Dear Governor Sununu:

Your years as governor of New Hampshire were landmarks of leadership in the state. You left us on a sound financial basis, with high employment, and an excellent education system. One can only conclude from such a performance, that you understand how things work in the real world. I wish that you could impart this knowledge to George Bush.

Many people that I come in contact with, at the grass root level here in New Hampshire, have lost patience with George Bush. For the most part, conservatives were never convinced that Mr. Bush was conservative in his beliefs to begin with. His performance in office to date, confirms our doubts.

For example, his failure to support the Lucas nomination can only be explained in terms of political expediency rather than on principle. 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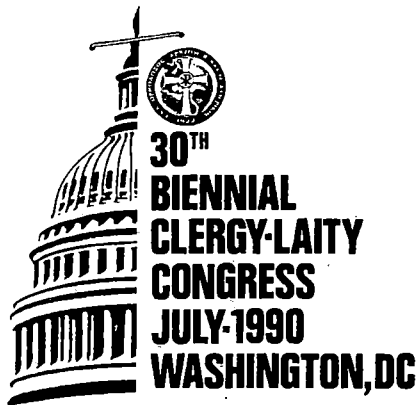

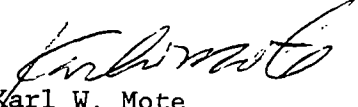

Dear John:

With the President's very regrettable about face on "no new taxes", you may need to ponder your own future. How long will your credibility remain intact, now that Darman and Brady have pushed the boss into a repudiation of his most explicit and uncompromising campaign promise?

And with the President apparently abandoning Lithuania, defending the NEA porno shows, and buying into such lunacies as the Clean Air bill, the handicapped rights bill, and possibly the truly shameful "civil rights bill", what have we Republicans got to look forward to? Rhetorical support for the failed anti-flag burning amendment? Not a very good trade off.

I have as a house guest this week a man who chaired the National Conference on Black Power at the height of the urban riots of 1967, Dr. Nathan Wright Jr. From Dr. Wright, a lifelong registered Republican and distinguished black educator with a Harvard doctorate, I learned long ago how objectionable racial quotas are not only to whites, but also to self-respecting blacks. The President's signature on the Kennedy-Hawkins bill would be nothing less than a shameful capitulation to the media-created "civil rights" movement. It would be very hard for me to support George Bush again after this, especially after compounding the crime with the "no new taxes" reversal and other follies unworthy of a Republican President - most if not all of which appear to have been entered into over your opposition.

Incidentally, it is unbelievable that this Administration has not named Dr. Wright, a man of immense diplomatic skills and international respect, to be a citizen member of the United Nations delegation, especially after George had his brother Bucky take Nathan to dinner in 1980 to recruit him for the Bush campaign. I tried to pump Atwater up on this idea last year and he stared vacantly at the proposition, poor fellow. Dr. Wright could be a brilliant ambassador for the Bush administration to the black community; he's semi-retired from SUNY-Albany and the Episcopal Church.

Anyway, I have long felt that you were perhaps the only dependable bright spot in the administration's top levels, and I am thus glad you are on the job. 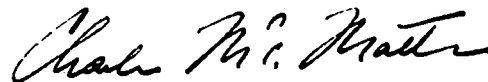
Dr. Edward J. Burger, Jr. seeks appointment as Commissioner of the Food and Drug Administration. I believe that his qualifications merit careful consideration.

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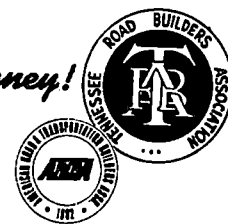

On June 26 I wrote you to express the concern of the Pharmaceutical Manufacturers Association regarding the OMB proposal to restrict sharply prescription drugs that would be available to Medicaid patients and to authorize a pharmacist to dispense to a Medicaid patient a cheaper pharmaceutical product which is different from that prescribed by the patient's doctor. I pointed out that the proposal had grave public-health implications and that it would not save money.

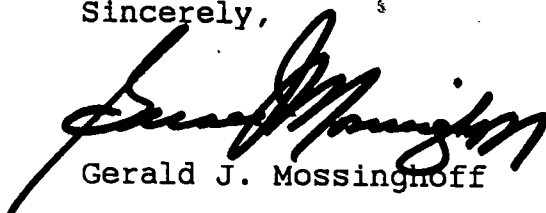
In case you did not see it in yesterday's Wall Street Journal, I am enclosing an article on the New Hampshire Medicaid program. The article states that:

"When Medicaid officials in New Hampshire adopted measures to limit prescription purchases, drug costs went down. But admissions to both nursing homes and hospitals for elderly patients went up."

We have not had an opportunity review the study referred to in the article, but it follows several studies that reached the same conclusions about various drug restrictions in other states.

Budget cutters may wish it to be otherwise, but prescription drugs are the most cost-effective form of medical therapy by far; when they are restricted, other, more expensive forms of therapy go up.

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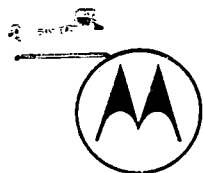

The Civil Rights Act of 1990 (H.R. 4000/S.2104) is of great concern to Motorola and many of our associates in the business community.

The legislation has been rushed through a series of hearings in Senate committees and was quickly reported out of the Senate Committee on Labor and Human Resources. Motorola is absolutely committed to equal opportunity in the workplace and to fundamental civil rights for all people, but this legislation would distort the civil rights law by discouraging conciliation and settlement, and encouraging protracted litigation. At the very least, the Civil Rights Act of 1990 would expose virtually all employment practices to allegations that they are discriminatory, subject employers to jury trials, change the remedies to compensatory /punitive damages, effectively mandate quota-like practices, and greatly diminish and/or eliminate employer defenses.

At a time when responsible companies like Motorola have demonstrated good faith and great success in hiring and advancing protected class people, we feel this legislation is ill-advised and unwarranted.

We urge you to continue to seek less onerous alternatives to the Civil Rights Act of 1990.

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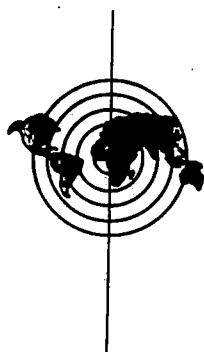

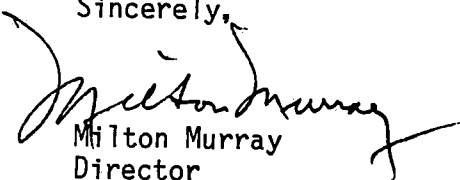

Dear Governor Sununu:

The undersigned food industry organizations -- whose members represent some 21 percent of GNP -- want to express deep concern at the Administration's apparent reluctance to grant preemption in proposed FDA rules on nutrition labeling, now pending within OMB.

Uniformity, for something as seemingly trivial as a food label, is not a mere matter of convenience to food manufacturers, wholesalers, brokers and retailers who operate in the fifty states. It is, in fact, essential to the continued vitality of an enormously complex chain of distribution which provides the most stable, inexpensive food supply the world has ever known.

Food in the United States is produced, manufactured and marketed on a national basis. The products that find their way to the grocery or convenience store shelf -- some 300 billion items per year -- are fungible and defy state-specific distribution.

From a logistical standpoint, there simply is not sufficient warehouse space at the manufacturer, wholesale or retail levels to segregate and ship products on a state-specific basis. Moreover, the lines and patterns of distribution are dynamic, constantly adjusting to reflect changing market forces, such as consumer demand, price fluctuations at the supply end, and the cost and availability of transportation. In all, the system works to put product where people want it at the most affordable prices anywhere in the world.

The success of this system and its clear benefits to consumers are no accident. This national marketplace has developed and flourished because of the unfettered movement of goods in interstate commerce, a right so cherished our forefathers sought to preserve it through constitutional guarantees. Thus, it is no surprise, this industry has fought hard in state capitals across the country to minimize barriers, such as disparate labeling requirements, that could jeopardize or inhibit this beneficial flow of goods among the states.

The pending FDA rules are a critically-needed reaffirmation of Federal authority. Your choice is not a philosophical abstraction. We will either continue to have a national marketplace, or let the balkanization, which has already begun, take hold and fundamentally alter the dynamics of this industry, and with it, the unparalleled benefits it has afforded U.S. consumers. In our minds, that choice is very clear.

On June 20 OMB Director Richard Darman presented to the Budget "summit" conference a proposal that purports to offer estimated Federal savings of some \$300 million--commencing in FY 1991--from a program which would allow pharmacists to switch Medicaid patients to a different and cheaper drug from that prescribed by the patient's physician.

Because of your key role in the budget negotiations, it is important that you know that--even without addressing the very serious public-health shortcomings in this proposal--a \$300 million savings estimate is completely unrealistic.

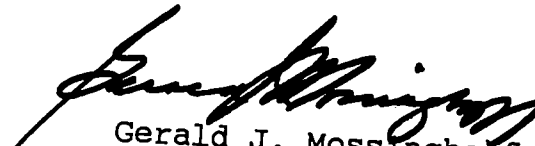
Moreover, the public-health implications of this proposal are grave indeed. The core of the proposal is "therapeutic substitution"--the switching of a patient's prescription to a different chemical from the one prescribed, without the knowledge or consent of the patient's physician. Therapeutic substitution is vigorously opposed by the American Medical Association and virtually every other medical organization. For example, it has been described as "a flawed and dangerous practice" by both the American College of Cardiology and the American Heart Association.

With respect to projected savings, a recent study of this issue found that: (1) FY 1993 is the earliest that such a proposal could be implemented; (2) the total combined Federal/state savings from such a proposal, without considering off-setting administrative expenses, would not exceed the range of \$27-135 million, and (3) administrative and other costs associated with this proposal would likely overwhelm any savings that might be achieved. I am enclosing for your use and information the Executive Summary of this study. I would be pleased to send you the entire study if you or your staff so desire.

As you go through the difficult and challenging process of crafting a budget compromise, I hope you will agree that the OMB proposal to restrict Medicaid patients' access to prescription drugs should not be part of any "solution."

Re: Alert on the status of Senate and House BB/TLA measures

SENATE

The U.S. Senate Judiciary Committee favorably reported a balanced budget/tax limitation amendment, S.J. Res. 183, (Simon, Thurmond, DeConcini, Hatch, Heflin) to the Senate floor on June 14, 1990. The vote was 11 to 3 with Senators Biden and Kohl in the positive column for the first time. (Ayes were: Biden, DeConcini, Heflin, Simon, Kohl, Thurmond, Hatch, Simpson, Humphrey, Grassley, and Specter. Nays were: Kennedy, Metzenbaum, Leahy.)

In 1982 the Senate approved a BB/TLA 69 to 31. In 1986, a BB/TLA similar to S.J. Res. 183 as reported, failed by one vote, 66 to 34. Since the 1986 vote, 25 new senators have been elected to that chamber.

Observers are optimistic about a chance for a vote in the Senate before the end of this session.

HOUSE

The bipartisan House BB/TLA, H.J. Res. 268, has the highest number of cosponsors ever at 248, or 42 short of the necessary two-thirds. Since the House Judiciary Committee has refused to hold hearings, a discharge petition was filed in late May. As of June 14, Discharge Petition 218. Prime cosponsors believe the requirement and House discharge would be July 23, 1990.

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REQUEST

Members of the BB/TLA Coalition steering committee request a meeting with White House political staff to discuss this opportunity to pass a balanced budget amendment. Coalition coordinator, Sheila Macdonald, can be reached at 543-1300.

Dear Governor Sununu:

Because you are participating in the negotiations on the Kennedy-Hawkins Civil Rights Bill, I thought this draft paper by Heritage Foundation analyst William Laffer would be of great interest to you.

Fundamental fairness and due process of law would be abandoned if the Kennedy-Hawkins bill passes in its current form, according to Laffer. He points out that the bill "must be stripped of any provisions that would tend to promote quotas in any way," and that, "the final product must include a provision making all federal civil rights laws applicable to Congress."

An official version of this paper will be published later this week, but I wanted to provide you with this pre-release draft in light of the timeliness of the issue.

Kennedy-Hawkins: Where Compromise Is and Is Not Possible

The "Civil Rights Act of 1990" (S. 2104, also known as "Kennedy-Hawkins"), scheduled for Senate action next month, poses important philosophical questions that go to the heart of what is meant by the term "civil rights." Such legislation presents policymakers an opportunity to adopt a new vision of civil rights that focuses on the neediest and most deserving members of society and that respects and enhances individual dignity and initiative rather than fostering dependence on government.

Negotiations are underway on a possible compromise on the Kennedy-Hawkins bill. Although President Bush has indicated that he wants to sign "a civil rights bill," he has also made clear that he will not sign any bill the unintended consequences of which would be to promote the adoption of quotas. If we as a Nation are to succeed in redirecting the civil rights debate in the 1990s -- and, more importantly, in emancipating individuals of all races or ethnicities from government dependence, several minimum requirements for any acceptable compromise must be met.

Anything good enough for the American public ought to be good enough for Congress. First, whatever specific compromises are made, the final product must include a provision making all federal civil rights laws (including but not limited to Kennedy-Hawkins itself) applicable to Congress. If Congress is not sufficiently comfortable with the bill's provisions to make itself subject to the new law, then the American public should not be subject to the new law either. A minimum test of the bill's fairness should be whether Congress is willing to subject itself to the bill's requirements.

Quotas. Second, the bill must be stripped of any provisions that would tend to promote quotas in any way. In listening to the debate about whether any of the pending civil rights bills would tend to promote quotas, it is important to keep in mind that the term "quotas" is being used as a short-hand term for all forms of race-conscious decisionmaking, including "goals" and "timetables," and for the danger of forcing employers to abandon perfectly legitimate tests, selection devices or hiring practices simply because they happen to produce statistical disparities between the employer's work force and the general population.

Although the Kennedy-Hawkins bill never even mentions the word "quota," several of its current provisions appear to have a substantial potential to encourage the practices described above. The most significant of these is section 4, which would respond to the Wards Cove decision by (1) relieving plaintiffs of the need to identify the specific employment practices that allegedly produce a disparate impact, (2) requiring defendant employers to

demonstrate -- "by objective evidence" -- that their hiring and promotion practices are "substantially and demonstrably related to effective job performance," and (3) raising the employer's rebuttal burden from one of production of evidence to one of proof or persuasion. The combined effect of these changes would be to stack the deck so heavily against employers as to make it almost impossible for them successfully to defend themselves against disparate impact suits. Moreover, even if it might still be possible for employers to defend themselves successfully against disparate impact suits, the cost of defending against such suits would be even greater than at present. (No matter what standard of business-relatedness is employed, putting the burden of proof on the defendant would make it almost impossible for defendants to obtain summary judgment and thereby avoid the expense of a trial.) Many employers would decide that defending against disparate impact suits simply isn't worth the effort--that the cost of altering their hiring process to produce the "right" mix of race and sex within each segment of their work force would be less than the cost of continuing to use race-blind, sex-blind selection procedures that focus solely on an applicant's qualifications.

Although section 4's standard of job-relatedness has been changed from the earlier requirement that any challenged practice be "essential to effective job performance," the new language doesn't even begin to solve the problem. Section 4 would still put the burden of proof on the defendant (contrary to the great tradition of Anglo-American law, under which a defendant does not have to prove his innocence, and to the customary practice in disparate treatment cases and in virtually all other areas of civil litigation), and it would still relieve plaintiffs of any need to identify specific employment practices that produce a disparate impact. Moreover, the new language, like the original language, defines the standard of job-relatedness exclusively in terms of "effective job performance." This narrow focus would artificially preclude consideration of other nondiscriminatory factors which can legitimately bear on employment-related decisions. (For example, if an employer were to close a particular plant for cost reasons and to terminate all its employees, thereby producing a disparate impact, the decision could be altogether unrelated to how effectively the terminated employees perform their jobs and yet be essential to the survival of the business.) Finally, the new language would require defendants to meet their new burden of persuasion solely by means of "objective evidence." While this term is not defined, it would appear to mean that employers would have to undertake statistical validation studies in support of every practice except those that the employer can prove do not produce a disparate impact. Because such studies can be very expensive, many employers would be forced to abandon perfectly legitimate practices because the cost of validating them would be prohibitive. Given the nature of the problem, it is doubtful whether anything short of a wholesale

deletion of section 4 or the codification of Wards Cove will do, for any legislative change which alters the standards of disparate impact litigation from those set out in Wards Cove will increase the expected costs of litigation to employers and thereby create pressures to avoid litigation place by getting the numbers to come out right.

While the principal focus in the debate over whether the Kennedy-Hawkins bill would tend to promote quotas has been on section 4 of the bill and the Wards Cove decision, one should not overlook section 6 of the bill, which deals with Martin v. Wilks, for it implicates quotas every bit as much as section 4. Section 6 would sharply curtail the ability of those who are affected adversely by consent decrees or court orders that call for quotas or other, similar kinds of race-conscious "remedies" to bring challenges to such orders or decrees. In Martin v. Wilks, the Supreme Court held that people who are not parties to an employment discrimination consent decree that contains racial preferences are not precluded from challenging decisions taken pursuant to the decree in a subsequent employment discrimination suit of their own. Section 6 of Kennedy-Hawkins would overturn Wilks by binding anyone who had notice of a proposed judgment and a reasonable opportunity to present objections before its entry, as well as anyone whose interests are deemed to have been adequately represented by a party to the original litigation, and it would also preclude subsequent challenges whenever "reasonable efforts were made to provide notice to interested persons."

The practical effect of section 6 would be to lock in quota programs by insulating settlement agreements and court orders that call for quotas from any subsequent challenge. Practices that would otherwise be per se illegal under Title VII would be immunized by judicial decree. Consent decrees and court orders that do not employ quotas or other racial preferences that impair the rights of persons not before the court aren't likely to be challenged in the first place, and they are likely to withstand any subsequent third-party challenge anyway. As such, they would not be affected by section 6. The only kind of court order or consent decree that would be protected by section 6 would be one calling for some form of race-conscious relief in violation of the rights of people not before the court. Thus, section 6 is really about quotas in the broad sense of the term. As such, it is doubtful whether there can be any compromise vis-a-vis Martin v. Wilks and section 6 of Kennedy-Hawkins.

Fundamental Fairness and Due Process of Law. Just as section 4 of Kennedy-Hawkins would reverse the customary presumption of innocence by placing the burden of proof on defendants, section 6 would violate the basic principles that no one may be bound by an agreement to which he or she was not a party, or (with certain limited exceptions) by a judgment in a proceeding to which he or she was not a party, and that everyone deserves his or her day in

court. For similar reasons, it does not appear that there can be any compromise on Price Waterhouse and the issue of whether the absence of causation and harm shall be a bar to recovery under Title VII. As a general matter, the plaintiff has the burden of proving that his injury was caused by the defendant's illegal act if he is to recover anything from the defendant. Of course, in a mixed motive case, where acts attributable to the defendant are responsible for creating the uncertainty as to causation in the first place, it may be appropriate to shift the burden of proof on the issue of causation from the plaintiff to the defendant (at least after some appropriate minimum showing by the plaintiff)--just as is done in cases of joint causation in tort, and just as the Court did in Price Waterhouse. However, at the very least the defendant must still be allowed an opportunity to prove that the improper motive didn't cause the action or decision that affected the plaintiff; if the defendant succeeds in making such a showing, it should be relieved of liability under Title VII. For example, if a 100-person partnership votes unanimously not to admit the plaintiff into the partnership, with one of the 100 partners basing his or her decision on the plaintiff's race, sex or religion and the other 99 partners taking no account at all of such factors, there would be no basis at all for holding the partnership liable under Title VII and making it pay damages to the frustrated candidate. This much would seem to be required as a matter of justice and fairness if not of due process of law.

However, under section 5 of the Kennedy-Hawkins bill, even if a defendant could prove that it would have made the same decision or taken the same action in regard to the plaintiff even in the absence of an improper motive, it could still be found liable for a violation of Title VII and thus be subject to possible injunction, payment of damages, and reimbursement of the plaintiff's attorney fees. The absence of causation would be relevant only to the issue of whether the plaintiff is entitled to be hired, reinstated or promoted. In effect, Kennedy-Hawkins would punish the defendant for bad thoughts even when those bad thoughts made no actual difference to the plaintiff.

Damages. On the other hand, there is one area in which a compromise not only is possible but would actually be justified on its merits. While Title VII currently provides victims of discrimination injunctive relief and back pay, it does not provide compensatory damages. Sometimes back pay would be the full measure of compensatory damages anyway. However, where the victim suffers consequential damages in addition to the loss of pay, or where the victim is harassed on the job on the basis of his or her race, sex or religion but is not discharged (with the result that there is no loss of pay), back pay and attorney fees will not be enough to make the plaintiff whole. Justice demands that every violation of a person's rights be fully compensated. While the Civil Rights Act of 1964 provided some measure of compensation to discrimination victims, part of the job was left

unfinished. Now is the time to finish the job and to fill the gap in Title VII's remedial scheme.

The Administration has already embraced part-way the idea of providing damages by proposing that 42 U.S.C. Section 1981, which already provides damages for racial discrimination in the making or enforcing of contracts, be amended to cover on-the-job racial harassment. Having done so, it ought to do the same for sexual, religious and other kinds of harassment, and for all other forms of discrimination besides harassment. The same principle applies in every case -- namely, that justice requires those whose rights are violated to be compensated fully by those responsible. (The view that racial harassment is deserving of a damages remedy but sexual harassment is not is philosophically untenable. Likewise, if the Administration doesn't agree to cover other categories as well (religion, national origin, color), it will find itself in the same dilemma all over again.) Since Title VII was designed to serve as the principal remedial scheme for dealing with discrimination, already covers harassment, and already covers discrimination on the bases of sex, religion, national origin, or color as well as race, Title VII would seem to be the more logical place by far (as opposed to Section 1981) to insert a compensatory damages remedy. Moreover, Title VII comes pre-equipped with procedural and jurisdictional safeguards that Section 1981 presently lacks. If Section 1981 is amended, an effort should be made to rationalize and integrate Section 1981 with the rest of the federal statutory scheme for protection of civil rights and with Title VII in particular. One way to do this would be to require prior exhaustion of remedies under Title VII and compliance with EEOC conciliation procedures as a precondition to any Section 1981 suit (not just those involving harassment) to which Title VII also applies. This would preserve Title VII's status as the primary federal statute for dealing with discrimination, along with its focus on fostering conciliation through the mediation of the EEOC, and it would incidentally bring Section 1981 under the same procedural and jurisdictional safeguards that are already provided under Title VII.

Guarding Against Any Tendency to Foster Too Much Litigation.

On the other hand, measures should be taken to guard against the tendency of the civil rights laws to foster too much litigation. (Some amount of litigation is necessary and desirable. What is to be avoided is not litigation per se but rather the filing of too many lawsuits with insufficient merit.) If possible, the current asymmetry in the awardability of attorney fees should be eliminated by adopting a pure English Rule. Under the "English Rule," the loser pays the winner's attorney fees regardless of who wins. However, under the Supreme Court's interpretation of Title VII's fee-shifting provision, a losing defendant must always pay the plaintiff's attorney fees, but a plaintiff who loses will only be made to reimburse the defendant's costs of defending the suit where the plaintiff's position is found to

have been unreasonable, frivolous or without merit -- something courts rarely find. This one-way fee-shifting confronts prospective plaintiffs and their attorneys with a "heads I win, tails you lose" situation that is grossly unfair to defendants and a powerful engine of litigation. Adoption of the "English Rule" would cause plaintiffs whose cases lack merit to think twice before bringing suit. Alternatively, restoration of a pure "American Rule," under which each party must bear its own costs, would also level the playing field and thereby check the enormous impetus to litigation that the current asymmetry causes (although this approach would mean that victims of discrimination would not be made whole since they would have to incur attorney fees without reimbursement in vindicating their rights). Either approach would be better than the current asymmetrical situation, which transforms Title VII from a vehicle for compensation of victims into a vehicle for enrichment of lawyers.

Other Problems. Although this surely was not something that the sponsors of Kennedy-Hawkins would have intended it to do, section 4 of the bill would have the practical effect of requiring employers to ask all job applicants to disclose their religious affiliations. Since employers will be far more vulnerable than before to disparate impact suits of all types, including suits alleging that their selection procedures admit or promote too few members of particular religious denominations, they will need to keep records of employees' and applicants' religious affiliations so that they can defend themselves against such suits (or in order to make sure that they hire enough people from each religious denomination represented in their applicant pool). Do we really want to have employers doing this? Would this move us closer to the kind of society we want to live in?

As it presently stands, Kennedy-Hawkins would also purport to make each of its major provisions apply retroactively to the respective dates of the various Supreme Court decisions they seek to overturn. This would amount to enacting something akin to ex post facto legislation. While Congress may arguably have the authority to alter the rules to be applied in cases that are still being litigated at the time Congress acts, section 15 of this bill would attempt to reopen cases that had already proceeded to final judgment -- something that has always been recognized as beyond the power of Congress to do. Here again Kennedy-Hawkins in its current form is inconsistent with due process of law; before the bill could be fit for enactment, section 15 would have to be amended to make all of the bill's provisions apply prospectively only.

A Forward-Looking View of Civil Rights. These examples are indicative of how extensive the changes are that would have to be made in order to transform any of the currently pending bills into something worthy of the American people. However, the most important feature of these bill's is their exclusive focus on

pursuing the goals of civil rights by modifying laws that were passed a quarter of a century ago. By looking backward instead of forward, these bills overlook the single most important fact of civil rights today, which is the irrelevance of civil rights law to the most important problems facing America's neediest and most deserving individuals.

Kennedy-Hawkins would principally benefit middle- and upper-class minority individuals who have the education and skills to benefit from de facto quota hiring. Low-income minority workers tend to work in the kinds of jobs in which they are already represented proportionally (if not overrepresented). They would not be particularly affected by the bill. Where employers will have to make changes in order to minimize their exposure to litigation is in the middle- and upper-level job categories in which minorities tend to be "underrepresented." The only minority workers who can occupy these jobs and thereby benefit from the Kennedy-Hawkins bill's tendency to increase the demand for minority employees are those with higher skill levels. Relatively underprivileged and unskilled minority workers would not be able to take advantage of any increased opportunities the bill might create, and the bill would do nothing to help those who presently lack the necessary skills to acquire them. Sadly, the particular minority individuals who would benefit from a change in industry hiring patterns are not society's neediest and least fortunate but a group of individuals who are already better off than their lower-income counterparts.

While it is all well and good to increase the wages of black engineers and doctors, what will that do for people who were not well enough off in the first place to be able get a medical or engineering degree? If you are a poor, 22-year-old black woman with a ninth-grade education, three children and no husband, the civil rights laws are irrelevant to the problems that concern you most. This is why we have called for a new civil rights agenda with a broader, more forward-looking perspective. The focus of the new civil rights agenda should be on "empowering" the worst-off minority individuals by providing them more and better jobs (through tax cuts, enterprise zones, reductions in the minimum wage, and so forth), safer neighborhoods, better schools (to be achieved through a voucher system that would give parent's a choice in where to send their children to school), and so forth. This is where proponents and opponents of all currently pending bills should look if they want to actually make a difference in the lives of the people who most need their help.

SENATE

The U.S. Senate Judiciary Committee favorably reported a balanced budget/tax limitation amendment, S.J. Res. 183, (Simon, Thurmond, DeConcini, Hatch, Heflin) to the Senate floor on June 14, 1990. The vote was 11 to 3 with Senators Biden and Kohl in the positive column for the first time. (Ayes were: Biden, DeConcini, Heflin, Simon, Kohl, Thurmond, Hatch, Simpson, Humphrey, Grassley, and Specter. Nays were: Kennedy, Metzenbaum, Leahy.)

In 1982 the Senate approved a BB/TLA 69 to 31. In 1986, a BB/TLA similar to S.J. Res. 183 as reported, failed by one vote, 66 to 34. Since the 1986 vote, 25 new senators have been elected to that chamber.

Observers are optimistic about a chance for a vote in the Senate before the end of this session.

HOUSE

The bipartisan House BB/TLA, H.J. Res. 268, has the highest number of cosponsors ever at 248, or 42 short of the necessary two-thirds. Since the House Judiciary Committee has refused to hold hearings, a discharge petition was filed in late May. As of June 14, Discharge Petition No. 8 has 202 signers, or 16 short of the mandatory 218. Prime cosponsors, Representatives Stenholm, Craig, Carper and R. Smith (OR), believe the requisite number will be obtained in the next few days. If this happens and House discharge rules are followed, the earliest the measure could come to vote would be July 23, the fourth Monday in July.

In 1982, a majority of the House voted for a BB/TLA but fell 46 votes short of the necessary two-thirds. No BB/TLA vote was taken in the House in 1986.

STATES

From 1975 through 1987, 32 states approved limited balanced budget convention call resolutions, or two short of the 34 needed to assure congressional action. In 1988, under pressure from the right wing, two states voted to rescind their calls (AL and FL). However, the following year in the states 17 proposed rescissions were stopped and in 1990 ten were halted. Thus, 30 state BBA resolutions remain in place.

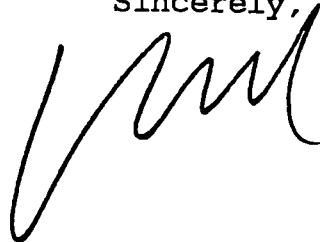

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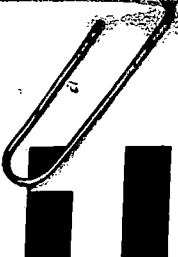

I received your nice note regarding the tie tac. I will have to say, this is one of my better works.

John, I want to be very philosophical and make mention of something that I think is very, very important. I have been asked to appear before the Senate Banking Committee either in late September or early October 1990, to discuss the effectiveness of bank examinations. Since we are a national bank I will be reporting primarily on examinations as they are conducted through the office of the Comptroller of the Currency.

First and foremost, their examinations are ludicrous. In my opinion, the Comptroller of the Currency is absolutely the worse I have seen in my 30 years as a banker, of which 20 years has been spent as an executive officer of various national banks. Now the point is simply this, I dearly love the President. I am devoted to him -- and, his mandate, is my mandate; and your mandate, is my mandate. I have always felt that I was a "rock solid" Republican. My late father was chairman of the Republican Party for years in McKeesport, Pennsylvania, and he always brought through winners in heavily Democratic areas. My testimony can be very, very damaging to the Comptroller's office. The problem with some of these examinations, is the lack of experience. The story that I have to tell is a "horror" story regarding bank examinations.

One of the reasons that I was asked to testify is due to the fact that we are considered to be one of the top operating banks in the United States -- as you can see by the enclosed. Last year, this institution made 24% on equity, and this year, it appears that we will be making almost 40% on equity. We have a tight ship, which is run extremely well. My philosophy in life has been never to hurt anyone, but I do think that some able aide from your office should sit down with me, in early September, and discuss my testimony before the Senate Banking Committee.

I do not want this letter to appear to be a dark, black problem, but if I give my testimony under oath, I must tell the truth.

The savings & loan industry has, as you know, a tremendous problem. This is going to filter over into the banking industry. I hope that through my testimony I can help prevent a savings & loan crisis in the banking industry. This country cannot stand that! Mark my words, before the savings & loan mess is cleared up, it is going to be \$600 billion -- believe me!

I would never, ever hurt this administration, but I am an American, and as a seasoned banker, it will be my duty to tell the truth. If I tell the truth, as I see it, it will fragment the Comptroller of the Currency.

In conclusion, I think you are doing a good job. The President needs you, and I know you are close to him. I am so very fond of the President and his family, and I just felt that I owed this letter to you, the President, and the administration.

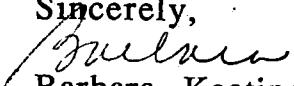

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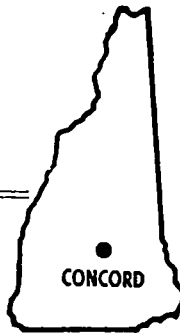

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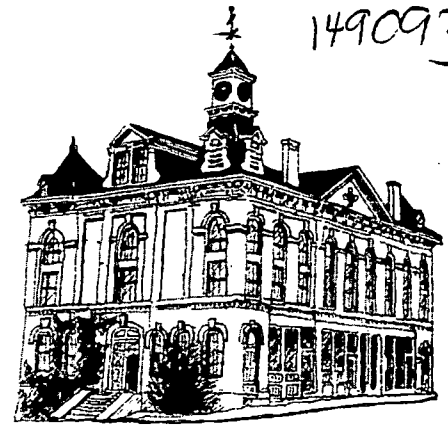

I am writing to request your assistance concerning the subject legal case that Milford is a party to. Background information on the case is as follows. In December 1989, the Town of Milford, in the form of our Director of Public Works, Robert E. Courage, and myself, Town Administrator were called to give deposition on the above referenced case currently proceeding in United States District Court in the District of Massachusetts. The case concerns the Charles George Landfill in Massachusetts which is presently on the U. S. EPA Superfund list. Involvement in this court case for the Town of Milford stems from the fact that during July 1980 - February 1983, Charles George Trucking Company took our solid waste from our transfer station in Milford, N.H. and deposited it in the Charles George Landfill in Tyngsboro, Massachusetts. Inactive since 1983, this site of 70 acres, begun in 1955 as a municipal dump, was acquired by Mr. George in 1977. Major landfill development occurred following this acquisition, and in the early 1970s, the Massachusetts Department of Environmental Quality Engineering issued a permit allowing disposal of hazardous waste in addition to refuse. Volatile organic waste, both in drums and in bulk form were disposed in the landfill between 1973 and 1975. In 1979, the Town of Tyngsboro revoked assignment of property, formerly requested by the owner for landfill expansion and ordered the landfill closed. However, landfill operations continued until 1982. At approximately that same time, the DEQE ordered two supply wells for the Cannongate Condominiums located approximately 100 feet to the Southwest of the landfill, closed due to volatile organic contamination.

In 1983 EPA allocated the sum of \$750,000. for a temporary water supply to the Cannongate Condominium complex, and for corrective actions at the landfill site. Again, Milford had its solid waste trucked there from July 1980 through February 1983. We had heard nothing concerning the Charles George Landfill, other than newspaper reports, until late fall of 1989 when we received the subpoena for deposition. Since that time, the Town has been heavily involved with a Boston law firm defending its actions and protecting it from further liability or settlement costs relating to this case and third party laws suits arising from the initial suit.

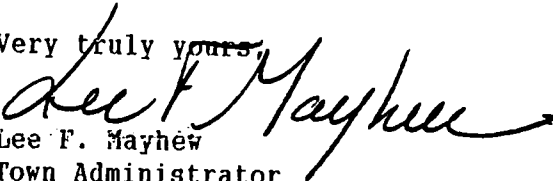
It is for this specific purpose that I write to request the assistance of your office in obtaining certain items of information from the government's lead counsel in this case. It is my hope that with your assistance, we will not have to require our legal counsel to do extensive discovery and reproduction of the EPA file in order to glean the documents necessary to provide ourselves with a proper defense. With this in mind, I respectfully request, of your office to obtain from the government's lead counsel the following documents:

- 1. A comprehensive list of all exhibits, subpoena, or deposition material gathered by EPA in its attempts to prosecute this case.
- 2. Any and all isolated lists identifying exhibits, materials, or deposition data generally involved or specifically detailing items, allegations, or activities pertaining to the Town of Milford.

It is our understanding for correspondence received both in this office and in the office of our counsel that Paula Potoczak, Attorney, U. S. Department of Justice, Environmental Enforcement Section, P. O. Box 7611, Ben Franklin Station, Washington, D. C., 20044; telephone, 202-633-1066 is the lead counsel in this matter. I realize that this is an unusual request to your particular office, but with austerity imposed on this community at the 1990 Town Meeting, and with other tax measures facing our voters by way of County, School; and other demands for services, we are attempting to be as thrifty and frugal as possible, yet as thorough as possible. Any assistance that you may be able to render in this matter will greatly appreciated.

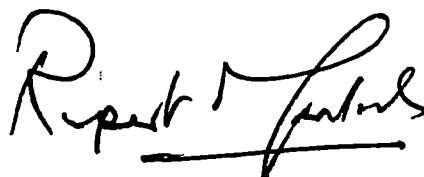

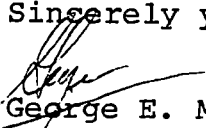

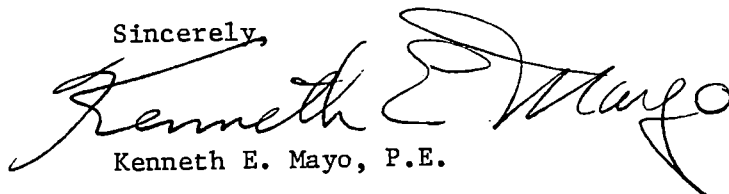
