening than L. William Seidman's.

"The bad news is that we've seen just the tip of the iceberg," the chairman of the Federal De-

posit Insurance Corp. said not long ago. "The worst is yet to come."

In the face of what the General Accounting Office estimates is a \$325 billion problem, Mr. Seidman's forecast is chilling. But his analogy strikes many observers as dead on. Unless the rescue gets under way in earnest soon, the government's flailing about, they say, seems more than anything like rearranging the deck chairs on the Titanic.

Launched with much fanfare in August, the Financial Institutions Reform, Recovery, and Enforcement Act has become a giant liner adrift in dangerous

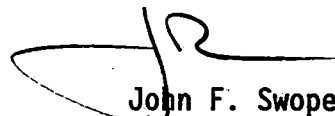

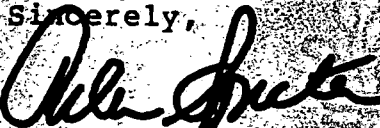

As to scheduling, we will of course work around your calendar; however, we hope that you could consider the morning of April 9th or 10th at 9:00 a.m., (assuming that there is a possibility that the President will be our key-note speaker at 9:30 a.m. on April 8th).

You and Nancy are of course invited to all Forum events during that entire week as CEO's guests.

We did receive a letter dated March 5, 1990 from Jacqueline Kennedy indicating that heavy demands made it impossible for you to accept. I am believing that that letter was sent with the belief that the invitation was for April 9th or 10th of 1990.

As we have discussed, and as I'm sure you already know from conversations that you have probably had with Rink Dewitt or others, CEO is a premiere group of international corporate chief executive officers - approximately 1200 world-wide - all of whom are graduates of the Young Presidents Organization. The theory of a CEO Forum is that we are able to be better executives when we combine discussions of business-related matters with meetings with high-ranking officials who give us insights not only into matters concerning us as business people, but also those which help us to be better citizens and better participants in the democratic process.

About half of our programs are held in foreign cities and half in the United States. This will be the first Forum of CEO in Washington, DC. In foreign countries more often than not, our Forums have been attended by heads of state and others of cabinet rank and their participation is very valuable to us. Recently at our Forum in Mexico this spring, we were received by President Carlos Salinas de Gortari and in our Forum in 1988 by Premier Li Peng. Last fall Vice President Quayle was kind enough to address us in San Francisco.

I really do look forward to your participation in this Forum.

I have attached herewith a very brief suggested script which we would appreciate having the President do for television sometime within the next 4 or 5 months to be used in connection with our promotion of the event. The script does not say, and I hope it clearly does not imply, any participation by him in the process. We mean it simply as an invitation by the President to a well regarded group to visit Washington and study the Democratic process in person.

Dear John:

As a follow-up to our telephone conversation earlier today, I wanted to briefly describe the background of the Congressional Sportsman's Caucus (CSC) and reiterate my invitation to the President to be the Keynote Speaker at a dinner honoring National Hunting and Fishing Day. The Caucus' Members feel it is important to recognize and commend the contribution sportsmen have made on behalf of wildlife resources of America.

The Members of the CSC feel it is important that President Bush, America's #1 sportsman, be the Keynote Speaker at the Congressional Sportsman's Caucus Foundation dinner held here in Washington, honoring National Hunting and Fishing Day. Realizing the demands on the President's time, and scheduling problems, I would appreciate if you could indicate a date in September or October which would allow President Bush to join us and the many sportsmen in recognizing their important contributions made to wildlife management.

Early in 1989, it became clear to many Members of the House that there was a need for a Member's organization to speak on behalf of America's sportsmen. Anti-hunting and anti-gun groups, using misinformation and emotion have taken direct aim at American's constitutional and historical right to hunt and legally own firearms. The CSC was formed as a response to the attacks on America's true conservationist, the American sportsman.

The CSC is a bi-partisan group of 64 Members of the House of Representatives, comprised of hunting and fishing enthusiasts, organized to provide a forum to meet and discuss outdoor sports issues. The Members of the Caucus are eager to educate our fellow lawmakers and the general public, about sportsmen's historical commitment to wildlife and wetlands preservation, our support for responsible gun use and our support for the conservation of wildlife resources and habitat.
