Dear Governor Sununu:

There is widespread concern about reports that a securities transaction excise tax (STET) is a revenue option being considered for the budget summit agreement. The interests of the American economy and our principal constituents -- millions of individual and institutional shareholders as well as our member firms and over 1,700 listed companies -- compel the New York Stock Exchange to urge you in the strongest terms to reject this option.

Financial markets compete intensely with each other. Investment decisions are extremely sensitive to transaction costs, and they are measured in cents or fractions of a cent. In a global market with nearly unlimited mobility of capital, even a small increase in the cost of a transaction will drive investment managers to another product or another market. By raising costs significantly, STET would lower domestic market volume and quality, leaving a thinner American market with inferior pricing for public customers.

The tax rate most frequently mentioned in connection with STET is a deceptively small 0.5% of the value of the transaction. But with the average price of a share on the NYSE at about \$35, this would add an average tax of 17.5 cents to today's typical pension or mutual fund costs of about 4-5 cents per share, quadrupling costs of a trade.

The Eurobond experience of the 1960s is a prime example of how the U.S., through ill-advised tax policy, lost irreversibly an important segment of our international capital base. Understandably, most countries do not have or are repealing securities transaction taxes.

To compete effectively, U.S. business must be able to raise capital at costs reasonably in line with costs in other countries. A transfer tax would raise those costs and, in turn, the final cost of the products, making them less competitive.

We appreciate the difficulty and the awesome responsibility you face in addressing the federal budget deficit. It is in a spirit of support and cooperation that we must advise you that STET will add to the problem, not contribute to the solution.

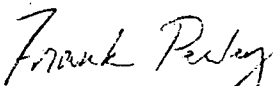

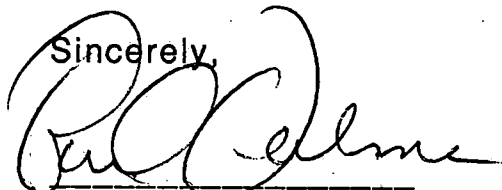

On behalf of the National Association of Home Builders and its over 157,000 member firms, I am writing to urge you to oppose the imposition of any further restriction on the mortgage interest deduction or the deductibility of state and local property taxes.

While we are well aware of the difficult and important task you face, we urge you to be mindful of the potential ramifications of your actions. The 1986 Tax Reform Act and the thrift industry crisis have had a dramatic impact on the home building and construction industry. Housing production is at an eight year low and home values are beginning to decline. Once considered the best hedge against inflation, the value of homeownership is now being questioned. The timing of this attitudinal shift, when homeownership rates are already declining, could not be worse. The United States cannot afford, either economically or socially, to foster this dangerous trend.

A variety of proposals to cap or limit itemized deductions, which would also result in the further restriction of the mortgage interest deduction have surfaced. Regardless of the form these proposals take, and the ends they are purported to achieve, the result will be devastating to millions of current and potential homebuyers and an industry which has always been one of the pillars of America's economic foundation.

Please be aware of the adverse social and economic consequences of these proposals and oppose their inclusion in any deficit reduction package you agree upon.

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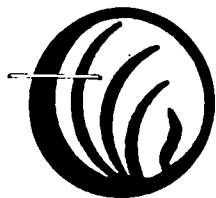

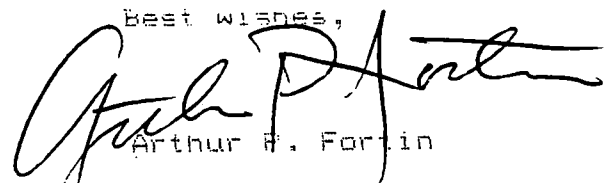

Re: Therapeutic Substitution for Medicaid Recipients

Dear Governor Sununu:

As President of the National Medical Association ("NMA"), I wish to express NMA's strong opposition to the Office of Management and Budget ("OMB") proposal to include therapeutic substitution in the deficit reduction plan.

The NMA, founded in 1895, currently represents over sixteen thousand (16,000) physicians residing in all fifty (50) of the United States, as well as Puerto Rico and the Virgin Islands. Most of our members are minority, and of those, most are African American. We are dedicated to improving the health care status of all Americans, especially the poor and minority populations in this country. The NMA actively and aggressively addresses health issues which impact the delivery and access to quality health care services.

It is our understanding that on June 20, 1990, OMB proposed therapeutic substitution to the budget summit conference as a means to reduce Medicaid expenditures. The key elements of OMB's therapeutic substitution plan include classifying drugs and selecting the least expensive drug in each class as the *preferred drug*. Pharmacists would be required to substitute the *preferred drug* in all Medicaid prescriptions without the knowledge of, or consent of the patient's physician.

NMA recognizes the inherent and very real danger in utilizing cost alone to substitute a medication prescribed by a physician, who has personally examined the patient and written the prescription based upon the individual patient's entire medical history and health milieu. Drug allergies, harmful side effects, lesser effectiveness in differing populations, or even death may result from slight variations in medication. Further, changing a prescription without the knowledge of, or consent of a physician is not legal in most states.

Dispensing medication to Medicaid recipients based solely on price creates another objectionable distinction in medical services provided to the poor, many of whom are African-Americans or other minorities. The OMB proposal clearly indicates that the elderly, blind, disabled and indigent are only worthy of the cheapest medication, and not the prescription that best meets their medical needs. This treatment of Medicaid recipients is discriminatory and assigns a lesser value to their lives.

Although we recognize the need to reduce the federal deficit, we urge you to eliminate the therapeutic substitution provisions under consideration in the budget deficit reduction negotiations that will severely lower the quality of health care to our nation's needy population.

Now that the "T" word has been spoken, there has been much speculation on the possible tradeoffs that might be worked out in the budget negotiations which would allow both parties to claim victory. One of the hottest proposals is for a reduction in the capital gains rate to be coupled with an elimination of the "bubble." Certain members have hinted that such a proposal would be "fair." I would like to throw some cold water on the idea that such a "trade" would be fair.

The five-year deficit reduction target is still a point of contention among the summit participants, but it appears that the goal is to produce a package which reduces the deficit by \$450 to \$600 billion. I'll assume that the ultimate package falls somewhere in between -- say \$500 billion. There are also different opinions about what the mix of revenue increases and spending cuts should be. The simplest agreement would be for the package to be split equally. This means that the five-year revenue increase needed will be \$250 billion.

In reviewing the "fairness" of the revenue proposals, one must look at all of the possible revenue-raising components which may be included in it. According to the Joint Committee on Taxation, a reduction in the capital gains rate will lose \$12 billion over five years while elimination of the bubble will raise \$44 billion over those same five years. Therefore, of the \$250 billion in new revenue needed, the capital gains/bubble tradeoff will net only \$32 billion. Other revenue increases will be needed to raise the additional \$218 billion.

The proposals with the greatest support appear to be increases in alcohol, tobacco and gasoline taxes and the imposition of a new excise tax on energy. It is inconceivable how a revenue package that includes these proposals could be considered fair. These taxes are inherently regressive because lower- and middle-income families pay a higher percent of their income on them. These proposals would make the tax system even less progressive than it already is.

From 1977 to 1990, despite the rhetoric about "across the board" tax cuts, only the richest 10 percent of the population experienced a reduction in their total tax liabilities. The remaining 90 percent had their total

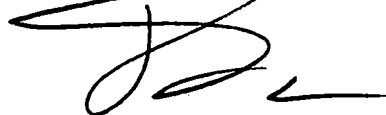

tax liabilities increase. Given the degree in which the tax burden was shifted from the wealthy to the middle-class and poor during this period, it is unconscionable for us to even consider a revenue package that will exacerbate this trend.

Furthermore, there seems a belief that "fair" means that an increase in the tax burden of the wealthy, by eliminating the bubble, must be offset with a corresponding reduction through a reduced capital gains tax rate. However, the net effect of these two proposals would force additional measures to be included in the package. These additional measures will dramatically increase the tax burden borne by low- and middle-income families. Where is their tradeoff?

Clearly, what Congress should do is to eliminate the bubble without a corresponding capital gains tax reduction. This would raise revenue in a "fair" manner by imposing the burden on those who can afford to pay it -- those who received the benefits of tax cuts over the past decade.

On behalf of the National Council on Disability, I would like to thank you for your leadership on the Americans with Disabilities Act (ADA). As the enactment becomes imminent, a number of business organizations and concerned individuals have approached us in a state of alarm wondering how they will be able to comply with the law. The following are among questions which have been posed:

1. Where will we be able to go for clarification of what the legislation requires as we attempt to implement it in our own particular setting?
2. How will we be able to find the expertise and understand available resources to assist in developing reasonable accommodations and accessibility?
3. How can we avoid endless lawsuits?
4. Where can we go to learn about the application of technology to assist in accommodating persons with disabilities?
5. How can we establish communication with the disability community to engage in an ongoing dialogue as we begin the long and complex task of implementing this law?

Members of the disability community have approached us with a number of concerns as well. These include:

6. How will Americans with disabilities and their families find out about the Americans with Disabilities Act and be able to determine how the law affects them?
7. How can we monitor the development and timeliness of regulations to implement the law? (Some Section 504 regulations are 10 years late in being issued.)

8. How can we communicate effectively with the business community?

After considerable reflection on these questions, the Council believes the establishment of a Commission on the Americans with Disabilities Act is the appropriate response. Further, the Council believes that the President can provide the critical leadership to establish such a Commission to ensure that the Americans with Disabilities Act moves from a mandate on paper to a daily reality in the lives of Americans with disabilities. An announcement of the Commission at the signing ceremony for the Americans with Disabilities Act would be most fitting.

We submit the attached proposal for your consideration, and look forward to our continued work with you on behalf of our nation's citizens with disabilities.

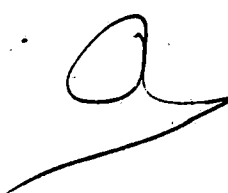

Dear Mr. Sununu:

The targeted jobs tax credit ("TJTC") since its enactment in 1978 has been one of the most successful tax incentive programs ever adopted by Congress. By providing private employers with a credit for hiring disadvantaged workers, the TJTC has helped to increase the workforce each year by an average of half a million Americans, many of them leaving the welfare rolls in the process.

In spite of this record of success, however, Congress has elected to make the TJTC subject to periodic renewal. The most recent TJTC extension was only for nine months -- absent further extension, this vital program will expire after September 30, 1990.

I am writing to express my concern about recent reports that the budget summit negotiators may agree to exclude any provisions which in and of themselves are deemed to lose revenue. Because the Joint Committee on Taxation measures the cost of TJTC only with respect to the employer's tax benefit, and does not take into account any increase in revenues resulting from the fact that TJTC creates jobs, TJTC is classified as a revenue loser. This has not precluded extension of the TJTC in the past, however, because under accepted budgetary practices, it has only been necessary for Congress to meet its revenue targets on a net basis.

In this new capacity I have become a Director of the Southeast REA Borrowers Association (SEBA), which is holding its annual meeting at the Ritz-Carlton in Pentagon City on August 2-3, 1990. I would like to endorse personally the SEBA invitation dated June 1 for you to address our Annual Meeting on Thursday, August 2.

Let me also take this opportunity to thank you and the Bush administration in general for the recent appointment of Gary Byrne as the Administrator of REA. I had the opportunity to meet him in Washington about a month ago and the REA loan to our Company, which was pending before the REA from August of 1987, was disbursed just two days ago in some substantial part due to his willingness to resolve issues and get things done.

It's also a pleasure to thank you and the Bush administration for the excellent cooperation we received from the State and Commerce Departments in connection with our recent acquisition of 80% of the Guyana Telephone Company. The privatization of telephone companies in the Caribbean Basin is a giant step forward in improving the infrastructure of many countries in this region. We are very pleased to be an agent for extending the concept of investor-owned utilities and market driven capital attraction in the Caribbean.

On the other hand, I feel compelled to tell you that the Federal Emergency Management Agency (FEMA) is an agent of the U.S. Government that is not helping investor-owned utilities and private enterprise. We discovered to our utter dismay in the wake of Hurricane Hugo here in the Virgin Islands that FEMA would not even permit us to bring in critically needed parts on their airplanes, while at the same time FEMA provided pure grants of about \$40 million to help our municipally-owned electric utility.



The message that this FEMA policy conveys is precisely the opposite of privatization: a privately owned business will have to pay its way, but government-owned utility businesses will get free new facilities from Uncle Sam.

Lastly, I would like to congratulate you on the progress at Seabrook. It is hard to believe that nuclear power is finally being generated in New Hampshire and that the New York Times is editorializing for the same result at Shoreham. You deserve great credit for your political courage in standing up to the Seabrook critics and the critics of nuclear power generally, these many years.

Dear Sir,

We are a new, small construction and engineering firm based in Gloucester, Massachusetts, who under a Department of Transportation contract between the FAA and Raytheon Service Company, provided subcontractual services for the installation of instrumentation landing systems at the Sanford Municipal Airport, Sanford, Maine.

The purpose of this letter is for clarification of a situation that has resulted in a dispute over services we provided beyond our contractual obligation to Raytheon. Specifically, throughout our work at Sanford Municipal Airport we were told by Mr. William Kossowan, the Raytheon Contracting Administrator in Burlington, MA, that this was an "exceptional project", that it was a "White House priority", and that you were personally monitoring our daily progress. This incited a good deal of enthusiasm among our staff and crew, which in the end resulted in a job well done and in short order.

Unfortunately, however, mother nature and inaccurate government provided plans necessitated additional material and manpower beyond our contract. Record breaking cold temperatures for Southern Maine brought our progress to a crawl last winter, and we would have delayed construction until the ground thawed out in the Spring, but Mr. Kossowan again stressed that the "White House" wanted the job completed on time, and we would be fired if we didn't continue working.

assured us that we would be compensated for our extra efforts even if it meant constructing the "largest heated shelter in the world" over the entire airport, just as long as we got the job done for The President. We provided him with a quote for extra costs on a per day basis, and now he is refusing to honor the ten additional days billed to Raytheon last February.

He lead us to believe that this was an exceptional situation, and in exchange for waiving our contractual rights he would make certain that our bill, which incidentally only amounts to \$57,000.00, would be paid.

This firm is only 18 months old with a small to negative working capital budget, and cannot afford to spend vast sums for litigation as will be the case if we don't try and resolve this problem by obtaining all the facts ourselves.

My partner and myself are the founders and owners of this firm and perhaps lack contract sophistication, but we work physically side by side with our laborers in the field, and until we have growth enough to justify a contract specialist, we will have to rely on taking people at their word. This shortfall in our dealings with Mr. Kossowan has placed our bond for this job in jeopardy and our suppliers upset and anxious about their accounts.

If you could find a moment to respond to these claims by Mr. Kossowan of your involvement with this project it would be very much appreciated by one Republican contractor in Gloucester who needs information on this matter. We look forward to your reply.

I am enclosing a copy of a letter on the Civil Rights Act of 1990 which was recently sent to members of the House and Senate by Bob Daniell, the Chairman of United Technologies. This issue is one that concerns us deeply and I want to share our views with you.

United Technologies Corporation is firmly committed to equal rights and opportunities. We are morally committed to this goal, but in addition, we believe it to be an economic necessity. Real opportunity for women and minorities will come out of continued economic growth and successful competition in world markets.

We are convinced, however, that the proposed Kennedy Hawkins Bill (S. 2104/H.R.4000), will prevent us and others from focusing our affirmative action resources where they will do the most good - on education, training and the creation of new jobs, rather than on litigation. This bill will radically change employment law by abandoning conciliation in favor of confrontation.

The remedies provisions of the Kennedy-Hawkins bill amount to an extension of tort remedies to employment situations. In this respect, the bill is not civil rights legislation. Neither society nor business will benefit from such an anti-competitive, adversarial and costly approach.

With passage of the 1964 Civil Rights Act, the Congress and administration wisely chose to avoid lengthy trials and expensive damages in favor of EEOC resolution and "make whole" relief such as back pay, injunctions, and other equitable remedies. I urge you to hold the line on this point. Surely we can find ways to achieve the laudable objectives of equal opportunity without undermining the business community with a flood of lawsuits that are counter-productive to good employee relations.

If there is some way we can help you on this issue, please call on me. Once again, I urge you to oppose the Kennedy-Hawkins penalty provisions.

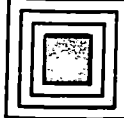

A solution to one security and economic problem for President Gorbachev, West German Chancellor Helmut Kohl, and the US would be to have the Soviet Union establish a GI Bill of Rights, patterned after ours following WWII, to take troops out of uniform and then educate them as civilian veterans on student visas on German soil (until adequate housing can be constructed in the USSR), to educate them about multi-party democracy, free market economics, private enterprise, all the basic freedoms, and professions and trades as well.

My letter is not about your trip to Russia. In fact, my wife and I shall be going there ourselves in two months to look at nature preserves, birds, plants, and marmots. Our trip will be neither so fascinating and challenging as yours, I am sure. We wish you well.

It is your trip which arouses me from a lethargy of months, however. I have served three terms on Commerce in the House and have decided against running again. I'm 65, long retired, and don't plan to relocate to Washington, where I lived twelve years before 1965. What does interest me during this autumnal season, though, is an appointive opportunity to survey language teaching in the intelligence sector. I have the credentials (Harvard Ph.D. in Slavic, 1953), the experience (employee of the National Security Agency; lifetime college language teacher at Georgetown, GWU, New England College). One other fact: I'm widely traveled and conversant with languages (and cultures) in the broadest sense (Far Eastern, Middle Eastern, European).

I'm not interested in salary. But I don't want anything without authority, parking, research capability, and compensated expenses. And not more than two or three times a year. My final offer. I'd like to serve. If I cannot bribe you --my second \$20 assured your third term and I was the last to wish you well on State House turf-- is there anyone whose personal recommendation you would esteem: Doug Scammon, Leo Fraser, Harold Burns, George Disnard, John Burns, Ed Dupont? I don't have an infinite list, but anyone from around the middle knows I've had a good record.

If you have any interest in my proposal, please let me hear from you. We shall be in the Soviet Far East until late September (from late August to late September); in fact, I watch Soviet TV daily now in preparation. Your boss went to Andover, a class or two ahead of me, I think. He planted a slippery elm in March. I write him from time to time, always hoping to improve his foreign policy perspectives, of course.

The Detroit News reported that Mr. Mikhail Gorbachev made some comments during his recent visit to the United States indicating that he did not know why Ford Motor Company withdrew from a potential automobile assembly venture in the U.S.S.R.

I am providing for your information the attached letter that I sent to Mr. Gorbachev outlining our rationale for withdrawing.

We withdrew from the venture because the Soviet Government was unable to provide previously promised assurances on the convertibility of currency, devaluation protection, or the requirement to export. The significant size of the automotive venture made these assurances mandatory, and the Soviet officials understood those requirements early in our discussions.

After our withdrawal in March 1989, we met a number of times with Ambassador Dubinin, and the Automotive Ministry and Gorky Plant personnel to clarify further our position and to identify alternative approaches. These discussions were to no avail and ended in August 1989.

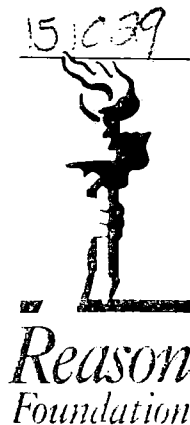

I am writing out of great concern over the impending demise of the Office of Privatization in OMB. The most recent reorganization of functions appears to be eliminating this office, after its downgrading earlier in this Administration from the level of an Associate Director for Privatization.

There is a vital need for a single focal point for privatization within the Administration. Major issues are at stake, such as the sale of existing federal enterprises (Alaska PMAs, Naval Petroleum Reserves, surplus military bases), the sale of municipal airports and state highways (where DOT can greatly impede or facilitate such transfers), the use of private firms to build and operate all sorts of needed infrastructure, etc. These issues go far beyond a narrow concern with federal contracting-out under OMB's A-76 (though that, too, is a valid function of a Privatization Office). And many of them go beyond the concerns of individual departments and agencies.

In a great many other countries, the privatization minister is a cabinet-level position. While the United States does not have as much state-owned property or enterprises to privatize as Eastern Europe or even Mexico, there is at least enough urgently needed work to occupy an Associate Director for Privatization at OMB, with a staff of 10. I urge you to join with Mr. Darman in reconsidering the need for such a focal point within OMB.

Enclosed for your information is a copy of the report by the Panel on Market Volatility and Investor Confidence.

Formed by our board of directors and chaired by Roger B. Smith, chairman and chief executive officer of General Motors, the panel put an extraordinary amount of effort into the deliberations that produced this report.

Included on the committee, which is independent of the New York Stock Exchange, are representatives of the individual and institutional investor communities, listed companies, member firms, academia, and stock and futures exchanges. A full list is on the inside cover of the report.

Before presenting its findings to our board, the members consulted with experts in business, government and academia, and reviewed the major changes that have taken place in our financial markets since October 1987.

Over the five months of its discussions, the panel addressed concerns about the impact of market volatility and the need to maintain a strong market for all participants.

It made these eight recommendations:

- . Coordinated, mandatory circuit breakers should be established across all domestic markets to halt trading in times of market stress. Trading would be halted for one hour if the Dow Jones Industrial Average moves up or down 100 points from the previous day's close. If the DJIA moved 200 points from the previous day's close, trading would halt for 90 minutes; 300 points, 120 minutes; and 400 points, 120 minutes.

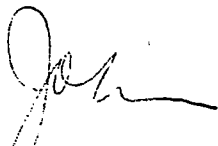

- . Regulatory authority over the U.S. equity and equity derivative markets should be consolidated under one federal agency. The panel found no evidence that a single regulator would affect volatility, but a majority of the panel believes that the consolidation of regulatory authority would improve investor confidence.
- . While recognizing that margins for securities should be higher than on broad-based equity index futures, a majority of the panel believes margin requirements for U.S. equity and equity derivative instruments should be set by the exchanges with government oversight consolidated in one federal agency.
- . To enhance liquidity in times of market stress, the SEC should ease existing constraints on the ability of corporations to repurchase their own common stock.
- . Other steps should be considered to increase liquidity, such as removing obstacles that interfere with the ability of market makers to hedge their positions, encouraging the use of limit orders and improving credit arrangements on bank holidays.
- . The exchanges and market professionals should work with the media to educate the public on program trading, index arbitrage and program trading's exclusion from the uptick rule.
- . New products should be developed to enable individual investors to protect themselves from the extremes of intraday price swings. Such products would guarantee order execution at an average price over the day, in response to investors' concern about their ability to get "fair price execution."
- . The exchanges and their regulators should strive to improve their capabilities to detect intermarket trading abuses. In particular, this would involve improving the quality of the audit trails of all markets.

This report will form a basis for our consideration of these important issues and for broad discussion within the securities industry. I hope it will be of assistance to you in resolving issues with which you will be concerned during the months ahead.

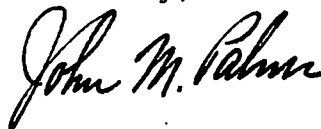

Dear Governor Sununu:

Prior to considering any tax increases, would you please consider the following:

Adopt Grace Commission recommendations as needed.

Eliminate price supports.

Require purveyors of alcohol, tobacco, and drug products to pay for all health and rehabilitation consequences generated from use and/or abuse of their products.

Tie congressional pay to success in balanced spending.

Authorize executive withholding of funding for all but entitlement programs to balance budget in any following year, (withholding in same year would cause too much fiscal disruption to planning).

Create incentives to recover stolen S&L funds and to recover maximum value for S&L property.

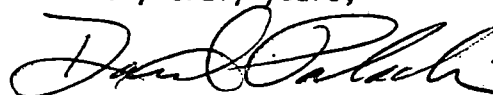
Enact capital gain and tax reform package in exchange for some kind of national health plan that eliminates present wasteful administrative costs, that covers catastrophic illness and nursing home care-- Hawaii and Canada provide excellent examples of the efficiencies possible.

Lastly, enact a temporary and separate tax to retire the national debt over the next ten years, or sooner, should congress have the incentive to find the efficiencies to accomplish such. As the debt is retired, so will the budget busting interest on the debt be reduced.

Governor, I know the above might be looked at as a bit simplistic, but maybe there are some ideas in there that might be of help. And please remember, tax reform can be OK if it does not unfairly raise middle class taxes-- something the last reform act seemed to have ignored in spades.
