Any Wednesday noon is acceptable with a month's advance notice since we will have to reserve the Union League of Philadelphia.



WITHOUT IT OUR LAKES AND PONDS COULD BECOME POLLUTED THROUGH VARIOUS SOURCES SUCH AS ACID RAIN, SEWERAGE, SEEPAGE OF CONTAMINANTS FROM BELOW GROUND, SURFACE RUNOFF CONTAMINANTS AND OTHERS.

IF THESE POLLUTANTS ARE NOT DETECTED IN A TIMELY MANNER WE WILL ALL PAY A HIGHER PRICE IN ORDER TO MAINTAIN OUR LAKES AND PONDS AS ASSETS.

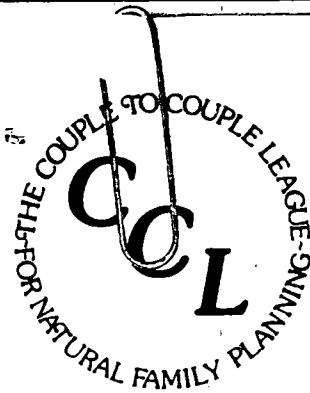

Dear John,

Peter Grace, at this afternoon's Press Club luncheon, was asked the following question: "Do you feel that the Senior Executive Service, which is scheduled to get a pay raise in the near future, should be getting salary increases which would bring them up to an average of about \$100,000 a piece?"

He replied to the effect that he would have no problems with the pay raise, but he would make it only on the condition that their pension benefits be comparable to what they would get if they were in the private sector - and he mentioned specifically that under present statutes their pension benefits were two or three times as generous as in the private sector.

When President Bush was asked by a Newsweek reporter, in his first interview after he had taken office, about a proposed 50 percent Congressional pay raise he replied that he was "somewhat appalled" to read in the Washington Times about the pension implications of the proposed Congressional pay raise. The same situation applies for the Senior Executive Service as it does for the Congress.


Our Committee, The National Committee on Public Employee Pension Systems (PEPS), has as you know been concerned about the pension liabilities ever since we were founded back in 1980 or 1981. (For your information I am enclosing some copies of pertinent earlier information outlining my personal views. You may recall that when you were speaking in Plymouth several years ago, that I asked you personally about your views on the federal pension system.)

In any event, the enclosed copy of a rapporteur's notes, that are being distributed by the National Economist Club, may refresh your mind as to the salient features of our committees concerns about the pension system.

You will be speaking to the Press Club on December 11- and I would assume that you will be getting the same kind of questions as those which Peter Grace was asked. I would hope that in as much as the Executive Order has not yet been published that you could find some way to provide the pay raise but ask in typical private sector fashion that they only provide full COLAs on the first \$1,000 a month on an individuals federal pension income or \$1,500 for an eligible married couple. (In arriving at this figure you would take into consideration all federal pension income, including Social Security. PEPS settled on this figure because it is the maximum Social Security benefit for someone who has earned the maximum all of his lifetime.)

The country would be with you on this issue - and it could show that the President recognizes the need for prudence in the matter of pension benefits. (I have enclosed a November 24th Op-Ed piece which I wrote for the Los Angeles Times, and I am also enclosing a copy of a Rapporteur's report from a speech I made at the National Economists Club a few weeks ago.

Several months ago my son, Frank, Jr, wrote a Flag Song titled "Red, White and Blue...God Bless You."

It has been heard over 1200 radio stations in United States as well as in Canada and far away as Guam.

I am a staunch supporter of President Bush. If it wasn't for brave men like him, I would have died in a Japanese POW camp in Manchurian during World War II.

Attached is some correspondence with Chairman Lee Atwater and his staff in which I have suggested that my son's song, "Red, White, and Blue...God Bless You" be used to help Republican candidates this November.

I am also suggesting that "Red, White and Blue...God Bless You" be played over loudspeakers at the demonstrations which have begun to spring up against President Bush's efforts to stop any further aggression by Iraq, and to drown out these draft dodging Vietnam leaders in their tirades against President Bush. Reference is made to our telephone conversation this morning.

Enclosed is a cassette containing the lyrics of the Flag Song my son Frank, Jr. wrote together with a fully-orchestrated studio rendition directed by Disneyland musician Dana Seufert.

Over 50 radio stations from Canada to Guam had phoned him at his home in Tustin, California, to have him sing acapella solos of his Flag Song, "Red White and Blue...God Bless You." It has been overwhelmingly received by the average grass roots patriotic American, as well as the liberals in Boston, Mass.

I am a retired U.S. Army Warrant Officer, a survivor of the World War II "Bataan Death March" and a Japanese POW for 40 months. I recall an excerpt from a smuggled-in Japanese newspaper translated by Col. S. Wood read secretly to us in a POW camp in Manchuria during the battle for Okinawa: "The fury of the American attack was such, that mountains turned into valleys and valleys turned into mountains."

Saturday, on local and national television networks, the draft resistors from Vietnam and their new followers, were televised trying to foment an anti-war, anti-President Bush's efforts to resolve Iraq's aggression in Kuwait.

I believe that the Republican party should meet these demonstrators immediately head on to lessen their impact on public opinion.

My son, Frank, Jr, with his simple Flag Song has stirred the patriotism of the average American throughout United States just by singing his acapella solos.

In a few days his song will be heard by short wave broadcast from a transmitter owned by Mr. Don Otis, former Lear Jet Co. executive in Beirut, Lebanon. He is the leader of the Voice of Hope Broadcast Christian Group, which has been in operation since 1979. In October 1989 terrorists killed five of his employees and damaged the transmitter during an attack. Mr. Otis' daily 3 hour broadcast covers the entire mid-East including Iraq, Saudi Arabia, Syria, Northern Africa, etc.

When I first heard the orchestrated rendition of the song, it reminded me of the barefooted, ragged soldiers marching off to battle the British during the revolutionary war in step to the fifes and drums.

I am of the opinion that it is a stirring melody, one that could be used to introduce the Republican candidates seeking election. It would be a reminder to those who opposed President Bush's legislative efforts to outlaw flag burning, that the American Flag is a symbol of how the United States of America was born in a war against tyranny, just as we today under the leadership of President Bush have drawn a line on the sands of Saudi Arabia.

A few bars of the melody, with the fifes and drums, could be played, and the candidate beside the Flag could begin the rally with "Red, White and Blue ...God Bless You" and then have a celebrity or the candidate sing the first verse, or use my son's tape recording.

The Willie Horton TV spot had a terrific impact on the American voter, so much so it destroyed Dukakis. This Flag Song might have the same effect on these new demonstrators, and their their Vietnam War draft dodging leaders.

President is a World War II combat pilot, and represents the best in America, a patriotic rich man's son, who offered his life in defending the principles for which this country stands.

If it was not for the bravery of men like President Bush during World War II, we would have not won the war with Japan, and I would not be here typing this letter to you.

Did you hear it? Neither did we.

Well, Frank Kazerski of Tustin — who might have been Francis Scott Key in another life — got the chance to sing his "new national anthem" at a national-league ballgame earlier this week. Sort of.

From his desk at the United Way in Santa Ana, Frank played a tape of his "Red, White and Blue, We Love You" into the phone to Denver station KOA-AM/85, which broadcast it live moments before the Broncos-San Francisco 49ers game.

But Denver will do just fine. "It all started in Juice!" Frank said. Oh, boy, what we started.

COSTA MESA — It all started during a Grand Slam breakfast at a Denny's restaurant three miles from Disneyland.

The little patriotic ditty called "Red, White and Blue, God Bless You" that Tustin political activist Frank Kazerski penned on a napkin has been called the new national anthem by a bevy of radio disc jockeys.

Kazerski serenaded Rep. Christopher Cox, R-Newport Beach, with a new arrangement of the song Friday at a Joshua Generation religious group dinner at the Red Lion Inn on Bristol Street here.

Kazerski said he has been the darling of more than 30 radio talk-show hosts — from Boston to Guam — who love to play the 1-minute, 20-second song.

Kazerski said he never intended to have it replace the "Star Spangled Banner." Instead, he wrote it as an answer to comedienne Rosanne Barr's screeching rendition of the national anthem at a San Diego Padres baseball game and a song to be played at anti-flag burning rallies.

On his radio station appearances, Kazerski sang the song a cappella. But he asked a Disneyland songmaster, Dana Siefert of Laguna Beach, to write a military band arrangement for the song. The Marine Corps Marching Band played the tune and recorded it for Kazerski. (to be contacted)

Cox met the United Way worker at fund-raising open house in Newport Beach and asked him to sing the song at the dinner. Cox said he enjoyed the tune and complimented Kazerski on his songwriting prowess.

"I think it's very creative and expressive. As Frank says, it's a reply to Rosanne Barr," Cox said. "I

give Frank very high marks and he has been busy improving it."

Kazerski said he wrote the tune during breakfast with his friend, Edward Kelly, the former publisher of Millionaire magazine. Kelly encouraged him to write the song, despite Kazerski's lack of musical training.

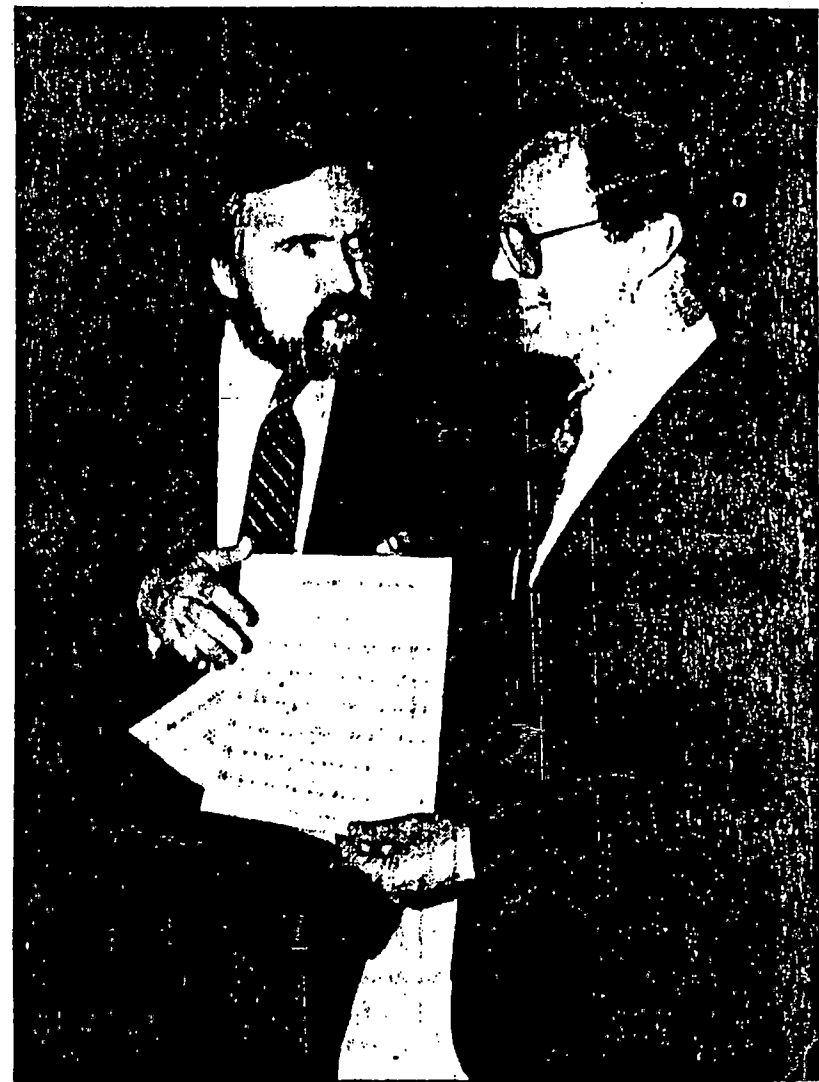
"I was just sitting there in the restaurant and was in the middle of a Grand Slam breakfast. It just came to me," Kazerski said. "In my mind, I could see a flag waving on a mountain top, a flag in the desert and a flag on ship sailing on the sea. I was writing freely what I could see in my mind's eye."

"The song is about patriotism," Kelly said. "It looks like one heck of a winner. He doesn't like music and he sure doesn't sing. It's just one of those lucky things."

Following the Roseanne Barr fiasco, the song has caught on at San Diego radio stations, Kelly said. From his desk, Kazerski played a tape of the song into the phone to Denver radio station KOA-AM/85, which broadcast it just before Monday's San Francisco 49ers Denver Broncos game.

Here are the lyrics:

"Across our land a flag is waving freely;
"Above the sand, the deserts to the sea.
"A living symbol of freedom blowing brightly,
"A burning torch of our liberty,
"She's our flag for you and me.
"She's the emblem of the free, our flag for you and me,
"From mountains, deserts to the sea.
"May our flag wave above for the land that we love,
"O Red, White and Blue ... God Bless You,
"O Red, White and Blue ... God Bless You."

Flag Song To Be Televised

Tustin "activist turned songwriter" Frank Kazerski, after many radio-broadcasted performances of what he calls "the new National Anthem," is now appearing on national television touting the patriotic song he invented on a napkin at an Anaheim restaurant.

Kazerski, who is not a professional

singer or musician, was inspired to write the song through his concern over the national flag burning controversy, and by his outrage over a recent rendition of "The Star Spangled Banner," by comedienne Roseanne Barr, during a baseball game.

He refers to himself as the "replacement" for Roseanne Barr and

is now seeking to sing "Red, White and Blue...God Bless You" at a baseball game of the World Series, to "salute our servicemen at home and abroad."

He has already performed a cappella solos in inimitable tones over the phone to radio stations from Canada to Guam, with one performance broadcast during a football game.

Recently he had the song taped in a fully-orchestrated studio rendition directed by Disneyland musician Dana Seufert.

On Monday, Columbus Day, Kazerski was interviewed by Fox Entertainment News at the Anaheim restaurant where the song was born last June during a moment of gastronomical inspiration. The interview, presumably with a performance of his song, will be aired on Channel 11 within the next couple of weeks.

The same day, Kazerski arranged a meeting with three descendants of Francis Scott Key, author of "The Star Spangled Banner," and presented them with a tape of the song.

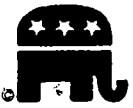





Dear John:

I wish to express my deepest reservations concerning American policy in the Middle East, in particular with respect to the recent buildup of American forces in the Gulf.

It is categorically essential for there to be a political solution to the Iraq/Kuwait crisis. War will be devastating to everyone. War will in the short and long run be detrimental to the United States' interests in the Middle East. A war will create a worldwide recession, if not depression, and in my view war simply cannot take place for these and many other compelling reasons.

A political solution must include but may not be limited to (i) withdrawal by Iraq from Kuwait, (ii) direct Iraqi/Kuwaiti negotiations under the auspices of the United Nations, (iii) reduction of the American forces in Saudi Arabia, (iv) the establishment of a United Nations peace-keeping force made up principally of soldiers from the Arab countries, (v) application of all United Nations resolutions as they apply to the Middle East, including but not limited to the withdrawal of Israel from the West Bank, Gaza, Southern Lebanon and the Golan Heights, (vi) the withdrawal of all Syrian and Palestinian forces from Lebanon, and (vii) the establishment of a United Nations conference for the purpose of addressing and resolving the differences in the region.

A clear reading of history tells us that linkage of related issues is essential in the overall resolution to a

crisis of this magnitude. It really is time that the United States applied principle uniformly in the Middle East and that we not have one standard for Arabs and another for Israel. Clearly what Saddam did was wrong. He is willing to negotiate to resolve the crisis.

May I respectfully suggest that every possible effort be made to resolve the Gulf crisis by political means and that under no circumstances should the United States engage in a war with Iraq. If the United States is committed to a peaceful political solution to the crisis, such will be achieved.

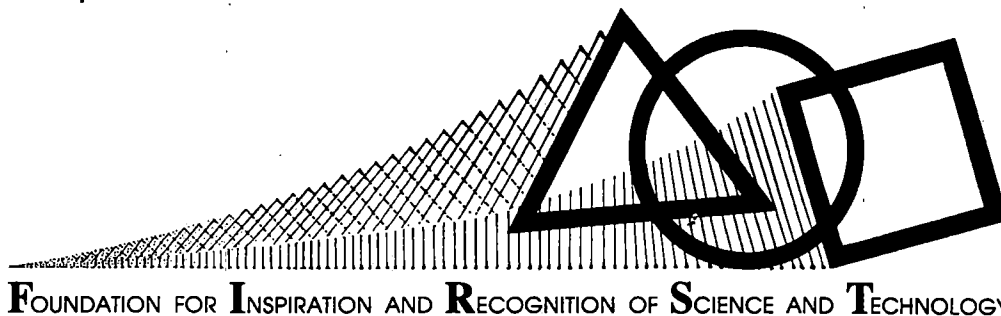



Dear Dr. Sununu:

I am writing to solicit your help in promoting a favorable outcome on the H.R. 1602, the "Trauma Care Systems Planning and Development Act". As you are doubtless aware, this legislation will provide financial incentives to states to plan, develop and implement regional trauma care systems. Trauma, which should best be thought of as a disease, is the third leading cause of death in the United States following heart disease and cancer. Moreover, it is the leading cause of death of U.S. citizens under the age of forty-five and the economic losses and lost productivity engendered by trauma on a yearly basis clearly exceed one hundred and thirty to one hundred and forty billion dollars. Historically depicted as the "neglected epidemic of the twentieth century", trauma has recently attracted more attention as a disease which is largely preventable. In addition, when injured, patients have a much better outcome when they are treated and managed in appropriate trauma care systems. As yet, very few of the states have effective systems in place; in fact, several states and/or counties have begun to abandon their trauma commitments because of impaired funding.


I maintain a vacation residence in Ashland, New Hampshire, and am constantly refreshed by the great natural beauty of the surroundings. However, like much of the United States the rural nature of the state lends itself to potential catastrophes in trauma care that an organized trauma care system would begin to alleviate. Every time I see a severe automobile accident on Route 93 or hear of a boating accident on Squam Lake or Lake Winnepesaukee, I wonder about the emergency medical system response in the Lakes Region, and wonder whether or not an individual injured in rural New Hampshire has as good a chance of survival as an individual with a similar injury in downtown Boston. Sadly, I feel the answer is "no".

Surgeons are trained to examine the risk versus benefit for

...that they may undertake. In a time of budgetary pressure, it is clearly prudent to do the same thing for any potential legislation which may come before the President. In this case, I believe the merits of this legislation and its relatively small cost clearly outweigh any risks to be taken with the Federal budget in passing it; non-medical economic losses from trauma alone certainly justify a vigorous attempt on the part of the Federal Government to foster and encourage the development of appropriate care for trauma, which will lead to a diminution in these losses and an overall improvement in economic conditions.

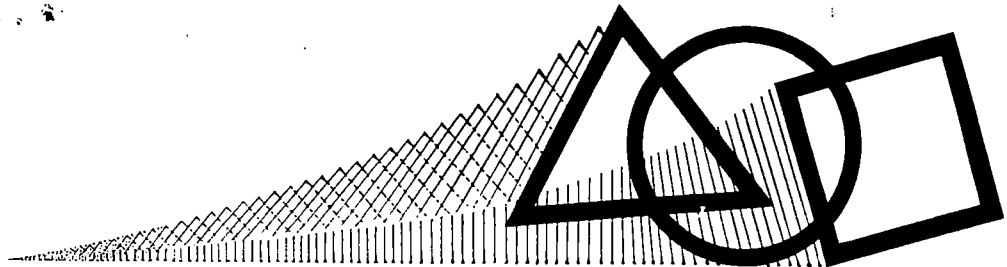

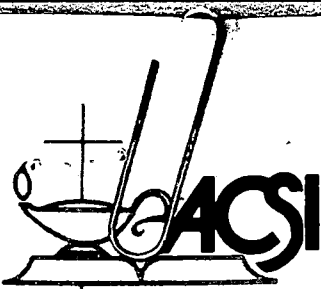

I was among the evangelical leaders who met with you and President Bush in the Roosevelt Room at the White House today. I have been in a number of these meetings over the years and I must say that our meeting today was, by far, the most productive. Your personal participation made a major difference.

As the leader of the nation's largest association of protestant schools and colleges I was particularly heartened by your report on the child care bill. Dr. John Holmes, my assistant in Washington, D.C., tells me your personal efforts were a major factor in protecting the interests of our religious schools. Please accept our sincere thanks, we are grateful indeed.

I know it is a long shot to ask but it would be great if President Bush could speak to the 8,000 Christian school teachers at the 41st Annual ACSI Convention held at the Anaheim Convention Center in Anaheim, California, Monday or Tuesday, November 25 or 26, 1991.

If given adequate time, we would totally adjust the convention program to fit the President's schedule on those dates. We would prefer that the President speak at either of the morning general sessions. The Presidents in the past have spoken to Catholic education conferences but never to evangelical school meetings. So the President's remarks at our largest Christian school convention would go a long way toward mending evangelical fences. If President Bush accepts our invitation we would like to present him with our annual Religious Freedom Award for his timely efforts on the child care legislation and the ADA bill.

I was particularly impressed with your offer to talk personally with us if ever we need to express our concerns for evangelical causes. I may do that from time to time.

Again, thank you for your gracious hospitality today, it was a memorable day for evangelicals!



Dear Mr. Sununu:

We at Texaco are firmly committed to helping improve our nation's air quality and have urged that cost-effective control strategies be adopted.

In this regard, there are provisions in the amendments to the Clean Air Act currently before the Congress which will impose many billions of dollars of additional costs on American consumers with unproven and perhaps little, if any, benefit. In addition, these provisions can significantly weaken our U.S. refining industry by reducing capacity and increasing imports of gasoline and heating oil at a time when our nation is already heavily dependent on imported crude oil and products.

I am referring to the mandates to manufacture reformulated gasoline for certain areas of the country currently in non-compliance with Clean Air standards. These provisions were added by floor amendments in both the House and Senate and require the manufacture of emission-reducing gasolines by 1995 and 2000 which cannot be made in existing refineries and which many in our industry doubt can ever be made. Yet these are the only gasolines that will be permitted to be sold in ozone non-attainment areas. In addition, gasolines with a prescribed oxygenate content must be available in 40 cities by 1992 when the worldwide supplies of such oxygenates very likely will not be adequate to meet such demands within the time period and procedures prescribed.

There were no House and Senate Committee hearings or review which would provide a basis for determining: (1) if such fuels could ever be made; (2) at what cost; (3) within what period of time; (4) what emission reduction can be achieved; and, (5) whether alternative control strategies could provide greater cost-effectiveness and cost benefits. The results of the unprecedented oil/auto research program will be available in

early 1991 and should then provide a scientific basis to address some of these issues.

In these circumstances, to mandate, as the bill does, specific fuel components without requiring feasibility studies by EPA or flexibility to adjust the compliance dates or the emission-reduction standards on the basis of subsequent information is gambling with the U.S. economy and our energy security. Careful consideration must be given as to how the U.S., if necessary, can protect itself against such a potentially dangerous, costly and disruptive experiment with yet undeveloped gasolines.

As a major national and international refiner with a state-of-the-art refinery system and long experience in the refining business, Texaco feels a responsibility to advise the Congress that it has seen no research which indicates the mandated fuels can be available within the inflexible deadlines imposed by the bill. If this legislation is adopted, we urge that an ongoing monitoring system with periodic public reports be established so that the Congress and the American people will have timely notice of any need to consider a mid-course correction to achieve a cost-effective solution if this experiment begins to indicate it is becoming a costly failure.

Texaco will use its very best efforts in an attempt to develop and produce the gasolines mandated by this legislation. If any refiner can find a way to successfully manufacture and nationally market such fuels, we believe it will be Texaco. Nevertheless, because of the serious risks posed by this technology-forcing experiment, we feel a responsibility to call the above facts to your attention.

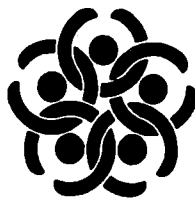

Dear Governor Sununu:

The American Mining Congress (AMC) is a national trade association that acts as an advocate of the industry's positions. Our members include all sectors and commodities of the mining industry, as well as equipment manufacturers and others that serve the mining industry.

We have serious concerns over possible actions by Congress that would amend the Occupational Safety and Health Act (OSH Act) and Mine Safety and Health Act (MSH Act) to increase both civil and criminal penalty sanctions. We strongly oppose this action, especially when it is implemented through budget activities without the open and due process of public scrutiny. We urge you to consider our concerns, which are based in part on the following:

- Civil penalties were established for improving workplace safety; criminal penalties are set to punish violators of the Acts. Neither was established to provide a general revenue source.
- Any amendments to the Safety and Health Acts should be accomplished by an open and thorough public process, not through closed and unrelated fiscal activities.
- Reported projections of future revenues (1991-1995) of \$1.13 billion for civil penalty violations are purely speculative and grossly exaggerated.
- No federal revenues would be derived where OSHA "state plan" agreements are in place (23 states).

- Dramatic increases in citation contests and appeals will ensue, placing an extraordinary burden on the administrative appeals process. There will be similar increases in litigation, overtaxing our already stressed judicial system. Due process will be compromised by excessive delays in rulings.
- Provisions currently exist whereby significant civil penalties can be levied and other punitive measures can be taken for violations (e.g. OSHA's "egregious violation" policy and MSHA's Pattern of Violations rule).
- Criminal penalty sanctions have been adequately addressed by the Crime Control Act of 1984. Inclusion of the proposed expansion of the scope of criminal sanction by the budget process is unacceptable.
- There is cause for concern that inspectors, and others, may be motivated or establish objectives based on revenue targets.
- The Occupational Safety and Health (OSH Act) does not mandate minimum penalties, and doing so will be counterproductive to positive accident prevention programs.

And most important:


- There will be no increased contribution to employee safety and health; on the contrary, diversion of finite resources will reduce protections.

The enclosed information elaborates on these and other important points.

We believe that increasing the maximum civil penalties by amending the OSH Act and the MSH Act through the budget process is wholly inappropriate. This action will not enhance employee safety and health; it will be detrimental to effective programs of accident reduction. We hope you will support this position and advise Congress of your objections.

Bureaucrats' good sense is in the minority

YOU PLAY the jury and decide. Does Mike Welbel discriminate in his hiring practices?

Welbel owns a small business, the Daniel Lamp Co., on Chicago's Southwest Side.

He buys lamp parts that are made elsewhere, and his workers assemble them in his plant. The lamps are shipped to furniture stores.

He has 26 employees. The jobs require little skill or education so the pay is low. But a job is a job. Welbel says that of his 26 workers, 21 are Hispanic and five are black.

At this point, some of you might say: Yes, Welbel discriminates because he doesn't have any non-Hispanic white employees.

Overruled. Welbel's business is in the heart of the Southwest Side's Hispanic community. So most of the people he hires are from the neighborhood. It's doubtful that anyone would want to travel a considerable distance to work in the lamp shop.

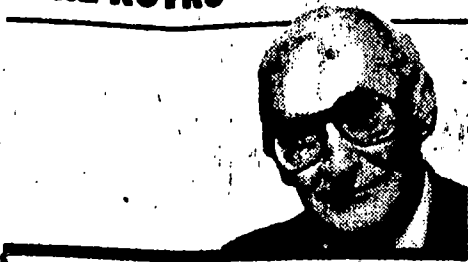
But yes, Welbel does discriminate. You might not think so, and I don't think so. That doesn't matter. Federal bureaucrats say he does. And so he's up to his ears in trouble.

It seems that a black woman applied for a job about 18 months ago. She wasn't hired. Welbel says he doesn't know why.

"I didn't interview her. Maybe the plant supervisor did. He's not here anymore. I don't know why she wasn't hired. Maybe we didn't need anyone. I just don't know."

But he does know that the woman filed a complaint with the Chicago office of the Equal Employment Opportunity Commission, the federal agency that is supposed to guard

against discriminatory hiring practices. She complained that she wasn't hired because she is black. And one spring day last year, two investigators came to his plant.

"I told them, 'Here's the records. Help yourselves. You can see everything.' What did I have to hide? I figured that if everybody who works for me is Hispanic or black, how could I be discriminating?"

"You see, when I started the business nine years ago, I used to deal with the state Department of Labor or place help-wanted ads.

"Then I got to know these Hispanic organizations — the Spanish Coalition and Latino Youth in Chicago — and we could call and say we needed a couple of people, and they'd say 'no problem,' and send someone in.

"So that's how I've done most of my hiring the last few years. When there's an opening, I call them and they refer people and we hire the ones who are best suited for the work."

That's why Welbel wasn't concerned when the federal bureaucrats came snooping. With

an all-minority work force, why should he worry? "I didn't even get a lawyer."

Now he knows why he should have worried. "Dealing with those government people is frightening. They do all the talking. They tell you how it's going to be. You just sit and listen. I've never even met the woman who filed the complaint."

The bureaucrats have told him how it is going to be.

First, they say he must pay the woman \$340.01 in wages she lost by not being hired.

Welbel says: "Fine. I'll be glad to pay her that just to get rid of the headache."

But that's just for starters. Sort of a small ante in the pot. The bureaucrats also demanded that Welbel pay \$123,991 in back pay.

Back pay to whom? Good question. The money is to be divvied up by six other blacks who weren't hired and whose names were found in Welbel's files. And by any other blacks who might have applied in 1988 and in 1989.

And who are these others? Welbel doesn't know. Nor do the bureaucrats. So the feds want Welbel to spend \$10,000 on newspaper ads to find black people who say they applied and weren't hired. Then they can come in and get their share of the \$123,991.

"They told me that I should have had 8.45 black employees in 1988 and 1989. They said that within a three-mile radius of my plant, companies that have 100 workers or more average 31.3 percent black. So I should have a 31.3 percent black work force. And that's how they came up with what I owe people who

didn't work for me.

"And they want me to spend \$10,000 on advertising to find people who didn't work for me so I can pay them \$123,991 for not working for me."

Is Welbel going to do it?

"I can't. I don't have the money. To tell the truth, the whole company isn't worth that much. That's why I came in this neighborhood. I got the building cheap. Nobody wanted it. I have a non-skilled work labor pool nearby.

"No, I can't pay that money. I'll have to close down, go out of business.

"This is incredible. I'm a small operation. I've got 26 minority people working for me. And here's this federal agency on my back with some mathematical formula that I never heard of before."

I called the EEOC officials for their side of it, but they wouldn't discuss the case. I can understand that. If I did something that loony, I wouldn't want to talk about it either.

So if the EEOC doesn't back off, Welbel might have to go out of business. And that will eliminate 26 jobs held by minorities. They won't have incomes, they won't pay taxes, and maybe some of them will have to go on welfare, which means someone else's taxes will be used to support them.

I wonder: Among all the other things the Japanese have acquired, do you think they might have bought the EEOC?

In the 1980's, the American economy experienced an unprecedented expansion, generated over 21 million new jobs -- more jobs than Europe, Canada and Japan combined -- and created more than 4 million new business enterprises. While the Nation's gross national product grew by 26.3 percent between 1983 and 1989, Federal tax revenues expanded by 35.7 percent, twice as fast as they did in the 1970s. Federal income taxes paid by the top 1 percent of taxpayers surged by over 80 percent - from \$51 billion in 1981 to \$92 billion in 1987.

Dear Mr. Sununu:

We support continued efforts by Congress and the Administration to reduce the federal budget deficit. We remain deeply concerned, however, that members of the budget summit are considering an energy tax on electricity as a means to raise revenue.

A recent survey conducted by Cambridge Reports/Research International indicates that Americans overwhelmingly oppose energy taxes. The survey asked 1,250 adult Americans: "In general, would you favor or oppose raising energy taxes on things like natural gas or electricity if the increased revenues were targeted specifically for reducing the federal budget deficit?" In response, 70 percent said they opposed energy taxes; 26 percent said they favored energy taxes; and four percent did not have an opinion.

We believe the public will not support energy taxes because energy is a necessity--not a luxury item. Taxing necessities will hurt low- and fixed-income individuals the most as they spend a higher percentage of their income for these necessary energy services. The regressive nature of an energy tax on electricity is becoming widely understood by these low- and fixed-income individuals.

In demonstration of this strong public sentiment, a number of consumer organizations have joined with EEI in opposition to energy taxes. These groups include: National Consumers League, The National Women's Political Caucus, the National Council of Jewish Women, The National Council of La Raza, the League of United Latin American Citizens and the National The National Association of Regulatory Utility Commissioners.

Energy taxes are likely to weaken the U.S. economy. Such a tax will be inflationary and increase the costs of U.S. goods and services to consumers. An increase in the cost of domestic goods would place the U.S. at a competitive disadvantage in the international marketplace. This problem is heightened by the Middle East crisis resulting in further inflationary prices on the U.S. economy.

I have enclosed a copy of the survey's results for your information. Energy taxes lack public support because they are unwarranted for economic and public reasons. They are regressive, inflationary and would have severe adverse effects on the economy and U.S. competitiveness. We strongly urge you to reject an energy tax as part of the budget summit agreement.

OUR MEMBERS, WHO ARE NOT PARTIES TO A CASE SHOULD HAVE THE RIGHT, REFLECTED IN MARTIN VS WILKS, TO CHALLENGE THE IMPLEMENTATION OF A CONSENT DECREE AFTER IT OPERATES TO HARM THEM. IT IS ONLY THEN THAT POLICE OFFICERS CAN DEMONSTRATE TO THE COURT HOW HE OR SHE HAS BEEN ACTUALLY HARMED, IN ADDITION TO MAKING LEGAL ARGUMENTS BASED ON THAT HARM.


Enclosed are a couple of copies of the October 1990 issue of *New Dimensions* magazine on the abortion issue.

Dear Governor:

The American Mining Congress representing much of America's metals, coal, industrial and agricultural minerals, supports rational and economically sound proposals to reduce the nation's federal budget deficit. We are concerned, however, that several proposals under consideration in the "budget summit" are seriously flawed, anti-competitive, anti-growth and should be rejected.

The American Mining Congress is particularly opposed to new energy taxes. Studies indicate that the economy, burdened by new energy taxes, will suffer in terms of higher inflation, job loss, and lower gross national product.

New energy taxes will play havoc with the domestic mining industry. Mining by its very nature is energy intensive. Higher energy taxes will serve only to drive up mining costs that domestic producers will be forced to absorb giving foreign producers new cost advantages. With no practical border tax adjustment, U.S. energy tax policy will favor imports, penalize exports thus reducing the demand for domestically mined minerals. This will cost miners their jobs and strain the tax base of many state and local governments that depend on a sound mining industry.

The American Mining Congress opposes the imposition of new selective excise taxes such as "luxury" taxes on jewelry. The United States is the second largest gold producer in the free world and jewelry fabrication is the largest end use of newly mined gold. A tax on jewelry will disrupt this segment of the industry and would do nothing to reduce the deficit. In fact, a House Ways and Means Committee report discussing an earlier repeal of certain excise taxes agreed with this conclusion stating that:



These selective excise taxes tend to reduce sales and therefore reduce income and jobs in industries that produce the taxed goods. In these ways, selective excise taxation results in arbitrary and undesirable distortion in allocation of resources and in this manner interferes with the free play of our competitive market.

Clearly this is not a desirable result and an approach destined to fail.

While the goal of deficit reduction is important, it is equally important how it is accomplished. Energy taxes that strike at the heart of the nation's production base and excise taxes on selected industries should not be part of the solution.



And in April she enlisted in the Army Reserve and is now on active duty at Fort Lee, Virginia and is trying very hard to make a career of service. "I want to defense America" is her reason for volunteering. "It is the best!" Everyone tells her that she is the most motivated person that they have ever met in the service. A quick glance at her enclosed *vitae* will show why. All of those encounters with the KGB, her time in a Soviet mental hospital for refusing to conform to the system (back in the early 1970s) shows why she has such feelings for the privilege of being in this country.

At the moment she is in the hospital at Fort Lee where they are repairing some damage she suffered in her efforts to out-do everyone else during basic training. She completes her advanced training at Fort Lee about the 19th and I will join her there to see the sights in the District. I would very much like to be able to introduce her to the President sometime late in that week. I am informed that he sometimes will take a minute and shake hands with visitors. How can it be arranged? Can your office help?

It would not only please her, very much, but of course, if we can arrange such an opportunity for her, she will think even more of us. She is trying to get into the Army's jump school because I went there during the Korean War and she thinks that being in the AIRBORNE is the next best thing to being able to walk on water. Of course, she thinks that the President can already walk on water. If we can arrange for her to meet the President I can assure you that we will be even higher on her list of heroes than we are now.

Thank you for your help. I hope to hear from your office as to whether we should even hope for such an opportunity.

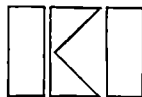



Dear John:

Hurray for your recent world class act. I am ready for a home State class act. Do you remember when you wrote the letter to the Secretary of the MIT Class of 1961 that was published in Technology Review? In it you urged the rest of us to consider public service at some time during our career. I was with Course VI, Class of 61, and have been an independent consultant, after serving Sanders, Fasfax, and other industrial firms (see enclosed resume). I have also served SARC and the Special Olympics in Salem and Durham as a volunteer. Events in my career and personal life have led me to heed your advice. I have started an exciting venture to serve the needs of a seriously neglected segment of our population. It involves both public and private service to disabled children and adults who are unable to communicate by speaking with their natural voice.

For several years well-thinking providers of service to severely motorically impaired individuals have made various attempts to use computers and other high technology devices to provide augmentative and alternative communication aids. The results have been less than satisfactory. The efficiencies of such systems are less than their lower tech counterparts. The key to resolving this dichotomy in results may lie in converging the differing perceptions of the problems as they really are by the different disciplines involved in delivering the service. For example, rehabilitation engineers should provide input to the assessment process. Jan Nesbit at UNH, Jim Whitlock at Northeast Rehab, Beth Taylor at Mary-Hitchcock, David Jordan at Crotched Mountain and several State government directors, such as Don Shumway, Ed Burke and Mike Jenkins, all are supporting me and feel that I am uniquely qualified to add the missing engineering component.

A letter of endorsement from you would carry considerable weight in our quest for private foundation seed money while we apply for federal grants.

It would also be helpful to know where the top support is for the American with Disabilities Act. My perception is that you left the State of New Hampshire in a ripe position to legitimately bring the motorically impaired minority forward to realize their full potential as productive citizens, paying taxes on their income instead of continuing to be a burden on other taxpayers. We have the determination to lead the way for the rest of the nation in the granting of civil freedom to this last pocket of discrimination.

Dear Mr. Sununu:

We support your efforts to reduce the federal budget deficit in consultation with Members of Congress in a budget summit. We are very concerned, however, that the Congress and Administration are contemplating imposing a broad-based energy tax as a means of raising revenue.

Broad-based energy taxes are inequitable, would have severe adverse effects on the economy and would impede our Nation's ability to compete in the international marketplace. Particularly in light of Iraq's invasion of Kuwait and the subsequent increase in oil prices, further inflationary pressures have the potential to seriously weaken the U.S. economy.

The most common proposals being discussed are taxes on domestic energy, such as a "btu" or "ad valorem" tax. These taxes will ultimately be borne by the consumer. Such taxes are clearly regressive, as low-income households spend a larger share of their budget for essential utility services. Thus, the greatest burden of an energy tax would fall on those individuals and households least able to afford additional costs.

A tax on domestic energy production and/or consumption would be inflationary as it would increase the costs of U.S. goods and services. Increased costs of domestic goods and services would place the U.S. at a competitive disadvantage with our foreign competitors. These taxes would encourage imports of foreign products, thereby worsening our trade deficit.

Energy taxes would be felt disproportionately among consumers in different geographic regions of the country. These taxes would have the greatest impact on these states and industries that produce and/or use the largest amount of energy. Many of these same states will be affected the greatest by the

requirements of the pending Clean Air bill. To impose an additional tax burden on these same consumers is particularly unfair.

In conclusion, we feel strongly that a broad-based energy tax is unwarranted for economic and public policy reasons. Taxing an essential service such as electricity is poor public policy because it would be regressive and regionally inequitable. In addition, an energy tax on domestic production/consumption would be inflationary and put the U.S. at a competitive disadvantage. For these reasons, we believe broad-based energy taxes should be rejected.
