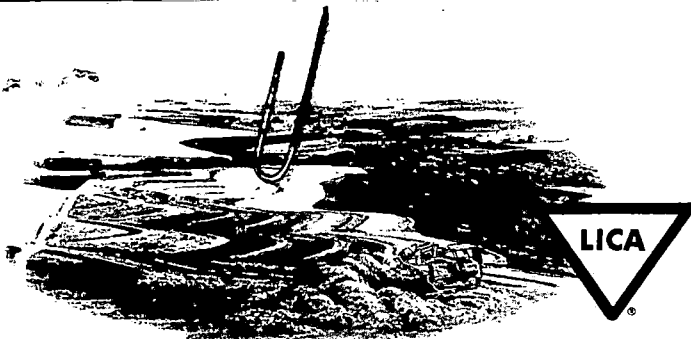

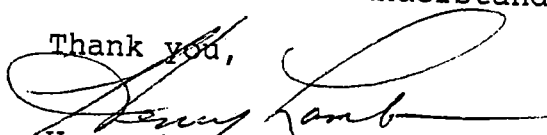
In my letter of April 26, I requested the schedule for the Wetlands hearings that were supposed to occur later in the year. On July 27, we officially requested an opportunity to present comments to the Wetlands Task Force at the meeting in Peoria on August 20. Our second request was directed to Barbara Wyman, Public Meetings Coordinator for the Wetlands Task Force. As of this date, neither request has even been acknowledged.

The hearings appear to be designed to produce only those comments that the hearing planners want to hear. Individual presenters were selected well in advance and invited to participate with their travel expenses and an \$85 per diem paid. The planned agenda leaves very little time for the comments of the people who are most directly affected - the people who own the land.

The President must know the impact that his "no net-loss of wetlands" policy is having upon the citizens of this country. Therefore, I am enclosing a copy of our written comments on wetlands directly to you, along with a video tape of network news reports about a variety of victims of current wetland law.

Please see that the President is aware that the American people need his understanding and his help.

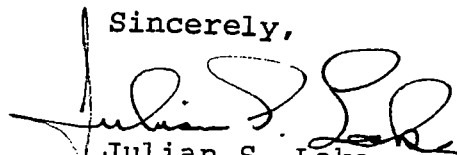

Dear Governor Sununu:

I want to raise with you the issue of a successor to Director Sessions, should he be unable to complete his term as FBI Director.

Having been chief counsel of the FBI oversight subcommittee in the Senate Judiciary Committee and also a former FBI agent, I believe I have acquired some background in evaluating potential candidates for senior positions in federal law enforcement and with this as background I would like to bring to your attention the name of an individual who I believe should merit the President's consideration in the event the Director's position should become vacant.

The man of whom I speak is Dr. Lee P. Brown who now serves as Commissioner of the New York City Police Department. I have known and worked with Dr. Brown for nearly ten years.

Commissioner Brown's long and distinguished career in law enforcement began in 1960 when he was sworn in as a patrolman in the San Jose, California Police Department, where he served with distinction.

Eight years later, he established the Criminal Justice Program at Portland State University.

In 1972 Dr. Brown joined the faculty at Howard University in Washington, DC becoming Associate Director of the Institute for Urban Affairs and Research. He also held the rank of Professor of Public Administration and Director of the Howard University Criminal Justice Program.

He returned to Portland in 1975 where he served as Sheriff and Director of Public Safety for Multnomah County. The following year he was appointed Director of the Department of Justice Services, a department comprised of all the county's criminal justice agencies.

Commissioner Brown served as Public Safety Commissioner in Atlanta, Georgia for four years and as Chief of Police in Houston, Texas for eight years before being invited by Mayor Dinkins to head the 26,000 officers of the New York City Police Department.

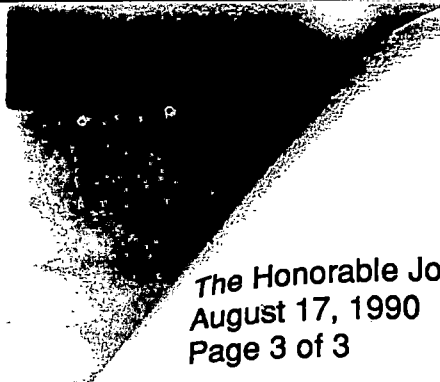
Commissioner Brown holds Master's and Doctorate Degrees in criminology from the University of California at Berkley, a Master's Degree in sociology from San Jose University and a Bachelor's Degree in criminology from Fresno State University.

He has authored many article and papers on police management, community relations as well as, crime and the criminal justice system. He is the co-author of "The Police and Society: An Environment for Collaboration and Confrontation".

He is First Vice President of the International Association of Chiefs of Police.

I served in the FBI as a Special Agent and Special Agent Supervisor for nearly nine years. I was a Senior Trial Attorney in the Department of Justice, Criminal Division for ten years, thereafter, before joining the staff of the Senate Judiciary Committee. I also served as minority counsel to the Senate Iran-Contra Committee. I provide this information in order to help establish my own bonafides in putting forth Dr. Brown's name.

In my view Dr. Brown's conservative law enforcement views, and his contagious enthusiasm, will bring to the FBI, strong leadership and commitment not only to the mission of the Bureau, but to the men and women who serve it so honorably and ably.

Reference the current emergency, I have taken a snapshot review and assessment of the mobilization readiness of Selective Service.

Our strength lies in effective and tested plans, programs, and procedures, and a trained and exercised cadre of mobilization manpower.

Our one weakness is that we are currently below authorized strength in our complement of Reserve Forces Officers because of budget constraints. However, we can still carry out our mission.

Therefore, I can report to you that this Agency is capable of mobilizing the System given the appropriate authorities associated with a national emergency.

On this subject, we have been receiving about 15 - 20 media inquiries a day here at national headquarters, plus a scattering at our six region headquarters. I have had two goals in handling these:

First, to try and calm everyone down, assure them that there are no plans for a draft, and remind them that a draft requires Congressional legislation.

Second, to try and use the media attention to our own benefit by getting out our good story: for example, acceptance of the responsibility of registration by the young men of our nation; the high registration rates of 96 - 99%; the necessity of maintaining continuous registration and a current data base, otherwise we could never conduct a fair and equitable draft; that 1990 is the 50th Anniversary of Selective Service, the Act having been signed by President Roosevelt on 16 September 1940. This struck me as a great opportunity in view of the de Fazio - Hatfield bill and other efforts to put Selective Service out of business.

With regard to longer range matters, I have picked up on the policy theme of "reconstitution" capability, and I noted the President's Aspen speech with special interest. In due course, you may want to mention Selective Service by name in one of the policy statements.

Thank you very much for including Selective Service on the agenda of your breakfast meeting with Secretary Cheney.

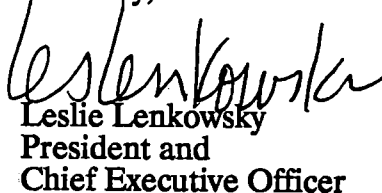
The Blue Ribbon Commission on Hungary's transition to a market economy recently completed its work and submitted its report. We thought you might like to have a copy of the English language version. The Hungarian version was published both as a book and as an insert in the Budapest economic weekly Figyelo. Some 30,000 copies of the insert were distributed in Hungary during the second week of April.

We all are now listening to the words and watching the actions of the newly elected Government of Hungary headed by Mr. Josef Antall. Not surprisingly, the new government has taken a couple of months to form and define its direction. Although we are gratified to see that the early statements of government officials accord well with the BRC recommendations, it is too early to tell how closely implementation will track the report.

Hudson's work on Hungary is but a part of our comprehensive program of involvement in and study of the processes underway in Central and Eastern Europe. This program includes a continuation of our work on the future of Germany and the evaluation of political and economic transition in Eastern Europe and the Soviet Union.

Thank you for sending my wish to serve the Bush Administration and my letter to the Office of Presidential Personnel. I appreciate it and hope to hear from that Office "directly."

Although I hate the thought of war, or even its potential, the decisive action, carefully planned and communicated, was beautiful. Congratulations, congratulations on the Hussein affair.

But my letter today is about domestic affairs. I am worried about the family-care veto. I have been surprised at its response, negative, although larger events have made it seem less important. We all want the President to get reelected--he will, of course--and I want to find a role for myself. I am looking for it. I believe I have it.

While I worked at the Office of Education, now the Department, I was on loan for two years to the Center for Educational Statistics. I directed a national study to survey barriers to women in post-secondary education. I understand how such a study is done.

I'd now like to see research, a needs assessment really, on what the wants and needs of the family (men and women) are. We set forth much legislation, which sometimes passes, without really knowing if it is needed, or if it has alternatives. National in scope, this research would include large and small business, health care units, organizations, government agencies, colleges and universities, and other entities. I'd also like to head it. Could this be a response to the President's veto?

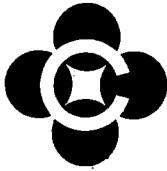

Dear Governor Sununu,

I want to express WRQX's strong opposition to the Administration's proposed 4% "royalty fee" for the use of the broadcast spectrum. It is my understanding that this fee would be 4% of the gross revenue of this station as well as every other station in this country.

We object vociferously to this tax proposal. Four percent of this station's gross revenue is a significant amount and would be imposed on us at a time when local stations are facing a stagnant advertising market. Economic projections do not suggest that this market will improve in the near future, and, as you know, advertising is our sole source of revenue.

Radio stations provide news and public service programming to communities throughout this nation in exchange for government licenses to use the airwaves. We will continue to live up to these responsibilities to serve our local community, but we must voice our strong objections to a tax that singles out our industry with such Draconian results.

I urge you to oppose this spectrum tax and to communicate that opposition to the Administration and to all those involved in the budget negotiations. I look forward to hearing from you regarding this subject of concern for WMAL.

A done deal

Lee Anne Metzger, 27, will replace Doug Wead as special assistant to the president for public liaison. She was offered the job last week by Dave Demarest, White House communications director, and met with Chief of Staff John Sununu yesterday to accept the post.

She is a longtime ally of Sununu aide Ed Rogers and is described by a senior White House official as having "very fine conservative credentials."

Miss Metzger is now coalitions director of the National Republican Congressional Committee and is former legislative director of Phyllis Schlafly's Eagle Forum.

NRCC Co-chairman Ed Rollins said he "would reject her leaving here to go anywhere but to help the president with a very important constituency: conservatives. She is a good grass-roots operative who has been one of my most valuable players."

"She's very pretty and very bright," he added.

In a related move, the public li-

aison office is to be upgraded, a White House official said. A second staff member will be added specifically to deal with the evangelical community. He is reliably rumored to be Les Csorba, now a staff member of the White House Personnel Office, who formerly worked with Reed Irvine's media and education monitoring organizations.

"He is well wired to the conservative community," the official said.

Paul Weyrich, a key player in discussions of the vacancy, termed the selection of Miss Metzger "excellent for the conservative community." He had been aware of the job offer to Miss Metzger since last week and had not, as reported here, circulated the name of any other candidate. It was suggested that he was pushing Ida Mae Webster for the job, but she is quite satisfied with her current position as tour guide at the tomb of the unknown Beltway columnist.

The conservative community remained buzzing yesterday with reaction to the Wead firing. Fax machines were spitting out copies of an item in U.S. News and World Report that said Mr. Wead was canned because Mr. Sununu didn't like Mr. Wead's independent links to the right and — via his friend George Bush Jr. — to the Oval Office.

Mentioning Mr. Sununu in an item about Mr. Wead can be a risky move. Right after we mentioned liaison official Bobbie Kilberg's dismissal of an Insight magazine profile of Mr. Sununu, the chief of staff's office called Insight to cancel its complimentary subscription.

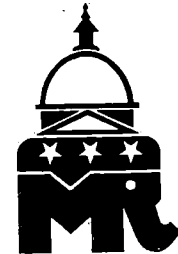

Dear Governor Sununu:

It has come to our attention that in the current budget "summit" negotiations the Administration may propose the imposition of a fee on all users of the radio spectrum as a means of raising revenue for the Federal Government.

For the reasons stated below, we strongly urge you to refrain from including radio spectrum fees as part of any negotiated FY 1991 budget package.

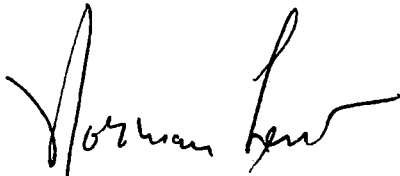
First, it is uncertain whether any fee would actually raise the target revenue figure. We are concerned that any arbitrarily calculated fee, particularly one which uses percentages of gross revenues, would particularly harm the ability of (1) small businesses to continue using private and mobile radio services, and (2) radio and television broadcasters to adequately provide service, particularly local news and information, to their communities. This is especially true of broadcasters serving smaller communities, since that revenue may be crucial to continued operation of those stations.

There also are significant and complex communications policy questions which must be resolved before a spectrum fee could be imposed. Currently, licensees cannot hold an ownership interest in the spectrum it uses. All licenses for spectrum use are granted for a specific purpose under a requirement that the public interest be served by that use. Regulation of radio and TV broadcasting stations are based on a licensee's obligation to serve local communities in exchange for an interference-free frequency granted for use without charge.

If payment for spectrum use is not reconciled with the current statutory framework and these important public interest obligations, the result could modify or destroy the public service obligations of broadcasters and others under the law. This could have drastic consequences for the way Americans now receive their news and information over broadcast radio and television. This is a consequence which we are sure is not intended by those involved in the current budget negotiations.

As you may know, the Congress last year authorized the Federal Communications Commission (FCC) to collect filing fees from all applicants for spectrum use. There has been substantial interest in Administration proposals for auctioning portions of the spectrum, and even in the spectrum fee idea itself. In view of that interest, and the complexity and gravity of this issue, we believe radio spectrum fee proposals are better resolved in the normal legislative process by the relevant committees of jurisdiction than in budget negotiations.

Thank you for your attention to our concerns. We look forward to discussing this issue in greater depth with you.

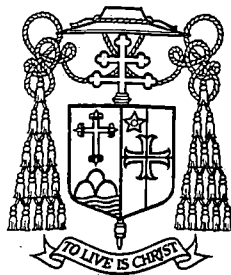

I thought you might be interested in a copy of the report on my visit to the refugee camps in Thailand and Hong Kong. The report includes my observations of camp conditions and of the screening process. It concludes with a series of recommendations for action to help alleviate the asylum crisis in Southeast Asia.

I applaud the Administration's continued opposition to the forced repatriation of Vietnamese boat people. However, that debate is symptomatic of the disintegration of first asylum in Southeast Asia. The US government could pursue several alternatives to ease the crisis. These include the expansion and acceleration of the Orderly Departure Program and greater resettlement options for Vietnamese refugees.

The Catholic Church has developed an Emergency Resettlement Initiative (ERI) in response to the crisis facing refugees in Southeast Asia. The goal of ERI is to increase the opportunities available for resettlement and to encourage resettlement and first asylum countries to pursue more generous refugee assistance policies. I will be writing to my brother Bishops in the US in the near future to urge them to participate in the ERI as a means of underscoring the Church's commitment to refugees.

Resettlement opportunities are important, but it is equally important to ensure that the boat people are treated fairly and humanely. To this end, my report recommends a series of measures to improve the screening process: pre-interview counselling; regular evaluation of the screening process and better training for interviewers and interpreters; and an open accessible appeal process. In addition, safe living conditions for boat people should be ensured and education, health care and training should be provided. A temporary regional holding center designed to provide a humane environment for those denied refugee status could ease the situation.

Finally, it is clear that the only way to resolve the Vietnamese refugee crisis is to promote change that would bring economic development and political and religious freedom for the Vietnamese people. Renewed diplomatic ties and normalization of trade with Vietnam might provide the initial impetus toward the evolution of freedom there. Secretary of State Baker's interest in opening a dialogue with the government of Vietnam to discuss Kampuchea is a welcomed step forward.

I hope your summer has been going well.

Since we last corresponded, I led a U.S. delegation to Europe for negotiations with the EC and Japan on a one billion dollar Japanese proposal for an international program in advanced manufacturing called Intelligent Manufacturing Systems (IMS). With the trilateral negotiations to continue this Fall in Tokyo, I have been busy working with U.S. companies and universities to develop the U.S. response. This has been quite a challenge.

Most U.S. universities merely want more research money notwithstanding the source (e.g., U.S., Japan or the EC) and many U.S. companies want the U.S. government to fund commercial activities. Those companies recognize, however, that basic research is not the real competitive challenge in manufacturing as much as converting that research into successful products through improvements in corporate management and quality. The more difficult question presented by the IMS proposal is "how do we respond to other countries' industrial policy efforts in our own backyard?"

Since I know you have been working on these issues (e.g., foreign companies failure to pay U.S. income taxes despite billions in revenues), please let me know if you have any thoughts on the matter. Enjoy the remainder of your summer.

This letter is to follow up on our conversation yesterday morning at the breakfast meeting at the White House concerning the importance of filling the vacancy on the Federal Energy Regulatory Commission (FERC) as soon as possible.

There are presently four members on the five member commission. The fifth slot has been open for quite some time now. This means that the Commission can become deadlocked in its work on tie votes. The mere possibility of a tie vote provides undue leverage to any single member of the Commission. 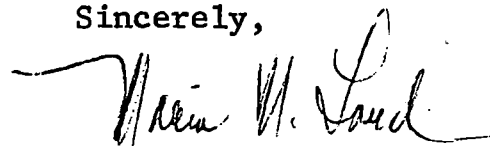

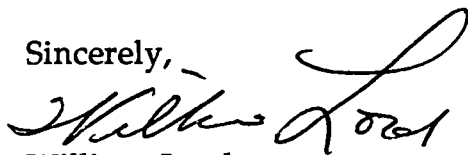
Obviously, we will revise our production schedule if the President can commit to a taping later in the fall.

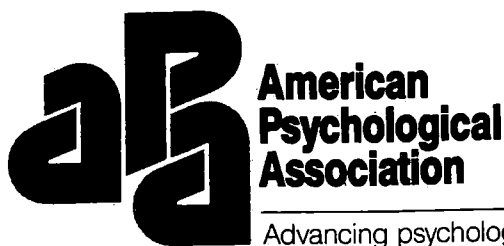

I write on behalf of the American Psychological Association, a scientific and professional association of over 103,000 psychologists, many of whom are engaged in research on measurement and personnel selection. We believe that the Department of Labor decision to suspend the use of the General Aptitude Test Battery (GATB) is regrettable and impractical.

Based on cumulative research findings, we are confident that the effect of suspending the use of an acceptably valid personnel screening instrument in favor of less valid techniques will decrease efficiency in the use of human resources and reduce output and productivity in the thousands of U.S. firms that have relied on the U.S. Employment Service for referral of qualified job applicants.

No employment testing program is perfect, and, as the National Research Committee (NRC) reported, there are some respects in which the GATB might benefit from additional research. APA commends the Department for proposing research to increase the validity and utility of its employment testing program over the next two years. However, job referrals must be made whether the GATB is used or not, and there are no known alternatives that are as valid and economically useful as the GATB. Referring to the economic value of the GATB, Dr. John Hartigan of Yale, Chair of the NRC Committee that reported on the GATB in 1989, stated: "We probably cannot afford not to use the GATB." Thus there is no apparent scientific or economic justification for suspension of the GATB.

APA has supported and often pioneered efforts, historically, on behalf of the development and use of standardized tests and assessment instruments (e.g., Standards for Educational and Psychological Testing; Guidelines for Computer-Based Tests and Interpretations). We would like to work with the Department in its efforts to improve the scientific aspects of the testing program and increase the utility associated with proper use of its tests and score reporting procedures. We hope the DOL will consult with APA, and perhaps other scientific societies with members having the technical expertise required for conscientious attention to these issues. In the interim we respectfully urge DOL to reconsider its decision to suspend the use of the GATB.

Nancy Baybutt's visit to Wediko last week brought to mind that I hadn't given you a recent update on our project designed to develop a cost-effective, short-term treatment/educational model for high-risk, emotionally disturbed New Hampshire children.

Briefly, after you signed off on the project before the presidential election, Wediko implemented a detailed fund raising plan which, to date, has netted close to \$2 million for the plant. We are now on the cusp of establishing an extraordinary resource for some of the most vulnerable and traumatized children in the state. And I think Nancy would say to you that the place has little if any institutional or hospital feel. In my obviously biased eyes, the buildings border on the stunning in terms of the strength and simplicity of their architectural lines. I am just so pleased with how the entire operation has progressed.

I want to add that Bob Kennedy's acumen and backbone has been fundamental to our mission. You might also be interested in knowing that the average daily rate of our new program is approximately 60% less than the average daily rate for placement in a private psychiatric hospital for children. Even though the program is still very much in its maiden run, there are several children we have just finished treating who illustrate the clinical power of the setting. When such positive outcomes are secured, substantive cost savings accrue to the referring cities and towns due to the fact that more restrictive, often longer-term and often out-of-community placements are no longer indicated.

It has been a difficult pull for this small nonprofit agency to reach this point and we still have much ground to cover. We are exhilarated by our strides yet are simultaneously humbled by the tasks before us. But we are here and recognize you as the silent prime mover behind it all. I thank you.

If you ever stray from your arduous duties as the Chief of Staff and for some reason meander to little Windsor, you'll find the door open and the welcome mat out.

Dear Mr. President:

George, we have a small problem you may be able to help with. This letter may be somewhat lengthy, so I would suggest it be routed first to your legal staff, who no doubt will want to talk to our own legal staff, before any determination is finally made. And I want to make clear at the outset that I do not want this to go forward unless you are completely comfortable with the suggestion that will be made, after I have laid out the problem.

Back in 1981, when I first assumed a seat on this Board, the Corporation had just finished signing a contract with The Annenberg School of Communications wherein they agreed to provide \$150 million, at \$10 million a year, over a period of fifteen years, for a project to help make a college level education available to all through telecommunications. We, that is, the Corporation for Public Broadcasting, were to provide the courses and certain other services, as well as the vehicle to disseminate the products of that project through public broadcasting outlets in the United States.

A great deal of excellent programming came out of that relationship as well as a tremendous amount of valuable college course material which I believe was most beneficial in the general field of education, or learning.

Suddenly, and with no advance notice to us, or stated reason, the contract was terminated. We need not here go into what we think the reasons were, but the fact remains that the contract was terminated with some \$60 million still due to the Corporation for Public Broadcasting.

We have tried repeatedly to arrange some sort of meeting with Ambassador Annenberg, to no avail. His lawyers have stepped in and, in effect, placed a stone wall between us and the Ambassador. Our own General Counsel has advised our Board that in his view, a legal contract was entered into, that the contract was unilaterally terminated, and that we should go to court to determine where justice and equity, and all those things, lie. The Board wishes to pursue every other channel possible before a final decision is made on that point. This is the basis of this letter to you, as I will try to explain.

We have tried to use, and have used, "back channels" to try to determine how to approach the Ambassador, or at least to sit down and talk with them to see if we can come to some sort of agreement. To that end, I visited with Tom Johnson, who has a friend who he says is close to the Ambassador. (In fact, Tom said it was all right to use his name in any communications with you on the matter.) The word that came back from his friend was to the effect that the only thing that would change the Ambassador's mind on this would be a call from you. Honey Alexander talked to Howard Baker, seeking advice, and he said essentially the same thing.

The Board, when this was relayed to them in Executive Session, were in general agreement that I should approach you on the matter. After all, \$60 million for higher education is not be sneezed at, as it were.

To be quite frank, I was, and am, reluctant to approach you on this kind of an issue. But I wanted to lay it out for you, have your staff explore the issue with our staff, and make their recommendations to you. Under no circumstances would I want you to phone the Ambassador unless all that were done, and unless your staff could be quite certain what the response would be on the other end of the line, before you made the call. And even then, as I said before, I would want you to feel completely comfortable with the situation.

There are some things in the works in the field of education that I think might excite the Ambassador, even if he did not wish to reinstate the fund in exactly the same manner that existed prior to the termination of the contract. I refer to some of the things you have initiated, and that the nation's Governors are interested in. And, in particular, I refer to initiatives of the Education Commission of the States and the desires of the Governors to enhance our efforts in the field of math, science, and other critical educational programs. These are things that can be worked out between your staff and ours before anything goes forth to the Ambassador, if you are agreeable.

I know you have many more important things to worry about than this. But it is important that we resolve the issue one way or the other as soon as possible. My hope is that it can be resolved "peaceably", as it were, and that we can go forth from here and do more good things for education, together.

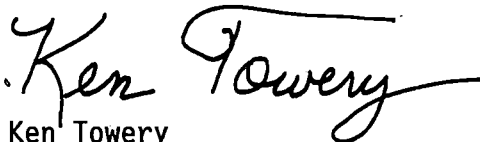

Dear Senator Sununu:

I am the President of the Society for Industrial and Organizational Psychology and am writing to you to express the concern of our Organization for the substance and tone of what is emerging as the Civil Rights Act of 1990. In an earlier letter, sent to members of the Senate and House involved in the formulation of the Civil Rights Act of 1990, I expressed concern over several points as they appeared in the proposed legislation and as they were discussed in committee hearings and in the mark-up process. I have enclosed a copy of that letter for your information and review. Since the time that this letter was sent, additional discussion and debate has occurred as have attempts to develop a compromise position that would be acceptable to the administration (e.g. the Kennedy-Danforth initiative). Most recently, I have received copies of the Senate Education and Human Resource Committee report on the Proposed Act. It would appear that each version of the proposed legislation adds new confusion to the issue. The report, and in particular, pages 38-47 provides the justification for our concern. It is not always possible to infer detail from draft legislation, press releases, or television sound bites. In contrast, the Senate report confirms that there was good reason for our original concern.

To put our concerns as succinctly as possible, we feel that the report is unnecessarily ambiguous in some parts and simply wrong in other parts. The passage of the act in its current form will ignore the scientific progress made in many areas in the past twenty years and contradict other, well established scientific positions. We make no assumptions regarding why such ambiguity and incorrect positions are represented in the report but we can recognize very clearly the damage that will be done from both the public policy and the scientific perspective if the legislation passes in its current form.

In order to provide an appropriate historical context for my current concerns, I will first briefly restate some of the points I made in previous letters.

In my letter of May 4, 1990, I pointed out that there are no clearly articulated professional standards for determining that a selection procedure is "essential".

Also, we had concern that "effective" may be interpreted as implying that job performance may be divided into two categories, and that once an individual has met the "effectiveness" criterion, higher levels of performance were irrelevant. In most cases, according to the professional literature, there are advantages to obtaining employees who perform beyond the minimally "effective" level.

Another objection was to the term "job performance," which we felt might be interpreted so restrictively that employers would be prevented from using selection procedures for such purposes as reducing turnover or absences.

We also have problems with the word "substantial," because it appears considerably more demanding than the prevailing standards for evaluating job relatedness and might be interpreted to be a level of job relatedness impossible to reach using even the most advanced selection instruments.

In the Senate report, a number of additional issues arise and I will address the most serious of these.

The most alarming concept introduced in the Senate report is the definition of unfair discrimination that appears on p. 44 of the report. That definition seems to have come from Darlington (1971) and Cole (1973). The key to the problem is the term "qualified" black workers. The Darlington approach most certainly reduces to quota hiring. In fact, many leading texts in personnel selection (e.g. Cascio, Applied Psychology in Personnel Management, Prentice-Hall, 1987, p. 177) suggest that such a model might support claims of reverse discrimination. In fact, the most widely accepted definition of unfair discrimination is presented by what is known as the Regression model (see Cascio, pp. 175-176). It is this model that was eventually included in the Uniform Guidelines on Employee Selection Procedures. It is shocking to see that consensus abandoned in the current report. Further, the language on p. 44 of the report implies that tests must be without error. That will never be true. Errors of prediction will always occur. The issue is whether those errors occur more frequently in the case of minority test takers. That is not to say that tests are no better than flipping a coin. In fact, we can greatly improve the probability of hiring better employees through the use of tests but we can no more guarantee a 100% success rate than you can guarantee that every bill passed by Congress will have exactly the impact that was anticipated in framing the legislation. We urge you to reconsider the concept of fairness put forth on p. 44 of the report.

A second troublesome concept also appears on p. 44 of the report. The concept of "substantial" appears on two separate occasions. As I indicated in my earlier letter, "substantial and demonstrable" presented serious problems of interpretation and application. To that language is added the notion that a "substantial part of the job" must be covered by the selection device in question. We agree that employers should select persons on the basis of non-trivial aspects of the job, and we feel that if that is accomplished, there need not be an additional burden of proving an undefined substantial relationship in this respect.

An additional concern appears on p. 44 in the discussion of cut scores. The implication is that once a cut score has been identified, all individuals hired with test scores above that point will be equally effective and all below that point will be equally ineffective. In practice, a cut score often represents a promise by an employer not to go below some minimal level in adding employees. This is particularly important in positions involving public trust (e.g. police officers, firefighters, nuclear power plant operators, airline pilots). The employer has a duty and responsibility to maintain and enhance the quality of his or her workforce. This is accomplished not by setting the cut score as a target but as a "floor" below which the employer will not go. As the report currently reads, there is a disincentive (in the form of increased likelihood of Title VII litigation) for an employer to improve the effectiveness of an employee population. In fact, the effect of hiring around an absolute cut score may ultimately be more damaging to the economy than quota hiring, although both clearly present problems.

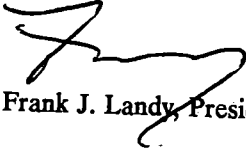
As I indicated in my earlier letter, "job performance" is much too narrow a concept to be of value in the modern business environment. It ignores issues such as absenteeism, turnover, accidents, training costs, reducing sexual harassment, reducing offensive racial behavior on the part of workers or supervisors, etc. It implies that any behavior not directly related to the quality and/or quantity of work output is irrelevant to the present concept of "business necessity." That is simply not the case. The police officer who writes the greatest number of tickets will not necessarily make the best police supervisor.

Since the late 1970's, it has been widely accepted that differences in observed validity coefficients from study to study were not prima facie evidence of the need to do local validation studies. The notion of "situational specificity" of validity has been widely abandoned for over ten years yet the notion is re-introduced on p. 43 of the Senate report. There is little empirical or theoretical support for the notion that each test must be locally validated for every situation and for every job title. We are very concerned about what meaning will be attached to the requirement to show validity for the job or jobs in question.

Finally, we are surprised to find what seems to be an enthusiastic endorsement of the Uniform Guidelines on Employee Selection Procedures. It is clear that these Guidelines are badly out of date and do not represent the current thinking in personnel selection and test validation. In fact, the Society for Industrial and Organizational Psychology Principles are referenced in almost every Title VII case in Federal Court. It is remarkable that they do not receive the same deference in the Senate report. There is no justification for using these outdated Guidelines as benchmarks for new legislation.

As I indicated in my earlier letter, SIOP is centrally concerned with the issues that you and your colleagues are addressing in the Civil Rights Act of 1990. We stand ready and willing to help in restoring the balance you seek in Civil Rights law. Nevertheless, as the current legislation and supporting material is written, it does more to obstruct the efforts of right thinking professionals and employers in establishing an industrial environment fair to all citizens than to assist in achieving that goal. Please feel free to contact me or any of the members of our Society to assist you in your efforts.

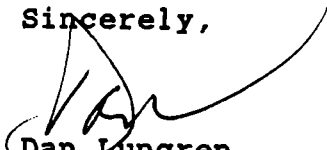

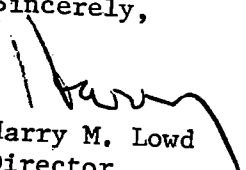
As you begin budget summit negotiations in earnest, I am writing to urge you not to reduce the Medicare funding beyond that which was proposed by the Congress.

Hospitals have contributed significantly to the reduction of the deficit and also to extending the life of the Hospital Insurance Trust Fund. A hospital such as New London with its high medicare patient days (65%) cannot survive with continued cuts. If we are to survive at reduced levels of payment, then I fear quality and access to care may be compromised.

Although politically unpopular, it is my feeling that we should consider again medicare participants participating financially in their coverage based on their ability to pay. I recognize this is by no means universally acceptable, but this segment of our population has the largest amount of disposable income and perhaps should participate more in their medical care.

Dear Governor Sununu:

This goes back to our conversation on the front steps of the National Academy on April 5, while you were waiting for your limousine after the 5th Anniversary celebration of The National Technological University that our mutual friend Bob Galvin organized.

As you may recall, we commiserated over the parallels between the measures advocated now to stave off the threat of global warming and those taken following the 1973/74 embargo attempt to avoid what turned out to be a largely fictitious "energy crisis." Unfortunately, the proposals for reducing the emissions of greenhouse effect gases could cause an order of magnitude more harm to the economy and social fabric of the United States and other industrialized countries willing to take premature action. The premises underlying these proposals seem to be even more questionable than the erroneous (and contradictory) expectations of ever worsening oil shortages and steeply rising world oil prices, which were the justification for the largely counterproductive federal interventions in the energy market during the seventies and early eighties. I believe we agree that U.S. global competitiveness is inseparable from the pursuit of least-cost energy supply and utilization strategies. Naturally, such strategies must internalize quantifiable costs of mitigating environmental impacts. I doubt that we are anywhere near the point where we could quantify the costs and benefits of reducing carbon dioxide emissions from fossil fuel use, other than through independently cost-effective end-use efficiency improvements.

In another replay of history, alarmists with a quite varied set of agendas are again beating the drum for federal intervention in the oil market to stem rising U.S. oil import dependence caused by the economically very beneficial low level of world oil prices and

price expectations. At the request of the Energy Engineering Board of the National Research Council on which I serve, I prepared the attached draft of a position paper on appropriate DOE policies to deal constructively with the quite legitimate concerns over a return to the excessive volatility of the world oil market experienced between 1973 and 1986. I thought you might find it of interest.

As you can see, I am back in energy after my stint as university president.

Dear Governor Sununu:

You were quoted yesterday in the Wall Street Journal as saying that you will borrow a good idea from anybody. I have one for you which might assist you on the savings and loan bailout problems you are currently facing. I am attaching a copy of a proposal which I have been advocating throughout Illinois.

You will note that my proposal has received several endorsements from the Illinois news media, including such nationally known newspapers as the Chicago Tribune and St. Louis Post-Dispatch. I have forwarded my proposal to Ed Derwinski, Secretary of Veterans' Affairs and a former director of United Savings of Chicago. This information has also been made available to Congressman Michel, Congressman Hyde and Congressman Ed Madigan. I would suggest talking to them regarding a change in policy regarding the application of FIRREA.

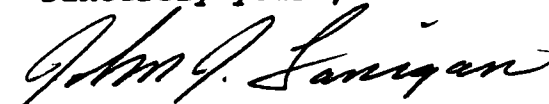
The Administration's FIRREA bill as it is currently being enforced will cost the taxpayers a lot more money in the long run than the original problem caused by double digit interest rates in the late 1970's and early 1980's and subsequent thrift deregulation. The present Administration's policy of shooting the wounded by taking over undercapitalized mutual thrifts is escalating the bailout costs to the taxpayers. Many of these thrifts could be saved and FIRREA's capital standards met by utilizing the present inventory of RTC owned assets to replace intangible assets and improve capital standards. The newly capitalized thrifts would be much more attractive to investors. In the event there was an absence of financial investors, the RTC would own the thrift's capital stock, permitting if necessary a sale at a future date to reduce the overall cost to the taxpayers. This approach would be a substantial improvement over the present

policy of hiring thousands of bureaucrats to maintain billions of dollars of depreciating assets and the disposal of these assets at huge discounts. Thank you for your consideration. I hope to hear from you, for if I can be of any further assistance, please let me know.

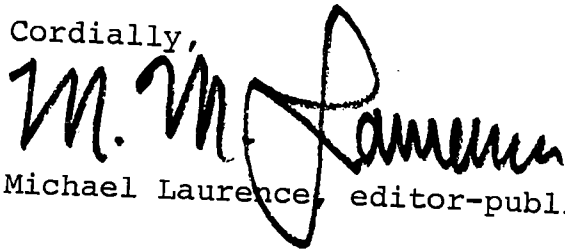

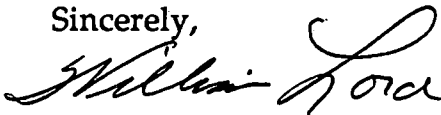

It is our understanding that consideration of legislative proposals to override the Bell System Consent Decree may again be on the Economic Policy Council's agenda. Since our visit with you last year, Bob Allen and other senior officers have met with several EPC members to explain why AT&T disagrees with the proposed legislation. However, we have not talked in depth with you about this critical issue.

I was therefore pleased to hear of your offer, relayed by Marc Rosen, to read a paper from AT&T which states the reasons why the Decree should be left intact. I understand you also offered to circulate the paper to key people in the Administration. (Marc spoke to you on June 4th at the New Hampshire Industry Association dinner).

Our paper, which is enclosed, focuses on the Decree's manufacturing injunction. The Decree contains two other injunctions, covering long distance and information services. We understand no one in the Administration contemplates removal of the long distance injunction, but it will be jeopardized by one of the current legislative drafts. As for information services, the D.C. Court of Appeals recently instructed the district court to reconsider and apply a different "public interest" standard to whether the injunction should be removed, and the matter is going forward.

We would be glad to send you any other information you and the EPC members may require in the coming weeks. We would also be delighted to talk with you anytime, if that would be useful.

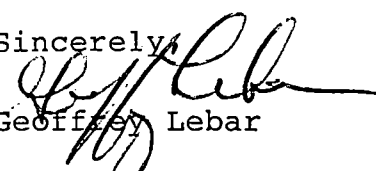

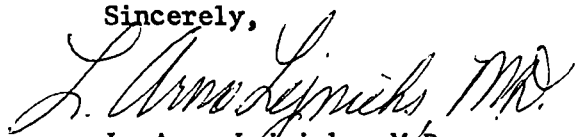
