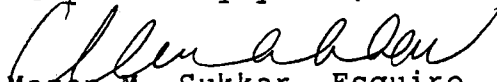

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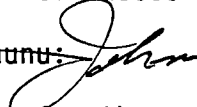

I have written today, " In Memory of Jimmy Reed, Soldier " for the record and especially for you. I wanted to tell you how a man, a kid, died in battle. 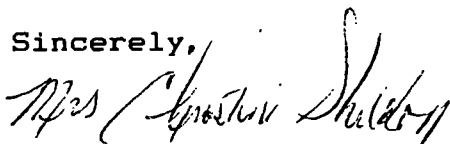

Baghdad's ability to defeat a water blockade would be minimal. The Ataturk Dam has several surface-to-air missile batteries around it, according to U.S. intelligence sources, and other facilities could easily be outfitted with the defense systems as well. Moreover, Turkey, as part of its NATO duties, is already equipped for intercepting and defeating enemy aircraft that might try to attack such facilities. All this, combined with poor Iraqi intelligence, insures the probable survivability of the dams.

Unlike the embargo on food, circumventing a water cutoff by finding an alternative supply would be difficult for Iraq. While Iraq could shift water supplies from agricultural and industrial to human use, water experts believe that this would provide only a few days' relief. A military response would be short-lived: the Iraqi war machine would quickly grind to a halt for lack of water.

A water cutoff is really no more or less ethical than the U.N.-supervised food embargo. Any distinction between the two is artificial. Water experts point out that a cutoff could be calibrated to allow the bare minimum necessary for humanitarian aims.

Moreover, in strategic terms, a water cutoff is preferable to a stalemate. Time would be working against Mr. Hussein; he would be presented with a grave problem that could be solved only by negotiating with the states arrayed against him. Military action would be pointless.

Turkey has not publicized its capacity to use the water weapon, largely because it would quickly become the main villain in Baghdad's eyes. But Turkey seriously needs economic assistance and lately has been beset by fears that its status as a NATO power is declining with the winding down of the cold war. The United States and the other industrial powers have the means to make such blockade an attractive option for the Turks.

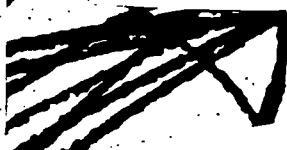
The German military philosopher Karl von Clausewitz wrote that a good strategy identifies the enemy's main weakness and then exploits it. With Saddam Hussein isolated by land, sea and air, Iraq's main weakness has yet to be exploited; only by doing so will his misadventure be brought to a humane and speedy end.

The Turks can do much the same with the Tigris. Half a dozen water diversion projects exist along the Turkish portion of this river. According to a report issued earlier this year by the Turkish state water works, running all of these facilities at full capacity during the dry season could "dramatically cut the flow" to Iraq.

Dear John,

I recently returned from a fact-finding trip to Taiwan and I wanted to share some of our findings with you.

The main focus of our research was education, but one of the most serious concerns I brought from Taiwan involves a foreign policy matter.

There is a growing perception in both Taiwan and Mainland China that the United States will not intervene if Mainland China threatens the sovereignty of Taiwan. The day we left Taiwan an editorial in a Mainland newspaper said the United States had proven its inability to defend its allies when Kuwait was invaded. It is obvious that the government of Mainland China thinks (and hopes) that the United States would not act quickly to prevent Communist China from invading and annexing Taiwan.

Taiwan is a vital ally to the United States and a strong voice for Democracy in the Far East. They need and deserve to know that the United States will help defend Taiwanese sovereignty in the face of aggression from the Mainland.

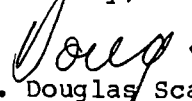
All eight members of our group, including state representatives Elizabeth Hager and William Kidder, very strongly urge President Bush to let both the people of Taiwan and the government of Communist China know in no uncertain terms that the United States is unwaveringly committed to the liberty of allies like Taiwan.

We spent a great deal of time in Taiwan dealing specifically with education and observed that they had considerably fewer administrative positions in their education system than we do. One elementary school we visited had 6000 students and only 13 administrative employees, not including teachers. The American education system could certainly save millions of dollars at the federal, state and local level by reducing administrative costs.

One final note - I have a number of concerns about the recent election here in New Hampshire that I'd like to discuss with you. Perhaps we can get together the next time you visit New Hampshire, or discuss it over the phone when your schedule permits.

I look forward to hearing from you.

John:

Now that the Congress (Democrats, that is) has worn out the budget process as the club with which to knock the President on the head, usurpation of the President's powers under the Constitution as the architect of foreign and military policy in the Middle East, etc. seems to be the goal.

A handful of "lilliput" Napoleons in Congress (who would be President, but aren't), have one absorbing thought, i.e., to keep the President from exercising his Art. II powers as Commander-in-Chief without their permission.

As I talk with my old colleagues on the Republican National Committee, I get the impressions that they would like the President to be more assertive of his prerogatives.

In U.S. v. Curtiss-Wright Export Corp., 299 U.S. 304 (1936), the Supreme Court defined the President's powers in this area, but one would think many members of Congress are ignorant of the law.

In this decision the Supreme Court said, in pertinent part:

"In this vast external realm (foreign affairs), with its important, complicated, delicate and manifold problems, the President alone has the power to speak or listen as the representative of the nation.

"It is important to bear in mind that we are here dealing not alone with an authority vested in the President by an exertion of legislative power, but with such an authority plus the very delicate, plenary and exclusive power of the President as the sole organ of the Federal government in the field of international relations - a power which does not require as a basis for its exercise an act of Congress...."

It has been settled by the courts that the President does

not require any action by Congress to use military force to protect the Nation, its citizens and its commerce in his capacity as architect of foreign policy and Commander-in-Chief.

When on November 7, 1973, Congress enacted the War Powers Resolution over the President's veto, it was recalled that Secretary of State Dean Acheson, testifying before Congress, explained:

"Not only has the President the authority to use the Armed Forces in carrying out the broad foreign policy of the United States and implementing treaties, but it is equally clear that this authority may not be interfered with by the Congress in the exercise of powers which it has under the Constitution." (Hearings before the Sen. Comms. on Foreign Relations and Armed Services, 82nd Cong., 1st Sess., 993 (1951)).

As Acheson is a great hero of the Democratic Party, it might be useful to remind them of the views of their foreign policy patron saint at some appropriate time.

It is well established that nationality and sovereignty do not depend upon powers in the Constitution, but derive from the law of nations. The rights and powers of the United States in the field of foreign relations are vested in the Chief Executive and are inherently inseparable from nationality.

When Chief Justice John Marshall was a member of the House of Representatives, he stated:

"The President is the sole organ of the nation in its external relations, and its sole representative with foreign nations....He possesses the whole executive power. He holds and directs the force of the nation." (10 Annals of Congress 596, 613-14(1800)).

In Durand v. Hollins, 4 Blatch. 451, 454 (1860) the Court said:

"As respects the interposition of the Executive abroad for the protection of the lives or property of the citizen, the duty must, of necessity rest in the discretion of the President ... under our system of government the citizen abroad is as much entitled to protection as the citizen at home."

Justice Miller said the President's duty is not limited "to the enforcement of acts of Congress or of treaties of the United States according to their express terms, but includes the rights, duties and obligations growing out of the Constitution itself, our international relations, and all the protection implied by the nature of the Government under the Constitution."

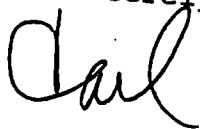
During the Civil War President Lincoln used force without any declaration of war or act of Congress, and the Supreme Court ruled in *The Prize Cases*, 2 Bl.(67 U.S. 635, 69(1863):

"The President was bound to meet it in the shape it presented itself, without waiting for Congress to baptize it with a name; and no name given to it by him or them could change the fact."

The Research Service of the Library of Congress, after reviewing the history of the Constitutional Convention and various U.S. Supreme Court decisions has concluded:

"When hostile action is taken against the Nation, or against its citizens or commerce, the appropriate response by order of the President may be resort to force." (The Const. of the U.S. of America", U.S. Gov. Printing Office(1987), pp. 337-339)

I am writing to urge your support for the Clean Lakes Program by encouraging the Administration to include this program in the Environmental Protection Agency's (EPA) FY92 budget request. This program has been consistently left out of EPA's budget request and OMB's budget review process. However, in consideration of a cost/benefit analysis, the Clean Lakes program is a win-win effort and enshrines the "points of light" metaphor.

The Clean Lakes Program is a ground-up structure. It entails maximum volunteer effort, full community participation and matching funds from the state or locality in order for grants to be awarded. The returns are lasting. Dying lakes, generally involving eutrophication due to improper development and siltation, can be returned to thriving ecological and economical resources again.

I recently had the opportunity to become involved with a Clean Lakes project in my own district. The community used the local high school science class and local experts to implement the many required tests for application. In addition, a local pilot and journalist provided the professional aerial photographs required for various scientific analyses. An individual who was very much responsible for the tenacity necessary to receive this grant was recently recognized by President Bush at the Teddy Roosevelt Awards ceremony.

The grant finally awarded by EPA was not only well deserved, but cherished by the community. As such, it is being utilized with maximum efficiency. This program is not synonymous with dumping money down a bureaucratic hole. It is pragmatic from an economic viewpoint as well as an environmental one. It restores

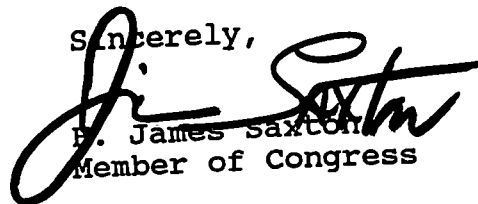

I know that I'm not "licensed" to give advice in the area of which is the subject of this letter, but I can't help trying because I think it's so important.

I think the President ought to ask the Congress for a declaration of war, effective by some date certain (March 1st ?) if he has determined that certain conditions have not been met before that deadline.

I believe that the "opposition" is in the process of destroying national resolve by way of a million tiny increments.

While the President is clearly doing what he ought to do to build international consensus and a viable military capacity, the negators are destroying domestic unity.

Subject: Arizona Governor's Race

As you know, we have a gubernatorial runoff election in Arizona scheduled for February 26th. I am writing this to share with you my thoughts about the race and to explore the potential for additional White House assistance.

Incidentally, it may not have made the news media here, but at his press conference the morning after the election, Fife Symington was asked whether he intended to avoid President Bush' support in the runoff. His answer was unequivocal. He said that he was proud to have the President's endorsement, that he would always be proud to stand "shoulder to shoulder with George Bush," and that he felt that the President is doing a great job.

Since we have the President's endorsement on videotape (which we used in a commercial during the campaign), and given the expense involved in holding a Presidential fundraiser in Arizona, my feeling is that the best use of the President's time and energy would be for him to agree to appear at a Washington, D.C. reception. With your help, we could try to attract the support of the New York investment firms which backed Terry Goddard in the regular election (because they believed the lie that his election was a foregone conclusion) but may be interested now in hedging their bets.

The fact that we cannot accept out-of-state PAC money remains a serious liability to holding a D.C. event, but given the uniqueness of this race and what is at stake, I feel that we should be able to turn out individual contributors who would like to support the Republican Party and shake hand with President Bush (the maximum individual contribution allowed by Arizona law is \$550; no corporate money is allowed).

An event in early or mid-January would appear to be the optimum timing.

1. Would the President agree to be the host of a Symington reception in Washington and appear at that event? Could you give us a date and guidelines for selecting a location?
2. On the day of the reception, could we arrange for Symington to meet with you and the President in the Oval Office and invite the Arizona media in for a photo opportunity? This would ensure a major news hit in the state.

Let me briefly explain why I am optimistic about the outcome of the Arizona runoff:

- ▶ By finishing 4500 votes ahead of Goddard (after being written off by virtually every national and local predictor), Symington has succeeded in making his campaign truly viable; now, everyone knows he can win.
- ▶ Republicans hold a 100,000 voter registration edge; in special elections, Republicans have historically turned out in greater numbers than Democrats.
- ▶ The February 26th date, and the fact that there is no Tribal election being held concurrently on the Indian reservations, works to the advantage of the GOP (Navajos vote Democrat).
- ▶ We ought to be able to at least match Goddard in fundraising if not out-raise him.
- ▶ We have a better message than Goddard and a campaign that is viewed as having been successful, versus the Goddard campaign that went awry.

In the general election, the Democrats seized control of the Arizona State Senate. This makes control of the Governorship all the more important from the standpoint of redistricting (Arizona will get one, perhaps two, new House seats in 1992).

You were kind to lend your support to Fife by attending his reception in Washington last October. I hope that you are inclined to give us the support we need in order to elect a new Republican Governor in Arizona in February.

I will look forward to hearing from you or your staff.

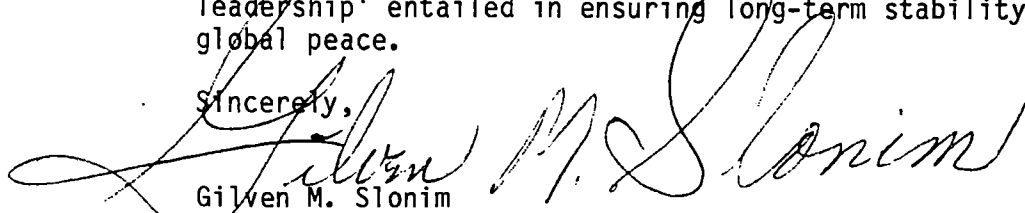

Re: CSO In-Plant Bypass

Dear John:

In accordance with EPA National Policy, cities and towns throughout the United States must begin to address combined sewer overflows (CSO). Based on estimates currently available, the monetary impact of this undertaking is staggering. There just are not enough federal, state or local financial resources available to handle the problem. In view of this fact, it is felt that every opportunity should be taken to help alleviate the CSO problem by making maximum use of wastewater facilities already available.

One such issue is the EPA regulations concerning in-plant bypasses (40 CFR 122.41). EPA policy is that CSO's are not subject to secondary treatment regulations applicable to publicly owned treatment works. However, flows to a treatment plant, including wet weather flows, are subject to secondary treatment regulations. This position forces communities to discharge combined sewage (runoff, rain, snowmelt, and sewage) upstream of the treatment plant rather than to maximize the capacity of the treatment plant. Rather than violate water quality standards, communities must, by regulation, overflow outside the plant proper.

Many treatment plants have the capability to provide a degree of treatment and disinfection to a volume of flow greater than their secondary treatment plant capacity. Accordingly, for little or no additional cost, many communities could increase their ability to treat stormwater and reduce the frequency of overflow by constructing an in-plant bypass. This would allow the treatment plant to provide secondary treatment up to the capacity of the plant and primary treatment and disinfection to an additional quantity of flow. The attached New England Water Pollution Control Association position paper provides a case study of the Nashua, N.H. Wastewater Treatment Facility which illustrates this problem.

is recommended that the EPA regions in conjunction with each state be allowed to readdress the bypass issue on a case-by-case basis through the NPDES permit process.

The State of New Hampshire has six communities which are impacted by the CSO regulations, but this bypass policy is of major significance to the cities of Manchester and Nashua. Allowing primary treatment of the CSO flow has major implications to both cities in saving hundreds of millions of dollars and providing immediate benefits to water quality.

During the meeting on October 1, which you and the Vice President conducted at OEGB, I apprised you of the strong resentment our industry felt from the Administration's initiative to quintuple our taxes. The resentment was fed in large part by the refusal of the White House to grant our industry an interview at anytime during the preceding 21 months of the Administration's life. We have some issues which exceed those of excise taxes and which could also coincide with the basic governing philosophy of the Bush Administration.

Without going any further in detail on those issues, I would like to direct your attention to one immediate concern now raised by the departure of William Bennett. Our entire industry was pleased by the judgement shown by Mr. Bennett in his carefully drawn distinction between illicit drugs and our legal and highly regulated products. Mr. Bennett successfully resisted the pressures of the special interest groups whose basic philosophy is prohibition in disguise.

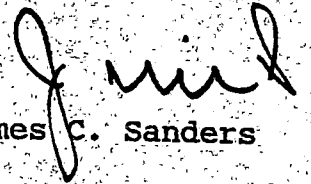
We know that the anti-alcohol lobby will be hard at work to place one of their own as Bennett's successor. Such a person would manipulate that office to blur the distinction between illicit drugs and our products. 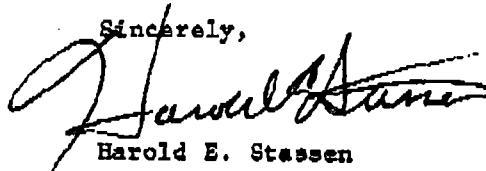

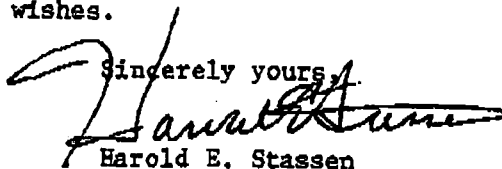

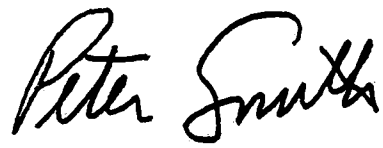

I hope all is well with you and yours. Enclosed for your information is a copy of my most recent essay concerning perceptions of Arabs. I recently returned from the Marine Command and Staff College in Quantico where I had the opportunity to address officers on the Arab in the mind of Americans. My hosts were bright, hospitable and displayed an eagerness to learn more about the Arab peoples.

Most Americans perceive Arabs in a negative manner. The "seen one, seen 'em all" cliché prevails. For our armed forces these perceptions are dangerous. They fail to distinguish the difference between Saddam Hussein and his villainy and the majority of our Arab allies. This problem needs immediate attention. For example, T-shirts stating "I'd Go 10,000 Miles to Smoke a Camel" are not only displayed in military stores but worn by our servicemen here and perhaps even in Saudi Arabia. The T-shirt features, in the scope of the rifle, an Arab on a camel as target. To the soldier, does the Arab represent a Saudi, a Kuwaiti, or an Iraqi? Recently, a California radio station did a parody of "California Girls." The song ridiculed Kuwaiti women with "little moustaches" running around on camels. As you know, in the Persian Gulf crisis the Kuwaitis are victims. Imagemakers would do well to acknowledge Mark Twain's wisdom. Twain said, "The difference between the right word and the almost right word is the difference between lightning and the lightning bug."

Editorial cartoonists also cloud the issue by showing President Bush sleeping with three veiled Arab women, the Saudis being accused of lusting after our American female soldiers, Arab oil sheiks depicted as being responsible for rising gas prices or cowering behind Uncle Sam as we fight the Iraqi aggressor.

Many Americans especially members of our armed forces wrongly believe all Arabs are Muslims, all Muslims are Arabs, Iranians are Arabs, and Arabs are Iranians. To them, the generic Arabs are billionaires, bombers, belly dancers or bundles in black. Sadly, in our culture the Arab lacks a human face.

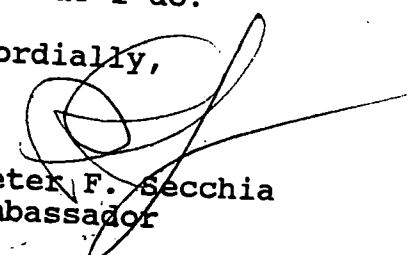

I want to extend my very sincere and heartfelt thanks for your personal involvement in crafting the child care provisions of the budget reconciliation package which Congress just passed.

In particular, I appreciate your dogged attention to and promotion of the so-called "wee tots" tax credit provision. There is no doubt in my mind that without your personal persistence on this provision, it would not have become part of the package.

As you are well aware, this provision, tied to a "no double-dip" requirement vis-a-vis the dependent care tax credit, is perceived by many as a significant achievement for those who do not like the current bias in the tax code against families who choose in-home parental care rather than out-of-home day care. I believe that "wee tots" is, in fact, important in "levelling the playing field" of the tax code for those families.

Along with your own personal commitment to this child care compromise, I want to commend the tireless efforts of Tom Scully in this regard. His negotiation with Senate Labor Committee leaders and others was masterful. In addition, during the many months of hard work on this issue, my staff and I have deeply appreciated the cooperative working relationship which has developed with Barbara Selfridge of OMB, Larry Lindsay and Hans Kuttner of White House Policy, Jack Howard of White House Legislative Affairs, and Virginia Thomas of the Labor Department.

As you know, this final child care product looks very, very similar to the Stenholm-Shaw amendment of earlier this year. 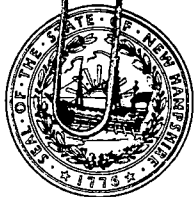

The ironic aspect of the situation which came about as a result of the 1986 tax reform is that a transaction which gives me an annual pre tax gain of \$8300 on which the U.S. Government should realize tax revenues of \$2739 results in an after tax loss to me of \$8308 and a revenue loss to the U.S. Government of \$4092 while Massachusetts reaps \$20700 in tax revenue. This situation has existed since 1987 and will continue through 1996 when the wrap mortgage which generates this income comes due. The sale of the property occurred in late 1986 before the finer points of the new law were well understood.

The 1986 Tax Reform requires that partnerships report interest on wrap mortgages held by the partnership as portfolio interest on partner's K1s and the interest expense on the underlying mortgage as investment interest expense. The intent was I believe to prevent sheltering interest income with operating losses which is indeed reasonable. For Federal tax purposes the interest income (\$172,500 in this instance) is offset by a deduction for the investment interest expense (\$164,200 in this instance) resulting in taxation of the net income of \$8300 at 33%. There are minor side effects caused by reporting gross rather than net income because increasing adjusted gross income results in reducing allowed miscellaneous itemized deductions and medical expense deductions. Newly proposed limitations on itemized deductions for taxpayers with adjusted gross incomes greater than \$100,000 will further increase the tax liability. The big flaw is that Massachusetts does not allow a deduction for investment interest expense. My gross interest income of \$172,500 is now taxed at 12% by Massachusetts resulting in a tax of \$20,700 which I can take as an itemized deduction on my Federal return resulting in a reduction of \$6831 in Federal tax for a net loss of \$4092 to the Federal Government.

I believe that an equitable solution to the problem would be for the U.S. Government to permit reporting the net interest income (but not less than zero) in this situation which would result in the U.S. Government receiving tax revenues of \$2410 (a gain of \$6502), Massachusetts receiving tax revenues of \$996, and leaving me with an after tax gain of \$4894. I do not know whether this requires legislation or whether it is a technical implementation issue. I do not believe it was the intent of the 1986 tax reform act that Massachusetts be subsidized to this extent by me and the U.S.

I have attempted to gain a sympathetic ear of my state senator and representative but considering the current economic problems in Massachusetts it is highly unlikely that the legislature would entertain a bill to allow a deduction for investment interest expense.

Can you assist in solving this mutual problem? With three students in college next year I could use the help. Any assistance you could render would be greatly appreciated.

Hope to see you and Nancy at our 30th MIT reunion next June.

Dear Governor Sununu:

While I have been pleased by the admirable work you and Administration staff have accomplished in fashioning a child care compromise within the budget reconciliation package, I have just become aware of issues in two areas which cause me concern.

I believe it was your intention, and it certainly was my understanding, that 75 percent of the block grant funds would be available to parents through a voucher system. In actuality, the current draft provides an unintended loophole through which a state may attempt to divert all of those funds (the 75 percent) for programs it vaguely defines as "improving availability and quality."

The impact of this language would be controversy and, probably, litigation. This situation would arise if a state, wishing to deny parents the right to vouchers, simply refused to provide direct services with that 75 percent, and instead, tried to use this "soft money" for items such as training, standards, and bureaucracy.

While I fully support the empowerment of states which a clean block grant provides, I continue to hold the strong conviction that the empowerment of families to choose how to care for their children must be the cornerstone of any child care bill.

I am enclosing some legislative language which would be one way to rectify the problem just outlined. In addition, I have included language to clarify the "preference" language included in the compromise. I would particularly like to call your attention to the "religious groups" amendment. All of the enclosed proposed amendments simply clarify the obvious intent of the child care subtitle. However, I believe such clarifications are necessary to avoid protracted disputes and litigation.

I respectfully and urgently solicit your attention to these issues so that language might be improved in a final reconciliation bill.

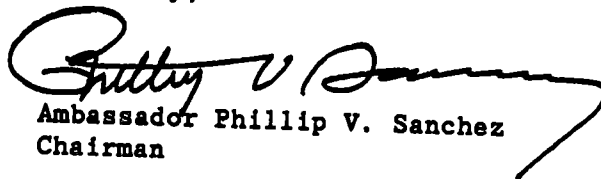

On behalf of the National Association of Independent Schools (NAIS) I am writing to urge your support of two matters of great concern to our schools -- both related to the taxation of charitable gifts. NAIS is a voluntary member organization of over 1,000 schools and associations in the U.S. and abroad representing 355,000 elementary and secondary school students, 37,600 teachers and 6,000 administrators. The schools are coeducational and single sex, boarding and day, nontraditional as well as traditional. Membership is limited to nonprofit schools that have racially nondiscriminatory admissions and employment policies.

The first issue of concern involves the proposals in the Senate and now from the Bush Administration to limit itemized deductions for charitable gifts, state and local taxes, and mortgage interest. These proposals could establish a dangerous precedent for increased limitations on the charitable deduction. NAIS opposes a floor on total deductions, as we are convinced giving to charitable organizations ultimately would decline. If you support a provision to limit deductions, the deduction for charitable donations should be excluded, as was proposed by Senator Kasten.

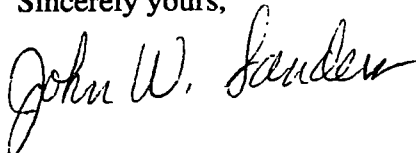
Also of great concern to independent schools is the taxation of gifts of appreciated assets which resulted from the Tax Reform Act of 1986. Included in the Senate budget proposal is an amendment to remove appreciated gifts of art and manuscripts from the alternative minimum tax (AMT). We urge you to support full restoration of prior law for all appreciated property gifts, as proposed by Congressman Frenzel.

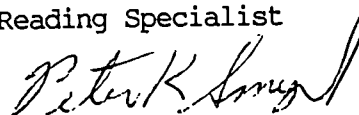

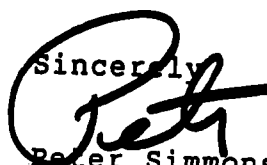
