Dear Mr. Sununu:

The undersigned members of the Leadership Council of Aging Organizations (LCAO) support your efforts to address the federal deficit crisis. We trust that you will apply principles of equity and fairness as you determine the effects of program and expenditure cuts and the impacts of tax and revenue increases.

The LCAO is also aware that debates revolving around current summit discussions on the federal budget often refer to older persons assuming their "fair share" of the total burden of proposed solutions. In the light of the willingness of older persons to assume such a "fair share", the LCAO offers the following recommendations and observations:

- 1) Older persons recognize that federal revenues must be increased if we are to deal effectively with the deficit and with the pressing needs of communities and citizens across the nation. We believe that older persons are prepared to pay their "fair share" of increased revenues provided that the over-all burden is distributed in a progressive manner. For example, older persons support legislative action to close tax loopholes that continue to benefit those with high incomes, young or old.
- 2) We believe that older persons are prepared to give vigorous support to proposals for significant reductions in defense programs consistent with the major developments that have taken place in the field of international affairs.
- 3) Older persons, however, are not prepared to support arbitrary cuts in government service and benefit programs that have a major adverse impact on low and moderate-income persons of any age such as Medicaid, Medicare, Social Security, and other federal retirement programs. We oppose changes in Medicare that tend to increase costs which bear most heavily on lower income beneficiaries or which cut essential

services. We also oppose arbitrary reductions in such discretionary federal programs as employment and training, assisted housing, energy assistance, social services, the Older Americans Act, and older American volunteer programs. Older and other low income Americans have made substantial sacrifices over the last decade in the name of deficit reduction as a result of major cuts in such programs as Social Security, Medicare, Medicaid, assisted housing and energy, while SSI and AFDC programs remain abysmally low. The nation should not continue to try to solve its deficit problems at the expense of the poor and working people just getting by.

- 4) LCAO urges the prompt removal of the OASDI Social Security program from the Gramm-Rudman-Hollings deficit calculations. Social Security does not now nor has it ever belonged in the federal administrative budget. Its inclusion serves to mislead the public on the true state of the deficit. Continuation of such a policy seriously undermines public confidence in the fiscal integrity of the federal government, and in the future of the Social Security system. However, a decision to remove Social Security from Gramm-Rudman-Hollings must be accompanied by amendments to the deficit reduction requirements of the law which will protect those essential public services upon which all Americans, especially those of low and moderate income, depend.

In short, LCAO believes that the Budget Summit discussions present the nation with the opportunity to advance fiscal reform and to redress inequities at the same time. We support your work toward these goals.

Thank you for your consideration of these recommendations.

Dear John:

As New York's largest non-profit developer of affordable housing, the New York City Partnership depends on the Federal National Mortgage Association (FNMA) as our primary source of home mortgage financing. Therefore, we are greatly concerned that the federal government take no actions that might impact unfavorably on FNMA without opportunities for full public review and comment.

Specifically, we are writing to urge that issues associated with reform of Government Sponsored Enterprises, including FNMA, not be taken up under the pressure and in the closed context of the "Budget Summit". We understand the need to limit the government's potential liabilities in connection with GSE's. We do not believe that the budget negotiations are the appropriate forum for consideration and action on these critical matters.

In our experience, FNMA maintains strict mortgage credit and appraisal standards that bear no resemblance to the speculative and erratic criteria for extension of credit that brought down many thrift institutions. On the contrary, even in its Low and Moderate Income programs, FNMA applies exacting standards to mitigate against the likelihood of default.

At a time when the federal government is struggling to balance budget priorities, and funds for housing are likely to remain small in comparison to the need, we urge you not to tamper with our most significant source of capital to finance affordable housing.

We wish to bring to your attention our continuing concerns about the hardships being suffered by the fishing industry of the Gulf of Mexico and South Atlantic, brought about by the enforcement of the Turtle Excluder Device (TED) requirement upon the shrimping industry.

It is important to begin by stating that over the past months, the shrimping industry has attempted to properly utilize TEDs. Documented shrimp loss is a direct result of this effort. Additionally, the industry is faced with increasing fuel, insurance, and incidental costs.

We have received urgent requests from our fishermen, due to the economic infeasibility of TEDs, that alternatives be explored. The fishing community of the Gulf and South Atlantic has called upon its Congressional representatives to work with the President and the Department of Commerce to seek a more equitable method of sea turtle protection.

We believe we have a possible solution. A young fisherman from coastal Louisiana, experienced in shrimping in the Gulf, has designed and tested a Turtle Detection Device. We have researched the cost to the shrimper and the effectiveness of this device for protecting endangered sea turtles and we believe it has great promise. Therefore, we respectfully request that you expedite the research, testing, and approval of the Turtle Detection Device as an acceptable option under the TEDs regulations.

We suggest the following conditions:

1. Any shrimper who is using the Turtle Detection Device must

agree to pull up his nets within a reasonable time after the warning buoy has been activated.

2. If a turtle is caught in the trawl, the shrimper must tag the turtle, properly release it, and then report the release to the National Marine Fisheries Service.

3. If the shrimper violates these conditions, he would risk the losing his license to operate in the shrimp trawling industry for a suitable period of time.

We believe this plan will significantly enhance the compliance rates and assist in documenting the correlation between the shrimp trawling and endangered sea turtles. Shrimpers will pull this new device, whereas they resist current TED designs. Additionally, compliance can be as easily, perhaps more easily witnessed by the simple act of visual inspection. A buoy and its wake behind a shrimp boat are easily visible.

With the current regulations, the shrimping communities are beginning to see the stress and loss of livelihoods pay its toll on its families. Reports of broken families, separations, and even apparent suicides have occurred. We cannot allow this to continue when they repeatedly lose their shrimp with the TED and rarely, if ever, catch turtles. All these people want is to earn a living shrimping.

Also, in light of the severe hardships being suffered by the shrimping industry, we urge that you reconsider the imposition of criminal penalties for noncompliance of TEDs regulations. This would be a step in the right direction toward better cooperation between the Department and the industry.

The TEDs struggle has been difficult on the government and on the industry. These past months have proven that an alternative solution to TEDs is essential. We are encouraged with the promise of the Turtle Detection Device and hope that you accept this viable alternative.

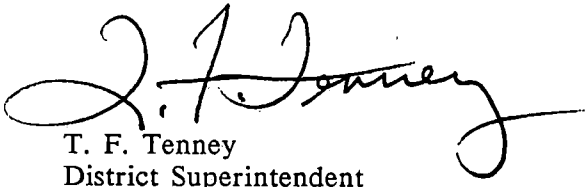

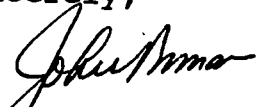

Dear Governor Sununu:

The attached letter to Dr. Mohamed Abdel-Wahab speaks for itself. Although many books have been written about the Mideast, none of them have brought about real understanding among Americans of the people there and their great culture. Thus the time for some brief and candid talk has come:

1. Although the oil-producing Arabian nations have the most money available, they have about the worst Public Relations program in this country of any country. Thus misinformation and ignorance about the Mideast is pandemic.
2. Except for the National Rifleman's Association, the Israelies have the most powerful lobby in the United States. It includes a nation-wide grass-roots organization that will defeat any candidate for office who does not vote their way: witness former Senator Percy, once considered presidential material.
3. The Israelies had to have and must continue to have a homeland. The fact that it now exists is a source of pride for Jews worldwide whether they visit the place or not. The same principle prevails also with the Palestinians. They also must have a homeland. There will be no peace in the area until they do. The line need not be drawn at the former Westbank border. A line 20 miles further in from the coast might well be negotiated.
4. The intransigence of the present Israelie government has alienated many Jews in this country and most likely in other countries, too. One of the worst by-products of this state of affairs is likely to be new waves of antisemitism world-wide. Such a horrible development we can well do without.
5. Other conditions prevail: Arabic is one of the great languages of the world. From the 5th Century A.D. on, it produced some of the world's greatest literature. Arabic is read and spoken by more people than many European languages including German, French, and Russian. In spite of this, almost no one in the United States can read it or write it or understand it. We know more about Latin and Greek than we do Arabic.

The Institute for Mideast Studies proposed should be considered a start to ameliorate these conditions. It should be considered a pilot project. Based on the experience at Maine, other such institutes should be established in all sections of the country. Perhaps in time, the American public will have an informed base to deal with the realities of the 21st century.

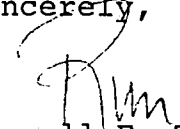

I am writing on behalf of the American Medical Association (AMA) to express our serious concerns about reductions and program changes presently under consideration by the Budget Summit.

We appreciate the arduous task you face in developing a responsible and workable budget compromise. Because this task is so difficult, we feel compelled to underscore facts you already know: medical care programs which serve the needy and elderly are severely strained. Vital public health programs which provide vaccinations and other preventive health services as well as crucial biomedical research efforts are at risk. Further cuts can only serve to disrupt access to care and demonstrate a lack of understanding of the basic promises of the Medicare and Medicaid programs.

In particular, the Medicare program has been especially hard hit over the last decade, having contributed proportionately more than any other program to deficit reduction. Access to care is already jeopardized. The very real health care needs of all Americans are at stake.

Just seven months ago, Congress passed far-reaching reforms that as enacted will fundamentally change the nature of physician payment practices. These landmark physician payment reforms include a resource-based relative value scale (RBRVS), the basis for a new payment schedule. OBRA 1989 also contained Medicare volume performance standards (MVPS) which for the first time will allow Congress and the profession to monitor the volume of physician services provided to beneficiaries. The adoption of these reforms argue against further reductions and significant changes in the payment system. Congress intended the RBRVS to be implemented in a budget-neutral manner and will take effect in 1992. The RBRVS is designed to rationalize reimbursement inequities across the country.

Despite the magnitude of the OBRA-89 physician payment reforms, the Administration proposed an additional \$2.2 billion in Part B cuts immediately after enactment. These and other cuts would undermine RBRVS before the methodology is even implemented.

In addition, the AMA must protest the Administration's most recent proposals including those that would (1) apply Medicare payment rates to the Federal Employee Health Benefits Plan; (2) establish a \$1 charge for processing of non-electronic claims; (3) reduce the ESRD payment rate by \$10 and reduce the intraocular lens payment to \$100; and (4) adopt Medicare Prescription Drug Formularies. It is our understanding that Members of the Summit have already spoken out against the arbitrary and unfair nature of the proposed cuts for ESRD and intraocular lenses. As you are also aware, AMA has already expressed its objection to the proposal on Medicaid formularies. We do feel compelled, however, to express our additional concerns about the first two proposals:

APPLYING MEDICARE PAYMENT RATES TO THE FEHBP PROGRAM

Medicare currently reimburses physicians at less than 65% of their typical charge level. To further extend these absolute price controls to yet another system is unjust and unwarranted.

ONE DOLLAR FEE ON PHYSICIANS FOR PROCESSING NON-ELECTRONIC CLAIMS

Congress recently mandated that physicians file all Medicare claims. This new fee proposal could tax them for complying with the law and providing a beneficiary service. It is our understanding that HCFA currently lacks the capability to fully implement the alternative of electronic billing; therefore, this provision amounts to nothing more than a tool designed to tax and harass physicians.

We hope that there can be greater consultation on the development of budget savings options. While we believe that some of the proposals under consideration will have a negative impact on patients if enacted, we are willing to work with you to develop necessary, proportional and effective budget reductions.

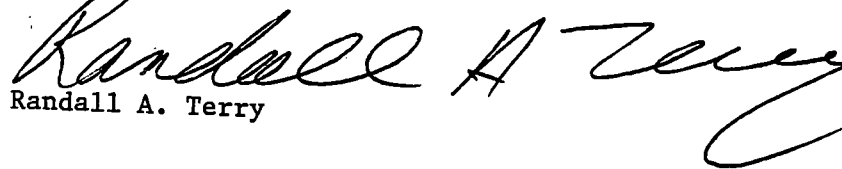

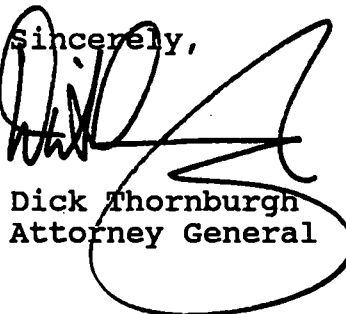

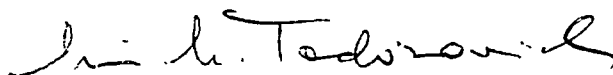

I regret that a scheduling conflict will preclude my attending the meeting scheduled for today with you at The White House to discuss the implications of an energy tax as part of the deficit reduction talks. I did want to take this opportunity to convey some of my thoughts and concerns regarding this issue.

We all recognize the critical problem the federal deficit presents and the need to take action. There has been some discussion of an increase in the per gallon motor fuel tax for the purpose of deficit reduction. I do not believe this is acceptable national policy and would be opposed to such an action.

Just as there is a federal deficit problem, there is also a transportation infrastructure deficit problem we must face. There are overwhelming transportation infrastructure needs both at the national level and here in Wisconsin. A federal cents per gallon tax increase for deficit reduction will make it very difficult to raise transportation user taxes urgently needed to meet these infrastructure needs and to maintain our national competitiveness in a world economy.

If an energy-related tax is indispensable to a workable deficit reduction agreement, I believe it is critical that a federal commitment to an improved transportation infrastructure be made at the same time. This should begin with a phased spend down of the balances in the highway trust fund.

Any energy tax should be crafted to reach across all forms of energy and must strictly avoid a cents per gallon increase in the motor fuel tax. This specific mechanism should be preserved for dedicated federal and state transportation funding.

I must also emphasize the essential requirement that any long term transportation plan should restructure the federal transportation program to meet the challenges of coming decades

-- as recommended by AASHTO and The National Transportation policy and distribute federal funds on an equitable basis, avoiding any continuation of the "donor" status Wisconsin and some other states have faced for the last three decades.

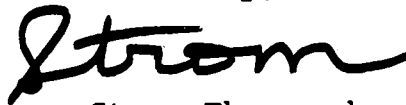

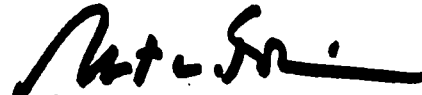
I am writing to urge you, as a participant in the budget summit, to fight against cuts in federal employee programs. I know that an appealing solution to the current budget deficit crisis is to make all sectors of society bear an equal share of the deficit reduction burden. But all sectors of society didn't share equally in causing the current deficit. For example, since 1981, while the wealthiest Americans were seeing their federal income tax rates reduced from 70% to 28%, federal employee pay and benefits have been cut by \$119 billion. Reductions in scheduled federal employee pay increases alone come to \$74 billion. (I've attached the GAO study that details these cuts.) The pay gap between federal employees and the private sector has risen to almost 30% and is causing major recruitment and retention problems according to Paul Volcker's Commission on the Public Service.

The House Budget Resolution calls for a pay raise for federal workers of 4.1% effective January 1st, 1991. We urge you to support that amount in the budget summit. Also, House and Senate Committees are working to complete comprehensive pay reform legislation this session. We hope that the summit will not tie the hands of those in Congress and the Administration who are working so hard to find a solution to this difficult issue.

In addition to pay, federal employees are concerned about skyrocketing health insurance premiums, the lump sum retirement option and the retiree Cost of Living Adjustments. As the GAO study shows, all of these programs have been cut over the last 9 years. It is time to look elsewhere for savings.

The people of this country count on federal employees to do their jobs every day. I hope federal workers and retirees can count on you to do the right thing and protect their pay and benefits in the budget summit.

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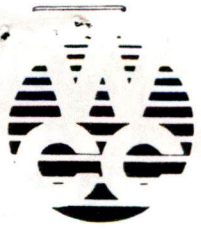

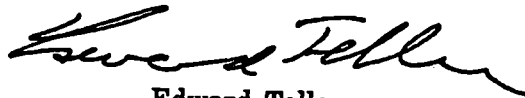

It was a pleasure to have dinner with you here in Wilmington, and talk about the proposed sale of Hercules' Semi-Gas Systems subsidiary to Matheson Gas Products, Inc. The Committee on Foreign Investments in the United States (CFIUS) will conclude its review of this transaction by July 13, and will then submit a report to President Bush for his review and approval. You will recall that Matheson is a subsidiary of Nippon Sanso, a corporation based in Japan. I am writing to provide you with some additional details about this transaction.

John, we believe that the Administration should approve this transaction, not only because it will be good for the U.S. semiconductor manufacturing industry, and for the companies involved, but also in light of the recently-concluded Structural Impediments Initiative (SII) with Japan. This transaction will provide the Administration with a timely and possibly unique opportunity to demonstrate its commitment to its new trading relationship with Japan, and to the Administration's long-standing open investment policy.

From what I understand, in the report of the SII working group, the United States specifically confirmed its continuing commitment to an open and non-discriminatory policy regarding foreign investment in the United States. With Nippon Sanso's support, Matheson intends to maintain the R&D and manufacturing operations of Semi-Gas in the United States and invest funds in these operations in order to upgrade and expand them. Further, Matheson's acquisition of Semi-Gas is expected to result in a net inflow of technology from Japan to the U.S., strengthening Semi-Gas as a supplier to the U.S. semiconductor

industry, and strengthening U.S. competitiveness. This is exactly the kind of foreign investment that the U.S. open investment policy is designed to promote. A prompt approval of this transaction would thus demonstrate the commitment of the United States to this policy and the on-going SII process.

As I explained when we talked, this is not a transaction that threatens U.S. national security in any way. Semi-Gas makes no direct sales to the U.S. military, and it has no access to any classified data or technologies. Rather, Semi-Gas is a supplier of products and services to the U.S. semiconductor manufacturing industry, including Sematech.

Further, this transaction will not compromise Sematech's operations in any way. A Confidential Information Agreement exists between Semi-Gas and Sematech which precludes the disclosure of Sematech proprietary information to third parties, including Matheson and Nippon Sanso, if Matheson completes its acquisition of Semi-Gas. Further, Matheson has made a specific proposal for a structural means to shield Semi-Gas employees from any commercially sensitive information that Sematech wants to protect. Finally, if Sematech chooses not to continue its relationship with Semi-Gas following the transaction, Sematech has alternative suppliers for each of the products and services supplied by Semi-Gas.

John, I know you are not directly involved with the President's review of foreign acquisitions in the United States, but I wanted you to have these thoughts, and the attached fact sheet, for your background. One of our board members, Stu Eizenstat, has been in touch with Roger Porter, and Stu and our CEO, Dave Hollingsworth, have scheduled a meeting with Boyden Gray.

Again, we believe that this transaction does not threaten U.S. national security, and that it should be approved by CFIUS and the President, not only to strengthen Semi-Gas as a supplier to U.S. industry, but also to demonstrate the Administration's

The National Council on the Aging urges you to reject any components of a deficit reduction plan which would seriously damage the delivery of pharmaceutical services to Medicaid beneficiaries. We believe that inclusion of the Office of Management and Budget June 20 proposal on Medicaid pharmaceutical purchasing and dispensing would cause such damage. The savings under the OMB proposal would be at the cost of good health care for the nation's poor.

Three aspects of the OMB plan disturb us. First, OMB calls for the designation of the "preferred drug" to be dispensed under Medicaid based solely on the factor of price. We believe that such additional factors as quality, and patient and case mix should be considered when designating the "preferred drug" within a class of drugs. We agree with those who have analyzed the generic drug scandals that cheapest is not always best.

Second, OMB would allow pharmacists to substitute a preferred drug for a drug prescribed by a physician when the physician does not specifically indicate that a brand product is medically necessary. This kind of therapeutic substitution can be dangerous and can result in inappropriate treatment. We prefer the safeguards contained in Senator Pryor's bill, S 2605, the Pharmaceutical Access and Prudent Purchasing Act of 1990 (PAPPA) which would require, in all cases, specific physician approval for all substitutions.

Lastly, OMB would use savings from discounted Medicaid drug purchases by the states solely for deficit reduction purposes. NCOA believes that mandating cost savings through multi-state drug buying groups or negotiating for Medicaid discounts from drug manufacturers makes good sense. However, instead of using some of the savings to restore some badly needed drug benefits lost through recent cutbacks as S.2605 would require, OMB would continue current restrictive Medicaid patterns. This could result in further cost-shifting to other medical expenditures such as hospitalizations and additional office visits for the lack of effective drug therapies.

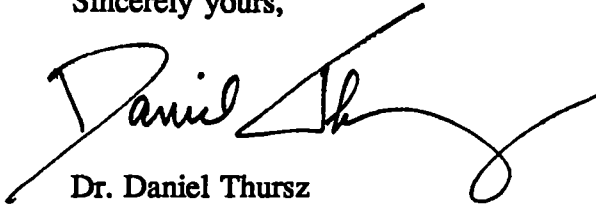

In short, the OMB "Entitlement Savings" proposal on Medicaid pharmaceuticals makes poor public policy and should be rejected. Instead, we urge consideration of Senator Pryor's PAPPA bill, S.2605, which addresses the same set of financial and treatment issues in a far more responsible manner. You and your colleagues engaged in the budget summit can be assured of wide political and moral support if your final agreement balances savings with social justice and good sense.

Dear Governor Sununu:

Since you don't know me let me tell you briefly that I work for Jack Stephens as manager of the Equity Division of Stephens Inc. The other item of note on my resume is that last year I was the Chairman of the Board of the National Association of Securities Dealers (NASD). While I hope the foregoing at least separates me from most of the nuts who write the White House, neither position really qualifies me to speak on the subject matter of this letter.

I am writing to propose an idea that might conceivably help solve the fiscal dilemma in which we Americans find ourselves today. I am of course referring to the Federal budget deficit. Our common sense is telling us that we can't keep borrowing these enormous sums indefinitely. If we try, the government will begin to lose its creditworthiness as investors around the world conclude that there is no way our citizens can repay these loans without resorting to the printing press. That would mean inflation. The expectation of inflation will cause lenders to demand higher interest rates. Higher interest rates will guarantee an economic slump. Another alternative is default. The government could just refuse to pay back the lenders in whole or in part. If that idea ever caught on, lenders would immediately demand higher rates to compensate them for that risk. Either way we lose.

That leads us to where we are heading today--toward higher taxes to head off the problem before it reaches true crisis proportions. The Catch-22 is that higher taxes will reduce aggregate spending just at a time when the economy is already showing many signs of exhaustion. Besides, Congress will be sorely pressed to reach a conclusion as to whose taxes should be raised. The political risks are obvious. Maybe this is the time for a radically new idea.

With aid of technological advances that have come about in recent years, it has become possible to conduct our personal and professional business without the use of cash money through the use of credit cards, debit cards, wire transfers and checks. Reflect for a moment on the possibilities that would surface if we could make the move to a cashless society:

1. The government could then tax transactions rather than income. Every depository institution could be instructed to deduct a small percentage (1% would do it) of every deposit and send it to government. The income tax would be abolished. The Internal Revenue Service could be virtually eliminated. The small amount of the tax would make the risk of evasion not worth the reward. The only way to avoid the tax would be through barter which is too difficult to arrange for most transactions.

2. As most Americans are aware, there is a huge volume of business being transacted in cash to avoid detection from law enforcement officials or tax collectors. Stolen merchandise is fenced for cash; political bribes are paid in cash; drug traffickers are paid in cash; cash purchases are pocketed by dishonest store owners and employees and not reported as sales; and millions of small jobs are paid for in cash and never reported as income. The cost to society of all of this illicit activity is staggering both in dollar terms of the tax revenue lost and in the effect on the lives of people who must live with the crime and corruption it finances. Without cash the underground economy would be forced to the surface to pay its fair share.

3. Law enforcement would be handed its greatest tool ever as a paper trail would be created by almost every transaction. Fugitives from justice would find achieving anonymity nearly impossible thus exerting a strong deterrent to many types of crime. Illegal immigrants would find it extremely difficult to melt into our society thus allowing the country to regain control of its boundaries without expensive enforcement procedures.

I don't mean to down play the difficulties that such a change would cause. There would be opposition from civil libertarians who would see this as a reduction of our personal freedom. There would be the problem of the underclass for whom this would pose a new complexity with which they might be unable to cope. Taxes would now be collected on previously tax exempt activities such as pension fund transactions. Foreign tourists would have to be able to gain temporary access to the system. Vending machines might have to be redesigned to accept credit or debit cards.

Despite all of the foregoing, I find the concept is intriguing enough to think about. If it succeeded, the benefits would be substantial.

Ideally, in the aggregate, most citizens would find this system close to revenue neutral. The revenue increases mainly would come from taxing the underground economy and from taxing previously tax exempt activities such as pension funds. Reduced government spendings would result from the savings of money now spent to operate the current tax system. In this way we would avoid most of the reduction in economic activity that is likely with an income tax increase.

Thank you for letting me share my thoughts with you. If you have any other little problems you need some help with, just give me a call.

Congratulations on the fine job the Bush team is doing up there.

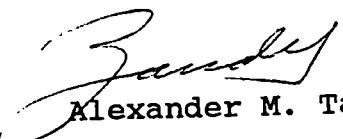

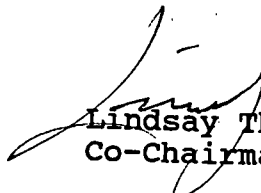

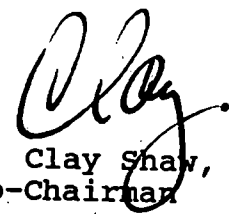

If you have not had an opportunity to read the attached article please try to do so, as I suspect that it may serve as a blueprint for the Democrats this fall and for the 1992 Presidential campaign. Particularly if the economy continues to slow down.

Ironically, the author, Kevin Phillips, is identified as a Republican conservative, although his support for the candidacy of George Bush was non-existent and, in fact, hostile. As a result of his party affiliation, you will see quotations from this article in future columns, editorials, Congressional Record inserts and campaign attacks by the Democrats.

It would be wise to have an economic rebuttal to this for future reference, as it contains a number of incorrect assumptions and flat mis-statements. For example, it claims that Reagan/Republican policies that stimulate high interest rates benefit the rich. It was the Republicans who reduced the prime in 1981 from 21.5% to its current 10%. It was the Republican tax cuts of 1986 which totally eliminated 15 million low income wage earners from the tax rolls altogether. It was a Republican Administration that reduced inflation from 13% to the steady 4% over recent years.

Despite these points and others, the Phillips article contains some excellent political ammunition -- the references to Wall Street investors and their incomes, to the corporate heads and their ratio of income to that of workers; the de-regulation policies that lead to the abuses of the savings and loan industry; the efforts to further reduce capitol gains taxes while at the same time fighting minimum wage increases all contain the arguments necessary for what Lee Atwater calls, "Economic class warfare." Lee is correct in his assertion that the fall campaign of Michael Dukakis never got off the dime until he began to package the Republican economic proposals as Us vs Them as it applied to capitol gains.

More than a year ago I raised the point that those guilty of financial irregularity in creating the S&L crisis should be investigated and vigorously prosecuted. My appeal has greater urgency today and I can't understand why the Department of Justice has not moved aggressively in this area. And isn't it curious that the Senate Ethics Committee has chosen to investigate the alleged financial improprieties of Senator Durenburger, which cost the taxpayer nothing, while ignoring the activities of five U.S. Senators, four of whom are Democrats, in some of the biggest S&L problems facing the country.

I have it on good authority that Democrat strategists in the House and at the Democrat National Committee are exploring every possible avenue for a forum that will humiliate the Bush Administrations involvement in the S&L crisis.

Two suggestions have come forth:

A Joint Congressional Investigating Committee, along the lines of the Iran Contra Committee, and a call for the establishment of a Special Prosecutor to investigate the causes of and those who are responsible for the S&L mess.

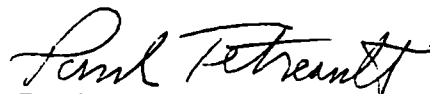
