Sub.: Iraq-Kuwait

Dear Governor Sununu,

I hope you were able to read my letter of August 6, 1990 delivered to you at the White House by Peter Tannous. As you recall, I had been hospitalized with back surgery and was unable to attend the meeting with the President but did outline in my letter some ideas regarding some possible solutions to the problem.

As you know, I and many of us in the Arab-American community who have served in the U.S. Government as well as being active in various Arab-American organizations fully support the actions taken by President Bush. We pray that the economic boycott and military deterrence provide the necessary action to convince President Saddam Hussein that the world will not tolerate his actions and that further aggression will lead to serious adverse consequences for him and unfortunately for the people of Iraq.

At the same time as these important programs are being planned and implemented I believe that those in the Arab-American community who have worked in this region and U.S. businesses who have worked with Iraq should get involved. After speaking with both Peter Tannous and David Sadd about these ideas and discussing them with members of the U.S.-Iraq Business Forum I believe that a small group of Arab-American leaders together with Chief Executive Officers of major U.S. corporations familiar with Iraq such as Occidental Petroleum, Boeing, General Motors, First City Bank of Texas, and others could put together a plan to resolve the issue once the economic sanctions and military actions have convinced Saddam Hussein that his pursuits are fruitless.

I believe that we can do this without interfering in any way with the actions of the White House and certainly without communicating with anyone the White House would prefer that we avoid. These plans would be kept confidential within our group and cleared by you before being discussed with anyone else. Any modifications or changes would be most welcome. This is a role that I think is essential and one that can be very helpful in providing for a reconstruction in Iraq that will not lead to a victory for Sadam Hussein but will resolve the issues peacefully and to the benefit of the entire international community.

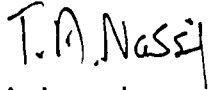
Your endorsement is crucial. I would be happy to provide more detail if in fact you believe it is worthwhile.

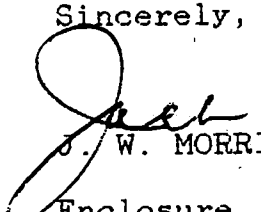

GOLDEN ANNIVERSARY CAMPAIGN

WASHINGTON, D.C. -- Committees to plan the July 4, 1991, Golden Anniversary celebration and formal dedication of Mount Rushmore and to finance the face-lifting of the "Shrine of Democracy" in the Black Hills of South Dakota were announced here today.

Bob Hope will be honorary chair of the celebration and star entertainer. Tom Brokaw, NBC News anchor and Mary Hart, Entertainment Tonight co-host, both former South Dakotans, will co-host and emcee the extravaganza.

Radio City Music Hall Productions of New York City will produce the celebration program for the live audience and for national television.

President George Bush has been invited to give the dedication address. Bush recently signed a Mount Rushmore Commemorative Coin Act passed by Congress which will help raise funds for the Rushmore renovation.

A \$40-million campaign for funds to repair the faces of Presidents Washington, Jefferson, Lincoln and Theodore Roosevelt and expand visitor facilities at Mount Rushmore is under way.

The four living former Presidents -- Nixon, Ford, Carter and Reagan -- have been named special honorees for the July 4, 1991, event and will be invited to attend and participate in the program.

The national fund campaign chair is Harry Conger, chairman, president, and CEO of Homestake Mining company, headquartered in San Francisco but with its chief mining operations in the South Dakota Black Hills.

A national honorary campaign committee of distinguished former South Dakotans is chaired by Al Neuharth, founder of USA TODAY and chairman of the Gannett Foundation.

Secretary of the Interior Manuel Lujan and key executives of the National Park Service are working closely with the campaign committees and will supervise the renovation program.

Serving with Conger as officers of the campaign committee are:

Co-Vice Chairs -- Paul Christen, Co-owner of the Minnesota Twins and Chairman, First Western Banks; Larry Owen, CEO, Black Hills Corporation; and former Gov. William Janklow. Treasurer -- Clifford Graese, former national vice chairman of Peat, Marwick and Mitchell. Secretary -- Ray Aldrich, executive vice president of the Mount Rushmore Society.

Other national campaign committee members will be named.

Joining Neuharth on the honorary national committee as co-chair is Meredith Brokaw, New York City author and toy boutique operator. National honorary vice chairs, all former South Dakotans, include:

Sparky Anderson, manager, Detroit Tigers; Tom Brokaw; Joe Foss, World War II Marine ace and former South Dakota governor; Mary Hart; Cheryl Ladd, Hollywood personality and actress; George McGovern, former U.S. Senator and 1972 Democratic presidential nominee; Billy Mills, 1964 Olympic Gold medalist; Pat O'Brien, CBS sportscaster; Elizabeth Robbie, whose family owns the Miami Dolphins.

Other former South Dakotans will be named to the national honorary group.

The firm of Brakeley, John Price Jones Inc. of Newport Beach, Calif., has been retained as fund-raising consultants for the \$40-million campaign.

Dear John:

The close of CSFA's fiscal year on June 30 provides another appropriate point in time to report to you on the progress of this unique organization called Citizens' Scholarship Foundation of America.

Dollars for Scholars Passes 500. In June we celebrated moving past the milestone of 500 Dollars for Scholars chapters affiliated with CSFA throughout the United States. Officially the 500th chapter was Saddleback High School Scholarship Foundation in Santa Ana, California. In the very early days of his pioneering work in Fall River, Massachusetts, CSFA Founder Dr. Irving Fradkin did not immediately envision 500 chapters, but together he and all of us can now work toward 1000 chapters, then 2000 chapters, and then...

Program Growth. The end of a fiscal year is a good marking point for all programmatic growth. We are happy to report that FY 1990 witnessed significant increases in all program areas. The roster of sponsored student aid programs managed by CSFA reached 340 (324 under our Scholarship Management Services unit and 16 under our Education Grants/Innovative Services unit). The number of Dollars for Scholars chapters officially climbed to 505 in 33 states. Collegiate Partners numbered 259. Total scholarship funding distributed last year to students was approximately \$19.8 million. The remarkable growth in CSFA programs and services is best seen by looking at comparative figures for the past five years.

Tylenol: A Major New Scholarship Program. CSFA has recently completed arrangements with the McNeil Consumer Products Co. to initiate the \$500,000 Tylenol Scholarship Fund. The scholarship program will be a part of a massive marketing campaign to be launched in September. CSFA is preparing to receive more applications for this program than any previous scholarship competition. Five hundred scholarships will be awarded.

North Dakota: An Important New Approach. Through the leadership of CSFA Vice President Marlys Johnson, Program Development Officer Curt Trygstad, and a number of forward thinking North Dakota government, business, and community leaders, a significant new venture for expanding the Dollars for Scholars program throughout the Peace Garden state is about to begin. Fred Scheel (Scheels Hardware and Sports Shops) has agreed to provide up to \$100,000 to challenge North Dakota communities to create and begin to endow Dollars for Scholars chapters. Bob Alin, recently retired from Scheels Hardware, has volunteered to give literally thousands of hours over the next three years to help local communities create and develop Dollars for Scholars chapters in the state. And the Scheels Company is paying his expenses. CSFA will, of course, oversee, promote, and publicize the program, and provide our usual wide variety of support services. We are confident that the caring people of North Dakota will respond quickly and positively to this challenge to help their local students.

California. More great news! The ARCO Foundation recently announced a grant of \$35,000 to CSFA and the Weingart Foundation a grant of \$100,000 to develop the Dollars for Scholars program in California. Coupled with the earlier \$100,000 grant from the Irvine Foundation, the total raised for the California program has reached \$235,000. The Weingart grant challenges CSFA to complete our goal of raising \$450,000 for the program by June of 1991. Our hope is to be able to open the California office as soon as feasible this fall.

Capital Campaign Feasibility Study. As authorized by the CSFA Governing Board, the Development Committee recently took the next important step toward a potential capital campaign for CSFA. After interviewing four well-known campaign consulting firms, and pending final negotiations, the Committee selected Campbell and Company, a national firm headquartered in Chicago, to conduct the feasibility study. The study to be carried out this fall will include interviews and focus group meetings with Board members, friends, and potential supporters of CSFA.

While our growth as an organization has been significant in recent years, we need to keep focusing not on what we have done but more importantly on what we can do once we have the resources to do so. This enlarged vision is the whole point of preparing for a capital campaign. Think of the thousands of communities yet to be reached in the Dollars for Scholars program! Think of the hundreds of companies that can still be a resource for improving educational achievement! Think of all the individuals who can help students through the establishment of endowed scholarship programs! Our preparation for the capital campaign reminds us that we are really just beginning!

As always, thanks for your interest, support, and your own visions for meeting the educational needs of our country.

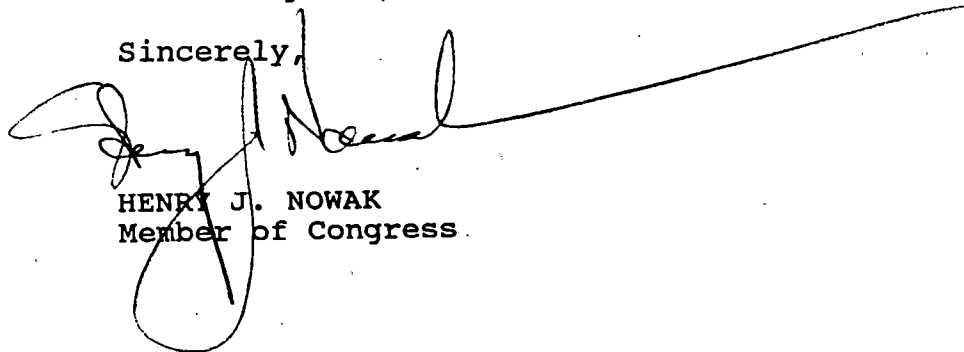
Enclosed is an editorial from the Buffalo News, which summarizes the case for retaining the state and local income tax deduction in the Federal tax code.

The battle over fairness to residents of states with high taxes, compared to residents of states with no income taxes or minimum rates, was fought in formulating the 1986 tax reform measure, and the wiser House position prevailed. The merits of this case have not changed since then, and the issue should not be revisited in our search for revenue sources.

There is a lengthy list of options for revenues, none of them attractive to Congress or the public. However, the state and local tax deduction serves a useful economic purpose in most of the states, to national advantage. I strongly urge that budget negotiators cross this proposal off the list.

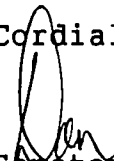

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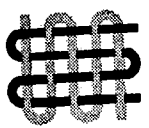

Sorry I missed you at the Lawrence Eagle affair, Helen was under the weather and we couldn't make it. I know both you and Nancy are in good health as I see Pat Corbin and Ed Duvall quite often.

Since I missed speaking to you face to face, I had to write. I know you are very busy, but I hope you will take the time to look into the following matter, which is of great importance to the Northeast (specifically the lower New England States), and ultimately effect the Country and the President. John I am referring to the Economic climate. It is near disaster...

I know you are aware of the Economic slowdown in the Northeast as I spoke with Pat Corbin and he said he mentioned it to Nancy. But I do not think you know how severe the problem really is.

Business and personal bankruptcies are being filed at an uncontrollable rate. Business and Home foreclosures fill eight to ten pages of both the Boston Globe and Union Leader each week. The people, (the men and women we all count on to keep our businesses and this country moving) have lost their confidence. They do not know if they will have a Job at the end of each work day, or be able to keep their business open. They are afraid to spend any of their money (if they have any) for fear they will lose their car, house or whatever they own. Their worries stem from a number of facts, (1) some are over extended, Both members of the family were working when they went in debt now one or both are out of work. (2) with the cut in defense budgets a number of workers at high paying defense manufacturing jobs have been laid off and others are being told there will be more lay offs. (3) The computer industry is at a standstill, Wang and Digital are laying employee's off by the hundreds. (4) My business (Automobiles) is off 35% to 40% and I assume the formula I was told in the recession years still holds true that every 3 out every 5 jobs relates to the Automobile Business?? (5) The housing industry is at a complete standstill. Between the loss of jobs and the increase in taxes, there are houses for sale by the droves, and the buyers are few and far between. All the contractors have laid off most of their employee's, and some have just given up and are trying to sell of their equipment. And the biggest problem (6) THE FEDERAL RESERVE AND OR THE BANKS????

It is my understanding after talking with some bankers and business men that have had dealings with the banks that the Federal Reserve is telling the banks they have to have cash reserves equal to one half of their realstate outstanding loans regardless of the loan risk. In order to get these cash reserves the banks are calling in the demand notes of the good risk loans where they have the most equity, the

businesses having no place to go to get a replacement loan are either closing or letting the banks foreclose. The banker I spoke with says the Federal Reserve will absolutely not listen to what the bankers have to say on the matter.

There are solutions, but something must be done now or we will be in a full fledged recession, which will take years to dig ourselves out of. 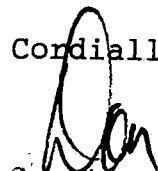

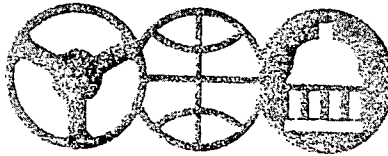
