Dear Mr. Sununu,

Some weeks back I saw on the news that our troops in Saudi Arabia were drinking bottled water. Now I know this is probably a good way to assure that our troops drink good water, however after this water has set for a period, it may require chlorine to stop bacterial growth. This in turn will allow the water to stay consumable. However, drinking water with chlorine in it is not good for humans and should be given some thought.

I would like to suggest a product that is lightweight and portable which a soldier could carry with his gear. This product is the National Safety Associates 10P, portable water filtration unit. It is made to take particles, taste and odor out of water and will also take the chlorine out as well. This will help the soldier to be able to drink good water. Even if (Heaven Forbid) we go to war and the soldier is getting water from ponds in Oasis, he will have to use chlorine tablets to purify this water, just like in World War II, Vietnam and Korea. This filter could be used to take the chlorine out prior to consumption. Once again to help the soldier come back from war without any side effects from our own indifference to take the chlorine out of his drinking water.

Now we currently know that the bottled water we buy is good when we buy it, but, what about 3-6 months from now?

I have a dream. I would like to see all our troops have a personal/portable water filtration unit to aid in being able to drink good chlorine free water!

If you were to give these units to our troops, it would no longer be necessary to purchase bottled water from a company, but you could simply fill containers with municipally treated water and send it to our troops. They in turn can filter out the chlorine prior to drinking, with the portable filtration unit. This would cut the cost for bottled water considerably, as the unit is less than 25 cents a gallon, in quantities of one unit!H Think of how much cheaper per troop the cost would be. also the fact remains that he can make his own bottled water in the field!

Please consider this option. I would like to know what you think of helping out the soldiers and giving them a unit which could help them in the long run.

I would like to also mention that we make all types of water filtration units, even bottleless water coolers. This could be good for the troops barracks where they could get water from a large tank which is chlorinated to prevent bacterial growth, but is filtered prior to coming out of the cooler. This would also be good for the government offices in the United States as well. Just think of the cost effectiveness of replacing water bubblers that use water at \$1.15 per gallon for a unit that gives you water for approximately 3 cents a gallon!

I know you are a very busy person and already have a lot on your mind. I am only trying to help with an option that not only saves the government money but gives it people good drinking water!

I would be most happy to come and talk some more with you, and also demonstrate this product to you and whoever it would be necessary to show as well.

It was recently brought to our attention that there was a D.O.T. proposal to tax each canoe, kayak, and raft in the United States \$25.00 for the benefit of the Coast Guard.

We are already struggling with incredibly high property taxes, state taxes, and federal taxes. Our workers' compensation and liability insurance have increased over 400% in the past three years.

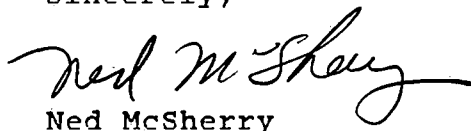
The companies on our river fund the Saco River Recreational Council the only river maintenance program we have. There is no state or federal help, say nothing of the Coast Guard! Our company alone donates \$4,000.00 annually to maintain our river. The majority of canoe outfitters have many local problems that require funding that the federal government has no involvement in. For the federal government to take money that could be used locally is very misguided! We have not been able to pass along these increases in insurance, property taxes, and river maintenance costs to our customers as it would increase our rates to a level that would hurt our business.

Knowing the general paddling public, I can guarantee you would have literally millions of people quite upset if their canoe was taxed \$25.00. The enforcement of this proposal would cost almost as much as it raised.

Almost all of our largest private and public institutions have over extended themselves - local government, state and federal government as well as banks and insurance companies and all are trying to increase their funding in an uncoordinated manner which could be a disaster to the average person and our economy.

This proposal is out of touch.

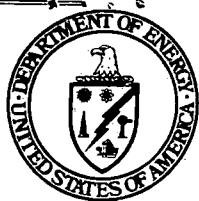

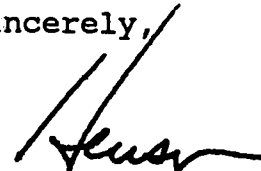

It has come to our attention that a proposed Commerce Department appointee, Sylvia Earle, was a Greenpeace activist in 1980.

Ms. Earle is currently being considered to represent the government of the United States in an important international organization, the International Whaling Commission. The perception that a U.S. government official may be promoting a Greenpeace or radical environmentalist agenda is likely to cast a shadow on our country's integrity at that organization and cause an irreparable rift in the attempt to seek international agreement on whale conservation measures.

Please see the attached articles from Icelandic newspapers describing Ms. Earle's activities on behalf of Greenpeace. She was accompanied by the head of Greenpeace's U.K. office, Alan Thornton, and Dr. Sidney Holt, who was paid by Greenpeace at that time and who now is employed by the International Fund for Animal Welfare.

Incidentally, last May the IWC Scientific Committee completed a comprehensive assessment of the central Atlantic minke whale stocks taken by the Icelanders and found the population to be robust and abundant, contrary to the assertions of the Greenpeace group when it tried to pressure Iceland.

I am writing this letter to you at the urging of my Icelandic friends, at my own expense, and without the knowledge or consent of my clients.

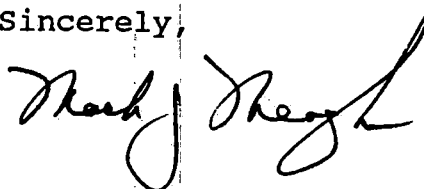

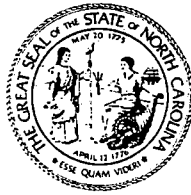

Dear Mr. Sununu,

I have never written to personally thank you for the wonderful eulogy you delivered at my dad's funeral, but I will always remember your words. He enjoyed working with you in New Hampshire, and valued your friendship. I thank you and all my family thanks you.

Not having followed my father's footsteps in politics, I have a very simplistic view of the problems facing our country today, and hope they don't seem too far-fetched to you. Dad instilled in me many values which may sound like his attitudes, but I feel he may have been correct in many of them.

I have some ideas which might work, and perhaps even enable President Bush to live up to those famous words of his, "READ MY LIPS-NO NEW TAXES!" and save the S&L's, make the senior citizens financially secure, reduce the National debt, and bring some sanity to an out of control bureaucracy in general.

1. Accomplish two things with a single stroke-Save S and L's and enable the next generation of retirees to become financially independent--all with no new taxes. Pass a law now allowing individuals to deposit a tax-deductible amount of up to 10% of their annual income into their IRA accounts (maximum of \$15,000, whichever is the least), more would be better, but that would be too hard to sell. This money could be deposited in one of two ways to be eligible for tax deduction. (1) Deposit it in a special escrow account set up by the Federal S&L Insurance Corp. of America at a low, tax-free interest rate, as in a Municipal Bond on today's market. (2) Deposit these IRA moneys directly with the S&L's at the going interest rate.

The majority of American Businesses are small corporations and they are strangled by government regulations to the point they can not afford proper retirement plans for their employees. Today's Employee is tomorrow's retiree, and we know from statistics that the retirement population is becoming a greater and greater burden on the fewer and fewer workers trying to support all the mess congress has created. Meanwhile the government spends SS moneys in the general budget. This is frightening.

**We need to take steps to create financially self-sufficient retirees during their "golden years".**

By the same token, a multibillion dollar bailout of the S & L crisis could be avoided because I believe that either a corporate deduction for the IRA Contribution or better still, an individual deduction from salary would create a simple way that all Americans could understand. It would create a tremendous influx of cash where it is needed. We don't need tax money from the people to solve this crisis. Then put the crooks who directed the S & L's in jail and make sure the S & L's are run properly the second time around. This will create a pool of money enabling more Americans to afford a home like they only dream to do now. This might even help to boost the real estate slump and help sell all the federal repo's whose portfolios are bulging.

**2. Encourage savings - Japan and other countries who now have the highest savings rates are economically fit - Do this by not taxing interest on saving accounts. Break it in gently - set limits to start with, but get it started.**

**3. Capital gains tax relief - Very important for stimulating investing and activity economically - Do not let Bush cave in on this - he can keep his promise.**

**4. Complete freeze on all new spending increases. Give teeth to Graham-Rudman. Do not raise national debt. Do not deceive the American people with useless economic indicators washed to give a rosy picture. Instead, use proper and meaningful accounting procedures in all government reports.**

**5. Pass law now - to allow tax deduction of up to dollar for dollar on donations for direct reduction of the PRINCIPAL on the federal debt. They are directly responsible, and they should rightfully assume that responsibility. No I am not crazy, I would be willing to bet that if proposed to the people on a ballot they would vote for this. Spending, Borrowing, and printing money to cover overbudget costs ALWAYS fails. History has proven this over and over again. When will responsible people ever learn? Only when they are forced to be responsible by a mandate from the people. So put it to a vote but let every American vote not just the congressmen. Let Dan Quail**

publically push for this on the next Pres. ballot across every state, he'll become an instant heavyweight with the common people.

7. All laws passed in Congress should pass by their own merits and not have "add ons" to compromise and please special interests. At least give the President line item veto power so we can hold him responsible .....

I'm sure better people than I have thought of all these things. But I want my children and grandchildren to have a chance at life unencumbered by the mistakes of Congress in the later 1900's. I pray you had time to read this. SUBJECT: President's Appearance Before the American  
Petroleum Institute

I understand that the White House is still considering accepting the invitation from the American Petroleum Institute for the President to speak at their annual meeting being held on November 12-13, 1990. While we disagree with the political benefits that some are arguing would result from using the speech to criticize the oil industry, we are also concerned that such a speech could have negative impacts on the current supply situation and that is the purpose of this memorandum.

First, we agree with the view that for political reasons the President would have to be critical of the industry for price increases. However, using this opportunity to jawbone for additional restraint on the part of the major integrated oil companies has the potential of perpetuating, and possibly exacerbating, incentives to export refined product and the current squeeze on independents.

The oil industry has generally responded well to the President's request for price restraint. A number of integrated oil companies have been holding prices down at their company owned and operated stations. Independent station owners must meet the refiners' street prices, so their prices also have remained low. Since the Mideast crisis began, retail gasoline in the United States has risen only about 20 cents per gallon, or less than half the increase in world crude oil prices. Gasoline prices in other countries have followed crude oil costs closely.

#### Exports of Refined Products

Wholesale prices in the United States also have not kept up with those elsewhere. In late July, leaded premium gasoline in the Rotterdam spot market cost 2 cents per gallon more than unleaded regular gasoline in the New York Harbor spot market. By mid-September, Rotterdam's price exceeded New York's by 26 cents. Thus, Europe became a more attractive market for gasoline than the U.S. East Coast. This led to the widely reported incidents of U.S. gasoline exports to Europe during September.

U.S. East Coast depends heavily on imports, largely from the Caribbean and Venezuela, for supplies of gasoline in summer and heating oil in winter. If the Europe-U.S. price spreads stay high, these foreign sources may choose to export to more lucrative European markets in the coming months. Therefore, continued or increased oil industry price restraint may contribute to a decrease in U.S. supply of imports from its traditional offshore sources. If this happens during the winter, it could have a negative impact on heating fuel stocks. Very visible exports to Europe also could occur.

#### Squeeze on Independents

Wholesale prices at U.S. terminals, which supply independent dealers, have risen more than U.S. retail prices. Obviously, this creates a financial disadvantage for independent, non-refiner dealers. In addition, a significant supply effect also may result because some smaller, non-integrated refiners may not be able to continue to afford price restraints. Because of their other operations, integrated firms may be able to cushion refining losses from a price restraint program. Most non-integrated refiners, on the other hand, must pay the market price for all of their crude oil supplies and may not have other substantial operations. If crude oil costs rise faster than product revenues, the smaller, non-integrated refiner may have no recourse but to shut down operations temporarily. For example, they may decide to schedule maintenance activities reducing supply.

#### Summary

In conclusion, price restraint by the domestic industry has created distortions in oil markets not unlike more formal price controls. Positive aspects are reduced economic damage and lessened consumer discomfort as prices rise. These should be weighed against the possibility of negative supply effects in the coming months, and the probable longer term impact on independent refiners and distributors.

The Medical Society of Arab Americans in its endeavor to address Medical and Humanitarian questions here at home and the Arab World, has been instrumental in trying to gap the differences between those who are dealing with these issues especially in a hostile environment such as that long existed in the Middle East. Since the Institute for Social and Economic Policy in the Middle East at Harvard had initiated programs dealing with such issues, our Organization carried out a successful medical and humanitarian conference, in conjunction with the Institute, in Amman and Jerusalem March, 1989. The cooperation of adversaries such as the Jordanian Authorities, the Israeli Authorities and the Palestinian Medical Association to make our mission successful, was unprecedented.

The recent Gulf crises created among us deep concern about medical and humanitarian problems that could arise in the aftermath. At our last Board Meeting Sept. 28th, 1990, an overwhelming support was expressed in favor of contacting the office of the President to see if we can get approval to visit Iraq and Kuwait, so as to get first hand look at the medical and psychologic needs of the Americans held there. Meanwhile, assessing the needs of the children, the

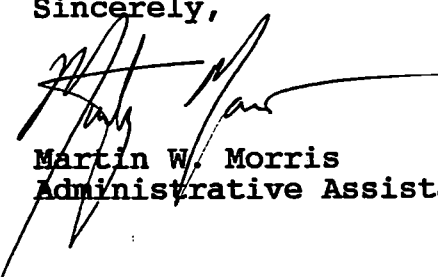
On Monday, Tuesday and Wednesday of this week, before our position on the budget agreement was made public, we received well over a thousand telephone calls to our various offices.

Senator Lugar's district offices in Evansville, Fort Wayne, Hammond, Indianapolis and Jeffersonville received approximately 1,220 calls from constituents voicing their strong opposition to the budget proposal. In these same offices, only 110 Hoosiers called to register their support of the budget agreement.

In our Washington, D.C. office the volume of calls was not as high; however, the percentages were similar. We received approximately 250 calls with only 8 constituents in favor of the budget proposal.

Senator Lugar's statewide approval rating at this time is 78%, and we have indicated our willingness to extol the virtue and courage of those who support the President and our Congressional leadership. However, as you can see from the opinions expressed by our constituents, this will be an uphill battle in most of the Indiana delegation's offices.

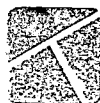

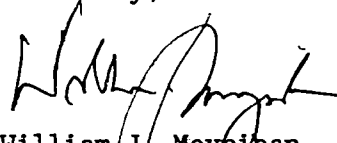

This will confirm the offer you made in our discussion yesterday evening in the Vice President's office to assist our industry in adjusting to the heavy negative impact of the budget summit agreement. It is my understanding that you will recommend transition rules to the bipartisan congressional leadership which will:

- (1) Delay the effective date of alcohol beverage excise tax increases from January 1, 1991 to April 1, 1991. This will avoid a disastrous Holiday selling season since hundreds of thousands of retailers will be reluctant to stock up because of the floor stocks tax due on the level of their New Year's Eve inventories;
- (2) Provide relief to wholesalers and retailers to the maximum extent possible from the burden of financing and paying a floor stocks tax on their inventories on the effective date of the tax. (Even though the incidence of federal excise taxes on alcohol beverages falls on the producer, wholesalers and retailers would be required to pay a tax equal to the amount of the tax increase on their existing inventories on the effective date of the tax.)

Although the foregoing does not exhaust the list of transition priorities that we will continue to seek, based on your assurances of administration advocacy of bipartisan congressional action to implement the above understanding, I am prepared immediately to recommend to our executive committee that our association and its nationwide membership support passage, before October 5, 1990, of a budget resolution containing necessary



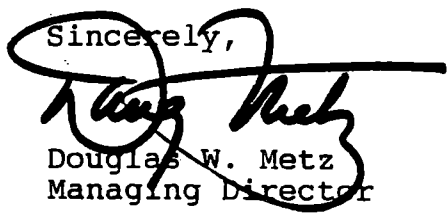

instructions to implement fully the budget summit agreement. We will, of course, monitor Congressional actions taken to implement the resolution and the understanding contained in this letter. We are very unhappy with the rates specified in the agreement, particularly that of distilled spirits, and further escalation of any of the rates would be not only unfair but unconscionable.

We appreciate your sensitivity to the real concerns that we have as distributors about the double impact of reduced consumer demand on top of tremendous increases in our delivery costs occasioned by motor fuel tax increases on top of currently escalating pump prices.

Dear Governor Sununu:

We understand that one of the proposals being considered by the budget summit negotiators would disallow the corporate deduction for interest paid on tax underpayments. The Electronic Industries Association (EIA) opposes this measure because it denies, without careful consideration by the Congress, a deduction for a legitimate business expense, and because it grants the IRS an unfair advantage when it disagrees with reasonable positions taken by taxpayers.

This measure raises a serious issue of fairness. It appears to raise revenue by forcing taxpayers to make payments to the IRS that the taxpayers would be able to ordinarily contest. It is unfair to require a taxpayer to choose between agreeing with the IRS on audit (even in instances where the taxpayer has legitimate reasons for contesting the IRS viewpoint), or losing the interest deduction in the event the taxpayer is deemed to have been mistaken and has underpaid its taxes. At a time when the Congress has expressed grave concerns about overreaching by the IRS, it should not provide additional tools permitting the agency to become more adversarial.

More importantly, we think it is unwise to disallow, without careful consideration and hearings, business expense treatment for a valid business expense. There has never been any suggestion that all interest paid to the IRS should be treated as a penalty. Ample penalty provisions now exist, and, in fact, the entire area of IRS penalties was fully examined by Congress only last year. Corporate interest expenses are a cost of doing business, to whomever paid. Any analogy to personal interest expenses (which are not deductible) is weak. Expenses deductible by corporations are not deductible by individuals because those expenses are not costs of conducting a trade or business.

Finally, many large, publicly-held companies have accrued the tax benefit of interest on potential tax deficiencies. The proposed interest disallowance would have a devastating impact on fourth quarter earnings at a time of market instability and high capital needs.

On behalf of the Distilled Spirits Council of the United States (DISCUS), representing over 90 percent of the producers and marketers of distilled spirits in the U.S., we wish to inform you that we strongly oppose the reported budget agreement to increase the tax on distilled spirits from \$12.50/proof gallon to \$14.00/proof gallon.

It is important to note that if a \$10 billion target has been set for beverage alcohol, the \$10 billion can be raised with spirits taxed at a much lower rate than a \$1.50 in new taxes. Our calculations clearly demonstrate that even a \$1.00 increase in spirits could raise the required amounts.

While the reported tax package has increases for beer and wine, it must be recognized that their current tax rate and even their newly proposed tax rate is still significantly below the absolute tax level that would be incurred by distilled spirits. This is not a fair sharing of the tax burden! This is especially the case after we unilaterally took the full blow of a \$2.00 tax increase in 1985. While we are not arguing for higher taxes on beer and wine, clearly, within the revenue raising package, a sensible adjustment can and should be made to hold spirits to no more than a \$1.00 increase.

The spirits industry is a responsible industry and would like to positively participate in helping develop a fair and equitable tax package that we could enthusiastically support. To our great dismay, this is not the situation we find ourselves in with a \$1.50 increase. It is unfair for our constituency and our consumers to become the objects of an unjustifiably high "plug" tax number that seems to go up, while other segments of the beverage alcohol industry come down. While such adjustments may seem minor to the negotiators, every penny of additional taxes on spirits has a strong and immediate adverse impact on our segment of the economy.

Distilled spirits already is the highest taxed consumer product in the U.S. with 45 percent of the cost of a bottle of spirits currently going to taxes. Additionally, distilled spirits was the only beverage alcohol product taxed in 1985 when we went from \$10.50/proof gallon to \$12.50/proof gallon. This caused over a five percent decline in sales from which we are still trying to recover. Additionally, there have been over 100 tax increases on distilled spirits at the state level in the past five years.

Distilled spirits sales have been declining on average two percent a year for the past nine years. The \$1.50 new increase will add an additional three percent sales decline on top of the two percent per year. It is not just a case of higher taxes but also the fact that we already are closing plants and laying off substantial numbers of employees.

We strongly recommend that an appropriate downward adjustment be made in the proposed spirits tax rate so that we can be supportive of the entire tax package to reduce the Federal deficit.

Re: Worsening Conditions in New Hampshire

Dear John:

You are no doubt up to your ears in international problems and activities, however, if John Stabile has not already told you so, the financial conditions herein New Hampshire get bleaker every day. In that regard, I enclose some of the more recent pertinent newspaper articles, including the Thursday auction pages, which used to be 1 - 2 pages, and now average 10 - 11 pages of mostly foreclosures.

I think the foreclosure situation relates specifically to the banks in the state effectively being out of business as regards making new loans of any type. Here are some of the experiences that people I talk with have had over the last month.

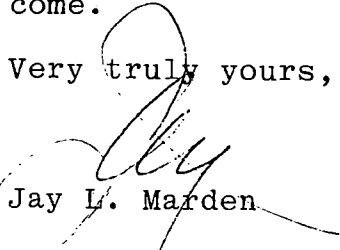
1. A residential broker with four signed contracts to build new houses for people with approved credit was told the bank could only handle one of the loans, but only if they could lay it off on the secondary mortgage market. (Amoskeag Bank)
2. A customer of Dartmouth Savings Bank who runs \$60,000 a month through the bank in his business applied for a car loan and was turned down; upon inquiring why, he was informed the bank was so short on funds that they "could not lend him money on the car, a mortgage, or even issue anyone a new Visa card".
3. I personally was at Dartmouth Savings last week and was told by a Vice President that the bank has so much foreclosed property on the books, or about to be foreclosed, that they are making no new loans to anyone.
4. Also last week, we were informed that the Hillsborough Bank & Trust lending officers were instructed to make no further new loans, period, even to existing customers, as their holding company had decided to shrink their bank down from \$65,000,000 to \$60,000,000.

It seems that these scenarios are becoming more prevalent each week, with the resultant increases in bankruptcies and layoffs. So goes the economy in New Hampshire as we approach a bleak winter.

By the way, unleaded regular gas has gone from \$1.03 a gallon in August to its current price of \$1.37.

As a suggestion; how about reorganizing the savings banks to allow them only to lend on single or multi-family houses, and as an incentive for people to deposit their money in savings banks, make any interest earned thereon, tax free until such time as the Savings and Loan problem is overcome. <sup>OR APARTMENTS</sup>

Dear Mr. Sununu:

As you know the new Federal criteria for identifying wetlands have resulted in 75% of Chatham County's acreage being categorized as jurisdictional wetlands. This will strangle development, reduce property values and the tax base, subject our citizens to the long, cumbersome and expensive corps of engineers permitting process, and pose a serious threat to the economics of the coastal counties.

Figures that I have indicate that if the criteria and definitions of the Federal Manual for Identifying and Delineating Jurisdictional Wetlands remain unchanged on 12.5% of our total acreage is available for growth and development. Half of the "upland" area of Chatham County is already developed, and unfortunately, most remaining pieces of upland are small, poorly located for development, and accessible only through areas which the "manual" defines as wetlands.

An already understaffed corps will struggle to cope with an ever increasing backlog of requests for permits. What is sadder yet, the overwhelming majority of lands which the "manual" defines as wetlands are in fact dry. Also these criteria, which have the effect of taking jobs and opportunities for economic growth away from our citizens, do nothing to enhance the environment.

It seems to me that the criteria contained in the "manual" were developed without meaningful independent scientific review, without public input, and certainly without congressional approval. A "manual" as for reaching as this should never be developed in such a way.

Commissioner Julie Smith of Chatham County attended a public hearing in Baltimore on the wetlands issue. She outlined several areas in which she believed the "manual" to be technically flawed. I fully agree with her assessment. I

will not go into detail by repeating her full statement. However, I do urge you to give every consideration to her review. She has expressed the concerns of many people.

Please include in the "manual" the EPA's 404 Regulations defining wetlands which read "wetlands generally include swamps, marshes, bogs, and similar areas."

Apparently the "manual" uses existing regulations and soil lists which were intended for taxonomic classification, not regulatory purposes. I urge you to revise the criteria to identify only those sites with a predominance of obligate wetland plant species occurring on true hydric soils.

It is impossible to develop a valid single set of criteria for application in all areas of our county. Coastal Georgia is very different from the plains of the mid-west. Again, I urge you to develop regional manuals which deal precisely with the variables of climate, rainfall, vegetation and soils of each region.

Some wetlands are of extreme environmental importance while others have minimal ecological significance. Please revise the "manual" to protect significant wetlands while allowing the development of less important wetlands.

Please simplify the system of identifying wetlands. Only trained biologists, botanists and soil experts can operate this system. A cumbersome, complex and slow system will only increase staffing of regulatory agencies.

It is my hope that the bureaucracy will not persist in retaining inappropriately classified dry land as wetlands, but if it does, then property owners should be compensated when property is designated as jurisdictional wetland, its value declines sharply. Owners of such lands suffer significant losses.

I urge you to take a strong stand with the United States Army Corps of Engineers, United States Environmental Protection Agency, United States Fish and Wildlife Service, and the National Marine Fisheries Service to have these criteria revised. In their present form they are destructive. Coastal Georgia will suffer dire consequence without the proper changes.

Thank you for your prompt attention to this matter.

Dear John,

It's been many years since I visited with you and Nancy in West Concord. Since then I have been following your career with great interest - as has my wife Betty, who you may remember from the High Energy Physics project at Tufts.

Betty received her M.A. at Tufts in Human Factors Engineering - some time after you left - and is now working on several defense projects for GTE Sylvania. She sends to you and your family her warmest regards.

My understanding is that the President will be making a short visit to Massachusetts on October 4th or so, to show political support for Republican candidates here. As a Republican, I know the value of a presidential endorsement to any campaign especially when the President holds a 70% favorability rating nationwide. There's no doubt that Massachusetts Republicans will benefit from the appearance of George Bush.

But that doesn't have to be a broad brush endorsement of all candidates. - When gubernatorial candidate Rep. Steve Pierce passed an amendment in the House to ban homosexuals from adopting foster children, Lucile Hicks undermined his bill in the Senate. She cut the prohibitive language about homosexuals after consulting with the Mass Gay and Lesbian Political Caucus. As a result, homosexuals now have the right to adopt foster children in the State of Massachusetts. Hicks calls this a victory.

I have extreme doubts that the President was aware of Hicks' social agenda last May when the postcards were sent out to the 5th Middlesex District.

Now that she has publically withdrawn from the State Republican Committee, Hicks is moving to garner any independent and liberal Evelyn Murphy votes that she can.

As a Republican, I don't believe that Lucile Hicks should enjoy any White House support during her campaign. I hope that President Bush concurs.

There's no "true" Republican running in this district.

That's why I'm voting Democrat for the State Senate seat.

That's why I'm voting against ninth month abortions and homosexual foster care - against unrestricted abortions for minors. Against the distribution of condoms in grade schools.

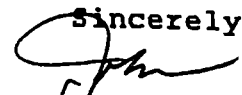
That's why I'm voting for my son - Bryan.

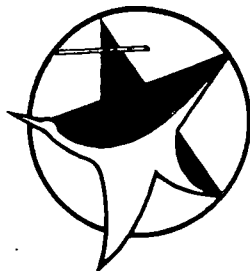

Dear John:

On September 7, I sent you a note and a copy of my letter to my Japanese counterpart (copy enclosed), urging the Japanese business community to exert greater pressure on their government to maximize Japan's contribution to the allied Persian Gulf effort. This is to advise you of the results of my letter.

I am please to report that on September 14, the four top Japanese business organizations (Keidanren, Japan Chamber of Commerce and Industry, Keizai Doyukai and Japan Federation of Employers) issued an unusual joint public statement.

Speaking for the entire "Japanese economic community", the statement urged the Japanese government to take a more aggressive approach in dealing with the Persian Gulf crisis. Specifically, the public statement:

- ◆ expresses "unanimous support" for contributions by the Japanese government, while calling for the removal of all obstacles to such contributions;
- ◆ gives "full support" to United Nations economic sanctions;
- ◆ urges new legislation in Japan (including a law to offer cooperation for United Nations peace-keeping efforts) so that the government can better respond to future crisis; and
- ◆ urges the government to go beyond emergency aid for nations standing up against Iraq to develop longer term ties in the region.

I am taking the liberty of quoting parts of Mr Saito's September 19 response to my letter.

"Grave anxiety is being felt by us regarding the Middle East situation, which, with no easing of a hair-trigger crisis in sight, only seems to show signs of dragging on. As this region not only constitutes Japan's lifeline supplying 70% of its total oil requirements, but also plays a significant role in sustaining the stability and development of the whole world, we have a serious interest in seeking a solution to the Persian Gulf crisis.

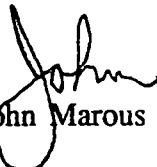
We are firmly determined to combine the private and public sectors' efforts in the formation of a consensus of Japanese people so that Japan can make stepped-up contributions to the joint action of the countries of the world.

I thank you again for your letter and would like to express my sincere hope that the complete withdrawal of Iraq from Kuwait will materialize as soon as possible, restoring the peace and stability in this important region. I hope that the frequent contact with you as chairman of the two business councils will help solve this crisis."

I promised Mr. Saito that I would share the results of his letter with the White House. This note to you does so.

As a business man chairing a business group, I am uncomfortable addressing strategic issues. However, I think the Persian Gulf warranted our Council's involvement. I am pleased with the results of this involvement, which I think paid off.
