I am writing on behalf of the Association of American Publishers to protest budget proposals which would have the effect of levying upon the U.S. Postal Service up to \$1.7 billion in additional costs as a contribution to deficit reduction.

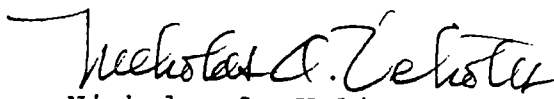
The Association of American Publishers (AAP) is the principal trade organization representing book and journal publishers in the United States. AAP members have a direct stake in the maintenance of an efficient and affordable U.S. postal system because they use all classes of mail extensively as a means of marketing their products and servicing their customers. In addition, many publishers rely on the postal system as their primary mechanism for product distribution and delivery.

To burden USPS with additional costs to help deficit reduction would be contrary to the letter and the spirit of last year's legislation which removed the Postal Service from the budget. In addition, it violates the principles of the Postal Reorganization Act, the purpose of which was to take politics out of the Postal Service by permitting it to function as a quasi-independent, corporate entity.

Postal rate payers were subject to a general 17 percent increase in 1988. A possible 24 percent increase in 1991 is expected, which would mean an over 40 percent rise in somewhat less than three years, vastly exceeding the rate of inflation. If the Postal Service were required to absorb up to \$1.7 billion in deficit reduction costs, this would unfairly burden mailers with even higher, unreasonable costs.

We wish to associate ourselves with the Mailers Council -- composed of nearly 50 corporations and trade associations from across the spectrum of mail users -- in strongly urging rejection of proposals to use the U.S. Postal Service for reduction of the federal deficit.

Dear John:

I am writing this letter at the request of Francis Vicino, President of Hi-Way Concrete Co., Inc. located in Wareham, Mass.. It is a brief account of the difficulties encountered in securing a wetland permit for the expansion of Hi-Way Concrete's operating facilities from The U.S. Corps of Engineers.

Francis contacted me in February of 1989 and asked if I would consider working for him to help resolve on going problems securing the corps permit. I reviewed Francis's records and came to the conclusion that it would be a difficult project and I would undertake it only if I could work just for expenses. My reasons were that Hi-Way Concrete had been so thoroughly abused by E.P.A. and had incurred such excessive costs that I would be glad to help.

The factors which caused major problems were as follows:

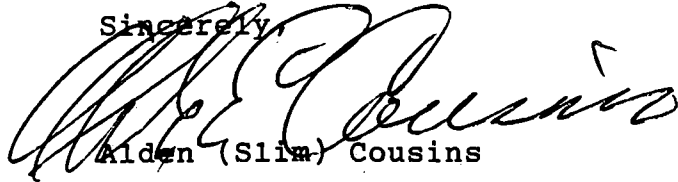
1. E.P.A.'s inability to agree with any of the previous consultants wetland delineations.
2. The restoration of areas subjected to the Corps' jurisdiction .
3. The species and size of the plant material used and to be used.

In the first case, E.P.A. visited the site on at least four occasions and each time changed the line. Secondly, further restoration was subject to the acceptance of the wetland delineation line. Thirdly, the plant material already planted as required were not suited for the site and were extremely expensive, \$44,315.00.

In my opinion, more damage was done to the wetland area by E.P.A.'s site restoration requirements than leaving it alone and letting natural seeding and sprouting provide vegetative cover.

In conclusion, it is most unfortunate that on such a small site that a small family business which was making every effort to comply with all agencies, should be subjected to such excessive costs and labeled as a major violator in the media. I am a retired Commonwealth of Mass. Department of Environmental Management employee. During my 30 year governmental services I administered the Mass. Wetland Acts statewide for 5 years. In that time working with the Corps of Engineers Mass. Division of Waterways, I had never seen a case to equal Hi-Way Concrete's.

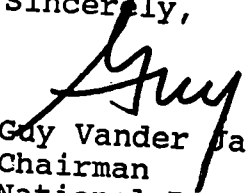

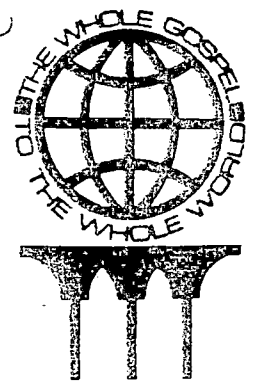
Dear Mr. Sununu:

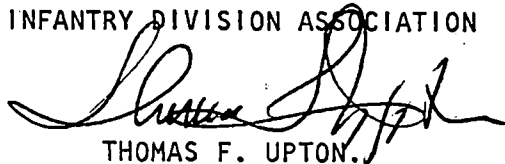

Dear Chief of Staff Sununu:

I would like to bring to your attention an important measure which is under consideration through the Administration Budget Summit Proposal.

The Administration has proposed a program of controls for drug products under the Medicaid program which will substantially lower the quality of care to patients under the Medicaid program.

Under the budget proposal, pharmacists would be required to substitute the "preferred" (i.e. lowest price) drug in each "therapeutic class" unless the physician overrode the substitution by writing a phrase such as "brand name medically necessary" on each prescription. There are no provisions to inform physicians of the nature of the substitution made nor is there any opportunity for a physician to override the substitution made in accordance with the national formulary. However, there are no provision for similar protection for physicians.

This proposal is highly complex and would, if adopted in its current form, severely lower the quality of care to the nation's needy population. Issues of substitution, of changing a physician's written treatment order for an individual patient, are too important to be dealt with in the context of a government wide budget summit. The medical society urges you to encourage the Administration to work with all interested parties to reach a fair and equitable solution to Medicaid drug pricing concerns, without trying to regulate therapeutic decisions for individual patients.
