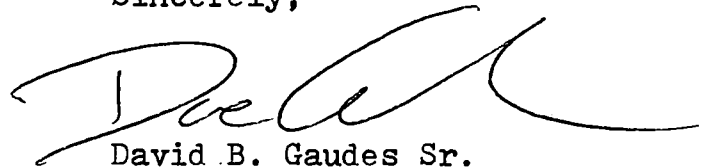
Dear Governor Sununu,

Dear John:

It has come to my attention that draft regulations to implement the new child care voucher programs are currently under review at the White House. I'm writing to express my serious interest in seeing that these regulations undergo the highest degree of scrutiny to ensure that they will indeed further the President's objective of parental choice in child care.

Throughout the two-year struggle to enact meaningful federal law in this area, you were always receptive to advice from your allies on Capitol Hill. Now that the process has reached a new stage, I want to share with you my thoughts on the potential trouble spots.

I've attached a summary of the issues prepared by the Heritage Foundation, but I would like to briefly touch on each separately in this text.

First, the term "sectarian institution" must be clarified to ensure that it covers a child care program that includes religious activities and instruction. No state should be permitted to prohibit a parent's use of vouchers in a day care program that includes religious activities and instruction.

Second, the regulations should be clear on the point that at least two-thirds of the total funds under the new block grant must go to programs which provide parents the option of receiving a voucher. States should also be given the clear option of placing up to 95% of the funds of the block grant into a single voucher program.

Third, in order to ensure that parental choice is not frustrated by additional regulations by state agencies, the federal regulations should specify that a state's general laws regarding child care control whether a provider is eligible to receive vouchers.

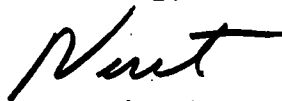
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Fourth, vouchers should retain the same value regardless of the type of provider a parent selects.

Fifth, states should be given the option to provide vouchers to families in which one parent is employed while the other cares for young children. Traditional families should not be subject to discrimination.

John, you've been an immense help in moving this process forward. I urge you to keep my comments in mind as the White House takes the next step and begins review of these significant regulations.

As per our conversation of this afternoon, Senators Hatfield, Packwood, and I believe it appropriate to have a brief, private meeting with the President to bring him up-to-date on all aspects of the Endangered Species Act-Timber Supply situation in the Pacific Northwest. We will discuss exactly what we have discussed with you, both short-term possibilities open to the Administration, limited as they may be, under the Endangered Species Act, and our own desires and limited progress toward substantive legislation. We have every hope that this will strengthen your own most helpful hand and we do not intend to publicize the meeting.

On a second subject, I am enclosing a story to which I referred on Tuesday. You have short changed your humble and obedient servant and his constituents, and I hope that you will promptly rectify the situation. Ironically, I don't have a single candidate for a major Administration office now, though I can certainly find some. The last couple of years have just been too discouraging to my friends and neighbors.

After the Interagency Scientific Committee (ISC) announced its sweeping recommendations with respect to the spotted owl on April 2, 1990, President Bush, in May, told the people of the Northwest that "there has to be a middle ground that protects the owl and keeps people working. It's the balance we are seeking." The recommendations made by the Secretary of Agriculture last summer were consistent with the President's stated goal of finding a middle ground between the proposed ISC set-asides and no set-asides at all. The Fish and Wildlife Service, however, seems pointed in the opposite direction from the goals of the President. Specifically, the Service appears as though it will respond to litigation in the Federal District Court in Seattle with an increase to the ISC set-asides rather than a decrease. The Service also continues to apply severe restrictions on private and state lands.

The recommendations of the ISC would devastate allowable cuts on forest service lands, threatening to wipe out a number of timber dependent communities in Washington and in Oregon. A broader Fish and Wildlife Service critical habitat designation would add to that devastation, rather than seek the "middle ground" promised by the President.

In addition, USFWS has imposed its regulations and guidelines on private landowners whose land is adjacent to forest service land on which owl sites or nests have been found, by threatening state land management agencies with criminal prosecution should those agencies not impose the USFWS regulations and guidelines. Already, more than 300,000 acres of private land have been affected by owl habitat circles drawn by USFWS, and substantial additions to that acreage are reportedly likely. Forest products workers in our state see economic destruction on the horizon and are understandably panicked. This sharp course away from a "middle ground" and toward the

destruction of an important industry is particularly ironic in light of the wide latitude available to the Secretary of the Interior to consider economic impacts in making a designation of critical habitat. The Secretary must base the critical habitat designation on the best scientific evidence available "after taking into consideration the economic impact and any other relevant impact" of specifying an area as critical habitat. 16 U.S.C. 1533(b)(2). No consideration of the economic impact of its actions seems to have motivated USFWS to this point. Its actions certainly do not constitute the type of balance that the President indicated would be struck between owl protection and working people in Northwest communities.

I believe it important that agencies within the Administration follow the direction of the President and of the law. House Speaker Thomas Foley indicated his view last week that the Endangered Species Act needs to be amended so that economic factors are considered to a larger extent. I believe that the Endangered Species Act, as currently enacted, allows the Administration to reduce the overall economic impacts of a species listing. If the Administration determines that it cannot reduce those impacts sufficiently to reach the "middle ground" which is the President's stated goal within the ambit of the Endangered Species Act, then it should promptly propose amendments which will authorize the balance we both seek.

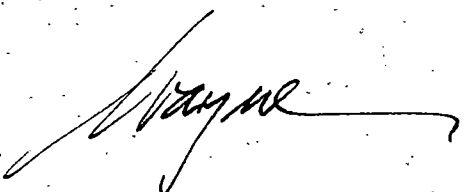

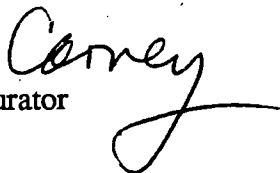

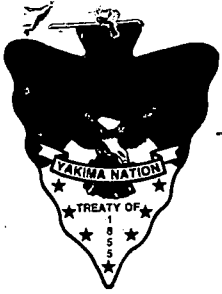

Dear Governor Sununu:

This is to request the Administration to reconsider its FY'92 Budget proposal to combine various domestic assistance programs' funding that would be provided to the states through block grants.

The Yakima Indian Nation has a Treaty with the United States Government. It has a distinct and separate legal status as a government. To require the Yakima Nation to apply to the state for federal funds would place the tribe in an untenable position.

Federal block grants currently received by the state have not been fairly shared with our tribe. The state is not required to share these funds with the tribes; what is shared is minimal and sporadic resulting in an unstable funding for services for our people.

Block grants is a mechanism which allows local control to meet local needs. This opportunity, afforded to the state and other local governments, is not enjoyed by our tribe although we are in the best position to provide services to our people.

There are programs slated for inclusion into the block grants to be transferred to the states which our tribe receives through direct federal funding. We are successfully administering these programs. We urge the administration to not include these programs without retaining a portion of the funds which could continue to be provided through direct federal funding to the tribes.

Thank you for your assistance in this important matter.

My suggestion is for His Majesty to get started immediately on a massive educational program via his Amman TV station. I'll spare you the details.

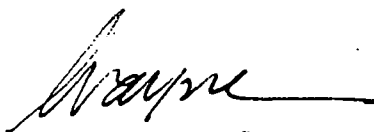

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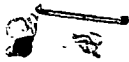

Dear John:

I'm writing you out of concern for what is taking place at Pan American World Airways. As you know, the company is currently under Chapter 11 bankruptcy protection, and some analysts have expressed serious reservations about whether Pan Am will actually return as a competitive and profitable airline.

We have already seen an attempt to sell off Pan Am assets, including international routes, which could seriously jeopardize the airline's ability to continue operations in the future. As in the Eastern bankruptcy, an attempt to infuse cash into an airline through these route transfers have not been successful. In the case of Pan Am, the majority of business is generated in the international marketplace, which would question the airline's ability to sell off international routes and still remain competitive with foreign and domestic carriers.

As we have seen when Eastern Air Lines ceased operations, there are numerous costs to the government associated with large shutdowns. The State of Georgia has been inundated with requests for unemployment benefits and job retraining funds, requiring emergency funds from the U.S. Department of Labor. Pan Am currently has around 28,000 employees who would face unemployment should the airline be forced to shut down.

The Pension Benefit Guaranty Corporation (PBGC) is continuing to try and collect over \$700 million to fully fund the various pension plans at Eastern Air Lines. In the case of Pan Am, the PBGC estimates that the pension plans are underfunded by about \$800 million. If the PBGC is unable to collect these funds, the burden would fall on the government and taxpayers.

It is also important to look at the way Pan Am impacts our relationship with other governments. The U.S. has been very successful in negotiating with foreign governments for air service. Should Pan Am cease to exist, requiring the piecemeal sale of its international routes, the U.S. would be placed at a serious negotiating disadvantage.

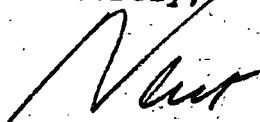

Pan Am's heritage of air service is known worldwide, and the loss of this company would be a serious blow to our international aviation efforts. Countries would seriously question our ability to compete in the growing global world aviation market if Pan Am is allowed to be dismembered and sold in parts.

Therefore, I think it might be helpful for the government to carefully analyze what the government-wide costs associated with the shutdown of this airline would be in relation to the costs of a government-backed attempt to encourage the sale of the airline as one entity, rather than a piecemeal dismantling.

I would appreciate any thoughts you might have in keeping this great airline flying, and I look forward to hearing from you on this subject.

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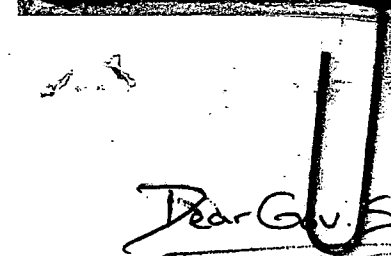

I am pleased to transmit to you a copy of the Commission's sponsored research report, A Feasibility Study of the Use of Unemployment Insurance Wage-Record Data as an Evaluation Tool for JTPA.

The President and Congress have become increasingly concerned with the accountability of the programs funded under the Job Training Partnership Act (JTPA). In response, the Commission has been conducting a multi-state project to study the issues involved in using state Unemployment Insurance (UI) wage records for the evaluation of the JTPA programs.

The study demonstrates the feasibility of linking UI wage records to JTPA administrative records for 11 states and Program Year 1986 (July 1, 1986 - June 30, 1987). The report uses the linked data to track the employment and earnings of different groups of participants, such as minorities and welfare recipients, before and after they receive training services. It also compares results on JTPA outcomes obtained from the UI data with those currently obtained from a survey of participants undertaken 13 weeks after they complete the program.

Among the study's findings, the costs of using UI data can be expected to be much lower than the costs of the current survey. This report concludes just the first phase of our three-phase project. Subsequent phases will cover more states and additional years of program activity. These further analyses will extend the present findings.

I hope this study proves most informative and useful to you.

Dear Governor Sununu:

I am writing concerning EPA's promulgation of its final rule for the wood preserving industry regulations.

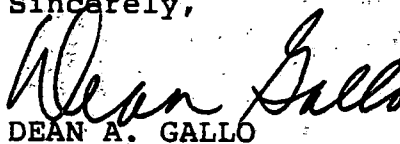
I have been told that implementation of this rule will have a devastating impact on the wood preserving industry. Constituents have informed me that costs of complying with these regulations would eliminate many companies, and increase consumer costs. They state that this is the least cost-effective regulation issued in the past 20 years. The regulation's cost per premature death averted, according to OMB figures, is \$5.7 trillion.

During the comment period it is my understanding that over 250 members of Congress contacted the EPA to ask them to use a multi-statute approach. However, it appears the EPA promulgated a RCRA-only regulation. Industry sources believe that capital expenditures for the EPA regulation could be as high as \$5 billion, easily exceeding more than twice the estimated net value of the industry.

Currently, representatives of the wood preserving industry and the EPA are discussing the impact that this final rule will have on their industry. At their request, I urge you contact Administrator Reilly and relay to him their concerns.

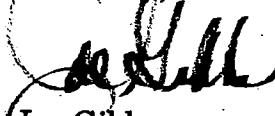

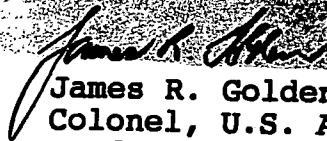

I listened with interest to you on "Larry King Live" last week and felt heartened by your statements of support for American industry. I share your concern that the United States is missing an opportunity for economic and technological growth and stature by not participating in the international marketplace.

Governor Sununu, our company SENCORP SYSTEMS, INC. (established 45 years ago, 25 years in Massachusetts), is one of the few companies in the world that has a certain type of machinery and process technology - in fact we are the only American company to offer certain technology (our other competitors are located in Japan, Germany and Italy). Unfortunately, we are unable to penetrate certain world markets and are at a loss as to where to find the proper governmental support for our endeavors; thus our letter to you as someone who is familiar with and has a stake in the future prosperity of New England.

Our company's domestic sales are at an all-time low; however, we are fortunate in that we have been able to counterbalance some of our slumping domestic sales with sales to the European and Pacific Rim marketplaces. (Foreign sales have risen from 15% to 50% of total company sales.)

Recently we attempted, in every way possible - as you can see by the enclosed correspondence - to be allowed to fairly compete for business in Saudi Arabia. We are at a stand-still. We are unable to obtain a response from either the customer or American officials in Riyadh. Is there anyone that you can suggest that we work with?

While I fully understand that our request is just one of many that reaches your desk, I feel that on behalf of the 125 employees of my company I have to pursue every avenue open to me.

I am enclosing, unedited, a memo to my Chief of Staff from my Deputy State Director in Seattle. Mariana Parks had no previous experience in politics when she joined my 1988 campaign, first as a volunteer and then as a full-time staff person. She lives in an extremely liberal Seattle city neighborhood. As a consequence, the development of her views over the last three years and the way in which she expresses them perhaps reflect a wide variety of Americans better than those of us who have been involved in this business for a long time.

I think she is right. The President has a magnificent opportunity to seize the initiative in domestic policy as he has in foreign and defense policy, though no one will ever get the degree of unanimity in the former that he has in the latter.

Most of the discussion among Republicans here in the Senate over the last several days has been on this subject. Almost unanimously, we expect the Democrats to attempt to ram through a large number of bills on a wide-range of social issues, including liberal Veterans benefits, in an attempt to change the subject. It will be a disorganized effort, but one that they hope will cut the President down to size.

In this case, as in so many others, the best defense is a good offense. Frequent Presidential speeches, as well written as possible, on a wide-range of subjects will keep them disorganized at a minimum, and at a maximum change the mood of America toward domestic issues as dramatically as we have exorcised the ghost of Vietnam.

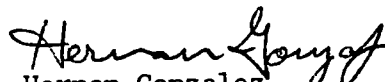
On February 8, 1991, KPMG Peat Marwick presented testimony before the Internal Revenue Service on the proposed regulations dealing with consolidated tax savings adjustments. As I informed you in my previous letter communicating our comments to the IRS, our oral comments incorporated the concerns of many of our clients as well as our own evaluation on this critical ratemaking issue involving the normalization rules under the Internal Revenue Code. I have attached for your information and review a copy of my oral comments submitted to the panel composed of IRS and Treasury officials.

During the hearing on February 8, 1991, we had 10 minutes to summarize our comments on the proposed regulations to the IRS. I was able to entertain quite a few questions from panel members, from both Treasury and the Internal Revenue Service. They were particularly interested in one of our recommendations, that a provision be included in the final regulations whereby restoration of all of the net cumulative consolidated tax savings that have been used to reduce rate base should be provided if any one of the subsidiaries in the consolidated group is sold. Of course, this recommendation was made to ensure that, in case the rate base reduction is retained in the final regulations, we will have a way of recovering this permanent loss in future rate proceedings.

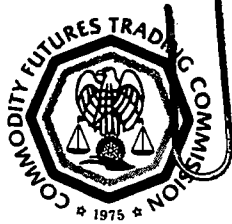

Re: Civil Rights Bill Proposals

Dear John:

Here are certain reflections with respect to our ongoing discussions of an appropriate civil rights position for the Administration and its supporters in the House and Senate. There seem to me to be, in order of importance, only three major issues that rise to the stature of public consciousness and public debate. They are (1) gender discrimination, (2) business necessity, and (3) burden of proof. The latter two, of course, encompass the heart of the Supreme Court's decision in Wards Cove.

1. I continue to believe, very firmly, that the question of gender discrimination will be the key to this year's debate. It is clear to me that the Democrats and the so-called "civil rights" community realize this, and that they will attempt to move the debate from one over quotas to one over the proposition that Republicans and the White House treat gender discrimination as being less significant and less outrageous than racial discrimination. As a matter of policy and politics both, we should not be put in this position.

Ideally, perhaps, the solution might be to fold Section 1981 into Title VII, and to abandon unlimited compensatory and punitive damages in cases alleging racial discrimination. As a practical matter, that dog won't hunt. In addition, none of the half way measures we proposed during the course of last year's debate immunize us from the valid and emotional criticism to which we are subjected by our opponents. It is for that reason that I have made the suggestions outlined to you by Marianne McGettigan. I believe that we should simply authorize Section 1981 suits in cases of gender discrimination (as well as other Title VII protected classes) on the same terms and conditions under which the courts have authorized them for racial discrimination.

As you well know, I hold no brief for the American Trial Lawyers Association. I am firmly convinced that there is far too much litigation in this country and that it damages both societal peace and appropriate concepts of justice in business and in industrial productivity. I support significant limitations on such litigation in fields like product liability and medical malpractice. As a consequence, I do not come easily to this conclusion to expand Section 1981.

Nevertheless, I am persuaded that if losing parties in Section 1981 litigation, including gender discrimination, are not only required to pay the winners' attorneys' fees but are also subject to punitive damages to exactly the same extent that punitive damages are risked by an unsuccessful defendant, such litigation will be sharply reduced. If we add to that risk the imposition of the risk on lawyers bringing such actions when they are the true parties in interest, which is an essential part of my suggestion, then we will have effectively discouraged the overwhelming vote of Section 1981 litigation, and will have encouraged primary reliance on Title VII remedies. (Incidentally, only the first of these three proposals is the "English practice"; the second two go beyond it.)

Nor do I believe it sufficient for me and others simply to offer this as an amendment to the Administration bill. Neither in committee nor on the floor of either House will we be dealing with the Administration bill but with Kennedy's. To have a chance of success, the Administration's proposals and our own must be identical and presented in the form of a single amendment.

2. I believe that you are now persuaded that we should not change the definition of business necessity established in Wards Cove. I believe this to be an entirely sound decision. Business necessity is already a court construct, not a statutory one, and should be left to the courts. The majority in Wards Cove was right.

3. Nor would I give in to the Kennedy crowd on the burden of proof. We should not allow the debate to be over how wrong Wards Cove was; the high ground is to defend the correctness of the entire decision of a Court which, after all, we and our predecessors appointed. I find it easy to defend the proposition that if you accuse me of racism or sexism you should have the burden of proving that I have engaged in such activities, rather than being able to impose on me the burden of proving that I did not.

This is the least important of the three issues, and is the only one I think that we should be willing to give up during the

course of negotiations. As a consequence, we should not give it up before we start.

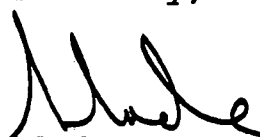
As a final note, I believe it is imperative that the overall debate focus squarely on civil rights and not be confused by related, but inapposite, arguments. We cannot permit the Democrats to promote affirmative action programs under the guise of a civil rights title as they successfully did last year, especially in connection with Wards Cove.

The present "civil rights" and "affirmative action" communities clearly are one and the same and would be delighted to win passage of an affirmative action or quota bill under the guise of civil rights. As you will note from the attached article, Morton Halperin of the ACLU conceded after last year's debate concluded, "We thought that, given the current Supreme Court and its demonstrated hostility toward civil rights, that the language (of the bill) had to be stronger to get the result we think Griggs mandated." Their real agenda is clear.

I would encourage the President to set the tone of the debate at the outset and clarify we propose a civil rights bill and our opponents are pushing affirmative action legislation. Dr. Martin Luther King and the civil rights community took to the streets of Selma, Alabama to bring about equality for all Americans, not preferential treatment for a selected few. That should be our objective as well.

This is a battle we can win both in Congress and in the minds of people of the country because we are right.

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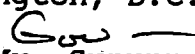

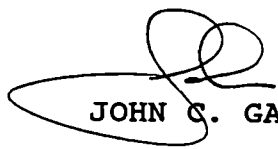

In the quest for contributions from other nations towards the cost of Operation Desert Storm, here is a suggestion which I think may be worth several billion dollars.

The size of a country's contribution should be based on the degree that it stands to benefit from the Allied action in the Gulf, and on its ability to pay. Scoring very high on both counts is the Sultanate of Brunei, which has striking parallels with the Emirate of Kuwait. Both are oil-super-rich Moslem mini-kingdoms which were carved out by the British Colonial Office from much larger British-controlled regions. Compared with Kuwait, Brunei is even smaller in both area and population, more recent and arbitrary in its statehood, and coveted by even larger and more populous neighbors.

Had Iraq's annexation of Kuwait been allowed to stand, it would surely have occurred to both Malaysia and Indonesia that Brunei was a plum ripe for the plucking. Brunei is clearly unable to provide for its own defense, and thus is especially indebted to the World Order that came to the rescue of Kuwait. In many ways, Brunei is an even bigger beneficiary than Kuwait of Operation Desert Storm, since Brunei has been spared the devastation resulting from both the occupation and the liberation of Kuwait. Also, Brunei will remain at risk even if Iraq is totally destroyed, and therefore has even more need for continuing protection than the sheikdoms of the Gulf.

Since contributions were being discussed primarily from industrial oil-importing nations and from oil producing states on the Arabian peninsula, it occurred to me that perhaps Brunei's indebtedness might have been overlooked.

Dear John:

It was good to see you at the Business Roundtable Meeting last week. I am following up on our conversation regarding Superfund.

We have assembled a project team in Washington to push for a change in the current Superfund law that has created a bonanza for lawyers and consultants. We estimate that up to sixty percent of the cost associated with cleaning up hazardous waste sites together is going toward transactional and legal expenses.

I have discussed this matter with Bob Mosbacher, Dick Darman, and a variety of other administration officials and have met with Senators Lautenberg, Chafee, Dole and others in Congress.

My sense is that there is a growing appreciation that the current law is not cleaning up hazardous waste sites while passing on excessive costs to our economy and to business in an attempt to find blame and responsibility for the clean up cost. The retroactive liability nature of the current law, while designed to force the polluters to pay, has simply not worked.

I would strongly urge you to consider the establishment of a task force on the Superfund funding mechanism within the Environmental Policy Review Group. Such a group might examine the current funding mechanism, why it is not working and what solutions could be developed to correct it. We happen to think that our proposal is a good place to start, but we are anxious to work toward any approach that would lead to a
