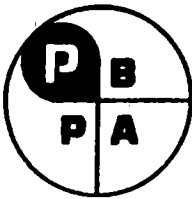

Dear Mr. Sununu:

The purpose of this communication is to express our concern about the Kennedy-Hawkins bill (S.2104/H.R.4000) in its present form or any substitute that might contain similar provisions.

The Mutual of Omaha Companies are strongly committed to equal opportunity and affirmative action as evidenced by our employment practices and involvement in civil rights organizations nationwide. However, we are adamantly opposed to certain provisions of the Kennedy-Hawkins bill as currently drafted.

By allowing for jury trials, punitive and compensatory damages, and an extended statute of limitations, this legislation would encourage private litigation rather than conciliation and prompt resolution of charges available currently through existing administrative processes. These remedies would cause the cost of employment litigation to skyrocket for both employers and employees. Furthermore, this legislation would force employers to resort to quotas because the burden of proof imposed by the bill presumes that the employer is guilty of discrimination until proven innocent.

For the above reasons, we urge you to oppose this legislation or any substitute that contains similar troublesome provisions.

Dear Chief of Staff Sununu:

The American Medical Student Association (AMSA) is a national organization of over 28,000 medical students throughout the United States. We are an independent organization of physicians-in-training committed to the improvement of medical education, the prevention of disease, and equal access to affordable health care. As National President, I am urging you to at least double the cigarette excise tax.

It is well known that cigarette smoking or any use of tobacco products is extremely harmful to the health of both the user and those passively exposed. According to the American Heart Association: in 1989, 87% of the 142,000 deaths from lung cancer were due to smoking, in 1986, approximately 200,000 deaths from heart disease were due to smoking. In 1987, 64,000 deaths from chronic obstructive lung disease were likewise attributed to smoking.

As medical students, we see hundreds of patients suffering from the ill effects of smoking. It is heart breaking to watch these patients struggle with the terrible symptoms of a preventable disease and with acceptance of their ultimate death. More important, patients and families are devastated when they realize that their lives will be filled by the hardships of chronic illness then voided by an early death due to the insidious effects of smoking.

The above speaks nothing about the financial impact of cigarette use. Smoking related health care costs are estimated by the Office of Technology at \$22 billion dollars a year. More than 20% of these expenses are paid for by the federal government. Productivity losses due to smoking are estimated at \$43 billion.

Doubling the cigarette excise tax to 32-cents a pack addresses concerns about morbidity and mortality, the costs of associated health care and finally the decrease in productivity amongst tobacco using workers. 3.5 million Americans would be encouraged to forgo smoking, according to K. E. Warner, PhD an economist at the University of Michigan. Raising the tax by 25-cents will deter even more people from smoking and will raise an additional 4.4 billion dollars allowing the government to recoup some of the losses associated with smoking. As physicians in training, we can only view the effects of an increase in cigarette excise tax as an excellent form of preventive medicine and a very useful plan to minimize the overwhelming effects of cigarette use.

Once again, it is time for Congress to definitively address and actively pursue its concern for the health and well-being of this country. By supporting an increase in cigarette excise taxes that concern, with all of its benefits is very well stated.

Dear Governor Sununu,

I continue to be delighted in reading about the many areas in which you are now so intimately involved including that of global cooperation. These are heady times and you must be enjoying the challenge immensely.

For fifty years, Manhattan College has had one of the leading programs in Environmental Engineering and Science on the graduate and undergraduate level. Many of its graduates have gone on to prominent leadership positions in government, academe, and the private sector while others provide the skilled technical work force necessary to address our nation's environmental problems. Through an annual institute in water pollution control, now in its thirty-fifth year, scores of practicing scientists and engineers have come to our campus for state-of-the art training. Through international technology transfer programs in Europe, Latin and South America, Manhattan has been proud to share its expertise. Additionally, we have provided a forum to address pressing national issues through activities such as a recent EPA co-sponsored regional conference on "Cleaning Up Our Coastal Waters: An Unfinished Agenda."

I am writing to inform you that Manhattan College is going to submit a proposal to the Environmental Protection Agency in order to be selected as an Exploratory Research Center. The Center for Coastal Zone Water Quality and Ecosystem Modeling would be concerned with the development, construction and application of large scale, predictive mathematical models of our transport and fate of nutrients and toxic chemicals in the coastal zone aquatic system. There are currently several large efforts underway in the Mid-Atlantic region: Long Island Sound, New York Harbor, New York Bight and the Chesapeake Bay. In each of these studies, numerous questions are raised about the impacts of distant sources on coastal water quality as well as the interactions between the problems in the large coastal bays and harbors. The Center will develop a large scale framework for integrating these separated efforts.

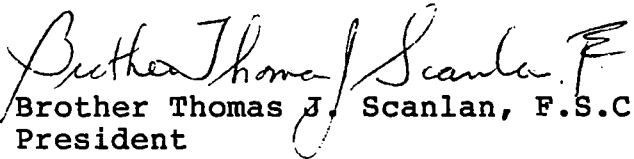

Manhattan College would complete the structure by providing a proven "track-record" of performance in integrating diverse elements into a synthesized modeling framework responsive to both scientific and management questions.

I know that President Bush has expressed his strong commitment to the environment and I know of your great interest as well. The successful establishment of the new research center at Manhattan College would enable us to enhance our public service contributions and guarantee the continued growth and excellence of our world renowned program.

My Dear Governor:

I write to you to share my thinking on the matter of tax increases. It may well be that the good of the republic requires additional revenue. I myself have been previously persuaded that a better answer would be to cut expenditures. However, I know that with things being as they are in Congress, that may not be possible of attainment. Under these circumstances we may just have to increase revenues.

Nevertheless, how we increase revenues makes a great deal of difference. The guiding principle which I recommend is that you and the President not agree to any increases in revenues which are not balanced by corresponding concessions from Congress of equal importance. A tax increase, painful as it will be to all of us, should be accompanied by reductions in spending and the capital gains tax.

I think the form of the tax increases is also very important. Tax energy, gasoline, oil (everybody's not just foreign oil). These are taxes on consumption (which I favor) and not on production (which I oppose). Tax sin...tobacco, alcohol, et al. User fees are fine. All of these recommendations are designed to preclude the possibility of increasing marginal income tax rates to the most productive segment of our society (Democrats call them "the wealthy").

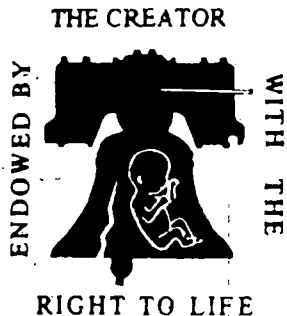
Two major goods came from the Reagan years. The tough military posture which resulted in the winning of the cold war and the decline in top rates of income tax which stimulated productivity and enterprise. It would be truly tragic for us to sink back into the "soak the rich" mentality, and not only because that's tough on the rich. SUBJECT: Discovery Airways

I wanted you to be personally aware of a recent decision involving the airline industry and our citizenship rules. Early this year, the Department was required to decide whether or not to permit Discovery Airways, a new airline applicant, to begin operations. We faced a number of objections by other airlines, unions and members of Congress related to whether there was foreign ownership and control that exceeded statutory standards. In addition, questions were raised about the veracity of the carrier's statements in its filings. Notwithstanding these objections, and in light of my desire to encourage foreign investment and competition in the airline industry, we permitted the airline to commence operations while an Administrative Law Judge gathered further evidence. Discovery began operating in April.

The Judge has now advised us that he has found indications that Discovery's principals have consistently provided false submissions and appear to have violated the terms of their temporary operating authority and federal law. Based on our review of the record, we agree with the Judge's findings. Discovery has made little attempt to correct the problems. In the absence of a strong showing of corrective behavior, we consider such a pattern of non-compliance to be grounds for terminating Discovery's temporary operating authority and we have taken such action.

We have given Discovery numerous opportunities to satisfy our concerns over its foreign control and compliance problems, and it has failed to do so or even to show any credible inclination to do so. We cannot justify Discovery's continued temporary operating authority with that disposition.

If Discovery wishes to pursue an operating license, it will retain that opportunity through continuation of the evidentiary hearing procedure before the Administrative Law Judge. Please feel free to call me if you have any questions.

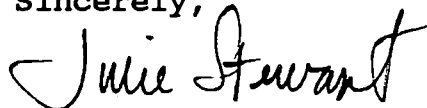

I am writing to follow-up on my conversation with the President last week concerning my views on the five-point plan on the northern spotted owl announced on Tuesday, June 26, by the Departments of Agriculture and Interior.

I would also like to take this opportunity to discuss my concerns regarding the U.S. Fish and Wildlife Service's document of June 1990, entitled, Interim Procedures Leading to Endangered Species Act Compliance For The Northern Spotted Owl. I believe that the compliance procedures outlined in this document could result in significant harvest reductions off of private lands. This is very disconcerting, since the Forest Service's economic impact analysis of the Thomas report relies heavily on private lands to mitigate for the job losses resulting from a reduction in federal harvest levels.

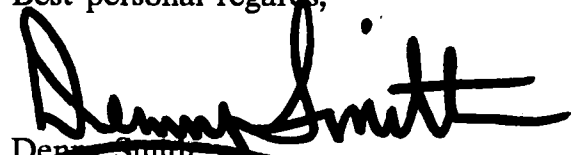

I am writing to urge further consideration of several issues in the proposed Civil Rights Act of 1990 which are of concern to Boeing.

Boeing has long been committed to equal opportunity and affirmative action. In 1961, four years before affirmative action became mandatory for government contractors, Boeing was one of the first eight corporations that voluntarily joined Plans for Progress in an effort to improve employment opportunities for minorities.

Boeing's commitment to equal opportunity has continued in the ensuing years. During this period, federal policy for labor and employment laws emphasized affirmative action and "make whole" remedies through prompt resolution and settlement.

The proposed bill is described by sponsors as restoring legislation to reverse recent Supreme Court decisions. In reality, it is a complete rewrite of our equal opportunity laws and would substantially change the balance between the goal of eliminating discrimination and maintaining an equitable, efficient business environment.

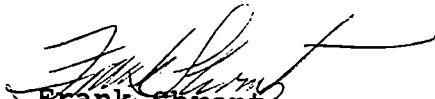
The proposed bill enables a plaintiff to prevail based upon the simple showing of a statistically imbalanced workforce, overturns the accepted and settled principle that a plaintiff must prove that specific, unlawful acts of the employer caused the alleged harm and provides plaintiffs with broader remedies of additional compensatory and unlimited punitive damages. The effect of adding general damages to Title VII will result in a dramatic increase in litigation and substantial delays in resolution.

Boeing supports legislation that encourages continued attention to equal employment opportunity while preserving employers' ability to base hiring decisions on an applicant's qualifications for the position, rather than forcing employers into quota hiring in order to avoid costly litigation and compensatory and punitive damages. The proposed tort-based employment law will threaten private sector ability to continue to grow and to successfully compete in international markets, and will deter industry from focusing its resources on the education and training programs needed to develop and maintain the diverse workforce of the future.

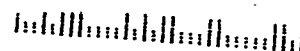

Dear Mr. Sununu:

As a Republican member of the Georgia House of Representatives, I desperately need your help regarding an issue which, in its current interpretation, is creating an untenable situation in my district and is rapidly taking on national implications. The issue to which I refer is the method of identifying and classifying wetlands.

The term "wetlands" originated in Section 404 of the Clean Water Act eight to ten years ago. Wetlands, as defined in the Act, were swamps, bogs, marshes and similar areas. These are areas that I certainly recognize as vital to an ecologically sound environment, and I am committed to the protection of our true wetlands. However, on January 10, 1989, the definition of wetlands was immediately broadened. The new Federal manual for identifying jurisdictional wetlands has potentially created these catastrophic results:

1. Eighty-five percent of the land in my House district has been deemed "jurisdictional wetlands." This determination could result in the cessation of vital infrastructural services such as sanitation, centralized water and sewage, road maintenance, storm drainage and mosquito control. The tax base would be severely impacted, which would negatively affect the economic vitality of the area resulting in many jobs lost.
2. The future of our most significant cash crop, the pine tree, is included in the wetlands identification. There is a question as to whether a timber producer can cut his current crop. Furthermore, under the new wetlands definition, no reforestation can take place if the current crop is allowed to be harvested. This places the future of the forestry industry in jeopardy.

Economic chaos and devastation is about to take place if the Corps of Engineers, the Environmental Protection Agency, and other Federal agencies do not immediately reassess the interpretation of wetlands. I completely understand and appreciate the President's position on "no net loss of wetlands" and his desire to have quality wetlands retained or replaced if

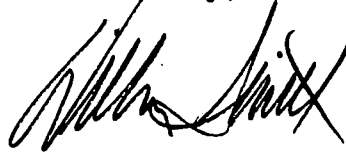
damaged by development. However, in making this statement, I do not believe the President ever intended that the Federal agencies in question apply such broad classifications to the wetlands concept.

As this letter was being typed, I received the attached notice announcing further public hearings on the wetlands issue. While such hearings are a step in the right direction, the locations are far too distant to have real input from the public at large ... the people whose very livelihoods are at stake.

It is my understanding that Congressman Lindsay Thomas from our area will be discussing the wetlands issue with you later in the month. Hopefully, such a meeting will be an integral step forward in returning the delineation of wetlands to a more common sense definition.

Thank you for the good job you continue to do for the President. I look forward to working with you further in the days ahead.

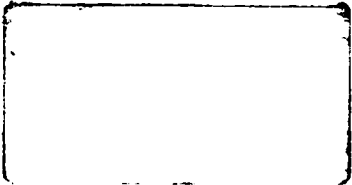

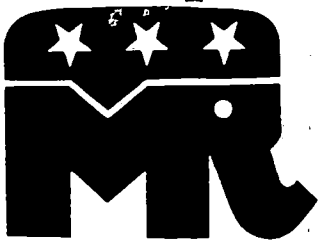

At the risk of being presumptuous and perhaps out of order, I crave your indulgence to bring to your attention my situation, in the hope that my desire to serve the country of my adoption where I have been a citizen by naturalization since 1961, might be conveyed to the proper source.

To-day marks the end of my 5-year tour of duty as Grenada's Permanent Representative to the United Nations, having been appointed by deceased Prime Minister of Grenada Rt. Hon Herbert A. Blaize, well known to President Bush, even when the latter was Vice-President, and visited Grenada in 1985.

Grenada of course is the country of my birth, and the USA the country of my adoption, where I studied my profession of Dentistry at Howard University, after completing my requirements in the College of Liberal Arts in Washington, DC, and coming to New York since 1953 to practice.

During that time, I was always mindful of my brethren at home in Grenada and in the wider Caribbean community, perhaps the reason

for my being asked to represent Grenada at the U.N.,

Now that I have concluded my service to the

adoption, in my capacity where I can be of service
This country has been good to me, as it has
been to so many. Because of the opportunity afforded
me, I was able to secure an education, practice
my profession, and raise a family of five, all of
whom were born here and are now good and
useful citizens, spread in all the learned pro-
fessions. God and this blessed land have been so
good to me, that it is my continued desire to "put
back into the good earth a little of what has ^{been} taken
out."

I was a Democrat until 1983, when the then
President Ronald Reagan intervened to rescue
Grenada from the grip of Cuban - Russian com-
munism. I conveyed to him from my Brooklyn
office, on behalf of Grenadian nationals in New

history. I am now a member of the Republican Party, in good standing, and thus I intend to maintain. Hence the reasons for my asking you, Hon. Sir, to bring to the attention of the proper source, my desire to be of further service to the country of my adoption.

Please permit me to tell you that I want to be remembered, as my best contribution as Grenada's Permanent Representative to the UN, the vote I cast on the resolution, entitled The Question of Namibia, during the special session of the G.A. in 1986, wherein Grenada was the only "third world country" and member of the Non-aligned Movement, to abstain along with the so-called developed countries. Grenada's position and that of the USA and the other developed countries were equated as a vote against economic sanctions of South Africa. Grenada's rationale was that the resolution was not economic against South Africa, but how best Namibia could be brought to independence, viz. when Cuba leaves Angola, and South Africa leaves Namibia for whatever reason; then Namibia would be afforded the best hope for independence. Grenada felt that the presence of Cuban troops in Angola was not extraneous and

In December 1988, when here at the UN, the bilateral treaty between Cuba and Angola was signed, by which Cuba agreed to withdraw its forces from Angola, and the trilateral treaty was signed among Cuba, Angola and South Africa, by which South Africa agreed to withdraw forces from Namibia, (all this negotiated by our distinguished U.S. negotiator Chester Crocker) the way was paved for Namibia's independence, which is a fair accomplishment. Grenada stood tall, in that the logic of its position was now unassailable. Of course, it was only because of a principled and well studied position, that Grenada's abstention co-incided with the USA and other countries. I was prepared to take the vitriolic remarks and abuse, from those who could not discern the forest from the trees, in the realization that time would be the unfolding of truth.

My second best contribution (if that is possible) is that I was able to persuade good donor countries such as U.K, Canada, Australia, N.Z., etc, to help small impecunious Commonwealth countries to maintain themselves at the UN. So that to-day the

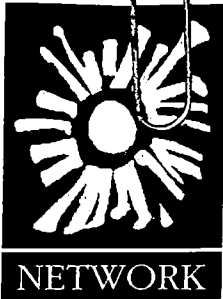

NETWORK: A Catholic Social Justice Lobby welcomes the announcement of President Bush that he will step back from his campaign pledge not to raise taxes. NETWORK considers this move, which is not only necessary but critical to the solution of the nation's fiscal situation, long overdue.

We congratulate those Congressional members of the Budget Summit who rejected the Administration's June 19-21, 1990 proposal for deficit reduction, presented by White House Budget Director, Richard Darman. They rightly contended that it fell far short of what was needed to reduce the deficit and relied heavily on cost-cutting measures formerly rejected by Congress. Undoubtedly, this rejection contributed to the President's decision to back away from his "no tax" position.

However, we wish to signal our concerns about how these "tax revenue increases" are to be achieved. NETWORK in collaboration with the Citizens Budget Campaign has consistently called for deeper cuts in military spending and progressivity in raising taxes as ways to address the deficit and increase spending for domestic human needs. The burden of the fiscal mistakes of the past decade should not be laid on the middle class and the poor.

PROGRESSIVITY IN TAXATION

According to the Congressional Budget Office, 90 percent of American families are paying a higher share of their incomes in federal taxes now than in 1977- before the two "supply-side" tax cuts of 1978 and 1981, and the Tax Reform Act of 1986. Only one in 10 American families has had its federal tax burden decreased and most of the tax cut gains have gone to the richest one percent of the families. For this elite group (average 1990 income: \$549,000), effective tax rates were reduced by 15 percent.

According to Citizens for Tax Justice, this translates into an average 1990 tax cut over 1977 rates for the super rich of \$82,196. During the 1980's, the rich got richer and their taxes smaller.

Progressivity, therefore, demands that the taxes for the wealthy be raised and the so-called "bubble" of the 1986 tax code be closed. This would generate some \$4.1 billion in 1991 alone.

THE CAPITAL GAINS TAX CUT

NETWORK also opposes any restoration of the pre-1986 special tax status for capital gains. The Congressional Joint Committee on Taxation and the CBO both project that a capital gains tax cut would only increase revenues in the first year, as people sold assets to garner the tax benefit. Thereafter, the cut would cause losses of up to \$70 billion over the decade.

In addition, 77% of the benefits would again flow to the richest three percent of taxpayers - those in the \$100,000 plus income bracket.

EXCISE TAXES

We further urge you to analyze carefully any revenue increases generated through excise taxes in the light of their effects on the middle class and the poor. Excise taxes are inherently regressive. Rep. Rostenkowski's list of "consumption taxes" on pollutants, tobacco and alcohol, not gasoline, may have some merit when compared with the President's taxes on long distance phone calls and travel on airplanes - other than private jets and Air Force One.

CUTS IN HUMAN NEEDS PROGRAMS

Finally, cuts in domestic programs which not only affect the most vulnerable in our midst, the poor, elderly and children, must be avoided. The nation's future can ill afford further diminishment in programs directed to address needs in education, housing, health care, drugs, transportation, and the environment.

This is a moment to reverse the course of this nation's priorities, a moment which may never come again. It calls for strong and visionary leadership. In the past few months, we have witnessed the hunger of the American people for courageous leadership as they have welcomed Havel, Walesa and Mandela to our podiums. As a free people, we have a right to expect the same quality of courage in our elected officials.

I know you are the country's busiest man, but PLEASE take a couple of moments to read the enclosed news article called "Day-Care Home Rules Called Too Costly" from yesterday's ST. LOUIS POST-DISPATCH.

Though the POST is a very liberal newspaper supporting the ABC Daycare bill, this factual news report gives an excellent picture of the problems that are down the road when the government gets into overregulation or federal-regulation of daycare. Please read this article and then imagine the turmoil among low- and middle-income employed mothers when the situation described herein is multiplied in every community across our nation.

The best estimate I've seen is that there are 1.7 million family daycare homes, most of them UNlicensed. This is many times more than the daycare "centers" we hear so much about on TV. There is no evidence that the unlicensed family daycare homes or informal baby-sitting arrangements are bad or unsafe, and most parents prefer this type of arrangement -- because they are personally acquainted with the daycare provider, and because the disease risk is far less in homes where there are fewer children.

The goal of the ABC-daycare lobbyists is to regulate family daycare out of existence -- and ANY way that the Federal Government gets into financing or regulating daycare (with or without advisory councils) will move us mightily toward that goal. Any Congressional bill which puts an army of busybodies on the payroll, whether directly or by grants to states, will advance this goal.

As you can see from the enclosed article, this type of government busybodyism in the daycare field increases costs and eliminates daycare slots which both mothers and daycare providers are happy with today.

This article describes the real world of daycare -- a world which is not understood Inside the Beltway. I hope it will fortify you in the belief that Federal daycare is anti-family, and the only way to help employed parents is by the \$1,000 tax credit George Bush promised in 1988 -- with no strings attached.

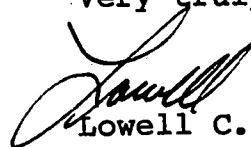

The Painting and Decorating Contractors of America is a trade association representing over 3,400 member firms working in all fifty states in the coatings application industry. We strongly oppose the Civil Rights Act of 1990 (S. 2104/H.R. 4000).

Employers in the coatings application industry, like others in construction, are faced with difficult manpower problems. Much of the work is seasonal, which results in peaks and valleys in manpower requirements. Employers, therefore, are constantly challenged to find workers with the requisite skills for the industry. Contractors employ individuals who have the appropriate job skills regardless of race. A contractor only hurts himself by discriminating.

This legislation would force the abandonment of the merit principle that the best qualified persons available should be hired. Instead, it clearly makes an individual's race a pertinent factor in the employment process.

Even though some "compromise" language was enacted in the Senate, the thrust of the bill remains the same: employers are guilty of discrimination until they prove themselves innocent. A plaintiff would only need to demonstrate a statistical imbalance in the employer's workforce to create a presumption of guilt. It wouldn't matter whether any of the employer's practices had a discriminatory effect. The only way an employer could protect himself would be to engage in racially oriented, statistical hiring. That means quotas.

The President has stated he would not sign a quota bill. We appreciate and support that stance. Please do all that is possible to defeat this legislation.

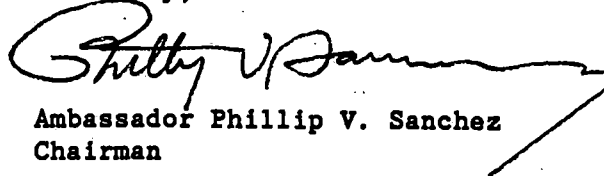

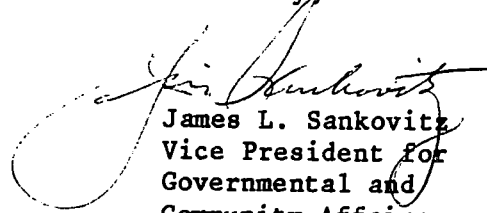

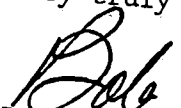

Thank you for taking the time to meet with my colleagues and me this morning to discuss issues that are vital to our Western States.

I contacted the Forest Service to settle our discussion on which state, Oregon or Maine, has more timber. According to their publication, "Forest Statistics of the United States" (1987), Oregon has 66 billion board feet of timber standing compared to Maine's 22.4 billion board feet. This does not include forest land that is designated as wilderness, so the difference is even greater. Also, in 1987, 8.2 billion board feet were harvested in Oregon and only 1.4 billion in Maine.

So, as can be seen from these numbers, the "Beaver State" leads the "Pine Tree State" in both the amount of standing timber and in timber harvest.

As requested in our phone conversation this evening, I am enclosing a list of actions that the Administration must request of the Congress in both the short and long term.

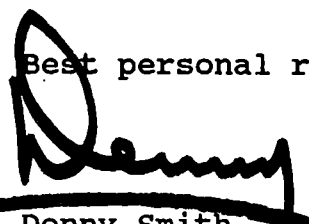
As a follow-up to our meeting last week, I am also enclosing more detailed proposals for the various actions that can be taken administratively by the Departments of Agriculture and Interior to help address the current timber supply problems facing the Pacific Northwest.

I appreciate your personal involvement in an issue that will significantly affect my constituents. Oregon has over 19 million acres of commercial forestland, and the Federal government owns almost sixty percent of the forested land in my state. We can have a sound timber industry and a sound environment--it does not have to be an either/or proposition.

Briefly, on the jobs issue, the environmentalists claim that jobs are being lost to automation. It is true that mills have modernized in the last decade, but the timber industry also suffered a severe recession in the early 1980s. There are fewer mills in operation today than there were in 1980, yet lumber companies have added 11,000 jobs since the recovery began in 1983.

I hope that you will find the enclosed proposals useful. If you or your staff have any questions concerning these proposals, please be sure to contact me.

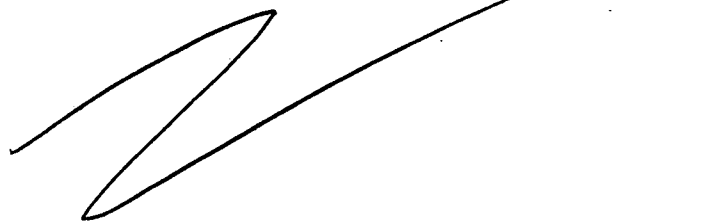
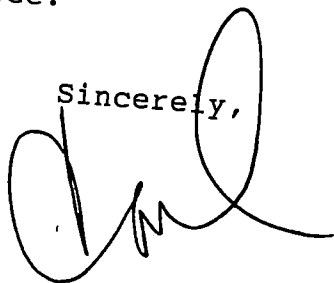
John:

MEMORANDUM FOR GOVERNOR SUNUNU

As you are aware, the Sixth International Conference on AIDS begins today in San Francisco, California and runs through Sunday June 24, 1990. Because the news coverage of this conference is not likely to be favorable to the Administration, I thought you might be interested in some background against which to read the media reports.

I am scheduled to address the conference at the closing ceremony on Sunday. Approximately 12,000 participants are expected to attend, including scientists, health-care professionals, policy makers, gay and civil rights advocates and others concerned about AIDS and HIV infection. Controversy surrounding this year's conference is particularly keen for a number of reasons and tensions are unusually high. Issues of concern include: discrimination against people with AIDS; United States immigration policy related to HIV infected persons; accessibility to treatments; and, the current level of funding for AIDS related research and services.

I am also providing a separate summary of likely media issues and talking points prepared for the White House Press Office.

I am available to discuss any of these issues in greater detail at your convenience.

Dear Governor Sununu:

Thank you for the time you spent last Thursday meeting with my constituents about the timber supply crisis facing Oregon. They appreciate the President's expression of concern about the potential job loss and the economic consequences of protecting the spotted owl. The meeting was a good opportunity for the group to tell you personally of the impact this situation is having on their communities and lives.

I will be sending to you within the week the concise proposals you encouraged us to send, but would like to take this opportunity to summarize for you the issues we presented Thursday.

The timber volumes specified in Section 318 of the Fiscal Year 1990 Interior Appropriations bill are mandated harvest levels, not merely targets. We in the Congress spent weeks negotiating those harvest levels, and we expected that all the volume would be sold. Despite optimistic claims from the Washington, D. C. headquarters, Region Six of the Forest Service will probably fall very short of this mandate.

There is also an estimated 300 million to 500 million board feet of blown down timber which must be harvested before it becomes fuel for forest fires. This blowdown should be aggressively salvaged and the areas reforested. This volume should be offered in addition to the Section 318 level, in an effort to help refill the timber pipeline.

We are very concerned that the Forest Service seems intent on implementing the Jack Ward Thomas report whether or not the owl is listed as threatened. Implementation of the Thomas report will bring economic disaster to the Pacific Northwest. This report recommends locking up over 8 million acres in Oregon and Washington, yet no one knows how many owls there are and how many are necessary for the species to be declared out of danger. We do know, however, that the recommendations of five men will put 50,000 Oregonians out of work.

While the compilation of available raw data under this report may be good, no one knows exactly how the policy recommendations were developed, and they have not been subject to review. It is a management strategy. But to say it is the only management strategy is a disservice to hard-working Oregonians.

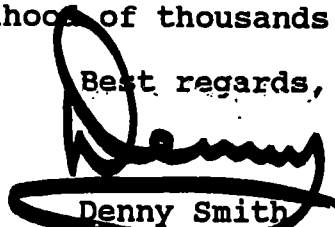
The Thomas report did not consider human and societal needs in deciding what was best for the owl. It falls far short of the balance between the environment and the economy that President Bush promised his Administration would provide. By contrast, the BLM is working on an owl management plan that seeks to minimize economic disruption.

Eco-terrorists must be stopped. We can achieve this by directing the Forest Service to take steps, including the closure of logging roads, to deal firmly with the life-threatening incidents that these groups engage in. We cannot make it our tacit policy to tolerate vandalism of equipment and tree spiking that is designed to maim or kill loggers and millworkers.

On the question of banning log exports from public lands, I would urge the Administration to accept the legislation that would establish such a ban currently pending in the Congress. Until this issue is resolved, it is the excuse the environmental extremists constantly use for the current raw material shortage in the Pacific Northwest.

The President's concern about the timber supply crisis is clear. His leadership during this time is critical to the economic survival of the Northwest. By working together, I'm confident we can have a win-win solution that will protect our environment and the livelihood of thousands of Oregonians.

Dear Mr. Sununu:

In his letter to me last February (enclosed), Lee Atwater stated that the Republican Party holds a variety of views on the issue of abortion and the federal ban on fetal tissue transplants. I have the impression that, while Mr. Atwater is in convalescence, you are overseeing the major strategies of the party, especially as related to the President. Accordingly, I am writing to you with regard to the Administration's position on these issues.

In spite of the so-called "big tent" approach, the Administration and the national platform reflects the most constricted view of the antiabortion policy. This again is reflected in the Administration's ban on fetal tissue research, in spite of many calls from within and outside the party, that the ban be lifted.

At the 4/2/90 hearings of the House Subcommittee on Health, Assistant Secretary Mason and the Administration were embarrassed by the flimsy argument used to support the Administration's position. It is quite clear that Representative Waxman is preparing legislation which could put the President in a position to either lift the ban or veto funds authorized for other health matters of importance to the public. Against this background there seems to be a grass-roots letter campaign to gain more and more support for lifting the ban. Much evidence exists that a strict antiabortion stance can lose a lot of votes. Recent polls in Maryland show that 74 percent of the public supports some abortion rights (Washington Post p. 1, 4/24/90).

I am suggesting that we can avoid the confrontation and save possible further embarrassment if the President would lift the ban by executive order now. This would preempt the opposition's action through the Congress and would demonstrate to many people, both in and outside, that the Party indeed holds a diversity of opinion.

Mr. Steve Silveira, who works in campaign headquarters, told me when I was getting ready for the race, that a Puerto Rican had no chance to win in this district. Let me add that this statement has never been denied by Mr. Silveira. While I tried to ignore his statement at first, subsequent events proved to me that the party establishment had already selected someone else to run against Mr. Barney Frank, and I was an obstacle that had to be trampled on.

I protest the treatment that I have received for three reasons. First, I have been a team player who tried to help the Bush campaign as much as possible. I took time off from my race in a state legislative contest two years ago to fly to Chicago and campaign for President Bush. I also appeared in the video "A View from Massachusetts" attacking the Dukakis record in our state. Then I helped produce TV commercials helping the Bush campaign in the Hispanic media market.

Second, I asked Mr. Shamie for a public policy statement "declaring that a candidate's viability will never be measured in our Party on the bases of sex, race or ethnic background." The importance of this is obvious but it failed to move Mr. Shamie. Would he have failed to support Senator Brooke in our state because he was a black man and had no chance of winning a state where blacks were a small minority? Well, Mr. Brooke was Senator of this state for many years, and his race had nothing to do with his success. I demand a color blind test in our state Republican Party.

Imagine, Dr. Sununu, if you had tried to run for political office in our state and someone in party headquarters had told you that you had no chance because you were a Cuban-born Catholic of Lebanese ancestry. How would you have felt? I have chosen not to make a public issue of

this since my initial demand for a public policy statement, but The White House has to know about the treatment that a minority member is being given in my state.

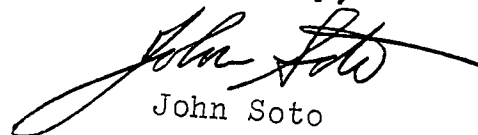
Third, I believe that party headquarters is running down the Republican Party in our state. Candidates are receiving almost no direct financial help from headquarters. When I last checked, this help amounted to only 5% of all contributions received by party headquarters. The State Convention was a total disaster, with headquarters burning the ballots of the delegates. One candidate for lieutenant governor, Deborah Cochran Mazzola, was denied a place in the primary ballot because she received 14.8% of the convention vote, even though the rules clearly said that in such a case the percentage would be rounded off to 15%. Mrs. Mazzola had even been declared as qualifying at the time of the convention.

What is going on in our state is an outrage, and only party headquarters fails to know the mood of activists. Mr. Shamie has now supported a true blood liberal candidate who even favors gays in the military to run against me. Why? Dr. Nuzzo is a well-off man and a member of the country-club set that is favored by the party establishment. He is such a political novice that he is talking about converting to Judaism in the middle of a political campaign. His campaign manager declared that Dr. Nuzzo would not concede the Jewish vote to Mr. Frank. I enclose two newspaper articles demonstrating the consequences of this extremely foolish political behavior. But Dr. Nuzzo remains Mr Shamie's candidate: What a brilliant choice.

It is now clear to me that attempts are being made to draw The White House into my district's race, and it is my hope that you can stop this from happening. I do not want any favors from the national party but I do request a neutral stance.

Good luck on your trip to Moscow.

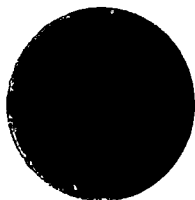

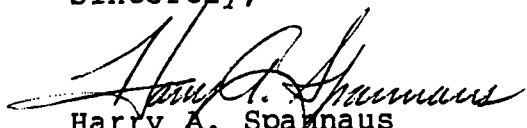

Thank you for listening to my concerns about the NRC. It is a good group of people who I believe have an outdated mission, or if you will, an incomplete mission.

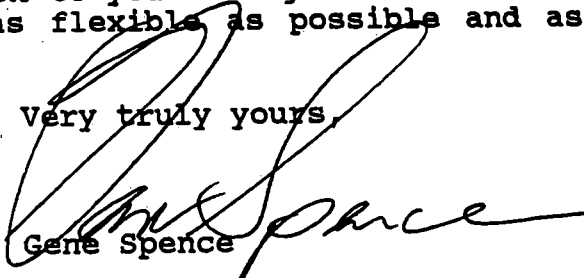
The NRC's mission of safety alone leads the average citizen to conclude that nuclear power is dangerous and even sinister.

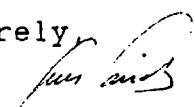
On behalf of my Government, I am writing to enclose an Aide-Memoire which the Peruvian Institute of Foreign Trade recently prepared on expanding textiles trade under the President's Andean Initiative.

My Government believes that elimination of the highly restrictive and discriminatory quotas imposed by the United States on imports of Peruvian textiles and apparel would be the single most important action that could be taken under the Andean Initiative to expand textiles trade with Peru. The existing quotas are unnecessary, because Peru accounts for less than one-quarter of one percent (by value) of United States imports of textiles and apparel. The quotas are also discriminatory because Peru is the only Andean country with such quotas, despite the fact that Colombia's imports are more than twice those of Peru.

If the Andean Initiative is to succeed in Peru, my Government needs concrete actions from your Government on textiles and apparel. The type of action needed is quota relief.

Your attention and interest in this matter is greatly appreciated.

3. NH has a right of way through NH to Canada.

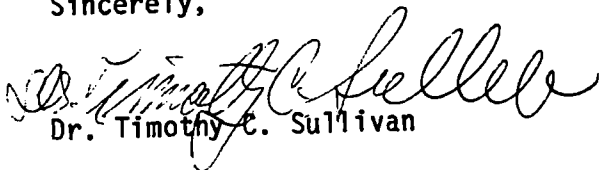
a) With all these right of ways owned by one company, they can sell nuclear energy to Canada and with their arrangements, it would be easy to deliver.

I was in the Soviet Union all of last September, along with sixty nine other American CEO's, and we were the guests of the Academy of Sciences and the Ministry of Aviation Industry. Katy Industries, through its West German subsidiary Schön & Cie AG, is the leading supplier of shoe machinery to Russia, with installations of our equipment in over 100 cities in the Soviet Union.

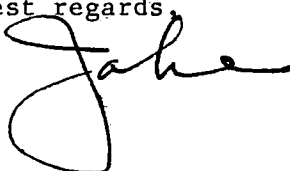
When we were in Russia we met with Deputy Prime Minister Leonid Abalkin at the Kremlin. He is the chief economic advisor to Mr. Gorbachev and we were accompanied by Jack Matlock, our ambassador who, incidentally, is fluent in Russian.

Our German subsidiary has an office in Moscow and we have access to excellent translators and interpreters with capabilities in German and English. I personally made excellent use of these people last September and also last February when I again visited the Soviet Union. Because of their many years in Moscow, I am sure that our Moscow staff could be helpful to the members of your family or staff in facilitating services which are normally difficult to obtain.

Incidentally, our Schön subsidiary has recently signed one of the most important manufacturing joint ventures with the Ministry of Aviation Industry and Katy Industries will be hosting the July visit to the United States of Appolon S. Systsov, the Minister of Aviation Industry.

Your visit to Moscow, and the assistance that you and your staff are providing is the greatest evidence of the confidence and good relations that now exist between America and the Soviet Union. I hope to see you at the International Business Center dinner in Boston on Thursday, June 21st, and hopefully I can give you a few more details concerning our activities in the Soviet Union.

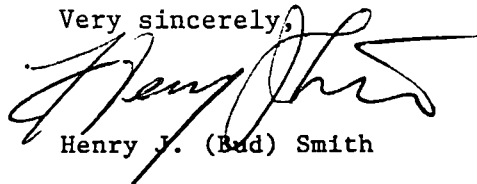
Dear Chief of Staff Sununu:

Maybe there was a time when the U.S. could make a case for diplomatic boot-licking to keep on the good side of the Soviets, but no more.

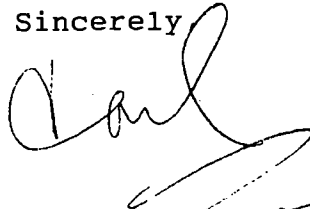

Dear Governor Sununu:

Over the past three years, our association has counted on the privatization office within the Office of Management and Budget as a chief ally in our effort to create jobs and save taxpayer dollars by privatizing various government functions. Now we hear that the privatization office may be eliminated, and the occasion of this letter is to strongly urge you to keep the office. Perhaps our industry's success story may serve to highlight the important role played by the privatization office.

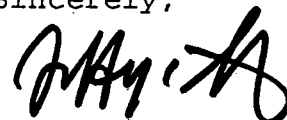
This industry came into being in 1983 because of a DOT privatization policy which allowed private towing firms to handle non-emergency marine assistance cases, thus freeing up Coast Guard resources to focus on emergency responsibilities and the war on drugs. Before 1983, boaters who ran out of fuel were towed home by the Coast Guard at taxpayer expense, and this industry did not exist. Today there are over 400 marine towing firms across the country and hundreds of jobs have been created.

But the entrepreneurs in this industry did not find the going easy. The Coast Guard had proposed to reverse the privatization policy on three occasions, which would have put this new industry out of business. Only with the involvement by the OMB privatization office under Dr. Ron Utt was the Coast Guard forced to withdraw their dangerous proposals, and this industry continued in business.

Simply put, we would not be here if it were not for the persistent efforts of the OMB privatization office to keep the bureaucracy in check. Now we are forced to wonder what the future of this industry would be without a privatization advocacy office in the Bush administration.

Again, we urge you to do everything in your power to continue the office. Thank you for your consideration of this matter.

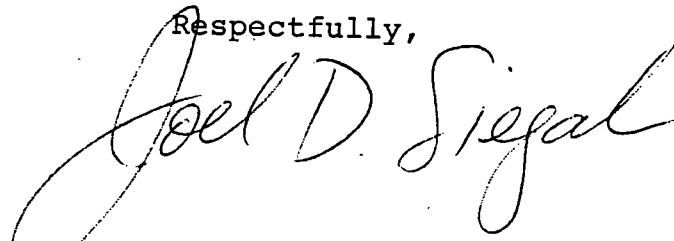

Dear Governor Sununu:

When you met with me and several other engineering deans on April 25, we discussed the importance of dramatizing President Bush's commitment to improving science and engineering education. To that end you offered to request the President's presence at appropriate occasions. I think I have one.

We are in the third summer of a program that brings to Cornell minority high-school students who have aptitude for science, but lack the inspiration and motivation to prepare themselves for university studies and careers in science and engineering.

Students participate in this program from ninth grade to College. It includes two weeks of intensive summer training, monthly visits to campus during the academic year, continual involvement with mentors from industry and the Cornell faculty, and active participation by parents and high-school teachers. It is funded entirely by Cornell and by corporate gifts. Its core is rigorous study in science, math and English.

As the third class of ninth-graders enters this summer, the inaugural class of two years ago will be taking AP tests in chemistry and calculus and enrolling in Cornell Summer College courses, which are given by regular faculty and attended by ambitious, college-bound high-school juniors from around the country and the world.

We are not inviting the President to a well-intentioned but unproven program. We have begun to succeed in attacking two critical national problems: the looming shortage of scientists and engineers, and the need to bring more under-represented minorities into the mainstream

of education and the professions.

This year's summer program opens on Sunday afternoon, July 8, and closes on Saturday, July 21. On the final day, at 10:00 a.m., we have scheduled the presentation of projects done during the previous two weeks, with awards to be given at noon. That would be the ideal time for a visit; however, we would of course be delighted to have the President here at any time, and would be able to provide the effects and hardware that might help dramatize the event.

I would be happy to provide you with more details if you think these ideas are promising.

Thank you for your interest in a matter I know we agree is critical to our national future.

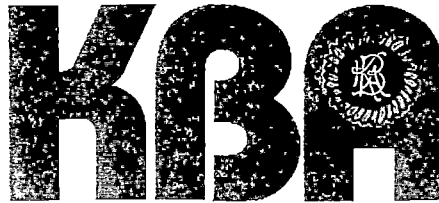

It was my pleasure to visit with you during a recent White House luncheon honoring President Eisenhower's centennial birthday. I appreciated being at your luncheon table, and enjoyed your informal comments.

What a heady time for the Administration! The President's approval rating is at unprecedented highs, and will soar even higher since the Summit. Our view from Middle America is that, with just a few exceptions, the President and his advisers are doing everything right. Any student of politics knows there are many people with important and complicated roles to play in this success story. None, however, more crucial than yours. And you are carrying it off splendidly. You personally are keeping an important element of support close at hand, while allowing the President the luxury of not having to deal with some of these specific matters. You are to be commended, and no doubt the results will show during our next plebiscite.

Having said that, may I now engage in the luxury of carping just a little? The intentional leaks that FDIC Chair Bill Seidman is "on the way out" strike us as unfair to an official with courage and talent. There are many in the heartland who believe Chairman Seidman deserves better than this. He has been a symbol of integrity and confidence in an arena where there has been precious little of either in the minds of a great many Americans!

Chairman Seidman took that office during our very toughest times. Agricultural and energy loan portfolios in our state's banks had declined over 50% in value, and banks were being forced to recapitalize heavily with their owners' resources to remain in business. Those of you in the northeast had not yet experienced a down economic cycle, but middle America was in very sad shape, and discouragement was at every hand. During Chairman Seidman's first week in office, he traveled to Topeka, and met with officials of the Kansas Bankers Association.

His message was one of hope and encouragement. He has always been tough, sometimes frightfully tough, but infinitely fair, always sensitive and frequently inspirational. His personal interest in our affairs inspired all of us to work harder and smarter, and to do a better job for the interests of our customers and our communities. We survived; only 54 banks out of total of 600 failed in the decade of the '80's; and many of our customers' farms and businesses were saved.

He was exactly the right man at the right time. He has performed a tremendous service to his country, and the economy of many communities is healthier and safer today because of his efforts. In our view, Gov. Sununu, he deserves better treatment.

Thank you for this opportunity. Please count on Kansas as strong supporters of the President and of you.

Dear Governor Sununu:

This concerns the privatization office of the Office of Management and Budget, which we understand may be eliminated. We wish to communicate to you in the strongest possible terms the importance of this office, and that the small business entrepreneurs in this industry need this office to get a proper hearing before government.

The commercial weather services industry is made up of firms which provide private weather forecasting services to business and government. Our number one problem as an industry has been competition from the government. But recently, we have been working closely with the OMB privatization office to have a federal policy statement on the roles of the private sector and the role of the government in the delivery of weather services. Following a mention in the President's FY 1991 Budget, this policy was drafted and published in the Federal Register at the beginning of this year. This policy represents a milestone in this industry's effort to lessen government competition.

Without the involvement of the OMB privatization office, the policy would never have been on the agenda of the administration. Without the office in the future, it is very unlikely that this policy will see final publication in the Federal Register.

Lastly, it is my understanding the Bush administration wishes to stand up for the entrepreneur. Having observed Washington policymaking for 6 years, I can assure you that elimination of the OMB privatization office would violate this policy objective.

I am writing regarding the confusion associated with the space allocated to the Commission on Minority Business Development.

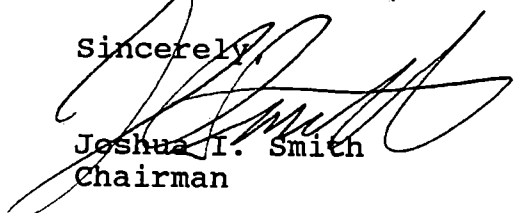

Since our formation, we have been housed at 730 Jackson Place, a site which, by the way, has received wide attention and considerable respect within the various minority communities.

Several weeks ago we were advised by GSA that we would need to move. I have since met with Paul Bateman of your White House staff, advising him of the negative message that is sent forth to minorities if we are now moved to another location.

Quite frankly, the Jackson Place offices are less than ideal for a variety of reasons, and I am certain some of the staff would be happy to be in a more modern office building. Nonetheless, I feel very strongly that we should remain at Jackson Place for reasons of perception. The perception that the Bush Administration truly cares about the advancement of minority business is being steadily enhanced, and I strongly urge we not make any hasty decisions which would lessen that perception.

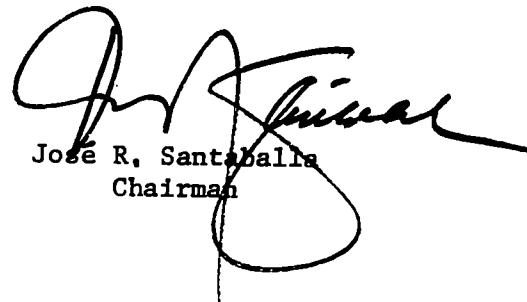

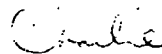

Dear Governor Sununu:

I am writing to you on behalf of the National Equal Employment Coalition (NEEC), a group representing a cross-section of Fortune 100 and smaller employers actively concerned about the devastating impact this proposed legislation will have and the cost it will add to doing business, as well as the interference in the fundamental fairness in administering forward looking, nondiscriminatory employment and human resources programs.

I presented testimony in the House Education and Labor Committee, and together with Rick Berman of Berman and Co. am actively participating in an effort supported by over 100 companies to explain Industry's position. I am the senior labor and employment partner at Abramson & Fox where, as part of my practice, on a daily basis, I represent both large and small employers in defending Title VII and other employment related lawsuits. In the past 18 years, when major labor and employment legislation was being considered in Washington, I have been active on behalf of my clients in assisting and coordinating Industry efforts.

This legislation is particularly troublesome and difficult for Industry because of our late start and because we are not in the normal position of negotiating about alternative approaches through the regular lobbying process. The last and only hope that we see in explaining our position so that we can participate in a fair resolution of this problem is the

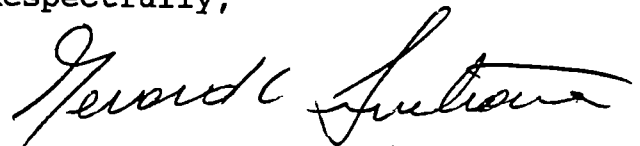
opportunity to meet with you and others in the Administration who are now working on a compromise bill.

The only time that I have been privileged to meet you was at a luncheon I attended at the Chicago Club on your visit to Chicago on behalf of President Bush. From that brief meeting, I believe you would find time from your extremely busy schedule to listen to a short, well structured presentation on alternative approaches that Industry can live with. I would propose that approximately six to eight Industry representatives, including Rick Berman and myself, meet with you and others in the Administration who are involved in the process of finding a solution. Pending your agreement to such a meeting, I have taken the liberty of specifically discussing such a meeting with David Shute, Vice President and General Counsel and Hymen Bear, Assistant General Counsel-Labor and Employment Law, of Sears Roebuck and Co. who are actively involved in the Steering Committee of the NEEC.

At such a meeting, we would be prepared to have a full and free discussion, bringing to the table persons knowledgeable in carrying forward policy in this area and in litigating the questions addressed in the legislation. We would propose substitute language that would curtail the increased remedies, make accommodations on the business justification defense, calling attention to the fact that many defenses by their nature are not job-related but rather based on justifiable economic requirements.

We look forward to an early meeting with you at your convenience and hope that you could arrange 45 minutes to one hour of your time.
