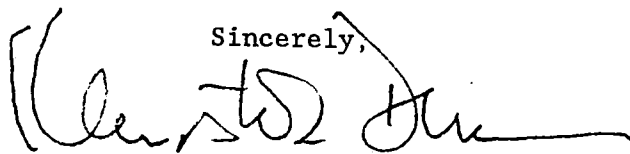
We are pleased to announce the International Affairs Fellowship competition for 1991-92. 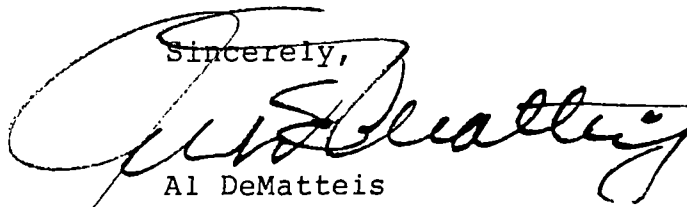

Dear Governor Sununu:

I greatly appreciated your finding the time to discuss with me my request concerning a member of my staff. This letter is to assist you in providing the relevant information about Bulcsu Veress' application to serve our country in Hungary.

Four months ago Bulcsu applied for a position with the new Regional Environmental Center for Central and Eastern Europe, announced by President Bush on the occasion of his visit to Hungary. The position is called Associate Program Manager for Institutional Development. The incumbent would serve as liaison with the participating governments and legislations, non-governmental environmental groups, academic institutions and international organizations. According to the outline of the Center, this position is to be filled by an American. In light of Bulcsu's qualifications this is a very modest ambition and one that he is uniquely qualified for, having an outstanding dual background in the politics and culture of both the United States and Hungary.

Bulcsu came to this country 20 years ago, he is a citizen for over 13 years and works for me for over 10 years covering a wide variety of issues in the defense and foreign relations areas. He is a solid professional with a top secret clearance, widely respected here by both Republicans and Democrats who work with him. His academic credentials are outstanding, he has 3 academic degrees from 3 countries in 3 languages.

What is equally important is that he has kept fully abreast of developments in his native country and cultivated the friendship of opposition figures for many years. He was bringing people to my office 8-9 years ago telling me that these were the future leaders of Hungary and he was right in every case. The present Prime Minister, Jozsef Antall, and Foreign Minister, Geza Jeszenszky, sat in my office at a time when hardly anyone here ever heard of them. I just visited Hungary with Bulcsu again and I can tell you from first hand experience that he has scores of important friends there from the State President down through the Cabinet and the Parliament.

An interesting feature of Bulcsu's background is that he is a former Hungarian freedom fighter who spent half a year in jail at age 17 after the Revolution. To send him to Hungary to work in our assistance program would carry a pleasing symbolism.

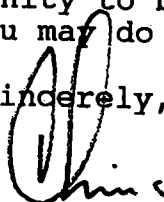
Bulcsu's case may not be hurt by the fact that he helped out the White House recently when, on May 18, one hour before President Bush's meeting with Hungarian President Goncz we did not have an interpreter for our President. Someone called Bulcsu, he went to the Oval Office on a 50 minute notice and, Larry Eagleburger told me, he did a splendid job.

I understand that Chase Untermeyer's office is aware of Bulcsu's application as several Republicans contacted the White House on his behalf. I know, for instance, that one of the top Republicans in Connecticut, Wally Barnes, who is a friend of the President, sent a strong letter supporting Bulcsu.

I am constantly reminded of how lucky we are, as a Nation, to have well integrated loyal Americans who, at the same time are perfectly at home in their native culture and environment and are willing to go there to serve an important American objective. Bulcsu Veress is not anxious to leave the U.S., he certainly does not want to re-patriate, but he wants to serve our Nation with everything he has, and the best and most unique he has to offer is this dual capacity of being totally connected in two political systems and two cultures. I don't think we should waste his willingness to serve.

I thank you for the opportunity to bring this to your attention and for everything you may do to help.

Dear Mr. Sununu:

As you consider the potential new taxes to be included in the Federal budget, I urge you to oppose any Securities Transfer Excise Tax (STET). This proposed tax would place an additional burden on the transfer of stock or debt and would be detrimental to the United States economy, the securities industry and the economy of New York City. By raising the cost of capital to American businesses, a STET would hurt these companies in worldwide competition.

In response to a similar proposal to impose a STET in 1987, the Congressional Research Service (CRS) analyzed the impact of this tax. The 0.5 percent transfer tax, according to the CRS, would constitute a significant increase in the cost of buying and selling shares and would have an adverse effect on the stock market and the nation's economic growth. CRS estimates that the Dow Jones index would decline over 200 points as a result of a STET, hurting every investor, pension fund and university endowment.

It is also likely that some component of securities transactions will be diverted to foreign markets because of the tax. The transfer of securities is a very mobile activity and therefore quite fragile. Given the global nature of our markets, a tax on the transfer of stocks and bonds will cause this activity to move offshore. The United States, and particularly New York City, will begin to lose preeminence as the financial center of the world. With major securities firms and investment banks already laying off thousands of workers, partly as a result of the October, 1987 stock market crash, this is precisely the wrong time to render our markets less competitive. Although other countries have a STET, they are actually moving to repeal these taxes.

The proposed transfer tax would also have a deleterious effect on pension funds that invest the savings of millions of working Americans. This tax will limit the ability of pension managers to maximize the value of the funds which provide retirement benefits for working class people. Pension funds entrusted with the life savings of millions would be forced to pay a large share of this tax, directly reducing the income to these individuals.

Because of the harmful impacts on national economic growth, the competitiveness of the U.S. securities industry and the local New York City economy, I urge you to oppose any proposed Securities Transfer Excise Tax.

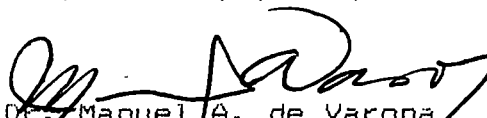

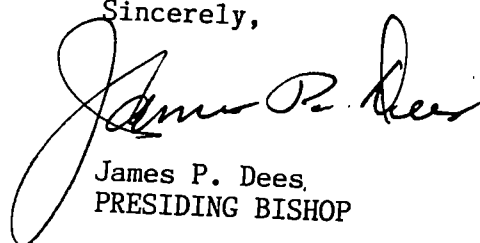

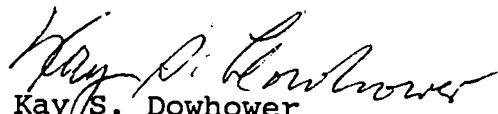
This spring, the non-profit community was encouraged by the introduction of bi-partisan bills in both the House and the Senate to restore charitable tax deduction to non-itemizing taxpayers. Since low and moderate income Americans are the nation's most generous contributors, these frequent non-itemizers have not had the benefit of deducting their contributions to charity. Extending this benefit to Americans with moderate income who give so generously to a broad array of human services is a cost effective way of complementing the work of our government.

To our dismay, we now read that a revenue proposal under consideration would curb these tax deductions for itemizers. I write to urge you to not withdraw this tax incentive for charitable giving. As I have already indicated, our church urges you to extend it to non-itemizers as well.

The charitable deduction is one of the most efficient, unique and beneficial ways of encouraging private giving for public purposes. The non-profit delivery of services to people in need is the backbone of a country made up of people who care for each other. As the availability of public funding for these services continues to be insufficient to meet the needs, the non-profit sector is faced with increasing calls for service. The increased contributions this incentive encourages must be retained in any summit agreement.

With great appreciation for the challenging task before you, I urge that the charitable contributions which support so many services to our citizens not be the target of your efforts to find additional revenues.

Dear John:

The Derecktor Shipyard of Middletown, Rhode Island has asked for my assistance in an urgent matter regarding a Naval contract. I sincerely hope that you might be able to assist me in the following regard.

Derecktor was apparently low bidder on a Department of Navy contract dated April 1, Contract No. N0024-89-4-2099G for 16 naval patrol boats. The contract is for \$160,000,000 and will employ 200 Rhode Islanders for 4 1/2 years.

Apparently, the bidding procedure started with 16 bidders and was ultimately short listed to 4. A company by the name of Trinity Marine was not one of the four companies short listed. Trinity Marine has filed a protest with the General Accounting Office, which in effect states that the Navy had no right to disqualify them as a bidder.

Derecktor apparently was required to have a bid bond which it did and it was to run until June 27. They were then requested to extend the bid bond to July 27 which they did. It is Derecktor's concern that if the award is not made by July 27 and their bid bond was to expire, Trinity might cause the entire contract to be rebid or awarded to another firm.

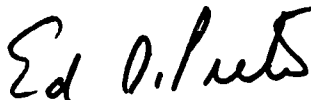
It has been suggested that the most expeditious route to resolving this problem would be for me to contact you.

I want to reiterate my deep concern over the inclusion of a COLA freeze for military and civil service retirees in a possible Republican deficit reduction package. This proposal would also limit COLA adjustments beyond 1991 to CPI minus one.

You know that I support an overall package to reduce the deficit by over \$50 billion in 1991 and more than \$500 billion over the next five years. I have worked tirelessly to achieve that goal. I will continue to do so. But I am convinced our goal can be achieved without touching COLA's.

I must make it very clear that I will, if asked, disavow any COLA proposal in a Republican package. I do not make this statement lightly. A COLA proposal is not necessary for the deficit reduction package.

As we discussed yesterday, my meeting with Fang LiXhi was extremely productive.

I, too, have been troubled by many of the statements which have been attributed to Fang during the past several months. I was thus surprised by some of the comments that he made to me during our meeting.

Most of what he told me contradicted public statements attributed to him in newspaper articles. We both shared our abhorrence of last year's massacre at Tiananmen Square. He insisted that we do need to continue to pressure the Chinese government to release the several hundred remaining political prisoners, and asked me to mention individuals like Wang Ruowang and Wang Dan by name.

Professor Fang went on to say that while he was not enamored by the President's policy during 1989, he believed that the policy during 1990 has been stronger and more effective. In particular, he was pleased that the President's veto of the Chinese student legislation was sustained, fearing that such a law would lead the Chinese government to block other young people who want to pursue a U.S. education. His comment regarding the "double standard" of U.S. policy on human rights was meant as "an observation, not a criticism."

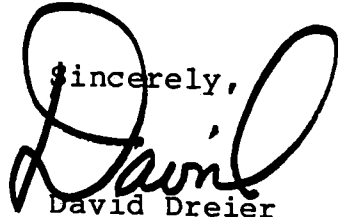
He also argued that some sanctions should remain, but that compromise was very important since we are dealing with a country representing 25% of the world's population. He indicated that he felt that the human rights situation is slightly improved, and he expressed little concern over the granting of Most Favored Nation status.

Over the long term, he predicts that Deng will live another two to three years, and that significant change will only be possible following his death. At that point, the U.S. should do everything possible to push for democratic reforms.

We are writing to express our strong objections to several revenue options that may be currently under discussion in the bipartisan budget summit. We are particularly disturbed with proposals that would increase the federal tax on gasoline, eliminate or limit the deductibility of state and local taxes, and raise excise taxes on tobacco and alcoholic beverages. The National Conference of State Legislatures (NCSL) opposes these possible revenue suggestions due to the serious damage they would cause to the integrity of state revenue systems and the state-federal partnership.

NCSL has long advocated the critical need to reduce the growing budget deficit. However, the federal government's expansion into the excise tax base for deficit reduction would seriously threaten the fiscal health of state governments. State excise taxes are a stable resource that generated more than \$25 billion during 1988, and states rely greatly on these revenues to provide necessary services. However, federal increases will discourage state reliance on such taxes and cause a decline in state revenue bases.

According to a study just released by NCSL, possible increases in federal excise taxes would reduce state excise tax collections by more than \$4 billion over the next five years. This potential revenue loss is especially troubling at a time when more than half of the states are experiencing fiscal problems, and state governments are being called upon to assume a larger role in meeting domestic needs. If new deficit reduction efforts continue the shifting of more responsibility onto the states, federal tax policy must not undermine the ability of state governments to meet those new demands.

Similarly, alteration in the deductibility of state and local taxes essentially amounts to the federal government increasing taxpayers' burden for state and local services. Equally important, this federal action would further erode taxpayers' willingness to improve funding for education, mental health, drug control, criminal justice, and other government programs that depend on a combination of state and local revenues. Effectively increasing state taxes also further restricts the ability of states to fulfill their constitutional and statutory requirements that call for balanced budgets.

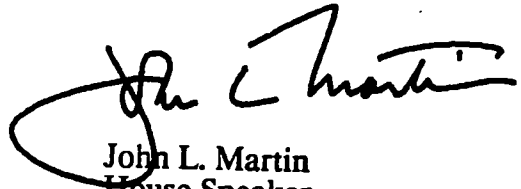

We view reducing the federal budget deficit at the expense of state fiscal systems as an unacceptable violation of the state-federal partnership inherent within our system of self-governance. Uncertain financial stability of state governments should not be the price that taxpayers pay for bringing the budget deficit finally under control. We, therefore, respectfully urge the budget summit negotiators to reject those revenue options that pose harmful consequences for state governments and encroach upon the ability of states to raise necessary revenues. Thank you very much for your consideration.

Dear Governor Sununu:

Recent news reports indicate that one of the proposals being considered by the White House and Congress to raise revenues is a tax on the sale of securities, including futures contracts. If that is the case, I urge you to reject such a proposal, for it would generate a high level of uncertainty and a lack of confidence in our nation's economy, and it would serve to drive our markets overseas to our competitors.

At a time when Great Britain, Japan, Sweden and the Netherlands are lowering or removing transaction taxes on exchange-traded instruments, the last thing America's financial markets need is a tax that drives a stake through the heart of our worldwide leadership position.

I have no doubt that you are aware that, ultimately, such a tax is passed on to the taxpayer in terms of increased costs. Such a tax on the futures markets would hurt farmers, grain processors, those individuals with lifelong assets in pension funds and savings institutions, and all other individual taxpayers who benefit from the services offered by futures contracts.

If the federal government were to suddenly increase the cash expenses of another type of small businessman--a farmer or shop owner, for example--his ability to stay in business might be jeopardized. The situation is no different for those who work in or benefit from the futures markets.

The same would be true for the American taxpayer if such a tax were enacted. If a transaction tax were to reduce liquidity in the markets by as little as "one tick"--i.e., if the bid/ask spread in the Treasury bond futures and cash markets were to widen by only \$31.25 per \$100,000 of Treasury bonds traded--it would cost the American taxpayers \$1 billion per year in increased interest costs. Do you think that is a cost they are prepared to accept?

Contrary to comments made by some in the Bush Administration, the small investor has not left the market. The small investor is actively invested in pension funds, mutual funds, and other programs. However, a transaction tax would not fall on the rich, as some would like, but it would fall most heavily on those who can afford it the least: the small investor, the average American. It also would discourage younger Americans who may want to invest for their future or to reach out for the American dream.

With the current savings and loan fiasco, and now this proposal, America is heading toward an economic crossroad. Why should we make matters worse by giving business away to foreign markets, not because they beat us competitively, but because of poor policy decisions made in Washington, D.C.? That is what would happen with the enactment of this proposal.

I urge you to reject this idea of a transaction tax on the sale of securities. It is a bad idea for everyone.

Dear John:

I have read with interest your communication of June 19, 1990 to Congressional conferees on pending child care legislation. I am heartened by your expression of the Administration's position on what components of a potential combined tax, credit and programmatic compromise might be acceptable.

As you know, the enactment of comprehensive federal child care legislation is a top priority for the National Conference of State Legislatures (NCSL). We have been active advocates for legislation that would increase child care availability and affordability through tax credit mechanisms. Our efforts have been equally devoted to development and structuring of a direct grant program to supplement efforts already undertaken by states, to the development of quality incentive grants to enhance standards and public/private partnerships, and to the expansion of existing program efforts, such as Project Head Start. We have stressed the need for retention of state authority for mandating child care and have supported establishment of federal model standards.

I realize that the Administration's direct program preference is, in part, aimed at a simple "earmark" increase of the Title XX Social Services Block Grant program. While an unearmarked increase has been one of our preferred funding options, we are troubled by any attempts to mandate specific block grant usage. Earmarking contradicts the basic intergovernmental balance sought by the Administration and the states. Block Grants were created to allow state legislatures to address state and local needs. This earmarking compromises state capacity to utilize very limited federal resources for a broad array of social

service purposes and creates potential new tensions among needy populations. I wholeheartedly urge you to shift your programmatic focus to a grant program that, as your letter explains, would be under "the jurisdiction of the Labor Committees". I realize that is a second choice for the Administration, but it is a preferred option of the nation's state legislators.

NCSL's positions on child care legislation (enclosed) have remained consistent. As new proposals and developments have emerged and been reviewed, our Human Services Committee members and general membership have affirmed and reaffirmed what is essentially unanimous agreement on our position. Our policy reflects the kind of compromise we feel federal policymakers should and can achieve. Toward this need for compromise, NCSL has endorsed S.5 as legislation providing programmatic and tax-credit provisions while protecting state authority, and ultimately, our nation's children.

I appreciate the Administration's willingness to encourage enactment of child care legislation this year. NCSL stands ready to work with you so that we can meet this urgent need of our nation's children and families and strengthen the partnership required to implement federal child care legislation. 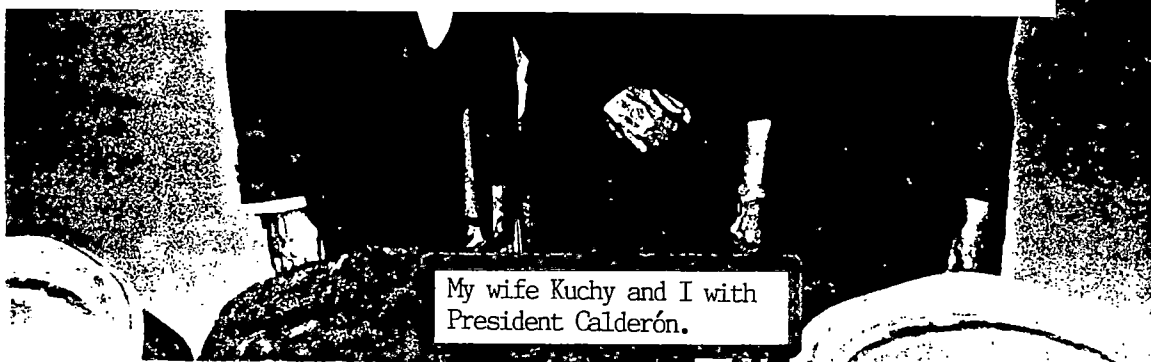

Dear Governor Sununu:

I am writing on behalf of thousands of scientific investigators who are concerned that the outcome of the present Administration-Congress Budget Summit will result in inadequate funding for biomedical research and will thereby impair the health of our people and the nation's leadership in this vital social and economic area.

The more than 31,000 members of the seven scientific societies that comprise the Federation of American Societies for Experimental Biology recognize the difficulties you face in dealing with the nation's fiscal problems. However, it is essential that the federal government maintain and strengthen biomedical research. This research leads to improved health and provides the training ground for the young scientists who will help the United States maintain its competitive edge with other countries in such fields as biotechnology and pharmaceuticals.

Scientific investigators are working to develop new leads to meet the problems of AIDS, cancer, Alzheimer's Disease and other afflictions, but there is an urgent need to make even greater progress. That progress cannot be made without providing the National Institutes of Health and the Alcohol, Drug Abuse and Mental Health Administration sufficient resources to fund the research opportunities available in universities, research institutes and small businesses throughout the nation.

We urge the Summit's participants to recognize that more funding will be needed in fiscal 1991 to achieve the knowledge base and the breakthroughs medical progress requires and which help to reduce the enormous costs of care. The additional funds also are needed to support young investigators who are abandoning these careers for lack of assistance. At a recent meeting of top scientists, it was pointed out that only one new assistant professor in eight or 10 can expect to begin work under traditional NIH grants.

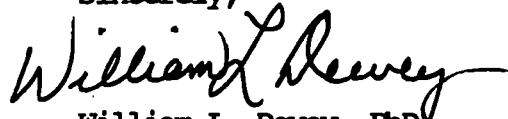
Summit can give tangible recognition to these needs by including a clear statement of support for biomedical research in its final report. We recommend language along the following lines:

"Congressional and administration participants in the Budget Summit have focused on the opportunities now available to biomedical research in the U.S. to make maximum progress against the diseases whose causes and treatments have eluded humankind for centuries. Left unconquered, these afflictions will continue to burden our people and economy.

"The research to meet this challenge will require \$9.2 billion and 6,000 fully funded new and competing grants for the National Institutes of Health in fiscal 1991, and greater funding levels in future years. For alcohol, drug abuse and mental health research, the Summit recommends a funding level of \$1.2 billion in fiscal 1991. Neither the House nor the Senate budget resolution goes far enough to provide for these vitally important programs. The Summit's recommendations will close the gap."

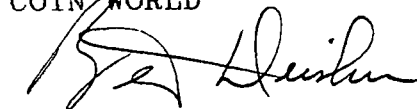

Democratic ferment and capitalist initiatives in the Soviet Union and Eastern Europe are an appropriate prelude to presentation of this year's annual report on **The Fulbright Program**.

Since 1946, **176,000 alumni worldwide** have passed through the turnstiles of the Fulbright international exchange program, including heads of state and other leading public officials on every continent as well as prominent bankers, university presidents, lawyers, doctors, professors, journalists, artists and persons in numerous other professions.

In the **New York Times**, Senator Fulbright wrote this year that: "I think it quite likely that President Gorbachev has a more realistic perspective on the United States because of the advice he receives from his friend and senior adviser Aleksandr Yakovlev, who studied American history and wrote on the New Deal as a Fulbright scholar at Columbia University in 1958."

In the **Washington Post**, Senator David L. Boren wrote this year that the United States should: "...dramatically increase student exchange programs for college undergraduates--especially with the Soviet Union, Eastern Europe and Latin America...It forges bonds with the future generation of leaders of nations of growing importance to us."

In the **Baltimore Sun**, I wrote this year that: "The Cold War may be over, but freedom's infrastructure has not been built. The Fulbright Program has earned the right to help finish the job."

Whether the Soviet Union and Eastern European countries are perched on the precipice of democratic progress or on the brink of totalitarian backsliding may well depend on how swiftly they are educated in democratic traditions and capitalist initiatives. Freedom could be stillborn. Fulbright exists to give live birth.

On behalf of the 25,000 physician members of the American Society of Internal Medicine, we urge you to oppose suggestions that have been proposed by the Office of Management and Budget to save money in the Medicaid program by the use of what is known as "therapeutic substitution" in the dispensing of drugs supplied Medicaid beneficiaries. The implementation of this practice would represent a grievous disservice to Medicaid patients and carries extraordinary potential to adversely affect the health of these poor patients.

Medications prescribed by physicians for the treatment of patients represent the exercise of the physicians best judgement in what will be effective and least likely to produce a harmful effect. From time to time, generically equivalent (i.e. chemically identical - or nearly identical) medications may be substituted without significant harm and at lesser costs. This is known as "generic substitution" and with appropriate safeguards our society supports this practice.

"Therapeutic substitution" is a totally different matter. In this instance, an entirely different drug, albeit having a similar therapeutic effect under certain conditions, may be substituted for that which has been actually prescribed by the physician. This is a pernicious and dangerous notion wherein a pharmacist's opinion of appropriate therapy may replace the best professional judgement of a physician in the management of a very individual patient. The potential for harm is substantial.

We doubt that you would seriously entertain such a substitution for yourself or for your family. Again, we urge that you oppose the suggestion by the OMB that it be imposed upon the nations poor under the Medicaid program.

Dear Governor Sununu: 

On behalf of the nuclear energy industry, I would like to bring to your attention the importance of a favorable reference to nuclear energy development in the joint communique to be issued at the economic summit held in Houston in two weeks.

As you are aware, nuclear energy is currently making an enormous contribution worldwide to meeting the demands of economic growth in tandem with environmental progress. In light of public concern over global climate change and likely enactment of the Clean Air Act Amendments this year, this recognition would be both timely and appropriate.

I reviewed the communiqués issued at the economic summits over the past fifteen years, and was struck by the frequency of favorable references to nuclear energy development. Although in most cases the references focus on the energy security benefits of nuclear energy development, recent references highlight the environmental benefits, as was the case at the summit last year.

I have taken the liberty of enclosing an outline of some suggested language for the communique and excerpts from previous communiqués. As a key friend of nuclear energy, we hope that you will -- among other things -- work to support initiatives at the summit that promote nuclear energy's vital role in meeting the world's future economic and environmental goals. Let me add that we are working with our counterparts in the other industrialized countries to build support for a favorable reference to nuclear energy development in the summit communique.

Home health needs your help again. Gramm-Rudman once again occupies the agenda. I am seeking your assistance in acting to protect the home health benefit.

Gramm-Rudman sequestration constitutes a unique and devastating problem for the Medicare home health benefit. Under Gramm-Rudman, Medicare home health agencies are asked to supply goods and services to home health beneficiaries at less than it costs to provide them. Home health agencies are cost reimbursed, and are not allowed to make a profit in providing Medicare services. Gramm-Rudman reduces reimbursement for the reasonable costs of these providers without allowing them any method to avoid losses. Assuming two percent cuts, if a HHA responds to sequestration by reducing its costs for services or items, Gramm-Rudman then automatically reduces the provider's lower costs by another two percent. Nothing can be done to offset the losses.

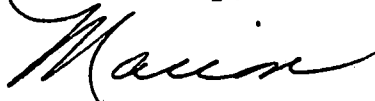
The Medicare home health benefit has been hit by three rounds of Gramm-Rudman, the first time in 1985. Since then, congress has twice indicated its desire to exempt the benefit from Gramm-Rudman. In the Omnibus Budget Reconciliation Act of 1987, Congress exempted home health, plus the skilled nursing home benefit, from across-the-board cuts--from December 31, 1987, through the end of sequestration on March 31, 1988. Again, during last fall's Reconciliation negotiations the Senate and House Budget Committees sought to exempt home health from sequestration as of November 30, 1989; this exemption was lost however, in last minute budget negotiations as Congress was searching for cuts sufficient to meet the mandated deficit target. Consequently home health reductions were in effect through December 31, 1989.

The home health benefit could face a devastating sequestration again this year. Since Congress can address the problem of cost-reimbursed providers only imperfectly and temporarily--if at all--through Reconciliation legislation, I ask that you resolve the recurring problem through the Budget Summit negotiations currently under way. A solution can be achieved by amending the Balanced Budget and Emergency Deficit Control Act of 1985, in one of two ways: (1) exempting the home health benefit until it is under some form of prospective payment, or (2) if an exemption is not politically possible, reducing the mean home health cost limits (published yearly by the Health Care Financing Administration) by two percent--instead of taking two percent off an agency's costs.

John, I thank you for your time and interest. If you would like to meet with me or Ann Howard of the American Federation of Home Health Agencies, please notify me and I'll come to Washington.

I am writing to bring to your attention a private humanitarian project which is currently being reviewed by the administration.

Dennis Catron, a friend and supporter from Orange County who has been very active in the local Vietnamese community, is attempting to establish humanitarian charter flights carrying donated medical supplies and equipment to Treasury Department-approved hospitals in Vietnam. The equipment and supplies would be subject to a monitoring program to ensure proper use.

In addition, Dennis is also requesting permission to permit Vietnamese-Americans to travel to Vietnam on these humanitarian flights in order to visit sick and elderly relatives, and to provide transportation for individuals leaving Vietnam under the Orderly Departure Program (ODP).

While I am opposed to any effort to improve official U.S. relations with the communist Vietnamese government, a program such as this would help to alleviate the pain and suffering of the Vietnamese people.

I am writing to express my concern about potential cutbacks in Defense Department spending which could have a major adverse impact on the Rhode Island economy. My concerns are primarily related to the construction of submarines by General Dynamics Corporation/Electric Boat Division.

Of like magnitude, is the Defense Department's work, which is generally undersea-related, and is performed by the Raytheon Corporation and the Naval Underwater Systems Command.

Electric Boat and Naval Underwater Systems Command also have facilities in Connecticut. We have a total of 10,000 Rhode Islanders working in the previously listed facilities. If these programs are dismantled or if any of this work is transferred to any other locations, the impact would be devastating. It could well approximate the tremendous blow Rhode Island suffered in 1973 with the closing of Naval facilities at Quonset and Newport.

You will find attached a letter I recently wrote to Richard Cheney, Secretary of Defense, outlining my concerns. Any assistance you could give us with the Department of Defense would be greatly appreciated and of vital importance to me.

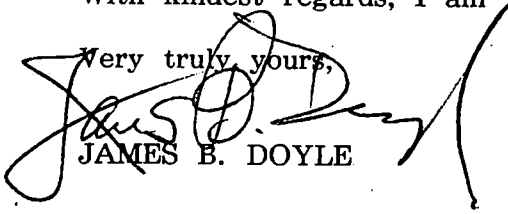

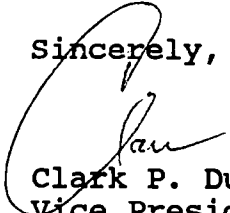

The article in the May 21, 1990 issue of Time magazine is very provocative. If it accurately describes reality, as I suspect it does, one taxpayer, amateur public policy dabbler, is quite pleased. I hope you are equally pleased by the coverage which certainly strengthens your hand, which doesn't appear to need much strengthening. Public officials who stand as you do know that the stand is correct as the silent majority of public at large supports you. You know this from the polls but not from the mail you receive.

Since last writing you, when I told you of my retirement from Deloitte's, things have occurred in my life which may be of interest and use to you:

You may be aware that I was able to share my ideas about the Pentagon with Colin Powell when I was passing through DC last fall on my way back from my overseas assignment in Jordan.

We have moved our residence to Sacramento, with the expectation of permanency. I have joined the Deukmejian administration as Chief Deputy Director of the Department of Finance. This is the same position I held under Governor Reagan 18 years ago. You have probably surmised I really am a public policy junky. This may be of use to you if you need to reality test anything from the large state perspective. As you may be aware, California has a "federal-size" budget headache of \$3.6 billion in our budget year starting July 1, 1990.

Aside from the enjoyment and comfort I get from knowing you are there and doing what you are, I will continue to look for ways to solve our mutual budget problems. If the states find ways of reducing programs and their related costs with federal financial participation that action also helps to reduce the federal deficit.

I'm certain you have been contacted by many New Hampshire friends and supporters who share my concerns over our state's economy. Its deterioration affects everyone who has made our state a great place to live. The current "sick" conditions of many of our lending institutions can be felt in all businesses and most acutely in real estate.

The "credit crunch" is a very real issue and causes area businesses to lay off personnel.

The U.S. Comptroller of the Currency, Mr. Clark, spoke in Nashua last Friday. With all due respect to his comment that regulations do not "dictate" loan policy, many of us are being told that loans are being denied because of regulators influence. The reference to "good loans" seems to mean loaning to people who don't need the money. The free-fall decline in property values in New Hampshire will only worsen if this situation continues. Based on my daily work appraising property our market is currently at or below 1985 value levels and declining rapidly.

The feeling of crisis is emerging and many working people honestly wonder how long they can hang on to their homes.

Dear Governor Sununu:

American poet Langston Hughes once posed a question that is appropriate to today's budget debate: "What happens to a dream deferred?" Already we have seen the results of decade of neglect in education--unacceptable dropout rates, inadequate facilities, a sense of frustration among students and teachers. We must reverse course if we are to fulfill our aspirations as a nation.

Over the next few weeks, you will shape the Fiscal Year 1991 federal budget. You will also shape the future. If federal education programs are not adequately funded, I ask that you speak directly to the students affected. Say to 5 million disadvantaged students, "Sorry, you can't participate in a Chapter 1 reading program this year." Say to almost 1 million school-aged youth in Chicago, Boston, Los Angeles, and rural school districts across the country, "We don't care if you drop out of school." Tell millions of ambitious young adults, "You won't be getting tuition assistance through Pell Grants this year."

Each day, some 54 million Americans are directly affected by federal education programs. Millions more are dependent on federal nutrition, health, and human services programs that advance school readiness and other national goals in education.

Education should have a preeminent position in the federal budget that reflects its priority among Americans. At least 86 percent of all Americans consider cuts in federal education spending unacceptable according to a May 1990 New York Times/CBS New poll.

Education is so essential to our national life that the President and the nation's governors pledged to accomplish six

ambitious goals in education by the year 2000. It will take national leadership and resources to meet these goals.

We urge you to protect education funding in any final deficit reduction package.

1) Prevent any sequestration of Fiscal Year 1991 education appropriations.

Despite the appearance of fairness in "across-the-board" cuts, the sequestration process cuts education disproportionately compared to other national priorities. While education represents about 1.7 percent of the federal budget, it would have to absorb almost 20 percent of the cuts in domestic discretionary programs in a sequester.

The annual ritual of brinksmanship -- playing mumblety-peg with the Gramm-Rudman budget knife -- makes for dramatic politics, but results in poor education policy. It is possible in subsequent years to restore funding for programs and schools, but educational opportunities lost to students can never be regained.

2) Provide sufficient funds for existing needs-based education and related programs.

Most federal education programs are funded far below the amounts needed to keep pace with inflation and enrollment increases since FY1980.

Chapter 1, Head Start, and Pell Grants are not funded at levels comparable to a decade ago, despite an increase of the number of families in poverty.

Federal assistance for handicapped education programs has fallen from 12 percent of the costs above average per-pupil expenditures to around 7 percent between FY80 and FY90. At present the federal government provides only \$352 for each student served in handicapped education programs, out of a total average cost of \$8,800.

Current child nutrition and health care funding levels impede our ability to advance as a nation.

Erosion in general support programs exacerbates funding shortages in the most economically depressed communities. Some 14 states experienced revenue shortfalls in FY89; another 37 states expect shortfalls in FY90. As of FY90, education represents from one-third to one-half of all state expenditures in 23 states; an additional 20 states spend from one-half to two-thirds of their total budget on education.

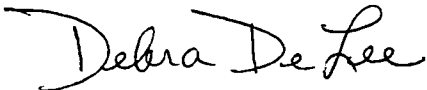
- 3) Increase funding levels for new education programs, including those reauthorized in the 101st Congress: Vocational Education, Handicapped Education, and the Asbestos School Hazard Abatement Act.

The FY91 budget agreement must include sufficient funding levels to support important new initiatives to reinvigorate the drive for excellence in education and accomplish the national goals in education by the end of the decade.

Congress is considering programs to enhance teacher excellence, attract and retain minority teacher candidates, enhance adult literacy efforts, and serve greater numbers of eligible students in needs-based education programs. The final agreement on the FY91 budget must take these into account.

Education is vital to America's economic, social, and national security goals. Unless we make significant progress -- by serving disadvantaged and other special-needs students and enhancing the quality of education for all Americans -- we will limit our options for the future.

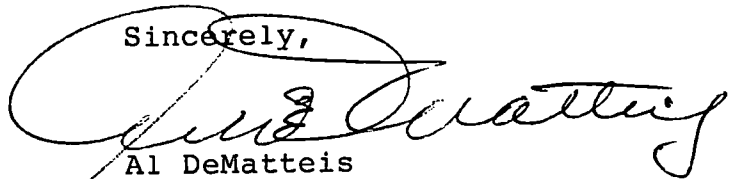

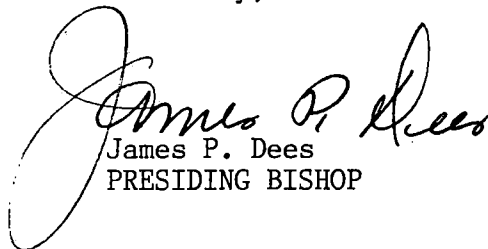
It is hardly sufficient.

Thank you for your recent letter concerning the National Endowment for the Arts (NEA).

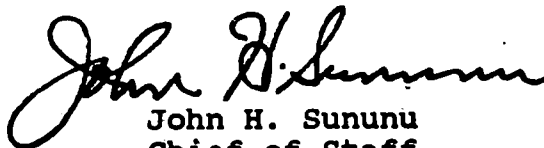

He, too, has seen what he termed "sacrilegious, blasphemous depictions that are portrayed by some to be art," and he pledged to speak out strongly against Federal funding of such works.

As part of his efforts to ensure that the National Endowment promote only the finest art available, President Bush named John Frohnmayer as the new Chairman of the NEA. The President has said, "I would prefer to have this matter handled by a very sensitive, knowledgeable man of the arts, John Frohnmayer, than risk censorship, or getting the Federal Government into telling every artist what he or she can paint, or how he or she might express themselves. So, I am against censorship, but I will try to convince those who feel differently in terms of legislation that we will do everything in our power to stop pure blasphemy."
