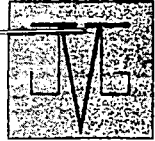

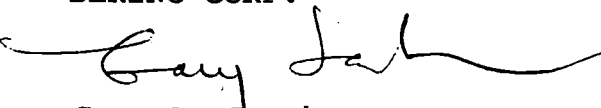

Dear Mr. President:

I am writing to express the National Association of Manufacturers' grave concerns with the direction of the Clean Air Act Amendments of 1990 House/Senate conference. NAM is deeply troubled with the apparent abandonment by Congress of your original concepts of "allowing both environmental protection and economic growth" in new clean air legislation.

A study recently released by the Clean Air Working Group estimates the proposed modifications to the Clean Air Act to be between \$51 and 91 billion annually. This far exceeds the estimated costs of the bill which you introduced and does not include permitting and enforcement costs. These latter costs could be moderate or devastating, depending upon whether the House or Senate language is adopted.

In the past several weeks, NAM has watched the conferees consider permitting, toxics and nonattainment controls which, if accepted, would negate much of the good work done in the various committees and through the bipartisan negotiation process last January.

Specifically, NAM remains committed to a bill which will bring cities into attainment in a time-frame needed to protect human health and maintain the economies of the 181 areas now in noncompliance with the act. To that end, the NAM supports the Senate nonattainment language (Title I).

Your support of the Senate nonattainment language is imperative. Failure to provide a realistic time for cities to meet compliance attainment deadlines will cause the act to fail.

We fear that passage of a flawed new Clean Air Act, will increase the American people's frustration with the painfully slow and highly politicized process.

We also fear they will grow more impatient with the Administration, and more distrustful of the U.S. Environmental Protection Agency. This disillusionment will not contribute to a climate conducive to improved environmental protection or realistic goals for other environmental programs.

NAM also remains committed to correcting the bureaucratic and administrative excesses in the permitting and enforcement titles. We appreciate the excellent work conducted by the Office of General Counsel and the Domestic Policy Council. There is no question that the House permitting language is far superior to that of the Senate bill. We urge your continued support on this issue which may well remain the foundation of the new Clean Air Act.

NAM believes the conferees should more closely follow your original air toxics proposal. We are distressed to see the Durenberger conference proposal offered. This would make several key changes in permitting and air toxics. These changes would take the bill back to the earlier concepts in S.1630 which were rejected by the bipartisan Senators in January.

The Durenberger permitting proposal would trigger New Source Review for routine factory changes or modifications. The toxics proposal would trigger Maximum Achievable Control Technology (MACT) controls for existing facilities each time these facilities make routine operational changes.

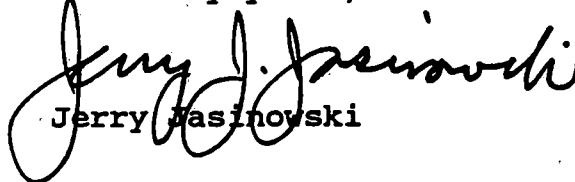
Routine factory changes will be necessary in order to implement the new act's controls. In fact, bureaucratic disincentives will both delay implementation of regulatory controls and cause production delays in manufacturing.

Mr. President, a paper outlining NAM's conference positions is enclosed. It also addresses other issues such as emission trading under the acid rain title, the jobs retraining program and visibility.

We want to be on record with you and the conferees since, given the developments of the past few weeks, we now seriously question whether this bill, if passed, will deserve your endorsement. We urge and appreciate any efforts by your staff to re-direct the bill to its original, workable goals which you outlined one year ago. Failure to do so, we fear, will result in a bill which we will strenuously recommend that you veto.

We remain available for any appropriate discussions with Governor Sununu, Boyden Gray, Roger Porter or Richard Schmalensee in order to assist in the final stages of conference deliberations.

CLEAN AIR AMENDMENTS ACT OF 1990 CONFERENCE POSITION

NAM TOP PRIORITIES:

- **Support House Permitting and Enforcement Title**
- **Support Senate Nonattainment Controls**
- **Support Treasury Department Managing Allowance Trading Program**
- **Oppose General Savings Clause in House Nonattainment Title**
- **Oppose Visibility Provisions**

NONATTAINMENT:

NAM believes the Senate nonattainment language will better control NO_x, VOCs/ROGs, and other nonattainment pollutant precursors. NAM is particularly pleased with the Senate's treatment of offsets, netting, and other provisions needed for factory and facility modernization.

NAM opposes the General Savings Clause (Sec. 193) in Title I of the House bill. This provision would freeze in place any settlement agreement, court order, or Federal Implementation Plan (FIP) for areas including Los Angeles, Chicago, Phoenix, and northern Kentucky, under the existing Clean Air Act. This would bypass the intent of Congress to reauthorize the Clean Air Act and not have states propose new state plans for improved air quality management. NAM prefers the Senate General Savings Clause for Title I.

NAM prefers the Vehicle Miles Traveled (VMT) provisions in the House bill. Note: The VMT controls do NOT include auto design or fuel reformulation.

ALTERNATIVE FUELS:

NAM supports performance-based standards approach for alternative fuels.

AIR TOXICS:

NAM opposes hard line numbers such as 10-4 and 10-6 in the residual risk assessment provisions of the Senate bill. NAM prefers the House approach that gives EPA flexibility to set risk assessment methodology.

NAM would like to limit New Source Review controls to companies that have made significant changes in manufacturing rather than routine manufacturing modifications. NAM also prefers EPA to determine which source categories to be controlled rather than to list all categories in the legislation.

ACID RAIN:

NAM supports moving responsibility for managing the allowance auction program from the Environmental Protection Agency to the Department of Treasury.

NAM supports electric utility industry in getting credit for sulfur dioxide reductions beginning in 1980 using data from the National Acid Precipitation Assessment Program.

VISIBILITY:

Visibility provisions are not needed because EPA currently has authority to issue visibility regulations. If forced to choose, NAM prefers the Senate visibility language.

PERMITTING AND ENFORCEMENT:

NAM's Top Priority in Conference. NAM believes that the House permitting and enforcement language, while not perfect, is far preferable to the Senate language. NAM strongly opposes the Senate permitting language.

NAM supports a state operating permit program with no mandatory EPA permit review/approval. NAM wants reasonable permit procedures, fees, and administrative requirements. A bureaucratic and slow permitting system will cause the new Clean Air Act will cause the new act to fail. Permitting is an integral aspect of a workable Clean Air Act.

CFCs/HCFCs:

NAM opposes unilateral controls on CFCs and HCFCs. NAM supports the Montreal Protocol process and believes that a multilateral approach is the only effective way to deal with global environmental issues. NAM recognizes that limited or full Federal pre-emption may be needed to deal with the problems resulting from local and state CFC and HCFC controls.

WISE JOBS TRAINING PROGRAM:

NAM opposes the Wise jobs retraining program. Adequate jobs training programs exist to retrain displaced workers.

I'm writing to request a brief meeting with you to discuss *virtual world technology* and the spur it can provide to the future American information industry.

You may have read about this technology in the popular press or seen items about it on TV. Using unique software and special visual, aural, and tactile devices, we create unique three-dimensional environments *into which you, the user, may "enter."* Virtual worlds will enable us to educate, conduct scientific and medical experimentation, and design things (e.g., as in concurrent engineering) as never before. The implications of *televirtuality*, virtual worlds shared over telecommunications networks, are truly heady.

The Human Interface Technology Laboratory is one of only two nonprofit industrial laboratories in the U.S. working to advance the state of this technology -- and the only one with the single goals of transferring this technology transfer to the private sector. Our director, Dr. Thomas A. Furness, the designer of the "Super Cockpit," brings 23 years of Air Force experience to the job. (I have enclosed further information about the Laboratory.)

To help us meet substantial research challenges from abroad, we are soliciting the interest and support of industry and government. On August 22nd, I will be attending the applicants' conference for the Commerce Department's Advanced Technology Program (ATP). I would like to visit with you on the next day, **August 23rd**, to brief you on our work and its importance to America's future technological leadership. In the event you are not free, I will be glad to speak with your staff on these matters. Thank you for your consideration of this request, Mr. Sununu.

On behalf of the Energy Tax Coalition, I am writing to reaffirm our strong opposition to inclusion of any form of energy tax as part of a budget summit agreement to reduce the federal deficit. It is our firm conviction that energy taxes would not only do significant damage to the economy, but would prove to be largely self-defeating as a revenue raiser.

Shortly after the Coalition last wrote you on July 19, we prepared a brief macroeconomic study of several forms of energy taxes. This study, which is enclosed, concludes that energy taxes can be expected to damage the economy more than other types of revenue increases. Our analysis confirms that the energy tax proposals under consideration would harm the economy by lowering both GNP growth and employment; lowering business investment, and therefore productivity; and finally by raising price levels and therefore inflation, ultimately causing an increase in indexed government transfer payments. The resulting decrease in economic activity would lead to lower overall revenues than are being projected to flow from adoption of energy taxes, due to lower collections of individual income, social security and corporate profits taxes.

As a participant in the ongoing budget summit negotiations, we urge you to take note of the attached study and the detrimental and counterproductive economic effects of a proposed tax on the energy sector. Coalition members stand ready to meet with you or members of your staff at any convenient time to discuss this subject in further detail.

RE: Proposal to Impose Excise Tax on Investment Trading

Dear Governor Sununu:

I am writing on behalf of the Florida State Board of Administration (SBA), the Pension Plan for the State of Florida, located in Tallahassee. The Plan covers 618,424 active employees, retirees, and other beneficiaries, and last year paid out over \$690,000,000 in retirement and death benefits. The Plan had assets of \$19,308,619,950 as of December 31, 1989.

We are gravely concerned about the proposal under consideration by the White House and the Congressional leadership that would impose a transactions tax on the sale of securities by tax-exempt pension funds and other investors. The proposal to tax securities transactions is both ill-defined and overbroad, covering all types of capital assets and extending to all investment markets. The proposal would wipe out a whole series of clearly valid short-term investment strategies, such as the temporary investment of funds used to make benefit payments. By seriously limiting our investment flexibility, the proposal could impede the discharge of the fiduciary duties necessary to achieve the defined benefit levels relied on by our retirees. Also, the proposal would have a broad and unknown effect on the investment markets.

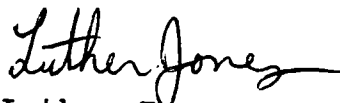
We have analyzed the effect of the tax on the total SBA portfolios and are gravely concerned about the results. It suggests that the total cost of a tax of .015%-.5% would significantly reduce the SBA's total return on investment on a yearly basis. An assessment of this magnitude would force the SBA and other institutional investors to seriously reconsider our current investment strategies. Particularly, the tax impact on short-term investment instruments could have a very detrimental effect upon the liquidity of the capital markets. The actual effect on all of our portfolios is shown in exhibit A of our correspondence.

As a long-term investor, we are strongly supportive of initiatives which may improve the competitiveness of U.S. corporations. However, this legislation would impede such an effort by disrupting the capital markets and lessening liquidity. This would come at a time when U.S. companies are increasingly under pressure from strong, well-financed international competitors.

We would appreciate it very much if you would join with us in actively opposing any proposal to impose a new tax on investment transactions.

We thought that the enclosed analysis and letter to Barber Conable of the World Bank might be of interest. It is an issue that needs to be revisited at appropriation time.

1. Negative Impact on Growth: I was surprised to see that developing nation debt (foreign investment) reduced economic growth and lifespan of the population. The World Bank investments also reduced developing nation economic growth.

2. Debt Reduction: A case can be made that the best program from the interest of the United States would be to shift the World Bank and other official lender programs towards finance of developing nation debt reduction and debt-for-nature, environment, education and health swaps in the next few years.

Debt reduction via either route has much higher rates of return and sustainability than present World Bank programs. Indeed, the Bank seems to have been using American taxpayer money for very low return investments in the past twenty years.

3. Moratorium: A good case can be made for a one to two year moratorium on American taxpayer investments in the Bank while a study is made of its past investment performance (which appears to be very poor), and ways to improve this performance.

Reserving taxpayer money only for debt reduction financing and debt swaps in the next two years would seem to be in the best economic interests of the United States.

Comparison of Returns

The Philippines loan by the World Bank for debt purchase on the open market brought an "economic rate of return" of 50 percent. In contrast, the Bank reported that its portfolio returned 14.6 percent in 1986, and only 49 percent of its projects could be considered to be sustainable.

We found five areas of investment that brought much higher rates of return than the present Bank programs, and they could easily absorb the entire annual investment flow of the Bank and similar institutions each year.

Dear Governor Sununu:

The National Association of Manufacturers supports the development of a credible deficit reduction package. With respect to the Medicare and Medicaid programs, it is critical that fiscal decisions not result in further cost shifting to the private sector. It is equally critical that any five-year budget agreement include sufficient flexibility to accommodate future legislative changes in these programs in the areas of restructuring and financing.

Cost shifting results when the federal government fails to adequately reimburse hospitals and physicians who provide services to Medicare and Medicaid recipients. In response, health care providers seek to recover these funds by shifting costs to private employers sponsoring health plans. Cost shifting also occurs when uninsured persons, now estimated at 31 million, obtain services in hospital emergency rooms and must be treated regardless of their ability to pay.

Employers provide health benefits to over 66 percent of Americans (or more than 139 million persons) under age 65. Given a doubling of health care cost inflation over the last decade and the various factors contributing to cost increases--defensive medicine, an inefficient third-party payment system, unevenness of health care quality, new health care technologies and changing demographics--it becomes even more imperative that government-induced cost shifting not exacerbate health care cost inflation, which averages 15-20 percent yearly.

We would be pleased to work with you and the deficit reduction team to ensure that any cost-control plan will benefit the entire nation, not just the public sector.

The members of the Mississippi Road Builders' Association oppose the use of the federal highway users fee mechanism to raise revenue for non-transportation purposes, including deficit reduction.

The federal gasoline excise is a true user fee that has always been dedicated to financing transportation improvements. It produces tangible benefits for those who pay it.

The need to increase highway investment to improve mobility and strengthen the national economy is widely accepted. In fact, Congress will consider an enlarged highway program next year as part of the Federal Highway Program reauthorization. If the federal gasoline excise is raised this year for deficit reduction purposes, Congress will have a difficult time finding the additional revenue that is necessary to meet the nation's highway and bridge needs.

Federal highway users fees should be increased, but to meet highway and bridge capital needs. A 1989 U.S. Department of Transportation report to Congress shows that almost a third of the bridges on the Federal Highway System need to be repaired or replaced -- at a cost of more than \$50 billion. The same report says that 40 percent of the pavement on the federal system is in "fair" or "poor" condition. Just meeting existing capital needs on the federal system, DOT says, will require a 20-year, \$40 billion annual investment -- about \$25 billion per year more than current federal highway support.

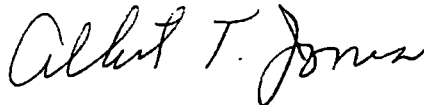
Recent economic research shows that an expanded and sustained federal investment in highway improvements would generate longterm increases in national productivity, corporate profits and private investment.

The softening economy is raising fears of a new recession in the United States. Expanded public works programs can stimulate the economy while at the same time providing needed infrastructure improvements.

In April of this year, you kindly offered to bring to the attention of Ambassador Carla Hills, Erie's request that the United States tariff on microscope slides be eliminated or reduced as part of the Uruguay Round tariff negotiations. I am reluctant to ask you to intervene again in order to obtain action by the Executive Branch of the federal government. However, we are extremely frustrated by our inability to obtain a decision on a matter from the U. S. Customs Service after almost four years of discussion.

In September, 1986, Erie imported from our plant in Braunschweig, West Germany, a quantity of 3" x 1" pieces of sheet glass. It was our intent to manufacture these "blanks" or "cut units" into microscope slides at our Portsmouth, New Hampshire plant. The U. S. Customs Service's Import Specialist at the Highgate Springs, Vermont port of entry (Saint Albans, Vermont District) denied entry of the glass shipment as sheet glass and admitted it as microscope slides in the laboratory glassware classification, at a substantially higher tariff. We promptly protested that action by the Customs Service, and since late 1986, we have been trying to obtain a final administrative ruling.

In the meantime, we have spent many thousands of dollars both for higher tariffs on glass imported from our plants in West Germany and Switzerland for manufacturing into microscope slides here in New Hampshire and for legal fees, in our efforts to resolve this matter.

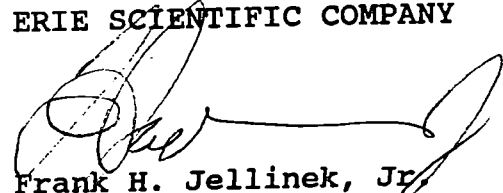
These efforts have been continually frustrated by transfers of Customs Service personnel and responsibility for our matter and by a seemingly endless series of reviews, tentative decisions, re-reviews and changed decisions. The Customs Service number of our Protest is 02018000040.

You may recall that it is necessary for us to import the sheet glass from which we manufacture microscope slides because such glass is not produced in the United States. The high customs tariff that we are protesting as having been incorrectly applied is a tax that ultimately is paid by the hospitals, laboratories and universities that use most of the microscope slides. The tariff does not protect any United States glass-producing industry because there is none.

I will appreciate anything that your office can do to cause the Customs Service to give this matter consistent attention so it may be finally resolved and put behind us. Again, I know how busy you are and appreciate your efforts on behalf of our New Hampshire business.

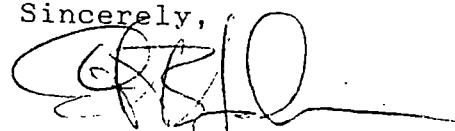

On behalf of the undersigned members of the Energy Tax Coalition, I urge that you not agree to the imposition of taxes on the energy sector as part of a "budget summit" agreement to reduce the federal deficit. While a credible deficit reduction package should be a top priority goal, the inclusion of energy taxes in such a package would be highly counterproductive.

Our preliminary analysis indicates that such taxes would impose significant costs on the economy in terms of lost jobs and reduced economic growth. As a result, we believe energy taxes would raise considerably less revenue than projected and, by no later than the fourth or fifth year, would probably start losing revenue relative to current law.

Another critical point is that energy taxes—which directly increase the cost of industrial production—would significantly damage the competitive position of many U.S. manufacturers and thus worsen our trade deficit. Furthermore, we can see no effective way to offset the comparative advantage that would be conferred on foreign-based production. It should also be noted that in many cases the burden of energy taxes would fall squarely on firms already staggering under the increased costs of pending Clean Air Act changes.

Our views expressed above apply to all forms of energy taxes said to be under consideration, including ad valorem taxes, taxes based on BTU content, and taxes on specific fuels such as gasoline taxes and so-called "carbon" taxes.

Coalition members would be pleased to meet with you or members of your staff at any convenient time to discuss our objections in greater detail.

Dear Governor Sununu:

I am writing to ask that you endorse Tim Shea for president of the Legal Services Corporation (LSC).

As you know, the LSC Board will meet on July 30 to select a president from among four contenders. While the directors will reach their own judgments on the candidates, I am sure that a number of the directors would place considerable weight upon your endorsement.

On July 9, NRLC sent a letter to each director to urge the rejection of John Rother, who has supported LSC involvement on the wrong side of both the abortion and euthanasia issues. (Copy attached.) Now we are encouraging pro-life directors to support Shea, on the basis of his outstanding pro-life "track record," and on the basis of his overall experience and competence.

If Shea becomes president, we are confident that he will defend and advance pro-life interests to the maximum extent possible within the law. And, within the policies established the board, I have no doubt that he will actively support reform legislation which would, among other things, further advance pro-life interests.

Shea is not a johnny-come-lately to his pro-life beliefs. A graduate of the College of the Holy Cross and Notre Dame Law School, he served as legal advisor to a Maryland crisis pregnancy center as early as 1981. His wife served as a pro-life counselor at that "alternatives to abortion" center from about 1979 to 1982, when her own family responsibilities made continued participation impossible. (The Sheas now have six lovely children-- one boy, and five girls.)

Moreover, over the past three years, we at NRLC have observed Shea in action at the LSC, especially in connection with the continuing involvement of some LSC-funded centers in lawsuits challenging state pro-life policies. Congress has attempted to curb such pro-abortion activity, but some LSC grantees have interpreted the congressional restrictions in a very permissive manner. The problem was compounded by Carter-era LSC administrators who endorsed these permissive interpretations.

Soon after becoming General Counsel of the LSC in 1987, Tim Shea initiated a project to reverse these pro-abortion policies. It was Shea who challenged the National Center for Youth Law regarding its continuing pro-abortion litigation. It was Shea who directed the exhaustive legal research which culminated in an October 1988 letter, instructing the National Center for Youth Law that it could no longer justify various pro-abortion lawsuits with the absurd argument that such litigation did not attempt to "procure" an abortion. As Shea demonstrated, such an disingenuous interpretation was clearly contrary to the legislative history of the anti-abortion provision (the Froehlich amendment) to the 1974 LSC law.

Moreover, Shea properly clarified the term "therapeutic abortion," rejecting previous liberal interpretations that had classified virtually all abortions as "therapeutic."

Shea has also been instrumental in attempting to curb the continuing evasion of anti-abortion restrictions by the National Center for Youth Law in the current case of American Academy of Pediatrics v. Van DeKamp. Indeed, just last week Shea interrupted a family vacation to fly to California to participate in a legal proceeding which is part of the continuing effort to force the National Center for Youth Law to discontinue its illegal involvement in that litigation.

Shea also added a question to the general LSC grant application form, asking whether the prospective grantee was engaged in abortion-related litigation.

During the past year, Terrance J. Wear and James Wootton have touted their efforts to curb pro-abortion litigation, as part of their campaign to mobilize conservative support for specific candidates for the board, for LSC president, etc. While we welcomed their efforts to suppress pro-abortion activity by LSC grantees, we assure you that it was Tim Shea who originally took the initiative in this area. I believe that Shea did so not because of any outside influence, but because it was the right thing to do, consistent with congressional intent and with Administration policy, and he continues to do the real "heavy lifting" in fighting the pro-life battle within the LSC.

As years of efforts to "reform" LSC have shown, good rhetoric and flashy gestures don't go very far. Real reform requires political savvy, administrative competence, and legal sophistication. These are qualities which Shea possesses, and which the job of LSC president demands.

Unfortunately, some of Shea's critics sometimes display a lack of those very qualities.

Tim Shea would be a president who would carry out the policies established by the board. I believe that the cause of reform would be far better served by such a president, than by a continuation of guerrilla warfare by LSC staff members against board members with whom they disagree. I refer especially to the 1989 smear campaign launched by James Wootton and his close ally, Libby Whitley of the American Farm Bureau Federation, against the pro-life leader on the previous board, Basile Uddo, because he voted contrary to the Wootton-Whitley position on certain issues; and to the recent pressure campaign which resulted in the resignation of John Erlenborn from the board.

In our view, the anti-Erlenborn campaign was unfortunate. Although allied with Senator Rudman, who is pro-abortion, Mr. Erlenborn was pro-life. He was the architect of the 1984 Child Abuse Amendments, the first federal legislation specifically crafted to protect the right to life of handicapped newborns. Mr. Erlenborn also had a solid anti-abortion voting record in Congress. I understand that Mr. Erlenborn's seat will soon be filled by Senator Rudman's designated replacement, Tom Rath, who is pro-abortion.

Even considering the distinct policy interests of the "Legal Services Reform Coalition," the anti-Erlenborn campaign was very counterproductive. As reported in the enclosed article from Legal Times, the anti-Erlenborn campaign enraged Sen. Rudman, and probably has motivated him to once again become fully engaged in second-guessing the LSC board on policy questions. Moreover, what happened to Erlenborn may have offended other Members of Congress and other parties whose support would be critical to the enactment of the legislation supported by the reform coalition.

Thus, for the sake of temporarily removing one "moderate" vote from the board (to be replaced by one more liberal), the Whitley-Wootton operation created a political environment in which their policy goals are significantly less likely to be achieved. And it was foreseeable that their anti-Erlenborn campaign would have such results.

Unfortunately, the Erlenborn episode is typical of the reckless and counterproductive manner in which the Whitley-Wootton group has operated for the past couple of years. Another example was the sordid attempt by Mr. Wootton and Ms. Whitley to smear Prof. Basile Uddo during 1989, regarding which we wrote to the President last December (copy enclosed).

The people who ran the campaigns against Uddo and Erlenborn are now telling conservative groups that Tim Shea is "anti-reform." That is not the case, as you can ascertain by questioning Shea on reform-related issues.

Regarding David Martin: We have been unable to obtain any concrete information regarding Mr. Martin's views on the LSC issues which are of interest to us. We have no evidence of any pro-life involvement by Mr. Martin in either the public or private spheres. We have sought a meeting with Mr. Martin, but were told that he is out of the country until July 24, which is only six days before the board meeting.

In any event, even if Mr. Martin turns out to verbally endorse the right policies for LSC on pro-life issues, he would require time to become familiar with the LSC programs in general and with the pro-life concerns in particular. We hope that you will consider supporting Tim Shea because of his good track record and his ability to "take charge" immediately.

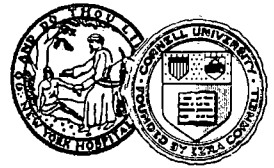

Dear Governor Sununu:

It has been our practice to advise the White House staff of our decision on requests for fire suppression assistance under Section 420 of the Stafford Act, Public Law 93-288, as amended. This letter advises you of our decision on a recent request from the State of Alaska.

On July 5, 1990, the State of Alaska submitted a request for Fire Suppression Assistance under Section 420 for the uncontrolled Tok River Fire, located 200 miles southeast of Fairbanks, Alaska, which started on July 1, 1990, burned over 20,000 acres of forest and grassland, and threatened the Town of Tok. Our assessment of this situation in consultation with the Bureau of Land Management, Department of Interior, revealed that the fire threatened such destruction as would constitute a major disaster. Consequently, assistance under Section 420 was authorized.

Our Regional Director in Bothell, Washington, assisted by the Bureau of Land Management, verified the need for immediate Federal funding for this potentially critical fire situation. Based on this recommendation, the Federal Emergency Management Agency has authorized Federal funding under Federal/State cost sharing. The Federal share is 70 percent of eligible State fire suppression costs in excess of the State floor cost which is \$672,900. On this basis, our preliminary estimate of Federal costs to suppress the fire is \$3.4 million.

The Regional Director is actively monitoring the situation and has notified the Governor that Section 420 assistance is available.

Dear Governor Sununu,

About one year ago you were kind enough to open the WhiteHouse doors to me by introducing me to Bill Roper to whom I submitted a number of healthcare issues, which are summarized in the enclosed sheet. Approximately two weeks ago in response to a request from Mr Kuttner I sent him essentially the same summary. Last night I heard Joseph Califano, former HEW Secretary being interviewed on TV and was shocked to hear him claim that the President has no health policy. Last month the NY Times saw fit to devote two pages to Sununu bashing. I wrote to the editor about the great help that you were to me in gaining access to the President with healthcare proposals, but since the Times prints only what fits I shall not hold my breath waiting. I feel that the fertilization of my healthcare proposals will benefit the President, the medical profession and the public and had suggested to Mr Kuttner the possibility of my coming to Washington to discuss them. Each proposal has been submitted to my chief clinical societies i.e. the AMERICAN COLLEGE OF SURGEONS and AMERICAN ACADEMY OF ORTHOPEDIC SURGEONS and have their approval.

Re: Update on Friends' Team in Nicaragua

Dear John:

I just wanted to drop you a note to let you know what a tremendous impact Friends' 12-member Medical Team and two Mobile Clinics are having in Nicaragua since arriving in Managua earlier this month.

In cooperation with President Chamorro, Friends' team has worked 12-hour days treating patients in the most strategic parts of the Managua area! Despite harassment from the Sandinistas and difficult conditions, we have treated 4,679 patients. Here is a summary of the work:

May 8-10	In front of Presidential Palace	861 patients
May 11-12	Ciudad Sandino, very poor marginal area, former hotbed of Sandinistas	570 patients
May 14-15	Masaya, a city southeast of Managua, the birthplace of the Sandinistas	662 patients
May 17	Carreterra Sur, marginal area south of Managua near foreign embassies	300 patients
May 18	National Theological Seminary (students there harassed for years by Sandinistas)	256 patients
May 19-20	Colonia Central America, a low income area, and Isias Gomez, whose people were forcibly moved there by Sandinistas	580 patients
May 21-22	Bello Horizonte, hometown of Sandinista Interior Minister Tomas Borge, and 14 de Septiembre, a low income area	680 patients
May 23-24	Las Americas, marginal area, mostly people who work in open air markets, and Esquipulas, poor village near Managua	770 patients

Total patients treated.....4,679 patients

SANDINISTAS THREATEN TO KILL OLGA ESCALANTE UNLESS FRIENDS LEAVES NICARAGUA. An otherwise successful mission has been marred by a serious threat against the life of Olga Escalante, Friends' country director for Guatemala, who has been with the team in Nicaragua. At noon on

Friday, May 25, Olga was leaving her hotel room when two people pushed her back into her room. A short, ganster-like man and a short, fat woman -- both about 25 -- jammed her against the wall of her room. The man held her by the throat and began a tirade against the U. S. He said they were Sandinistas and that they knew she was the director of Friends. "If you want to stay alive, you will move the gringos' clinics out of Nicaragua now. Otherwise, you are dead!" he said.

The man started to pull Olga over to the bed, but the woman objected. He seemed to know about Friends' work in Honduras and said we could never have come to Nicaragua, if the Sandinistas were still in power. The man was cursing constantly and holding Olga by the throat. As you may recall, Olga had throat surgery last year. So this was painful.

Olga is normally very quiet but this time, she told me, "I talked like crazy! Everytime he said something, I challenged it and argued with him about it. When he said our medicine was bad and the clinic was no good, I told him we have treated more people in three weeks than the Sandinistas have in 10 years!"

WE WILL BE LEAVING SOON, BUT NOT BECAUSE OF YOU! Finally, Olga told the man, "We will be leaving soon, but not because of you. It's because our work is almost done for now. We are pleased with our work. It has been a big success! But we will be back!" The man got very angry and said, "I want to kill you." But Olga said, "I'm not afraid of you. If you want to kill me, go ahead! But that will not stop us!" The man was in a rage, but they left the room without further harm.

Olga went downstairs to tell the hotel what had happened. She talked to the receptionist who was -- like the rest of the hotel staff -- a Sandinista. The woman was very upset, saying "Our people should not do things like this. I will find out who let him in!" When Olga reported this incident to the Minister of Health, he was very worried and reported it to the Minister of the Interior.

Olga has been calm -- even joking -- about the incident. "This is good! It shows that we are having an impact on the country. Otherwise, the Sandinistas would leave us alone. I have been praying alot during this trip, and I knew something like this would happen. Besides, this will make a good chapter in the book I'm going to write someday!"

POLITICAL SITUATION IN NICARAGUA. Mrs. Chamorro's government is in office but not in power. It has no money, and its mortal enemies -- the Sandinistas -- still control the Army and the National Police! Thanks to the U. S. Congress, the Chamorro government has not yet received a cent of the aid it has been promised by President Bush. As a result, Mrs. Chamorro's government can't even meet payroll for government workers, much less reconstruct the country.

There is a three-way standoff right now among the Sandinistas, the Democratic Resistance, and the government. Friends' team leader John Gemmell said, "Nicaragua is like a barrel of gun powder right now, and everyone's smoking." Meanwhile, the people are in the middle, getting no help at all after years of deprivation. Everything is expensive, and there is little to buy. The people are armed, and the danger of renewed civil war is very real.

ATTITUDE OF PEOPLE TOWARD SANDINISTAS. The Sandinistas seem to have the support of 15 to 20 per cent of the people. These are die-hards, many of whom have benefited directly from the Sandinistas' rape of the country. Some of these Sandinista militants have done and will do anything imaginable to stay in power.

However, most Nicaraguans are fed up with the Sandinistas, and they expect the new government to make big changes. Although people are still afraid of the Sandinistas, many speak freely and criticize the Sandinistas for what they have done to the country.

CONDITION OF NICARAGUAN PEOPLE. The physical condition of the people in the Managua area is very poor. They are malnourished and in a state of deterioration. They have had no medical care in years, and many are suffering from stomach problems, diarrhea, eye problems, skin diseases, hypertension, arthritis and a host of other diseases.

ENTHUSIASM OF NICARAGUAN PEOPLE FOR FRIENDS OF THE AMERICAS. The Nicaraguan people have been very grateful for Friends' help. Everywhere we go, they give thanks and say, "This is good medicine -- this is the help we need right now!" The crowds at Friends' clinics are large and the lines are long. But the vast majority of people are patient, good-natured and grateful. The needs are so great, and everybody needs help!

WORLD MIDDLEWEIGHT BOXING CHAMPION WORKS AT FRIENDS' CLINIC. Alexis Arguello, a Nicaraguan who is the reigning World Middleweight Boxing Champion, learned about Friends' Mobile Clinics and volunteered to help out. So the Champ has been assisting our doctors with examinations and organizing the crowds. He is respected by the people, and they respond favorably to everything he says.

GUATEMALAN AMBASSADOR EXPRESSES PRIDE IN FRIENDS' WORK. The Guatemalan ambassador to Nicaragua has visited Friends' Mobile Clinics several times and has expressed pride at the good work being done by our Guatemalan-American team. The U. S., Guatemalan and Nicaraguan flags have been flying over our clinics, and the Guatemalan flag is a source of particular pride to the Guatemalan ambassador.

FOUNDER OF DOMINO'S PIZZA VISITS MOBILE CLINICS. Tom Monaghan, founder/CEO of Domino's Pizza, was in Nicaragua earlier this month and stopped by Friends' Mobile Clinics to see our work. There were 2,000 patients waiting and the U. S. flag was flying. The Middleweight Champ came out to greet Mr. Monaghan and told him, "This work of Friends of the Americas -- this is the kind of help our country needs!"

REACTION TO U. S. FLAG FLYING OVER FRIENDS' CLINICS. It is interesting to see the reaction of people to the American flag, which hasn't been seen very much in Nicaragua for the past 10 years. A few of the Sandinistas spit at "la bandera gringa" (the gringo flag), but most people are happy to see it. "I'm proud of that flag," one woman said. "Thank God you're here!"

On one occasion, two Sandinistas tried to steal and burn the American flag flying over one of Friends' mobile clinics. But our staff was able to stop them and make them leave the area.

HARASSMENT OF FRIENDS' TEAM BY SANDINISTAS. Everyday, the Sandinistas have sent their thugs to harass Friends' team while the mobile clinics were in operation. Almost daily they have stimulated fights with people waiting in line for medical care. At every place the clinic has visited, Sandinistas get in line with the people and begin pushing. They say things like, "Hey, push, push, push. The gringos have to help us! Push, push!" Sometimes Sandinistas drive by and shout at our clinic, "Assassins!" and "You'll never get out alive!"

One night when the Mobile Clinics were parked at the Intercontinental Hotel, two of our nurses were cooking their supper inside the clinic. Two Sandinistas burst inside and threatened them. Fortunately, someone on the hotel staff called the police, who arrived and made the men leave. Otherwise, we have had little cooperation from either the police or the hotel. Before Mrs. Chamorro took office, the Intercontinental was a virtual private club for the Sandinista elite and left-wing media. The hotel staff is pro-Sandinista and have been rude and abrasive to our team. In order to save money, the team has had two hotel rooms -- one for the nurses and the other for the rest of the team on a rotating basis. The team is convinced that the telephone in their room at the hotel is tapped by the Sandinistas. So they are very circumspect in what they say on the phone.

TWO VIEWS OF FRIENDS OF THE AMERICAS. You'll be interested in the enclosed newspaper articles. They show the contrasting perspectives in Nicaragua today, with Friends as an example. The article from Barricada, the Sandinista newspaper, is entitled, "Now They Are 'Friends'." It describes Friends of the Americas as a U. S. government organization (not true), which promised to distribute food to the people (not true) but didn't provide it. After the people waited in the hot sun (true), Friends finally gave some medical attention and free medicines. It said the gesture would have been kind but for the fact that we have been impoverishing the people of Nicaragua for 10 years by the Contra war, the commercial embargo and the economic blockade.

On the other hand, the story from La Prensa -- the only independent newspaper in Nicaragua -- has a headline that says, "Medical Help Arrives from the United States." According to the article, Minister of Health Dr. Ernesto Salmeron inaugurated two mobile clinics of Friends of the Americas which will serve, in a nonpolitical way, the people of Nicaragua for a four-week period. The clinics, which will treat thousands of people, also brought 15 tons of medicines. Dr. Salmeron welcomed the group and gave thanks for this gesture, which is the first material help to come to Nicaragua. The clinics will serve people without charge, while the staff studies the health of the country with the possibility of bringing greater help in the future.

NATIONAL POLICE STILL A SANDINISTA STRONGHOLD. Immediately after our arrival, the Minister of Health officially requested the police to provide protection for Friends' Mobile Clinics. This was particularly important, since we faced serious problems of crowd control with 2,000 or more people showing up daily for medical attention before 8 a.m.

The Sandinista police came to the clinic for two hours the first day we were there, but then disappeared. They have never returned, despite repeated request for help. The police are still completely pro-Sandinista. On several occasions, when the clinics have passed police checkpoints, the police on duty have given our team obscene gestures as

they drove by. This contrasts with the general population who often wave and give a "thumbs up" when they see Friends' Mobile Clinics.

WORKING CONDITIONS FOR FRIENDS' STAFF ARE VERY DIFFICULT. Our 12 doctors, nurses and other personnel have worked tirelessly since arriving in Nicaragua. But conditions have been exhausting. The first and biggest problem has been the heat! Daytime temperatures have ranged between 95 and 102 degrees. It's been very, very hot -- sweltering -- and there has been no relief. The city needs rain badly. The clinics' air conditioners have not been adequate, especially since the constant flow of patients keeps the doors open all the time.

When 2,000 people are outside waiting for medical attention in extreme heat, the pressure on the medical personnel inside the clinic is enormous. They must evaluate patients and make decisions rapidly. Imagine ten hours or more a day of that kind of pressure -- combined with the unbearable heat. Then add to that the harassment by the Sandinistas and the knowledge that our team is completely vulnerable to attack (since there is no police protection). Yet, Friends' team members have not made the first complaint! They have no desire other than to help the suffering people of Nicaragua.

SANDINISTAS' SOCIALIST HEALTH CARE SYSTEM IS A DISGRACE. For years, the Sandinistas' apologists in the U. S. have said, "Yes, the Sandinistas have made some mistakes, but they have also built clinics and made good quality health care available to everyone." That is propaganda -- pure and simple! After three weeks in Managua, Friends' team leader John Gemmell said, "The Sandinistas' socialist health care system, which has been praised in the U. S., is a joke! There's been no improvement in health care under the Sandinistas. In fact, this is by far the worst health care system in Central America!"

SHORT-RANGE SANDINISTA GOALS. The Sandinistas have three short-range goals, all designed to weaken an already very weak government. First, demobilize the Contras. Second, paralyze the country through strikes. And third, build a new wave of anti-American protests, which strongly discourage American support for the Chamorro government.

NO. 1 SANDINISTA OBJECTIVE: DISARM THE CONTRAS. The most important objective of the Sandinistas is for the Resistance to lay down their arms. Once that is done, the Sandinistas will have a complete monopoly on power. Right now, the Resistance shows no signs of disarming. So far, only the disabled and new recruits have turned in their weapons. It appears that the Resistance will not lay down their arms until they know it is safe to do so. That may be awhile.

SANDINISTA STRIKE PARALYZES COUNTRY. Right after Friends' team arrived in the country, the Sandinistas launched a strike designed to embarrass the new government. The Sandinistas had already stolen everything in the national treasury, deeded government buildings and cars to individual Sandinistas, and passed laws giving Sandinista sympathizers life-tenure in government jobs. But with the strike, they were demanding a 200 per cent payraise for Sandinista government employees.

More than 60,000 workers joined in the strike, and the government was paralyzed. Ultimately, President Chamorro settled with the Sandinistas and granted the strikers a 25 per cent payraise. It demonstrated once again the enormous power the Sandinistas still exercise.

FRIENDS HOPES TO BEGIN WORKING AMONG MISKITO INDIANS ON ATLANTIC COAST OF NICARAGUA. Our dream is to expand Friends' aid to the Miskito Indians to the Atlantic Coast of Nicaragua, the traditional homeland of the Miskitos. The Miskito Council of Elders has asked Friends to move its schools into Nicaragua, to expand our Mobile Clinics across the Coco River into Nicaragua, and to build a clinic in Puerto Cabezas.

JACK DYER TO TOUR NICARAGUA'S ATLANTIC COAST WITH MINISTER OF HEALTH. Of course, Friends can work in Nicaragua on a permanent basis only if we have 1) the permission of the new government and 2) the funds to pay the expenses. Now we have received written permission from Nicaraguan civil aviation authorities for Jack Dyer, Friends' country director for Honduras, to fly directly from Honduras to any airport in Nicaragua.

Next week Jack flies to Managua to pick up the Nicaraguan Minister of Health and fly him to Puerto Cabezas, the Miskito Capital, to inspect conditions there. The Miskitos tell us the small hospital in Puerto Cabezas is in bad condition and needs physicians and medicines. Perhaps we could begin our work by sending a large supply of medicine and one of Friends' doctors to work at the hospital in Puerto Cabezas on a temporary basis. This would permit us to work with the new government and evaluate conditions before deciding whether to build a clinic of our own.

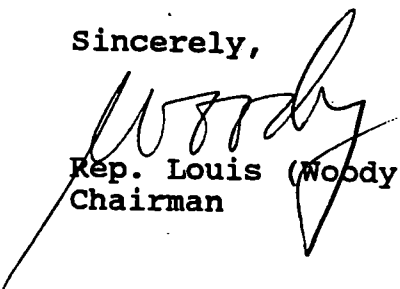
THE FUTURE OF FRIENDS' WORK IN NICARAGUA. Working in Nicaragua after the Sandinistas will be a difficult, expensive, and dangerous enterprise. But it must be done, if democracy is to be consolidated in Nicaragua and the rest of Central America. In order to play a major role in the future, Friends must raise funds to pay the remaining expenses related to our mission to Nicaragua and invest in transitional projects. Here are some of the major things that need to be done:

Pay remainder of expenses for mission to Nicaragua	\$ 75,000
Establish Friends Mobile Clinic in Nicaragua for one year	150,000
Move Friends schools from Honduras to Nicaragua	75,000
Assign one physician and supply of medicine to hospital at Puerto Cabezas, Nicaragua	50,000

This would give us a good start until we can determine what direction to take in the longer run. Of course, at the same time, we must continue all of Friends' other projects.

I hope this report brings you up-to-date! Clearly, Friends is uniquely positioned to make a difference in this important period in history. Thank you so much for your prayers and your loyal support, which has made this work possible. With kindest regards, I remain

Dear Governor Sununu:

According to a recent survey conducted by the House Select Committee on Hunger, the Special Supplemental Feeding Program for Women, Infants and Children (WIC) is experiencing severe revenue shortfalls in many states, due mainly to much higher than expected food cost increases. As a result, more than 50,000 women, infants, and children may be dropped from this vital program this year.

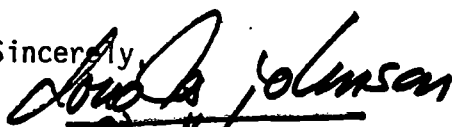
The National Right to Life Committee (NRLC) has long been a strong supporter of the WIC program. We are concerned that, because of this budgetary crisis, many pregnant and nursing women and their babies will not receive services which are necessary to ensure healthy mothers and children.

The nervous system of an unborn child develops much more quickly than many people realize. Brain waves can be detected by seven weeks after conception. Poor maternal nutrition during pregnancy, including the early stages, can seriously retard the baby's development. One major object of the WIC program is to educate eligible women regarding proper pre-natal nutrition, and to provide the foods which are most needed for the proper development of their unborn and newborn babies. Research indicates that WIC has helped increase the number of women seeking early prenatal care, and has reduced the late fetal death rate, the chances of having a baby born at a low birthweight, and the incidence of premature births. Participation in the WIC program appears to lead to better cognitive performance in children.

Even before the current crisis, no more than 60% of the eligible, at-risk women and children were in the program. Because of food cost increases, it now appears that annual increases of \$150 million for the next five years, requested by the House Budget Committee, may only cover those already on the WIC rolls, instead of expanding the program to include more eligible clients, as Congress intended.

Therefore, NRLC urges you to support substantial additional increases in funding for FY 1991, over and above the House Budget Committee request of \$150 million, to ensure the continued participation of present WIC participants and permit outreach to others eligible to be served.
