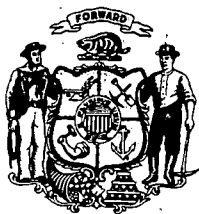

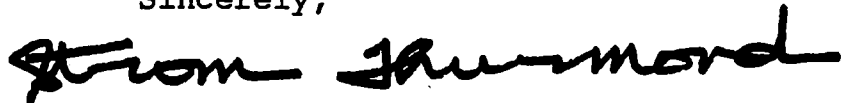

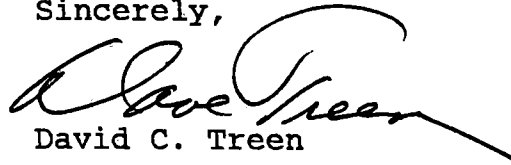
Dear John:

Dear Mr. Sununu:

I am writing in hope that the administration will recommend that \$10 million be appropriated in EPA's budget for the Clean Lakes Program (Section 314 of the Clean Water Act). I understand the agency's budget request is presently under review by your Office of Management and Budget.

Since 1974 this program has been able to effectively deal with a broad variety of environmental problems which have affected the quality of our nation's lakes, despite the fact it has cost, on the average, less than \$200,000 per state. It is a program which has been successful because it responds directly to local perceptions of water quality problems, identifies (and prioritizes) problems and their sources, and implements solutions in cooperation with a local sponsor. It is the type of approach more of our environmental initiatives ought to follow.

I would encourage the administration to take ownership of this popular, low cost, and effective program by providing funds for next year's operation and using it as a model for other programs as we near re-authorization of the Clean Water Act of 1992.

As the Uruguay Round nears the December meeting in Brussels, I wanted to take a minute of your time to review continuing concerns that my company has on the antidumping code negotiations. My company and our workers have over the last twenty years fought a series of battles to stay alive. Many of our workers have experienced first hand the injury that can result from dumping. Indeed, we have recently been forced to file yet another case because of the serious harm being suffered because of the dumping of products competitive with our personal word processors. Our foreign competitors, particularly the Japanese, have repeatedly targeted our products for domination. The dumping law and the existing antidumping code have been critical to prevent the destruction of my company and many other companies and industries in the United States.

In Geneva, we find that the existing U.S. system to neutralize price discrimination that is harmful to domestic producers is under serious attack by the very countries so often found to have engaged in targeting of American industry. Some of the attacks threaten the ability of injured industries to recover and reinvest after dumping is neutralized. Indeed, in industries such as consumer electronics, U.S. producers have been under sustained attack from the Japanese for nearly thirty years. Adopting provisions that would require periodic petitions to maintain relief from such persistent dumping encourages foreign competitors to drive U.S. industries out of the game over time. For example, injured industries (by definition suffering reduced production, lower employment, reduced capital expenditures, reduced R&D) are not compensated for past harm due to dumping. Because relief when given neutralizes price discrimination, U.S. injured industries often find themselves behind competitively with their foreign competitors. It takes time to generate profits to catch up in

R&D or capital expenditures, to add back the capacity that has been shut, to retrain the workers who have been laid off. Current efforts to force termination of the order where dumping is continuing or forcing U.S. companies to endure the uncertainty of additional injury investigations every few years will let foreign competitors continue to dump until they have driven U.S. companies out of the game altogether.

My understanding is that our U.S. negotiators to date have worked very hard to maintain a reasonable Antidumping Code. However, they remain under heavy pressure to Geneva to agree to changes that would substantially weaken our country's ability to neutralize price discrimination.

It is critical to the manufacturing sector that the U.S. not accept in these last few weeks of the Uruguay Round changes to the unfair trade codes that would undermine their essential remedial purpose, that would increase the expense of bringing and prosecuting cases, or that would make relief inadequate to correct the prior harm. The Antidumping Code is simply too important to the manufacturing sector of this country.

If, as the Administration has often stated, no deal is better than a bad deal, then it is important to understand that a strong Antidumping Code is critical to there being something other than a "bad deal" at the end of the day.

SUBJECT: Utilization of the Domestic Policy Council

Following up on your discussion of the Administration's domestic agenda at this week's Cabinet meeting and Ede Holiday's memorandum soliciting views on domestic policy initiatives, I am writing to share with you some observations and solicit some views on the Domestic Policy Council (DPC).

Since the DPC was established early in the President's Administration (see attached), it has developed a number of options papers and decision memoranda for him in response to requests for interagency policy consideration. Other issues have been cultivated in response to congressional initiatives.

At a time when the domestic agenda is obviously going to be at center stage, for the next two years at least, I am inclined to think a more active (and indeed pro-active) role for the DPC should be an option given careful consideration by White House staff and the President himself.

This view is based on a perception that the President's election evidenced the fact that people wanted more than simply the competence in government promised by Governor Dukakis. They wanted, I believe, a President who pursues a specific agenda based on the values and principles which the campaign highlighted. To date, much of the DPC's activity has, however, focused more on competence -- making present government programs work better. While this is, in itself, important, I would suggest that more effort, in the next two years, could be devoted to shaping new initiatives designed to further an agenda based on the President's values and principles. The DPC could well become an effective catalyst for formulation of such a domestic agenda.

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RETURN IT WITH THE FILE COPIES TO ORIGINATING OFFICE

The empowerment theme expressed by the President and increasingly noticed by the media is a good example of the kind of bold thinking which the DPC could develop and encourage. The DPC could provide substantial assistance in the development of specific domestic policy initiatives designed to bring this concept into reality for most Americans. Programs already suggesting themselves include, for example, child care vouchers, choice in education, repeal of the social security earnings limit and tenant management of public housing. Many more could be considered, if not proposed.

Before suggesting any specific changes in the role of the DPC, however, I would appreciate knowing from you and/or the President:

1. Your assessment of how the DPC has contributed to the development of Administration initiatives in the past two years?
2. If it has not done so effectively, has it outlived its usefulness or should a new role be designed?
3. If a new role should be designed, should it be of a more pro-active nature, as suggested above?
4. Does the DPC relate in a positive and productive way to OMB, the Office of Policy Development, the Office of Cabinet Affairs and other White House components concerned with policy development?
5. If not, how should these relationships be altered or restructured so as to improve coordination?

Please let me know if you want to pursue this matter further.

Dear Governor Sununu:

We have met twice. The first time was when we shared the platform at Peggy Stock's inauguration as president of Colby-Sawyer College in New London. The second time when we were seated next to each other at a Friendly Sons of St. Patrick Dinner. On the basis of this long and deep friendship, I write to request your indulgence of H.R.1602 -- The Trauma Care Systems Planning and Development Act of 1990 -- which I understand may come to the President for action at any moment.

My concern is prompted by a rumor that OMB has expressed a concern about the Act, based on a philosophical sentiment favoring block grants, rather than categorical grants, for the contemplated initiative. I am further advised that OMB reservations notwithstanding, H.R.1602 is supported by virtually all the important trauma and emergency care societies in America, as well as the major health care associations (including the Americal Medical Association, the American Hospital Association and the College of Surgeons).

My personal interest, or rather professional interest, in H.R.1602 is inspired by the authorization which accompanies it providing a challenge grant to The George Washington University to modernize its Hospital. The Hospital desperately needs to be upgraded. Even with this assistance, it will be some time before we can do what is necessary to make that facility state-of-the-art. Without the renovation, the long-term viability of the GW Hospital is open to question.

The GW Hospital -- located as it is, only minutes away by ambulance from the White House, the State Department and other key federal agencies and embassies -- makes a special contribution to the capital city. It is generally believed that the treatment provided to President Reagan by The George Washington University emergency care facility, after he was shot ten years ago, saved his life. We are determined to serve the nation in the future, as we have in the past, should appropriate circumstances arise. In order to do so, we badly need the help that H.R.1602 provides.

My thanks in advance for any support you feel you can appropriately provide for H.R.1602.

Quite frankly, **newspapers and the general media do not reprint the Proclamation in its entirety** and as an educational association we attempt to make it available for use to all our members and contacts.

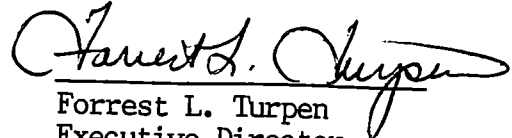
Our goal would be to distribute selected Presidential Proclamations to individual teachers and the 15,700 school districts in our Nation.

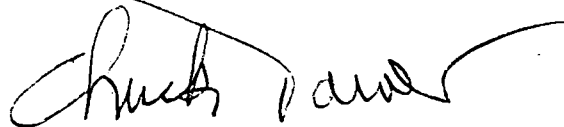

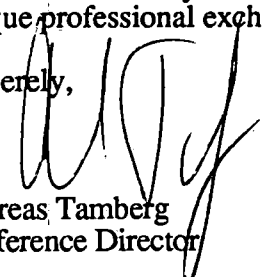
Earlier this year, you received information about the upcoming US-USSR Leadership Conference. ACIL has agreed to a request by its Soviet counterpart, the Union of Soviet Friendship Societies, to reschedule the conference from October to January 19-31, 1991. This decision was taken in consultation with the US Embassy in Moscow and Consulate General in Leningrad. In accordance with the position of its government, the Soviet Embassy has expressed its support for this decision.

The importance of the Chautauqua citizens diplomacy process to US-Soviet relations prompted ACIL to continue the five-year old process begun by the Chautauqua Institution of New York State. We felt that the process should continue in a pragmatic vein, focusing on professional exchange across a range of 20 disciplines. ACIL's long-standing programs in the USSR and successful track record with the 1988 and 1990 US-USSR Emerging Leaders Summits made the Center an ideal candidate to assume responsibility for the Chautauqua process. Moreover, ACIL's commitment to international leadership development will help convert that process into the major bilateral professional conference between the US and USSR.

There have been five such programs in the past, the most recent having been held in Pittsburgh in 1989. A protocol signed by ACIL President Stephen Hayes and Gennadi Fedosov of the Union of Soviet Friendship Societies commits both sides to the January conference dates. The professional commission format and conference schedule remain in effect.

If you were unable to attend the Leadership Conference this year, the shift in dates offers another opportunity to participate as a delegate or to nominate someone you feel is qualified. Nominations to the professional commissions may be made without regard to age. Please check your schedule and contact ACIL should you wish to participate in this unique professional exchange.

Dear Governor Sununu:

The Task Force has been intimately involved in trying to push through a provision in the immigration bill H.R. 4300 that would allow Lebanese already in this country to stay for a period of three years until stability returns to their homeland. As you know, the House approved the immigration bill on October 3 and we are thankful that the provision granting deferred departure to nationals of Lebanon, Kuwait, El Salvador, and Liberia was included.

The Senate-House conference on the immigration bill may take place next week and we understand that one of the prospective conferees, Senator Alan Simpson, has threatened to filibuster the conference, thereby precluding it. The Task Force is alarmed at this eventuality.

The Task Force office in Washington is literally inundated with frantic calls from members of the Lebanese-American community with questions on deferred departure for Lebanese and we have acquired a minor expertise on immigration law. For many Lebanese, the only avenue to avoid returning to the infernal conditions of Lebanon is to apply for political asylum. However, a "well-founded fear of political persecution" must be proved for a grant of political asylum and this does not adequately apply to the situation in Lebanon.

On behalf of the Lebanese-American community, we hope that the White House will help ensure passage of this legislation, which is the best hope for allowing Lebanese to remain in this country until conditions in Lebanon stabilize.

Thank you for allowing us to convey an issue of such vital concern to the Lebanese-American community.

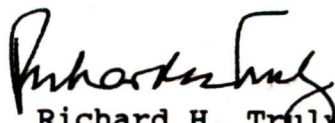
Dear Governor Sununu:

I am very pleased to provide you copies of two very recent photographs taken by the Hubble Space Telescope. The first is a picture of the planet Saturn. The Voyager spacecraft launched in 1977 took 34 months to travel to Saturn, but this image is equivalent to those taken by Voyager when she was only 7 days from the planet. The resolution of features on the planet is at least three times better than those from the most powerful telescopes on Earth.

The second photo is an image of the planet Pluto and its moon Charon, two bodies so close together that Charon was only discovered 12 years ago. Hubble is able to clearly distinguish these two bodies. With Hubble in orbit, we will be able to look at Saturn, Pluto, and all the other bodies in the outer solar system repeatedly, thus gaining unique insights impossible from our previous planetary fly-by missions.

We are also very excited about the growing productivity of the Hubble Space Telescope, which is already producing pictures of astronomical and planetary bodies not yet seen by the world's scientists. We are also looking forward to the results of measurements from Hubble's spectroscopic instruments which are unaffected by the flaw in the telescope's mirror. These instruments will be providing us unprecedented new information about the composition and evolution of objects in the universe.

We are writing to urge you to reconsider and withdraw the administration's support for the Local Broadcaster Gross Tax (or "Spectrum Fee") we understand the administration is advocating at the "budget summit." We believe this tax is bad public policy because it would threaten the economic viability of thousands of local broadcasters, including ourselves; would be grossly unfair; would raise a relatively small amount of new revenue for the federal government; and would deal a potentially devastating blow to one of our most basic freedoms, freedom of the press.

Before we explain the reasoning behind these statements we would like to clear up one basic area of potential confusion. The advocates of this tax call it a "Spectrum Fee." It is not. It is a Local Broadcaster Gross Tax, pure and simple, since, as we understand it is currently proposed, it would be levied on local broadcasters only, not on any other users of the electromagnetic spectrum.

1) This tax would threaten the economic viability of thousands of local broadcasters.

a) We understand this tax would be levied on the gross revenues of most local television and radio stations at the rate of four or five percent*. Many, if not most, local broadcasters do not generate enough profit to pay such a

*We understand a lower two and one half percent rate is also proposed for stations with gross revenues below levels that are so low that only a relatively small number of stations would be subject to this lower rate.

tax, let alone pay it and continue to produce viable financial performance. We know that our Company does not and we believe many others do not either. For example, 1988 financial data available from the National Association of Broadcasters indicates that this tax would consume either all or the lion's share of the pre-tax profits of the average local radio station. And the financial performance of most local broadcasters has worsened since 1988 due to the nationwide advertising slowdown and increased competition.

b) Local broadcasters could not pass this tax along to viewers and listeners since we, alone among the major media, do not charge the public for our service. We could not pass it along to advertisers, who are currently virtually our only source of revenue, since our competitors for advertising, such as newspapers, cable television, billboards and magazines, would not be subject to the tax.

c) We would therefore be forced to cut our costs to attempt to pay the tax and still generate enough profit to remain economically viable. This would, of course, throw thousands of people out of work. In addition, it would start what we refer to as the cost reduction death spiral. In cutting our costs we would also have to cut the service we provide viewers, listeners and advertisers. This would make us less able to compete with other media such as newspapers and cable television. This, in turn, would result in reduced revenues for us, necessitating further cost, job and service reductions, which would result in further revenue reductions. And so on. Eventually many of us would be out of business, eliminating even more jobs. An ironic consequence of this death spiral is that the federal government would collect less and less from us through the Local Broadcaster Gross Tax as our revenues declined. And income and capital gains taxes currently collected from local broadcasters would either be totally eliminated or drastically reduced. Hundreds of millions, if not billions, of dollars of shareholder capital would also be lost. In addition, millions of Americans would lose some of their favorite sources of entertainment and news as well as some of the most important public service institutions in their local communities.

d) In short, this would not be just another tax. Its size compared to local broadcasters' ability to pay it would make it one of the most punitive, brutal, confiscatory and highly destructive taxes ever levied by a government on its citizens.

2) This tax would be grossly unfair.

a) Many businesses, not just local broadcasters, use public resources. For example, newspapers use public roads to deliver their papers; cable television uses the spectrum, to receive virtually all of its programming, either from satellites or local broadcasters; magazines use the mails; airlines use the air both to support their planes while in the sky and as fuel; telephone companies use the spectrum. We don't believe any of these businesses is charged more for the use of these public resources than the approximate direct cost to the government. Why should local broadcasters be treated differently? At most we should be required to cover the direct costs to the government associated with our use of the spectrum, which are regulatory costs.

b) Current regulatory law, developed over the last fifty years, requires that local broadcasters accept and fulfill public interest obligations, such as local news coverage, local public affairs and public service programming, and the provision of political advertising at lowest unit rates, in exchange for use of the spectrum. This new tax would be, in essence, a double charge.

c) The federal government already levies taxes on the economic usefulness of all resources including the spectrum: income and capital gains taxes.

d) Private companies and individuals, such as our company and its founder, Sarkes Tarzian, made the spectrum valuable for commercial use through their vision, courage, ingenuity and willingness to fund large initial financial losses. As a result the federal government receives income and capital gains taxes from local broadcasters. It does not, in all fairness, deserve to reap additional windfall profits from the value created not by it, but by private citizens.

3) This tax would raise a relatively small amount of new revenue for the federal government.

The total annual advertising revenues of local broadcasters are about twenty-three billion dollars, according to Veronis, Suhler and Associates. At a four or five percent rate this tax would raise at most about one billion in new revenue initially for the federal government.

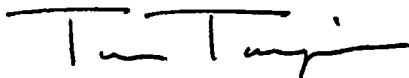
This is far below the estimates we have heard the government is using. Because of the death spiral, lost income tax revenues and lost capital gains tax revenues, the amount of new money actually collected would be a lot less.

- 4) This tax would deal a potentially devastating blow to one of our most basic freedoms, freedom of the press.

The power to tax is the power to intimidate and destroy. It is therefore absolutely incredible to us that this or any other American administration would attempt to single out the press, or any part of the press, for a special tax, let alone a punitive and unfair one. The thought that two of the media, television and radio, upon which polls show people rely most heavily for news would be singled out for a special, in fact punitive, tax is scary as hell. No government should have the power to do that because the danger to press freedom is both obvious and terrifying. Protestations of good faith are no comfort. Once the principle of such a tax is accepted and established, who can say how it might be used or what kind of person or persons might manipulate it to their advantage in the future? We feel certain this is the kind of thing the founding fathers most wanted to prevent the federal government from doing.

For the reasons we have just given, we believe this proposed Local Broadcaster Gross Tax threatens the economic viability of thousands of local broadcasters; would be grossly unfair; would raise a relatively small amount of new revenue for the federal government; and would deal a potentially devastating blow to the freedom of the press in our country. We therefore fervently urge you to withdraw the administration's support from it.

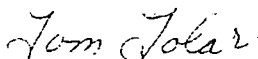

Dear Mr. Sununu:

The Federal Managers Association, which represents the interests of 250,000 managers and supervisors in the Federal government, is unequivocally opposed to the current budget summit proposal. Specifically, FMA opposes:

* *Eliminating the lump sum retirement annuity.* To achieve savings, the better approach is to revise of the lump sum formula from its current two-year payout to a three-year payout. This would provide nearly one billion dollars in savings, and keep the faith with Federal and postal retirees.

* *Freezing Federal and military COLAs in FY 1991 and permanently reducing future COLAs formula to CPI minus one percent.* Federal and postal retirees ought to be treated equally with Social Security recipients, who receive the full COLA. Because all retirees face inflation, they should receive the same adjustment. Two-thirds of the members of Congress have cosponsored the Oaker and Domenici COLA fairness resolutions.

* *Cutting \$400 million from the Federal Employees Health Benefits Program.* This would cause health insurance premiums to skyrocket and place Federal workers and retirees at risk.

The above cuts, if enacted, will require Federal and postal workers and retirees to finance twenty-five percent of all deficit savings for FY 1991. Singling out Federal employees and retirees for deficit savings is patently unfair. They already have borne \$120 billion in cuts in less than a decade in the name of deficit reduction.

These proposals will have a profound and negative effect on the quality of public service in America. I ask you to reject them.

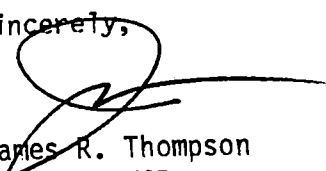
Dear Governor Sununu:

Negotiations have begun on the final version of Clean Air legislation. I hope that the bill will contain the strongest possible provisions for oxygenated fuels and reformulated gas.

Expanded use of oxygenated fuels will go a long way in assisting areas such as Chicago in reducing ozone and carbon monoxide problems. It will also greatly assist corn-growing regions and, according to the General Accounting Office, produce farm program savings in excess of lost fuel tax revenues. These fuels will also reduce our dependence on imported oil. Recent events in the Middle East illustrate our need to become more energy self-reliant.

Oxygenated fuels are clean, safe, and effective replacements for harmful aromatic compounds in gasoline. I ask for your support of these fuels in the Clean Air bill as part of a sound, forward-looking solution to our nation's air quality problems and energy needs.

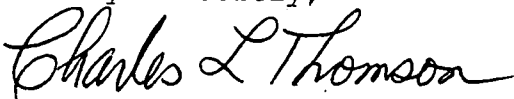

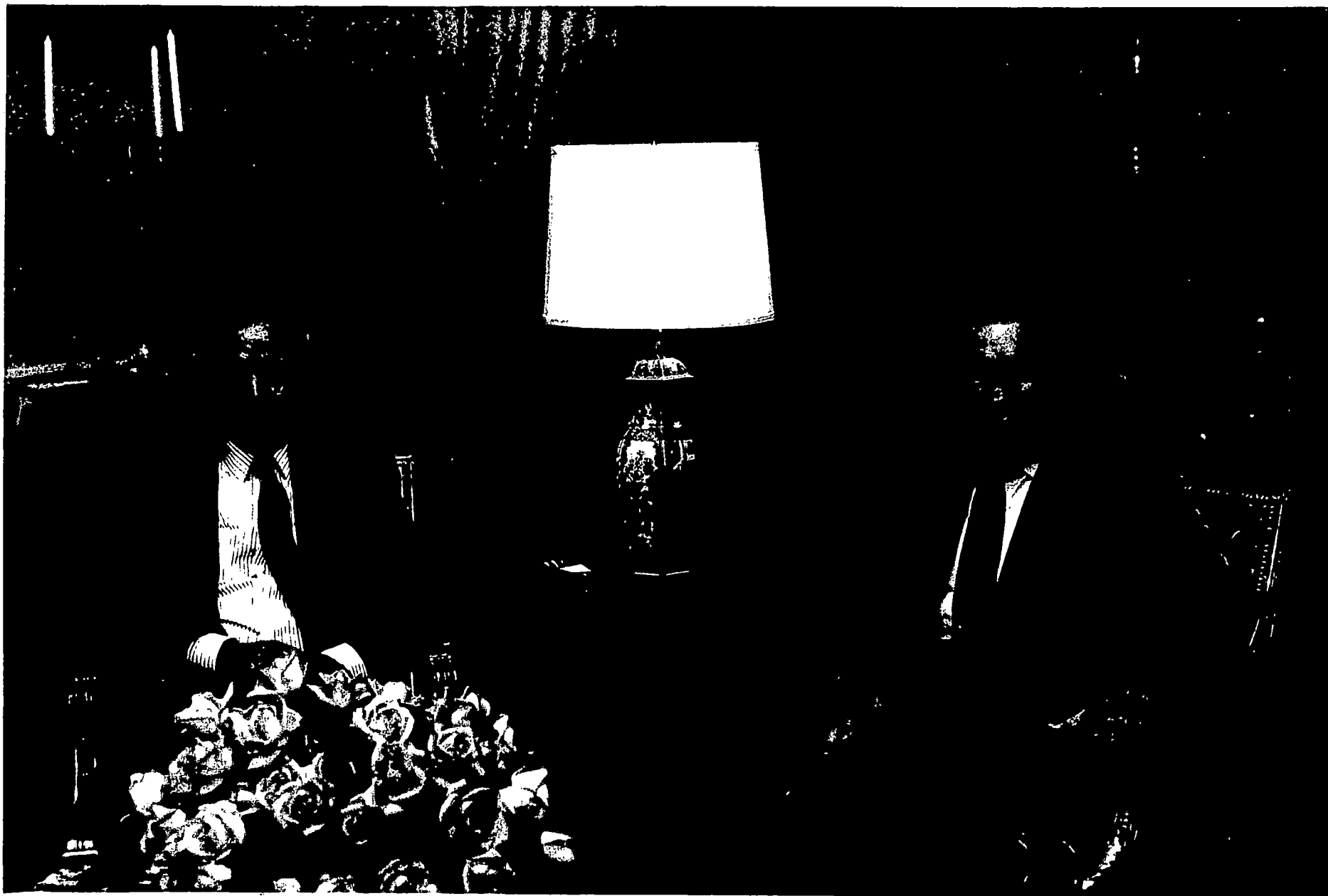
