Dear John:

This is in reference to your upcoming meetings in the Soviet Union and, in particular, the discussions you will hold on using technical assistance to help build the Soviet Union's communications infrastructure.

Following up on my August 9 letter to you regarding Postal Service efforts in this area, I am enclosing talking points for use in your technical assistance discussions.

Essentially, I am suggesting that you note the important role of the Postal Service in a strong and diversified economy and that you convey our interest in having Soviet Posts and Telecommunications Minister Pervychin come to the United States for discussions and briefings on postal development and modernization issues.

We would be very pleased to provide briefings on USPS automation and modernization efforts and to have him view operations at some of our larger facilities. Such a visit might provide the framework for more effective technical level contacts and follow up to efforts already under way.

Incidentally, I would also like to encourage discussions on further improving Soviet customs treatment of our mail. The Soviets are much less restrictive about what can be sent through private parcel services to

the Soviet Union, services through which customs duties can be prepaid, than they are about what can be sent through the mails. The postal services and the senders and addressees in both of our countries would benefit from improvements in this area.

I wish you all the best in your meetings with the Soviets and hope the Postal Service will be able to contribute further to our overall technical assistance efforts.

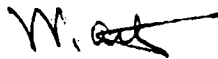

Dear John:

The *Wall Street Journal's* caption misses my point that the appropriate Fed response to the oil price rise is to maintain the original nominal GNP "target" -- that is to manage monetary policy so that there is no need to change the FOMC members' forecast of nominal GNP growth. That would mean a little more inflation and a little less real growth than we would have had before the price rise but would avoid both recession and the kind of loose accommodation strategy that could start a new inflation spiral.

The Fed Must Not Accommodate Iraq

The rise in oil prices caused by the Iraqi invasion of Kuwait will raise the general level of prices in the United States and lower our real economic growth during the year ahead. But if the Federal Reserve does its job well, the oil price rise need not cause a recession or start an inflationary spiral like that of the 1970s.

Although there are already calls for the Fed to ease policy enough to prevent any economic slowdown, that would be a mistake. It would also be a mistake for the Fed to tighten monetary policy enough to prevent any oil-induced rise in next year's overall price index. The best strategy for the Fed would be to stick to its current implicit target of a rise in nominal GNP (i.e., total national output at current prices) of about 6% even though that will mean some slowdown in real activity and a somewhat faster rise in prices than would have been anticipated before the Iraqi invasion.

An unchanged nominal GNP target is more than just a compromise between a more expansionary monetary policy aimed at preventing any slowdown in real activity and a tighter monetary policy designed to prevent any rise in inflation. An explicit Fed promise to stick to a policy consistent with its original nominal GNP projections would reassure financial markets and the public that the current oil price rise would not trigger an inflationary spiral and ultimate recession.

No Accommodation

Market expectations that the Fed will not shift its nominal GNP goal are important. If companies believed instead that the Federal Reserve will respond to the oil price hike with an accommodating easy money strategy, as it did in the 1970s, they will try to get a jump on the upcoming inflation and the overall price level will rise by more than the direct effect of the oil price increase. But if companies believe that the Fed will not accommodate such a price-rise, the overall price increase could be less than the direct effect.

Before the oil price jump, a nominal GNP rise of 6% during the next four quarters would probably have translated into an inflation rate of about 4% and a rise in real GNP of about 2%. Any faster rise in total spending would be inconsistent with bringing U.S. inflation down from its current unsatisfactory level.

And while the recent inflation rate of between 4% and 5% may seem moderate in comparison to the much higher inflation of the late 1970s and early 1980s, the current inflation rate is substantially above

that in Japan and in major European countries and nearly twice as high as the U.S. sustained between the end of the Korean War and the acceleration of the Vietnam War. The Fed has been correct to insist on reducing the rate of inflation.

To lower the pace of inflation, the Fed has been gradually slowing the rate of increase of nominal GNP by slowing the ex-

ture level of oil prices, as of today the spot price is \$27 a barrel or about \$7 a barrel above the \$20 average around which oil prices have fluctuated for the past two years. Looking ahead, the prices of oil futures for the 12 months of 1991 now average about \$24 a barrel. At the risk of overestimating the decline in real GNP growth, let's assume that the current \$7

of nominal GNP would involve more inflation and less real economic growth. How much less? The impact of the higher oil price on the overall GNP price level depends on the total volume of oil produced in the U.S. (about 3 billion barrels a year) and not on oil imports. A \$7 a barrel price rise would directly increase the dollar value of U.S. oil production by \$21 billion a year or about four tenths of 1% of GNP. This translates directly into a 0.4% rise in the overall price level.

Since the combination of higher oil prices and depressed real activity would change other prices as well (the prices of coal and gas are already up while the prices of the wide range of goods for which demand will fall as overall activity slows will decline), it's not possible to say with precision how much the overall price level would change if the Fed holds constant the increase in nominal GNP. But even if the increases in coal and gas prices offset all of the other price slowdowns, the effect would be an overall price rise of only 0.4%. If total nominal GNP growth is unchanged, the effect of that higher price level would be to cut the growth of real GNP next year by four-tenths of 1%.

OPEC Tax

These estimates of each of the two effects taken by itself—the OPEC tax that reduces real consumer spending and the higher domestic price level that reduces the real GNP component of a given nominal GNP—are not additive. Because the two effects interact with each other, their combined impact is an average of the two effects calculated separately.

A precise estimate of the prospective change in real GNP is, however, not possible. But my own judgment is that if the Federal Reserve achieves a nominal GNP growth of 6% over the next four quarters, the oil price rise is likely to reduce real GNP growth in the coming year by only about one-half of 1%. Economic growth would drop to about 1.5% but a recession would be avoided and price inflation, while rising temporarily to 4.5%, would be kept under control.

Although such a slow growth of real GNP would be frustrating to everyone at a time when unemployment is rising and profits are falling, it would be the best response to the extra burden imposed on our economy by Iraq. Such a policy would avoid the risk of repeating the inflationary explosion of the 1970s.

pansion of monetary aggregates. In recent months, however, the execution of this strategy of gradualism has been frustrated by the reluctance of banks to lend in the current regulatory and economic climate. Despite the Federal Reserve's actions to lower the federal funds rate, the M2 and M3 monetary aggregates have not increased since April. The virtual standstill of the aggregates over the past six months is inconsistent with a nominal GNP rise of 6% and could contribute to a further slowdown this year.

Unless there is reason to expect a sharp rise in velocity in the future—and I can see no such reason—a more expansionary monetary policy during the coming months would have been appropriate in order to achieve 6% nominal GNP growth. Sticking with that same 6% nominal GNP target after the oil price rise may now require a slightly different path for money than it would have if the level of oil prices had remained unchanged. But the pace of monetary expansion should still be increased enough in the coming months to bring the aggregates back to the center of their target ranges, an expansion that would lower short-term interest rates.

What impact would such a 6% nominal GNP increase have on real economic activity during the coming year? If 6% nominal GNP growth would have implied a rather weak 2% rise in real GNP prior to the jump in oil prices, will the shift to higher inflation and lower real growth now mean a recession? I don't think so.

The extent of the increase in next year's inflation and the corresponding slowdown of real growth within the overall 6% nominal GNP rise depends of course on the extent of the jump in the oil price. Although no one can be certain about the fu-

a barrel price rise will persist.

There are two channels through which the higher oil price will depress economic activity. First, an increase in the price of imported oil is like a tax levied by the OPEC producers on American consumers and businesses. Since the U.S. imports about two billion barrels of oil a year, a \$7 a barrel price hike would reduce total real income by \$14 billion.

Most of this would translate into reduced consumer spending. Although this would in principle be offset by increased demand for our exports as OPEC countries spend their added income; in practice much of that extra income would be saved by the OPEC countries. The increase in overall OPEC saving will lower world interest rates, but the resulting rise in U.S. investment won't happen soon enough to offset the fall in consumption in 1991. The net short-run impact would be likely to be equivalent to a decline in demand of \$10 billion to \$15 billion or between two-tenths and three-tenths of 1% of GNP.

The other short-run direct effect of an oil price rise is to raise the overall price level in the U.S. This rise in the price level would increase the public's demand for money. If the Federal Reserve does not fully accommodate this increased demand, short-term interest rates would rise and real activity would be depressed. This is what will happen if the Fed keeps the rise in nominal GNP unchanged. Over a two or three year period, such a policy will reverse the initial rise in the price level as the temporarily weaker economy slows the rise in the prices of non-oil products.

Interest rates would then subside and real economic activity return to normal. But in the short run, the higher overall price level would mean that the growth

Dear John:

After reading recent accounts during the Houston Summit of the President's emphasis on using technical assistance to build the Soviet Union's "communications infrastructure," I thought this would be a good time to update my letter of November 28, 1989, concerning the Postal Service's efforts in this area.

My letter stressed four areas that the Soviets proposed for joint consideration, namely, construction of a modern airmail facility in the Soviet Union, demonstrations of U.S. Postal Service computerized retail equipment, furnishing of samples of our long-life vehicles, and establishing procedures for the regular exchange of information on service standards. All of these items and some additional objectives were incorporated in the enclosed joint Protocol on technical cooperation which Deputy Minister of Posts and Telecommunications E. A. Maniakin and I signed in Washington during the 20th Universal Postal Congress.

Since that signing, we have been working on refining and completing these objectives. In the case of the airmail facility, we determined it would be more productive for us to concentrate on supplying technical expertise rather than material support. Three senior U.S. Postal Service executives will travel to the Soviet Union this fall for consultations with their Soviet counterparts on automation of mail processing activities, and the airmail facility will be one of the primary topics of discussion.

We recently hosted two Soviet technical experts who observed the U.S. Postal Service use of integrated retail terminals (IRTs), our computer based system for calculating postage and reporting sales. This visit was jointly sponsored with UNISYS Corporation, manufacturer of the IRTs, and at its conclusion UNISYS and the USSR Ministry of Posts and Telecommunications signed a Memorandum of Understanding. The Memorandum of Understanding provides a schedule of technical development and joint meetings leading to implementation of an IRT pilot system in Leningrad. This visit gave our Soviet counterparts a unique opportunity to see how private industry and the government can work together to produce better service for the public. We are also pursuing the other two objectives mentioned in my previous letter as well as the other goals stated in the Protocol.

I will now say a word concerning our future efforts to build upon the progress accomplished through the Protocol. The most effective means to improve mail operations in other administrations and, I might add, at the same time enhance the quality of their exchange of mail with our mailing public is to share with them the technical knowledge which we have built up over the years. The Postal Service has ongoing programs in this area based on providing technical consultants, training foreign postal officials by enrolling them in existing U.S. Postal Service courses at our Management Academy, exchanging senior level officials for briefings and consultations, and transferring surplus and outdated equipment.

These programs are ideal for our joint projects with the Soviet Union since they rely heavily on the goodwill and knowledge of our own employees. I can assure you that many postal employees, at all levels, have expressed a strong desire to share their knowledge with their Soviet and Eastern European counterparts. We certainly intend to make use of these resources to create a cadre of individuals whose knowledge and energy can be of benefit to the postal administrations in that part of the world as they update their communications systems.

As always, we will coordinate with the Department of State and with the Department of Commerce regarding technology transfer implications, and I am sure that we will continue to find these agencies as supportive of our technical cooperation efforts as they have been in the past.

Perhaps you noticed that the Protocol calls for the joint issuance of stamps between the Soviet Union and the United States. In fact, on October 3, the U.S. Postal Service and the Soviet postal administration will jointly issue stamps in Moscow and Baltimore commemorating Creatures of the Sea. I will be presiding at the Baltimore ceremony and I would be delighted if you could join me.

I appreciate your interest in our technical cooperation efforts with the Soviet Union.

PROTOCOL

of the meeting of representatives of the Postal Administration of the USSR and the United States Postal Service on the development of Technical Cooperation proposals covering:

1. Construction of a Modern Facility at Sheremetyevo;
2. Integrated Retail Terminal (IRT) Demonstration;
3. Long-Life Vehicles Demonstration;
4. Quarterly Exchange of Service Quality Information;
5. Regular Exchange of Technical Documentation.

Washington November 20 - December 14, 1989

As a result of Technical Cooperation discussions held between representatives of the Ministry of Posts and Telecommunications of the USSR and of the United States Postal Service in Washington, DC during the 20th Universal Postal Congress, the two administrations have decided on the following actions:

1. Construction of a Modern Facility.

The two administrations agree to study the feasibility and possible options involved in construction of a modern, fully automated international airmail facility at Sheremetyevo. Study of these options will include a full investigation of the scope, cost, and technical requirements of construction as well as the various funding possibilities and possible legal implications. As a first step in this process, the Ministry of Posts and Telecommunications agrees to send an advance team to the United States to be briefed in the technical data requirements necessary to determine the scope and cost of construction. The USPS agrees, after this initial visit, to send a team to the Soviet Union to discuss the data necessary to determine the scope of construction, cost and effort. This will include determination of both equipment requirements for the facility and the suitability of this equipment for downstream operations in the Soviet Union. Both administrations will fully investigate the possibility of UNIPOST support in developing EMS operations at the facility.

2. Demonstration of IRTs.

After determining any technology transfer and proprietary rights implications, the USPS (or the company which manufactures the equipment) will provide a sample IRT to the USSR and will work with Soviet technicians to program the sample IRT to handle Soviet mail categories.

3. Demonstration.
After determining any technology transfer and rights implications, the USPS (or the company which manufactures the equipment) will make information available concerning long life vehicles and tractor trailers (if requested). The information will consist of vehicle specifications and types of operations for which they are currently being used.

4. Exchange of Service Quality Information.
As part of its development of data on delivery times for international mail, the USPS will determine whether it would be possible to obtain specific data in this area on Soviet mail. Soviet postal authorities will make a similar determination for US mail delivery times in the Soviet Union. Coordination of these efforts will be conducted through mutual correspondence.

5. Schedule.
The Postal Administration of the USSR and the United States Postal Service will strive to realize the intentions stated in paragraphs 1-4 of the present Protocol as soon as possible.

6. Regular Exchange of Technical Documentation.
Both administrations agree to a regular exchange of the technical documentation contained in their official publications.

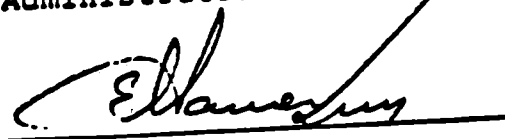
7. Draft Philatelic Program.
By February 1, 1990, both Administrations agree to provide a draft philatelic program for joint issues of postage stamps for 1990-1991.

8. The USPS congratulates the USSR on its election to the Chairmanship of the Consultative Council for Postal Studies.

9. The Postal Administration of the Soviet Union congratulates the USPS on its election to chairmanship of the Executive Council.

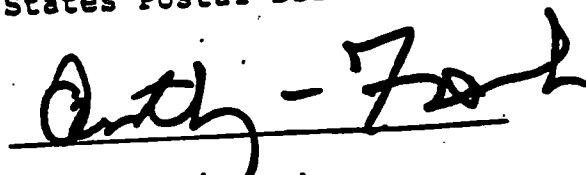
10. The negotiations between the Postal Administrations of the USSR and the USA were held in the spirit of mutual understanding and were extremely productive.

I am writing to express my opposition to any proposal that would interfere with the ability of state and local governments to finance public facilities with municipal bonds. I am especially concerned about the imposition of any securities transfer excise tax (STET) on securities trades as a means to raise revenue. While I welcome your resolve in attempting to reduce the federal deficit, I believe that the imposition of a STET would have a negative effect on the ability of state and local governments to raise capital, particularly for critical infrastructure needs. A STET would increase the cost of needed public capital improvements. In addition, low and middle income workers, retirees and individual investors would bear a substantial burden of such a tax.

From 1914 through 1965, an excise transfer tax was imposed on certain corporate stock transfers. State and local government obligations, in addition to those issued by the federal treasury, were exempted from this transfer tax because such a charge would have increased the cost of borrowing to these jurisdictions. This occurred because, in order to compensate for their additional tax liability, investors would demand higher pre-tax earnings. The same result is true of current STET proposals, and the additional borrowing cost is the main reason why such proposals now still exclude federal obligations from the STET.

Despite the claim that the STET is a tax which would not have to be borne by the general population but would only affect the rich, in fact it is low and middle income individuals who will pay a price. Public pension funds, whose investments comprise an important part of the securities market, exist for the benefit of a state and local government workforce largely comprised of low and middle income workers and retirees. The imposition of STET would reduce the investment earnings of public employee retirement systems by increasing

ision funding costs for state and local systems, resulting in reduced benefits for state and local government workers or increased costs to the taxpayers.

Individuals are now the most significant purchasers of tax-exempt bonds. Because of the changes made by the 1986 Tax Reform Act, banks and property and casualty insurers have been leaving the municipal bond market. The imposition of a STET would act as yet another disincentive for individual purchases of state and local government securities and would further erode the market.

Low and middle income investors will also be penalized by a STET. In 1988, 27 percent of tax-exempt income was reported on returns of individual taxpayers having an adjusted gross income under \$50,000, and 55 percent of tax-exempt income was reported on returns with an adjusted gross income of under \$100,000. In the tax-exempt mutual fund sector, a Gallup survey revealed that, between 1982 and 1985, 42 percent of the bonds were held by households with incomes less than \$50,000 and 77 percent by households with incomes less than \$100,000. These individuals would be directly affected by an excise tax.

I urge you to oppose any attempt to enact a securities transfer excise tax as a means of balancing the federal budget. A recent National League of Cities fiscal survey warns of the challenges facing state and local governments as they struggle to maintain needed services in the face of decreasing federal assistance. The imposition of a STET will further hamper these efforts by raising the cost of capital, hindering the ability to raise capital, and adversely affecting Americans of all income levels.

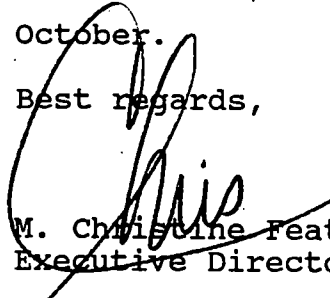

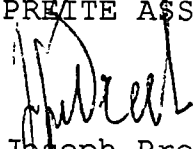

Dear Governor Sununu:

I have been recommended to you for the slot at the Nuclear Regulatory Commisison (NRC) recently vacated by Mr. Thomas Roberts. I am taking the liberty of writing directly to you because I am deeply convinced that I would bring valuable experience and perspective to this position, and because I feel that it is important that I communicate my views to you.

I view the NRC in the broad perspective that I think it needs and I feel it has sometimes lacked in the past. By law the NRC must be an independent agency solely concerned with health and safety. However, the NRC must also function within the scope of the society and the Government of which it is part. Therefore, the NRC must find the way to attain the reasonable levels of safety mandated by the law while at the same time taking into account the economic and societal effects of its regulations and the viability of the industries it regulates. The NRC must also be able to be decisive and to communicate in a convincing manner the bases for its actions.

The need to maintain the nuclear industry viability should not be underestimated because it is vital to our country's energy independence, environmental well-being, and our technological capability. As part of our energy mix, nuclear power is needed to maintain our economic growth. As an exportable technology, nuclear power is an asset to our balance of trade and our international prestige.

Furthermore, in the domestic front we need to restore the trust of the public in our scientists and engineers if we are to improve our technical literacy. We have fallen into a pattern where we see our scientists and engineers often blamed and ridiculed, and their integrity questioned, for all sorts of disasters, e.g., the collapse of a highway during the California earthquake, oil spills, space program accidents and delays. We as engineers must bring back pride and public trust to the technical professions if we want to see talented students seeking careers in the sciences. We need to better communicate the outstanding job done by our

community and organizations. The NRC must regulate, but it should retain the respect of Congress and the American public for itself and for the industries that it regulates.

As a first step, the appointment of an engineer who has worked at the Agency and is familiar with its needs and functions would serve as a morale booster to the NRC staff. My technical expertise cannot but contribute to the credibility of the NRC with Congress and the public.

I would not allow myself to be considered for the Commissioner position at the NRC if I had any doubts as to my technical qualifications. In addition to being a nuclear engineer, in over twenty years I have worked my way up through a variety of technical and managerial positions that have given me an in-depth knowledge of the nuclear power industry and the NRC. I am intimately familiar with the regulatory process from inside - I worked at the NRC for nine years, including a two-year stint as technical assistant to the Chairman - and from the industry perspective - I have done consulting work for plants in the process of obtaining a license and for operating plants. I know how the NRC interacts with the industry, the media, and Congress, as well as the effect of NRC actions on state regulatory agencies and financial institutions.

Having been born in Cuba, I believe that I also bring the experience and maturity of someone who has faced and overcome difficult situations, and who has shown the determination to convert goals into reality.

Taking this position will represent an economic sacrifice to me, but I want to make a difference, and I believe that I can make a difference. Dear John:

The legitimacy of government is a certain victim of totalitarianism. At a recent Heritage Foundation lecture your colleague Dick Thornburgh pointed out that subjecting itself to the rule of law is the only way the Soviet government may be able to recover sufficient political support to survive the upheaval now under way.

Dick reviews the Soviet legal tradition -- far different from that of the West -- and proposes the principles of due process, respect for property and contracts and independent judicial review as essential to a reformed Soviet system.

These efforts to encourage reform in the Soviet legal system may be more significant than arms control treaties to the future of the Soviet Union, and to the course of Soviet-American relations. I commend his remarks to your attention.

What this means to the man-in-the-street is a call placed with a provider in one service area can be automatically transferred to a provider in another area without interruption in the transmission, even though the two providers utilize equipment manufactured by different companies. Although the technology is available, this is not presently part of the service. Currently, a customer would be disconnected, interrupting a phone call.

The problem that the JHP Partnership is currently faced with is that we cannot implement the use of this technology so long as Judge Harold Greene withholds approval. I am asking you to please consider this a priority and to write a letter of support to me regarding this technology in the cellular industry. This would be a great step forward in communications.

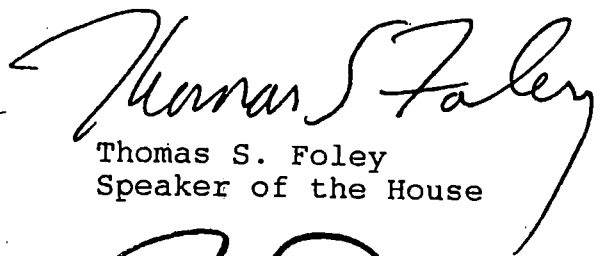

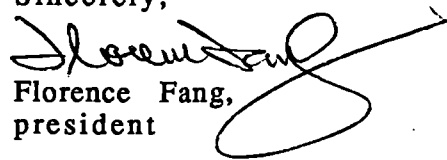

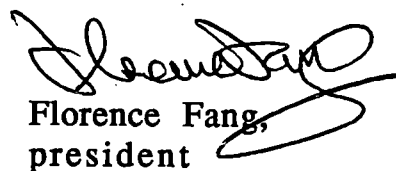

I am writing to express my strong support for the policy outlined by the President in his May 17 Rose Garden speech on civil rights.

While the President indicated that he wants to sign a civil rights bill, he also stated quite clearly that he will not "sign a bill whose unintended consequences are quotas." John, I believe it is vital that the President not embrace legislation that violates this principle, particularly in light of the recent clamor and confusion over the President's position on taxes. As such, any bill the President signs must be entirely free of provisions that would tend to promote quotas.

In listening to the current debate over whether the "Civil Rights Act of 1990" (or "Kennedy-Hawkins") would tend to promote quotas, it is important to keep in mind that the term "quotas" is being used as a short-hand term for all forms of race-conscious decisionmaking, including "goals" and "timetables," and for the danger of forcing employers to abandon perfectly legitimate tests, selection devices or hiring practices simply because they happen to produce statistical disparities between the employer's work force and the general population. Two sections of the Kennedy-Hawkins bill would tend to promote quotas -- Section 4, which would overturn the Supreme Court's decision in Wards Cove Packing Co. v. Atonio, and Section 6, which would overturn the Supreme Court's decision in Martin v. Wilks.

Any legislative change which would alter the standards of disparate impact litigation from those set out in Wards Cove will increase the expected costs of litigation to employers and thereby create pressures for employers to avoid litigation in the first place by getting their workforce numbers to come out right.

Therefore, in the course of your negotiations on the quota issue in particular, I believe that the following points must each be addressed, as Kennedy-Hawkins will still be a quota bill if it includes any of these provisions:

- * It will still be a quota bill as long as it would relieve plaintiffs in disparate impact cases of any need to identify the specific employment practices that allegedly produce a disparate impact.
- * It will still be a quota bill as long as it would shift the burden of proof in disparate impact cases from plaintiffs to defendants.
- * It will still be a quota bill as long as it would the raise standard of job-relatedness in disparate impact cases from that set out in Wards Cove (namely, whether a challenged practice serves the legitimate employment goals of the employer in a significant way).
- * It will still be a quota bill as long as it defines its standard of job-relatedness for disparate impact cases in terms of "effective job performance," thereby artificially precluding consideration of other nondiscriminatory factors that can legitimately bear on employment-related decisions.
- * It will still be a quota bill as long as it would require defendants in disparate impact cases to meet their rebuttal burden, however defined, solely by means of "objective evidence."

Although the debate over whether Kennedy-Hawkins would tend to promote quotas has focused principally on Section 4 and Wards Cove, Section 6, which deals with Martin v. Wilks, supports quotas every bit as much as Section 4. Any bill that curtails the rights of individuals to challenge consent decrees or court orders that call for quotas or other race-conscious "remedies" is a quota bill. Therefore, even if Section 4 is removed entirely, the Kennedy-Hawkins bill will still be a quota bill if any of the following is the case:

- * It will still be a quota bill as long as it would bind by an earlier judgment or order anyone who had notice of the proposed judgment or order and an opportunity to present objections before its entry.

- * It will still be a quota bill as long as it would bind by an earlier judgment or order anyone whose interests are deemed to have been adequately represented by a participant in the original litigation.
- * It will still be a quota bill as long as it would preclude subsequent challenges to an earlier judgment or order whenever "reasonable" efforts were made to provide notice to anyone whose interests might be affected.

Because it is these details that will determine whether a civil rights bill promotes quotas, in opposition to the President's position, I hope that the Administration will apply each of these tests to any compromise proposal.

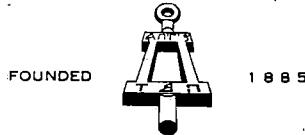

Dear John:

I believe that the current Soviet economic situation offers a unique opportunity for even greater arms reductions than have recently been agreed. Even after those reductions are fully implemented, the Soviet Union will remain a major military risk. Why not offer massive economic assistance in exchange for much more radical Soviet military cuts?

The enclosed article from today's Wall Street Journal examines the case for trading Western economic aid for Soviet arms reductions. I think that such linkage would be far better than either the unconditional aid being proposed by some in Europe or the provision of aid tied only to Soviet economic reforms and progress in Lithuania. Rejecting the idea of aid altogether means passing up this opportunity to negotiate important further arms reductions.

I hope that you will read it in the context of the recent European proposals and the forthcoming Summit. I would be interested in any reactions.

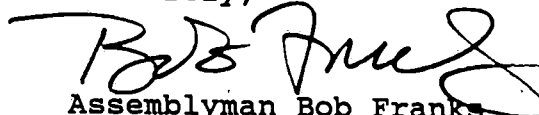

Dear Governor,

John and I were recently in Concord at a kick-off barbecue for Town Chairmen in Governor Gregg's re-election campaign. In a chat with him on the subject of his speech writing needs, I agreed to work up some talking points for his review on the abortion issue.

When I came back to Rumney and did some hard thinking on the subject - - particularly after Governor Martinez's defeat in Florida and Governor Andrus's wimping-out in Idaho -- I realized that this issue has troubled me greatly. I have felt strongly that Lee Atwater is way off-base if he thinks his dictum "The Republican Party is a big enough umbrella to include all sides of the abortion issue" is going to fly. I think that's a real non-starter, a real non-answer, and that many of the great silent majority are going to bolt if they feel you're waffling on such a gut issue.

It's my hunch that one reason we elected President Bush was because we thought we knew where he stood on abortion and that we elect leaders because we expect them to lead.

In the upcoming months of campaigning around the country I hope that the President and your colleagues on the White House Staff will not promote the Atwater line.

As I thought through Governor Gregg's situation here at home, it occurred to me that what is needed is a good,

leological, secular, logical argument.

With the help of several local people well versed in the law and ethics, along with a some sound thinking by Bill Buckley, the attached "Considerations in Connection with Abortion" has evolved. If you find it helpful, I would be glad to send along additional thoughts as they may develop.

Dear John:

You may remember me from last year's discussions about my replacement as NASA Administrator and possible appointments to the post of Science Advisor to the President. I'm now back at the University of Pittsburgh and am involved with a number of Boards and Committees as I was before coming to NASA the second time in 1986.

I'm writing in connection with a replacement for Eric Bloch, who, as I understand it, is definitely leaving NSF this summer. As you may remember I feel strongly that Science and Technology can play a vital role in the nation's continued economic growth in the years to come. I understand that there is considerable pressure from the pure science community to appoint a physical scientist--especially a physicist, to that position. I now believe it is important to have someone with an Applied background in this position since the President now has an outstanding physicist, Allan Bromley, in the post of Science Advisor to the President.

With this in mind, I would like to recommend Dr. Harold Liebowitz, Dean of Engineering and Applied Science at George Washington University. I have known Hal for a number of years and worked closely with him when we served as members of the Governing Council of the National Academy of Engineering,. At that time he was Home Secretary for the Academy and in this capacity had numerous contacts with this country's outstanding academic and industrial leaders. He also chaired NAE's major studies on engineering education some of which led to the reoriented education programs at the National Science Foundation.

Although a Curriculum Vitae is enclosed for your information I would like to bring to your attention some of his accomplishments which should make him uniquely qualified to serve as Director of NSF:

Before coming to George Washington he headed a program in the Office

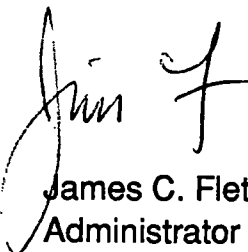
Naval Research which, as you know, in the period immediately following World War II, established a pattern for U.S. funding of both basic and applied research in American Universities which served as a pattern for the National Science Foundation. Many of our best scientists and engineers today owe their education to either the ONR or the AEC. The program he headed not only contributed to the fundamental knowledge of fracture mechanics but also was a driving force in building the research capabilities of the universities in the United States. The seven volume Fracture--An Advanced Treatise which he edited is considered the definitive work in the field and is convincing evidence that the United States is the leader of the world in the study of fracture mechanics.

As Dean of Engineering and Applied Science at GW, his contributions to the academic community are also significant. When he joined GWU in 1968 the engineering school was essentially moribund. He revitalized the school increasing its student body from 1200 to over 3500, its full time faculty from 32 to 94 and research grants from \$140,000 to over \$7,000,000. He also extended his service to the rest of the academic community by becoming editor or a member of the editorial board of a number of scholarly journals. He is also internationally recognized by the academic community which has resulted in working relationships between his School and universities in the UK, France, Germany, Japan, Sweden, Yugoslavia and other countries.

I believe his background and intellect is the right combination for leading the National Science Foundation during this critical period when Science and Technology may be the key to our Nation's economic prosperity.

John, even though the timing is a bit tardy, I sincerely hope you will give Dr. Harold Liebowitz due consideration for the position of Director of the National Science Foundation. Incidentally I have written a similar letter to Allan Bromley, since I'm sure he will have his own ideas on the kind of person that should be appointed. If you have any further questions please do not hesitate to call or write.

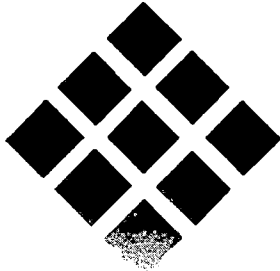

Dear Mr. Sununu:

The purpose of this letter, which is also being provided to other Congressional and Government leaders participating in Budget discussions, is to provide you with the views of the Associated General Contractors of America on any proposals to tax gasoline or other motor fuels for deficit reduction purposes.

We believe that attempting to tax gasoline and other motor fuels for deficit reduction purposes will not be approved by Congress and would be badly flawed public policy for the following reasons:

The deterioration of the Nation's highways and bridges, resulting from the substantial and constantly increasing use of them, means that huge amounts have to be raised to even maintain this Nation's stock of transportation infrastructure facilities.

For example, the Federal Highway Administration estimates that approximately \$40 billion will be needed annually to meet existing capital needs on the Nation's non-local highway system. Meeting that need alone would necessitate a \$.18 per gallon increase in the current \$.09 Federal Highway user fee.

The American Association of State Highway and Transportation Officials (AASHTO) estimates that a \$58.5 billion annual investment is required by all levels of government to fund highway, road and bridge needs through the year 2020. Current annual capital expenditures by all levels of government are only approximately \$31 billion.

We believe that it will be very difficult to convince Congress to raise the Federal Highway user fee to the level needed for adequate transportation infrastructure investment. However, asking Congress to meet such infrastructure needs and additionally asking Congress to tax the motoring public for deficit reduction purposes would not be palatable either to Congress, or the public that elects it.

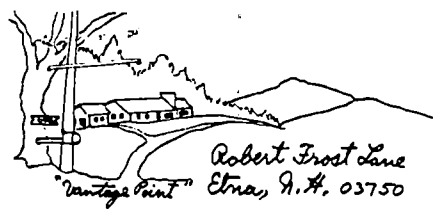

Dear Mr. Sununu:

As one of your supporters over the years that you were Governor of New Hampshire, I am writing to you for some information you may or may not be able to answer. However, I will try.

I retired to New Hampshire from New Jersey some years ago and turned over my fairly large home to my oldest daughter and her husband to "house sit" as they had just married and Mrs. Fernald and I wanted to help them get started.

Now they are fairly well established and want to buy the house which has been appraised at \$470,000. They now also have two teen-age children. I'd like to be able to give this to them over a period of time as allowed by IRS rules; however, I can't afford to do this. This property is my largest single investment and I didn't get the advantage of the usual \$225,000 life-time exemption. I haven't lived there for the last three years.

This brings me down to the question: Does Mr. Bush plan to ever bring up the possible reduction in the capital gains tax structure which he pushed in 1989? Nine months ago the newspaper and television was full of the prospects of this. Then Rep. Dan Rostenkowski, Rep. Gebhart and others objected to it as a means of "helping the rich."

I don't fall into this category but have been waiting and hoping this would go through so I could take advantage of it. My son-in-law and daughter are also ready to go through with it.

In fact my son-in-law, who specializes in the sale of large restaurants and motels, tells me he has several "listings" which he could sell for over a million dollars each but the owners are

holding off awaiting a reduction in the capital gains tax. What a boost such a reduction would give the commercial real estate market!

I think that the Republican Party, of which I belong, needs to come up with some good ideas to combat Rep. Gebhart who seemed to be always on television saying, "The bill is made for the rich." This is not so as I consider myself part of the great retired middle class. Furthermore, I believe the middle class and upper classes combined would have much more money from a reduction in capital gains to re-invest than the lower classes. It would take millions of the lower classes to scrape together enough money if they have some left over to make any kind of a dent in the national debt.

I realize that President Bush has been very busy with the budget and all the happenings in Europe, and they come first. However, in your opinion is a reduction in the capital gains tax still on the agenda or is it "dead"? If it's still alive and simmering, in what season of the year do you think it might come up again?

I was flabbergasted to read in this morning's Washington Post that John Frohnmayer wrote the President informing him of his intention to dismiss me, not for differences of policy, but for "administrative incompetence".

I direct your attention to the enclosed memorandum I wrote Chairman Frohnmayer on April 24, urging him not to recommend the awarding of grants to several projects of a highly confrontational nature. You will note that I made specific mention of items The Washington Times described in detail in its story of June 11.

You will also note in the margins the derisive manner in which the Chairman disregarded my advice and admonished me for daring to caution him on the matter. According to recent press accounts, Mr. Frohnmayer is only now beginning to act in a manner I recommended nearly two months ago.

Should you wish, I am prepared to share with you other recommendations I made to the Chairman about how to restructure this agency. These too were ignored.

I am sorry to trouble you on this matter, but I thought it best not to allow the fabrication the President was told to stand.

As you know, the House and Senate conferees on daycare legislation have begun meeting to produce a compromise bill. In the last two years there has been great progress on the "child care issue." Liberal initiatives have been stalled and debate has been increasingly focused on President Bush's principles of: non-discrimination against traditional families, parental rights of choice, and equal treatment of parents seeking religious daycare. In no small measure, this progress has been a result of the leadership, commitment, and energy which you have personally devoted to this issue. Your efforts are greatly appreciated.

The enormous outpouring of support for the Stenholm bill in March shows that the public embraces President Bush's child care principles. Over 100,000 phone calls deluged Capitol Hill in support of the Stenholm bill and in opposition to the Downey/Hawkins bill. Political momentum is on your side.

But, as you know, victory is still far away. The legislation passed in both the House (H.R.3) and the Senate (S.5), while paying lip service to the President's principles, contradicts these principles in nearly all respects. In their present form both S.5 and H.R.3 discriminate against traditional families, limit parental choice in daycare, and discriminate against parents seeking religious care for their children. H.R.3, which establishes a new federal program to provide daycare for young children in public schools with a flat prohibition on parental choice, is almost as deplorable as the original ABC bill.

The objectionable features of H.R.3 and S.5 are so pervasive, that any attempt to "clean up" those bills in conference will not produce a bill which is acceptable to President Bush or to the conservative groups who have devoted so much effort to this issue for the past two and a half years. I have attached a list of some of the worst features of H.R.3 and S.R.5. Most of these are, no doubt, familiar to you. We believe that all of these features, not just some, would have to be eliminated to produce an acceptable bill. For example, there are many technical issues relating to the definition of vouchers and limitations on their use. All of the provisions relating to vouchers listed in the attached paper would need to be corrected in order to produce a voucher which parents could realistically use in most churches. If only part of these problems are corrected, we would achieve the appearance of victory while yielding the substance to the liberals.

I am encouraged by the President's continuing support for solid conservative child care principles, and by his expressed willingness to veto the existing child care legislation. I am worried, however, that an undirected and piecemeal effort by Republican conferees to improve H.R.3 and S.5 could result in legislation which remained highly undesirable, but was more difficult for the President to successfully veto.

Let me thank you again for the effort and commitment which you have shown on this issue and express the confidence which we all have in your leadership. I believe that with continuing perseverance we can transform the enormous liberal daycare initiative of the past two years into a significant victory for American conservatism.

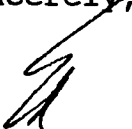

Over the past several years I have enjoyed following your political successes, first in New Hampshire and then in Washington. I am pleased that things have gone so well for you.

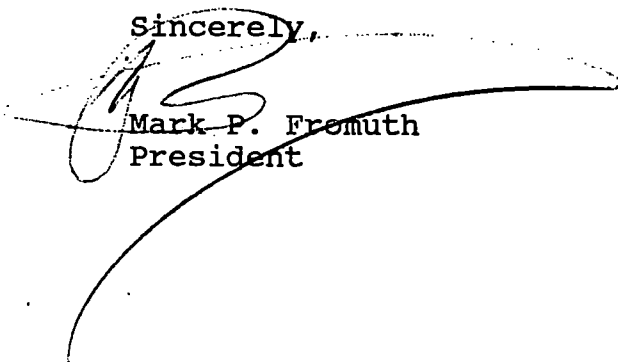

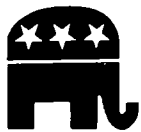

Please forgive my delay in writing to say thank you for lending us both Nancy and Jackie.

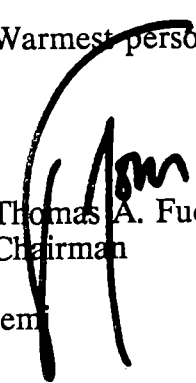
