As I am sure you are well aware we, in the New Hampshire Coastal Area, are facing a real environmental crises triggered by the closing of the Pease Air Force Base. Problems surrounding the Air Force withdrawal have been mounting steadily during the past month peaking this past week with the long awaited release of the Bechtel Report.

Bechtel's plans for the future of New Hampshire's small and fragile coastline has our citizenry up in arms. Not since the Onassis threat of an oil refinery in Durham has there been such a public outcry.

I was a founder, a President for two years and secretary for four years of the organization - The Great Bay Estuarine System Conservation Trust. As a present member of the Board of Trustees I assure you we are doing everything in our power to inform our constituents and the general public of the inherent danger to the quality of life we value so highly throughout the state itself but in this case and ESPECIALLY the Seacoast Area.

The Trust's main focus is the designation of 1,100 acres over a mile of which fronts on both Great and Little Bays as a Wildlife Refuge. This designation has been approved by Governor Gregg. But the Bechtel Report gives no guarantee that this site on prime land will be saved as a Refuge.

I am inclosing a letter written By Emma Rous, wife of our Trust's President which clearly details some of the dangers we are facing.

As a former Governor who understands this state so well, I urge you to assist us in any way you can to curtail the plans of Bechtel to turn this jewel of land on the Bays into a megalopolis.

**Statement on Federal Budget Agreement
by Michael Baly III
A.G.A. Executive Vice President and COO**

The American Gas Association (A.G.A.) commends the White House and Congressional negotiators for reaching a compromise agreement on the 1991 fiscal year budget. Passage of this budget package is far preferable to the debilitating sequestration that would occur under the current Gramm-Rudman-Hollings law.

A.G.A. is particularly pleased that the budget negotiators abandoned the broad-based energy tax proposals in favor of the 10-cent increase in the federal gasoline tax and a relatively modest two-cent tax on refined petroleum products. This approach will help promote conservation, improve urban air quality, and will be much less disruptive to the nation's economy. Of equal importance, the gasoline tax proposal directly attacks the chief energy security problem facing the United States -- ever-increasing reliance on unstable oil imports. Furthermore, the budget negotiators' action will enhance the potential contribution of domestically produced fuels, such as natural gas.

A.G.A. also welcomes the action in the budget agreement on Section 29 of the Internal Revenue Code, which permanently extends the nonconventional fuels tax credit. This action helps ensure that domestic natural gas production will increase in the years ahead.

The association congratulates all those involved in the budget negotiations and urges prompt passage of the budget resolution.

Dear Governor Sununu:

I am writing to ask your commitment -- in exchange for mine -- with respect to assembling an elegant, effective solution to the problems now arising from the first try at the S&L bailout. I am confident that we have defined the proper framework for that solution, but that's my opinion, not yours. I am equally convinced that you, and only you, can command the resources necessary to determine whether we are correct.

I've spent a fair amount of time in government, including a bit at the White House. So if I say at the outset that I'm pleased to bring staff over and make a presentation, it is not because we want "bragging rights" but because I know that solving the S&L crisis is a high-stakes matter that has to be done right this time around.

However, you must understand something as well. Although the "complete" solution to the S&L bailout will in substance be "economic", the only way it will be brought about is if it is managed the right way politically. It is also my judgment that *you* have to manage it, which means that even if our framework is the right one, you have to understand it and agree with it from the very outset.

For that to happen, it is incumbent on people like us to be able to explain it to people like you succinctly and completely. If we can, then you can, and you will have the *real* answer you want: where you'll find the time and resources (including knowledge) to be certain that the solution -- in the formative stage and when the bureaucrats get hold of it -- stays on track.

You have my commitment to the following: if our approach is one you think will work *and* you agree to manage it, we will claim no authorship and help you get support for it within the financial community. I will be asking you to agree to something else: the necessity of forcing the preparatory work so that it can be completed before the next Congress begins; that way, the President can choose the timing of its announcement. We will certainly help you keep the wraps on it until you and he think the time is ripe. Be forewarned, however, that if you agree that this solution is the best, you will also see that the wraps *will* have to be kept on it almost to the day it is formally announced.

Dear Governor Sununu,

While the events of last winter continue to be discussed among industry, consumers and government, the National Propane Gas Association believes that government must work with industry to plan for this coming winter. The crisis in the Middle East has already disrupted energy supplies and energy prices have shown unusual gyrations for over a month.

The National Propane Gas Association (NPGA) is the national trade association of the propane gas industry with about 4,000 members including 43 affiliated state and regional associations. We represent all aspects of the industry including producers, transporters, equipment manufacturers, suppliers and retail marketers. Therefore the continued supply of product to the consumer at reasonable prices is of great concern to us.

Early inventory reports show that fewer barrels of propane are in primary storage now than the same time last year. With major reductions in worldwide supply due to the Iraqi embargo, it is possible that we will enter the winter heating season with these lower inventories. However, reports show that there may be substantial building of propane inventory at private locations that are not reported such as petrochemical, retailer and consumer storage.

In December we found the transportation/distribution system strained to the limit, causing regional shortages due to the inability of the system to move the necessary volume of product from point of production or storage to consumption with sufficient speed. Through planning, we can deal with this eventuality.

Although we in industry do not have a crystal ball, we bring this problem to your attention in September so that plans can be made to alleviate problems if they arise this winter. Last winter no one could have predicted the record cold that blanketed the nation in December; this year we can

foresee the potential for problems to occur and wish to either forestall them or be prepared to deal with them.

Last spring, NPGA commissioned a special Supply Task Force that made several recommendations on actions government and industry could take to avoid a repeat of last December's problems. We want to share with you those Task Force recommendations and other suggestions which we believe can help the nation prepare for the coming winter.

For its part, NPGA has contracted with an outside accounting firm to assist us in conducting a statistical survey of our membership to provide additional information on the industry's capabilities. In an emergency, we plan to work with state propane gas associations and state energy offices by serving as an information clearinghouse to ensure that there is a free flow of information and industry data.

Pursuant to a recommendation of the Supply Task Force, propane marketers have been urged to encourage their customers to participate in scheduled delivery plans rather than purchasing product when they run low. This is intended to minimize sudden demands for fuel fill-ups at the onset of a cold spell, and to allow marketers to better plan their supply needs.

To reduce heavy demand in time of sudden cold, marketers are encouraging summer and fall tank fill-ups so that consumers enter the heating season with full fuel tanks. All segments of the propane industry are being asked to reassess their storage and delivery capabilities, as well as inventory practices. Finally, NPGA committees will give long term consideration to these and other energy emergency matters so as to be better prepared for any future problem.

RECOMMENDATIONS FOR THE WINTER OF 1990-1991

These recommendations address transportation & distribution problems, supply shortfalls, and the needs of the poor:

1) DOT RELIEF. There are several steps that the U.S. Department of Transportation and individual states or localities can take now or at the time of an emergency, to be of assistance. These include:

- * Establishing a mechanism from Washington to issue blanket exemptions from hours of service rules for an entire industry, or a segment of the country, without requiring each company to apply locally or regionally.

- * Providing relief from state and local routing restrictions.

- * Providing exemptions from truck weight limitations.

* Providing exemptions from requirements for state certificates of authority so as to permit the interchange of delivery vehicles among marketers from one state to another.

ACTION NEEDED: The Administrators of the Federal Highway Administration and the Research and Special Programs Administration should implement by policy and regulation the procedures for declaring an emergency at a national level. The Secretary of Transportation should call for cooperative action from state transportation agencies.

2) JONES ACT WAIVERS. During periods of extreme demand when pipeline and rail car capacity is exceeded, product could be moved from Texas to Northeastern seaports by LP-Gas tankers. Recognizing that there are only one or two U.S. flag propane vessels, the government should be prepared to act quickly to provide relief from the Jones Act which prohibits the use of foreign flag vessels moving product from one domestic port to another. Requests for waivers were long delayed in December 1989, even though it was reported that the only known U.S. flag propane vessel was unavailable in the Pacific Ocean. These waivers could have helped relieve the serious problems in the Northeastern states by expediting propane from the Gulf Coast.

ACTION NEEDED: We understand that the Departments of Energy, Transportation, and Treasury have executed a memorandum of understanding on the waiving of the Jones Act in an energy emergency. This MOU should be publicized along with the procedures for industry to make applications for waivers.

3) LIHEAP CHANGES. The Federal Low Income Home Energy Assistance Program should be altered to provide earlier payments to recipients of assistance so that they will be encouraged to fill up their tanks earlier in the fall, rather than waiting until December or January. In addition, funding for LIHEAP should be expanded.

ACTION NEEDED: The Department of Health and Human Services (HHS) must expedite funding this program early in the fiscal year. In addition, Congress needs to speed the passage of this vital appropriation early in the session so that HHS can implement its program.

4) RAILROAD IMPROVEMENTS. Recognizing that a shortage of railroad tank cars and the lack of railroad sidings are factors over which NPGA has little control, the Task Force nonetheless recommended that NPGA maintain close liaison with the Association of American Railroads and be prepared to request their assistance at the time of an emergency to expedite the movement of rail cars containing propane. The Federal Railroad Administration should be prepared to

monitor these rail car movements and support these industry efforts.

ACTION NEEDED: The Federal Railroad Administration should be brought into the energy emergency planning process and have a plan for working with the railroads.

5) IMPROVE SUPPLY AND DEMAND DATA. Coupled with the need to improve NPGA's own data collection process is the need to improve the data collection performed by the government, specifically the Energy Information Administration (EIA).

ACTION NEEDED: NPGA has met with EIA and with state energy officials to help implement EIA's new propane data collection program this heating season. Government and industry should continue to monitor the timeliness and efficiency of this new program.

6) SWITCH TO OTHER FUELS. State and Federal governments should be prepared on short notice, to temporarily waive air pollution control regulations to allow industrial boilers and furnaces to switch to less clean, heavy oil products rather than use propane.

ACTION NEEDED: The U.S. and State Environmental Protection Agencies should establish a plan for processing these environmental waivers in an emergency.

7) ENCOURAGE RELEASE OF PROPANE HELD BY PETROCHEMICAL INDUSTRIES. The government should encourage those in the petrochemical industry to switch to alternative feedstocks when possible and release their stores of propane for use during home heating fuel shortfalls. In addition, the EIA should make an effort to determine the quantity of propane held by petrochemical industries in private storage. These private storage stocks are not publicly reported and do not appear in either American Petroleum Institute or EIA inventory calculations; however, history tells us that they frequently will be released to the general market when supply and demand economics make it favorable to the holders to do so. Regrettably, this often occurs only after substantial price increases and sharp supply shortfalls.

ACTION NEEDED: If the collection of energy information is vital to national security, then all major sources must be surveyed. Congress should pass legislation to allow EIA to collect inventory information from all major private storage sites while protecting the confidentiality of the private sites.

8) ENCOURAGE CUSTOMERS TO HAVE APPLIANCE TUNE-UPS AND TO PRACTICE CONSERVATION. Just as with automobiles, appliances run more efficiently when properly maintained.

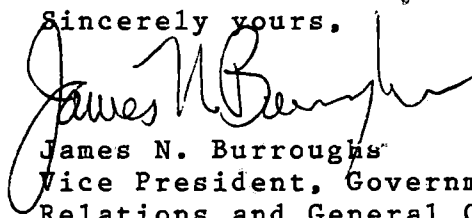
Government should return to the practice of promoting conservation in its many forms including the use of high efficiency appliances. Remind the public of the need to be informed purchasers of energy and energy consuming equipment.

CONCLUSION

Because of the uncertainty of events in the Middle East, we believe it is imperative that advance planning place us in a position where we can be prepared for any eventuality. By planning ahead and by working together industry and Federal and State governments can assure the public of the availability of home heating fuels.

The National Propane Gas Association and state propane gas associations and their members look forward to working with you and other government leaders in the months ahead. Please call on us if we can be of assistance.

As President of the National Association of Foreign-Trade Zones I am writing on behalf of our membership nationwide to urge you to resolve the remaining differences in pending FY 1991 federal budget.

The NAFTAZ is a national organization comprised of more than 300 state and local governments, private companies and small businesses involved in international trade and the U.S. Foreign-Trade Zones Program. Today more than 2100 firms operate in 280 foreign-trade zones and subzones in 47 states across the U.S.

The economic consequences of failing to enact budget legislation or forcing a Gramm-Rudman sequestration of U.S. Customs Service appropriations would be catastrophic to the U.S. international trading community.

A halt or sequestration of Customs Service funds would severely strain Customs' commercial operations and impede the orderly flow of international commerce. Any reduction of hours of operation or the closure of certain Customs' offices brought about by a sequestration would have a corresponding negative effect on our nation's ports, foreign-trade zones, airports and major trading centers. The loss of jobs, investment and economic activity at these facilities would be great.

Mr. Sununu, for several years now the U.S. Customs Service has been hard pressed to carry out its broad responsibilities of revenue collection, law enforcement and commercial operations due to inadequate funding. To force new draconian cuts on the agency now would be to halt the orderly flow of trade in the U.S.

For the sake of jobs, investment and international trade in the U.S., I urge to adopt an FY 1991 federal budget immediately.

Re: Use of Violence-Inducing Drug on Air Force One

Dear Mr. Sununu:

The Citizens Commission on Human Rights investigates the violence-inducing nature of psychiatric drugs and provides warnings to Americans about these drugs so that tragedies can be averted.

It has been reported in the press that the psychiatric drug Halcion is currently available and in use by persons on Air Force One and on the plane used by the Secretary of State. No information was provided as to who is using the drug or what the circumstances are of this use other than that it was being passed around "by the handful." If this report is accurate, this is a highly dangerous situation.[1]

Psychiatric drugs such as Halcion are extremely unpredictable and can bring about a psychotic state or an eruption of violence at any time. The liabilities presented by this are compounded exponentially when psychiatric drugs are used by persons in high office, where the consequences of drug-induced paranoia or aggression can be global and catastrophic.

It is imperative that any and all persons responsible for steering our country through delicate international matters, and any persons around them who could influence their decisions, be kept strictly free of the psychosis, paranoia, hallucinations, aggression or violence which Halcion is well known to generate.

For this reason, we ask that you look into this report to determine if any action should be taken to protect the representatives of our government from the potential adverse effects of this drug.

Halcion-Induced Psychosis

In its prescribing information, the manufacturer admits that frightening side effects, including confusion, depression, restlessness, irritability, agitation, aggressiveness, hallucinations or inappropriate behavior have accompanied use of Halcion.[2]

In addition, reports have been sent to the Food and Drug Administration linking Halcion with these side effects and others, including delusions, hostility, hysteria, nervousness, suicide attempt, paranoid reaction, and psychosis.[3]

Halcion is a member of the benzodiazepine class of drugs. This class, which is also termed "antianxiety agents" or "anxiolytics," is notorious for generating paradoxical reactions such as hostility, aggression and violence. These are termed "paradoxical" not because they are unexpected, but because they are directly opposite to the intended effect of the drug.

In fact, studies done on this class of drug indicate that these unpredictable and extremely dangerous violent side effects are far more common than is generally known.

One study into the effects of psychiatric drugs on

aggression in a prison setting published in 1975 found that benzodiazepines increased the incidence of violence among prisoners more than did any other class of drug. The authors of the report suggested, "Perhaps antianxiety agents do not act to relieve anxiety and frustration but only to remove the anxiety and inhibitions about aggressive acts." [4]

Five years after this study, John Hinckley downed four benzodiazepine tablets and two hours later tried to assassinate President Reagan. At Hinckley's trial, a psychiatrist attributed his assassination attempt to the benzodiazepine drug [Valium] he was taking. [5], [6]

In 1985, a study conducted on another benzodiazepine, Xanax, described insane acts of violence which were attributed to the effects of the drug. One participant in the study "erupted with screams on the fourth day of [Xanax] treatment and held a steak knife to her mother's throat for a few minutes." The study notes that there had been no history of overt violence by the patient prior to going onto the benzodiazepine drug. [7]

Halcion, as a member of the benzodiazepine class of drugs, can be fully expected to generate these horrible, violent side effects in some people.

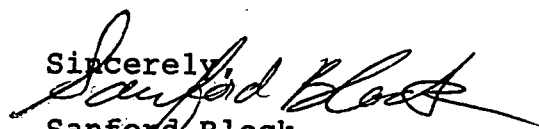
One of the people who was turned violent by Halcion is Ilo Grundberg of Hurricane, Utah. While under the drug's effects, Grundberg shot her mother repeatedly and then put a birthday card in her lifeless hands. Murder charges against her were dropped when the prosecutor became convinced that she had been turned into a killer by Halcion.[8]

Another case of Halcion-induced violence involved a police officer in Kalamazoo, Michigan, who nearly killed his wife while under the drug's effects. Ron Petty's conviction for the crime was later overturned and he was subsequently acquitted when information on the potential for violence from Halcion was presented to the court.[9]

We have received reports of numerous other cases of violence, including murder and suicide by persons taking Halcion and other benzodiazepines. The potential for adverse mental effects from use of Halcion is very real and must be regarded seriously.

There is considerably more information available on Halcion which we can provide on request. Please let me know if you require any further materials.

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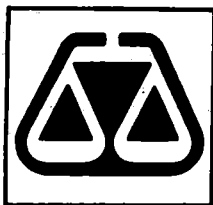

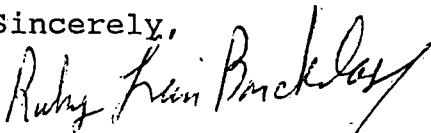

Dear Governor Sununu,

One of the rumours circulating about the budget compromise is that negotiators may be considering a tax on newsprint produced from virgin material. In the event that this proposal is gaining credence, I would ask that you review the effects of such a tax carefully because of the unequal burden it would place on Canadian producers.

Canadian newsprint producers and U.S. newspaper publishers have long enjoyed unimpeded trade. Under certain recycling initiatives, however, Canadian producers would be forced to haul quantities of old newspapers long distances from the U.S. and would have to install de-inking facilities far in excess of those required to meet Canadian needs.

Canada supports recycling and other environmental objectives and believes that these can be achieved in a way that is trade neutral and in keeping with fair and open competition. This would not be the case with a tax on virgin newsprint, which could have a significant adverse impact on Canadian exports valued at more than U.S. \$4 billion in 1989.

I recognize the importance that the Administration and the Congress attach to reaching a budget summit agreement quickly. In these circumstances, I would appreciate your keeping Canada's position in mind as you and your colleagues consider the variety of proposed measures before you.

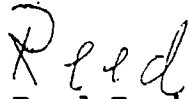

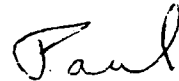

Dear Mr. Sununu:

As President of a not-for profit orchestral organization that depends on a healthy mixture of earned and contributed income for its survival, I am deeply concerned at the threat posed by a possible curb on charitable tax deductions. Every one of our programs including performances, educational outreach and training depends on charitable contributions for a large portion of its funding.

Organizations which are vital to the quality of life of our citizens depends on private giving since government social spending is restricted. Federal policy must continue to encourage our citizens to contribute financially and as volunteers to the non-profit sector. A change in the tax code curbing charitable deductions represents a direct value conflict with President Bush's "Thousand Points of Light" philosophy. It appears as if Congress is spurning the value of charitable giving.

Charitable deductions are different from any other tax deductions. They do not represent a financial advantage to the donor. No matter what the circumstance, charitable contributions place a donor in a less favorable financial position. The donor is contributing to the well-being of a community.

Congress has already made more challenging the Philharmonic's ability to serve the public: the 1986 Tax Act hurt the voluntary sector by eliminating the charitable deduction for those who do not itemize their tax returns and by altering the treatment of appreciated property. Limiting charitable deductions will simply further erode incentives for private giving.

I, therefore, urge you to advocate retaining the charitable deduction provision in the current tax code. Any alteration of these incentives will upset the balance of support of non-profit arts organizations from a combination of public, private and earned income support.

Your commitment to the arts, culture, and creativity is greatly appreciated.

Dear John:

I thought you might be interested in the attached testimony that I gave recently regarding the role that accounting rules promulgated by the Federal Home Loan Bank Board during the 1970s and early 1980s had in allowing the growth of the thrift problem. The Board's accounting policies sought in many ways to create the appearance of solvency among thrifts by overstating net worth. For example, the Board allowed certain types of accumulated losses to be reported as assets, which ultimately resulted in more than \$6 billion in reported "net worth" that was in fact "net loss."

In addition to describing how this problem was able to grow so large without public notice, the testimony seeks to explain the significance of the President's early recommendations to control this problem. As is reflected on page 12 of the testimony, in December, 1983, the President recommended that the absurdly permissive capital and accounting rules for thrifts should be made identical to banks. Almost 6 years passed between that time and the eventual adoption of these vital steps when FIRREA was passed. During that time, the industry added more than \$400 billion in loans (more than 50% growth) under the old rules, rather than under the rules that the President, together with the other members of the Task Group that he chaired, had recommended.

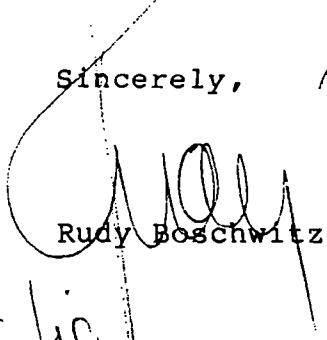

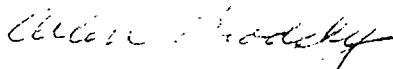
Enclosed is a letter from Representative Connie Morella to the President in behalf of Dr. Webster's nomination.

SUBJECT: America's Point Of Light Award

Dear Governor Sununu:

On August 9, 1990, President Bush honored the volunteers of The Huntsville Land Trust as America's 217th Point Of Light. This recognition has been of incalculable value to the Trust, both in terms of instilling pride and a renewed sense of purpose among our volunteers, as well as providing the enhanced credibility that comes with national attention. We are indeed honored that the President, through his Points Of Light Initiative, selected the Trust to join those other individuals and groups who are making, through voluntary action, tangible differences in their communities.

The Huntsville Land Trust, founded in late 1987, protects the natural heritage of our community by protecting lands of special scenic, educational, historical, or recreational value. Huntsville/Madison County is one of the fastest growing areas of Alabama. Conservation of natural lands will continue to be a challenge as our community grows, particularly if it is to remain a healthy, viable one that can continue to attract the planned, high quality economic growth we have enjoyed in the past.

To date, almost 1,000 acres throughout Madison County have been protected due to the influence of the Trust. Its premier project - as well as its most formidable challenge - is the protection of the western face of Monte Sano, the mountain that forms the scenic natural backdrop to the City. Monte Sano contains natural springs, caves, and fossil beds, as well as rich habitat for countless species of plants and animals. More than 11,000 schoolchildren will visit the property in 1990 as part of their science studies.

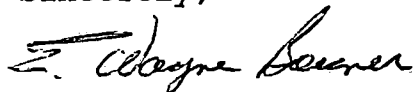
In order to protect the property, the Trust and the City of Huntsville entered into an innovative, public-private alliance. Together, the City and the Trust negotiated with landowners for the purchase of the property. In order to secure its portion, the Trust must raise \$1.8 million by November, 1991, and is seeking the generous support of citizens, businesses, agencies and foundations so that the Nature Preserve will become a reality.

During the remainder of 1990, the City and the Trust will develop a comprehensive long term management plan for the property to consider, among other things, new or extended hiking trails, interpretive facilities, and trails for the physically or visually challenged.

Because the President's honor has been such a meaningful one for the Trust, and because the President's national agenda is one of respect in our community, the Huntsville Land Trust's continuing efforts will be given a generous boost should it be officially recognized as a Point Of Light by you, on behalf of the President, during your visit to our City. Our goals are quite ambitious; the added prestige gained from official White House recognition will greatly increase our chances of success, and perhaps spread the message that government and private citizens groups, working together, can do much to enhance the quality of life in their own communities.

We would be honored if you would take the time during your visit on September 22, 1990, to officially present the President's Point Of Light Award to the Huntsville Land Trust. Some of the Directors of the Huntsville Land Trust will be in attendance at the breakfast honoring you and Governor Guy Hunt, and we look forward to meeting with you then.

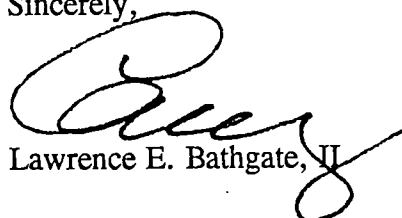

In an effort to reduce the cost of prescription drugs purchased by the Medicaid program, several proposals have been discussed that include provisions mandating, in certain circumstances, the substitution of the lowest-cost "therapeutically equivalent" drug.

The American Society for Pharmacology and Experimental Therapeutics has serious concerns about therapeutic substitution and believes that any legislative or regulatory action in this area must be considered very carefully. The Society's Council, in consultation with the Society's Clinical Pharmacology Division, recently adopted the enclosed resolution on the issue.

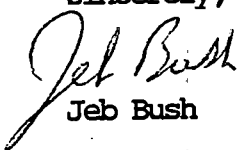

exist.

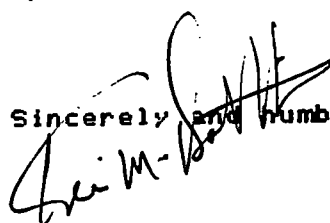
Most recently, on September 7, 1998, my wife, Rosalie,

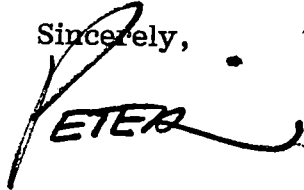

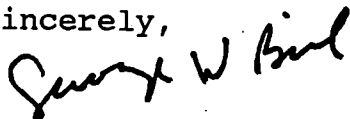
I am writing to ask you to advise the President to veto the Civil Rights Act of 1990.

The bill would allow juries to award whatever monetary damages they think are deserved. I have a deep concern about the spiraling costs of our civil justice system. We need reform in the area of non-economic damages, not more legislation promoting it.

The bill would also make it difficult for us to defend ourselves in charges alleging that a particular job requirement or practice, even if inadvertent, has a discriminatory effect. For this reason we would be forced to consider adopting quotas in hiring and promotion. This is a result that Congress expressly rejected when originally drafting Title VII.

Houston's has nearly 2300 employees. Of these, 27% are minorities and 48% are women. We have always had a strong commitment to the protection of civil rights for our employees and job applicants. The restaurant industry is, in fact, the largest employer of minorities in the country. However, the Civil Rights bill is flawed and should be vetoed. Please convey these thoughts to the President.

Dear Mr. Sununu:

I concur with the Bush Administration and the Congressional participants of the budget summit meetings that additional deficit reductions are necessary for a stronger U.S. economy. However, I am seriously concerned over the recently proposed energy and emissions taxation.

Ferro realizes its responsibility to utilize energy efficiently and has cut energy consumption in half since 1973. We also support legislation to improve the environment. However, our ability to pay for a cleaner environment will depend on maintaining competitiveness of U.S. manufacturing.

In my opinion the proposed taxes would have a very negative impact, not only on Ferro Corporation's competitiveness, but on the U.S. economy as a whole. The additional cost of production which these taxes would create would not be borne by foreign based manufacturers either in the U.S. or world markets, causing a further decline in U.S. competitiveness. For this reason, I strongly urge you to oppose these taxes.

Perhaps reduced federal spending and consideration of other revenue sources that would not, in effect, subsidize imports, should be employed in the reduction of the deficit.

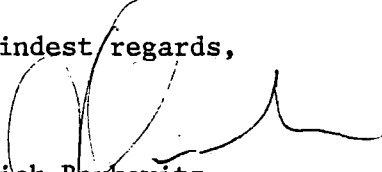

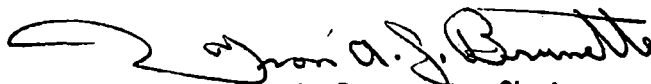

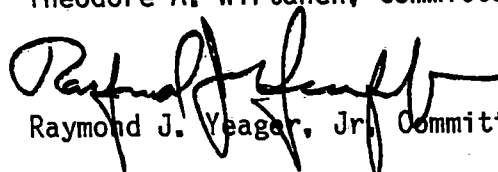

Dear Mr. Sununu:

The objective of the "Budget Summit" to achieve agreement on a budget that is "affordable" while taking into account the needs of the body politic is one that I heartily support. And while the popular outcry is to reduce expenditures, I realize full well the need for what the press terms "new sources of revenue."

No one wants more taxes that impact him/her directly -- or the businesses which provide them a livelihood while fulfilling a market or a social need. And at a time like the present when the growth of expenditures are outstripping the growth of revenues, those like yourself who occupy positions of high responsibility can expect to hear from "special pleaders" covering a broad segment of human endeavor.

In your deliberations, I would urge you to keep advertising free of taxation -- both directly on the purchase of advertising time or space and indirectly by retaining full and current deductability of advertising expenditures.

This, in my view, is an issue that transcends those of us who have an affiliation with the advertising business. Advertising is an important element of free speech and free press guaranteed in our Bill of Rights. While it serves a commercial purpose for the advertiser, it serves a basic informational need for the consumer and is essential to the market system that is so basic to the democratic process. Without advertising, there is restricted freedom of choice; with less advertising, there is less freedom of choice.

Any tax on advertising would undoubtedly affect the revenues of those channels of communication that are so vital to the free flow of information in our country. I would hope that you agree with me that we should refrain from placing any restrictions on this free flow of information to our citizens.

While there are undoubtedly "loopholes" to be plugged and "special interests" that merit increased taxes, I would urge you to look to the broad spectrum of the American public for the additional revenues required to operate our Government on a fiscally sound basis rather than the random selection of narrowly-based interests.

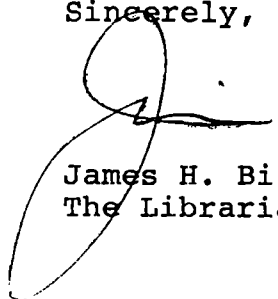
Dear John:

As Congress returns from its August recess, users of the postal system are getting quite concerned.

As you know, the U.S. Postal Service has filed for higher postage rates to take effect in February of 1991. The Postal Service's proposal would increase postage rates by 19% overall and increase the First Class Stamp to 30¢.

Today, the rumbling we hear from the Administration/ Congressional budget summit is that the U.S. Postal Service may become part of the summit's deficit reduction agreement. The number being bandied about indicates that the Postal Service may be forced to contribute up to \$1.7 billion to help reduce the deficit.

Unfortunately, the Postal Service does not print money, only stamps. Therefore, any summit agreement that impacts the Postal Service will ultimately be borne by users of the postal system. If the \$1.7 billion charge becomes a reality, the First Class Stamp will be 32¢. You will recall that in 1988 the basic First Class Stamp was 22¢. So, the average American could be seeing a 45% increase in postage in just three years.

The proposal to transfer \$1.7 billion to the Postal Service is unfair and just a real bad idea that should be rejected. There are many reasons why it should be rejected, but let me summarize just a few:

- It is a tax levied through the back door. If a tax increase is necessary, wouldn't it be better to march through the front door with a simple straightforward tax increase?
- Postal rates went up \$6 billion in 1988 and are already scheduled to increase \$7 billion in February of 1991. How much more of a burden can postal rate payers be fairly expected to take?
- These significant rate increases are weakening the Postal Service. Mail volume is dropping and more and more mailers are bypassing the Postal Service. This increase could put the Postal Service into a downward spin that it could have difficulty recovering from.
- Last year's legislation that moved the Postal Service off the Consolidated Federal Budget is, according to the Administration, already saving more than \$3 billion. That would seem to be a more than adequate contribution to the Budget deficit reduction.

A goal every American shares is to reduce the Federal deficit. Surely, there are better ways to reduce this task than to ask the U.S. Postal Service to pick up an inordinately large burden.

Thank you for your consideration to this extremely important matter.

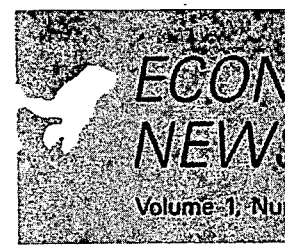
