Dear Governor:

We have just learned that the Democrats did not include the Stenholm "wee tots" tax credit provision in the child care portion of the budget package. Instead, we have been informed that the bill contains a flat-sum add-on to the standard deduction for families with a child under age 1.

In addition, we have been told that this provision does not contain a "no double dip" clause which specifies that taxpayers will be eligible for this credit only if they do not claim the Dependent Care Tax Credit (DCTC) or the Employer-Provided Dependent Care Assistance Plan (DCAPs). If this is true, this provision would be counter-productive.

I have enclosed "no double dip" language from the Holloway-Schulze Bill. This language is similar to that included in the Stenholm bill and the President's bill. Unless this language is inserted into the bill, this standard deduction provision does more harm than good.

Please see to it that this clause is inserted in the bill language. It would be better to have no provision at all than a provision without a "no double dip" clause.

P.S. I noticed the "tax on children" is still in dispute. How about offering a trade: a cap on the DCTC/DCAPs (like that found in the Stenholm and Downey child care bills) in exchange for lifting the cap on the personal and dependent exemption? Absent such a deal, the only way we see to correct this problem is through a higher top tax rate.

Dear Governor:

I know you have far more important subjects at hand this week but I wanted to let you know that Hernando de Soto, the Peruvian economist who has so excited conservatives concerned with foreign aid and Third World development, will be in the United States October 31-November 7.

De Soto called me to raise the possibility of meeting with the President during his upcoming trip to the States. The President would, I believe, very much enjoy meeting him (as would you) and it would serve as a positive reinforcement to the work his Institute for Liberty & Democracy is doing in spurring private sector entrepreneurship in the Third World. As you know, his work in this area has been enthusiastically praised by the Heritage Foundation, AEI and many others in the field. You may recall that tentative arrangements had been made for de Soto to meet with the President last spring. That was before the Peruvian elections however, and the meeting was cancelled so as not to have the President appear to be taking sides in the election. (Over the past year, I have been doing a good deal of work to assist de Soto in Third World deregulation.)

If there is an opening between October 31-November 7 for me to bring de Soto in, please let me know.

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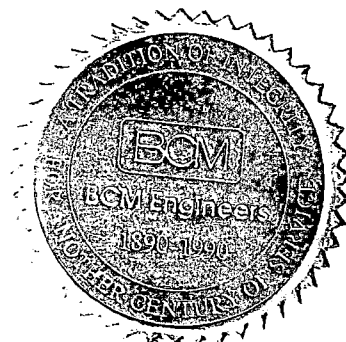

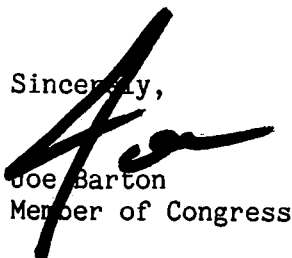

I am writing to alert you to a very serious problem in the language of the Child Care Block Grant currently being negotiated which has just been brought to my attention.

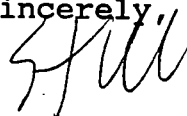
The Child Care and Development Block Grant has been divided into two parts. 25% may be used by the states for a variety of activities, and the remaining 75% is intended to be used to provide child care services which I had understood to include a mandatory voucher. The provision for a mandatory voucher program was a major conservative victory.

Sec. 658E.(c)(3) makes vouchers optional by allowing states to use 75% of the child care block grant funds either for child care services (which must be voucherized) or for "activities designed to improve the availability and quality of child care." The states are therefore free to use the entire 75% for new regulations, research, and infrastructure. Note that Sec. 658E.(c)(2) provides that parents have the option to receive a child care certificate if the child "receives or is offered child care services for which financial assistance is provided under this subchapter." If the state does not provide child care services with that 75%, no vouchers need be provided.

I believe that all parties have agreed that 75% of the block grant will be completely voucherized. I urge you to insist that the conferees ensure the bill actually accomplished the intent. I recommend the conferees either delete the provision allowing the States to fund "activities designed to improve the availability and quality of child care" or have the provision incorporated into the allowable activities under the 25% already devoted to similar activities in Sec. 658E.(3)(C).

I appreciate your assistance on this matter and look forward to working with you.

We want to alert you to our deep and growing concern about the rapidly deteriorating situation with respect to the child care provisions in the budget reconciliation bill now in House-Senate conference.

Throughout the 101st Congress, we have enjoyed our close working relationship with you in the pursuit of a child care bill that does not discriminate against traditional families and that puts resources into the hands of parents, not bureaucracies, to make decisions crucial to the well-being of their children. While we, like the President, have always preferred that child care benefits be distributed through non-discriminatory tax credits, we have been prepared to accept, as part of a tax-based package, a program of child care grants that would guarantee to parents access to vouchers usable in family and church-based day care settings. At last week's meeting with you at the White House, we were given encouragement to believe that the Administration-Senate Leadership child care package represented just such a program, with 75% of appropriated funds under the Child Care and Development Block Grant Act of 1990 dedicated to a completely voucherized system of child care benefits for families.

We have now had an opportunity to examine the language of the Senate Report that describes this program in detail. The long and short of it is that the grant program it describes is a break-through not for parental choice but for a massive Federal investment in day care infrastructure. Not one parent is assured of seeing a single dime of Federal pass-through support for the child care arrangement of their choice. In fact, we believe that the structure of the new grant program created by H.R. 5835, taken together with existing State and Federal child care authorities, contains positive inducements that will ensure that this money would be rarely, if ever, used for vouchers.

The report language states that the purpose of the block grant is "to increase the availability, affordability, and quality of child care" throughout the nation. While a state "may use 75% of block grant funds for direct assistance to parents for child care services and to increase the supply and to improve the quality of child care," there is no provision specifying any percentage set-

aside for such direct assistance. The report says only that the States "may use some portion of these funds" for an 11-point list of activities (other unspecified activities are also permitted) to increase the supply of child care services, including: grants and loans to providers; grants and loans to assist providers in meeting state and local standards; assistance for the temporary care of sick children; assistance for comprehensive, full-site, all-day child care demonstration projects in schools for children age 3-5; and so forth. We find no language barring the use of funds for creation of new state child care advisory bodies or regulatory agencies or guidelines.

In brief, the Child Care and Development Block Grant Act of 1990 provides no guarantee of delivery of voucherized child care services. It does, however, create an opening for funding of any and all of the uses of Federal funds envisioned in the original Act for Better Child Care. Moreover, we believe that the availability of these new funds for administrative, regulatory, and infra-structural activities will operate in most States as an inducement to pay for these projects with the new block grant and to provide actual services through such mechanisms as SSBG Title XX, which are subject to no mandates regarding the availability of vouchers or their use in religious day care settings.

Adoption of the Child Care and Development Block Grant Act of 1990 would amount to a massive wager of funds (\$925 million in FY 93) in a child care shell game in which parental choice will seldom be the winner. This is, needless to say, completely unacceptable to us. We are convinced that few members of Congress understood, nor perhaps the negotiators themselves, how damaging this report language is to the child care principles the Administration and its supporters have repeatedly articulated. Child care grantsmanship is per se violative of the second leg of the President's quartet of principles: that child care programs should not, as you wrote in May 1989, "discriminate against two parent families in which one parent stays home to care for the children;" to this per se violation is now added a violation of the third leg which requires child care programs to increase parental options.

This bill is clearly designed to provide a competitive advantage to large licensed daycare centers (which now serve less than 10 percent of preschool children). The bill would discriminate not only against mothers who care for their own children, but also against mothers who use family in-home daycare, who use informal legal-but-unlicensed daycare, and who use religious daycare. Informal, unlicensed, or religious daycare is preferred by the majority of employed mothers, and the proposed legislation makes it next to impossible for these types to receive funding. Driving informal daycare providers out of business will only increase the

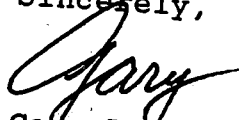

most of licensed daycare and make millions of parents -- and children -- unhappy.

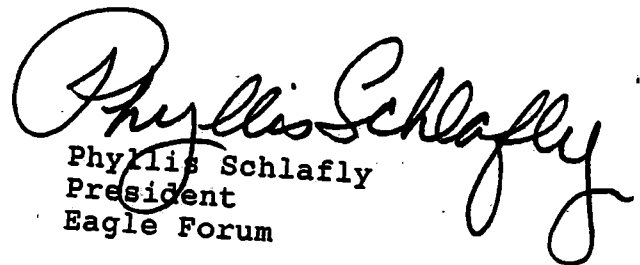
Finally, let us mention our sore disappointment that White House negotiators have reportedly agreed to give \$10 million to the National Board for Professional Teaching Standards. This money will ultimately deliver control of teacher certification all across America into the hands of the two largest teachers' unions, who dominate the Board. There is little question but that the Board's recommendations will be hostile to educational choice (including the decision to home school), to merit pay and alternative certification concepts, and to overall parental prerogatives in the rearing of children. The anti-parent agenda of the National Education Association was reaffirmed this past summer in Kansas City (See the enclosed article), and we are vehemently opposed to Federal funding of this agenda at a time when parents are crying out for genuine reform.

Realizing how weighty is the burden you carry as the last days of this Congress unfold, we urge you nonetheless to act as forcefully as you can to reassert the President's principles in child care and education and avert total embarrassment when the public discovers that the current provisions in the budget reconciliation bill are even more anti-mother, anti-religious, and anti-parental choice than the original ABC Dodd-Kildee-Hawkins bill.

Since I last corresponded with you, developments in the budget negotiations have made a compromise on child care tax credits possible.

If, as it now appears likely, there will be a young child supplement to the Earned Income Tax Credit (for children under age 5), then we would remove our objections to a partially-refundable Dependent Care Tax Credit (DCTC) provided a clause is inserted stipulating that a taxpayer cannot claim both the new Young Child Credit and the newly-refundable DCTC. This "no double dip" stipulation, which was included in the President's original child care proposal, would have the effect of increasing the "wee tots" credit to include children up to age five.

Such a compromise would bring the tax provisions of the child care bill into full conformity with the President's bill, something neither we nor Senator Packwood should find objectionable. This would also reduce not increase the overall cost of the child care tax provisions, allowing you to either pocket the savings or put additional dollars towards the EITC.

If such a move were successful, we would enthusiastically back the child care portions of the bill -- especially if the bill also included a cap on the DCTC and on DCAPs. Moreover, we would not publicly criticize any overall budget package that included this child care tax compromise.

We hope you will pursue such a compromise with Senator Packwood. Our constituents will be extremely pleased if you are successful.

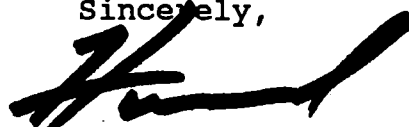

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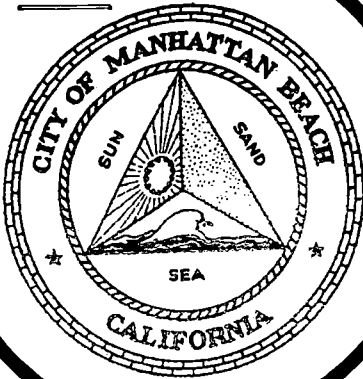

The Rotary International program for last year was titled "Polio-Plus." Over \$240 million was raised worldwide for the campaign to eliminate polio and other diseases in foreign countries by means of vaccine inoculation. Estimates are that 529 million children will be immunized. Already 225 million have received immunization from crippling diseases. President Bush personally recognized Rotary International for its pioneering volunteer work in this area.

President Costa will be visiting the United States on several occasions in the early months and Spring of 1991. I have enclosed his schedule. Because President Bush has encouraged voluntarism and has a strong commitment to environmental protection and restoration, this occasion may be used to highlight the Rotary example. A certificate or plaque presentation may be useful to commemorate the event.

Dear Governor:

As you know, President Bush has pledged repeatedly to work for a child care bill that does not discriminate against families that care for their own children, including those with a full-time mother at home.

As an expression of that commitment, the President has proposed and supported legislation that: (1) creates a new tax credit designed especially for families that are not currently eligible for the Dependent Care Tax Credit; and (2) does not extend significantly greater benefits to day care users than to families that care for their own children.

While inclusion of the Stenholm Bill's \$500 million "wee tots" provision addresses this first concern, the current direction of the budget negotiations leads us to believe that the second concern is in serious jeopardy.

We believe it is useful to look at the overall child care package as having three types of provisions:

- 1) those that exclusively benefit families that care for their own children;
- 2) those that benefit all families equally;
- 3) those that exclusively benefit families that use day care.

At present, it appears likely that the child care agreement will include:

- 1) \$500 million over five years for families that care for their own children (wee tots);
- 2) \$11 billion over five years in provisions that are neutral (roughly \$8 billion for EITC expansion and \$3 billion for the Bentsen health credit);
- 3) \$11.5 billion over five years in programs for day care users (roughly \$5 billion in DCTC refundability, \$4.5 billion in the new block grant, \$2 billion in expansion of Title IV.)

Thus, if one assumes the \$11 billion of "neutral" benefits will be divided equally among day care users and non-users, the bill provides a total of \$6 billion in benefits to families that care for their own children and \$17 billion in benefits to day care users. This 1-3 benefit ratio represents an extraordinary retreat from the Stenholm package, which provided roughly \$4 in benefits to families that care for their own children for every \$5 in benefits to day care users.

To achieve the type of balance Stenholm offered, we believe the following changes are needed:

- 1) cap the DCTC and the DCAPs at \$70,000 (in accordance with the Downey and Stenholm bills) and put the \$1 billion in savings towards an expanded "wee tots";
- 2) prevent the refundability of the DCTC and put the \$5 billion in savings towards an expanded EITC or "wee tots";

Both the cap and the diversion of DCTC refundable funds to an expanded EITC should have the support of Downey, Rostenkowski and Bentsen. Moreover, the cap is a relatively painless way of making the overall budget package more progressive.

These changes, coupled with a rollback of Title 4 spending to Senate levels (\$300 million over 5 years), would produce a package with a net benefit ratio providing roughly \$4 in benefits to families that care for their own children to every \$5 in benefits to families that use day care.

In pursuing such a deal, we would urge you to be willing to trade off budget items outside the realm of the current child care negotiations and to be willing to strip the child care portions out of the budget bill if an acceptable agreement cannot be reached.

We do not fear the prospects of revisiting this issue again in the 102nd Congress. Indeed, we believe our position in fighting ABC-type legislation has been strengthened by spending constraints, recessionary pressures, the ongoing rift between the NEA and CDF factions, the recent endorsement of our child care principles by the Progressive Policy Institute, and growing public concern about the effects of day care on children (a 1990 Times-Mirror poll shows that 73 percent of all Americans believe "too many kids are being raised in day care today" -- up from 68 percent in 1987).

Governor, please continue to work for non-discrimination against families that care for their own children. We need and appreciate your help.

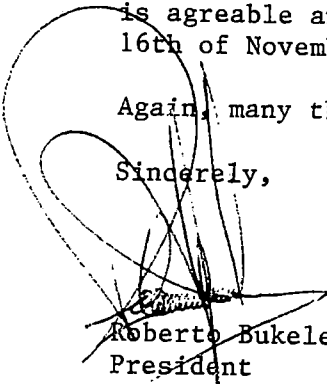

It is with great pleasure that I invite you to attend a very unusual evening at the Woodrow Wilson Center. The occasion, which will take place on November 13, 1990, will be an Evening Dialogue featuring a presentation by Rabbi Adin Steinsaltz. Rabbi Steinsaltz is a scholar who has had immense influence on modern Jewish studies, particularly in the Talmud; in this Dialogue he will speak on "Government, Power and Prophecy: Lessons of the Talmud for Our Time."

Rabbi Steinsaltz's most striking accomplishment is surely his translation into modern Hebrew, and commentary on, the Talmud. In carrying out this work, he has made this text, studied intensively during the past two millennia, accessible to a new and vastly enlarged audience of students and scholars. English translations and accompanying commentaries are being published in this country by Random House. Two volumes that came out last year were praised by critics and sold well beyond expectations; two more are about to appear, and further volumes are in press. An assessment of the English version of the Steinsaltz Edition, as well as a general discussion of the Talmud itself, are contained in the enclosed review from the Washington Post Book World that was written by Walter Reich, a Senior Scholar here at the Wilson Center.

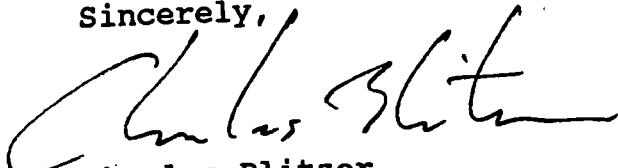
In addition to his work on the Talmud, Rabbi Steinsaltz has published books and articles on a wide variety of subjects. Recently he has devoted considerable energy to overseeing a number of projects in the Soviet Union, including the establishment, in cooperation with the Soviet Academy of Sciences, of the first center for Jewish learning in the Soviet Union since 1917, and the preparation of a Russian-language version of the Talmud.

The theme that Rabbi Steinsaltz will address on November 13th--"Government, Power, and Prophecy"--will be, I believe, of particular interest to the invited participants. Persons of diverse faiths and backgrounds are being invited. Despite their diversity, I expect that they will share a common interest in considering how the Talmud, an ancient text written under circumstances very different from ours, might illuminate our contemporary understanding of the challenges of justice, statecraft, and authority.

Evening Dialogues at the Woodrow Wilson Center are made possible by the generosity of the Xerox Foundation. This evening will begin at 6:00 p.m. with cocktails in the Center's Rotunda, on the third floor of the Smithsonian "Castle." Rabbi Steinsaltz's presentation will begin promptly at 6:30, followed by dinner and discussion. In the discussion, the participants will have an opportunity to engage Rabbi Steinsaltz in a dialogue on the theme of his presentation. I would not be surprised if, in true Talmudic fashion, both the talk and the dialogue veer into related, but no less illuminating, realms of discourse. I anticipate that the evening will end at about 9:30 p.m.

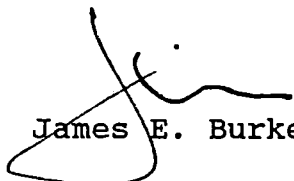

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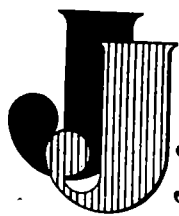

Dear Governor Sununu:

I am looking forward to hearing your remarks before the Economic Club of New York next Wednesday, especially, given the rapid pace of events in Washington and around the world! Your experiences in helping President Gorbachev design an effective presidency for the Soviet Union would surely be interesting.

I have also corresponded with Gorbachev's economic advisers, focusing, in particular, on my 1989 OP/ED in **The New York Times** on the advantages of a gradual return to a gold standard. Possibly you have seen this and other papers that I send to President Bush periodically.

Enclosed in the folio are several economic and strategy reports to bring you up to date. I should note, incidentally, that two of my quotes which appeared on the front page of **The Wall Street Journal** on Wednesday, October 10th presented the appearance of a more pessimistic view of the economy than I actually hold.

Last September I met with CEA Chairman Boskin to discuss the 1990 recession that had just been forecast by my Macro-Economic Index model which is discussed in the enclosures. However, while that recession forecast has proven accurate, I still feel that the probabilities favor this recession being a mild one, despite the concerns expressed in the article above.

After a recent meeting at the Federal Reserve, I came away with an enhanced conviction that a significant easing of monetary policy is imminent, most probably following resolution of the budget impasse (hopefully soon). This should be an important bulwark against the recessionary forces now in motion.

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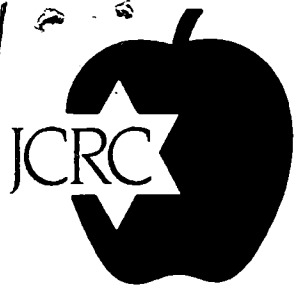

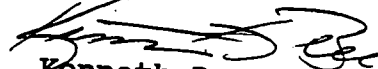
Now, your appearance on behalf of my candidacy is needed. Your leadership and national stature will make a critical difference in these final weeks of the campaign.

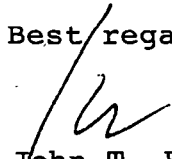

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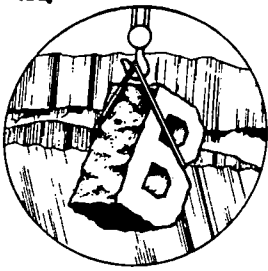

We are one of the two Granite companies left in the Granite State. We are bringing this to your attention, not expecting immediate reaction, but as a protest to what is a growing disregard to what is happening to small business in general.

We are enclosing associated material in order to help to you understand our position.

This matter is in regards to furnishing granite for the National Law Enforcement Memorial in Washington D.C.

In early May, we were very pleased to be informed that our "Kitledge Buff" granite was specified for the major portion of the granite requirements for the National Law Enforcement Memorial. In association with our representative in Washington, The Interstone Company, we prepared a proposal for the granite required. When the bids were opened, we were informed that the prices for all the granite were over the budget. We were asked to do value engineering and present suggestions to reduce the cost without affecting the aesthetics or general theme too greatly. After much work we furnished the architects with a proposal that reduced the price by approximately by one third without greatly affecting the general theme. The architect and owners appeared to be pleased with our proposal.

Since that time until early in September, continual discussions were made to fix the design and specifications. Finally, we were asked to quote on what they said was the final approved specs and design. We were surprised to see that aside a few minor changes most of the cost reduction items were restored, resulting in a cost of the project practically same as the original which was considered much too high for the budget.

The results of the bidding was that the Hyman Construction Company was low as general contractor and we were low for the required buff granite. We were pleased with the expectation participating in such a prestigious national project.

Early last week were notified that a Canadian marble, blue grey in color, produced by a Canadian firm was substituted in place of our New Hampshire buff colored granite which had been originally specified. We are protesting the unprofessional, unethical and inconsiderate manner in which this procedure was conducted.

We wrote to the architect (letter enclosed) and copied the owners and the general contractor for an explanation. We were told that the decision was final and that it was entirely due to the difference in costs. We find it hard to understand how months of effort should wiped out by such an abrupt reversal of the specified provisions.

We are continually faced with competition and the effort that is lost when we are unsuccessful but if done fairly we accept it as part of the territory. This was an unprofessional process, start to finish.

We respectfully, ask you to consider our reference to a situation concerning use of Canadian granite at the Canadian Embassy a few years ago. It seems to be a perpetual no win situation when faced with unfair competition.

We apologize for intruding on the intense demand on your time and attention during our current national problems. We hope the above series of events will in help in some, to assist the small business who are the backbone of this nation.

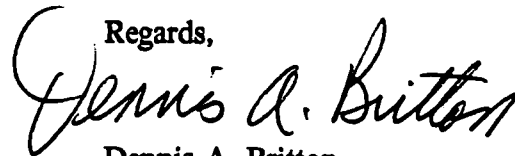

Dear Mr. Sununu:

During this week, you and your peers will, it is hoped, complete action on the deficit-reduction package. As individuals and as an organization, the members of the Institute of Transportation Engineers realize how important it is that this country come to grips with the deficit, and we also understand that it will be difficult to do so without affecting many programs and interest groups.

During your deliberations this week, we ask that you consider the implications of the specific action that is to be taken concerning the federal gasoline tax.

In recent years, this country has fallen behind in the investments necessary to provide and maintain the transportation system capacity needed to meet today's demand. Numerous studies indicate that the magnitude of investment required to meet today's transportation system needs warrants an increase in funding at all government levels -- federal, state, and local. Most states, however, depend heavily on a combination of federal and state gasoline taxes to finance their highway programs. The proposed increase in federal gasoline taxes will preclude many states from raising their gasoline taxes in the near term. The effects of such "lost" state taxes are likely to be further exacerbated by the provisions of the pending Clear Air Act, which would mandate the expanded usage of "blended" fuels and which would further reduce revenues to the Highway Trust Fund as a result of the federal gasoline tax exemption for gasohol.

Please consider your country's need for a safe, efficient, and environmentally compatible transportation system. If you see no recourse but to raise the federal gasoline tax to help reduce the deficit, then it is essential that all of the revenue collected from the proposed .10/gallon tax increase be deposited into the Highway Trust Fund. Doing so will ensure that these funds will be subsequently invested in transportation system improvements that will result in more jobs, increased productivity, and a more efficient transportation system.

We encourage you to take the decisive actions that are now necessary to address our country's federal budget and to maintain the United States' position as a leader in the global economy. Please remember that transportation plays a key role in our nation's international competitiveness.
